## 2007 SEASON - JUNIOR

Tied for fourth (Lindsey Marquez) on the team with seven doubles ... The seven doubles were just one short of tying her career high of eight, set in 2006 ... Tied for the MWC lead and was tops on the team with three sacrifice flies after not recording any in each of her first two seasons on The Mesa ... Was a perfect 4-for-4 on stolen base attempts, also just one short of her career high of five (2006) ... Started 40 of the 46 games she appeared in ... Was second on the team with 76 assists ... Her 127 at-bats were sixth on the team ... Had five multiple-hit games and two multiple-RBI contests ... Had three game-winning RBI and three game-winning runs ... Was part of a game-winning play on six occasions, tied with Monica Alnes and Melissa Owens for the third-most on the squad ... Helped the Aztecs to an impressive 8-0 record when she was in the cleanup spot ... In the four hole, she went 9-for-26 (.346) with seven runs scored, three doubles and three RBI ... Batted .375 (3-for-8) in limited action against left-handed pitchers ... Was 8-for-24 (.333) when leading off an inning and had three RBI in three at-bats with the bases loaded ... Batted .270 (10-for-37) in 14 games during the first month of the season ... Through her first three seasons, she is batting .318 (35-for-110) with 20 RBI in February ... Had a season-long four-game hit streak from March 17-21 ... Batted .400 (6-for-15) during the streak with five runs and three RBI ... Had a run in five straight games from March 13-21 ... SDSU was 11-1 when she scored a run, 7-2 when she had at least one RBI and 5-0 when she had a multi-hit game.

## 2006 SEASON - SOPHOMORE

Named to the Mountain West Conference all-tournament team after batting .556 (5-for-9) with a home run and a team-leading eight RBI ... Tied with four others for first on the team with her seven multi-RBI games ... Third on the team with 29 RBI ... Also was third in doubles (8) and home runs (3) ... Started 46 of the 48 games she appeared in, fourth most on the team ... Had three games with three or more RBI (the most she had in one game in her freshman season was two) ... Went 3-for-5 with a career-high five RBI in SDSU's 21-5, five-inning win over New Mexico on April 23 ... Also homered and scored two runs ... Was 5-for-6 on stolen base attempts ... Hit .450 (9-for-20) during a career-long six-game hitting streak from Feb. 23-March 1 ... Had two hits apiece in three consecutive games (vs. Colorado State - 4/9/06, vs. UNLV - 4/15/06, and vs. UNLV (game two) - 4/15/06) ... Batted .400 (14-for-35) in night games, the second highest night batting average on the team ... Was 11-for-32 (.344) in the month of February ... Hit .389 (7-for-18) with two home runs and 11 RBI in six games against perennial MWC power Brigham Young ... Was 4-for-8 (.500) with the bases loaded ... Her two homers in MWC play was second most on the team, while her 13 RBI was third ... Aztecs were 14-3 when she scored a run and 13-3 when she had at least one RBI.

SDSU was 8-4 when she batted No. 3 in the lineup ... Hit .324 (12-for-37) from the three spot with five doubles and eight RBI ... Had four-game hitting streaks on three occasions including the first four games of the year (Feb. 4-6) and the last four games of the season (May 8-13) ... Hit safely in 11 of her first 14 games ... Batted .341 (14-for-41) with 10 RBI in the month of February ... Was 4-for-13 (.308) with two RBI in the Mountain West Conference tournament ... Went 3-for-3 and added two RBI in a 3-0 Aztec victory over New Mexico on May 6 ...

## 2008 SEASON - JUNIOR

**SDSU Single-Season Rankings:** 2nd in RBI (39), T-7th in sacrifice flies (3), T-8th in walks (22), T-8th in times hit by pitch (3), 9th in fielding percentage (.991), T-10th in games started (61)

A tri-captain ... Battled back from an ACL tear in her knee that sidelined her 27 games into the 2007 season ... Was one of only three Aztecs (Tamani Wells and Britany Knudsen) to start every game ... Set career highs in games played (61), games started (61), at-bats (172), RBI (39), walks (22), times hit by a pitch (tied, 3), sacrifice flies (2), sacrifice bunts (10) and assists (53) ... 39 RBI was the second most in program history ... Had a .991 fielding percentage while playing three positions - catcher, first base and third base, which is the ninth-best mark in a season in school history ... Had a team-best eight game-winning RBI ... Was second on the team with nine multi-RBI games, while her 13 multi-hit games was tied with Britanny Knudsen for third on the squad ... Stepped her game up in MWC play, batting .346 with 10 RBI, a .423 slugging percentage and a .477 on-base percentage (5th in MWC) ... Batted .316 (25-for-79) with runners in scoring position with a team-best 19 RBI ... Her 14 2-out RBI was tied for the team lead (Megan McDonald) ... Had back-to-back two-hit games on Feb. 9 ... Recorded a career-high four RBI and added a homer against UC Davis on Feb. 9 ... Was 2-for-3 with two runs and a home run versus Eastern Michigan on March 1 ... Was 2-for-2 with an RBI, run and a walk against Loyola-Chicago on March 5 ...

SDSU was 11-0 when she scored at least one run.

## 2007 SEASON - SOPHOMORE

Had her season cut short after playing in just 26 games when she tore her ACL following a single against Fordham on March 16 ... Was named to the 2007 USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List ... Had started all 26 games she had played in until the injury ... At the time, only three others - Monica Alnes, Melissa Owens and Tamani Wells - had also not come off the bench ... SDSU was 16-11 (.593) when she went down with the injury. The Aztecs finished 16-13 (.552) while she was out of the lineup ... Despite missing the majority of the season (30 games), she still finished among the Mountain West Conference leaders in runners picked off (T-2nd, 2) and times caught stealing by (4th, 11) ... In fact, Floros threw out 52.3 percent (11-of-21) of attempted base stealers which ranked her top in the conference ... Led the squad in with a .988 fielding percentage (minimum 60 chances), committing only two errors in 165 chances ... Also was third in putouts (148) ... Was one of four Aztecs to record at least two home runs, 10 RBI and one triple ... Had she earned enough at-bats to qualify, she would have been sixth in batting average (.274) and slugging percentage (.384) ... Batted .357 (5-for-14) over her final five games before the injury ... Was a perfect 3-for-3 in SDSU's 8-5 win over Sacramento State in the Stanford Tournament on March 10 ... Posted a season-long six-game hitting streak from Feb. 16-24, where she was 6-for-17 (.353), including a solo home run and a triple ... The triple, which came against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Feb. 17, was the first of her career ... Hit a three-run homer in SDSU's 8-0, five-inning victory over 2006 NCAA Regional participant Long Beach State on Feb. 25 ... The three RBI was a season-high ... Recorded a two-hit

## 2006 SEASON - FRESHMAN

**SDSU Single-Season Rankings:** 1st in slugging percentage (.558), 1st in on base percentage (.467), 1st in OPS (1.025), 2nd in batting average (.388), T-3rd in extra-base hits (17), 4th in fielding percentage (.993), T-4th in doubles (13), T-8th in home runs (4), T-8th in times hit by pitch (3), T-9th in total bases (82)

Had arguably the best season statistically in school history despite being a freshman ... Became the first All-American in program history when she was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Third Team ... Also earned first-team Easton-Bell Sports All-America accolades ... Named to the NFCA all-West Region first team, a first by an Aztec since 2003 (Bre DeSanta) ... MWC Freshman of the Year ... All-MWC pick ... Set school records in slugging percentage (.558), on-base percentage (.467) and OPS percentage (on-base % + slugging %), and was just one percentage point short of tying the batting average (.388) record ... Also ranked among the top 10 in doubles (tied for fourth, 13), home runs (tied for seventh, four) and in total bases (tied for eighth, 82) ... Led SDSU in batting average, hits (57), doubles, total bases, slugging percentage and on-base percentage ... Was second in games started (48), at bats (147), home runs and fielding percentage (.993) ... Her 18 multiple-hit games was tops on the team and her seven multiple-RBI games tied her with four others for the most on the squad ... Defensively, Floros picked off five runners and committed only two errors in 296 chances ... Threw out 11 of 19 base stealers (57.9 percent) ... Batted .492 (30-for-61) with 10 RBI over the final 19 games ... Had at least two hits in 11 of final 19 contests ... Batted at a .444 clip (44-for-99) over final 32 games (since March 10) ... Had a .491 batting average, .660 slugging percentage and .578 on-base percentage in MWC games ... Reached base safely in 33 of her last 36 starts and in 39 of her final 44 starts ... Named MWC Player of the Week on May 8 after going 8-for-13 (.615) over four

games to help the Aztecs clinch the MWC regular season championship ... Hit a remarkable .591 (13-for-22) with 10 runs scored over the Aztecs' final six MWC contests ... Went 3-for-3 with two RBI and a career-high four runs in SDSU's 8-3 title-clinching win over Utah in the first game of a doubleheader on May 7 ... Had her first career home run in her first at bat against Cal Poly on Feb. 9 ... Had a homer and drove in a career-high three runs against Wagner on Feb. 24 ... Had another three RBI after going 3-for-4 in SDSU's 21-5, five-inning win over New Mexico on April 25 ... Had an eight-game hitting streak from March 10-31, where she batted .440 (11-for-25) over the three-week period ... Hit .462 (18-for-39) in road contests, tied with Monica Alnes for tops on the team ... Also led the Aztecs with a .338 average at home and three homers ... Batted a team-high .556 (20-for-36) with 10 runs scored in 12 night games ... Her .364 (4-for-11) batting average, two RBI and four hits at the NCAA tournament at UCLA were also team highs ... Hit over .500 against MWC opponents New Mexico (.583) and Utah (.556) ... Aztecs were 23-6 when she reached base two or more times, 18-4 when she scored a run and a perfect 13-0 when she drove in at least one run.

the 2007 season and had the most starts at the hot corner (43) in 2008 ... Is coming off a season where she set or tied 12 season highs ... Plays the game hard ... Swings a strong bat ... Comes up with big hits when called upon ... One of 11 lefthanded hitters on the squad ... Will be called upon to provide leadership as a returning letterwinner and one of five seniors.

## 2008 SEASON - JUNIOR

Started 43 games at third base and appeared in 47, while starting the final nine contests of the season ... Set career-highs in games played (47), games started (43), at-bats (105), runs (6, tied), hits (21), doubles (3), RBI (11), total bases (24), walks (7), putouts (42), assists (50) and fielding percentage (.939) ... Batted .333 (9-for-27) when leading off an inning ... Hit an impressive .364 (8-for-22) against left-handed pitchers, despite being a lefty herself ... The average trailed only Megan McDonald's .385 mark ... Had four multi-hit games, the ninth-most on the squad ... Added two multi-RBI games, which tied her with Brittany Knudsen and Jen Wisneski for seventh on the team ... Had her first RBI of the season against Saint Peter's on Feb. 29 ... Had season highs of two hits and two RBI against Loyola-Chicago on March 5 ... Added two hits, including her first double of the season, versus UC Davis (March 8) ... Hit .555 (5-for-9) with three runs, three RBI and a double in four games against Oregon, Loyola-Chicago, Pacific and UC Davis from March 2-8 ... Recorded a season-long three-game hitting streak from March 17-20 ... Added two RBI over the streak ... Had two hits at San Diego on April 16 ... Set a career high with three hits in SDSU's win over Colorado State on April 20 ... Tied her career best with two RBI in the game and had her second double of the season ... Had a solid weekend at UNLV to help SDSU wrap up its fourth MWC title in seven seasons ... Drove in a run in each game and scored a run over the two contests ... Had a hit in two of the three NCAA Regional games in Fresno, Calif. ... Batted .286 (2-for-7) with a walk in the tournament ... Had a career-high four assists on two occasions ... The first came against Washington on March 20 and the second came against Fresno State in the NCAA's ... Improvement and patience showed toward the end of the season as she struck out just twice over her final 16 at-bats (1K/8 AB) ... Before that, she had struck out 25 times over her first 89 at-bats (1K/3.6 AB) ... Also improved in the field ... Committed just two errors in 54 chances over her final 24 games for a 96.3 fielding percentage ... Had four errors in 44 chances (90.9 fielding percentage) over her first 23 contests ... San Diego State was 33-10 when she started, 9-0 when she drove in at least one run and 6-0 when she scored.

## 2007 SEASON - SOPHOMORE

Saw the majority of playing time at third base down the stretch ... Ended up starting 14 of the final 15 games ... On the season, she saw action in 27 games with 18 starts ... Started 13 of the 15 conference games ... Batted .290 (9-for-31) in league action, which would have put her fifth on the team had she had enough at-bats ... Had

four RBI and three sacrifice hits against MWC opponents ... Hit .300 (6-for-20) with two sacrifices in nine away contests ... Batted .316 (6-for-19) with five runs scored in night games ... Was 3-for-7 (.429) over three games against conference foe New Mexico ... Hit .347 (8-for-23) over a nine-game stretch from April 14-May 5 ... Stole two bases on the season without getting thrown out ... Swipes came against Iona on March 18 and another one versus Utah on May 10 in the second game of a doubleheader ... Got her first hit of the season in SDSU's 7-1 victory over Fordham on March 16 ... Had her first two-hit game of her career against New Mexico (April 14) ... Followed that with a single and an RBI against the Lobos on April 15 ... Scored a run against Siena on Feb. 24 and another against Brown on March 28 ...
