

Double-Figure Scoring Games: 7

Came off her redshirt season to post career highs in every category in 2005-06 ... a veteran in the front court, who had a strong 2006 conference campaign, making her first three career starts ... only four-year member of the SDSU program on this year's roster ... owns a good short-range jump shot and improved rebounding skills ... is lefthanded.

As A Junior (2005-06): Competed in 22 games, earning three starts ... played in all 16 league contests ... led the squad in field-goal percentage (.523) ... fifth on the team in points (6.1) and third in rebounds per game (4.0) ... scored in doublefigures in five of six conference outings from Jan. 21 to Feb. 11 ... reached double-figures in scoring seven times ... team game-high in points five times and in rebounds three times ... saw her first action since December 2004, playing three minutes and recording a rebound and a steal at Wichita State ... doubled her previous career high with 10 points at BYU, going 4-for-5 from the field and also adding her first career block in just 14 minutes ... made the most of her first career start at New Mexico, scoring a team game-high 14 points and also added five rebounds versus the No. 18 Lobos ... career high in points for the third straight contest, scoring a team-best 16 on 6-for-10 shooting versus Wyoming ... also had a seasonbest seven rebounds in 35 minutes against the Cowgirls ... matched her season high in rebounds

with seven in her third start of the year versus Colorado State on Feb. 4 ... scored in double-figures for the fourth time in five outings with 12 points off the bench to go with seven rebounds, both team game highs, at Air Force ... fifth contest with 10 or more points at Utah, ending up with 10 on 4-for-7 shooting from the floor ... team-high 11 points in the regular season finale at Wyoming ... made seven of her nine shots from the field at the conference tournament, ending with 14 points and also tallying four rebounds and three assists versus Colorado State.

As A Sophomore (2004-05): Played in four games before having ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle ... converted on her only field-goal attempt and had three rebounds and an assist against Cal State Stanislaus ... injured her left ankle during pregame warm-ups prior to the team's contest versus Northern Colorado on Dec. 4 ... limited to a combined three minutes against Northern Colorado and at Nevada due to injury.

As A Freshman (2003-04): Saw action in 25 games ... four rebounds, an assist and a steal in 17 minutes in the victory over Nevada ... best game of the season at Cal State Fullerton, scoring the first five points of her career and adding five rebounds and three assists in the win ... career-high eight rebounds versus Oral Roberts ... scored four points and had five rebounds against SMU ... two steals in the team's win over Air Force, including one on the final play of the game ... also tied for a team game-high with five rebounds versus the Falcons.

High School: Starred at Reed High School under coach Richard Shaw, helping the Raiders to the 2002-03 High Desert League title with a perfect 12-0 record ... Reed finished 22-5 overall in 2002-03 ... invited to attend the elite adidas Top Ten All-America Camp ... As A Junior (2005-06): One of two Aztecs to play and start all 27 contests ... led the Mountain West Conference in blocks per game for both overall (1.41) and league (1.44) contests ... four or more blocks in a game three times, including a leaguebest six versus Colorado State ... SDSU's leader in rebounds and blocks and was third in scoring ... reached double-figures in scoring on six occasions and had two double-figure rebounding efforts ... ninth in the MWC in defensive rebounds per game (4.37) ... team game-high in points twice and in rebounds 10 times ... starter at center in the opener at Wichita State ... scored five points in her Aztec debut ... tallied 12 points to go along with six rebounds, three steals and three blocks in just 25 minutes against USD ... pulled down nine rebounds at UC Riverside ... was also the team's second leading scorer with 16 points versus the Highlanders ... career-high 12 rebounds against Pepperdine, the most by an Aztec in a game since 2004 ... 10 points, seven rebounds and four blocks against Portland State ... 10 boards in the


