► **When & Where:** Tuesday, Nov. 11, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7:00 p.m. (PST)

► **Webcast/TV:** None

► **The Records:** SDSU (0-0) faces Vanguard University (0-0) in the first action of the 2003-04 for both schools. The contest will be an exhibition for the Aztecs, while the meeting will count toward the Lions' overall season record, as NAIA schools are not allowed to play exhibition games.

The Aztecs were 9-18 overall and 3-11 in conference play in 2002-03. The Lions, meanwhile, are coming off a 28-10 season in which they advanced to the final four of the NAIA national tournament. The game with the Aztecs is the Lions' lone contest versus a NCAA Div. I foe in 2003-04.

► **In The RPI:** In the 2003-04 preseason strength of schedule report released by the WBCA on Oct. 21, SDSU's schedule is ranked 152nd of the 324 NCAA Division I teams. Vanguard is ranked fourth in the 2003-04 preseason NAIA national rankings.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 9-18.

► **Vanguard Head Coach Russ Davis:** Davis is in his eighth season with the Lions. His Vanguard and career head coaching record is 164-67.

► **Series History:** Tuesday is the first meeting between San Diego State and Vanguard, which changed its name from Southern California College in July 1999.

SDSU Women's Basketball Opens 2003-04 Campaign With An Exhibition Game Tuesday

The San Diego State women's basketball team will have its hands full as it opens the 2003-04 season against NAIA-power Vanguard University Tuesday at Cox Arena at 7 p.m. The match-up will be an exhibition contest for the Aztecs, while the game will count toward Vanguard's season record as NAIA schools are not allowed to play exhibitions.

The Aztecs return just three letterwinners from last year's squad which finished 9-18 overall and 3-11 in the Mountain West Conference. Three of the team's four returnees, however, saw significant starting time in 2002-03 and will be bolstered this season by a talented group of eight newcomers.

The Lions, meanwhile, are coming off a 28-10 season in which they advanced to the final four of the NAIA national tournament. Two starters return for a Vanguard squad which is in the No. 4 spot in the preseason NAIA rankings.

Vanguard Tid-bits

This Tuesday's game with San Diego State will be the season-opener for Vanguard ... the Lions posted a 28-10 overall record in 2002-03, advancing to the NAIA final four ... Vanguard boasted one win over an NCAA Div. I team a year ago, defeating UC Irvine, 50-48 ... UC Irvine defeated SDSU last season, 61-58 in overtime ... the Lions' leading scorer, Jennifer Wilcox, returns this season after averaging 11.1 points and 7.1 rebounds per game ... Lacey Mills is the team's other returning starter, averaging 8.4 points per contest in 2002-03.

Aztecs In Exhibitions

The Aztecs split their pair of exhibitions games in 2002-03 for the fourth year in a row, opening with a 72-65 win over the Basketball Travelers, before falling to the West Coast All Stars, 74-70.

Pick Six

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish sixth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 7, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The voting panel consisted of the conference's eight head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs jumped one spot from each of the three previous preseason polls, receiving 57 total points. SDSU, which finished seventh in the MWC a year ago, was accurately picked to place sixth in the inaugural poll in 1999-2000.

Defending regular-season conference champion Utah, which returns all five starters, was the top selection for the 2003-04 campaign, receiving 19 out of the 20 first-place votes and 152 points overall. The Utes were followed by BYU (120 points), which claimed the other first-place vote, and New Mexico (119 points). Colorado State (98) and UNLV (85) were picked fourth and fifth, respectively, while Wyoming (54) and Air Force (28) finished out the poll.

The media and coaches have correctly picked the regular-season conference winner in three of the four previous polls, with Colorado State earning the nod in 2001-02, and Utah claiming the title in 1999-2000 and 2000-01. BYU was picked to win the MWC a year ago, but ended up finishing tied for third.

2003-04 Rewind

SDSU ushered in the Jim Tomey era with a 9-18 mark overall and a 3-11 record in MWC play. The Aztecs finished the non-conference campaign at an even 6-6, with two of those losses coming in overtime to UC Irvine and Missouri Valley co-champion Creighton.

SDSU got off to a rough start in conference play, barely falling to UNLV in the opener (50-48), before dropping the next three to conference powers BYU, Utah and New Mexico.

A 73-55 victory at Air Force started a two-game winning streak for the Aztecs, capped by the team's biggest victory of the season, a 60-47 defeat of Colorado State at Cox Arena.

The second half of the MWC schedule saw SDSU struggle, especially on the offensive side, as the team dropped eight of the last nine contests, including a narrow five-point loss (54-49) to New Mexico in the first round of the conference tournament.

Two players, senior Jamey Cox and freshman Ashlee Dunlap, earned all-conference honors.

Back Again

While SDSU returns just three letterwinners in 2003-04, all three, senior Nicolette McCartney and sophomores Ashlee Dunlap and Veronica Shaw, played starring roles a year ago.

McCartney is the lone returning upperclassman, having started in all 27 games in 2002-03. The senior is the conference's top returning shot blocker, who is tied for sixth in the Aztec career record books with 76 blocks. McCartney posted career highs in almost every category as a junior, averaging a career best 7.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

Dunlap, meanwhile, had an outstanding freshman campaign, leading the Mountain West Conference in both rebounding (8.8/g) and double-doubles (10). In addition, she ranked first on the team in field goals and steals and was second in scoring and blocks. A conference honorable mention selection, Dunlap led the team in scoring 19 times and in rebounding on 20 occasions.

The team's third returning letterwinner, Shaw, started in 14 games before missing most of the second half of the conference schedule with a knee injury. Prior to that, she was the Aztecs' spark on both sides of the ball, averaging 7.6 points and 2.0 steals per game. In the team's upset victory over Colorado State, Shaw showed off her versatility with a team-best 16 points, nine rebounds and three steals.

Sophomore Michelle Strawberry also returns for the Aztecs.

Noting The Newcomers

Eight newcomers comprising three of the four class levels will don Aztec uniforms this season.

The junior class of newcomers Lindsey Casey and Candace Mattson adds instant experience

to the San Diego State line-up. Casey played for championship squads at both the University of Oklahoma and Midland College and should help both on the offensive and defensive boards. Mattson, meanwhile, competed at Salt Lake City Community College the last two years and offers great versatility with ability to shoot from the perimeter or post up players inside.

Junior college transfer Farryn Lewis gives SDSU added depth and experience at the forward position, while the five-member freshman class boasts three guards and two forwards, who will need to step in immediately and contribute on all areas of the court.

Geographically Challenged

The SDSU coaching staff traveled far and wide to make-up its 2003 recruiting class. This year's 12-player roster includes players from 10 states with the most coming from California (3). Other states represented include: Arizona, Colorado, Illinois, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

Year Two: Fast Facts

Three of the previous five Aztec coaches to coach more than one year at SDSU have seen improvements in their second seasons at the helm. Kathleen Wallace (1976-78) went from four wins in her inaugural campaign to 10 the next season. Richie Spears (1978-1983) followed suit with 23 victories his second year, after tallying 13 his first season.

While Earnest Riggins broke the string, tallying three less victories than his first season, Beth Burns doubled her win total in two years, going from a 7-23 record in 1989-90 to a 14-14 mark in 1990-91.

Barb Smith went from 10-15 to 7-19, but then rebounded a year later with the best effort, a 13-15 record, of her Aztec tenure.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2003-04

Offense - The Aztecs must find a way to replace career three-point leader and team captain Jamey Cox both on and off the court ... Cox averaged a team-best 12.7 points per contest and accounted for 64 percent of SDSU's 121 three-pointers ... scoring is the main focus this season, after the team averaged just 50.8 points per conference game and was kept below the 50-point barrier in each of its final four contests.

Defense - While both of the team's top two rebounders return, SDSU averaged 32.8 rebounds a game and only 30.3 boards in conference play, ranking last in the MWC in both categories ... the Aztecs excelled in steals (8.70/g) and blocks (3.67/g), while holding opponents to a sub .400 field-goal percentage 13 times.

The Schedule - Non-conference meetings with 13 schools from seven states and seven different conferences highlight the 2003-04 San Diego State women's basketball schedule.

The Aztecs begin with two exhibitions before playing host to St. Mary's College (Nov. 21) and Nevada-Reno (Nov. 24). The team then heads on a three-game road trip to Big West Conference schools Cal State Fullerton, UC Irvine and Cal State Northridge, prior to a three-game set at home, featuring crosstown rival University of San Diego (Dec. 10). SDSU rounds out 2003 with trips to Washington State and the University of Alabama-Birmingham tournament before concluding non-conference action with Santa Clara and Texas Pan-American.

The Aztecs will once again face a grueling conference schedule as six of the Mountain West's eight schools are coming off postseason bids (three NCAA, three WNIT).

Lunch With Champions

The San Diego State men's and women's basketball teams will play host to the second annual SDSU Basketball Tip-Off Luncheon on Tuesday, Nov. 18 from noon to 1:30 p.m. The luncheon will take place at the Town & Country Convention Center in Mission Valley. Individual cost is \$50, while tables are available for \$400 (no student-athlete) and \$500 (table with a student-athlete).
