## SDSU Men's Soccer Heads to Pacific Northwest For Pac-10 Games Against Oregon State, Washington

The San Diego State men's soccer team heads to the Pacific Northwest for a pair of key Pac-10 Conference games this weekend. Riding a three-match unbeaten streak, the Aztecs (9-5-2, 2-4-1 Pac-10), who are once again receiving votes in both the NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com* and *Soccer Times* national polls, will meet Oregon State (6-8-0, 1-6-0 Pac-10) at 7 p.m. PT Friday and Washington (9-5-1, 3-4-0 Pac-10) at 1 p.m. PT Sunday.

SDSU is coming off a 4-1 victory at Cal State Fullerton on Saturday night, when it spotted the Titans a first half penalty kick goal and erupted for four goals in the second half for the non-conference win. Freshman Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) scored twice, while junior captain Daniel Steres (Calbasas, Calif.) and red-shirt junior Justin Davies (San Diego/Brooks School (Mass.)) each added solo goals.

This weekend will be a huge test for San Diego State, which is trying to get into the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs, who have nine wins this year, their most since 2006, have struggled in the Pacific Northwest. Since SDSU joined the Pac-10 (2005), it has gone 0-5-5 on the road against the Beavers and Huskies.

## Noting the Aztecs

\* With three games still to be played on the 2010 regular season schedule, San Diego State is 9-5-2 (.625). The nine victories matches the program's most since the 2006 season, the last year the Aztecs made the NCAA tournament. It is the most wins since the 1994 team went 10-9-0.

\* SDSU is receiving votes in both the NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com* and *Soccer Times* poll. In the NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com* poll, San Diego State has 16 votes, which is the 30th most in the nation. The Aztecs have three points in the *Soccer Times* poll, which is the 35th most in the country.

\* In the NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com* Far West Region poll, SDSU is fifth, up from seventh a week ago. Four weeks ago San Diego State was fourth and five weeks ago it was third, the highest in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure. Other Pac-10 teams in the top 10 include California (No. 2), UCLA (No. 3), the Aztecs (No. 5) and Washington (No. 6).

\* SDSU has earned results in three of its six matches against nationally ranked teams this season, going 2-3-1. San Diego State's wins have come against San Diego (No. 32 by *Top Drawer Soccer*) and Washington (No. 14 by *Soccer America*), while its tie came Friday vs. California (No. 12 by NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com*, *Soccer Times* and *Top Drawer Soccer*). The Aztecs' losses against ranked opponents, meanwhile, have come at the hands of Loyola Marymount (No. 28 by *Top Drawer Soccer*), UCLA (No. 8 by *Top Drawer Soccer*) and California (No. 10 by NSCAA/*HendrickCars.com*).

\* SDSU began its season with a seven-game (6-0-1) unbeaten streak, outscoring the opposition, 15-4. The seven-match unbeaten streak was the program's longest since an eight-game undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the eighth-longest in program history.


\* San Diego State is 5-0-1 in tournament games in 2010.

\* Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) leads the team in points (16), goals (6), penalty kick goals (3), shots (63) and shots on goal (23). Among the national leaders, Reza ranks in a tie for 82nd with 1.06 points per game. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS), meanwhile, is tied for 14th in the country with 0.56 assists per game.

\* Reza has started 52 consecutive matches.

## At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 11th year as head coach at San Diego State and 14th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 42-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to

the Pac-10 in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 46-36-25 (.547), including an 19-21-17 (.482) mark in the competitive Pac-10.

Over his 10 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, nine professional players, seven all-Far West selections and 50 all-conference picks.

### A Glance at the Beavers

Oregon State defeated the Aztecs, 2-1, in San Diego on Oct. 1, but has lost its last six games since to sit at 6-8-0 overall and 1-6-0 in the Pac-10.

Travis Sanchez leads the Beavers in scoring with 14 points on six goals and two assists. Brian Ramsey (five goals, two assists) and Roberto Farfan (three goals, four assists) are also in double-digits in points for OSU with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

**\* THE SERIES:** Oregon State leads the all-time series between the two schools, 9-4-1 ... In the Pac-10 era, the Beavers lead, 7-3-1 ... SDSU has yet to win a game in Corvallis, going 0-5-1 all-time and 0-4-1 in the Pac-10 era ... Eight of the 11 matches in the Pac-10 era have been decided by one goal ... OSU has won the last five games in the series, all by one goal ... Four of those five contests have been 2-1 Beaver wins ... The Aztecs' last win in the series was a 3-0 victory on Oct. 28, 2007, when the two teams played in Los Angeles due to fires in San Diego County ... Friday will be second time the two schools will meet in the month of November (Oregon State won, 2-1, in San Diego in 2009).

### Scouting the Huskies

Washington is 9-5-1 overall heading into Friday's match at UCLA and 3-4-0 in the Pac-10. The Huskies are coming off a tough, double-overtime, 2-1, loss at nationally ranked California. Prior to that game, UW shut out Oregon State, 4-0, and Stanford, 1-0.

Brent Richards leads the team with in goals (8), assists (5), points (21), shots (56), shots on goal (29) and game-winning goals (3). Matt Van Houten (five goals, three assists) and Daniel Gray (four goals, three assists) have added 13 and 11 points, respectively.

**\* THE SERIES:** Washington leads the all-time series, 6-4-6, including a 3-2-2 record in Seattle ... In San Diego State's Pac-10 era (since 2005), Washington has the slight edge, 3-2-6 ... The Aztecs have yet to win in Seattle in the Pac-10 era, but have tied four times (0-1-4) ... Eight of the 11 meetings in the Pac-10 era have been settled in overtime or double-overtime ... Of the six ties since 2005, four have been 0-0 decisions ... The two teams combined to score 16 goals in the first 10 meetings of the Pac-10 era (1.60 goals per game) ... The teams combined for seven goals in the earlier meeting this season when SDSU came out on top, 4-3, in overtime.

### A Look at the Pac-10 Season So Far

San Diego State currently sits in fourth place in the Pac-10 standings with a 2-4-1 league record. The Aztecs, however, are playing much better than their record indicates. SDSU has outshot the opposition, 110-73, in conference games, or an average of 15.71 shots per game to 10.43. San Diego State has outshot the opposing teams in each of its games except for its last Pac-10 game against Stanford on Oct. 24, when each team recorded 11 attempts.

Rarely does a visiting team outshoot the home team and even more rare does that happen in losses. In the Aztecs' three road games, where they are 0-3-0, SDSU has outshot the home teams (UCLA, Cal and Stanford), 46-31.

San Diego State has also had four more shots on goal (37-33) than its opponents in league action.

Another good indicator of how the Aztecs are playing is corner kicks, where SDSU and the opposition have 32 apiece in league play.

### SDSU Receiving Votes in Two National Polls

Although not officially ranked, San Diego State is receiving national recognition once again. The Aztecs are receiving votes in both the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com and Soccer Times national polls for the second consecutive week after being left out of all five polls for the first time since Sept. 7.

In the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com poll, SDSU has 16 vote, up

from one a week ago. The 16 votes is the 30th most in the nation. UC Santa Barbara and Georgetown are each tied for No. 25 with 51 points. South Carolina leads the receiving votes crew with 49 points, followed by Saint Mary's (48), Indiana (42), Michigan State (20), the Aztecs (16), South Florida (14), Central Florida (8), UAB (8), St. John's (6), Loyola Marymount (3), Portland (2), Colgate (1), James Madison (1) and Washington (1).

On Sept. 28, San Diego State was tied for 22nd, its highest ranking in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com poll since Oct. 31, 2006.

SDSU has three votes in the *Soccer Times* poll, the same as last week, which is 35th in the country. Charlotte is 25th with 44 points, while South Carolina (36), Georgetown (32), UC Santa Barbara (28), South Florida (28), Central Florida (17), Saint Mary's (9), Ohio State (8), UAB (5), Florida Gulf Coast (5), the Aztecs (3), Loyola Marymount (1) and Providence (1) are among the teams trying to get in the top 25.

On Oct. 5., San Diego State was ranked in all five polls for the first time since Oct. 11, 2005 (only four polls, *Top Drawer Soccer* was unavailable). SDSU has been as high as No. 21 in the Oct. 5 edition of the *Soccer America* poll.

## San Diego State and the RPI

The Aztecs moved up one spot in the latest RPI, which was released Nov. 1, and are now at No. 61. The rating, a mathematical formula that objectively compares results, strength of schedule and opponents' strength of schedule, is out of 204 Division I programs.

SDSU debuted at No. 65 in the initial release (Oct. 11), then dropped to 79th a week later. San Diego State was at No. 62 a week ago and are now at its highest spot all season.

## Nine Victories for the Aztecs

San Diego State has nine victories, matching the team's most since 2006. It is the third time the Aztecs have had nine wins in the six years of their Pac-10 era (since 2005). The previous two times the feat happened - 2006 (9-5-4) and 2005 (9-4-6) - SDSU made the NCAA tournament.

The nine victories are the program's most since the 1994 squad went 10-9-0.

## SDSU Scoring in Bunches

San Diego State is coming off a 4-1 victory over Cal State Fullerton where it scored all four of its goals in the second half. It's the fifth time this season that the Aztecs have scored at least three goals, all which led to SDSU wins. In fact, San Diego State has won its last eight games when scoring three or more goals.

The five games with three or more goals matches the program's most since the 1996 season and is the most since the Aztecs pulled the feat seven times in 1995.

## SDSU's Scoreless Streak Stopped

The San Diego State men's soccer team yielded a late goal in a 1-0 loss to No. 8 UCLA on Oct. 9 in Los Angeles. It was the first time the Aztecs were held scoreless since Nov. 6, 2009, breaking the team's 12-game scoring streak. It was the longest scoring streak by the program since a 13-match stretch from Oct. 19, 1990-Sept. 29, 1991. In fact, the 12 consecutive games with at least one goal is tied for the 10th-longest in the history of the program. Over the course of the 1986 and 1987 seasons, the Aztecs scored at least one goal in a school-record 46 consecutive games

## Start Me Up

The Aztecs got off to a 6-1-1 start (.813), the program's best eight-game start to a season since 2005 when they were 6-0-2 (.875). The 6-1-1 start was tied for the eighth-longest in school history with five other teams. Four of the seven teams - 2005, 1982, 1981 and 1969 - with better eight-match starts made the NCAA tournament.

## SDSU Posts Eighth-Longest Unbeaten Streak

SDSU recently had its seven-game unbeaten streak snapped with a 2-1 loss to Oregon State on Oct. 1. Over the seven matches, San Diego State outscored the opposition, 15-4.

The seven games without a loss was tied for the eighth-longest unbeaten in the history of the program. Four of the teams - 2005, 1989, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longer unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

## The Young...

Coming into the season the big question was, "Who is going to replace the departed seven seniors?" Of those seven seniors (six who finished the season), three were drafted by Major League

Soccer and five were named to the 2009 all-Pac-10 team (one first team selection, four honorable mention picks).

Sixteen games into the season, 11 (of 17) newcomers have seen action with eight earning a combined 60 starts. True freshmen Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) has started all 16 matches, while redshirt freshman Robbie Freise (Canyon Country, Calif.) (15 starts) and true freshman Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis) (14 starts) have also been regular starters. Other newcomers to earn starts in 2010 include true freshman Sean Zaher (Las Vegas, Nev.) (6), redshirt freshman Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) (4), true freshman Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) (3), graduate student Falke Verwer (Delft, Netherlands) (1) and true freshman Brett Helm (Frisco, Texas) (1).

Biles has been on a offensive tear, scoring three times over the past two games. Other newcomers to contribute offensively include Verwer (two goals), Meuser (two assists), Ongaro (two assists), Zaher (one goal) and true freshman Kody Duff (Roseville, Calif.) (one assist). Redshirt freshmen Daniel Kohen (Los Angeles, Calif.) and Blake Hylan (San Diego/Torrey Pines HS) ha

In the opener at Loyola Marymount on Sept. 1, four freshmen (all true) started. The four freshmen was the most in a season-opener in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure and five later started in the 4-3 overtime win against No. 23 Washington on Oct. 3. An amazing six started the second half at San Diego (Sept. 5) and at home versus Air Force (Sept. 10) (both wins).

### ...and the "Rustless"

Maybe a bit overlooked because of the 17 newcomers are the four Aztec seniors Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.), Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and Michael Rocha (Pasadena, Calif.). The four, however, have been rocks in the program since their arrival on The Mesa and this year is no different.

A 2007 honorable mention all-Pac-10 pick, Byrns returned from an injury-plagued 2008 season to start 16 of SDSU's 18 games a year ago, leading the league in saves per game (4.50). Over his career, San Diego State is 23-12-8 (.628) when he earns the start. Among the all-time program leaders, Byrns ranks fifth in saves (165) and shutouts (14), and tied for seventh in goals against average (1.11). This year, Byrns is 9-5-2 with a 1.10 goals against average, a mark which ranks 85th in the nation.

An all-Pac-10 selection all three years (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2007-08), Diouf tied for third on the team in 2009 with nine points on three goals and three assists. Over his career, the tri-captain has five career game-winning goals (14 total). This year, Diouf has eight points on three goals and two assists.

A two-time all-conference honoree (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2008), Reza is a two-time team MVP after leading the squad in scoring each of the past two seasons. Reza had 16 points (six goals, four assists) last year after recording the top SDSU offensive season in a decade in 2008 (20 points - eight goals, four assists). The tri-captain has 17 points (six goals, five assists) in 16 games in 2010. The 1.06 points per game ranks in a tie for 82nd in the nation.

Rocha, meanwhile, has come back strong after missing all of 2009 with a wrist injury. Rocha scored his first career goal on Sept. 12 in the team's 4-1 win over Oakland and added another on Sept. 24 vs. Houston Baptist. Rocha has seven career points on two goals and three helpers.

### Reza Moves to No. 23 in Top Drawer Soccer's Upperclassmen Top 100

Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) is ranked No. 23 in the latest *Top Drawer Soccer* Upperclassmen Top 100 list, released Oct. 8. Reza improved 44 places from the initial release (Sept. 15). According to the website, the list, which will be updated weekly, "is meant to reflect overall quality of players. This means it is far more than a ranking of statistics. As soccer in many ways is not a statistical game, it is important to understand the qualities that players can bring to defense, attack, central midfield and wing play, along with goalkeeping. So many of the things that make players desirable to have on teams are not reflected in statistics."

Reza leads the team in points (17), goals (6), assists (5), shots (63), shots on goal (23) and penalty kick goals (3).

Reza also improved from No. 6 to No. 3 in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Players to Watch Men's Top 20 list for the Pac-10. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) and senior Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), meanwhile, are 16th and 17th, respectively, on the Pac-10 list.

### SDSU's Martin, Meuser Make College Freshmen Top 100

San Diego State's Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Calif.) and Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) are ranked the same in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Freshmen National Top 100 list, the website announced Oct. 8. Like the initial list (Sept. 22), Martin is rated No. 34, while Meuser is at No. 85 in the rankings.

The duo has played an important part in leading the Aztecs to a 9-5-2 record out of the gate. Meuser has started all 16 games, while Martin has 14 starts for his credit.

Martin has played 1,282 minutes this season, all in the back. Martin was named to the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central all-tournament team last month.

Meuser, meanwhile, has logged an impressive 1,378 minutes this season, a mark that only trails Byrns redshirt senior goalkeeper Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.). Meuser, who has mainly seen action in the back, but also some time in the midfield, has two assists in his first year. He has nine shots, including two on net.

### Byass Named One of 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On

San Diego State men's soccer forward Miles Byass (Highland, Calif./Redlands HS) has been picked by *College Soccer News* as one of the 100 Freshmen From Coast To Coast To Keep An Eye On during the 2010 season. Current Aztecs who have previously been named to the preseason list include redshirt junior Gemechu Abraham (Beaverton, Ore./Beaverton HS) and sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS).

Byass (6-0, 155) brings instant credibility to this year's class after playing for the United States Under-18 National Team for each of the past two years. A Parade All-American in 2009, Byass was ranked as the 16th-best

### SDSU Men's Soccer's 2010 Recruiting Class Ranked No. 29 Nationally

San Diego State's 2010 men's soccer recruiting class has received a No. 29 national ranking from *College Soccer News*. It is the fourth year in a row that the Aztecs have had a top-30 recruiting class, and the fifth time in the last six seasons that they've been ranked in the top 40.

The 2010 recruiting class, consisting of 12 players, is the largest of head coach Lev Kirshner's 10-year tenure. Ten high school prospects and two college transfers will be asked to replace seven seniors, three of whom were Major League Soccer draft picks.

The individual accolades of Kirshner's class include an under-18 U.S. National Team starter, two U-17 and U-20 Canadian National Team members, a high school All-American, an adidas ESP participant, multiple starters on regional ODP teams and two top-100 nationally-ranked players.

The Aztecs are one of four Pac-10 squads to receive top-40 rankings. Perennial powerhouse UCLA picked up the top rated class, with California (No. 15) and Stanford (No. 31) also included. The Aztecs' No. 29 class ranked ahead of Big Ten schools Michigan State (No. 30) and Wisconsin (No. 35), as well as a pair of Big West squads in UC Irvine (No. 32) and Cal Poly (No. 38).

### Aztec Men's Soccer Tie for Fourth in 2010 Pac-10 Preseason Poll

The San Diego State men's soccer team has been picked in a tie for fourth place in the 2010 Pac-10 preseason poll, the league announced Aug. 18.

SDSU picked up 10 points, tied with Oregon State, six behind third-place California. UCLA has been chosen to win the regular season title with 25 points, including five first-place votes, while Stanford grabbed the other first-place tally and is picked second with 20 points. Washington's nine points rounded out the preseason poll.

The fourth-place prediction is tied for the Aztecs' best ever (2006). San Diego State, however, has finished the season better than each of its predicted finishes. In its inaugural Pac-10 campaign in 2005, SDSU was picked sixth, yet managed a fourth-place finish. The Aztecs finished second in each of their next two seasons despite being picked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the preseason poll. In 2008, San Diego State was picked fifth but finished third in league play, while last year's squad (T-4th) bettered its prediction of fifth.

SDSU's 19-match (regular season) schedule, which includes 10 games away from SDSU Sports Deck, the program's most since 2004, kicks off Sept. 1 at Loyola Marymount at 4 p.m. PT. Six of the Aztecs' 19 games are against teams who made the 2009 NCAA Tournament, while three are versus squads who earned national seeds in last year's tourney (No. 6 UCLA, which San Diego State will play twice, and No. 11 San Diego).
