ORAL ROBERTS Golden Eagles (3-4)* vs. SAN DIEGO STATE Aztecs (3-4)

- ▶ **When & Where:** Sat., Dec. 20, 2003, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 4:30 p.m.
- ▶ **Webcast/Live Stats/TV:** The game will be televised live by Channel 4 San Diego, with Bill Earley (play-by-play) and Tammy Blackburn (analysis) making the call from Cox Arena. There will also be a live audio broadcast on www.goaztecs.com with Pete Tenney. Live stats will be available for Saturday's game.
- ▶ **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team will look to end its three-game losing streak with a victory over Oral Roberts in its final home game of 2003. SDSU is coming off losses to San Diego (65-60) and Southern Methodist (64-55) last week and faces Oral Roberts for the first time since 1988.
- ▶ **The Golden Eagles** are 3-4 heading into a Tuesday night game against Arkansas-Pine Bluff before traveling to San Diego. Only one of Oral Roberts' wins this season have come against an NCAA Division I opponent in Texas Pan-American (67-57), while the other two have been over NAIA schools Bacone (119-29) and Newman University (98-49).
- ▶ **In The RPI:** In the fourth RPI released by the WBCA on Dec. 15, SDSU is ranked 314th, while Oral Roberts is 157th of the 324 NCAA Division I teams. The Aztecs are 276th in the Jeff Sagarin/*College Basketball News* rankings.
- ▶ **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 12-22.
- ▶ **ORU Head Coach Jerry Finkbeiner:** Finkbeiner is in his eighth season as head coach at ORU. His ORU record is 103-104 and his 15-year career record is 302-138.
- ▶ **Series History:** SDSU leads 1-0 (Last: SDSU def. ORU, 86-61, in San Diego, 2/23/88).

SDSU Women's Basketball Looks To Break Losing Spell Against Oral Roberts

The San Diego State women's basketball team hopes to rebound from a three-game losing streak when it plays host to Oral Roberts this Saturday, Dec. 20, in its final home contest of 2003. The Aztecs are coming off a pair of close losses last week against rival San Diego (65-60) and Southern Methodist (64-55) and are 3-4 to start a season for the fourth straight year.

Oral Roberts is also 3-4 heading into a Tuesday night match-up with Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The Golden Eagles boast a win over future SDSU opponent Texas Pan-American, while one of their losses came against No. 13 (AP) Oklahoma (90-42).

SMU Wins Battle With SDSU

Southern Methodist broke a 52-52 tie with a 9-0 run in the game's final three minutes to hand San Diego State its third straight loss, 64-55, Sunday at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs

dropped to 3-4 overall, while the Mustangs, playing their first game since Dec. 3, improved to 2-3 in 2003-04.

Guard Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.) led SDSU in scoring for the second consecutive game with 17 points, including four of the team's five three-pointers. Freshman Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.) continued her string of scoring in double figures in every game with 10 points. Sophomore Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.), making her first career start, secured season bests in both points (10) and rebounds (7), while forward Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.) logged her fifth game this season in double-figure rebounding with 10.

Other SMU Notes

The game was tied eight times, while the lead changed hands on 13 occasions ... SDSU is 3-4 to start the season for the fourth straight year ... Fritz has led the team in scoring in three of the last five games ... Dunlap's six assists doubled her previous career high of three and is a team season best ... the SMU game is the first time the Aztecs have deviated from their original starting five with Strawberry replacing junior Candace Mattson (Alpine, Utah).

A Battle Won

While SDSU did not win the overall war with Southern Methodist, it did claim the battle on the boards, 39-33. The feat marks the first time the Aztecs have outrebounded their opponents in the last three games, after doing so in each of their first four contests of the season.

So far in 2003-04, SDSU has outrebounded its opponent five times, already tying the team's 27-game total from last season.

Seeing Double

SDSU freshman Michelle Elliott continues to be the team's most consistent threat on offense. Elliott has opened her career with double-figure scoring efforts in each of the team's seven games, the only Aztec player to do so this season. She currently leads all freshman in the Mountain West Conference in scoring average with a 14.1 mark.

Freshmen Fantastic

With only three letterwinners returning from last year's squad, new faces have no doubt been a key part of the Aztecs' success in 2003-04. Three of SDSU's top four scorers so far this season are all true freshmen, with Michelle Elliott leading the way with a team-best 14.1 points per game. Elliott has scored in double-figures in all seven contests, while Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.) has done so three times, averaging 7.3 points per game. Courtney Fritz rounds out the group with 11.7 ppg., including a pair of 21-point efforts against USD and at Cal State Fullerton.

Elliott, Fritz and Huettl have also combined for 31 of the team's 32 three-pointers in 2003-04.

Drawing The Line

After making just 61.5 percent of their free throws a year ago, the Aztecs have already made steps toward improving that mark, hitting a conference-best 71.9 percent in the first seven games.

The seven-game mark includes an 84.6 percent (22-for-26) effort at Cal State Northridge on Dec. 6, the team's highest free-throw percentage since the Aztecs shot 85.7 percent at Missouri-Kansas City on Dec. 20, 2001. SDSU has made 80 percent or more of its free throws in a game twice this season (also vs. Nevada) after doing so only once in 2002-03, versus New Mexico (81.8 percent) in the season finale.

The improvement at the line can especially be seen with the team's top two returnees in forwards Ashlee Dunlap and Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.), who were both under 60 percent

Oral Roberts Tid-Bits

Oral Roberts is 3-4 overall entering its Tuesday evening game with Arkansas-Pine Bluff ... the Golden Eagles' three wins have come against Texas Pan-American and a pair of NAIA schools in Bacone and Newman University ... ORU's four losses have come at the hands of Oklahoma, Texas-Arlington, Tulsa and SW Missouri State ... two players average in double-figure scoring with Elisha Turek (12.4 ppg.) and Cori Williston (11.7 ppg.) ... Turek is the team's top rebounder (6.9/g), while teammate Leah Cannon is averaging an amazing 10.3 assists per game ... ORU was 18-10 overall and 7-7 in the Mid-Continent Conference a year ago ... the last time SDSU and ORU met was back in 1988, an 86-61 Aztec win ... Friday's game will be the second of two doubleheader nights with the SDSU men's team, as the Aztec men play host to Eastern Washington at 7 p.m.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Oral Roberts will mean:

- ▶SDSU is 4-4 overall, breaking a three-game losing skid.
- ▶SDSU improves to 2-0 all-time versus Oral Roberts with both victories coming in San Diego.
- ▶SDSU is 3-1 against teams which it did not face a year ago. The Aztecs have already earned wins over Nevada and Cal State Fullerton and suffered a loss to SMU.

games with the Aztecs. CS Northridge had the most time off with 13 days between its previous game and its meeting with the Aztecs. St. Mary's had a 12-day gap between its final exhibition game and the season-opener at SDSU. SMU, meanwhile, had 10 days, while UC Irvine had seven. SDSU's record in such games is 1-3 heading into Saturday's contest against Oral Roberts.

The Aztecs have won every game in which they have had more days off than their opponent.

In The MWC

Through games of Dec. 14, SDSU ranks in the top three among conference schools in scoring defense (2nd - 56.3 ppg.) and free-throw percentage (1st - .719). Interestingly, the Aztecs were ranked sixth in the Mountain West a year ago in scoring defense and dead last in free-throw percentage.

Individually, Ashlee Dunlap is the league's second-leading rebounder with her 9.7 rpg., while she is third in both defensive (6.0/g) and offensive (3.71/g) boards. Freshman Courtney Fritz is second in three-pointers per game (2.14) and senior Nicolette McCartny is second in the MWC in blocked shots per game with a 1.29 mark.

Double Her Pleasure

With four double-doubles this season, including three in her last three outings, Aztec Ashlee

Dunlap continues to rise up the conference ladder.

With her 14 career double-doubles, Dunlap is tied for fifth in MWC history and is tops among active players along with UNLV junior Sherry McCracklin.

Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the conference record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23. With two more double-doubles, Dunlap can vault into third place all-time, moving past Utah's Lauren Beckman and BYU's Jennifer Leitner, who each finished their careers with 15 double-doubles.

A year ago, Dunlap also had four double-doubles through the first seven games, finishing the season with 10 to her credit.

20-20

Already this year, three different Aztecs have been able to reach the 20-point mark four times. Freshman Courtney Fritz became the latest addition to the club, putting up 21 points against both San Diego and at Cal State Fullerton. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap and freshman Michelle Elliott contributed career highs of 23 and 20 points, respectively, against Nevada.

Dunlap and Elliott became the first Aztecs other than former standout Jamey Cox to reach the milestone since Atim Otii had 21 points against New Mexico at the MWC championships on March 7, 2001. SDSU also had two, 20-point scorers in one game for the first time since Cox and Claire Swinbank scored 24 and 20, respectively, against UNLV on Feb. 24, 2001.

Aztecs Sign Four To National Letters Of Intent

Head coach Jim Tomey announced the signings Nov. 13, of four high school seniors to national letters of intent. Forward **Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah)**, point guard **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, center **Whitney Hollison (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.)** and wing **Marin McCue (Calgary, Alberta)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2004.

Pick Six

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish sixth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 7, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The voting panel consisted of the conference's eight head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs jumped one spot from each of the three previous polls, receiving 57 total points. SDSU, which finished seventh in the MWC a year ago, was accurately picked to place sixth in the inaugural poll in 1999-2000.

Geographically Challenged

The SDSU coaching staff traveled far and wide to make-up its 2003 recruiting class. This year's 12-player roster includes players from 10 states with the most coming from California (3). Other states represented include: Arizona, Colorado, Illinois, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

Unparalleled Coverage

Aztec fans will get a chance to follow the women's basketball team in a number of ways this season. Every regular-season game will once again be broadcast live on the internet by a trio of veterans in Bill Earley (play-by-play), Tammy Blackburn (analyst) and Dan Lawton (road games, home pre- and postgame shows). Earley and Blackburn also will team for SDSU's second television game, Dec. 20, on Channel 4 San Diego.

A new feature this season will be gametracker or live stats for every Aztec home game on goaztecs.com.
