BRUINS HOST AZTECS IN HOME OPENER — UCLA (0-1) will host San Diego State (1-0) on Saturday, September 7 at Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl at 1:15 p.m. PT. The game will be televised by Pac-12 Network. The Bruin IMG Radio Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over Sirius/XM, uclabruins.com and tuneln.com and the TuneIn App. UCLA Athletics is proud to join our institution in celebrating UCLA's Centennial all season long. The football team will mark the Centennial with a UCLA 100 helmet sticker for every game, and a UCLA 100 jersey patch for all home games.

This will be the first meeting between the teams since the 2009 season when UCLA captured a 33-14 decision in a game played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a 21-0-1 series mark against the Aztecs and are 13-0 in series games played in Los Angeles. The series began in 1922 and the tie game occurred in 1924 (13-13).

The Bruins own a September record of 14-9 over the past seven seasons -- 2019 (0-0), '18 (0-4), '17 (3-2), '16 (2-2), '15 (4-0), '14 (3-0), '13 (2-0). UCLA will be looking for its first non-conference win since a 2017 victory over Hawai'i in the Rose Bowl. It has dropped its last six contests against non-conference opponents (2019- at Cincinnati; 2018-Cincinnati, at Oklahoma, Fresno State; 2017-Kansas State (bowl), at Memphis).

Second-year head coach Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly owns a collegiate record of 49-17 compiled in one-plus seasons at UCLA and in four seasons as the head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12). During that span in Eugene, his Duck teams captured first place or a share of first in the North Division of the conference (three outright conference championships 2009-11) and four BCS bowl games. Kelly guided Oregon to appearances in a National Championship Game (2010), two Rose Bowls (after 2011 and 2009 seasons) and the Fiesta Bowl following the 2012 season. Kelly was named the 2009 and 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, 2010 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, 2010 Walter Camp Coach of the Year, 2010 Sporting News Coach of the Year, 2010 AFCA Coach of the Year Award and 2010 Associated Press Coach of the Year. In all five seasons as a collegiate head coach, Kelly has produced a top-10 rated NCAA rushing leader in yards per game average -- 2018: Joshua Kelley, 9th; 2012: Kenjon Barner, 4th; 2011: LaMichael James, 1st; 2010: LaMichael James, 1st; 2009: LaMichael James, 9th.

UCLA VS. SAN DIEGO STATE / MWC — This will be UCLA's 23rd meeting with the Aztecs. UCLA is 45-8-2 all-time vs. teams in the current Mountain West Conference -- Fresno State (6-3), San Jose State (1-0), Nevada (1-0), UNLV (2-0), Hawai'i (3-0), Wyoming (0-1), Colorado State (2-0), Air Force (6-4-1), Boise State (1-0), Utah State (1-0), New Mexico (1-0), San Diego State (21-0-1).

THE WATCH LIST

- Demetric Felton generated 174 all-purpose yards against Cincinnati (15th in the NCAA) and 162 of UCLA's total of 218 total offense yards (23 rushes-71 yards, 2 catches-91 yards and a touchdown on a 75-yard catch-and-run)...Felton had 12 yards on a KO return.
- UCLA had 48 players see game action in the opener at Cincinnati --- 2 grad students, 7 seniors, 11 juniors, 15 soph., 9 redshirt freshmen, 4 true freshmen.
- Making their first career starts as Bruins in the season-opener against Cincinnati were: OT Sean Rhyhan, OG Jon Gaines II, WR Jaylen Erwin, LB Leni Toailoa, CB Jay Shaw, S Stephan Blaylock.
- Seeing their first game action as Bruins in the opener were: OT Sean Rhyhan*, WR Jaylen Erwin, P Wade Lees, LB Jason Harris, LB Adam Cohen*, DB Kenny Churchwell III, DB Patrick Jolly Jr., LB Carl Jones*, TE Mike Martinez*. (* indicates true freshman)
- The Bruins were 6 of 15 on third down conversions at Cincinnati, but scored both touchdowns on third down plays (75-yard pass play from Dorian Thompson-Robinson to Demetric Felton in second quarter and 7-yard pass from play Thompson-Robinson to Chase Cota) ... Both of Thompson-Robinson's interceptions came on third down (3rd and 13; 3rd and 7) and each were followed by Bearcat scoring drives ... Thompson-Robinson averaged 19.5 yards per completion to rank third nationally in the category after one game.
- Defenders CB Elijah Gates (10 and a forced fumble), DL Antonio Mafi (9 and 0.5 TFL) and S Stephan Blaylock (6 and 0.5 TFL) each registered career-highs for tackles in the opener.
- WR Chase Cota made his first scoring reception in the third quarter at Cincinnati (seven yards).

HONORARY CAPTAIN

Kevin Jordan lettered four seasons, 1992-95, at wide receiver for the Bruins. He earned All-America honors in 1994 after leading the Pac-10 in receiving with a then school record total of 1,228 receiving yards. Jordan also set a regular season school mark with 73 receptions that season. He ranked fourth in the NCAA in receiving yards per game (111.6) and sixth in the nation in receptions per game (6.6). Jordan completed his career ranked No. 1 at UCLA with 179 receptions and 2,548 receiving yards. He was the first Bruin to make at least 40 receptions in three seasons. Jordan went on to the NFL and spent time with the Cincinnati Bengals, Arizona Cardinals and Denver Broncos from 1996-1998.

Media Availability

Coach Kelly is available to the media in person on Mondays and Wednesdays of game week on the field prior to practice. Players will be available 2-3 times per week after practice. Please make all interview requests for coaches, players and families through the Communications Office.

Credentials

Admission to the press seating and the Rose Bowl press box is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website at least two days prior to the game. Website address and instructions can be obtained by emailing Danny Harrington (dharrington@athletics.ucla.edu). Members of the media covering UCLA should request credentials for road games through Harrington (via email).

Credential Pickup

Credentials are available during the week at the Athletic Communications Office in the Morgan Center. Credentials not claimed prior to Friday at Noon will be available at Rose Bowl "Will Call" window (bet. Gates A and B). The media will call window and entrance opens three hours prior to kickoff.

Media Seating

A press pass enables entrance to the Press Box or Field (if photographer). The Press Box entrance is located on the west side of the Rose Bowl where media will pass through security and take the elevators to the Press level (F). For photographers, a workroom is centrally located under the South stands which features seating, tables, food, beverage, power and internet connectivity.

Postgame Procedure

The head coach and select players will be available to the media in the Rose Bowl media room (designated interview space on road) following a cooling off period. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. The Rose Bowl media room is centrally located under the South stands. The room can be accessed by walking off the field through the visitors tunnel. The head coach's post-game availability will be aired over press box television monitors. There are no interviews on the field after a home or road game.

- OT Sean Rhyan became the first true freshman to start a season-opener at tackle since Simon Goines did so at Rice in 2012.
- UCLA played without several projected key performers at Cincinnati, among them WR Theo Howard, RB Joshua Kelley, OT Alec Anderson, OG Michael Alves, CB Darnay Holmes, LB Tyree Thompson (health reasons), OLB Keisean Lucier-South (academics).
- Punter Wade Less launched a career-best 72-yard punt at Cincinnati which help UCLA gain almost 30 yards in an exchange of punts and put them in position to score a third quarter touchdown which narrowed the Bearcat lead to 17-14...It was the longest by a Bruin since Jeff Locke connected on an 81-yard punt in 2009.
- RB Joshua Kelley, a transfer from UC Davis, rushed for a touchdown in each of the last 8 games of the 2018 season - the last Bruin to tally a rushing TD in more consecutive contests was Skip Hicks who had rushing TDs in 14 straight games over two seasons (last 8 in 1996 and first 6 in 1997)... Kelley finished with 1,243 yards rushing in 2018 which is 10th on the Bruin single-season list -- Paul Perkins was the last Bruin 1,000-yard rusher (1,343 in 2015)... Kelley had six 100-yard rushing games in 2018, the most since Perkins had a like number in 2014...He ran for a series best 289 yards against the Trojans and in the fourth quarter alone vs. USC, Kelley ran 12 times for 104 yards ... Kelley produced a career-high six receptions in the game at Oregon, to mark the fifth time he grabbed at least three passes in a game in '18 ... Kelley ranked third in the P12 in all-purpose yards per game (130.5) ... Kelley ranked 9th in NCAA in 2018 in rushing yards per game, the first top-10 Bruin since Johnathan Franklin ranked 9th in 2012 and just the third Bruin since 1995 to rate in the NCAA top-10 in the category.
- UCLA played 4 true freshmen in the opener at Cincinnati (OT Sean Rhyan, TE Mike Martinez, LB Carl Jones, LB Adam Cohen) after playing 21 true freshmen in the 2018 season to set a new school record - old mark was 18 in 2013...True freshmen played in recent seasons: 2019: 4, 2018: 21, 2017: 8, 2016: 11, 2015: 10, 2014: 9, 2013: 18, 2012: 12 --- 2018 true freshman who saw action: 2 RB/5 WR/3 OL/1 QB/1 TE//3 DL, 4 DB, 2 LB ... RB Kazmeir Allen, RB Martell Irby, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, WR Kyle Phillips, OL Christophany Murray, WR Chase Cota, DL Antonio Mafi, DL Tyler Manoa, DB Stephan Blaylock, DB Rayshad Williams, DL Obito Ogbonnia and DB Elisha Guidry saw action vs. Cincinnati ... WR Michael Ezeike at Oklahoma ... WR Delon Hurt and LB Bo Calvert vs. Fresno State ... LB Elijah Wade saw his first action at Colorado ... DB Alex Johnson saw action at Oregon ... WR Greg Dulcich, TE David Priebe and OL Alec Anderson played at ASU ... OL Jon Gaines saw his initial action vs. Stanford.
- Cincinnati enjoyed a 4-2 turnover advantage over the Bruins in the 2019 opener ... In 2018, UCLA was plus-eight in turnovers in its three wins (5 Cal turnovers-0 UCLA turnovers//3 Arizona TOS-1 UCLA TO//2 USC TOS-UCLA 1 TO) ... UCLA was -7 in turnover margin in losses (Oppt. 8, UCLA 15 turnovers) ... Bruins were 6th in turnover margin in the Pac-12 (0.08) ...The five turnovers forced at Cal equaled the most in a game since 2013 when UCLA forced 6 takeaways at Utah.
- WR Theo Howard has caught a pass in each of the last 28 straight games he has played in (WR Craig Bragg ['01-04] owns the school record with a catch in 42 straight games he played in). With 119 catches, Howard moved up to tied for 16th on the school career receptions list vs. USC ... Against Utah, he became the 25th 100-catch receiver in UCLA history...He hauled in a season-best total of nine catches vs. UW and went over 1,000-yards for his career against Arizona.
- Defensive Improvement -- Rushing Yards per Game allowed 2017: 287.4 / 2018: 199.4 / 2019: 175.0; Average Yards per rush allowed 2017: 5.8 / 2018: 4.6 / 2019: 3.6; Average yards allowed per play 2017: 6.3 / 2018: 6.0 / 2019: 5.6.
- C Boss Tagaloa, who had started 8 games on the defensive line, made his first career start on offense at center in game 4 of 2018 at Colorado and went on to start the last 9 (after sitting out first 3 games) games of 2018 -- he helped produce six 100-yard games by Joshua Kelley, including serving as blocker for 1,216 of his season total of 1,243 yards.
- Kicker JJ Molson is seventh on all-time Bruin made field goal list (43) ... He has converted 22 of his last 28 FGAs over the last two-plus seasons (misses from 44, 56, 52, 47, 53 in 2018 season /47 in 2017 season) ... Molson, who is 11th on all-time school career scoring list (242 pts).
- UCLA's 218 yards of total offense yards for the game was its lowest since producing 210 yards in a 2016 setback at Colorado.
- Jay Shaw, starting at cornerback in place of Darnay Holmes at Cincinnati, made his first career interception near the end of the first half and returned it 66 yards.

A QUICK LOOK BACK AT THE MOST RECENT GAME VS. SAN DIEGO STATE

UCLA 33, San Diego State 14 --- The Bruins held the Aztecs scoreless for the final three quarters en route to a big win in the Rose Bowl. San Diego State opened up a 14-3 lead in the first quarter after registering a pair of passing touchdowns. Kai Forbath booted a 49-yard field goal and Jonhathan Franklin found the end zone on a 12-yard run late in the quarter to bring UCLA within 14-10. Derrick Coleman's second quarter 29-yard scoring dash ignited a roll of 23 unanswered points by UCLA. Terrence Austin grabbed a six-yard scoring pass from quarterback Kevin Prince to put the Bruins up 23-14 at the half. Forbath connected on a 50-yard field goal to open the second half scoring. Alterraun Verner closed out the scoring after returning a blocked field goal 70 yards for a touchdown. Linebacker Reggie Carter led UCLA with six tackles. The Bruins outgained SDSU 359 to 277 yards for the game.

ON THE SIDE

- Cornerbacks Darnay Holmes and Elijah Gates grew up together in the Pasadena, Calif. area ... They first played together at age six on a Pop Warner league team and continued to play together in youth leagues before heading off to different high schools and then reuniting at UCLA.
- Punter Wade Lees is 31 years young and ranks as the second-oldest player in the Pac-12 behind Colorado punter James Stefanou who is 32 ... both played Australian rules football coming out of high school and both are married ... Lees was married this summer (Caityn) and will be working on a graduate degree in education at UCLA.
- Running back Martell Irby has been playing the saxophone since the fourth grade ... He attended the San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts (a San Diego Unified School District college-preparatory, arts-focused public magnet school for students in grades 6 through 12 who have a strong interest and talent in the arts) and was a member of their award-winning jazz ensemble at the school ... Since the school did not sponsor a sports program, he was able to play football at nearby Morse HS.
- Defensive lineman Obito Ogbonnia has a busy off-season from football as a member of the track and field team ... Ogbonnia recorded a 10th-place finish in the shot put (19.44 m/63-9.5) at the NCAA Championship Meet to earn second-team All-America honors ... At the Pac-12 Championship meet, he placed fourth in the shot put (19.59m/64-3.25) and eighth in the discus (174-7) ... This summer, he won the shot put competition at the USATF U20 National Track and Field Championships (70-3.5) in Miramar, Fla. ... He then came away with the gold medal in the shot put at the Pan American U20 Championships in Costa Rica with a mark of 67-11.5.

IN BRIEF

- At Cincinnati, Dorian Thompson-Robinson became the third different player to start a season-opener in last three seasons at quarterback for the Bruins (2017-Josh Rosen, 2018-Wilton Speight).
- According to the NCAA, UCLA played the 8th-toughest schedule in the country in 2018 --- opponent record of 92-53 (.634).
- In 2018, the Bruins held the lead at the half in two games and won both contests (at Cal, vs. Arizona)
- Thirty-seven players (out of 76 overall players who saw action in 2018-48%) were playing in their first games as Bruins.
- UCLA has six quarterbacks on its 2019 roster; Dorian Thompson-Robinson is the only one to have taken a snap in a game.
- Returning players who made their first career starts as Bruins in 2018 - vs. Cincinnati: OT Jake Burton, C Christophany Murray, RB Joshua Kelley, WR Dymond Lee; DL Antonio Mafi, DL Martin Andrus Jr., LB Tyree Thompson, S Quentin Lake ...QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson and DL Obito Ogbonnia made starts at Oklahoma ... LB Odua Isibor vs. Fresno State ... TE Devin Asiasi at Colorado (Boss Tagaloa started his first game at center, as Murray shifted to guard) ... DL Osa Odighizuwa vs. UW ... WR Michael Ezeike at Cal ... DB Elijah Gates started vs. Arizona...WR Chase Cota made first start vs. USC.

UCLA HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY



Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly holds 28 seasons of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels, most recently serving as head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016). He also served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15) following four seasons as head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12) where he posted a record of 46-7.

In his first season in Westwood, Kelly became just the fourth Bruin head coach to guide his team past USC in the initial meeting with the crosstown rival. Running back Joshua Kelley racked up 289 rushing yards in the win, most-ever by a back in the series. Kelley finished ninth in the nation in rushing average (113.0 yds per game) and 18th nationally in all-purpose yards (130.55). It marked the fifth consecutive season in which Coach Kelly has produced an NCAA top-10 rated rushing leader as a collegiate head coach. A young Bruin team, which saw a school-record 21 freshmen take the field during the season, showed steady improvement and generated 432.9 yards of total offense

per game over the last eight games of the season, including a 528-yard effort in the season-finale versus Stanford.

Kelly's lone season in San Francisco saw the 49ers improve from the league's 21st-ranked rushing attack in 2015 (1,544 yards) to the 4th-best ground game in 2016 (2,019 yards). Running back Carlos Hyde was the biggest beneficiary of the improvement, gaining 988 yards in just 13 contests (76.0 yards per game).

Over Kelly's three seasons in Philadelphia, the Eagles ranked third in the NFL in points per game (26.9) and total offense (392.8 yards per game), as well as fourth in rushing yards per game (131.3). Sixteen Pro Bowlers were selected from his teams, including eight in 2014. The Eagles won 10 games in each of his first two seasons, as his 2014 offense scored a franchise-record 474 points to surpass his 2013 team's previous-record total of 442.

The Eagles showed a marked improvement in Year 1 under Kelly, as their 10 wins followed a four-win 2012. He became just the second head coach in league history to win a division title in his first season in the NFL, as the Eagles captured an NFC East Division Championship. He was also named the Maxwell Club NFL Coach of the Year.

Kelly began his head coaching career at the University of Oregon in 2009, leading the Ducks to a 10-3 record and a trip to the Rose Bowl. He finished his time at Oregon with an overall record of 46-7 as head coach (2009-12), including a 33-3 mark in conference play. In his four seasons in Eugene, the Ducks averaged 44.7 points per game. Kelly became the first coach in school history to guide the program to three consecutive undisputed conference championships (2009-11) and its first three 12-win seasons (2010-12).

Oregon made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons, including a trip to the National Championship game following the 2010 campaign. Kelly was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010, and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 2010.

The 2012 Ducks finished second in the nation in scoring (49.6 points per game) and fifth in total offense (537.4 yards per game) with freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota under center. They would conclude the season with a Fiesta Bowl victory over Kansas State. A January bowl game was also the end result for Oregon the year prior, as the Ducks defeated Wisconsin in a Rose Bowl thriller, 45-38. Kelly's offense notched Top-5 finishes in points per game (46.1, third) and total offense (522.8 yards per game, fourth) in 2011.

In 2010, the Ducks led the nation both points per game (46.1) and total yardage (530.7 per game) en route to a BCS National Championship Game appearance. In addition to his Pac-10 Coach of the Year and Associated Press Coach of the Year awards, Kelly garnered Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, Walter Camp Coach of the Year, The Sporting News Coach of the Year and American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year accolades.

Kelly's first season as a head coach (2009) culminated in a Rose Bowl appearance and the Pac-10 Coach of the Year award, as his offense ranked sixth in the country in both points per game (36.1) and rushing yards per game (231.7). He was promoted to the top spot after his offenses led the Pac-10 in a number of categories during his two seasons (2007-08) as offensive coordinator under Mike Bellotti.

Kelly had spent the previous 13 years at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire, before being named offensive coordinator at Oregon. As offensive coordinator at UNH, Kelly protégée Ricky Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding player in FCS in 2006. The quarterback previously finished second in 2005. Kelly also coached the Wildcats' offensive line (1997, 1998) and running backs (1992, 1994-96). The New Hampshire offense averaged better than 400 yards of total offense per game in seven of his eight seasons on staff.

Kelly began his coaching career guiding defensive backs and special teams at Columbia University in 1990. He moved to outside linebackers and safeties in 1991 before his first stint at UNH as running backs coach in 1992. He also spent one season at Johns Hopkins University as defensive coordinator in 1993.

The Bruins had games in 2017 on Sunday (win over Texas A&M) and Friday (loss at Utah, home win vs. Cal). The game vs. A&M was the first college game played on a Sunday in the Rose Bowl.
 In 2016, UCLA played a Thursday night affair on Nov. 3 at the University of Colorado (loss). In the 2015 season, in back-to-back weeks, the Bruins took the field on Thursday night at Stanford (loss) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (win). In 2014, on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins. In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had previously played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday had been against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.
 In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona (L) on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon (Thur.), Nov. 18 at Washington (Thur.) and Nov. 26 at Arizona State (Fri.). Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

 Current UCLA graduate assistant coaches Jerry Neuheisel and Daniel Fields were teammates with Pasquale. This season will be the first that a Bruin has worn the No. 36 since the start of the 2013 season.

SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – The Rose Bowl – will be in its 38th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface will be called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium is putting the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.



Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932

(83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest. With the current seating configuration for home games, the capacity is 80,616 for general admission contests and 88,565 for reserved ticket games.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

The 2019 season is UCLA's 23rd season with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the 13th year for the Bruins to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California (97.3 FM The Fan in San Diego). The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder. The broadcast includes a pre- and post-game show. The Bruins' football pregame show will run 90 minutes, while the postgame show will be one hour. Josh Lewin returns as the voice of the Bruins for a fourth

season. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 23rd year on the broadcast team and his 19th as the analyst in the booth. Another Bruin signal caller, Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 19th season as the sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The hour-long Bruin Insider Show returns to the Plateia Restaurant inside the Luskin Conference Center. Each week, it will stream live online on Tuesdays at ucla.leanplayer.com at 5:00 p.m. PT, and air on the radio on either AM 570 or AM 1150, most often at 7:00 p.m. PT.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Partner of UCLA Athletics. Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com and on tunein.com and the TuneIn App.

Bruins on Television

Following the 2019 Cincinnati game, 187 of UCLA's last 188 games have been televised live, including 120 in a row. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was on delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which feature football coach and player interviews during the season including special editions of The Drive during the season, programming which feature football coach and player interviews during the season including a special edition of The Drive one week during the season.

GAME ONE: Cincinnati 24, UCLA 14

Aug. 29 - Cincinnati, Ohio

CINCINNATI – The UCLA football team dropped its season opener on Thursday evening at Cincinnati, falling 24-14 to the Bearcats before 38,032 fans at Nippert Stadium.

After forcing a Cincinnati punt on the first possession of the game, UCLA took over and staged an 8-play, 46-yard drive that resulted in a first-and-goal at the Bearcat 9-yard line. Demetric Felton gained four on a first-down rush to move the ball to the 5-yard line. On the next play, Dorian Thompson-Robinson lost the handle on the ball as he rolled around the left side and Cincinnati recovered the loose ball. The Bearcats then drove 83 yards in six plays to take a 7-0 lead.

Cincinnati threatened again late in the first quarter, driving down to the UCLA 15 before kicker Sam Crosa's 32-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right. Crosa, however, would make up for his early miss, giving the Bearcats a 10-0 lead with a 44-yard field goal early in the second quarter.

The Bruins answered with a 75-yard scoring pass play from Thompson-Robinson to Felton with eight minutes left in the half, cutting the lead to 10-7.

The Bearcats had a great chance to extend their lead with just 39 seconds to play in the half, notching a first-and-goal on the UCLA 5-yard line. UCLA defensive back Jay Shaw thwarted that attempt, stepping in front of short pass by Cincinnati quarterback Desmond Ridder, returning it 66 yards. The Bruins, however, were unable to add any points before time ran out in the first half.

On UCLA's first possession of the second half, Cincinnati intercepted a Thompson-Robinson third- down pass and took over at the Bruin 30-yard line. Five plays later running back Michael Warren put the Bearcats up 17-7 after a 12-yard run.

The teams then exchanged punts, but Wade Lees' 72-yard kick gained field position for the Bruins. UCLA drove 59 yards on seven plays and closed to within 17-14 after Thompson-Robinson found Chase Cota for his first scoring reception from seven yards out with 5:40 to play in the third quarter.

The only score the rest of the game came early in the fourth quarter when Cincinnati's Ridder connected with Warren for a 21-yard pass play that ultimately put the Bearcats up 24-14.

UCLA had a chance to make a run with a little more than four minutes to play in the fourth quarter, however a fumble by Thompson-Robinson at the Cincinnati 18 ended the Bruins' scoring opportunity.
