Awing who enjoyed a career year in 2014-15... A high-motor player who has the ability to lock down his opponent... Is a good passer and can knife his way through the paint... Made strides in his offensive games a season ago... Worked on getting stronger in the offseason and improving his jumper.

As A Sophomore (2014-15 Season)

Played in 33 games and averaged 2.6 points and 1.7 rebounds, both career highs, in 12.0 minutes... Set career highs in assists (14), steals (19), field goals (30), three-pointers (2) and free-throws (23)... Scored in a career-long 13 straight games at one point of the campaign... Committed one turnover or less in 27 of his 33 games played... Set a then-career high with four rebounds and matched his personal best with three field goals vs. CSUN (11-14-14)... Pulled down a career-best five rebounds and had two steals vs. Bakersfield (11-20-14)... Played 18 minutes, including big minutes down the stretch in SDSU's come-from-behind win vs. Long Beach State (12-10-14)... Had five points, three rebounds a season-high two assists and two blocked shots vs. UC Riverside (12-22-14)... Knocked down his first career three-pointer in the second half at No. 25 Wyoming (1-14-15) to

give SDSU a 10-point lead, an edge it would not relinquish... Had a season-high two assists to go with four points and four rebounds in 21 minutes at Air Force (1-20-15)... Played a season-high 23 minutes at Colorado State (1-24-15)... Matched his career high with five rebounds, including a career-high four offensive boards, vs. Fresno State (1-27-15)... Had a career-high four steals, all of which came in nine first-half minutes, three points and four rebounds vs. Utah State (1-31-15)... Scored five points in five minutes at San José State (2-21-15).

As A Freshman (2013-14 Season)

Averaged 2.5 points and 1.2 rebounds in 10.6 minutes... Per 40 minutes, he averaged 9.5 points, 4.4 rebounds, 1.3 blocked shots and 2.4 steals... Played in 29 games, the most among the team's true freshmen, and started one game... Ranked seventh on the team with 10 blocks... Saw action in the first 16 games of the season and averaged 13.7 minutes and nearly one steal per game (15 steals)... Logged 20 or more minutes four times in the first nine games of the season (17.4 mpg)... Scored seven points all on free throws (7-8) in 20 minutes vs. UC Riverside (11-8-13)... The 20 minutes were the most of any Aztec reserve... Played a bench-high 20 minutes vs. No. 6/5 Arizona (11-14-13)...

Set career highs in points (8) and steals (3) vs. San Diego Christian (11-20-13)... Matched his career high with eight points and three rebounds vs. No. 25/rv Marquette (12-1-13)... Set a career high with three blocked shots vs. Washington (12-8-13)... Scored a career-high eight points to go along with a career-best three steals and 25 minutes vs. Southern Utah (12-18-13)... Started his first career game vs.

A versatile forward who is perhaps the strongest player on the team... Has the ability to transition quickly from one end of the court to the other... Has an array of low-post moves, but can also step out and hit a jumper... Is an inside offensive threat... Over half of his career rebound total has come off the offensive glass... Continues to work on his ball-handling, defending and free-throw shooting.

As A Junior (2014-15 Season)

Played in 35 of SDSU's 36 games and averaged a career-high 13.7 minutes... Enjoyed his best season to date by averaging 4.4 points and 3.1 rebounds... Shot a team-high 55.2 percent from the floor... Blocked 18 shots, the third-most on the team... Pulled down 45 offensive boards, the fourth-most on the team despite playing the ninth-fewest minutes... Shot 50 percent or better from the field 22 times... Reached double figures in scoring three times and led the squad in rebounding three times, with SDSU posting a 3-0 record when he accomplished both feats... Blocked multiple shots four times and committed one turnover or less 23

times... Named the preseason Mountain West Newcomer of the Year... Had eight points (4-4 FG) and four rebounds in 15 minutes in his Aztec debut vs. CSUN (11-14-14)... Recorded eight points and pulled down five rebounds in a career-high-tying 24 minutes vs. No. 25 Utah (11-18-14)... Scored a career-high 10 points vs. Pittsburgh (11-25-14)... Grabbed a season-high seven rebounds, including a game-high five offensive, vs. San Diego (12-4-14)... Played 20 minutes off the bench vs. New Mexico (1-6-15) and finished with a career-high 10 points by making four of his five field-goal attempts... Blocked a game- and season-high three shots and had a season-high two steals, to go with three points and five rebounds at No. 25 Wyoming (1-14-15)... Scored all eight of his points in the second half to help SDSU complete its comeback to beat UNLV (1-17-15)... Matched his career high with 10 points and tied a season high with seven rebounds, while blocking two shots vs. Fresno State (1-27-15)... Led the team in rebounding with a season- and career-high seven boards vs. Wyoming (2-11-15)... Connected on a career-high four field goals en route to eight points and grabbed four rebounds vs. Nevada (3-7-15)... Had five rebounds in nine minutes vs. St. John's (3-20-15) in the second

round of the NCAA tournament... Posted four points and two rebounds in seven minutes vs. Duke (3-22-15) in the third round of the NCAA tournament.

As A Redshirt (2013-14 Season)

Redshirted after transferring from Arizona prior 2013-14... Practiced with the team... Added muscle to his frame... Invaluable member of the scout team.

As A Sophomore at Arizona (2012-13 Season)

Was a part of a 27-8 Arizona team that advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament... Averaged 1.9 points and 2.0 rebounds in 8.5 minutes... More than 40 percent of his minutes played during the season came in his last 10 appearances (99 of 239), though he played in just two of UA's last six games... 42.9 percent of his rebounds came on
