Provided SDSU's lone score in a 1-0 triumph over Point Loma Nazarene ... Netted two goals in the Aztecs' 4-2 victory over UMKC ... Tallied the third score in a 3-0 shutout over UC Riverside ... Contributed an assist against Duquesne and at Oregon State ... Had a season-high four shots against St. John's on Sept. 3 ... Fired three shots in each of his next three games ... Sat out the match with cross-town rival San Diego after suffering a concussion at UCLA ... Aztecs were 3-0 when he tallied a goal and 4-1 when he had at least one point.
