San Diego State Opens 84th Season of Hoops with Four-Game Homestand; Aztecs Tip-Off Steve Fisher's Sixth Season with Long-Time Rival UC Santa Barbara Friday Night

San Diego State opens its 84th season of basketball, 35th season at the Division I level and sixth under head coach Steve Fisher, on Friday, Nov. 19, at Cox Arena against former conference mate and long-time rival UC Santa Barbara. The game will be televised locally in the San Diego market on Channel 4 San Diego (no satellite coverage) and can be heard on XPRS-1090 AM (The Mighty 1090). This is the first of four consecutive home games for the Aztecs marking their longest homestand since a five-game homestand in Dec. 2002-Jan. 2003 and the longest season-opening homestand since the 1974-75 NCAA Tournament team opened with four straight home contests.

San Diego State posted a 14-16 record last season, its fourth straight season with at least 14 victories marking the first time the Aztecs have accomplished that feat since the 1981-82 through 1984-85 seasons. SDSU, which has advanced to postseason play in two of the last three seasons, will open the season with three returning starters and eight returning letterwinners. In his coaching career, Fisher has guided all eight teams in which he returns at least three starters off a team he coached the preceding season to the postseason, including twice at San Diego State. The last time the Aztecs returned at least three starters was in 2002-03 when SDSU claimed the school's first Division I postseason victory (over UC Santa Barbara) and advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT. The last time SDSU returned as many as eight letterwinners was the 2001-02 season, when the Aztecs posted a 21-12 record, claimed the Mountain West Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

UC Santa Barbara returns three starters and eight letterwinners off a 2003-04 squad that finished 16-12 overall and 10-8 in Big West Conference play. The Gauchos were pegged for fourth place by both the Big West coaches and the league media, but preseason prognosticators *Athlon Sports* and *Street & Smith's* both have UCSB finishing among the top three positions in the Big West. Like the Aztecs, the Gauchos have advanced to postseason play in two of the last three seasons and averaged 18.0 wins per season during that span.

The teams are meeting for the 85th time with San Diego State owning a 51-33 series lead. In an odd scheduling twist, the teams will play again at The Thunderdome on Saturday, Dec. 4 (15 days after opening night). The teams met 57 times from 1934 through 1963, while sharing membership in the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the California Collegiate Athletic Conference and the PCAA. During the 70s they played 19 times (SDSU, 10-9) and met just four times during the 80s (SDSU, 3-1). This will mark the fourth time in the last six seasons their paths have crossed, with the Aztecs winning two of the last three encounters. In their last meeting, the Aztecs claimed the first Division I postseason victory in school history in a 67-62 win in the first round of the NIT on March 19, 2003. The last two games in the series have been decided in overtime and the last three games between the teams have been decided by a total of 11 points. In the Aztecs 2,097-game history, SDSU has never had three consecutive games against the same opponent go to overtime.

San Diego State owns a comfortable 30-13 record against UC Santa Barbara in games played in America's Finest City. The Aztecs have won six straight meetings in San Diego, dating back to a 76-73 victory by the Gauchos in Peterson Gym on Feb. 19, 1976.

San Diego State-UC Santa Barbara: The Series

► The teams are meeting for the 85th time overall with the Aztecs owning a 51-33 series advantage. With 84 previous meetings, the Gauchos represent the Aztecs second most common opponent, trailing only Fresno State (99 meetings). The 51 victories against UC Santa Barbara tie for the most Aztec wins against any opponent.

► San Diego State owns a 30-13 advantage in games played in San Diego. The Aztecs have won six straight in America's Finest City, with the last Gaucho victory on Aztec soil coming on Feb. 19, 1976 (73-76). The average margin of victory during that time span is 15.3 points.

► This is the first of two games between the teams this season, with the Aztecs traveling to The Thunderdome on Dec. 4 (15 days from opening night). It will mark the first time the teams have met twice in the same season since the 1977-78 campaign when the Aztecs defeated the Gauchos three times (twice during the PCAA regular season and once in the conference tournament). The last time the Aztecs met a non-Mountain West Conference opponent twice in the same season was in the 2002-03 season when SDSU faced Texas Tech during the regular season and the second round of the postseason NIT.

► Although the teams have met 84 previous times, UCSB and San Diego State have played just seven times since 1978. Of late, the schools have met a bit more frequently, with this game marking the fourth meeting in the last six seasons.

► San Diego State has won 10 of the last 12 games between the teams but the two Southern California schools have split the last four meetings.

► The series has been one full of streaks, with the Aztecs claiming 13 straight wins over the Gauchos from Feb. 9, 1934 to Feb. 17, 1940, the second longest win streak against any opponent in SDSU history. UCSB counters with a 13-game series win streak from Jan. 16, 1960 until Jan. 13, 1972, the second longest series losing streak in Aztec history.

► Last Meeting: San Diego State recorded its first Division I postseason victory in school history with a 67-62 victory over UCSB in the first round of the NIT on March 19, 2003.

Senior Tony Bland, who reached the 1,000-point plateau for his Aztec career, sent the game into an extra session by going the length of the floor and banking in a 17-foot shot with 1.9 seconds remaining. He ended the game with a team-high 17 points. Tommy Johnson and John Sharper are the only current Aztecs that played in the game. Johnson had 10 points and four rebounds in 25 minutes, while Sharper had three points and one assist in seven

Aztecs Enjoy Exhibition Success, Again

Despite substituting at liberty and a few nagging injuries, San Diego State ran its exhibition win streak to eight games with victories over Cal State San Bernardino (82-70) and Point Loma Nazarene (87-67). During those two games, the Aztecs were able to reverse a couple of the trends that proved to be fatal during last season. On the positive side, SDSU shot 48.0 percent from the field, 39.5 percent from three-point range and attempted 55 free throws. However, the Aztecs struggled from the free throw line (61.8 percent) and held a surprisingly small advantage in rebound margin (+4.0).

Individual tidbits from the two exhibition games:

► San Diego State's three returning starters from last season did not disappoint in the exhibition campaign. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter averaged 22.5 points and 7.0 rebounds while playing a total of just 50 minutes. Senior forward Chris Walton showed off his improved long-range shooting skills by connecting on 4-of-5 attempts from behind the line en route to average 16.0 points and 4.5 rebounds in 44 total minutes. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath, who has taken over the role of point guard for large stretches of time, averaged 9.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, but more impressively dished out 13 assists with a mere three turnovers in 49 minutes of action.

► The Aztecs got strong shooting from the field from their two leading scorers - sophomore Marcus Slaughter and senior Chris Walton. The two each cleared 62.5 percent field goal shooting and combined to connect on 28-of-41 attempts (68.3 percent) and an even more impressive 10-of-12 three-point field goal attempts (83.3 percent). The other 11 players on the team combined to connect on 32-of-84 attempts (38.1 percent) and were just 5-of-26 (19.2 percent from beyond the arc).

► San Diego State showed good ball handling skills, dishing out 41 assists with 26 turnovers in the two games. In fact, the Aztecs had almost as many steals (22) as turnovers (26).

► Senior center Chris Manker missed the second exhibition game due to a strained tendon in his left foot, but his performance in the first exhibition game should not be overlooked. Manker had eight points, five rebounds and four blocked shots in 20 minutes of action. A native of West Des Moines, Iowa, Manker also produced the best hockey plus/minus number of the contest, with a +20 rating.

► A trio of newcomers made noise during the two exhibition games. Junior center Mohamed Camara scored 16 points, and added nine rebounds and three blocked shots in 33 minutes of action. The projected starter at center made six of his nine attempts from the field. Freshman point guard Matt Thomas played 43 minutes of action and logged 14 points and four assists, while fellow freshman Tyler Smith had three points and three assists in 29 minutes.

Aztecs Look to Continue Cox Arena Magic

Cox Arena has become quite a home court advantage for the Aztecs during Steve Fisher's rebuilding project at San Diego State. The Aztecs, now entering their eighth season at the 12,414-seat on-campus venue, have recorded at least 11 home victories in each of the past four seasons. It is just the second time in school history that SDSU has won 11 home games in four straight seasons (1981-82 through 1984-85).

The numbers have even been better during the last three seasons, with SDSU posting a 34-13 record (72.3 percent). The Aztecs have been particularly hard on non-conference foes, winning 26 of their last 31 (83.9 percent) non-league games. During that span, two of the five losses have come at the hands of nationally-ranked opposition, making SDSU 25-3 against non-ranked non-conference foes since Dec. 9, 2000 (also subtract a non-conference win over 21st-ranked Fresno State during that time).

The Aztecs are 7-3 all-time against Big West opponents at Cox Arena, including a 2-0 record vs. UC Santa Barbara. San Diego State has won its last six home games against the Big West Conference, with the last defeat coming on Nov. 28, 1998, the year before Steve Fisher arrived on the Mesa, when Long Beach State posted a 75-70 victory over the SDSU.

Fisher Goes for Win Number 71

Steve Fisher is one victory away from moving into a tie for fifth place on the San Diego State all-time victory list. The coach with 254 career wins to his credit, can match the win total of SDSU's first varsity coach, C.E. Peterson with his next victory.

Peterson posted a record of 71-29 in his five seasons from 1920-21 through 1925-26. The Gymnasium, located directly west of Cox Arena, bears the name of Peterson, whose 71.0 winning percentage is still tops in school history. The basketball team played in the facility as recently as the 1996-97 season and the women's volleyball team currently calls the facility home.

Fisher will likely move into the top four positions before the end of the season. He needs just seven wins to match Tim Vezie's total of 77 wins accomplished from 1973-74 until 1978-79.

Season Opening Success

San Diego State opens its 84th season of basketball with a 52-31 record (62.7 percent) in season opening games. The Aztecs have won four of their last five openers and are now 17-17 (50.0 percent) in lidlifters during the Division I era.

Steve Fisher, as you might suspect, has enjoyed a little more success in season openers. The Aztec coach is 11-2 in his 13 season-opening games with two defeats coming to sixth-ranked Arizona (75-82) in the 1989 Tip-Off Classic and Eastern Washington (70-75) on Nov. 23, 2002.

Although Fisher is well known for his success in March, he has had an equally impressive resume during the season's opening month. He has posted a 23-13 record (63.9 percent) in the month of November and a near perfect 12-2 (85.7 percent) in home games during the Thanksgiving month.

Postseason Play, Guaranteed

Given Steve Fisher's track record, San Diego State's prospects of returning to the postseason for a third time in four seasons appears to be good. In his 12 full seasons, Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a squad he coached the previous season eight times. He has guided all eight of those teams to postseason play, including six of those squads to the NCAA Tournament. Those eight teams have combined to post a 20-5 record in postseason play, including two appearances in the NCAA Tournament championship game (1991 and 1992) and a championship in the NIT (1996).

- Some additional notes on Steve Fisher's success when returning at least three starters off a team he has coached.
- Is 8-for-8 in leading his team to the postseason. Six times he has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament.
- Has won at least one postseason game in six of those eight seasons and at least two games in five of those eight seasons.
- Averaged 22.6 wins in those eight seasons. In six of the eight years his teams have won at least 21 games.

Preseason Magazines Gives Aztecs Little Love

Most of the preseason magazines have picked the Aztecs to finish in the lower half of the Mountain West Conference standings and the MWC poll was no exception, picking the Aztecs to finish seventh; however, a pretty strong case can be made that San Diego State will have a successful 2004-05 season.

- San Diego State returns four starters and nine letterwinners (includes Travis Hanour who sat out last season due to injuries) from the 2003-04 season. The Aztecs return eight of their top nine scorers from last season.
- Steve Fisher is 8-for-8 in his career in taking teams to the postseason when returning at least three starters off a team he coached the previous season. Included in those eight postseason trips are six NCAA Tournament berths and an average total of 22.6 wins. The last time a Steve Fisher-coached team returned four starters was 2001-02, when Fisher guided the Aztecs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1985. Twice in his career, Fisher has returned at least three starters and at least nine letterwinners off a team he coached, both seasons he has led his team to the NCAA Tournament, posting a collective 56-14 record.
- San Diego State returns 77.0 percent of points, 74.2 percent of field goals, 99.4 percent of three-point field goals, 78.0 percent of free throws, 68.6 percent of rebounds, 91.3 percent of assists, 54.9 percent of blocked shots, 85.8 percent of steals and 81.9 percent of minutes from the 2003-04 season.
- The 2004-05 SDSU roster has played 538 games and made 161 starts. Nine players on the Aztec roster have played in at least 30 college games and five players have made at least 18 college starts. Last season, the Aztec roster (not counting Travis Hanour's total because he missed the season due to injury) entered the campaign with a total of 407 games

and 72 starts. In 2002-03 when San Diego State advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT, the Aztecs entered the campaign with 413 games and 152 starts of experience. In 2001-02 when the Aztecs claimed the Mountain West Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, San Diego State entered the season with 370 games and 194 starts.

► San Diego State was not that far away last season from making their third consecutive postseason appearance. Although the Aztecs finished 14-16 overall, they lost three games when they led with 59 seconds left, lost six games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games when they led with 13:48 or less remaining in regulation. Part of that can be explained by the fact that SDSU had just one scholarship senior (Aerick Sanders).

► San Diego State returns three players that earned all-Mountain West Conference recognition last season. Senior guard Wesley Stokes, sophomore guard Brandon Heath and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter are back for SDSU this season. This marks the first time in school history that three all-league performers return from an Aztec team. In fact, in the Mountain West Conference era, San Diego State has never returned two all-MWC performers the following season (2000-01 (0); 2001-02 (0); 2002-03 (1) Tony Bland; 2003-04 (0); 2004-05 (3) Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter, Wesley Stokes).

► San Diego State has two of the best underclassmen not only in the league, but also in the country in Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo was two of only four freshmen to earn all-league recognition last season. Heath and Slaughter combined to score 650 points and pull down 284 rebounds in their inaugural season.

► Another example of the stability of the Aztec program can be found by the number of players that have signed with San Diego State out of the prep ranks. Of San Diego State's 16-player roster, three are Division I transfers (Travis Hanour, Chris Manker and Wesley Stokes), two junior college players (Mohamed Camara and walk-on Jared Ines) and 11 players who signed with SDSU directly out of high school. Of the five newcomers, four signed with the Aztecs out of high school.

Captain Looks for 50th Career Win

Senior captain Chris Walton will be looking to play in his 50th career Aztec victory against UC Santa Barbara on Friday night. That would make him just the 14th player, since the 1975-76 season when complete data became available, to play in 50 career Aztec wins.

The all-time leader in the category is Leonard Allen, who helped lead San Diego State to 76 career victories from 1981-82 to 1984-85. Aerick Sanders ended his career last season with 61 wins, good for fourth place on the list.

Next on the active list is John Sharper with 28 wins, followed by Tommy Johnson with 26 victories.

No Freshmen Starters Expected

For the first time in three seasons, San Diego State will likely not have a starting freshman in the opening night lineup. In 2002, redshirt freshman Steve Sir started for the Aztecs, scoring nine points in 21 minutes of action. Last season, true freshman Brandon Heath had 12 points and four rebounds in 27 minutes.

Although Heath earned the start, it was Marcus Slaughter who came off the bench to steal the show. In just 19 minutes of action, Slaughter tallied 19 points on 7-of-9 shooting and added five rebounds. The 19 points matched Chris Webber for the highest scoring point total by a freshman in a season-opener under Steve Fisher.

This Program Keeps Building and Building

Steve Fisher and the Aztecs' journey from perennial basement dweller to a team that has made appearances in the postseason in two of the last three seasons is made all the more remarkable by the speed at which the turnaround was achieved.

Just five years ago in 1999-2000, the Aztecs won only five games, and four years ago in 2000-01, San Diego State finished seventh in the conference.

As if going from 5-23 in 1999-00 to 14-14 in 2000-01 was not enough, in the 2001-02 season the Aztecs went 21-12 for the second-highest win total in the school's Division I history and the 2002-03 Aztecs returned to the postseason and finished 16-14.

▶ San Diego State is now 51-42 (54.8 percent) since the beginning of the 2001-02 season and 65-56 (53.7 percent) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. Remember, the Aztecs averaged 9.8 wins per season in the 15 years from 1986-87 through 1999-00, with just one winning season during that stretch. In those 15 years, SDSU was 147-281 (34.3 percent) and failed to advance to postseason play.

▶ San Diego State is now 19-39 in its last 58 road/neutral games since the beginning of the 2001-02 campaign. Those 19 road/neutral wins equals the total from the 91 road/neutral games prior to the 2000-01 season when they went 19-72.

Below is a look at the Aztecs' records since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. The record on the right shows how many games it took San Diego State to win the same number of games prior to the 2000-01 season.
