San Diego State Aztecs (0-2, 0-0 MWC) at UC Riverside Highlanders (1-1, 0-0 Big West)

► **The Records:** San Diego State heads to UC Riverside Saturday still in search of its first win of 2005-06. SDSU dropped its home opener Tuesday, falling in an all out battle with city rival USD, 67-57, in front of nearly a thousand fans at Cox Arena.

The Aztecs meet the Highlanders (1-1) for the second straight year, but the first time in Riverside since 1983. UC Riverside has split each of its first two contests this season, having beat USD, 63-56, back on Nov. 18, and falling to Pepperdine, 51-44, on Tuesday in Malibu.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 151-85 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 232-150.

► **UC Riverside Head Coach John Margaritis:** Margaritis is in his second year with the Highlanders. He boasts a school record of 17-14 and an overall head coaching record of 127-94 in eight seasons.

► **UCR Series History:** San Diego State leads 2-1 (Last: UCR def. SDSU at Cox Arena, 65-53, on Dec. 20, 2004).

SDSU Women's Basketball Begins Three-Game Road Swing Saturday at UC Riverside

The San Diego State women's basketball team plays its first of three straight road games Saturday against UC Riverside at the Highlanders' Student Recreation Center, beginning at 1:30 p.m. The Aztecs are looking for their first victory of the season, after dropping their first two outings at Wichita State last week and at home versus the University of San Diego on Tuesday.

SDSU and UCR tangle for the second consecutive season and the fourth time overall. The Aztecs will look to avenge last year's 65-53 loss and are making the short journey to the northeast for the first time since 1983. The trip to Riverside is the first of three straight weeks of Saturday road contests before the Aztecs return home for five-consecutive home games to round out the 2005 calendar year.

USD Outlasts SDSU In 2005-06 Home Opener, 67-57

The University of San Diego went on an 8-0 with just over a minute remaining to hand the San Diego State women's basketball team a 67-57 loss Tuesday night in front of 971 fans at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 0-2 on the season, while the Toreros claimed their fourth straight in the series and improved to 1-2 in 2005-06.

SDSU senior forward **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** led the team in scoring and rebounding for

the second consecutive outing, recording her first career double-double with 19 points and 10 boards.

Strawberry was helped offensively by junior center **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)**, who logged 10 of her 12 points in the second half and added six rebounds, three blocks and three steals in just 25 minutes. Sophomore forward **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)** finished with nine points and a team-high five assists.

San Diego State opened the game by leading by as many as five points on three occasions, with the latest coming at 14-9. USD rebounded to knot the score at 14 apiece and took its first lead on the first of two free throws by Amanda Rego at 15-14. The two squads traded leads six more times before the half, as the Toreros used an 8-2 run to go into the locker room up by five at 31-26.

USD continued that scoring streak into the second half, building a pair of double-figure advantages at 40-28 and 46-35. The Aztecs, however, battled back with a 16-2 run to reclaim the lead on four straight points by Strawberry at 51-48. Back-to-back USD three-pointers by Polly Dong and Lindsay Helvey put the lead back in the visitors' hands, which they would not relinquish, shutting out the SDSU offense with an 8-0 run in the final 1:18 to gain the 67-57 victory.

After shooting 40.7 percent at the free-throw line in the opener at Wichita State, the Aztecs bounced back to post a 93.8 performance from the charity stripe, making 15 of their 16 attempts. SDSU also owned the advantage on the boards by a slim plus-three margin (33-30), but USD shot 46.2 percent from the field and went to the free-throw line 36 times, making 27 of them.

Other USD Notes

The Aztecs have gone to the line a combined 43 times less than their opponent in the two games this season, including a 36-16 margin versus the Toreros... Four different Aztecs have scored in double-figures in at least one game so far in 2005-06... SDSU has reached double-figures in both steals and assists in each of the last four contests, dating back to last season... SDSU owned a small plus-three advantage on the boards, marking the first time the Aztecs have won the rebounding battle since Dec. 18, 2004, versus Cal State Fullerton... SDSU has forced more than 25 turnovers in each of its first two games.

Burns Brings Them Back

The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena last Tuesday. The home attendance figure is the largest since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.

At The Stripe

After making just over 40 percent of their free throws in the season-opener, the Aztecs bounced back to shoot 93.8 percent at the line versus USD, making 15 of 16 attempts. The 93.8 percent free-throw percentage is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

Straw For Three

With her 1-for-3 performance from beyond the arc against USD, Aztec senior Michelle Strawberry is now tied for 10th all-time in career three-point attempts with 148, matching Angela Walker's total from 1994-96.

Strawberry is just one away from also entering the SDSU career top 10 in three-pointers made, trailing Jurate Zukauskaitė, who hit 46 from 1996-97.

Double Trouble

Michelle Strawberry logged her first career double-double versus USD with 19 points and 10 rebounds. It is the first double-double by an Aztec since Ashley Cheesman had 15 points and 11 boards against Washington State on Dec. 11, 2004. Cheesman was the only SDSU player to reach double-figures in rebounds in a game a year ago, doing so on two occasions (also vs. Air Force).

Berry Good

Michelle Strawberry proved that her 29 points in the season-opener were no fluke, pouring in a game-high 19 points versus USD. Strawberry's combined 48 points in back-to-back games are the most by an Aztec since Jodi Nowlin-Tres also scored 48 in the final two contests of the 1996-97 campaign. Nowlin-Tres tallied 24 points in the WAC tournament final against Utah and then scored 24 in the NCAAs versus Oregon.

Dating back to last season, Strawberry has scored 10 or more points in seven straight outings and in 15 of her last 18 games.

California Girls

The Aztecs will play each of their next eight games in the state of California, starting with road trips to UC Riverside, UC Davis and Pepperdine. The three-game road swing will be followed by a five-game homestand, which is the longest homestand since SDSU played six straight in Peterson Gym in the fall of 1994.

After returning from Wichita State on Nov. 19, the 2005-06 Aztecs will be in California for 44 consecutive days before having to leave for Colorado State for the conference opener on Jan. 4.

Nkele is from San Diego and worked with Aztec head coach Beth Burns when she was a prep and Burns ran her own fitness and basketball instruction business, BBHoops... Freshman

Seyram Gbewonyo is also an offensive threat, averaging 12.5 points a game.

2004 - UC Riverside

The visiting UC Riverside Highlanders broke open a tight game with a 22-8 closing run in the final five minutes to claim a 65-53 win over San Diego State at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-4 overall, while the Highlanders improved to 3-4, following their first contest in the last 15 days.

Senior Lindsey Casey and freshman Ashley Cheesman led San Diego State with 12 points each. Casey also added a team-best seven rebounds and four steals, while all nine Aztecs to see minutes scored at least two points.

SDSU was outshot from the field, 47.9 percent to 31.8, and outrebounded by a 45-26 margin. Despite those numbers, the youthful Aztecs held a 45-43 lead with five minutes left. SDSU, however, would score just six points over the next 4:30 as UC Riverside claimed the game with the decisive closing run.

SDSU forced the visitors into 26 turnovers, including 15 in the first half, to have a chance down the stretch. In the decisive second half, the Highlanders shot 57.7 percent from the floor and for the game, UCR was also on target from the free-throw line, connecting on 15 of its 17 attempts.

Agy Frankovits led UCR with 18 points, while Casandra Reeves added 17.

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.

- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).

- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.

Pick Eight

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been predicted to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 13, at the league's basketball media day in Salt Lake City, Utah. The voting panel consisted of the league's nine head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs, who finished tied for seventh with Air Force in the 2004-05 regular season, earned 45 votes from the panel, 13 more than the Falcons (32) and 45 behind Wyoming (90) for seventh place.

Utah, which tied for the 2004-05 regular season crown with New Mexico, was tabbed as the clear-cut preseason favorite, marking the third time the Utes have been picked to finish atop the conference. Utah received 23-of-26 first-place votes and 214 total points. New Mexico had two first-place votes and finished second with 180 points, followed by MWC newcomer TCU with one first-place vote and 164 points. UNLV (137 pts.) placed fourth, followed by Colorado State (117 pts.), BYU (107 pts.), Wyoming, SDSU and Air Force.

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signings Nov. 9 of four high schools seniors and one junior college sophomore to national letters of intent. Center Kendra Calvin (Perris, Calif.), forward Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.), guard Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.), forward Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) and forward Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.) will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2006.

"We are pleased to announce our first recruiting class for 2006-07," said Burns, who is in her second stint as head coach at SDSU. "Through the efforts of many, we know that we've signed a terrific foundation of excellent student-athletes, who are excited about the opportunity to be an Aztec."

only Aztec to start all 28 contests a year ago, averaging 10.3 points per game, including a team-leading 12.9 in league outings. Strawberry is also SDSU's top returning three-point threat, converting 22 of her 33 threes during MWC play.

Besides Strawberry, sophomore **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** was in the starting five 20 times at the point guard position, averaging six points a game and tallying a team-best 59 assists. Senior Veronica Shaw also started 16 times in 2004-05, and is the team's lone player with three years of collegiate experience.

Other letterwinners returning include sophomore forward **Jordie Smith (Fort Collins, Colo.)** and senior walk-on **Lindsay Goldblatt (West Hills, Calif.)**, while **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** and **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** will be in the line-up after redshirting a year ago due to injury.

Noting The Newcomers

Five freshmen and four transfers will wear the scarlet and black for the first time in 2005-06, as newcomers account for more than half of the Aztec roster.

One of the team's most talented players, sophomore forward Shanna Demus, sat out last year after transferring from Cal State Los Angeles. Demus averaged 16.3 points and 6.3 rebounds with the Golden Eagles to earn conference freshman-of-the-year honors and should see a lot of minutes in her first competitive season at SDSU.

Three newcomers signed letters of intent in the fall of 2004, including two San Diego-area natives in point guard Tamika Lipford and center **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif.)**. Lipford should see immediate playing time in her first season, while Green will provide depth in the front court.

A third fall signee, combo guard **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, was her league's player of the year as both a junior and senior.

Burns looked to fill an immediate need in the front court with the addition of freshman forward **Jana Heinrich (Fischbach, Germany)** and junior center Desiree Johnson during the spring signing period.

Johnson has two years of community college experience under her belt, averaging 13.7 points and 8.1 rebounds as a sophomore to earn first team all-South Coast Conference honors. Her power and strength in the middle should complement Heinrich's inside-outside game.

Also joining the Aztecs are walk-ons freshman **Brittany Santos (Paso Robles, Calif.)** and junior transfers **Ijlal Barnes (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Taryn Milburn (Moorpark, Calif.)**, who will provide key depth off the bench if called upon.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2005-06

Offense - Half of SDSU's top six scorers from the 2004-05 squad return this season, including senior Michelle Strawberry, who averaged a team-best 12.9 points per league game. Guards Kate Eveland and Veronica Shaw chipped in 6.0 and 5.1 points per game, respectively, but the remaining returnees combined to average just 2.1 points per outing.

Defense - San Diego State experienced extremes on the defensive side of the ball a year ago. The Aztecs led the conference in both steals and turnover margin, but on the flip side, struggled on the boards.

Returnees contributed over half of the Aztecs' 281 steals, including 52 by Eveland and 50 by Shaw. Freshmen Tamika Lipford and LaSandra Dixon, as well as transfer Shanna Demus add instant foot speed and athleticism to the line-up.

The Aztecs will look for immediate help in the rebounding department from front court newcomers Desiree Johnson, Jana Heinrich and Audrey Green, as well as redshirt sophomore Erin Jackson.

The Schedule: The most dramatic change in SDSU's 2005-06 schedule comes with the addition of a ninth team, TCU, to the Mountain West Conference ... league games will be played on Wednesdays or Thursdays and on Saturdays from Jan. 5 through March 4, but will no longer feature the travel partner format ... SDSU opens league play on Jan. 5, the earliest the Aztecs have played a conference contest since 1997-98 ... just two of the 10 non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule (USD, UC Riverside) ... five schools - Auburn, Boise State, Loyola (Md.), Wichita State, UC Davis - are first-time Aztec opponents ... the Aztecs will face schools from as many as eight different conferences ... SDSU plays host to a tournament for the first time since 2000.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 232-150 (.607). Her current SDSU record stands at 151-85 (.640).
