San Diego State Head Coach Brian Dutcher

Opening Statement:

"We played a good first half. I thought our point guard play was really good. The fact that Darrion and Lamont had 12 assists and only one turnover was great. When they play like that, when they take care of the ball and get everybody involved, we are hard to guard, so they did a really good job. The beauty is, there's something to learn from every game, we weren't perfect. We made a lot of mistakes. But it's a lot better to learn from a win than learn from a loss. So, the key is we can't get full of ourselves because we are 3-0. We have to know it's a long journey, we have to get better, and we will start that process again when we get back into San Diego."

On frustrating Stanford's offense:

"We guard hard. That's the one thing if teams get baskets on us, they usually deserve them. You know, I thought the one thing we didn't do well was rebound. We gave them a lot of second chance opportunities. We forced a lot more misses, but they did a good job on the offensive glass, and that's something we need to clean up. We are too big and strong to give that many second chance opportunities."

On Matt Bradley:

"Sometimes they don't go in and he's just got to keep his confidence up, because I have confidence in him. I've not lost one bit of confidence in Matt. I watched them all last year. I watched him for 30 some games with us and I know what he can do, and he'll do it soon enough. He's just got to fight through a little slump, and all players go through it. But he'll play his way out of it, and I'll try to run some plays to help him."

On the depth of the team:

"I've got three guys that can play but haven't been on the floor yet. Elijah Saunders, Miles Byrd, and Demarshay Johnson Jr. they can all play, and I feel awful I haven't got them a minute yet, but these kids can all play. I've got a deep roster and I have to take advantage of that."
