Played a career-high 20 minutes vs. Cal Poly (12-13-10) and corralled six rebounds, blocked a career-best two shots and added two points and one assist... Went a perfect 3-for-3 from the field en route to six points and added three rebounds vs. Occidental College (12-31-10)... Had two rebounds and an assist in only four minutes at TCU (1-5-11)... Hit his first career three-point field goal and free throw en route to four points vs. Wyoming (1-29-11). Also had one assist and blocked a shot in 15 minutes vs. the Cowboys... Scored three points in an effective three minutes at Colorado State (2-2-11)... Had two rebounds and one assist vs. TCU (2-5-11)... In just 17 minutes vs. Utah (2-8-11), he produced his first career double-double with 13 points (4-5 FG, 2-3 3FG, 3-5 FT) and 10 rebounds. He also had a career-high two assists and one steal vs. the Utes... Finished with six points and four rebounds in 17 minutes off the bench at Wyoming (3-1-11)... Knocked down both free-throw attempts and threw down a dunk vs. Colorado State (3-5-11)... In just 11 minutes off the bench vs. Utah (3-10-11) in the Mountain West Conference quarterfinals, he knocked down a career-high three three-point field goals en route to nine points. He also added a career-high two steals vs. the Utes... Had another productive day off the bench at UNLV (3-11-11) with seven points in eight minutes in the semifinals of the MWC Championship... Played two minutes vs. Northern Colorado (3-17-11) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament... 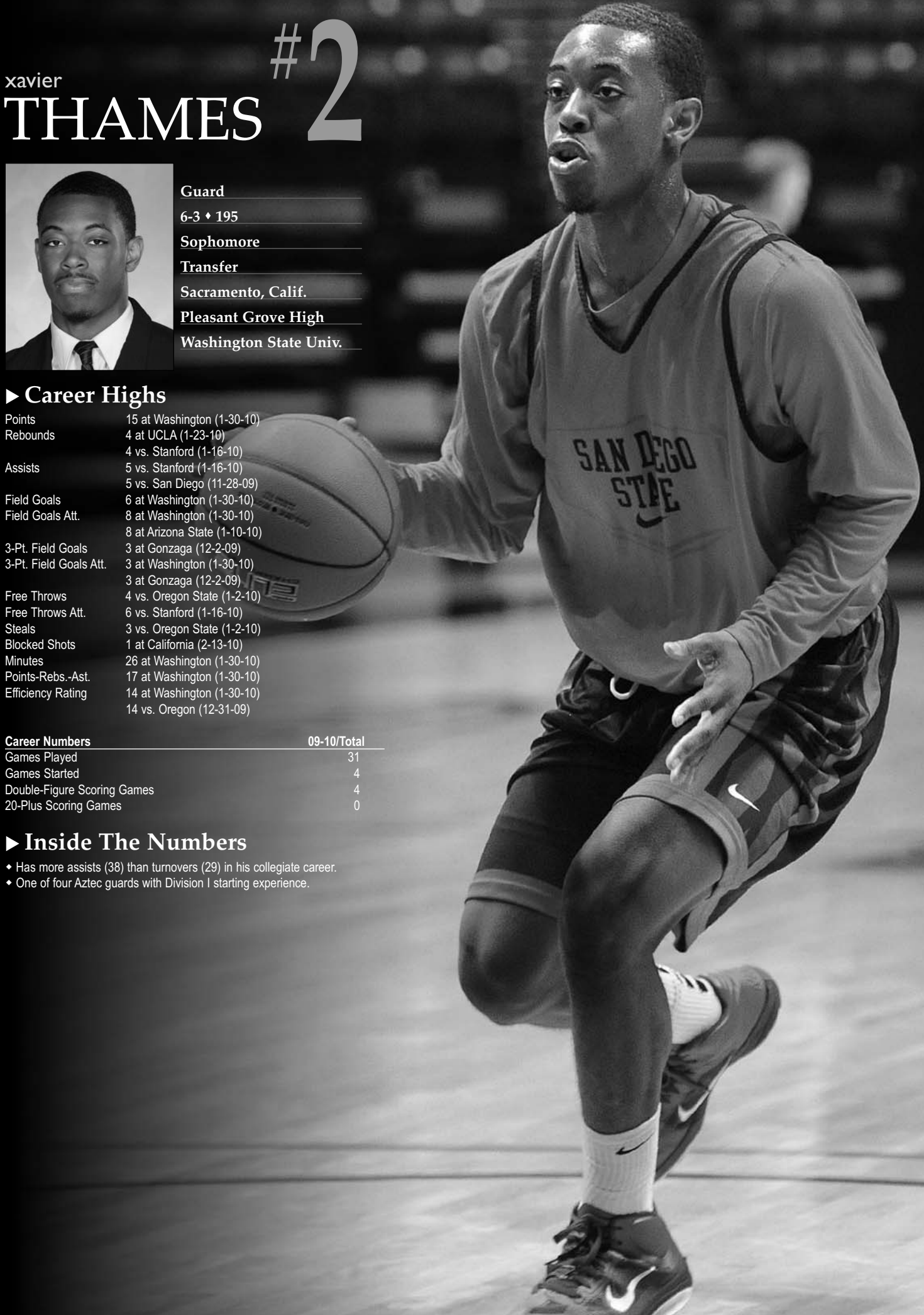

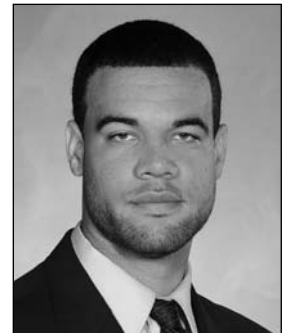

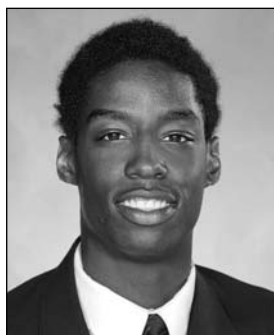
