Streaks Snapped

- 16-game win streak at Viejas Arena (was the seventh-longest active streak in the country)
- 9-game Mountain West win streak at Viejas Arena
- 8-game Mountain West regular-season win streak
- 6-game overall win streak
- 3-game win streak vs. New Mexico at Viejas Arena

Team Notes

- San Diego State drops to 32-2 in its last 34 home games, 59-6 in its last 65 home contests and 76-10 under Brian Dutcher at home.
- SDSU drops to 27-4 at Steve Fisher Court since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- San Diego State drops to 19-2 in its last 21 MW home contest since Jan. 1, 2021.
- The Aztecs have still won 13 of their last 15 MW regular-season contests.
- SDSU falls to 132-44 (.750) under Brian Dutcher
- After shooting a combined 50.7 percent (34-for-67) in its previous five games from 3-point range, San Diego State shot 25.0 percent tonight (6-for-24).
- The Aztecs shoot a season-low 52.4 percent from the free-throw line (previous low was 54.5 percent vs. Occidental on Dec. 2).
- SDSU drops to 74-24 in its last 98 games played in January.

Series Notes

San Diego State drops to 43-49 overall against New Mexico in the all-time series, including a 15-8 record in the Viejas Arena.

- As a nationally ranked team, San Diego State falls to 6-5 against New Mexico, including a 4-2 mark in Viejas Arena as a ranked team against the Lobos.
- The Aztecs drop to 6-2 against New Mexico in Viejas Arena since the start of the 2012-13 campaign.

Game Flow

- Keshad Johnson scored the first bucket of the game an alley-oop dunk with the assists to Lamont Butler at the 19:18 mark. It was
 the second straight game Johnson led off with an alley-oop dunk.
- San Diego State's 10-point half time deficit was its largest at home since it trailed by 15 points to Brigham Young on Dec. 18, 2020, a total of 36 games.
- SDSU had an assists on four of its first five baskets in the second half.
- SDSU led for only 1:26 of the game, but rallied from an 11-point first-half deficit to take a 49-48 lead with 9:23 left in the second
 half. New Mexico followed with a 12-point scoring run and San Diego State never got closer than four points for the rest of the
 game.

Player Notes

Matt Bradley - 14 points, 4 rebounds, 5 assists

Scored in double figures for the 10th time this season and 107th time of his career (134 career games)... Led SDSU in scoring for the eighth time this season and has now led his team (Cal included) in scoring 70 times for his career... Hit multiple 3-pointers in a game for the seventh time this season and 72nd time in his career.

Adam Seiko — 13 points, 4-of-6 FG, 3-of-5 3PFG, 3 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal

Reached double figure scoring for the third time this season and the 12th time in his college career (SDSU dropped to 10-2 when he scores in double figures).

Keshad Johnson — 10 points, 5-of-6 FG, 7 rebounds, 1 assist, 2 steals

Scored in double figures for the sixth time this season and the 18th time in his career... SDSU fell to 15-3 when he scores in double figures... Tied his season high with seven rebounds... Tied a season high with five field goals.
