





Aztec Basketball Takes On Host No. 17/20 Texas In NCAA First Round Sunday

The San Diego State women's basketball team earned its second consecutive NCAA tournament bid and eighth in program history, as the 11th-seeded Aztecs will take on the sixth-seeded Texas Longhorns in the first round on Sunday, March 21, at the Frank Erwin Center in Austin, Texas, beginning at 6:11 p.m. CT (4:11 p.m. PT).

The winner of the SDSU-Texas game will play the winner of the No. 3 West Virginia vs. No. 14 Lamar game on Tuesday, March 23, at 8:30 p.m. CT (6:30 p.m. PT) for the chance to advance to the Sweet 16 and a spot in the Memphis regional, March 27 and 29.

San Diego State earned an automatic bid to the tournament, after winning the Mountain West Conference championship last Saturday in Las Vegas with a 70-60 overtime victory over Utah. Fellow league member TCU garnered an at-large selection and as a No. 9 seed will take on No. 8 Dayton in Knoxville, Tenn. This is the sixth straight NCAA tournament in which the MWC is represented by multiple teams and the 10th time overall in the conference's 12-year history.

The Aztecs will meet the Longhorns for the third time in school history and the second consecutive season. A year ago, SDSU knocked off then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, in the championship game of the Surf 'N Slam tournament in San Diego on Dec. 30, 2008. The victory was the Aztecs' first over an Associated Press top 25 team in 14 years. The Longhorns, who boast a 22-10 overall record and are ranked as high as 17th nationally, claimed the first-ever meeting between the two sides in 1995 in Austin (69-58).

This is the fourth time in program history that the Aztecs have been to back-to-back NCAA tournaments, doing so in 1984 and 1985, and making three consecutive appearances from 1993-95. SDSU won its first round NCAA contest a year ago as a No. 10 seed, upsetting No. 7 DePaul, 76-70, before falling to No. 2 Stanford.

Sunday's game, as well as Tuesday's potential second-round contest, will be televised live on ESPN2. Chris Elio will have the call from Austin on XTRA Sports 1360 AM. Live stats will also be available on goaztecs.com.

San Diego State Tournament Tidbits

► San Diego State has advanced to the postseason 10 times, including to the NCAA tournament on eight occasions. The Aztecs also made a trip to the WNIT in 1989, getting to the championship game, and was a part of the AIAW tournament in 1981.

► SDSU made its first trip to the NCAAs in 12 years last season, defeating DePaul, before falling to second-ranked and eventual Final Four participant Stanford in San Diego.

► The last time the Aztecs played an NCAA road game was in 1997, when the team traveled to Knoxville, Tenn.,

and fell in the first round to Oregon, 80-68.

► The last time SDSU played an NCAA game on its opponent's home floor was in 1993, when the Aztecs lost at Georgia, 85-68. SDSU is 1-1 overall in such outings with a win at UNLV in 1985.

► SDSU's eight all-time NCAA appearances tie for the 36th-most among the 64-team field with James Madison. The Aztecs are one of 38 schools to also have made the 2009 tournament.

► SDSU has played six of its 11 all-time NCAA contests on its home floor, including twice a year ago. The Aztecs have never played an NCAA game in the state of Texas.

► San Diego State is playing a current member of the Big 12 Conference for the second time in NCAA tournament action, as the team faced Texas A&M in the second round in 1994. The Aztecs have never faced either West Virginia or Lamar in the NAAs.

► Texas will be SDSU's 11th all-time NCAA foe with Oregon being the only school that the Aztecs have played on more than one occasion.

► Of the 64 teams in this year's NCAA bracket, San Diego State has played five of its 31 contests against these teams. The Aztecs are 2-3 overall with wins over TCU and UC Riverside.

► This year's NCAA tournament is the seventh for Aztec head coach Beth Burns, including six at SDSU and the other at Ohio State (1999).

At Stake For State

► The Aztecs will be looking for their second consecutive NCAA first-round victory and fifth overall in eight all-time outings. SDSU has a current 4-3 program record in its first game of an NCAA tournament, advancing to the second round in 1984, 1985, 1994 and 2009.

► SDSU will try to secure its first NCAA win away from home since beating UNLV back in 1985. The Aztecs are 1-4 on the road all-time.

► The Aztecs are 4-7 overall in the NAAs entering Sunday's contest.

► Head coach Beth Burns can capture her third NCAA victory in nine tries.

► Eight of 10 players on the Aztecs' current active roster have appeared in an NCAA tournament contest, including junior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)**, who played four games for Baylor from 2007-08, before sitting out last year after transferring.

In addition, senior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** was a member of the 2006 Cal team that advanced to The Big Dance, but she did not log any minutes due to injury.

SDSU Travel/Media Information

SDSU will work out on campus on Wednesday and Thursday, leading up to its departure to Austin on Friday morning.

The Aztecs' time slot at the Erwin Center on Saturday is 1:05 to 2:05 p.m. CT. This is the only practice that is open to both the public and the media. The remainder of practices/shootarounds are closed to both groups per NCAA rules.

All interviews with SDSU head coach Beth Burns and players prior to Friday must be arranged in advance through the Aztec media relations office. On Saturday, SDSU's press conference time is 12:20-12:50 p.m. CT.

Last Time Out: SDSU Wins MWC Title

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Utah 12-2 in overtime to cap a dramatic rally, giving the Aztecs their first Mountain West Conference tournament title with a 70-60 victory at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. SDSU claimed the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, improving to 21-10 overall and avenging last year's loss to the Utes in the same MWC championship contest.

Aztec seniors **Jené Morris** and **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** combined to score 43 of the team's 70 points, including 16 of the final 22, and also chipped in 12 assists and five steals together. Junior **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** had 10 points and a team-best seven rebounds and three blocks and classmate **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** tallied three steals.

San Diego State got off to a quick start, jumping ahead by nine points twice, including at the 14:31 mark. Utah would eventually catch up and take its first advantage of the afternoon only four minutes later at 17-16. Five ties and six lead changes later, the Utes headed into the locker room up 34-33 on a last-second 3-point heave by Kalee Whipple.

Utah was up by as many as eight points in the second half, including at 56-48 with four minutes left. From there, the SDSU defense proved stifling, limiting the Utes to only two points - both from the free throw line - as the Aztecs tied the game at 58 on a basket by Coco Davis with 1:04 remaining to send the game into overtime.

San Diego State dominated the extra time, scoring first on a rebound basket by **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** and forcing Utah into four turnovers and four missed shots from the field. The Aztecs converted two of those giveaways into points and went on to outscore the Utes 12-2 to come away with the win.

Other Utah Game Notes

► The overtime contest was the second of the tournament and third in MWC championship history, but the first in a title game.

► The Aztecs are 20-20 all-time in conference tournament games and are now 3-3 in conference tournament title contests.

► San Diego State is the third No. 3 seed at the MWC tournament to win the championship ... The No. 3 seed is 3-0 all-time in MWC finales.

Conference Champs!

San Diego State earned its first MWC title on Saturday with a thrilling 70-60 overtime victory over Utah. The Aztecs advanced to their third-straight conference championship game, but lost in both 2008 and 2009, falling by a combined eight points to New Mexico and Utah, respectively.

Prior to 2008, SDSU had gone 0-8 in the eight previous MWC tournament appearances, never getting out of the first round, and now boast a 6-2 mark over the last three seasons.

The league tourney title is the third in school history. The Aztecs won the Western Athletic Conference championship in 1994 and 1997. Ironically, the team's most recent conference title in 1997, was also against Utah (56-50) at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas.

Davis, Morris All-Tourney

The SDSU senior guard tandem of Quenese Davis and Jené Morris were both named to the Mountain West Conference Championship all-tournament squad. Davis was selected as the MVP, while it was the third-straight selection for Morris.

Davis is the third Aztec to garner tournament MVP honors, joining Christina Murguia (1994) and Jodi Nowlin-Tres (1997). Davis led the team in scoring in two of the three games, including 22 in the championship contest with Utah. She averaged 18.7 points and also chipped in 12 assists, five steals, 13 rebounds and shot 55.6 percent from beyond the arc. It is Davis' first career selection to the MWC all-tournament squad.

Morris, meanwhile, set a MWC championship record for most steals with 12 in the three outings. She also scored the most points of any player in the tournament with her 28-point outburst vs. BYU. Morris had 21 points in the finale with Utah and contributed a team-best 14 assists, while shooting 90 percent at the stripe.

The pair was joined by Utah's Kalee Whipple and Taryn Wicijowski and Wyoming's Hillary Carlson.

Morris is the fourth player in conference history to be named to the all-tournament team on three occasions, joining BYU's Erin Thorn (four times), Utah's Kim Smith (three times) and New Mexico's Dionne Marsh (three times).

Awards Part II

For the second year in a row, guard Jené Morris was named one of 52 regional finalists for the NCAA Division I State Farm Coaches' All-America Basketball team, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced Tuesday. Morris was among just four players selected in Region 7, which includes teams in the Mountain West, Big Sky and Western Athletic Conferences.

The State Farm Coaches' All-America Team selection committee will review all 52 regional candidates and cut the list to 40 finalists on March 23. The 40 finalists will all be in the running for selection to the 10-member State Farm Coaches' All-America Team.

A year ago, Morris earned honorable mention All-America accolades, becoming just the third All-American in program history.

Oh-Overtime

San Diego State played its second overtime game of

2009-10, coming out ahead following the extra period for the first time since beating Cal Poly, 70-68, on Dec. 7, 2006.

The Aztecs played their first overtime game in three years earlier this season on Dec. 8, against Pepperdine, falling on a last-second basket to the Waves, 62-61.

The last time SDSU played multiple overtime contests was in 2006, when the team beat both Cal Poly and Wichita State in back-to-back games.

Rolling 20s

San Diego State seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris scored 20 or more points in the same game for the second time this season on Saturday against Utah.

Davis posted a career high for an MWC tournament game with a team-best 22 points. Morris, meanwhile, recorded her sixth 20-point scoring game in eight career MWC tourney contests with 21.

Morris had 32 points and Davis contributed 25 in a near upset of No. 5/6 Notre Dame back on Nov. 26 in the Virgin Islands.

Morris has 24 career 20-point scoring outings, while teammate Quenese Davis has 13, including seven this year.

Back-to-Back 20-Win Seasons

With the victory on Saturday, San Diego State has at least 21 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since the 1994-95 team won 24 and the 1993-94 squad won 26.

SDSU has posted 13, 20-win campaigns in school history with six coming under head coach Beth Burns.

Success Shooting

SDSU has shot at least 40 percent from the field in 24 of its 31 games, topping the 45 mark 14 times, including posting a 54.5 percentage in the MWC finals vs. Utah. The Aztecs are 13-2 when making at least 45 percent and are 8-0 when converting at least 50 percent.

The Aztecs are first in the MWC in shooting percentage at 44.7 and 23rd nationally. If the season were to end today, that mark would be the program's best since the 1995-96 squad shot 45.6 percent.

On Top Of Turnovers

One of the biggest keys to the Aztecs' success at the MWC tournament and during their current six-game win streak is limiting their turnovers.

SDSU averaged only 13.7 giveaways per game in the three outings last week, after entering the event with a 16.3 average. Over the last six games, the Aztecs have

yet to reach the 20-mark and have 15 or fewer five times, including four straight.

The team has committed over 20 turnovers in eight of its 10 losses and is 15-2 when it has fewer than 20 giveaways.

We're A Steal

Paced by the top two players in conference history, San Diego State has record double-figures in steals in four of its last five games and 16 times overall in 2009-10.

On the other side, Aztec opponents have not recorded 10 steals in each of the last eight outings.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Texas will mean:

►SDSU advances to the NCAA second round for the second year in a row and its fifth time in program history ... The Aztecs are 5-7 in all-time NCAA tournament games and improve to 5-3 in first-round contests.

►SDSU improves to 2-1 in NCAA games played at an opponent's arena and 2-4 in NCAA contests played away from home.

►SDSU wins its seventh-straight game, matching its longest win streak of the season. The seven-game streak is the team's longest since the 1996-97 squad claimed 11 in a row.

►SDSU defeats its second AP top 25 team this season and logs its fourth top-25 win in the last two years.

►SDSU improves to 2-1 all-time against Texas, wins its second in a row and first in Austin.

►SDSU improves to 1-1 all-time in NCAA tournament games against current members of the Big 12 Conference.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 3-6 in NCAA outings.

Texas Tid-Bits

Texas has a 22-10 overall record and finished 10-6 in the Big 12 Conference to tie for fourth with Texas A&M ... The Longhorns lost in the conference tournament to the eventual champion Aggies 77-64 in their most recent outing on March 12 in Kansas City ... Oklahoma is the only common opponent this season between the two sides, as Texas split the two meetings and the Aztecs lost in the Virgin Islands ... Both Texas and SDSU played in the Virgin Islands last Thanksgiving, but were in different brackets and did not face one another ... The Longhorns are led by senior Brittainey Raven, who averages a team-best 14.6 points per game ... Kathleen Nash chips in 12 points an outing and pulling down a team-high 6.8 rebounds a contests ... Nash shoots an unbelievable 48.6 percent from beyond the arc, which ranks second nationally ... Sophomore Ashley Gayle boasts 102 blocked shots on the year, ranking her eighth nationally ... Texas averages 73.8 points a game to rank 23rd nationally ... The Longhorns fell in the NCAA first round a year ago and are making their 24th appearance overall, carrying a 32-22 record.

Flashback 2008: Aztecs Upset No. 4 Texas

►San Diego State defeated No. 4 and previously unbeaten Texas, 60-55, on Dec. 30, 2008, to win the San Diego Surf' N Slam tournament at Cox Arena.

►The victory was the Aztecs' first over an Associated Press ranked team in 14 years dating back to Dec. 28,

1994, when the team defeated No. 6 Alabama, 79-76, at a tournament at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y. The Aztecs had gone 0-16 against ranked foes prior to the win over the Longhorns.

►Jené Morris scored 24 points, including 15 in the second half, and tied a career best with eight steals to lead the Aztecs. Quenese Davis scored 13 and had five assists and five steals, while shooting 6-for-6 from the line.

►Texas had a pair of 10-point leads early in the second half, but Jennifer Layton-Bailes' layup with 1:51 left gave SDSU a 53-52 lead. The Aztecs were ahead by five with 19 seconds remaining, but Carla Cortijo, who led the Longhorns with 13 points, hit a 3-pointer that pulled Texas to within 57-55 with 11.9 seconds left.

►Paris Johnson then hit a free throw with 10.6 seconds left before Erika Arriaran missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game. Davis hauled in the rebound and was fouled, making both of her shots at the stripe to secure the 60-55 victory.

►Texas committed 23 turnovers and the Aztecs recorded 16 steals. SDSU won despite shooting only 33.9 percent from the field and limited the Longhorns to just 1-for-7 from beyond the arc.

Aztecs In The National Polls

Coming off its victory in the MWC championship game, San Diego State received two votes in the Associated Press top 25 earlier this week. It is the sixth time the Aztecs have garnered votes in that poll in 2009-10, including in the preseason.

SDSU has received votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll seven times this year, including as recently as Feb. 2. Overall, SDSU has been mentioned in both polls in the same week five times this year.

The Aztecs achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years on Nov. 23, when they were rated No. 23 in the AP Top 25 poll. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the AP Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

On Nov. 24, the team also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

SDSU vs. The Top 25

Texas, which is ranked 17th by the AP and 20th by the coaches, will be San Diego State's fifth game this season against a top 25 foe. The Aztecs previously played then No. 5/6 Notre Dame, No. 17/20 Oklahoma and TCU, which was ranked 22nd in the first meeting and No. 23/25 in the second game last month.

SDSU has also played 12 other contests vs. opponents receiving votes in either national preseason or regular season poll at least some point this season with Arizona, Auburn, BYU (three times), New Mexico (twice), South Carolina, Wake Forest and Wyoming (three times).

The Aztecs' win over No. 23/25 TCU was their first vs. an Associated Press top 25 team this season and their third in the last two years.

SDSU last beat a top 25 team on Jan. 21, 2009, when the Aztecs defeated No. 23 New Mexico, 57-52, in Albuquerque. That win was less than a month after the team's 60-55 upset of No. 4 Texas.

Morris Named Defensive Player of the Year, Bradley Newcomer of the Year

San Diego State senior Jené Morris was named Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year and junior Jessika Bradley was tabbed Newcomer of the Year. Morris also received first-team all-league accolades and garnered a spot on the MWC all-defensive squad for the second straight season, while junior Paris Johnson was a second-team all-conference honoree and senior Quenese Davis was a third-team pick.

Morris becomes just the second player in league history to earn defensive player-of-the-year honors twice, joining Wyoming's Hanna Zavec (2006, 2008). She is also the first Aztec to be a two-time first-team all-conference selection since Jodi Nowlin-Tres in 1996-97. Morris ranked first in MWC games in scoring with an 18.4 average, while topping the charts in steals with 2.9 per outing.

Bradley made an immediate impact after sitting out last season following two years at Baylor. She has started 30 of 31 games, ranks second in the conference in blocked shots (60) and leads SDSU in rebounding with 6.5 per contest. She is the first Aztec to ever be named the MWC's Newcomer of the Year.

A first-team choice in 2009, Johnson is a second-team selection this year after posting a conference-best 57.7 field-goal percentage in the 16 games. The San Diego High grad was third in blocked shots and ranked in the top 13 in both scoring and rebounding. Johnson was tabbed an honorable mention honoree as a freshman in 2008.

Davis received a spot on one of the Mountain West's three teams for the third time in her career. She led the league in assists (5.6) and ranked second in steals (2.5g) in conference-only games in 2010.

Morris Is SDSU's First MWC Scoring Leader

Senior Jené Morris became the first Aztec to lead the Mountain West Conference in scoring in league-only games, boasting an 18.4 average, 16 points more than her nearest rival.

The highest an SDSU player had finished previously was Jamey Cox, who was third in 2000. Morris was second-best with her fifth-place performance in both 2008 and 2009.

Morris, who averages 16.4 points per game overall to rank second, reached the 20-point mark in seven MWC games, including three of the final five, and 10 times overall in 2009-10. She scored in double-figures in 15 of 16 league outings and ended up with more than 15 in 12 MWC contests.

Davis Moves To No. 2 In MWC

Aztec senior Quenese Davis moved into the second slot in the MWC career record book in assists last Wednesday. She now has 661 to move past former New Mexico standout Mandi Moore, who had 651 from 2001-05.

Utah's Shona Thorburn owns the all-time record with 689 from 2002-06. Davis, meanwhile, is already the

SDSU career assists leader, boasting over 200 more than her nearest rival.

Going 1-2

San Diego State boasts the top two players in Mountain West Conference history in career steals. Jené Morris broke the record back on Jan. 24, and remains No. 1 with 286 steals, but in only three seasons. Fellow senior Quenese Davis moved into the No. 2 spot earlier this month and now has 269.

UNLV Sequoia Holmes held the previous record of 263 thefts from 2004-08.

Morris is on pace to lead the MWC in steals per game for the third year in a row, as she ranks first with a 3.0 average and has 27 more than any other player in the league in 2009-10. Morris' 286 steals rank fifth in school career history, while Davis' 269 are seventh.

Another Record For Q

Aztec senior Quenese Davis has played in every game since coming to The Mesa in 2006, logging minutes in 122 straight contests and starting 121 of those outings.

Davis has started 119 in a row dating back to her freshman year, which surpasses the previous school record for consecutive starts of 118 held by Michelle Suman (1991-95).

Davis appeared in her 100th career game vs. Long Beach State in December and is the first Aztec to reach the century mark since Kate Eveland in 2008.

Fourth And Counting ...

SDSU guard Jené Morris is only the fourth player in program history to record 1,400 career points.

Morris, who has 1,427 points, just passed Jessica Haynes for fourth place and is 18 in back of Chana Perry for third.

The co-captain is 17th in MWC history, despite playing only three seasons and is third among active players behind Utah's Kalee Whipple and UNM's Amy Beggin.

Three Of A Kind

Three San Diego State players have reached the 1,000-career point mark this season with the latest being junior center Paris Johnson, who met the milestone on Jan. 23 in the first half of the team's game at BYU.

Earlier this season, senior Jené Morris became the first current Aztec to record her 1,000th career point in her 67th game in the Red & Black with her first bucket against South Carolina on Nov. 28. Fellow co-captain Quenese Davis followed suit two games later vs. Pepperdine, reaching the milestone on a second-half jumper in her 99th career outing.

Prior to this year, the last Aztec to reach the 1,000-

career point mark was Jamey Cox in 2002-03. SDSU has never had three players reach the 1,000-career point mark in the same season, but has had two accomplish the feat during the same campaign on four occasions.

In program history, which dates back to the 1976-77 campaign, only 19 SDSU players have recorded 1,000 career points.

Home Sweet Home

San Diego State finished its regular-season home campaign with a 12-2 record. Combined with the 2008-09 squad that went 15-1, the Aztecs have recorded back-to-back campaigns with double-digit wins at home for the first time since the 1996-97 squad went 11-2 and the 1995-96 team was 13-0.

SDSU actually has more than 10 wins in three of the last four seasons, as the squad went 11-5 in 2006-07.

Overall, the Aztecs have claimed 27 of their 30 home games the last two seasons.

Three And Under

The Aztecs have held opponents to three or fewer 3-pointers in a game 17 times this year, including a 1-for-14 effort by BYU last Friday. SDSU is first in the MWC in three-point field-goal percentage defense at 27.8 (112-for-403) and entered the week 16th nationally.

Another Sub-60

SDSU has limited 17 of its 31 opponents to under 60 points in a game. Eight SDSU foes have scored 50 or fewer points and three haven't reached the 40-point barrier. The Aztecs are 16-1 in 2009-10 when keeping an opponent to under 60 points.

Winning By A Wide Margin

So far in 2009-10, 12 of the Aztecs' 21 wins are by 19 or more points, including a season-high +35 mark against Air Force. Eight of the team's 10 conference victories were by more than 15 points with six being by more than 20 points.

In 2008-09, SDSU only had six victories by more than 20 points in 32 total outings.

Above 80

San Diego State's 87 points vs. Air Force on March 6 are its' most-ever in a Mountain West Conference game, beating its previous high of 86 vs. Colorado State in 2008, and most overall since scoring 91 vs. Navy in 2007.

Combined with their 84-point effort against TCU on Feb. 16, the Aztecs have won their last 48 games when scoring 80 or more points with the last defeat coming in 1992 against Fresno State (L, 84-86). The Air Force game was just the fifth time SDSU has reached the 80-point barrier in 164 all-time MWC contests.

Club Rejection

San Diego State junior Jessika Bradley blocked a career-best seven shots in the MWC quarterfinal win over Wyoming, including three on one play in the second half. Her seven blocks tie for fourth in Aztec single-game history and match the MWC tournament record set last year by teammate Paris Johnson vs. UNLV.

Bradley's seven blocks are the most by a league play-

er this season and tie for fourth in MWC history overall. Her 60 rejections in 2009-10 are currently fifth in the Aztec record book, while Johnson's 55 are sixth.

Team Block-A-Thon

SDSU is poised to lead the league in blocked shots in both overall and conference-only outings for the second year in a row and the third time in the last four seasons.

The Aztecs have tallied at least four blocked shots in 11 of its last 13 contests to rank first in the Mountain West Conference and 17th nationally with 5.4 a game. The team also easily led the MWC in league-only outings with 6.1 a contest and boasts two of the top three individual leaders in juniors Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley.

As a team, SDSU has reached double-figures in blocks four times this year, including a high of 11 vs. TCU and vs. Wyoming in the MWC quarterfinals, and has nine or more on six occasions. The 11 rejections vs. the Cowgirls are second-most in tournament history, as Wyoming set a record with 12 in their Tuesday game.

Injury Bug Bites

Unfortunately for the Aztecs, the injury bug bit early and often for this year's team. Before the season started, the team lost sophomore **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)** to an ACL injury. Just two games into the campaign, true freshman **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)** also went down with an ACL injury. Both Clark and Stamps will miss the remainder of the 2009-10 season.

Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

- ♦ Aztec all-time career leader Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's opener at UC Irvine and reached the 600-plateau vs. New Mexico on Feb. 6.
- ♦ Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.
- ♦ Jené Morris was one of six players named to the all-tournament team for the Island Division at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. Morris averaged 17 points in the three games, bolstered by a 32-point effort against No. 5/6 Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament and by any player in the MWC in 2009-10.
- ♦ SDSU made 60 percent (33-for-55) of its field-goal attempts in a win at LMU. That percentage is the team's best since making 68.1 percent vs. Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.
- ♦ San Diego State had three players earn all-tournament honors following the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Senior Quenese Davis garnered her first-ever career MVP honors after leading the tournament field in scoring with 24 points against Wake Forest and 16 vs. Auburn. Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were also tabbed for the second straight year.
- ♦ The Aztecs boast victories this season over a member of the Pac-10 (first time since 2003), the ACC (first win ever) and the SEC (first since 1994).
- ♦ SDSU won for the first time in the 11-year league history when opening an MWC campaign on the road. The Aztecs were 0-5 in that category prior to their victory over New Mexico on Jan. 6.
- ♦ The Aztecs won their first three conference games of

a season for the first time since the 1997 team opened Western Athletic Conference play 7-0.

- ♦ Aztec Beth Burns reached a milestone mark in her 18-year head coaching career on Jan. 13, recording her 300th career win with the team's 70-41 victory over UNLV. Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 229 of those 310 victories coming in her 13 campaigns on the Mesa.

- ♦ The Aztecs saw their eight-game Mountain West Conference regular-season win streak, which dated back to a 64-61 loss at Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2009, come to an end at TCU on Jan. 16. The eight-game streak was double the Aztecs' previous long in conference history (four games on three occasions).

- ♦ SDSU won eight straight road games, the team's longest streak since the 1996-97 team won nine in a row, before falling at TCU on Jan. 16.

- ♦ Junior Paris Johnson is the fourth Aztec to log 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 100 blocks. She joins previous standouts Michelle Suman (1991-95), Judy Porter (1980-83), Chana Perry (1988-89) and Jessica Haynes (1986-88).

- ♦ SDSU has overcome at least a four-point deficit in 11 of its 21 victories. The Aztecs have trailed at one point in all but two wins this year, that being the USD and most recent Air Force contest.

- ♦ San Diego State's streak of consecutive Mountain West Conference victories at home came to a halt at 14 games against New Mexico. The streak was the Aztecs' longest in conference history and dated back to a 55-44 loss to Wyoming on Feb. 20, 2008.

- ♦ SDSU scored 50 points in the second half of its near upset of No. 5/6 Notre Dame. It is the team's most points in a half since putting up 50 in the second half of a 91-79 loss at Wichita State on Nov. 19, 2005.

SDSU's 49 points in the first half against TCU on Feb. 16 and vs. UNLV on Jan. 13, are the most in the first 20 minutes of a game since the Aztecs posted 50 in a 91-45 victory over Utah Valley State on Feb. 10, 2005.

- ♦ Three different Aztecs earned MWC player-of-the-week honors at least once during the campaign. Senior Quenese Davis picked up her second award earlier this week, after also being acknowledged on Dec. 28. Junior Paris Johnson was tabbed on March 1 and senior Jené Morris was honored on Jan. 11.

- ♦ SDSU has owned a double-figure rebounding margin in 10 games this season, leading to a perfect 10-0 record. The Aztecs are 15-2 overall when outrebounding an opponent overall.

A year ago, SDSU only outrebounded an opponent 12 times in 32 games and ranked 263rd nationally in rebounding margin at -3.3.

Preseason Points

For the first time in the league's 11-year history, San Diego State was picked to win the Mountain West Conference title in 2010 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 7, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo. The Aztecs received 25 of the 28 first-place votes and 240 points overall. SDSU had nearly 25 more points than second place TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, *Lindy's College Basketball* and *Sporting News College Basketball Magazine*.


A few weeks later, *ESPN.com* and writer Graham Hays listed SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another *ESPN.com* writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year

Finishing her third and final season at San Diego State, senior Jené Morris is one of the most heavily-decorated players in program history and has already added more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the pre-season "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball."

Morris is also up for the other college player of the year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America team.

She is just the second player in MWC history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occasions.

Morris was also selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983.

More On Morris

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

Last season, Morris, a 2008-09 honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including 35 points vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the *Sporting News* and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Awards Aplenty

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row. Johnson was singled out as a possible national "breakout star" by *ESPN.com*'s Charlie Creme, after earning first-team all-league honors as a sophomore when she led the Aztecs in rebounding (8.3/g), blocked shots (94) and field-goal percentage (53.1).

Johnson's former club teammate, Jessika Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award.

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore, posting a pair of double-doubles, including a 10-point, 10-rebound performance vs. then No. 10 Oklahoma.

ESPN.com's Graham Hayes singled out the Johnson-Bradley duo as one of the country's best.

The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-foot-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard. The new center-hung unit features the latest Daktronics LED video technology, which provides SDSU fans the ability to see live and recorded video images from any seat in the arena.

Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward **Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah)** and 5-10 combo guard **Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent. The pair, who are each ranked among the top 100 recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2010.

Clements, Nahinu Join The Aztecs

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster. The pair of sophomores transferred after playing one season at Arizona and will have three years of eligibility remaining at SDSU starting with the 2010-11 campaign.

2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of last year's accomplishments:

- ♦ Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
- ♦ Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).
- ♦ Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.
- ♦ Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.
- ♦ Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.
- ♦ Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.
- ♦ Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

TV Time

The Aztecs have had a record 10 televised games so far in 2009-10. SDSU's game with Arizona on Nov. 21 was carried live on The Mtn., while six of its' MWC regular-season games were on TV, including three straight in mid-February. All of the team's games at the MWC tourney were televised, while the NCAA first round game will be shown on ESPN2.

In all, the Aztecs have had seven games on The Mtn., two on CBS College Sports and one on VERSUS.

Listen/Watch Live

For the ninth straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the third straight season.

Again in 2009-10, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action. The Aztecs won a share of their first-ever Mountain West regular season title, advanced to the MWC tournament championship game for the second consecutive year and garnered SDSU's first NCAA bid since 1997. For her efforts, Burns was named the league's coach of the year.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 310-219, while her school record stands at 229-154 over 13 seasons. The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she reached the 300-win plateau vs. UNLV on Jan. 13, 2010.



IRVINE, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley both scored 14, and juniors Jerica Williams, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Allison Duffy contributed 13 points apiece. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded five assists and, along with Morris, had four steals on the night to lead the defensive effort.

The Aztecs never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home team scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessica Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

ST. THOMAS, UVI - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a career-best. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessica Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

RIVERSIDE, Calif. - San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson and seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior Jessica Bradley, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 three-point shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - Pepperdine's Jazmine Jackson hit the winning lay-up with less than a second left in overtime to hand the San Diego State women's basketball team a 62-61 loss at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, playing their first overtime outing since 2006, dropped to 4-4 on the year, while the Waves improved to 6-4 overall.

San Diego State trailed for most of the game, as the visitors got off to a 4-0 lead to start and were up by nine at halftime, 34-25. The Waves' advantage grew to as many as 11 points on their first bucket coming out of the locker room.

Pepperdine took back the lead on its very next basket and the game was tied for the fifth time at 52-52 with just over three and a half minutes left. Neither side was able to convert until the final minute, when Jené Morris hit a falling jumper along the baseline and was fouled with 48 seconds remaining. Morris, however, missed the ensuing free throw, which would have put SDSU up by three points, as Wave Katie Menton sent the game into overtime on a basket with 20 seconds left and the score tied at 54-54.

San Diego State fell behind by four points with 2:16 remaining in the five-minute overtime period, but rallied back to take the lead at 61-60 on a Paris Johnson lay-up and Morris' only three-pointer of the game. Pepperdine missed a jumper on its next trip up the floor, which was rebounded by Johnson, but Morris couldn't hold on to a long outlet pass at the other end and the Waves retook possession with 25 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Jackson waited until the clock went under seven seconds and drove from the top of the key, ran around a crowd of Aztec defenders and managed to drive in for the winning lay-up on the right side of the basket to secure the 62-61 victory.

The SDSU junior duo of Johnson and Allison Duffy each finished the night with 17 points on a combined 16-for-30 shooting performance from the floor. Morris posted 13 points, five assists and three steals, while fellow senior Quenese Davis had seven assists and scored 10 points to become the second Aztec this season, and the 18th overall, to reach the 1,000-career point mark.

San Diego State ended the game outshooting the Waves from the field (42.6-37.7), but Pepperdine owned a +9 advantage on the glass, bolstered by 20-14 advantage in offensive rebounds. The Aztecs also made just 1-of-6 attempts at the charity stripe, including an 0-for-2 mark in overtime.

Coming out of a media timeout, guard Kim Spinardi hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key for SDSU's first lead of the night at 20-19. A Bradley lay-up followed, but LMU knotted the game at 22 points apiece.

From there the Aztec defense took over, limiting the Lions to only four points in the final 5:58. Davis was just as dominating on the offensive side, as the senior scored 17 of the team's 26 first-half points to give her squad a 10-point halftime edge, 36-26.

The LMU drought continued coming out of the break with the home team only hitting one field goal within the first 7:18 as San Diego State built an 18-point lead at 49-31. The Aztecs would push their advantage out to as many as 23 on six occasions, before coming away with the 75-54 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a nine-point deficit for the second time in as many games, edging visiting Wake Forest, 63-62, on at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs, improved to 7-4 overall, while the Demon Deacons dropped to 8-4 on the year. SDSU will take on Auburn, which defeated Valparaiso 51-50, in the championship game of the fifth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic on Wednesday.

SDSU was led offensively by the senior guard tandem of Quenese Davis and Jené Morris. Davis extended her streak of consecutive 20-point scoring outings to three, notching 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting. The starting point guard has five games with over 20 points this season and also tallied eight rebounds against the Demon Deacons.

Morris, meanwhile, finished with 18 points, and had three steals in playing all 40 minutes. Aztec junior Jessika Bradley tallied eight rebounds and a career-best four blocked shots, all of which came in the second half.

Wake Forest hit each of its first three shots and raced out to the early 8-0 lead. The Aztecs countered with a Davis three-pointer and jumper to get back to within three before eventually knotting the score at 10 apiece. The Demon Deacons came out of the tie with a field goal less than 30 seconds later and maintained the lead the entire first half, going up by as many as nine at 32-23, before the Aztecs got back to within six at the break, 36-30.

SDSU's first lead of the night didn't come until the 16:09 mark of the second half when Morris hit a lay-up for the one-point advantage at 39-28. The two sides traded leads two more times with the Aztecs looking to gain control with a seven-point lead with just 2:34 left to play.

Wake Forest went on a 6-2 run to get to within three and had a chance to tie it when Brooke Thomas was fouled on a 3-point attempt with six seconds left. Thomas, however, made just two of three free throws and SDSU was able to inbound the ball and run out the clock to preserve the 63-62 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team shot 52.1 percent from the field and had four players score in double-figures to claim its second consecutive Surf 'N Slam title with a 66-55 victory over Auburn at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to 8-4 overall, while the Tigers dropped to 9-4 on the year following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

Four of the Aztecs' five starters finished in double-figure scoring, led by junior Paris Johnson, who was one rebound short of a double-double with a game-high 18 points and nine rebounds. Senior Quenese Davis was named the tournament MVP with her 16 points, six rebounds, four steals and five assists in 38 minutes.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley tallied 12 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots, while classmate Coco Davis added a season-best 10 points, including both of the team's 3-pointers. Senior Jené Morris, who had 18 points vs. Wake Forest, joined Johnson and Quenese Davis on the six-player all-tournament squad.

After having to rally from nine-point deficits in each of their last two outings, the Aztecs kept it close the entire first half, falling behind by as many as four points on nine occasions, but retaking the lead at the 2:49 mark at 27-26 on a Bradley jumper. That basket kick started a 6-2 run which put the host up 31-28 heading into the locker room.

SDSU continued that momentum after the break, pushing out to a double-figure lead less than four minutes into the second half and eventually went up by as many as 15 points at 44-29. Auburn, however, fought back with a scoring run of its own, getting to within six points three times, including as late as the 8:09 mark.

Back-to-back baskets in the paint pushed the Aztecs back in front by double-figures and the team outscored Auburn 6-2 in the final 1:33 to pull out the 66-55 victory.

ALBUQUERQUE - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored host New Mexico 36-19 in the second half to cruise to a 61-39 victory in both schools' 2010 Mountain West Conference opener at The Pit in Albuquerque, N.M. With the victory, the Aztecs have won two straight on UNM's home court and have claimed three in a row vs. the Lobos for the first time since 1995, moving to 9-4 on the year. New Mexico, which scored its second-fewest points in the 41 all-time meetings, dropped to 8-5 in 2009-10.

The first half proved to be a tale of different stories for each team, as the Aztecs committed 13 turnovers and conversely, New Mexico hit only 9-of-30 shots from the field (30 percent).

SDSU made the first bucket of the game, but the Lobos responded for the first of three ties, including at 10-10 at the 10:53 mark. The Aztecs broke out of that tie with their first 3-pointer of the night by Davis and extended their lead out to five points on a Johnson lay-up.

UNM used a 6-0 run to gain its final advantage in the first half at 16-15. The Lobos, however, would only tally four more points the rest of the way, as SDSU took a 25-20 lead heading into the locker room.

New Mexico managed to get back to within a single possession after the break, scoring the first three points to close the gap to 25-23. SDSU moved back out to an eight-point lead on back-to-back jumpers by Johnson and a basket by Davis. The Aztec lead would grow to 10 points at 35-25, before dropping back to seven points on a Lobo three-pointer.

After that, Morris and Davis took over, combining to score the game's next 13 points which was a part of a 17-0 run, as SDSU went up by 22 and won by the same margin at the buzzer, 61-39.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its 11th consecutive home conference victory with a 65-50 win over visiting Wyoming Saturday afternoon at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs have now won each of their last seven regular-season conference games and have come out on top in six straight overall this season, moving to 10-4 and 2-0 in MWC action. The Cowgirls, who were the last league school to defeat SDSU on its home floor in 2008, dropped to 10-4 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

San Diego State got solid outings from each of its five starters, as senior Jené Morris notched her second consecutive 20-point scoring effort with a game-high 22 points, including a 4-for-9 performance from beyond the arc, and five assists. Two Aztecs notched double-doubles with junior Paris Johnson finishing with 13 points and 10 rebounds and senior Quenese Davis posting 11 points and a season-best 10 boards.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley fell one rebound short of becoming the third Aztec in double-figures with nine boards and eight points, while classmate Coco Davis added five points and five assists.

Both sides started the game red hot from beyond the arc, as the two teams combined for six 3-pointers in the first nine made field-goals. There were also 10 lead changes within the first seven minutes of play until three consecutive Morris baskets started a 14-0 SDSU run to put the host ahead 29-16 at the 7:44 mark.

Wyoming would get its deficit down to single digits four times before the break, but Morris' fourth triple of the first half put the Aztecs up 39-27 heading into the locker room.

Outrebounded 23-7 in the first half, the Cowgirls got three boards within the first two minutes and came to within eight on a pair of free throws and later, trailed by seven on an Emma Langford triple at 41-34.

The seven points would be as close as the visitors would get, however, as four different Aztecs contributed at least one basket in a five-minute span to put them ahead by 16 points and later posted their largest lead of the afternoon at 17 at 61-44 with 7:20 left. Wyoming made a late run, getting to within 11, but SDSU went on to win by 15 points, 65-50.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored UNLV 27-2 in the final seven minutes of the first half to easily give head coach Beth Burns her 300th career victory, as the Aztecs ran away with a 70-41 decision over the visiting Lady Rebels Wednesday at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 in conference play and won its seventh in a row overall, moving to 11-4 on the season. UNLV, meanwhile, dropped its seventh consecutive meeting with the Aztecs and stayed winless in the MWC (0-3), falling to 7-10 this year.

SDSU junior Jené Morris recorded a game-high 18 points, six assists and four steals in just 27 minutes of action. The game was close for the first three minutes before the Aztecs came out of a 4-4 tie with 11 unanswered points to go up 15-4 at the 13:01 mark of the first half. UNLV then went on a run of its own, scoring seven in a row to get back to within four points at 15-11 and again at 17-13.

Quenese Davis, however, hit a 3-pointer 15 seconds later and the Lady Rebels made only one more field goal in the final nine minutes of the first half, as SDSU went into the locker room up by 32 points at 49-17.

UNLV came out of the break outscoring the Aztecs 10-4 to get to within 26 points at 53-27, but SDSU increased its lead back up to 30 points on a Duffy lay-up with 14:37 left in the game and went on to win by 29, 70-41.

SDSU junior Allison Duffy came off the bench to score a team-best 16 points, including 12 in the second half, on 5-for-11 shooting. Junior Paris Johnson added 12 points and a team-best eight rebounds, while senior Jené Morris also had 12 points, before fouling out with 2:12 left in the game.

Both Morris and senior Quenese Davis had three steals apiece and Coco Davis had a team-best four assists and seven points.

TCU started the afternoon with the hot hand from the field, going up early by making nine of its first 14 shots to lead by 10 points at 23-13. The Aztecs cut their deficit in half with a long-range triple from Quenese Davis and a Bradley lay-up at 23-18. The Lady Frog advantage jumped back up to nine on two occasions, but SDSU continued to keep it close, heading into the locker room trailing by six at 38-32, despite committing 13 first-half turnovers.

The Lady Frogs scored the first five points of the second half to increase their lead back into double-figures and went to as many as 16 on three occasions before getting to 20 at the 10:03 mark. San Diego State got the deficit down to as few as 13 points, however, couldn't overcome a 12-for-38 shooting performance in the second half.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team kept visiting Utah scoreless for the final 5:50 of the game to earn a 51-42 victory Wednesday evening at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who won their 13th consecutive home conference outing, moved to 12-5 overall and 4-1 in MWC play, while the Utes, who have yet to score 50 points in four league contests this season, dropped to 10-7 and 1-3.

San Diego State senior Jené Morris notched her third 20-point scoring outing in the team's five league games thus far in 2010, posting 22 points, including 14 of the team's 29 total first-half points. Morris also added five steals and three triples to go with three assists in 39 minutes. She was the only Aztec in double-figure points, as Quenese Davis had nine points and a team-best four assists and Allison Duffy added seven points and six rebounds.

The Aztecs led the entire first half, building an 11-point lead at 23-12 with 8:31 left. Utah answered with a 4-0 run and trailed by only four heading into the locker room at 29-25.

Coming out of the break, Utah got two quick buckets to tie the score at 29 points apiece and took their first advantage of the night at 33-32 with 16:41 left to play. SDSU retook the lead on a Morris 3-pointer, but the game was tied again at 39. Out of the tie, the Aztecs notched back-to-back 3-pointers by Davis and Duffy to jump ahead by six points at 45-39.

After a 3-pointer by Kalee Whipple put the Utes behind by 45-42 with 5:51 remaining, Utah failed to score another point the rest of the way. The Utes had four turnovers and missed all five field goal tries and four free-throw attempts. During that same span, San Diego State scored three buckets in the paint to win by nine points, 51-42.

PROVO, Utah - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 14-point first-half deficit down to only two points at the half, but the visiting Aztecs were never able to gain the lead, falling to Brigham Young, 73-63, Saturday afternoon at the Marriott Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 12-6 overall and 4-2 in league action, while the Cougars improved to 13-4 and 4-1 in MWC play.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Jené Morris, who had a game-high 17 points and the team's only 3-pointers of the afternoon. Fellow senior Quenese Davis had 13 points and seven assists, while Allison Duffy and Paris Johnson, who recorded her 1,000th career point in the first half, both added 10 apiece.

Aztec junior Jessika Bradley pulled down seven of the team's 27 total rebounds and also had a pair of blocked shots. Morris and Davis finished with three of SDSU's 11 total steals on the afternoon.

BYU made three of the first four baskets of the game, including a 3-pointer to start, for the quick five-point lead at 7-2. SDSU cut it to a three-point deficit, but a hot Cougar offense made seven of its first 10 shots for a nine-point advantage and eventually went up by double-figures at 20-9.

The Aztecs later trailed by as many 14 heading into the second media timeout, before getting back-to-back Duffy lay-ups to trail by 10 at 24-14. The visitors continued their scoring run to nine unanswered and after a BYU jumper, ended up outscoring the Cougars 12-4 to come all the way back to within just four points at 28-24. SDSU had a chance to head into the locker room at least tied or ahead with a made basket, but Coco Davis' 3-pointer with seconds left failed to go in as the Aztecs still were down by only a pair at 33-31.

BYU came out of the halftime break by bumping the lead back up to nine points right away, as the Aztecs missed their first four shots before two lay-ups by Bradley and Duffy broke the drought to come back to three at 40-37.

San Diego State was within one on two occasions, but another BYU run meant it led by nine with 11:44 remaining in the game. Down the stretch, the Aztecs trailed by as few as five points with over a minute left, but the Cougars made seven of their eight free throws to claim the 73-63 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team broke open a four-point game with a 21-3 run midway through the second half to pull away from visiting Colorado State, 59-38, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs (13-6) won their 14th consecutive Mountain West Conference home game and moved to 5-2 in conference play.

SDSU forced 35 Ram (11-9, 3-4 MWC) turnovers, the most against an Aztec team since Air Force had 38 miscues in San Diego on March 8, 2008 (54 games), and held CSU to just 27.3 percent shooting (12-for-44). San Diego State also had a season-high 16 steals.

Colorado State went on 8-0 run, however, to take the 16-15 lead with 4:05 remaining on a pair of Chatilla van Grinsven free-throws. The Aztecs answered with a 7-0 run to head into intermission with a 22-16 lead.

In the second half, a lay-up by Kim Mestdagh brought the Rams to within four at 29-25 with 14:01 remaining. SDSU responded with the 21-3 run, with 10 of the 21 points coming from Morris, to take a commanding 50-28 lead with 4:35 left. CSU never got closer than 18 as San Diego State won its fifth straight in the series.

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used its advantage inside to outscore host Air Force 48-14 in the paint, finishing the first round of league action with a 68-48 victory at Clune Arena. With the win, the Aztecs kept pace atop the Mountain West Conference standings, moving to 6-2 in league play and 14-6 overall, while the Falcons dropped to 0-8 and 3-18 in 2009-10.

Nine of the 10 Aztecs to see action scored at least two points, with the lone exception being junior guard Coco Davis, who notched a career and team season-high 10 assists on the night to go with six rebounds. Davis' 10 helpers were one more than her previous career best of nine last year in a win over Wyoming, and marks the first time an SDSU player has reached double-figures since her sister, Quenese Davis, had 10 assists vs. TCU on Feb. 28, 2009.

Junior Paris Johnson had her best offensive performance in MWC action, scoring 17 points and hauling in a team-high eight rebounds. Her front court teammate, Jessika Bradley, was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 13, as the pair combined to make 13 of their 20 shot attempts.

Quenese Davis, who tallied a career-high three blocked shots, and classmate senior Jené Morris each had nine points apiece.

The Falcons scored the first basket of the game on a 3-pointer by Desiree Wilson, but the Aztecs countered with five consecutive field goals in the paint to go up by seven at 10-3. The SDSU lead would get into double-figures following back-to-back fastbreak lay-ups off of steals by Quenese Davis and Ashley Duffy and grew to as many as 18 points with 3:33 left in the half.

The visitor's advantage was only 13 heading into the locker room at 36-23, and Air Force continued to chip away out of the break, getting to within 10 at 40-30 at the 16:42 mark. That would be as close as the Falcons would get, however, as the Aztecs utilized a 12-2 run over a near five-minute period to go up by 23 points before closing out the 68-48 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team saw its conference home win streak come to an end at 14 games, as the visiting New Mexico Lobos earned a 65-58 victory in front of 2,069 fans at Viejas Arena. The loss was the Aztecs' first at home in league play since the 2008 campaign and also ended a seven-game home win streak overall. SDSU, which split the regular-season series with UNM, fell to 14-7 and dropped into a three-way tie in the Mountain West Conference standings at 6-3 with BYU and the Lobos, who improved to 14-7 in 2009-10.

Aztec senior Jené Morris posted a game-high 21 points with four of the team's six 3-pointers. The lead changed hands six times in the opening seven minutes of the game. A Davis lay-up put SDSU in front by one at 12-11 and kicked started a 6-0 run that gave the host its largest lead of the afternoon at 16-11. UNM closed the gap back to a single point on back-to-back lay-ups off in-bound passes by Georonika Jackson, but the Aztecs managed to stay ahead the remainder of the half, entering the locker room with a four-point advantage at 30-26.

A quick 3-pointer out of the break by Lobo Jessica Kielpinski brought their deficit down to only one and the score was tied at 36 and 43, before New Mexico took the lead on the second of two free throws with 12:07 remaining.

SDSU would later draw even on three more occasions, but was never able to move ahead, as the Lobos used a 6-0 run to go up 59-53 with 2:07 left and hit four of their six free-throw attempts down the stretch to secure the 65-58 victory.

The Aztecs missed their first five shots of the game until their first basket by Johnson made it 7-2 and was followed by a fastbreak lay-up by Davis to get them back to within three at 7-4. The gap remained three points, but then rose to seven on two occasions at the 9:18 and 5:27 mark.

SDSU answered back, nailing three consecutive 3-pointers, including a pair by Morris, to keep the visitors to within a pair with a minute left in the half. Following a timeout, Wyoming's Jade Kennedy hit an open triple and after an Aztec miss at the other end, Kennedy struck again from beyond the arc to turn a two-point Aztec deficit into eight points at 30-22 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State scored the opening bucket of the second half, but the Cowgirls got the next two to build their largest lead of the night to that point at 34-24. The deficit was still 10 points at 38-28, until a triple from the top of the arc with one second left on the shot clock by Hillary Carlson gave Wyoming an 11-point advantage and kick started a 6-0 run to move the score out to 44-30.

The Aztecs trailed by as many as 17 with 4:53 to go, but came as close as nine at 54-45 at the 1:45 mark. Wyoming, however, hit nine of 10 free throws to secure the 63-51 victory.

LAS VEGAS - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 10-point second-half deficit down to just two with under a minute remaining, but UNLV made 25 of its 41 free-throw attempts, including six in the final minute, to claim a 66-59 victory at Cox Pavilion. With the loss, San Diego State, which had an early 16-point lead, dropped its third in a row to fall to 14-9 overall and 6-5 in league play, while UNLV improved to 12-13 and 5-6 in conference action.

SDSU junior Paris Johnson had a season-high 19 points on 9-of-12 shooting to go with nine rebounds, while senior Jené Morris posted 17 points and four assists. Senior Quenese Davis tallied her second consecutive double-double with a season-best 10 assists and 10 points. Junior Jessika Bradley had nine boards, but was held scoreless after attempting only two shots.

The Aztecs opened the game with great energy on both ends of the court, racing out to a 10-0 lead, as UNLV missed its first six shots from the field before finally getting on the scoreboard with a free-throw at the 15:20 mark. The Lady Rebels didn't make a field goal until almost six minutes into the game and SDSU's advantage grew to 16 with the score 23-7 on a Johnson lay-up.

UNLV got right back in the game by capitalizing on the Aztecs' 16 first-half turnovers and cold shooting, coming all the way back to take the lead on the second of two free throws by Jamie Smith at 26-25 with under a minute remaining. Quenese Davis countered by making two free throws herself to give the Aztecs a 27-26 edge at the break.

SDSU finally broke through with its first field goal since the 7:54 mark of the first half on a Johnson lay-up three minutes into the second half. The two sides traded leads until UNLV used an 8-0 run to build its largest lead of the afternoon at four points and then went up by six at 50-44 and later 10 points at 56-46.

The Aztecs cut the double-figure deficit down to six points at 56-50 and later were down by just four with 53 seconds remaining on a Coco Davis 3-pointer from the right angle. The Lady Rebels made a free throw, but Quenese Davis banked in a difficult leaning jumper off the glass and was fouled to draw SDSU to within two at 61-59.

That would be as close as the visitors would get, as UNLV made five of its final six shots at the charity stripe to preserve the 66-59 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team got back into the win column in a big way, upsetting 23rd-ranked and first-place TCU, 84-61, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs' 23-point margin of victory was their largest in the 15 all-time meetings between the two sides and helped them improve to 15-9 overall and 7-5 in the Mountain West Conference. TCU, meanwhile, dropped to 19-6 overall and 9-3 in league action.

SDSU, playing its fourth game against a top 25 foe this year, scored a season-high 84 points with four of five starters reaching double-figures. Senior Jené Morris notched 16 of her game-high 23 points in the first half and also added four steals, five assists and five rebounds. Classmate Quenese Davis recorded her third consecutive double-double with a career-best 13 rebounds, 14 points, seven assists and three steals.

Junior Paris Johnson fell one board short of a double-double with her 19 points and nine rebounds, while junior Coco Davis added a career-best 12 points to go with three steals in 35 minutes of play. Sophomore Kalena Tutt had a career night for SDSU scoring eight points, hauling in five rebounds and blocking a pair of shots.

The Aztecs trailed only once the entire night on the opening bucket of the game at 2-0. A lay-up by Quenese Davis knotted the score at 2-2 less than a minute later and began a 7-0 run to put the host up by five. That lead grew to double-figure on consecutive lay-ups by Tutt and Morris at 17-6, before jumping out to as many as 19 points at the 9:59 mark.

The league's top offensive team, TCU cut its deficit in a hurry, converting three straight 3-pointers in just over a minute and to back to within 10. After its lead dipped all the way to eight at the 7:15 mark, SDSU finished the half by outscoring the Lady Frogs 18-8 to run the score up to 49-31.

Out of the break, TCU never got to within single digits again, trailing by as many as 26 points before the Aztecs went on to claim a dominating 84-61 win.

SALT LAKE CITY - Despite 27 points from Jené Morris, the San Diego State women's basketball team continued its struggles on the road, dropping what was a close game early at Utah, 73-55, on Sunday at the Huntsman Center. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 15-10 overall and 7-6 in conference action, while Utah improved to 16-9 and 7-5 in league play, as the teams split the regular season with each winning on their home court.

Morris scored 14 of her game-high 27 points in the first half for her seventh 20-point scoring outing this season, her sixth in an MWC game and 21st overall as an Aztec. Morris also equaled the MWC career steals record with three of the team's eight on the afternoon to tie UNLV's Sequoia Holmes at 263.

Morris was the only player in double-figure points for SDSU, as juniors Paris Johnson and Allison Duffy each scored eight. Senior Quenese Davis saw her streak of consecutive games with a double-double come to an end at three as she had five points and two rebounds to go with eight assists.

The Aztecs made their first four field goals of the game, including a pair of three-pointers, but Utah used five offensive boards to stay to a four-point deficit at 10-6 heading into the first media timeout. SDSU extended its lead to six points on a Johnson fastbreak lay-up, but Utah used a 3-pointer to begin a 9-2 run to gain its first advantage of the afternoon at 15-14.

The Utes went up by as many as four until the two sides traded leads seven times and the score was also tied on seven occasions heading into the final minute of the first half. Trailing 32-31 with five seconds left in the half, Morris took an outlet pass from Davis and nailed a difficult lay-up off the glass and was also fouled on the play. Morris hit the bonus free throw to send the Aztecs into the locker room up by a single point, 33-32.

Johnson made the first bucket of the second half, but Utah continued to get rebound putbacks and on a triple by Kalee Whipple, built its largest lead thus far of the afternoon at 44-39. The home team's lead continued to hover around four points until it went up by five at 51-45 and later more than doubled it with just over four minutes remaining at 60-49.

San Diego State never got any closer as its offense went dormant and the Utes couldn't miss, scoring 13 points in the final 3:32 to come away with the 73-55 win.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State junior Paris Johnson hit the game-winning basket with 35 seconds remaining to lift the Aztec women's basketball team to a thrilling 73-71 victory over second place Brigham Young at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU defeated BYU at home for the third year in row, improving to 16-10 overall and 8-6 in MWC play, while the Cougars saw their four-game win streak come to an end, dropping to 18-7 and 9-4 in league action.

Johnson finished the evening with a season-high 24 points on 8-of-11 shooting to go with nine rebounds, while classmate Coco Davis contributed a career-best 14 points, including a perfect 4-for-4 effort from beyond the arc, and seven assists. Senior Quenese Davis also had seven assists and recorded 13 points. Fellow senior Jené Morris was the fourth Aztec starter in double-figure scoring with 10 points and tallied four takeaways on the night to make her the Mountain West Conference's all-time career leader in steals (267).

The second meeting between the two sides this season featured 16 lead changes and 14 tie scores. The Aztecs were up by three points twice in the final two minutes, including at 71-68 with 1:16 left. BYU's Coriann Wood, however, hit her fourth triple of the game to tie the score at 71-71. Following a timeout, SDSU's Coco Davis found Johnson in the paint for what would turn out to be the game-winning jumper.

BYU had one final chance to tie or grab the lead, but Jazmine Foreman's 3-point attempt would not fall as Johnson hauled in the defensive rebound to secure the 73-71 victory.

San Diego State had an early five-point advantage in the first half, but the Cougars responded with an 8-2 run to take their first lead of the night at 10-9. The two sides continued to trade leads six more times until Wood scored five straight points in a span of 41 seconds to put BYU up by five and later seven on a Foreman jumper. The Aztecs came all the way back to take the lead again at 34-32, but a triple by Cougar Haley Hall put the visitors ahead, 38-36, going into the break.

Neither school was able to create any much separation in the second half until BYU owned a five-point lead at 59-54. Johnson quickly erased that deficit with a jumper and three free throws to tie the score at 59-59, and ended up contributing 13 of her 24 points in the final 9:26 to help secure the Aztec victory.

The two sides then both went dormant on offense as no one scored for the next 5:23 until Ram Meghan Heimstra hit two free throws with 3:25 left in the first half to take a 20-19 advantage.

Morris finally broke the stalemate at the 2:56 mark with a 3-pointer and a two-point Aztec lead at 22-20. The score was tied twice more before the half as the visitors were up 27-24 heading into the locker room.

The Rams scored three times, including their first triple of the game, before San Diego State could finally muster a point on a Kalena Tutt free throw at the 16:08 mark and now trailing 31-28. SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team scored a season-high 87 points in defeating visiting Air Force, 87-52, in both teams' regular season finales at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs finished in a tie for third place in the Mountain West Conference standings with a 10-6 record, while improving to 18-10 overall in 2009-10. Air Force, meanwhile, was on the losing end for the sixth-straight time in the series and ended up winless in the MWC for the second year in a row (0-16, 3-26).

In their final regular-season home game, Aztecs Quenese Davis and Morris combined for 40 points, eight steals and eight assists. Davis made her first seven shots of the game to finish with 23 points on 10-for-13 shooting, including a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and added three steals, five assists and five boards. Morris, meanwhile, had 12 of her 17 points in the second half and recorded a game-high five steals.

The team's third senior, Kim Spinardi, made her first career start and posted three assists, a 3-pointer and a steal in 23 minutes. Two other Aztecs ended up in double-figures points, as junior Paris Johnson had 14 and classmate Allison Duffy chipped in 10 and three steals.

San Diego State led from the opening tip for just the second time all season, racing out to a quick nine-point margin at the 13:28 mark. Air Force then used back-to-back lay-ups by Raimee Beck and a jumper by Alicia Leipprandt to cut its deficit to only three at 13-10. A Davis three-pointer returned the advantage to six, but the Falcons answered with two buckets of their own to remain down by only four near the mid-point of the half.

The Aztecs hit three consecutive lay-ups in the paint to move it back to a 10-point advantage and used their strength inside to own a 46-26 halftime lead.

Air Force got to within 19 at the 16:11 mark coming out of the break, but SDSU reeled off a 17-0 run from there and went on to win by its largest margin of the season, 87-52.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State used a 12-2 run in the final 3:38 to defeat Wyoming 60-51 in the Mountain West Conference tournament quarterfinals at the Thomas & Mack Center. The Aztecs advanced to the semifinals for the third year in a row and improved to 19-10 on the season, while Wyoming fell to 19-11 overall.

SDSU had four players score in double-figures, including junior forward Jessika Bradley, who had her best performance of the year, tallying a double-double with 11 points and a team-best 12 rebounds to go with seven blocked shots which tied a tournament record. Senior Quenese Davis was the Aztecs' leading scorer with 16 points to go with six boards, while her sister, junior Coco Davis, tied her career-high with 14 points and finished with six rebounds, four assists and no turnovers.

Junior center Paris Johnson was the fourth SDSU player in double-figures with 13 points on 5-for-10 shooting.

The game featured six lead changes with the final one coming with only 3:38 left. Wyoming's Jade Kennedy gave her team its only lead of the second half on a 3-pointer with the score 48-49, but the Aztecs countered with three consecutive lay-ups in the paint for the five-point advantage at 54-49 at 2:13 mark.

From there Bradley and both Davis sisters combined to make the team's final six free-throw attempts in the final 23 seconds to claim the 60-51 victory, as the Cowgirls only managed a single bucket in the final four minutes.

SDSU had led by as many as seven in the early part of the first half, but Wyoming tied the score at 15 and took its first lead on the very next basket. The Cowgirls were up by four twice until the Aztecs went on a 7-0 run kick started by a Coco Davis' triple before leading by just a pair at the break, 31-29.

LAS VEGAS - Jené Morris had a game-high 28 points and six steals to lead No. 3 seed San Diego State to a 77-47 rout of No. 2 seed BYU in the Mountain West Conference semifinals. With the victory, the Aztecs advanced to their third straight title game and improved to 20-10 overall for their second consecutive 20-win campaign. The Cougars, meanwhile fell to 20-9 on the season.

Morris was sensational on both sides of the floor, hitting 10 of her 14 shots and a perfect 6-for-6 at the line. She also tallied six steals, tying for second-most in tournament history, and had six assists in 31 minutes of action. Classmate Quenese Davis was 3-for-4 from beyond the arc and ended up with 18 points to go with five rebounds and three assists. Junior Paris Johnson was the third Aztec in double-figure points, tallying 10.

San Diego State fell behind by four points early, as BYU hit the first jumper and added a pair of free throws. The Aztecs responded with a 10-0 run over the next two and a half minutes to go up by six at 10-4.

The Cougars got it back to four points twice, but SDSU continued its offensive onslaught, using triples by Morris and Davis to extend the lead to double-figures at 18-8. BYU wouldn't get any closer the remainder of the way as the Aztecs owned a 44-29 halftime edge and would lead by as many as 30 with two minutes remaining in the game, before garnering the 77-47 victory.

SDSU's 30-point margin of victory is the biggest ever in an MWC tournament semifinal contest and was the team's 12th win of 19 or more points this season. The Aztecs committed only 14 turnovers, had 21 assists, 13 steals and out-rebounded BYU by four.

LAS VEGAS - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Utah 12-2 in overtime to cap a dramatic rally, giving the Aztecs their first Mountain West Conference tournament title with a 70-60 victory at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. SDSU claimed the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, improving to 21-10 overall and avenging last year's loss to the Utes in the same MWC championship contest.

Aztec seniors Jené Morris and Quenese Davis combined to score 43 of the team's 70 points, including 16 of the final 22, and also chipped in 12 assists and five steals together. Junior Paris Johnson had 10 points and a team-best seven rebounds and three blocks and classmate Coco Davis tallied three steals.

San Diego State got off to a quick start, jumping ahead by nine points twice, including at the 14:31 mark. Utah would eventually catch up and take its first advantage of the afternoon only four minutes later at 17-16. Five ties and six lead changes later, the Utes headed into the locker room up 34-33 on a last-second 3-point heave by Kalee Whipple.

Utah was up by as many as eight points in the second half, including at 56-48 with four minutes left. From there, the SDSU defense proved stiffling, limiting the Utes to only two points - both from the free throw line - as the Aztecs tied the game at 58 on a basket by Coco Davis with 1:04 remaining to send the game into overtime.

San Diego State dominated the extra time, scoring first on a rebound basket by Allison Duffy and forcing Utah into four turnovers and four missed shots from the field. The Aztecs converted two of those giveaways into points and went on to outscore the Utes 12-2 to come away with the win.

Quenese Davis was selected as the tournament MVP, while Morris earned her third-straight selection to the all-tournament team.


