GAME STORYLINES

▶ Saturday's match-up is for the West Division title and would put the winner in the Mountain West Championship game. A win by UH would give both teams a 5-3 record in league play. Nevada could also finish at 5-3 however Hawai'i would own the tie-breaker over both teams.

▶ UH has not appeared in the MW Championship game since joining the league in 2012. SDSU appeared and won the championship in both 2015 & '16.

▶ A win by UH would also give the Rainbow Warriors eight wins in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2006-07, which was also the last time UH was bowl eligible in consecutive seasons. Hawai'i is bowl eligible for the third time in four seasons under head coach Nick Rolovich.

▶ SDSU (8-2, 5-2 MW) leads the overall series 21-10-2, including a 11-6-2 advantage in games played in Honolulu. The Aztecs have won the last three meetings at Aloha Stadium. The teams met every year from 1980-98 as members of the Western Athletic Conference and only twice from 1999 to 2011, until UH joined the MW in '12

▶ The Aztecs are bowl eligible for the 10th consecutive year and are coming off a 17-7 victory over Fresno State last Friday. Both of SDSU's losses this season were by six points or less (6 by Utah State, 4 by Nevada).

▶ SDSU is allowing only 13.7 points per game this season, which ranks No. 8 nationally. Only two of SDSU's opponents scored 20+ points or more. Comparatively, UH is No. 21 nationally in scoring offense at 35.8 points per game and have scored at least 20 points in every game this season.

▶ The Warriors are averaging 212.3 rushing yards per game in their last four games with 12 rushing touchdowns. SDSU has not allowed 200 yards in a game and has held its opponents to under 100 yards rushing in 8 of 10 games. The Aztecs have also allowed only 6 rushing TDs all season and ranks No. 2 nationally allowing only 65.8 rushing yards per game.

▶ The most yards of total offense the Aztecs have allowed this season is 376 versus UNLV. UH's fewest yards of total offense this season is 395 versus Washington. The Aztecs rank No. 8 nationally with an average of 270 yards allowed per game while UH is 10th nationally with an average of 491.9 yards of total offense per game.

▶ Receivers Cedric Byrd and JoJo Ward are on the verge of 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Byrd needs 102 yards while Ward needs 120 yards to become the first UH teammates to reach that mark in the same season since Greg Salas (1,889) and Kealoha Pilares (1,306) in 2010.

UNLV POST-GAME NOTES

- ▶ UH maintained possession of the Island Showdown Trophy with its second straight win over UNLV.
- ▶ UH snapped a five-game losing streak at Sam Boyd Stadium with its first win at UNLV since in 2007.
- ▶ The visiting team won for just the 2nd time in the last 11 meetings.
- ▶ UH gained its seventh win and bowl eligibility for the third time under head coach Nick Rolovich.
- ▶ UH is bowl eligible in back-to-back seasons for the first time since going to three straight bowl games from 2006-08.
- ▶ The win secured a non-losing MW record for the third time under Rolovich.
- ▶ UH allowed 235 yards, the second-lowest of the season (203 at Nevada)
- ▶ UH won a game without throwing a touchdown pass for the first time since a 14-13 win at Fresno State on Nov. 19, 2016.
- ▶ UH scored its third defensive touchdown this season on Cortez Davis' 43-yard interception return in the third quarter. All three touchdowns have come off of interceptions.
- ▶ UH had a field goal blocked for the first time since 2014 when Ryan Meskell's 35-yard attempt in the third quarter was blocked.
- ▶ The win gives the Warriors a winning road record in MW play for the third time in four seasons and an overall winning road record (3-2) for the first time since 2010.
- ▶ The last time UH defeated both Nevada and UNLV on the road in the same season was 2007. Since then, UH had lost 10 straight to those teams until defeating Nevada, 54-3, on Sept. 28 in Reno.

RUNNING WITH THE 'BOWS

Over the last month, UH has shown the ability to run the ball effectively, averaging 212.3 yards per game with 12 rushing touchdowns.

- ▶ UH topped 200-yards rushing in three straight games, the first time that has occurred since 1994.

- ▶ UH's average of 151.2 rushing yards per game this season is the highest in the Run & Shoot era.

- ▶ Quarterback Cole McDonald rushed for a career-high 140 yards versus New Mexico, becoming the first UH quarterback to top 100 yards since Bryant Moniz in 2011. It was also the most rushing yards by a QB since Johnny Macon in 1995.

Under head coach Nick Rolovich, UH has generated 500+ yards of total offense 14 times, which resulted in 11 wins.

- ▶ UH has topped 500 yards of total offense in three straight games (UNM, FS, SJSU) which was the longest consecutive stretch in the Rolovich era.

- ▶ UH's season average of 491.9 yards of total offense per game is the fifth highest in the Run & Shoot era.

SCORING 40

The Warriors are 13-0 under Nick Rolovich when scoring 40+ points, including a 4-0 mark in 2019.

- ▶ Including Rolovich's tenure as UH offensive coordinator from 2010-11, UH is 24-0 when reaching the 40-point mark.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

The Run & Shoot offense has allowed the Warriors to spread the ball around to their many dynamic receivers.

- ▶ UH is the only team in the nation to feature six different 100-yard receivers this season. Jared Smart (twice), Cedric Byrd II, JoJo Ward, Jason-Matthew Sharsh, Melquise Stovall and Kumoku Noa each topped the century mark.

- ▶ UH is tied for No. 2 nationally with 18 different players scoring touchdowns this season and just one off the lead of 19 held by Oregon.

- ▶ In addition, the Warriors are tied for 15th nationally with nine different receivers reaching the endzone. Oregon and Ohio State lead the country with 12 different receivers.

RELYING ON THE PASS

The pass-heavy run-and-shoot offense has put UH among the nation's leaders in several passing categories.

- ▶ In addition to its No. 4 national ranking in passing yards per game (340.7), UH also ranks in the Top 5 in several other passing categories.

GOOD HANDS TEAM

In the Run & Shoot era, UH has a tradition of dynamic receivers and this year is no different.

- ▶ Senior Cedric Byrd ranks No. 11 nationally in receptions per game (7.2) and No. 15 in receiving touchdowns (9). He is also No. 3 in the Mountain West in receiving yards per game (81.6).

- ▶ Senior JoJo Ward is No. 11 nationally in receiving touchdowns (10). He also ranks No. 4 in the MW in receiving yards per game (80.0) and No. 9 in receptions per game (4.7).

- ▶ Byrd and Ward are on the verge of 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Byrd needs 102 yards while Ward needs 120 yards to become the first UH teammates to reach that mark in the same season since Greg Salas (1,889) and Kealoha Pilares (1,306) in 2010.'

- ▶ Junior Jared Smart leads the team with three 100-yard receiving games. He ranks fourth in the MW in receptions per game (5.5) and 10th in receiving yards per game (64.5).

- ▶ Senior Jason-Matthew Sharsh is No. 6 in the MW in receptions per game (5.2)

- ▶ Over the last two seasons, UH is 7-0 when either Byrd or Ward has 100-yards receiving, including 3-0 this season.

LET'S GO!

All season long, UH has not been afraid of going for it on 4th down.

- ▶ The Warriors have converted 17 of 27 on 4th downs with a success rate of 62.9 percent.

- ▶ In contrast, UH's opponents are converting 4th downs at a 38.9 percent which ranks the Warrior defense 21st nationally.

- ▶ UH is tied for No. 6 nationally with its 17 conversions and is tied for No. 7 with its 27 attempts. Only UNLV has more attempts (30) than UH among Mountain West teams.

- ▶ UH has converted at least one 4th down in 9-of-11 games this season.

HAWAI'I IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Hawai'i is in its eighth season in the Mountain West in 2019.

- ▶ UH owns a 18-45 (.286) all-time MW mark — 8-23 (.258) in home games and 10-22 (.313) in road games.

- ▶ Since the conference moved to two divisions in 2013, UH is 12-22 against the West Division and 5-16 versus the Mountain Division.

- ▶ Under Nick Rolovich, UH is 10-9 versus the West and 4-8 versus the Mountain.

- ▶ UH has finished in a tie for second in the West Division in two of three seasons under Nick Rolovich. In the previous four seasons, UH was 4-28 and never finished higher than fourth in its division.

COLE HARD FACTS

Junior Cole McDonald started the first nine games at quarterback before sitting out against San José State. However he came off the bench last week against UNLV and led the team to a 21-7 come-from-behind victory

- ▶ The La Mirada, Calif., native has completed 64.6 percent of his attempts for 3,007 yards and 25 touchdowns.

- ▶ In the win over UNLV, McDonald reached 3,000 passing yards for the second straight year, joining Timmy Chang and Colt Brennan as the only UH QBs with two or more seasons of 3,000 yards.

- ▶ Ranks No. 5 nationally in total offense (340.3), No. 9 in passing (300.7) and points responsible for (188).

- ▶ Rushed for a career-high 140 yards and two touchdowns and threw for 237 yards and another score in a win over New Mexico to earn Manning Award Stars of the Week honors.

- ▶ Ranks 4th on the school's all-time passing list (6,904) and total offense (7,797).

- ▶ Selected to the watch lists of the Maxwell Award (nation's best player), Davey O'Brien Award (nation's best QB), Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's best senior or 4th-year junior QB), and Manning Award (nation's best QB).

- ▶ 12 career 300-yard games and five 400+ games. UH is 9-3 when he throws for more than 300 yards and 4-1 with 400+ yards.

COMEBACK KID

After earning a reputation for his late-game heroics, redshirt freshman quarterback Chevan Cordeiro got the starting nod in each of the past two games against San José State and UNLV.

- ▶ In just his second career start, Cordeiro accounted for five touchdowns and earned Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week honors. He threw for a career-high 309 yards (23-of-31) and rushed for a career-high 55 yards.

- ▶ Against Fresno State, he entered as UH trailed 38-24 and directed two fourth quarter touchdowns, the second of which he scampered 10 yards for the tying score.

HISTORY OF THE RUN & SHOOT

- ▶ The most productive offensive scheme in program history is the Run-and-Shoot, which returned with resounding success in 2018.
- ▶ With R&S protege Nick Rolovich as the play-caller, UH finished in the Top 10 nationally last season (9th) in passing for the 12th time in the R&S era (310.3 yards per game).
- ▶ UH ran the offense for 13 seasons (1999-2011) under head coaches June Jones (1999-2007) and Greg McMackin (2008-11) and led the country in scoring in 2006 & '07.
- ▶ During that era, the Warriors broke dozens of NCAA records and featured the nation's career passing leader (Timmy Chang) and career TD leader (Colt Brennan).

- ▶ McDonald also finished in the nation's Top 10 in six categories last season including eighth in passing yards (3,875) passing yards per game (298.1), and total offense (325.7),

- ▶ He made the start against UNLV and was 4-of-9 for 46 yards and two interceptions before giving way to Cole McDonald. Cordeiro is still credited with the win and is 3-0 in three career starts.
- ▶ In this year's opener against Arizona, he entered the game with the score tied at 35 and directed two scoring drives for a 45-38 victory.
- ▶ Last season, Cordeiro entered the UNLV game as UH trailed 28-13 in the 4th quarter. He threw a 64-yard TD to JoJo Ward on his first pass attempt. On his second drive, he threw a 20-yarder to Ward tying the game. He capped the comeback with a 68-yard dart to John Ursua with 1:25 left and finished 4-of-5 passing for 153 yards and 3 TDs.
- ▶ Made his first start in his first collegiate appearance against Wyoming last year, leading UH to a 17-13 comeback win capped by a 38-yard pass to Ward with 1:26 left. Finished 19-of-29 for 148 yards and two TDs and became the first true freshman starter since Timmy Chang in 2000.
- ▶ Also became the first UH true freshman quarterback to win a game in his first career start since Blaine Gaison in 1976 (vs UTEP).

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

UH's offensive line has allowed only 15 sacks in 476 pass attempts (1 sack/31.7 att.) this season.

- ▶ UH has not allowed a sack in three games this season, including the last two. In fact, the Warriors have not surrendered a sack in the last 76 pass attempts dating back to the Fresno State game.

- ▶ UH ranks No. 3 nationally in fewest tackles-for-loss allowed (3.18/game) and is No. 22 in sacks allowed per game (1.36).

- ▶ Four of UH's five linemen have started every game – tackles IIm Manning and Gene Pryor, guard J.R. Hensley, and center Taaga Tuulima.
- ▶ Manning has started all 25 games of his career while Hensley has started all 25 games over the past two seasons.

- ▶ UH has started four different players at right guard, including Solo Vaipulu who started the first three games. He missed the next four starts before reclaiming the spot against New Mexico.

- ▶ UH returned all five of its starters this season, tying Auburn, Boise State, and Iowa State for most in the country.

- ▶ Last season, IIm Manning and guard Solo Vaipulu were two of four true freshman nationally to start every game.

FLY LIKE A BYRD

Cedric Byrd II has proven to be the Warriors' go-to receiver this season.

- ▶ The Los Angeles, Calif., native leads the team in receptions (79) and receiving yards (898) along with nine receiving touchdowns.

- ▶ Has at least five catches in every game this season with an average of 7.2 per game.

- ▶ Had a school-record tying four TDs and career-highs of 14 catches for 224 yards in Week 0 vs. Arizona to earn MW Offensive Player of the Week.

- ▶ In two career Week 0 games, had 181 yards vs. Colorado State in 2018 and 224 yards vs. Arizona this season, the latter of which is the second-most receiving yards by a Warrior in a season-opener (272 by John Ursua at UMass, 2017).

- ▶ Has four career multiple TD games and three career double-digit catch games.
- ▶ Has caught a pass in all 25 games played.
- ▶ The Fred Biletnikoff Award nominee finished last season second on the team with 79 receptions for 970 yards and nine touchdowns.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOJO

In two seasons, JoJo Ward has been the team's deep ball threat with 21 catches of 29+ yards, including a team-leading 12 this season.

- ▶ Ward leads the team with a 16.9 yards per catch average and 10 receiving touchdowns. He is second to Byrd with 880 receiving yards.

- ▶ The Waco, Texas native had a breakout game in a win over Oregon State with career highs in receptions (10), receiving yards (189), and touchdowns (4) to earn MW Offensive Player of the Week.

- ▶ His four TDs against OSU tied a single-game school record which was also matched by teammate Cedric Byrd II in a Week 0 win over Arizona. Three of Ward's TDs occurred in the first half.

- ▶ Had seven catches for 170 yards and two touchdowns in win over San José State.

- ▶ Has five career 100-yard receiving games, including three last season against Navy (161), UNLV (109) and San Diego State (120).

- ▶ Has two game-winning touchdown catches – both last season against SDSU and Wyoming.

THE REED OPTION

Sophomore Miles Reed has assumed the team's top back and has taken full advantage.

- ▶ The Corona, Calif., native leads the team in carries (129), yards (659) and rushing TDs (6).

- ▶ Over the last four weeks, has 69 carries for 386 yards (5.6 avg.) and three touchdowns, including his first career 100-yard game with 124 yards on 17 carries versus San José State.

- ▶ Career-high 22 carries (90 yards) versus UNLV.

- ▶ Tallied 97 yards on 16 carries in a win at New Mexico. Also rushed for 70 yards and two touchdowns in a loss to Washington and had 75 yards on 14 carries against Fresno State.

DEFENSIVE MINDED

The play of UH's defense has been a big part throughout this season.

- ▶ UH has shut-out five opponents in the third quarter and has pitched three second half shut-outs (Oregon State, Nevada, UNLV).

- ▶ The defense allowed only three first half points to New Mexico as UH built its largest halftime lead in a road game in program history (35-3).

- ▶ In a win over Nevada, UH allowed a season-long 203 yards of total offense.

- ▶ After surrendering a 1st quarter TD, UH shut-out UNLV over the final three quarters and allowed only 235 yards of total offense.

- ▶ UH shut out the Beavers in the second half and allowed only 150 yards of total offense after the break after surrendering 28 points and 282 yards in the first half to Oregon State.

- ▶ In its opener versus Arizona, the defense came up with the play of the game as safety Kalen Hicks and lineman Manly Williams teamed up for

the game-saving tackle of UA's Khalil Tate at the 1-yard line. Williams' effort made national news as he sprinted 40-yards downfield for the tackle.

MAN AMONG GIANTS

Standing just 6-foot, 225-pounds, defensive lineman Kaimana Padello is the team-leader in tackles-for-loss (7.0) and sacks (3.0).

- ▶ Padello missed the UNLV game due to injury.
- ▶ The Mililani, O'ahu native has 37 tackles, three QB hurries, and two forced fumbles.
- ▶ Tallied a career-high seven tackles in a loss to Boise State this season.
- ▶ Last season, he was the team-leader in sacks (8.5) and tackles-for-loss (13.5) while earning second-team all-Mountain West honors.

AUSSIE CONNECTION

Three Aussies grace the 2019 roster and all three are major contributors on special teams.

- ▶ Junior Stan Gaudion (Melbourne, Australia) is a two-year starting punter, who sports a 41.0 career yards per punt average that ranks No. 7 all-time in UH history.
- ▶ In 125 career punts, Gaudion has only one touchback including a streak of 88 straight without reaching the endzone.
- ▶ Senior Ryan Meskell (Gold Coast, Australia) is in his second year as the team's starting place-kicker. The preseason Lou Groza Award nominee is 7-of-13 after starting the year 2-of-7 which included four misses from 47 or longer.
- ▶ After missing three earlier attempts against Oregon State (47, 27, 48), he connected on the game-winning 28-yarder with 2:17 remaining in UH's 31-28 victory.
- ▶ Meskell has two career game-winning field goals including one in UH's 5-OT win over San José State last season.
- ▶ Senior Ben Scruton (Melbourne, Australia) splits time with Gaudion at punter and has five starts this season. Scruton sports a career average of 46.2 average on 9 punts.

TROPHY GAMES

Among the team's four rivalry trophy games, the Warriors played three of them this season.

- ▶ UH retained the Island Showdown Trophy which debuted in 2017. Hawai'i claimed possession of the trophy last season in Honolulu and retained it with a 21-7 win this year.
- ▶ UH won the inaugural Dick Tomey Legacy Trophy after a 42-40 victory over San José State. The trophy was created this year in honor of the coach who directed both programs.
- ▶ Last month, UH lost possession of the Kuter Trophy after a 56-26 loss to Air Force, Oct. 19.
- ▶ UH also possesses the Paniolo Trophy, which it competes for with Wyoming. Hawai'i reclaimed the trophy last season after a 17-13 win in Honolulu.

OTHER NOTABLES

- ▶ Under Rolovich, UH is 16-2 when leading at half-time and 5-21 when trailing at the half.
- ▶ In the win over UNM, UH jumped out to a 32-point halftime lead (35-3) for its largest on the road in program history.

▶ UH allowed its most points in consecutive games (115) since 2012, surrendering 59 points to Boise State and 56 to Air Force.

▶ UH's 51-point margin of victory in a win over Nevada (54-3) was the largest margin ever in a Mountain West game. It was also the largest margin in the Nick Rolovich era; the second-largest margin ever in a conference road game (WAC & MW); and third-largest overall road win.

▶ UH has lost the turnover battle in 8-of-11 games. The Warriors have turned the ball over 27 times (15 interceptions, 12 fumbles) with 11 takeaways (7 interceptions, 4 fumbles). UH's -1.27 turnover margin ranks No. 126 nationally.

▶ UH owns the longest streak in the nation at 141 games without allowing a punt block. Auburn is second at 140. Hawai'i last had a punt blocked by Notre Dame in 2008 a span of 683 punts.

▶ UH is tied for No. 126 (of 130) with only 27 punts this season. Alabama is the nation's leader for fewest punts with 21.

▶ Currently, five of UH's opponents are bowl eligible (Washington, Boise State, Air Force, San Diego State, Nevada). Three others also have a chance before the season is complete.

▶ With both Air Force and Army on the schedule this season, UH will have played at least one of the service academies in eight of the last 11 seasons. UH is a combined 13-16-1 all-time versus Air Force, Army and Navy.

▶ UH's August 24 opener vs. Arizona was the earliest start in program history surpassing last year's August 25 opener at Colorado State. This year marks UH's fourth consecutive Week 0 game and first at home.

▶ UH's win over Central Arkansas extended its streak over FCS teams to 17 dating back to 2001. Its last loss to an FCS team was to Portland State in the 2000 season opener (45-20).

▶ UH has won 14 of its last 15 regular-season non-conference home games and are 9-1 in those games under Nick Rolovich with its only loss against BYU to close out 2017.

ROAD WARRIORS

UH has a tradition of racking up the air miles. In the last decade UH has played no less than six road games a year, while transversing the country.

- ▶ While still racking up a whopping 29K miles this season, the Warriors will not travel nearly as much as years past.
- ▶ For the first time since 2007, UH will play just five road games. UH will also not travel beyond the Mountain Time Zone for the first time in more than 20 years (last in 1998).

▶ Since 2016, UH is 10-14 (.417) in road/neutral site games and 9-7 (.562) in MW road games.

▶ Comparatively in the eight seasons prior, UH went 11-37 (.229) in road/neutral site games and 9-23 (.281) in league contests.

UH ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

UH has made 107 all-time appearances on national television and owns a 25-80-2 (.243) record.

▶ The Warriors have won five of their last 12 on national TV dating back to last season including 2-3 in 2019. Prior to last season, Hawai'i was 2-36 in their last 38 games.

▶ UH has one more scheduled national TV game this season, Nov. 30 vs. Army West Point on CBS Sports Network.

DOING THE HULA

Four Warriors have earned invites to the recently renewed Hula Bowl.

▶ The bowl handed out its first invite to cornerback Rojesterman Farris II and second invite to defensive lineman Kaimana Padello.

▶ Receivers JoJo Ward and Cedric Byrd II have also been invited to the all-star game.

▶ The original Hula Bowl was held in the state of Hawai'i from 1947-2008. A total of 150 former Warriors participated in the game and a UH player was named the game's Most Valuable Player three times (Nick Rolovich, 2002; Blane Gaisson, 1982, Tim Buchanan, 1970).

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR

UH is tied for the most international-born players on its roster (13) in a survey of 130 FBS football programs. Temple also has 13 international-born players, followed by Syracuse (9) and Colorado and Penn State (8).

▶ Hawai'i features players born in American Samoa (9), Australia (3), and Canada (1).

▶ UH has a lasting tradition of players from American Samoa and this year's roster features nine student-athletes born in the country. Of those, seven are on the defensive side of the ball while two play offense.

DIVERSITY U

The Rainbow Warriors own one the most diverse squads in the country.

▶ UH has players from 15 different states, encompassing six time zones (Hawaiian, Alaskan, Pacific, Mountain, Central and Eastern time).

▶ More than half of the 116-man roster hails from Hawai'i (48) and California (31). UH also features players from American Samoa, Australia, and Canada.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL 150

As college football celebrates its 150th season in 2019, Hawai'i is celebrating its 110th anniversary of its first football team in 1909.

▶ UH has an all-time record of 562-462-25 (.547) including an all-collegiate record of 398-405-9 (.495).

HOME OF THE WARRIORS

The 2019 campaign is the Warriors' 45th season

at Aloha Stadium.

▶ UH boasts an all-time mark of 205-143-4 for a .588 winning percentage in the Halawa venue.

▶ Under Nick Rolovich, UH is 15-12 (.556) at Aloha Stadium with winning seasons in 2016 (4-3) and 2018 (5-3).

'BOWS IN THE PROS

A total of seven players with UH ties are currently on NFL rosters including three on 53-man rosters; P Rigo Sanchez (Indianapolis), LB Jahlani Tavai (Detroit), and WR John Ursua (Seattle).

▶ WR Marcus Kemp (Kansas City) is on injured reserve while S Trayvon Henderson is on Cincinnati's practice squad.

▶ Two others began their careers at UH before transferring to other schools; WR Trevor Davis (Oakland) and WR Keith Kirkwood (New Orleans) Davis transferred to California while Kirkwood ended up at Temple.

WATCH OUT

A total of 10 Warriors are currently on Watch Lists for national awards including quarterback Cole McDonald, who is on four major watch lists — Maxwell Award (nation's best player), Davey O'Brien Award (nation's best quarterback), Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's best senior or fourth-year junior quarterback), and Manning Award (nation's best quarterback).

TEAM CAPTAINS

This year's captains are senior RB Dayton Furuta (Mililani, O'ahu), senior DL Kaimana Padello (Mililani, O'ahu), senior DL Azia Se'ei (Honolulu), senior WR Jason-Matthew Sharsh (Honolulu), and junior QB Cole McDonald.

▶ Padello, Se'ei, and Sharsh were walk-ons while Furuta was a grayshirt.

▶ McDonald was added as a captain in Game #3 at Washington following Furuta's leg injury which will sideline him for an extended period of time.

ALL-TIME OVERTIME GAMES

UH has played 15 all-time overtime games since the overtime system was adopted at the start of the 1996 season.

▶ Ten of the 15 games were played on the road, which resulted in an 8-2 record.

▶ **Rojesterman Farris II** owns one of the most unique names in college football. His first name, inherited from his father, is a combination of four different names: Roy, Jeff, Terry and Sherman. He's better known, though, by his nickname "Roe."

▶ **Dayton Furuta** competed in judo, wrestling, and kickboxing throughout his youth and finished with a 70-4 career high school judo record, including a state championship as a senior at Mililani High in 2014.

▶ **KK Padello**, a former Hawai'i high school defensive player of the year at Mililani High, is a member of the Hawai'i National Guard and last year served in Puna, Hawai'i to assist with volcano relief.

▶ **Jared Smart's** father Keith is an assistant with the New York Knicks and is best remembered for hitting the game-winning shot in the 1987 NCAA basketball championship for Indiana.

▶ **Hekili Kelililiki**, who is of Hawaiian descent, went to high school in Arkansas and is fluent in Mandarin after serving a two-year mission in Brisbane, Australia. Double-major in Chinese and biology and is pre-med.

▶ **Chevan Cordeiro**, who backed-up Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa in 2016 at Saint Louis School, continues the school's tradition of FBS QBs which also includes Marcus Mariota (Oregon), Jeremiah Masoli (Oregon/Ole Miss), Timmy Chang (UH), Jason Gesser (Washington State), and Darnell Arceneaux (Utah).

▶ Three Warriors currently have their degrees **Rojesterman Farris II** (Sociology & Political Science), **J.R. Hensley** (Communication), and **Manly Williams** (Management & Industrial Rel.).

▶ **Kumoku Noa** is one of six brothers to play in college. Two brothers suited up for UH (Kilinahe & Waikalua) along with their father (Henry) and cousin (Kaulana). Older brother Kanawai is currently a receiver at Nebraska after playing at Cal, while brothers Kalua (Portland St.) and 'Ano (Menlo) also played.

▶ This year's squad features two pairs of brothers **Kaimana** and **KK Padello** and **Kalani** and **Kila Kamakawiwo'ole**. Five others have older brothers who also have suited up for UH: **Kamuela Borden** (brothers Kawika and Noah), **Andrew Choi** (Zeno), **Parker Higgins** (Jeremy), **Justus Taval** (Jahlani), and **Manly Williams** (Lance).

▶ The 2019 squad features six second-generation Warriors — **Jaden Allen** (father Gary, 1978-81); **Parker Higgins** (father James, 1984-85); **Kalani** and **Kila Kamakawiwo'ole** (Kila, 2002-05); **Kumoku Noa** (Henry, 1972-73) and **Elias Wong** (Hauoli, 1995).

▶ **Makai Manuwai** is the cousin of former UH All-American and NFL offensive lineman, the late Vince Manuwai. Chemistry major who aspires to go into chiropractice care.

▶ Before transferring to UH, **Ryan Meskoll** played two years of collegiate soccer at Lewis & Clark C.C. in Godfrey, Ill. He was a member of Australia's U19 soccer team

NICK ROLOVICH

Nick Rolovich became the 23rd head coach for the Rainbow Warrior program when he was hired in December 2015.

His "Live Aloha, Play Warrior" and "Pride Rock" slogans, which echoed throughout his introductory press conference, were the foundation of his inaugural season of 2016 that saw the Rainbow Warriors reach a bowl game for the first time in six years. In addition, his witty theatrics helped promote the program off the field through numerous ESPN SportsCenter Top Plays and viral videos across social media. He also re-energized a fan base, including the alumni with the help of three of his former UH teammates on the coaching staff.

The 2018 season saw a true resurgence of the formerly famed Run-and-Shoot offense. Under Rolovich's guidance and Cole McDonald at quarterback, the UH offense racked up over 5,800 yards of offense, along with 43 touchdown passes. The aerial assault accounted for 30.8 points per game and 419 yards per contest. The production led the Warriors returning to the Hawai'i Bowl for a second time under Rolovich, finishing with an 8-6 record.

When he took over the program as the fifth-youngest head coach in NCAA Division I FBS at the age of 37 after a four-year stint as Nevada's offensive coordinator, Rolovich promised a refined

offense and he came through in the form of a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver for just the second time in program history.

During his time in Reno, the Wolf Pack made three bowls — 2012 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, 2014 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl and 2015 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Rolovich's first coaching stint at UH was wildly productive from 2008-11, directing one of the top passing offenses in the nation. He was the quarterbacks coach all four seasons and spent the final two years as the Warriors' offensive coordinator.

For the latter three years of his time with the Warriors, he had play-calling duties, while UH threw for 13,915 yards—an average of 347.9 yards per game—and 96 touchdowns. That includes the 2010 season in which Hawai'i led the nation in passing offense (394.3 ypg) and finished sixth in total offense (500.6 ypg)

COACHES NOTES

▶ **Nick Rolovich** still holds eight school records from his UH quarterback playing days, including most touchdowns thrown in a game (8 vs. BYU, 2001).

▶ **Rolovich** is one of 18 FBS head coaches, who are coaching at their alma mater of one of four in the Mountain West along with Jeff Tedford (Fresno State), Bryan Harsin (Boise State), and Troy Calhoun (Air Force).

▶ Four former Warriors are on the coaching staff; **Rolovich**, **Brian Smith** (OC/RB), **Craig Stutzmann** (QB) and **Abe Elimimian** (CB). All four were teammates on the 2001 squad that finished 9-3. Rolovich (QB), Smith (C), and Stutzmann (WR) were senior starters, while Elimimian started six games as a redshirt freshman cornerback.

▶ The entire Rainbow Warrior coaching staff also remains entirely intact, something that has not occurred in more than a decade.

▶ Outside linebackers coach **Jacob Yoro**, who joined the program in 2017, is one of three Hawai'i natives on staff along with quarterbacks coach **Craig Stutzmann** and defensive coordinator **Corey Batoon**. All three played prep football at nearby Saint Louis School under legendary high school coach and former UH assistant Cal Lee.

▶ When he joined the staff in 2018, **Corey Batoon** was the program's seventh defensive coordinator in the last eight seasons. He spent the 2017 season as co-defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator at Florida Atlantic under head coach Lane Kiffin, helping the Owls to one of the nation's top turnaround seasons (11-3) and Conference USA and Boca Raton Bowl championships.

▶ **Elimimian's** younger brother Solomon (2005-08) is UH's all-time leading tackler and a veteran CFL linebacker with the B.C. Lions, who was the CFL's Most Outstanding Player in 2014 and a two-time Most Outstanding Defensive Player ('14 & '16).

▶ Inside linebackers coach and assistant head coach **Mark Banker** is serving his second stint with UH after coaching the special teams and outside linebackers in 1995 under former head coach Bob Wagner. Banker spent 12 years as Oregon State's defensive coordinator and two years as Nebraska's defensive coordinator.

▶ Prior to joining the UH staff during the offseason, receivers coach **Andre Allen** spent his entire 27-year coaching career at City College of San Francisco, and was on the CCSF staff when head coach Nick Rolovich began his collegiate playing career before transferring to UH.

▶ UH is offensive line coach **Mark Weber's** fifth stop at a Mountain West school after coaching at Fresno State (2004-05, '16), Utah State (2013-15), UNLV (1994-96) and Nevada (1993). Weber also twice coached in the Pac-10/12 - UCLA (1997-2003) and Oregon State (1987-90) during his 36-year coaching career.

▶ **Michael Ghoibrial** spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at his alma mater UCLA (2012-13) working with the special teams and defensive line. There he assisted former UH linebacker and then-UCLA assistant Jeff Ulbrich with special teams and helped the Bruins lead the nation in blocked kicks for two consecutive seasons.

▶ **Ricky Logo** has coached the defensive line during his entire 24-year career at eight different schools. He also has coordinator experience at UT Chattanooga and Troy.

▶ **Va'a Niumatalolo**, son of Navy head coach and former UH quarterback Ken Niumatalolo, is a graduate assistant for the 2019 season after serving as an intern last year. Va'a played collegiately at BYU (LB) from 2014-17.

GAME NOTES

- ▶ UH's first victory against Arizona in six tries and its first win over a Pac-12 opponent since the 2015 season-opener when the Rainbow Warriors defeated Colorado.
- ▶ UH never trailed in the game but had to overcome six turnovers and some tense moments, including the heart-stopping final play of the game in which the Wildcats drove 83 yards in 51 seconds.
- ▶ Senior defenders Kalen Hicks and Manly Williams stopped Arizona quarterback Khalil Tate at the 1-yard line with time expiring to preserve the victory.
- ▶ Cedric Byrd tied a school record with four receiving touchdowns while also setting career highs with 14 receptions and 224 yards.
- ▶ The senior's final touchdown, a 30-yarder from redshirt freshman Chevan Cordeiro with five minutes remaining, proved to be the game-winner.
- ▶ Cordeiro replaced starter Cole McDonald late in the 3rd quarter and directed UH on its final two scoring drives of the game to break a 35-35 tie.
- ▶ McDonald went 29-of-41 for 378 yards, while throwing four touchdowns and four interceptions in three quarters of action.
- ▶ UH got interceptions from Kai Kaneshiro and a key pick by senior safety Ikem Okeke in the fourth quarter, the first career interceptions for both players.
- ▶ Former UH head coach Dick Tomey was honored pre-game and at halftime.

- ▶ UH rallied from a pair of two-touchdown deficits and its defense came up big in the second half for a 31-28 victory.
- ▶ The Rainbow Warriors posted their second consecutive win over a Pac-12 opponent to start the season and got off to a 2-0 start for the third consecutive season.
- ▶ UH got a second-half gem by its defense, holding the Beavers scoreless and to only 150 yards of total offense after intermission.
- ▶ JoJo Ward scored all four of UH's touchdowns - including three in the first half - and finished with a career-high 10 receptions for 189 yards.
- ▶ It marked the second straight game that a UH receiver tallied four touchdowns, tying a single-game school record.
- ▶ Placekicker Ryan Meskell overcame three earlier misses by connecting on the game-winning field goal, a 28-yarder with 2:17 remaining.
- ▶ Cole McDonald finished the game with 421 yards passing, his fourth career 400-yard passing game.
- ▶ UH snapped a four-game losing streak to the Beavers with its first win over Oregon State since the 1999 Oahu Bowl.
- ▶ The win gave UH its second over a Power 5 school. The last time UH defeated two Power 5 schools in the same season was 2006.

GAME NOTES

- ▶ No. 23 Washington got off to a fast start and built an insurmountable lead to hand UH its first loss of the season.
- ▶ The Huskies went up 14-0 less than four minutes in and scored the first 38 points of the game.
- ▶ UW eventually took a 38-7 lead into the locker room, while averaging better than 10 yards per play.
- ▶ UH scored 20 straight points, including a pair of long 14-play touchdown drives in the third quarter, but UW slammed the door with 14 fourth-quarter points.
- ▶ UH got a career game from sophomore Miles Reed who rushed for 70 yards and the first two touchdowns of his career.
- ▶ The Huskies' first four touchdowns came on plays of 22 yards or longer, including a 47-yard strike on just their third play from scrimmage.
- ▶ UH has lost three straight to the Huskies and its last nine mainland games against the Pac-12.
- ▶ It was UH's 17th loss in its last 18 non-conference road games dating back to 2010.

- ▶ Hawai'i extended its win streak versus FCS opponents to 17 dating back to 2001 and won its third straight Homecoming Game.

- ▶ UH raced out to a 28-0 lead and kept its foot on the pedal to notch its largest margin of victory ever in a Mountain West game.
- ▶ UH racked up 512 yards of total offense, held Nevada to a season-low 203 yards, and scored off a blocked punt.
- ▶ The Warriors picked up its first win in Reno since 2007 and just its second overall in 10 all-time trips there.

- ▶ UH lost its second straight MW game and its first home game of the season.
- ▶ Air Force beat UH for the third time in the last four meetings and regained possession of the Kuter Trophy.
- ▶ Back-up quarterback Mike Schmidt came off the bench to rush for 120 yards and three touchdowns while passing for 147 yards and one score.

- ▶ It was UH's first win over New Mexico since 1991 after dropping seven straight meetings. It was also UH's first win in Albuquerque since 1987.
- ▶ UH led wire-to-wire, taking a 21-3 first-quarter lead before expanding it to 35-3 at the break for the program's largest lead ever on the road.
- ▶ The Warriors held a 45-10 lead in the fourth, before the Lobos scored the final 21 points of the game.
- ▶ UH ran for a season-high 255 yards, while finishing with 578 yards of total offense, its second-highest total this year.

- ▶ Kai Kaneshiro recorded a career-high eight tackles in his second career start.

- ▶ UH claimed the inaugural Dick Tomey Legacy Trophy, which was created in honor of the legendary head coach of both programs.
- ▶ UH won its fourth straight over the Spartans. As Mountain West members, UH has won five of the seven meetings.
- ▶ In his first start of the season and second of his career, Chevan Cordeiro passed for 309 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 55 yards and two more scores.
- ▶ The game was a back-and-forth affair as both teams did not punt once.
- ▶ There were six lead changes in the first two quarters alone with the Spartans taking a 23-21 advantage into halftime.
- ▶ Cordeiro directed a touchdown drive to open the second half to give the Warriors the lead they would not surrender.
- ▶ JoJo Ward finished with seven catches for 170 yards, including a 71-yard score.
- ▶ Running back Miles Reed topped the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career with 124 yards on 17 carries.
- ▶ The UH offense finished with 509 yards of offense, its third straight over 500.
- ▶ The Warriors reached 200 yards rushing for the third consecutive game, the first time that has happened since 1994.
