## Aztec Basketball Looks For Fourth Straight Win Wednesday At TCU

The road doesn't get any easier for the Aztec women's basketball team this week, as San Diego State travels to TCU on Wednesday evening for a 6:30 p.m. CT (4:30 p.m. PT) game at Daniel Meyer Coliseum in Fort Worth, Texas. SDSU is facing its third straight opponent in the top half of the league standings, after sweeping two games last week against a previously undefeated New Mexico squad and BYU, which entered the outing tied for third place with the Aztecs.

San Diego State (13-4, 4-1) has won each of its last three contests and nine of its last 10, with the only blemish being a six-point loss at first-place Utah in the opening week of conference play. The Aztecs are a perfect 9-0 at Cox Arena in 2008-09, and have the 16th-longest active home win streak at 11 games dating back to last season. Following last week's two wins, SDSU regained a vote for the fourth time this season in the Associated Press poll and has seen its RPI rise to as high as No. 45, according to *Collegerpi.com*.

The Aztecs, who are coming off a 20-point win at home against BYU last Saturday, will be looking for their first-ever victory at TCU this Wednesday. SDSU defeated the Lady Frogs for the first time since they joined the conference at the 2008 MWC championships in Las Vegas, overcoming a 10-point deficit to pull off a 69-67 win to advance to the tournament finale.

TCU is 12-7 on the year with huge wins over then No. 3 Maryland and No. 3 Cal. The Lady Frogs, however, have dropped five of their last nine contests, including a pair of league outings against BYU and New Mexico.

Wednesday's game will be televised live on The Mtn., with Erin Bajackson (play-by-play) and Andrea Lloyd (color) calling the action. There will also be a live audio feed with Chris Ello, along with live stats on goaztecs.com.

## Aztecs Shut Down BYU 56-26 For Fourth Conference Win

The San Diego State women's basketball team held visiting BYU to just two points in a span of over 14 and a half minutes, as the Aztecs' defense once again led the way in a 56-36 win Saturday in front of 2,792 fans at Cox Arena. With the victory, SDSU improved to 13-4 overall and won its 11th consecutive home game dating back to last season. The Aztecs moved to 4-1 in conference action, while BYU dropped to 13-4 overall and 3-2 in the MWC.

Aztec sophomore center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** notched a double-double for the second consecutive outing and her seventh of the season, posting a game-high 15 points and 11 rebounds to go with three blocked shots in only 27 minutes. Fellow front court member **Jennifer Layton-Bailes (Sacramento, Calif.)** made her first five shots from the field, including two triples, to end up with 14 points. Junior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** scored all 12 of her points in the second half, while **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** added six boards and a team-best five assists.

The game started off as a close one, as both teams turned it up on the defensive side with each forcing turnovers. San Diego State, though, managed to lead the entire way, making the first two baskets of the game and holding a six-point advantage on two occasions in the first five minutes.

BYU got to within a single point at the 13:45 mark on a three-pointer, the team's only triple of the game, at 10-9. A Layton-Bailes jumper, however, quickly put the home team in front by three once again at 13-9.

Both sides struggled to put points on the board, until San Diego State went on an 8-0 run to end the first half for a 27-15 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Aztecs continued to contain the BYU offense, as SDSU gave up just one bucket through the first eight and a half minutes of the second half to cruise out to a 24-point advantage at 41-17. The Cougars finally broke their drought with a pair of free throws, but didn't get to 25 points until just over five minutes remaining. SDSU went on to claim the 56-36 win in front of the second-largest crowd in Cox Arena women's basketball history.

#### Other BYU Game Notes

►BYU's 36 points are its fewest in the 36-game series between the two sides.

►BYU's 13 steals are the most by an Aztec opponent this season.

►SDSU opponents have failed to reach the 20-point mark in the first half four times in 2008-09.

►SDSU won the rebounding battle, 43-33. The Aztecs are 8-0 this season when outrebounding their opponent.

►The Aztecs' streak of committing fewer than 20 turnovers came to an end at 10 games when they had 24 giveaways against the Cougars.

#### Aztecs In The AP Poll

Following its victories over No. 23 New Mexico and BYU last week, San Diego State received a vote in the latest Associated Press top 25 poll for the fourth time this season. The Aztecs got a single point and remain one of two league schools to be receiving votes along with the Lobos (23 votes).

SDSU had three votes on Jan. 12, after getting two on Jan. 7. The Aztecs first received mention on Dec. 22, the first time the program has done so in over 10 years.

Prior to this campaign, the last time San Diego State garnered votes during the regular season was back in March 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

Overall, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP poll 40 times with their last actual ranking coming in 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

After averaging a double-double in two key victories last week, Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson was named the Mountain West Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week, the league office announced Monday. The award is Johnson's second this season and third of her career, while it is the fourth overall for San Diego State in 2008-09.

The sophomore also was named MWC player of the

week back on Dec. 29. Prior to this year, SDSU had not earned a conference honor more than twice in a single campaign since the league's inception.

#### What A Crowd

With the help of Girls and Women In Sports Day and the NCAA Pack the House Challenge, the Aztecs posted new a season high for home attendance with 2,792 fans last Saturday afternoon against BYU. The figure ranks second all-time in Cox Arena women's basketball history behind the 5,271 fans at last year's UConn game.

SDSU also passed the 1,000 single-game mark versus UC Riverside, when the attendance was 1,681, which is fourth-best in the 12-year arena history.

A year ago, SDSU posted an average home attendance of 1,043, up from a 499 average in 2006-07.

#### Crazy D

For seventh straight game, the Aztecs held an opponent to fewer than 60 points, allowing just 36 by BYU on Saturday. SDSU foes have fewer than 60 points in 12 of 17 outings in 2008-09, and have not been able to reach the 50-point barrier on six occasions, including three times in league play.

San Diego State ranks first in the Mountain West Conference for league-only games in scoring defense, allowing just 43.2 points an outing in the five contests. The Aztecs moved from fourth to second in overall scoring defense at 56.8 ppg., which is 52nd nationally.

#### Guarding The Three Ball

Brigham Young became San Diego State's 13th opponent and seventh straight to make three or fewer three-point field goals in a game, tallying only one on 10 attempts. The Cougars had entered the evening averaging over four and a half 3-pointers an outing.

On the year, Aztec opponents have made just 53 three-pointers, the fewest allowed by a Mountain West Conference squad by 13. Of the 53 treys, 10 were by No. 25/22 Iowa State and another seven were by No. 1 UConn, meaning SDSU's remaining 15 opponents have combined to convert just 36 (2.4/g).

#### Turning Them Over

After a one-game reprieve, BYU became the 14th San Diego State opponent this season to have 20 or more turnovers in a game, finishing with 24 on the afternoon. The only exceptions to the rule have been ranked squads in No. 1 UConn, No. 25/22 Iowa State and No. 23 New Mexico.

SDSU has forced 30 turnovers three times and still leads the Mountain West Conference in turnover margin with a +5.29 mark, which ranks 17th nationally. The team averages only 18.1 turnovers to their opponents' 23.4 per game.

A year ago, San Diego State forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in 25 of 31 games and easily set a league record for best-ever turnover margin of +5.81.

#### PJ Seeing Double

For the second time this season, center Paris Johnson recorded a double-double in back-to-back outings, posting 15 points and 11 boards against BYU, after a 17-point, 11-rebound performance on Wednesday at New Mexico.

Johnson has seven double-doubles in 2008-09 to rank second in the MWC and has 10 for her career. All but one of her double-doubles this year have come in SDSU wins, and with her 11 boards, she has reached double-figures in that category 11 times in her short two-year stint as an Aztec.

On the year, SDSU has already exceeded its season total from 2007-08 with eight double-doubles.

### Burns Nears 200 Wins At SDSU

SDSU head coach Beth Burns needs just three more victories to earn her 200th win with the Aztecs. Burns has a 12-year record of 197-140 at SDSU, while she is 278-205 in 17 campaigns as a collegiate head coach.

Burns is already the all-time winningest head coach in Aztec history and garnered her 250th career win overall last season against Southern Utah.

### Holding Down Home Court

San Diego State improved its home win streak to 11 games, including a 9-0 mark in 2008-09, with a victory over BYU Saturday. The Aztecs have also won five straight home MWC contests.

The current 11-game home win streak is 18th nationally entering this week.

### MWC Block Party

Through just five league games, San Diego State already has combined for 28 blocked shots to rank first in the MWC with 5.60 an outing.

SDSU has five or more blocks in 11 outings, including a MWC-record 15 rejections against Northwestern State. The Aztecs followed that with another double-figure effort with 10 by six different players against Loyola Marymount on Dec. 21.

The Aztecs began the year 8-0 when tallying six or more blocks in a game, before dropping the Utah game.

SDSU enter the week No. 8 nationally in blocks per game (6.0) and is first in the MWC. The school record for most blocks in a season is 162 in 1987-88.

An SDSU victory over TCU will mean:

► SDSU wins its fifth MWC game, already tying its second-highest win total in the MWC's 10-year history.

► SDSU earns its first-ever win in Ft. Worth and its first regular-season victory over TCU since the Lady Frogs joined the Mountain West.

► SDSU claims its fourth consecutive conference victory, matching its longest MWC win streak since the league's inception (also in 2008).

### TCU Tid-Bits

TCU enters Wednesday's outing with a 12-7 overall record and a 4-2 mark in conference action ... The Lady Frogs started the season with non-conference wins over then No. 3 Maryland and later at No. 3 California ... TCU, however has dropped five of its last nine outings, including league games to BYU and New Mexico ... The Lady Frogs are led by preseason all-MWC pick, sophomore Helena Sverrisdottir, who averages 15.9 points, 6.8 rebounds and 5.1 assists per game ... Two other TCU players average in double-figures, as the Lady Frogs are the top scoring team in the MWC (72.7 ppg.) ... TCU also is first in the league in three-point field goal percentage (.377), three-pointers made (6.79/g) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.05).

### Q Closes In



After tallying 10 assists in the team's two wins last week, Aztec junior guard Quenese Davis needs just eight more helpers to rank second in school history.

Davis currently has 406 assists to her credit in just two and a half seasons on the Mesa. She trails Crystal Lee (413) for second on the all-time list and should easily pass All-American Falisha Wright (448) for the school record by the end of the season.

Davis is currently tied for fourth in Mountain West Conference history in assists with New Mexico's Katie Montgomery and has the most among active players.

For the season, she has five or more helpers in 14 of 17 contests, including in 11 of the last 13 games. Davis had a season-best nine assists against Loyola Marymount and continues to lead the league in that category with 5.53 an outing. The Sacramento native enters this week ranked 20th nationally in assists.

**Steals Are All Around**

After a two-game break, San Diego State had double-figures in steals in a game with exactly 10 versus BYU. The Aztecs have recorded double-figures in that category 11 times in the 17 contests in 2008-09.

On the year, SDSU continues to lead the MWC by a huge margin with 11.76 per outing. The Aztecs enter the week ranked 14th nationally in that category.

Individually, Jené Morris is first in the league and eighth nationally with 3.5 per game, while classmate Quenese Davis is second in the MWC and 39th in the nation with 2.7 a contest.

**What About Those Wins?**

Through 17 games, San Diego State is off to its best start since the 1995-96 squad began its season with a 14-3 mark. The Aztecs have recorded their third-straight 10-win campaign, the first time that's happened since SDSU won at least 10 games eight years in a row from 1990-98.

Here are a few San Diego State winning notes:

- ♦ SDSU won its MWC opener for the first time since 2007 and just the third time overall.
- ♦ The Aztecs claimed their first win over an Associated Press ranked team in 14 years by beating No. 4 Texas on Dec. 30 and followed that up with a victory at No. 23 New Mexico. SDSU's last win vs. a ranked opponent was Dec. 28, 1994, when the team defeated No. 6 Alabama, 79-76, at a tournament at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y. The Aztecs had gone 0-16 against ranked foes prior to the win over the Longhorns.
- ♦ SDSU recorded its first-ever Surf 'N Slam title in the event's four-year history. It marks the first time the Aztecs have won a non-conference tournament since going 2-0 at the Santa Clara Diet Pepsi Shoot-Out in Santa Clara, Calif., in 1993.
- ♦ SDSU is 9-0 at home this season, its' best start at home since the 1995-96 team went a perfect 13-0.
- ♦ SDSU ended the non-conference regular season with a 9-1 mark against teams it did not face a year ago.
- ♦ SDSU is 14-3 during the month of December over the last three seasons, including a perfect 5-0 in 2008-09.
- ♦ The Aztecs earned their first victory over New Mexico since February 2001, breaking a 19-game Lobo win streak, and won in Albuquerque for the first time since March 1995, a span of 11 games.
- ♦ SDSU now has at least one win over each Mountain West Conference school since Beth Burns returned as head coach in 2005-06.

**On The Charts**

At the mid-way point of the season, several Aztecs have made a dent in the SDSU career record book.

Quenese Davis, as previously mentioned, is now third all-time in assists with 406, but she is also now tied for 10th in career steals with 172. Jené Morris is still third in career three-point percentage at 37.0, with her 71 makes rank eighth and her 192 attempts put her 10th. Sophomore Paris Johnson is tied for sixth in career blocked shots with 95.

**Also In The Rankings**

Besides the categories already mentioned, SDSU also continues to lead the Mountain West in assists (15.35/g) and offensive rebounds (15.41). Paris Johnson ranks

first in the league in offensive rebounds (3.41/g) and blocked shots (2.41/g). In conference-only contests, Johnson and Jennifer Layton-Bailes are tied for first with 10 blocked shots apiece.

**Other 2008-09 Notes**

- The Aztecs' 50 rebounds against Northwestern State are program's most since 2000, when they also had 50 against Northern Arizona.
- Jerica Williams' 14 boards vs. Northwestern State are the most since Ashlee Dunlap had 17 at Washington State on Dec. 22, 2003.
- SDSU rejected a record 15 shots against Northwestern State, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history. The Aztecs beat the previous mark of 14 held by New Mexico.
- Sophomore center Paris Johnson was selected to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. She averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in the three games, shooting 78.9 percent from the field and recording a career-best 31 points vs. the host Wahine.
- SDSU has had two different players reach the 30-point barrier this season in Paris Johnson (31 pts. vs. Hawai'i) and Jené Morris (34 pts. vs. Iowa State). Morris' 34 points are the most by a player in the MWC this season, while Johnson's 31 tie for third.
- SDSU has had four different starting line-ups this year, after having only three a year ago. Eight different Aztecs have started at least one game in 2008-09.
- SDSU had three players score 20 points or more in the same game vs. Montana State. The last time the Aztecs accomplished that feat was in 1992 vs. Colorado State.
- San Diego State scored 85 points in consecutive 85-70 wins over LMU and Montana State. The last time the Aztecs scored at least 85 points in consecutive games was in 1999, when SDSU defeated San Jose State, 89-51, on Jan. 28, and Fresno State, 89-68, on Jan. 30.
- The Aztecs have won their last 45 games when scoring 80 or more points with the last defeat coming in 1992 against Fresno State (L, 84-86).
- Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 22 and was co-player of the week on Jan. 5.
- Paris Johnson was named league player of the week on Dec. 29, following her 27-point, 13-rebound performance against Sacramento State.
- Jené Morris and Paris Johnson are the first Aztecs to win more than one MWC weekly honor in their careers since the league's inception. Overall, only eight Aztecs have been named MWC player of the week.
- Paris Johnson and Jené Morris were both named to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam all-tournament team with Morris garnering MVP honors. It is the first time Morris has been named to a regular season all-tournament squad, while it is Johnson's fourth in four chances since coming to San Diego State.
- San Diego State has had five different players score 20 or more points in a game 10 times in 2008-09. In all, six players on this year's roster have at least one 20-point scoring game in their career.
- Jené Morris has recorded a career-high eight steals on two occasions in 2008-09. The eight are the most by a player in the MWC since 2007, tie her for fourth in the league's single-game record book. The last time an Aztec had at least eight steals was in 2002, when

Veronica Shaw also had eight in a win over Sac. St. - Paris Johnson was named an honorable mention selection for Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Division I National Player of the Month for December. She was one of 28 honorable mention picks from around the country.

- SDSU's 51-point victory (79-28) over Air Force is its largest ever in a MWC game, beating the previous mark of 34 points (86-52) last season vs. CSU. The 28 points are the fewest by an Aztec opponent since Hawai'i also scored 28 in 1982. Aztec foes have failed to score at least 30 points only five times, with the record low being a 17-point performance by USD in 1978.

- Air Force's 19.0 field-goal percentages is the lowest ever by an SDSU opponent and the eight field goals tie the SDSU opponent low also held by USD.

- The Aztecs have recorded 11 double-figure rebounding performances this season, already exceeding last year's total of eight.

**Preseason Points**

The San Diego State women's basketball team to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009 in a vote by the MWC's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 14, at the conference's annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev.

The Aztecs earned six of the 26 first-place votes and garnered 184 points overall, trailing first place Utah, who had 16 first-place votes, by 22 points. The second-place projection is four spots higher than SDSU's previous best placing in the preseason poll when the team was selected sixth in both 1999-2000 and 2003-04.

In addition, two Aztecs, Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were selected to the five-player preseason All-Mountain West Conference team.

**Aztecs Sign Two Guards TO NLI's**

Head coach Beth Burns announced the signing of two, 5-9 guards, **Ashley Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** and **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, to National Letters of Intent. The pair will join the Aztecs in 2009.

**Tournament Town**

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, March 21 & 23.

SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected last February for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites.

This year's event in San Diego will feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

Cox Arena has served as the host site for three other NCAA championship events, including the 2001 and 2006 Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds and the 2001 Women's Volleyball Final Four, since the facility opened in the fall of 1997.

SDSU has played host to NCAA women's basketball games three times previously in Peterson Gym in 1984, 1994 and most recently in 1995.

**TV Time**

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season

games televised either live or shown via tape delay in 2008-09. SDSU has already had four games televised with the TCU contest (Jan. 28) and the Wyoming outing (Feb. 15) up next live on The Mtn. The game at BYU on Feb. 25, will be rebroadcast on the The Mtn. at 7 p.m. PT on Feb. 26.

The Aztecs have already appeared on CBS College Sports and Channel 4 San Diego.

**SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns**



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005.

In just four short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' posted their best season

in over a decade in 2007-08, going 18-13 overall and advancing to their first-ever MWC championship game.

Burns helped the Aztecs to a 7-9 mark in MWC play in 2008, to finish in a tie for fifth with Brigham Young. The Aztecs' seven league wins and fifth-place showing is their best-ever in the history of the MWC.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02).

# 2008-09 San Diego State Women's Basketball Box Scores - Games 1-2

## San Diego St. 67, Northwestern State 47

Game 1 ■ Nov. 14 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team won its season-opener for the second consecutive year, defeating visiting Northwestern State, 67-47, at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 1-0 on the year, while the Lady Demons dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure scoring and combined for 15 blocked shots, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson posted her fourth career double-double with a game-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to go with five blocked shots, which tie for 10th in the SDSU single-game record book. Sophomore Jerica Williams, playing in her first game in the Red & Black, posted nine points and 14 rebounds, 11 of which came in the first half. Williams' 14 boards are the most by an Aztec since December 2003.

Junior guard Quenese Davis added 13 points and eight assists. Sophomore Coco Davis had 11 points and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes, playing in her first game since 2007, tallied 10 points and three blocks.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by four points on three occasions, including at 12-8 with just over minutes left in the first half. The Aztecs increased that lead to six on a layup by Layton-Bailes, but the two sides failed to record a point over the next four minutes. Lady Demon Britany Kinlaw broke the stalemate with a jumper to put her team down by just four points at 14-10. Two Johnson free throws sparked an 8-0 SDSU run and the home team went into the locker room up by 13 at 28-15.

Northwestern State got to within 10 on three occasions coming out of the break, but the Aztecs matched the Lady Demons bucket for bucket, pulling away with a 20-point advantage at 49-29. SDSU never looked back, coasting to an eventual 20-point, 67-47, victory.

The Aztecs forced 30 Lady Demon turnovers and had 50 rebounds, the team's most in a single outing since 2000.

## San Diego St. 67, Long Beach State 59

Game 2 ■ Nov. 16 ■ The Pyramid ■ Long Beach, Calif.

**LONG BEACH, Calif.** - The San Diego State women's basketball team had a 15-point first-half lead, but had to rally to survive a strong Long Beach State run, coming away with a 67-59 victory at the Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif. The Aztecs start the season 2-0 for the second year in row, while the 49ers dropped to 0-1 in the teams' first meeting since 1997.

Sophomore Jerica Williams had a career-best 23 points with 16 in the second half and three of the team's four triples. Sophomore center Paris Johnson had 14 points and 12 boards for the second outing in a row, posting her fifth career double-double to go with four blocked shots. Junior guard Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures, notching 16 points and a game-high five steals.

The host 49ers scored the first point of the afternoon on a free throw, the only time LBSU would lead during the game. The Aztecs countered with a Williams' three pointer and took a 4-1 advantage on a free throw. The Beach got back to within one on a fast break lay-up by Courtney Jacob.

Over the next seven minutes, SDSU held LBSU without a field goal, building an 18-3 lead, before the 49ers could finally break the string at the 9:52 mark. That 15-point advantage at 18-3 was the Aztecs' largest of the game, but LBSU was able to shave six points off that deficit and went into the break down by just nine, 31-22.

San Diego State pushed its lead back into double-figures on a Lindsay Leo jumper to open the second half at 33-22. The rest of the way was a battle, however, as the 49ers drew to within four at the 11:17 mark and the score 46-42.

Another three-pointer by Williams increased the SDSU advantage to seven and the visitor's were up by 10 at 60-50 and again at 67-57. The Aztecs finished out the game by making five of six free throws in the final 1:33 to come away with the 67-59 win.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team overcame a nine-point, second-half deficit, but was unable to complete the comeback, falling 63-60 to the University of San Diego at the Jenny Craig Pavilion. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 2-2 on the year, while the Toreros improved to 3-2 after their fourth-straight win in the series on their home floor.

Junior guard Jené Morris scored 11 of her team-best 14 points in the second half and also contributed three steals. Classmate Quenese Davis added 12 points, three assists and three steals, while her sister Coco Davis scored in double-figures for the second time this season with 10 points and tallied a career-best five steals, all of which came in the first half.

The Aztecs got in foul trouble early in the game as both Morris and starting center Paris Johnson got two quick fouls apiece and played just 10 and two minutes each in the first half. Even without Morris and Johnson, the SDSU hung tough, trailing by just five points on two occasions, including at 28-23 with 2:52 left until the break.

The Aztecs got a spark off the bench from true freshman Kalena Tutt, as the center scored the first five points of her career to keep the team close. A Quenese Davis three-pointer cut the Torero lead to just two at 28-26, and then Coco Davis followed that effort up with a jumper and two straight steals and three-point plays to put SDSU ahead by four points, 34-30, heading in to the locker room.

Out of the break, USD rode the hot shooting of forward Kiva Herman, who finished the game 9-for-11 from the field, to not only erase the deficit, but also go up by as many as nine points at 51-42 with 7:55 remaining.

The SDSU offense, which managed just six points in the first 11:45 of the second half, finally woke up as a Jennifer Layton-Bailes' jumper kick started a 14-4 run that put the Aztecs back ahead 56-55 with just over three minutes left.

USD retook the lead on two free throws and was up by four points with 32 seconds left on a lay-up by Dominique Conners. SDSU countered on its next trip down the court when sophomore guard Jerica Williams banked in a three-pointer from the left angle to get to within just one 61-60. The Aztecs stole the ensuing in-bound pass, but Morris was unable to hold on, as two more USD free throws closed out the 63-60 victory.

The Aztecs had a season-best 13 steals, but could not overcome a -10 margin on the boards and a 13-for-21 performance at the stripe.

## San Diego St. 71, Hawai'i 48

**HONOLULU** - Sophomore center Paris Johnson had a career-high 31 points to help the San Diego State women's basketball team defeat Hawai'i, 71-48, in the first day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs ended a two-game losing skid to move to 3-2 on the year, while the Rainbow Wahines dropped to 0-4 after the two schools' first meeting since 1999.

Johnson made her first five shots and ended up with a career-high 31 points on 15-for-19 shooting, beating her previous best of 27 points last year against Indiana State. Johnson is the first Aztec to reach the 30-point barrier this season, while her 15 field goals tie for ninth in the SDSU single-game record book. The 6-4 center also led SDSU with seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes, who made her first start since January 2007, added a season-best 13 points and Quenese Davis had nine points and six assists.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start, going inside to Johnson, who hit each of her first four shots from the field for eight points by the first media timeout to put SDSU ahead, 11-5. Johnson also made her fifth-straight field-goal attempt, but the Rainbow Wahine used almost 60 percent shooting from the field to draw even at 18-18 with just over 10 minutes left in the half.

San Diego State came out of the 18-18 tie with a 6-0 run and held Hawai'i to just five points the rest of the way, heading into the locker room up by 15 points, 38-22.

The Aztecs continued to put points on the board coming out of the break, jumping ahead by 21 points at 46-25 with 16:26 left. Hawai'i drew to within 13 point with just over five minutes remaining, but two straight Johnson lay-ups started a 11-0 scoring run and SDSU went on to win by 23 points 71-48.

San Diego State shot a season-best 49.2 percent from the field, tallied 14 steals and forced 27 Hawai'i turnovers, including 20 in the first half alone.

**HONOLULU** - Playing its fourth game of the week and third in the last three days, the San Diego State women's basketball team made 10 three-pointers, but could not hold off a hot shooting Iowa State team, as the Aztecs fell to the No. 25/22 Cyclones, 87-71, in the final day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 4-3, while the Cyclones improved to 5-1.

The Cyclones added two more triples in a row and were up by seven at 29-22 with 6:48 left in the half.

ISU added to their lead with a jumper from the foul line to go up by nine at 31-22. A Johnson free throw finally broke the streak at the 5:33 mark, but Cyclones again answered with their fourth straight three-pointer to go up by 11 points.

Quenese Davis responded with her own set of three pointers and the Aztecs trailed by seven at 36-29. The Iowa State lead was 43-35 heading into the locker room with the help of a 50 percent mark from beyond the arc (6-for-12).

The Cyclones continued their hot shooting in the second half, scoring the first 10 points, including two more three-pointers, until Morris ended the drought with a triple from the left baseline with 16:55 left.

SDSU put together its own scoring run of nine unanswered to cut the lead to single-digits at 53-44. The rest of the contest was a battle on both sides of the ball as cut the deficit down to 75-65 with 3:11 left. ISU, however, made all 10 of its free throws in the final 2:10 to claim the 87-71 victory.

## San Diego State 54, UC Riverside 52

Game 8 ■ Dec. 4 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, CA

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State's Jené Morris hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, Thursday evening at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. With the victory, SDSU improved to 5-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-4 overall.

Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a team-best 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Morris was the only Aztec in double-figure scoring as senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes had nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. Junior point guard Quenese Davis led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of action.

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on a Morris three-pointer, but the Highlanders quickly matched her effort with a triple of their own to tie the score at 3-3. UCR took the lead on a free-throw at the 18:21 mark and held the advantage until a 7-0 Aztec run put the home team in front 12-10. A Kemie Nekele three-pointer restored order in the visitor's favor and UC Riverside led by a game-high eight points at the half, 29-21, behind a 54.5 shooting percentage.

The Aztecs, meanwhile, shot just 29 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room with two Morris three-pointers in the first minute and a half to get to within four at 31-27. The Highlanders led by six points at 39-33 and by five at 41-26, but a Davis three-pointer and a jumper inside from Paris Johnson helped SDSU even the score at 41 points.

Following the game's sixth tie score at 45-45, neither side could get its offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when the Highlanders made back-to-back buckets in the paint to once again lead by four, 49-45.

Morris' final three-pointer of the game broke the Aztecs' scoring drought at 49-48, and Layton-Bailes converted a long distance two-pointer from straightaway for a one-point lead at 50-49. UCR was not done, however, erasing a three-point Aztec advantage and knotting the game at 52-52 with just 21 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Morris hit the winning basket from the right elbow just before the buzzer sounded for the 54-52 victory.

## San Diego State 85, Montana State 70

Game 9 ■ Dec. 11 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - Three Aztec basketball players reached the 20-point barrier to help the team remain perfect at home, as San Diego State downed the visiting Montana State Bobcats, 85-70, Thursday evening at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 6-3 on the year, while the Bobcats fell to 4-4 overall.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson had the best all-around game of her career, posting a game-high 22 points to go with 13 rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals in 35 minutes for her fourth double-double of the season. Johnson's six assists were a career-best, while her 13 rebounds and three steals matched a career-high.

Johnson was helped offensively by Quenese Davis' 20 points and Jennifer Layton-Bailes' 20 points, which matched her career-best. Davis also had six assists and junior Jené Morris and sophomore Jerica Williams each had four of the team's season-high 16 steals.

SDSU never trailed in the game, coming out of the gate on a 9-0 run off back-to-back baskets by Johnson, a jumper by Davis and a three-pointer from Layton-Bailes. The Bobcats scored their first points of the game at the 16:34 mark on a three-point field goal by Nubia Garcia. San Diego State's lead grew to double-figures on a Layton-Bailes jumper at 15-5, but MSU put up a scoring run of its own, tallying nine straight to get back to within one.

Williams, who along with Layton-Bailes hit her first four shots of the game, stopped the Bobcat run with the first of three straight three-pointers over a span of just a little over a minute and a half to go back up by nine. The Aztecs continued to make plays, increasing their advantage to as many as 24 points, before heading into the locker room up 21 at 48-27, their highest first-half scoring output of the season.

Coming out of the break, Montana State began to get hot offensively, cutting the Aztec lead down to just 12 points on two occasions behind nearly 60 percent shooting from the field. The Bobcats never got any closer, though, as the Aztecs pushed their lead to 18 with 6:44 left and went on to win by 15 points, 85-70, to improve to 3-0 at home this season.

SDSU had a season-best 24 assists and its 85 points were also a season-high after scoring 71 against both Hawai'i and No. 25 Iowa State last month.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Loyola Marymount by 20 points in the second half to rally to its second consecutive 85-70 victory Sunday afternoon at Cox Arena. The Aztecs, who trailed at the break by five points, improved to 7-3 on the season and a perfect 4-0 at home, while the Lions lost their second straight, dropping to 8-3 in 2008-09.

## San Diego State 60, No. 4 Texas 55

Game 12 ■ Dec. 30 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, CA

**SAN DIEGO (AP)** - Jene Morris' late surge was too much for No. 4 Texas on Tuesday night.

Morris and San Diego State stunned No. 4 Texas with a 60-55 win on Tuesday night in the Surf 'N Slam championship game, handing the Longhorns their first loss of the season.

Morris scored 24 points, including 15 in the second half when San Diego State (9-3) refused to let Texas pull away.

"This is as good as it gets," San Diego State coach Beth Burns said. "How many people get an opportunity to play the great teams?"

The result was far different from earlier this season when the Aztecs were routed at top-ranked Connecticut 99-55 or when then-No. 25 Iowa State handed San Diego State a 87-71 loss.

"The difference was we came into this game thinking we could beat them," Morris said. "We had confidence that we didn't have against those other teams."

Morris almost single-handedly kept San Diego State in the game in the second half when she hit three 3-pointers. But it was late baskets by Jennifer Layton-Bailes and Paris Johnson that put the Aztecs ahead to stay.

Texas (11-1) played a sloppy game as it committed 23 turnovers and never seemed to get into an offensive rhythm.

The Longhorns led from the midway point of the first half until Layton-Bailes scored on a layup for a 53-52 San Diego State lead with 1:51 left.

Johnson followed with another layup with 1:08 remaining. Two free throws by Quenese Davis put the Aztecs ahead 57-52 with 19 seconds remaining.

Carla Cortijo, who led the Longhorns with 13 points, hit a 3-pointer that pulled Texas to within 57-55 with 11.9 seconds left. Johnson then hit a free throw with 10.6 seconds left before Erika Arriaran missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game. Davis hauled in the rebound and was fouled, making both of her shots at the stripe to secure the 60-55 victory.

Morris tied her career high with eight steals for San Diego State, which won despite shooting 33.9 percent.

Texas had a 10-point lead twice early in the second half but couldn't put away the Aztecs.

## San Diego State 79, Air Force 28

Game 13 ■ Jan. 7 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, CA

**SAN DIEGO** - San Diego State jumped out to a 15-0 lead and never looked back, defeating visiting Air Force, 79-28, Wednesday night in both teams' Mountain West Conference opener at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs claimed their first league-opening win since 2005 and improved to 10-3 on the year, including a 7-0 mark at home. The Falcons, meanwhile, dropped to 4-10 in 2008-09.

Four SDSU players finished in double-figures as 13 players logged minutes. Junior guard Jené Morris led the team in scoring with 16 points in just 21 minutes of action. Morris added four steals, as did classmate Quenese Davis, who also posted 12 points and five assists.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson had 13 points, eight rebounds, four assists and three blocks, while freshman Gabrielle Clark had a career-high 10 points on 3-for-4 shooting.

The Aztecs never trailed in the game, going up 15-0 before Air Force finally put points on the board with a three-pointer at the 13:04 mark. SDSU answered the Falcon basket with three straight buckets by Johnson to take an 18-point advantage at 21-3. The Aztecs led by as many as 30 points before heading into the locker room up by 28 at 38-10.

San Diego State scored the first five points coming out of the break on a Morris three-pointer and a lay-up. The Aztecs would outscore the Falcons 14-4 in the first seven minutes of the second half and moved their lead all the way out to 52 points at 76-24, before securing the 79-28 victory.

SDSU's 51-point margin was its largest in a Mountain West Conference game in the league's 10-year history, beating the previous mark of 34 points last season against Colorado State. The 28 points were the fewest the Falcons have scored in a game in their program history.

## Utah 58, San Diego State 52

**SALT LAKE CITY** - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 10-point halftime deficit down to just two points, but the Aztecs could not overcome a 48-24 disadvantage in the rebounding column as host Utah ended SDSU's six-game win streak with a 58-52 victory Sunday at the Huntsman Center. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 10-4 on the year and 1-1 in conference action, while the Utes improved to 9-6 and 2-0 in MWC play.

Junior guard Jené Morris scored a team-best 14 points and added four steals, but was 0-for-5 from beyond the arc. Jerica Williams was the only other Aztec in double-figures with 11 points and a perfect 2-for-2 from three-point land.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson was limited to just seven points on 3-for-11 shooting to go with 10 of the SDSU's 24 boards. Senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes had a career-high five blocked shots and three steals in the loss.

Utah opened the game with the first bucket, but San Diego State responded with a 9-0 run with the help of three steals. The Utes matched that 9-0 run with one of their own to go up by a pair at 11-9. The two sides would trade leads five times within the first nine minutes of action before Utah went up by four on two occasions at 19-15 and 21-17.

The Utes built on their advantage with a 12-0 run, until a Quenese Davis lay-up finally broke the scoring drought with 13 seconds remaining to send SDSU into the locker room down by 10 points at 33-23.

The Aztecs got their offensive and defensive game going coming out of the break, getting to within just two points at 39-37 following a 10-0 run, including six points by Morris. Utah once again responded as a three-point play sparked a 10-2 run for the 49-39 lead with 7:39 remaining.

San Diego State closed to within five at 53-48 on a potential three-point play by Layton-Bailes, but she missed the free throw and Utah hit five of six at the stripe in the final minute to secure the 58-52 victory.

## San Diego State 49, Wyoming 42

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team scored a season-low 49 points, but managed to hold on to stay perfect this season at home, defeating visiting Wyoming, 49-42, Wednesday at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs claimed back-to-back wins over the Cowgirls for the first time since 1997 and improved to 11-4 overall and 2-1 in conference action. Wyoming, meanwhile, fell to 8-7 on the year and 0-2 in MWC play.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs in scoring with 14 points despite playing just 19 minutes due to foul trouble. Senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes tallied 11 points and five offensive rebounds and sophomore Coco Davis had a career-high nine assists. Her sister, Quenese Davis, notched a season-best eight rebounds, while also chipping in eight points and five assists.

Wyoming started the game with a pair of two-point leads, but San Diego State pulled ahead with six straight points to go up 8-4 at the 13:03 mark. The Cowgirls cut their slim deficit down to one on two occasions over the next four minutes before an 11-0 Aztec run put the hosts up by 12 at 23-11. The Wyoming offense finally put points on the board after an 8:09 drought on a free throw by Megan McGuffey and went into the locker room down by 11, 25-14.

San Diego State saw its lead get cut to five points at the 14:02 mark of the second half, but then began to pull away, as Layton-Bailes scored a lay-up and converted a three-point play to return the advantage to double-figures at 34-24. The Cowgirls rallied to cut their deficit to single-digits with just over a minute left with a 6-0 run, but Quenese Davis closed out the game by hitting both of her free throws to preserve the 49-42 win.

San Diego State shot just 32.3 percent from the field and 15.4 percent from beyond the arc, but attempted 22 more shots than the Cowgirls, owning a 20-7 advantage on the offensive glass. The Aztecs also forced 23 Wyoming turnovers and the Cowgirls' 42 points were the second-fewest in the 36 all-time meetings between the two foes.

## San Diego State 57, New Mexico 52

**ALBUQUERQUE** - The San Diego State women's basketball team held on in a furious final few minutes, logging the program's first victory at New Mexico in nearly 14 years by defeating the 23rd-ranked Lobos, 57-52, at The Pit. With the win, the Aztecs ended a 19-game New Mexico series win streak and handed the Lobos their first loss at home this season following an 11-0 start. SDSU improved to 12-4 on the year, including two victories over top 25 teams, and 3-1 in league play, while the Lobos dropped to 14-3 and 3-1 in MWC action.

Sophomore Paris Johnson recorded her sixth double-double of the year with a game-high 17 points and 11 rebounds, but more importantly, sunk a pair of free throws with just three seconds remaining to secure the win.

Junior guard Quenese Davis was the only other Aztec in double-figures with 11 points, including a 3-for-5 effort from beyond the arc. Davis had a team-best five assists, Johnson had three blocked shots and Jennifer Layton-Bailes and Jené Morris each added nine points apiece.

After the two sides traded baskets to open the game, the Aztecs hit back-to-back three pointers to take an 8-2 lead. The Lobos responded with a 10-0 run as the SDSU struggled to get into its offense.

The Aztecs finally got back on the scoreboard at the 11:34 mark after going over five minutes between buckets, which sparked an 11-0 run, as SDSU once again took the lead at 19-12.

The Lobos broke their own drought with a jumper and a free throw to get back to within four at 21-17. SDSU found its inside game over the next two minutes, capping an 8-0 run with back-to-back lay-ups in the paint for their biggest lead of the night at 29-17.

After UNM closed to within four at the half, the Lobos scored eight of the first 10 points out the break all on lay-ups to reclaim the lead at 37-35.

Following a pair of ties and three more lead changes, the Aztecs built a pair of six-point advantages and later an eight-point edge at 53-45 with 4:29 to go.

UNM crept to within a pair with 55 seconds left, but an amazing steal by Morris gave the Aztecs a four-point advantage. The Lobos had a chance to equalize on a three-pointer their next trip up the court, but Layton-Bailes blocked the attempt from the right angle and Johnson secured the rebound. Layton-Bailes would later miss the front end of a 1-and-1 with four seconds on the clock, but Johnson got another board, was fouled and then proceeded to sink to free throws for the 57-52 win.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team held visiting BYU to just two points in a span of over 14 and a half minutes, as the Aztecs' defense once again led the way in a 56-36 win Saturday in front of 2,792 fans at Cox Arena. With the victory, SDSU improved to 13-4 overall and won its 11th consecutive home game dating back to last season. The Aztecs moved to 4-1 in conference action, while BYU dropped to 13-4 overall and 3-2 in the MWC.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson notched a double-double for the second consecutive outing and her seventh of the season, posting a game-high 15 points and 11 rebounds to go with three blocked shots in only 27 minutes. The game started off as a close one, as both teams turned it up on the defensive side with each forcing turnovers. San Diego State, though, managed to lead the entire way, making the first two baskets of the game and holding a six-point advantage on two occasions in the first five minutes.

BYU got to within a single point at the 13:45 mark on a Shawnee Slade three-pointer, her team's only triple of the game, at 10-9. A Layton-Bailes jumper, however, quickly put the home team in front by three once again at 13-9.

Both sides struggled to put points on the board, until San Diego State went on an 8-0 run to end the first half for a 27-15 advantage.

The Aztecs continued to contain the BYU offense, as SDSU gave up just one bucket through the first eight and a half minutes of the second half to cruise out to a 24-point advantage at 41-17. The Cougars finally broke their drought with a pair of free throws, but didn't get to 25 points until just over five minutes remaining. San Diego State went on to claim the 56-36 win in front of the second-largest crowd in Cox Arena women's basketball history.
