San Diego State Aztecs (5-3, 0-0 MWC) vs. Pepperdine Waves (7-5, 0-0 WCC)

- **When & Where:** Thursday, Dec. 21, 2006, at Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7 p.m. (PST)
- **Webcast/Live Video:** Bill Earley (play-by-play) and Tammy Blackburn (analysis) will have the live audio broadcast on www.goaztecs.com. A live video feed will also be available via the Aztecs' official website for the match-up with the Waves.
- **The Records:** Off to its best start in 10 years, the San Diego State women's basketball team gets back to action Thursday following an 11-day break for final exams. The Aztecs are looking for their fifth-straight win when they play host to reigning West Coast Conference champion Pepperdine at Cox Arena at 7 p.m. SDSU's most recent outing resulted in a 62-57 win over Saint Mary's back on Dec. 10, improving its record to 5-3 overall and a perfect 3-0 in the month of December.

The Waves, meanwhile, have struggled with injury this season and are 7-5 overall, including losses in three of their last four outings. Pepperdine claimed last year's game with San Diego State, 70-56, in Malibu, and went on to finish with a 14-17 record and a trip to the NCAA tournament.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 240-175 in 15 seasons, while she is 159-110 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.

► **Pepperdine's Head Coach Julie Rousseau:** Julie Rousseau is in her third season at Pepperdine and has a career and school record of 33-39.

► **Pepperdine Series History:** Pepperdine and San Diego State meet for the 18th time, with the Aztecs leading the series with an 11-6 mark. SDSU is 5-2 in games played in San Diego and had claimed five straight and 10 of the last 11 prior to last season's loss (Last: Pepperdine def. SDSU, 70-56, on Dec. 10, 2005, in Malibu, Calif.).

Off To Its Best Start In 10 Years, SDSU Women's Hoops Plays Host To Pepperdine Thursday

The San Diego State women's basketball team puts its four-game win streak on the line when it plays host to Pepperdine Thursday at 7 p.m. at Cox Arena. The Aztecs are off to their best start through eight games since the 1996-97 season, head coach Beth Burns' final campaign of her first stint on The Mesa. SDSU is a perfect 3-0 in the month of December with a pair of overtime wins, followed by a 62-57 victory against Saint Mary's in its most recent outing on Dec. 10.

The Aztecs are looking to avenge last year's 70-56 loss to the Waves in Malibu. Pepperdine enters Thursday's matchup with a 7-5 overall record, including wins over Rutgers and UNLV and losses to top 25 teams in Texas A&M and California.

The Pepperdine game is SDSU's final outing prior to a seven-day break for the holidays.

Last Time Out: Aztecs Claim First-Ever Victory Over Saint Mary's 62-57

Shanna Demus had a career-high 19 points and Quenese Davis logged her second career double-double to lead San Diego State to a 62-57 win Sunday over visiting Saint Mary's at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs have claimed four straight for the first time since the 2000-01 campaign, improving to 5-3 overall, while the Gaels dropped to 2-6 in 2006-07.

Demus (Palmdale, Calif.) beat her previous career high in scoring by seven points with the help of a 6-for-9 shooting performance from the floor and a 6-for-7 effort at the free-throw line. **Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, meanwhile, logged her first double-double since the season-opener with 17 points and 11 rebounds, while adding a team-best eight assists and four steals in 33 minutes of action. SDSU also got 12 points, five rebounds and three steals from junior **Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.)**.

The Aztecs opened the game strong, vaulting out to an 11-point advantage, their biggest of the game, at 17-6 at the 12-minute mark. The Gaels slowly cut into the deficit and trailed by just three points going into the locker room with the help of a 7-0 run.

Saint Mary's tied the game at 24 points apiece with a three-pointer by Maija Lahde to open the second half. The Gaels then took their first and only lead of the afternoon on the second of two free-throws by Eghosa Obaiza to go up by one at 25-24. SDSU immediately responded to the lead change with a Layton jumper and following a tie at 26-26, went ahead for good, 29-26, on a Demus three-pointer.

The Aztecs led by as many as 10 points on three occasions, but were up by only three with seven seconds left in the game. Following a St. Mary's timeout, however, Davis nailed each of her two free-throw attempts to secure the 62-57 win, the Aztecs' first in the all-time series with the Gaels.

Other Saint Mary's Notes

- Saint Mary's attempted an SDSU opponent season-high 40 free throws. The 40 attempts are the most by an Aztec foe since Wichita State tried 50 in the 2005 season opener.
- The Aztecs has claimed all five of their wins in 2006-07 by seven or fewer points.
- SDSU had 17 assists against Saint Mary's, marking the fourth time this season that the Aztecs' have had 16 or more in a single game. Last year's squad reached the 16-assist mark on just three occasions.

Welcome To The Family

The Aztec basketball family officially welcomed a new addition to the roster this week. Guard **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)** joined the team on the practice court for the first time on Wednesday. Myles graduated from Bishop Amat High School in La Puente, Calif., in 2006, and originally signed with Oregon State. She will be able to practice with the team the rest of this year and is eligible to compete in December 2007 with 3.5 years of eligibility remaining.

The 5-10 guard helped Bishop Amat, under head coach Richard Wiard, to a 70-1 record and two state Division III titles in her two seasons, including a perfect 35-0 mark as a junior. Myles averaged about seven points, four rebounds, three steals and three assists as a senior to earn second team all-CIF and all-league honors. She chipped in 10 points and eight rebounds a contest as a junior during the Lancers' undefeated campaign and is a past participant at the adidas top 100 invitational camp. Myles, who will wear jersey No. 31, began her high school career as a freshman at Ayala High School in Chino Hills, Calif.

At The Start

-With a 5-3 record, SDSU is off to its best start since 1996-97, which ironically was Beth Burns' final season of her first stint on Montezuma Mesa. That year, the Aztecs were 5-3, but then lost their next two in a post holiday tournament in Maryland. In 1995-96, SDSU opened the campaign with a 6-2 record through its first eight outings and then reeled off six straight wins for a 12-2 start.

-With one more victory in 2006-07, the Aztecs can double their win total from all of last season. This would mark the second time Beth Burns has had an SDSU team double its win total from her first to her second season at the helm. In her first stint on The Mesa (1989-97), Burns' first squad in 1989-90 won seven games, while her second doubled that with 14 victories in 1990-91.

While Burns wasn't able to do the same in her only other stop as a head coach at Ohio State, the Buckeyes still increased their win total by two from her first to her second campaign.

They're A Steal

With 16 steals against Saint Mary's, the Aztecs have combined for 50 in their last three outings. SDSU has now tallied double-figures in steals on four occasions in 2006-07, and ranks first in the conference in that category with an 11.50 per game average, which is also 41st nationally. A year ago, SDSU had 10 or more steals eight times, including in each of its first four games to open the year.

In 2006-07, six different SDSU players have recorded three or more steals in a game 10 times. Sophomore **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** tied her career-high with six steals against Wichita State and had four versus Southern Utah. Freshman Quenese Davis had three at USD, five against the Shockers and four versus Cal Poly and Saint Mary's. Shanna Demus, **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** and Jennifer Layton have each turned in one game with three steals or more this year.

With another in the game with Saint Mary's, four different Aztecs have combined to record eight double-doubles this season, a figure that leads the Mountain West Conference in 2006-07. All four players have accomplished the feat twice, including Quenese Davis, **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)**, **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** and Jennifer Layton. The double-doubles are the first career efforts for each of the four, while SDSU has had two players turn the trick in the same game on two occasions.

The last time SDSU had four separate players record a double-double in the same season was in 2001-02, when five Aztecs combined for five double-doubles.

On The Boards

With Quenese Davis' 11 boards against Saint Mary's, SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on nine occasions this season. In 2005-06, the Aztecs to only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times, with three going to Michelle Strawberry and two by Desiree Johnson.

Block Party

While the Aztecs were limited to a season-low two blocks in the win over Saint Mary's, SDSU continues to lead the conference in blocked shots with 5.63 per outing, a figure that is 18th nationally. The team had a season-high 10 blocked shots against Cal Poly, the team's most in a single game since also tallying 10 on Dec. 22, 2002 against Creighton. SDSU now has 45 blocks on the season by eight different players. The 45 blocks is already over 51 percent of the team's 27-game total of 95 from a year ago. The school's team season record for blocks is 162 by the 1987-88 squad in 31 outings.

At The Top

Two Aztec newcomers currently stand at the top of a pair of stat categories in the Mountain West Conference. SDSU boasts the league's assist leader in freshman Quenese Davis, who chips in 5.75 per contest to rank 22nd in the nation. The Aztecs occupy the top two spots in blocked shots per game with Jennifer Layton (2.00/g) holding a slight advantage over teammate Desiree Johnson (1.88/g).

Injury Update

For the first time this season, Aztec head coach Beth Burns may have all 12 players on the team's active roster at her disposal for Thursday's game with Pepperdine. Freshman guard **Chelsea Williamson (Boulder, Colo.)**, who has battled stress reactions in both of her feet, is expected to suit up for the first time this season against the Waves. Junior forward **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** should also be back in uniform after playing her first career game against Cal Poly and then sitting out the Saint Mary's contest due to soreness in her foot.

SDSU began the year with just eight players available for its first two games. Sophomore Tamika Lipford upped that number by one when she returned against USD on Nov. 14, after recovering from offseason ACL surgery. Her classmate, LaSandra Dixon, missed the first four games before playing at Southern Utah following surgery to repair a torn meniscus.

Interesting Notes

- San Diego State has trailed in each of its five victories this season, including four times in the second half. SDSU bounced back from a five-point, first-half deficit and was behind by four with 9:45 remaining in the win at Southern Utah. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight in the second half versus Wichita State and was down by 10 against Cal Poly, which is the largest deficit in an SDSU win since Jan. 7, 2005, when the team was behind by 14 in the second half in a 63-59 victory against Eastern Washington.

- SDSU is a perfect 4-0 since head coach Beth Burns first used the starting five of guards Tamika Lipford and Quenese Davis, forwards Shanna Demus and Jennifer Layton and center Desiree Johnson.

- Aztec opponents have attempted 20 or more free throws in all eight games this season. The year started out with 23 free throws by each of SDSU's first three opponents, followed by 22 by its next two foes. Since then, opponent's trips to the charity stripe have bounced from a season-low 21 attempts by Wichita State to a season-high 40 by Saint Mary's.

-SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games of the season, with one being a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage. San Diego State has broken the 40 percent mark four times in eight games this season, after turning the trick just six times in 27 outings a year ago.

-SDSU has outrebounded its opponent in five games this season, after doing so on only eight occasions in 27 games in 2005-06.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Pepperdine will mean:

►SDSU has won five straight games for the first time since 2000-01, when the Aztecs claimed six in a row from Dec. 18 through Jan. 11.

►SDSU is 6-3 overall, its best record through nine games since the 1995-96 team was 7-2.

►SDSU improves to 7-2 in home games played in the month of December since Beth Burns' return as head coach.

►SDSU improves to 3-1 against teams it also faced a year ago.

►SDSU has exceeded its home win total by two from last season.

►SDSU has defeated a team that advanced to the NCAA tournament the year before for the first time since beating Colorado State on Feb. 6, 2003.

►SDSU improves to 2-1 this season versus teams from the West Coast Conference.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 4-1 all-time against Pepperdine

Pepperdine enters Thursday's contest with a 7-5 overall record ... The Waves began the year by playing three of their first four games against team's ranked in the national top 25 ... Pepperdine lost to both Texas A&M and California, but defeated then 14th-ranked Rutgers 75-73 in overtime on Nov. 17 in Malibu ... The Waves have lost three of their last four games, including a 78-67 defeat versus UC Santa Barbara on Monday ... Pepperdine has played two Mountain West Conference schools already in 2006-07, including UNLV (W, 57-42) and TCU (L, 74-56) ... The Waves are led by junior guard Daphanie Kennedy, who averaged 12.5 points per game and also has a team-best 35 assists and 26 steals ... - Aztec assistant coach Kate Paye was an assistant at Pepperdine under head coach Julie Rousseau in 2004-05. Paye also was a teammate of Pepperdine assistant coach Vanessa Nygaard's at Stanford, as the two led the Cardinal to the Final Four in 1995.

- SDSU junior forward Shanna Demus and Pepperdine junior forward Teiosha George both attended Palmdale High School in Palmdale, Calif.

Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartney and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.

- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Quenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.

- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four campaigns. Davis is joined by Lipford (2005), current junior Kate Eveland (2004) and Courtney Fritz (2003).

She became the sixth SDSU player in the league's eight-year history to be named player of the week.

- San Diego State played back-to-back overtime games for the first time in program history against Wichita State and Cal Poly.

Pick Seven

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Thursday at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

The Aztecs, who ended up ninth in the 2005-06 regular season, earned 41 points from the panel, beating out eighth place Air Force by two points. New Mexico was picked to win the conference title, garnering eight of the 19 first-place votes. The Lobos edged BYU by just one first-place nod and three overall points. The Cougars are followed by TCU (126 pts.), Utah (102), Wyoming (96) and UNLV (71). Colorado State rounded out the poll with a ninth-place point total of 36.

Six Mountain West Conference teams are coming off postseason bids in 2005-06, with four playing in the NCAA tournament. All four squads won their NCAA first round game and Utah advanced all the way to the Elite Eight, falling to eventual national champion Maryland in overtime.

Aztecs Sign Stellar Fall Recruiting Class

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 8 of four highly-rated recruits - centers **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Geneshia Dunbar (Dallas, Texas)** and guards **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** and **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)**. Johnson, Dunbar and Davis will join the Aztecs in 2007, while Myles, who is eligible to compete in December 2007, has already begun practicing with the team.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 240-175, while her mark school record stands at 159-110 over 10 seasons.
