- ▶ **When & Where:** Mon., Dec. 22, 2003, Friel Court (12,058), Pullman, Wash., 7:00 p.m.
- ▶ **Webcast/Live Stats/TV:** The game will be broadcast live on the internet at www.goaztecs.com with Dan Lawton calling the action.
- ▶ **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team heads back on the road for the first time since Dec. 6, facing Washington State Monday in its first trip outside California this season. The Aztecs have dropped their last four games, including a 63-54 loss to Oral Roberts Saturday, but are 2-1 this year on the road.
- ▶ Washington State is also coming off a day's rest, falling to unbeaten Idaho on Saturday, 72-57. The Cougars at 4-4 have already equaled their combined season win total from the last two seasons after going 2-27 in 2001-02 and 2-26 in 2002-03.
- ▶ **In The RPI:** In the fourth RPI released by the WBCA on Dec. 15, SDSU is ranked 314th, while Washington State is 75th of the 324 NCAA Division I teams. The Aztecs are 276th in the Jeff Sagarin/*College Basketball News* rankings.
- ▶ **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 12-23.
- ▶ **WSU Head Coach Sherri Murrell:** Murrell is in her second season as head coach at Washington State. Her WSU record is 6-30, while her eight-year career record is 122-106.
- ▶ **Series History:** SDSU leads 1-0 (Last: SDSU def. WSU, 59-58, in San Diego, 11/23/81).

SDSU Women's Basketball Heads Back On The Road Monday At Washington State
San Diego State will look to break a four-game losing streak by traveling north for its first game outside the state of California Monday night at Pac-10 Conference member Washington State. The Aztecs are playing outside the confines of Cox Arena for the first time since Dec. 6, heading to Pullman, Wash., for the first time ever in the two schools' second all-time meeting and first since 1981.

Two of the Aztecs' three wins in 2003-04 have come in their opponent's arenas, while the Cougars boast a 1-1 record against Mountain West Conference schools this year, beating Wyoming (59-50) and falling at Utah (61-51).

Aztecs Drop Final Home Contest Of 2003

Playing without its leading scorer, the San Diego State women's basketball team dropped its fourth straight game, falling to Oral Roberts 63-54, Saturday at Cox Arena in its final home contest of 2003. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-5 overall, while the Golden Eagles improved to 5-4 in 2003-04.

SDSU was without its leading scorer in freshman Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.) who missed her first game of the season for personal reasons. The Aztecs' lone senior, Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.), was also limited to just two minutes of action due to injury.

San Diego State freshman Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.) led the team in scoring for the third straight game and the fourth time this season with 15 points on 4-of-9 shooting from beyond the arc. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.) pitched in her normal effort, recording 14 points and pulling down 13 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Dunlap's classmate Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.) added 10 points for the second straight game.

Other ORU Notes

SDSU set season highs for most blocks (6), steals (12) and free-throw attempts (29) ... Nicolette McCartney's string of 35 consecutive starts ended on Saturday. McCartney's streak dated back even further to 41 games if you take out the senior night line-up against BYU in 2002 ... McCartney suffered a broken nose against SMU and also battled an eye injury versus Oral Roberts in being limited to only two minutes, her lowest total minutes in a game of her career, not including the six games she missed due to injury to start 2001-02 ... Aztec sophomore Farryn Lewis (Walnut Creek, Calif.) scored her first career points on 2-of-3 shooting from the free-throw line in her most extensive playing time so far this year.

A Place To Start

San Diego State has sported two different starting line-ups in each of its last two contests after opening the season with the same starting five in the first six games. Freshman Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.) and junior transfer Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas) both earned the starting nod for the first time versus Oral Roberts, while guard Michelle Strawberry has made her first two career starts in the last two contests.

Count One More For Courtney

Aztec freshman Courtney Fritz has now led the team in scoring four times this season and in each of the last three contests. She has averaged 17.7 points over the three-game span and has made 12-of-27 or 44.4 percent of her three-pointers.

Four different players have led SDSU in scoring in at least one game this season.

Double Her Pleasure

With five double-doubles this season, including four in her last five outings, Aztec Ashlee Dunlap continues to rise up the conference ladder.

With her 15 career double-doubles, Dunlap is tied for third in Mountain West Conference history with former standouts Lauren Beckman (Utah) and Jennifer Leitner (BYU) and current UNLV junior Sherry McCracklin.

Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the conference record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23. A year ago, Dunlap also had five double-doubles through the first eight games, finishing the season with 10 to her credit.

More About A.D.

With her 13 rebounds against Oral Roberts Saturday, Ashlee Dunlap has tallied double-figures in rebounding in each of the last five games and six times overall this season. For her career, the sophomore has 17 double-figure rebounding performances in her 35 career games.

Freshmen From Three

The Aztec freshman trio of Courtney Fritz, Jessica Huettl and Michelle Elliott continue to be the team's lone threats from beyond the arc. Fritz has been on fire as of late, making four in each of the last three games, after tallying only seven in her first five games. Fritz has hit 44.2 percent of her three-point opportunities (19-of-43) for the season.

Huettl and Elliott, meanwhile, have combined for 18 of the team's 19 other three-pointers, meaning that freshmen have made all but one of the Aztecs' 38 three's this season.

Washington State Tid-Bits

Washington State opened its season with three wins, before dropping four of its last five to pull up at an even 4-4 ... The Cougars boast a win over MWC school Wyoming (59-50) and a loss at MWC member Utah (61-51) ... WSU has been led by senior Bianca McCall, who is the only Cougar to average in double-figure scoring (10.5 ppg.) ... McCall also averages a team high 6.3 rpg., but has missed two of the team's eight contests with a concussion at Baylor on Nov. 29 ... junior Jessica Perry is second in scoring with nine points per game ... Monday's game pits a pair of coaches in their sophomore seasons at their respective schools ... SDSU's meeting with Washington State is its first against a Pac-10 school since falling to California on Nov. 18, 2001 ... the first and only time SDSU and WSU met previously came in 1981, when the Aztecs won 59-58 in San Diego.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Washington State will mean:

- ▶ SDSU is 4-5 overall, breaking a four-game losing skid and improving to 3-1 this season on the road. The three victories match the Aztecs' win total away from Cox Arena all of last season when they were 2-10 in away games and 1-1 in neutral site contests.
- ▶ SDSU improves to 2-0 all-time versus Washington State. The victory is the Aztecs' first over a Pac-10 school since a 63-49 win against California on Dec. 22, 2000. It is the first win at a Pac-10 school since a 67-66 victory at USC on Dec. 6, 1995, a span of six games. SDSU improves to 48-68 all-time against Pac-10 schools and owns a .500 record or better versus six of the nine Pac-10 members it has faced.
- ▶ SDSU is 3-2 against teams which it did not play a year ago. The Aztecs have already earned wins over Nevada and Cal State Fullerton and suffered losses to SMU and Oral Roberts. The Washington State game is the third of a seven-game stretch in which SDSU plays teams that were not on its 2002-03 schedule.

In The MWC

Through games of Dec. 21, SDSU ranks in the top three among conference schools in scoring defense (3rd - 57.1 ppg.), free-throw percentage (3rd - .689) and three-point field goal defense (3rd - .288) Interestingly, the Aztecs were ranked sixth in the Mountain West a year ago in scoring defense and dead last in the other two categories.

Individually, Ashlee Dunlap is the league's second-leading rebounder with her 10.1 rpg., while she is second in defensive (6.25/g) and third in offensive (3.88/g) boards. Courtney Fritz is second in three-pointers per game (2.38) and senior Nicolette McCartney is second in the MWC in blocked shots per game with a 1.25 mark.

Seeing Double

SDSU freshman Michelle Elliott continues to be the team's most consistent threat on offense. Elliott has opened her career with double-figure scoring efforts in each of the seven games in which she had played, the only Aztec player to do so this season. She currently ranks first among all freshmen in the Mountain West Conference in scoring average with a 14.1 mark.

Freshman Courtney Fritz became the latest addition to the club, putting up 21 points against both San Diego and at Cal State Fullerton. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap and freshman Michelle Elliott contributed career highs of 23 and 20 points, respectively, against Nevada.

Dunlap and Elliott became the first Aztecs other than former standout Jamey Cox to reach the milestone since Atim Otil had 21 points against New Mexico at the MWC championships on March 7, 2001. SDSU also had two, 20-point scorers in one game for the first time since Cox and Claire Swinbank scored 24 and 20, respectively, against UNLV on Feb. 24, 2001.

Aztecs Sign Four To National Letters Of Intent

Head coach Jim Tomey announced the signings Nov. 13, of four high school seniors to national letters of intent. Forward **Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah)**, point guard **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, center **Whitney Hollison (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.)** and wing **Marin McCue (Calgary, Alberta)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2004.

Pick Six

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish sixth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 7, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The voting panel consisted of the conference's eight head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs jumped one spot from each of the three previous polls, receiving 57 total points. SDSU, which finished seventh in the MWC a year ago, was accurately picked to place sixth in the inaugural poll in 1999-2000.

Geographically Challenged

The SDSU coaching staff traveled far and wide to make-up its 2003 recruiting class. This year's 12-player roster includes players from 10 states with the most coming from California (3). Other states represented include: Arizona, Colorado, Illinois, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

Unparalleled Coverage

Aztec fans will get a chance to follow the women's basketball team in a number of ways this season. Every regular-season game will once again be broadcast live on the internet by a trio of veterans in Bill Earley (play-by-play), Tammy Blackburn (analyst) and Dan Lawton (road games, home pre- and postgame shows). SDSU also had a pair of home games televised live by Channel 4 San Diego earlier this year.

A new feature this season will be gametracker or live stats for every Aztec home game on goaztecs.com.

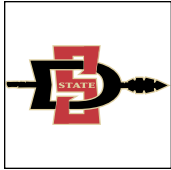
