A live video feed will also be available via the Aztecs' official website for the matchup with the Shockers.</p> <p>► <b>The Records:</b> After a nine-day break, the San Diego State women's basketball squad (2-3) returns to action this Sunday when it plays host to Wichita State (2-2) for a rare 1 p.m. tip-off. The Aztecs and Shockers meet for the second straight season, as the two sides faced on another in both schools' 2005-06 season opener in Wichita. The Shockers claimed the victory a year ago in an offensive battle, which saw the two sides combine for 170 points and 77 trips to the free-throw line.</p> <p>The Wichita State contest begins a month-long stay for SDSU at Cox Arena, as it rounds out non-conference action with six games in December, capped by the two-day San Diego Surf 'N Slam.</p> <p>► <b>SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:</b> Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 237-175 in 15 seasons, while she is 156-110 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.</p> <p>► <b>Wichita State Head Coach Jane Albright:</b> Albright is in her fourth season at Wichita State and owns a school record of 31-55. Her career record stands at 380-272 in 23 seasons. She is 2-1 all-time against San Diego State (1-1 at Northern Illinois).</p> <p>► <b>Wichita State Series History:</b> SDSU and Wichita State meet for the second time and the first time in San Diego, Calif. The Shockers own a 1-0 advantage in the all-time series (Last: Wichita State def. San Diego State, 91-79, on Nov. 9, 2005, in Wichita, Kan.).</p>	

**San Diego State Begins Month-Long Stay At Home Sunday Versus Wichita State**

The San Diego State women's basketball team returns to action for the first time since Nov. 24, as the Aztecs play host to the Wichita State Shockers Sunday afternoon at Cox Arena. Tip-off is set for 1 p.m. for the two schools' second meeting in as many seasons.

SDSU is coming off a 1-1 road Thanksgiving road trip, which saw it fall to Utah Valley State (75-44), but rebound to beat Southern Utah (55-52) for its second victory of the young season. Wichita State, meanwhile, is 2-2 overall with victories in each of its last two outings after opening the season with losses to Hofstra and at Arkansas.

The Aztecs are playing all six of their games during the month of December at home. The Wichita State contest will be followed by match-ups with in-state foes Cal Poly, Saint Mary's and Pepperdine, before the second annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam, scheduled for Dec. 28 and 30.

### Last Time Out: Aztecs Split On Trip To Utah

The San Diego State Aztecs rounded out its non-conference road schedule by splitting its pair of games in the state of Utah last week.

SDSU began the trip by falling to Utah Valley State, 75-44, on Wednesday afternoon. The Aztecs shot under 30 percent from the field for the second consecutive game and trailed 40-18 at the break. Freshman **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)** had her first career double-double to lead San Diego State with career-highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds. Junior **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** had 10 points, while sophomore **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)**, who made her first start of the 2006-07 season, added a season-high eight points.

Two days later, the Aztecs got a career-high 18 points from freshman **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, holding off Southern Utah for a 55-22 victory at Centrum Arena in Cedar City, Utah. SDSU, which trailed by as many as five points, outscored the Thunderbirds (0-4), 9-6, over the final 4:46 to pick up their second win of the season.

Davis was 7-for-8 from the field, including a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and added a team-high four assists in 30 minutes of action. Eveland and Hoisington each scored in double-figures for the second consecutive game for San Diego State with 11 points apiece. Six of Eveland's 11 points came from the free-throw line, including three in the final 20 seconds of the game to seal the win for the Aztecs.

Senior **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** had a team-high 11 rebounds, while junior transfer **Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.)** added 10 boards.

### Other Postgame Notes

-SDSU won its final non-conference road game of a season for the first time since 2002-03.

-SDSU freshman Kim Spinardi scored her first collegiate points at Utah Valley State.

-The five-point Aztec deficit at Southern Utah was the largest SDSU has overcome in a win since also trailing UNLV by five in a 76-60 victory on Jan. 15, 2005.

- With its win at Southern Utah, SDSU claimed its first victory on the road since beating Air Force on Feb. 26, 2005.

-The 27 team free-throw attempts at Southern Utah are the Aztecs' most in a single-contest since Jan. 18, 2006, a span of 17 games.

### Doing The Shuffle

After using the same starting five in the first three games, Aztec head coach Beth Burns did a lineup shuffle for the two road contests in Utah. Burns replaced freshman Quenese Davis with sophomore Tamika Lipford at the point in the outing at Utah Valley State, while senior **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** earned the nod for Kate Eveland, giving SDSU three starters above six-feet tall. Davis returned to the lineup along with Lipford at Southern Utah to go along with **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)**, Desiree Johnson and Jennifer Layton.

### Welcome Back, LaSandra

For the second straight week, another Aztec, sophomore **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, returned from injury, giving the squad 10 players on its active roster. SDSU was down to just eight for the first two outings of the season, before Tamika Lipford saw her first action since February against USD. Dixon, who missed just over two weeks after having surgery to repair a torn meniscus, played seven minutes at Southern Utah.

Still on the sideline are junior forward **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** and freshman guard **Chelsea Williamson (Boulder, Colo.)**, who are both battling stress reactions in their feet.

### Triple Double-Double Trouble

For the third time this season, an Aztec recorded a double-double in a game, as freshman Lauren Hoisington turned the trick with 16 points and 11 rebounds at Utah Valley State. Hoisington joins junior Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis, who had double-doubles in their first games as Aztecs against Nevada. In that outing, Layton finished with 18 points and 12 rebounds, while Davis fell one rebound short of a triple-double with 11 points, 10 assists and nine boards.

The last time three different players had at least one double-double in the same season for SDSU was back in 2002-03.

### On The Boards

With three such performances last week, SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on four occasions. In 2005-06, the Aztecs only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times, with three going to Michelle Strawberry and two by Desiree Johnson.

The last time San Diego State had three separate players record 10 or more rebounds in a game in the same season was also in, you guessed it, 2002-03.

### Block Party

Through five games, SDSU already has 30 blocked shots by five different players. The 30 blocks equal a

6.0 per game average and is already over 31 percent of the team's 27-game total of 95 from a year ago. The school's team season record for blocks is 162 by the 1987-88 squad in 31 outings.

The Aztec currently lead the Mountain West Conference by a large margin, as second place New Mexico has averaged just 4.67 blocks per game in their first six contests.

### Interesting Notes

- Aztec opponents went to the free-throw line exactly 23 times in each of the first three outings. The next two games, they attempted 22 free-throws each, giving Aztec opponents a 113-83 advantage in that category thus far.

-SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games of the season, with one being a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage. San Diego State has broken the 40 percent mark three times in five games this season, after turning the trick just six times in 27 outings a year ago.

### Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Wichita State will mean:

- ▶SDSU matches its win total from last season's 3-24 campaign.
- ▶SDSU improves to 4-2 in home games played in the month of December since Beth Burns' return as head coach.

▶SDSU claims victories in back-to-back games for the first time since defeating Portland State (Dec. 16) and Boise State (Dec. 20) last season. It was also the last time the Aztecs have posted two straight wins in consecutive home outings.

▶SDSU improves to 2-1 against teams it also faced last season.

▶SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 1-1 all-time against Wichita State.

### Wichita State Tid-Bits

Wichita State is 2-2 with wins over UMKC (78-71) and Pacific (71-55) and losses to Hofstra (79-72) and Arkansas (80-70) ... the Shockers are led by junior Kyrie Kinder, who averages 13.5 points per game, and senior Antionette Wells, who averages 10.5 rebounds per outing ... Three other WSU starters average more than 10 points an outing ... The Shockers have averaged 72.8 points per game as a team and are shooting 44.4 percent from beyond the arc (24-54).

### Flashback: Aztecs Fall In Battle With Wichita State, 91-79

Despite a career-high 29 points by senior Michelle Strawberry, the San Diego State women's basketball opened the second Beth Burns era with a 91-79 loss to Wichita State, 91-79, at the Charles Koch Arena on Nov. 19, 2005.

high) from the floor, beating her previous career-best point total of 23, and added a team-best seven rebounds versus Wichita State. She was helped offensively by classmate Veronica Shaw, who scored 14 of her 16 points in the final 20 minutes of action. Freshman forward Jana Heinrich tallied 12 points in her Aztec debut, while freshman Tamika Lipford had a team-high five steals and five assists.

SDSU opened the afternoon by going up by as many as six on five occasions, including with 5:25 remaining in the first half at 24-18. Wichita State, however, would go on a 20-5 run to go into the locker room up 38-29.

The Shockers would use that momentum into the second half, increasing their lead out to as many as 21 points at 67-46. The Aztecs wouldn't go away quietly as the deficit trickled from 15 points with 1:29 left all the way down to just eight at 86-68 and again at 87-79 with under a minute remaining. Four straight free throws by Shocker Whitney Rice would close out the game and any hope of a late Aztec comeback at 91-79.

SDSU shot 43.8 percent from the floor, had a plus-10 advantage in turnovers and a 16-9 margin in steals, but could not overcome a 55-33 deficit in rebounds, a 23.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc and a 40.7 percent performance at the free-throw line.

Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws, including 35 in the second half. The 50 attempts beat the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).

Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartney and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.

- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Quenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.

- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four campaigns. Davis is joined by Lipford (2005), current junior Kate Eveland (2004) and Courtney Fritz (2003).

- Jennifer Layton went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half of the UC Davis game, finishing the night with 20 points. She averaged a double-double in her first three career outings (15.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.).

-The Aztecs' 20 assists versus UC Davis are the most by SDSU in a single-game since the team had 23 in a 91-45 victory against Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.

Pick Seven

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Thursday at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

The Aztecs, who ended up ninth in the 2005-06 regular season, earned 41 points from the panel, beating out eighth place Air Force by two points. New Mexico was picked to win the conference title, garnering eight of the 19 first-place votes. The Lobos edged BYU by just one first-place nod and three overall points. The Cougars are followed by TCU (126 pts.), Utah (102), Wyoming (96) and UNLV (71). Colorado State rounded out the poll with a ninth-place point total of 36.

Starting in 2006-07, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the Air Force game, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Cox Arena on [www.goaztecs.com](http://www.goaztecs.com).

**Key Points For The Aztecs In 2006-07**

**Offense** - Scoring offense has been one of the major hurdles in the SDSU women's basketball program in recent years. The Aztecs ranked last in the MWC in that category with 53.1 points per game and averaged less than 50 points a contest in league action in 2005-06. SDSU lost its top two scorers from a year ago in Michelle Strawberry (13.5 ppg.) and Veronica Shaw (8.7 ppg.), but returns its next three in Desiree Johnson (7.5 ppg.), Shanna Demus (6.1 ppg.) and Erin Jackson (5.0 ppg.).

Expect more of a balanced, but still faced-paced offense from the Aztecs in 2006-07. The coaching staff worked hard to recruit more offensive weapons.

**Defense** - Pressure defense has been the trademark of coach Beth Burns' squads and this season should be no different. The team returns the conference's top shot blocker in senior Desiree Johnson, who also led SDSU in rebounding. Fellow returnees Shanna Demus and Tamika Lipford combined for 65 steals - almost 30 percent of the team's total a year ago.

One of the key areas will be keeping opponents off the glass, as the Aztecs averaged just over 20 defensive rebounds per game in 2005-06.

**The Schedule:** This year will mark the second time in the last three seasons that the Aztecs have played 16 home contests, also doing so in 2004-05 ... Just four of the team's 12 possible non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule ... SDSU plays host to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam for the second straight season, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena ... The field includes potential first-time opponent and 2006 NCAA tournament team George Washington, Brown University and perennial powerhouse University of Georgia ... The Mountain West Conference portion of the schedule runs from Jan. 4 through March 3 ... SDSU will play league games on four possible days of the week as opposed to last year's Wednesday/Thursday and Saturday format ... The Aztecs have five games each on Thursdays and Saturdays and three contests on both Wednesdays and Sundays ... Six Mountain West Conference teams are coming off postseason bids, with four of those advancing to the NCAA tournament second round or further ... The MWC championships returns to Las Vegas, Nev., in 2007, after a three-year stint in Denver, Colo.

**SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns**

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 237-175, while her mark school record stands at 156-110 over 10 seasons.
