Aztec Softball Kicks off Season at No. 1/2 UCLA's Stacy Winsberg Tournament

The San Diego State softball team begins its 35th season of competitive play this weekend when it travels to Los Angeles for the Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament on the campus of defending national champion and No. 1/2 UCLA.

The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both the preseason USA Today/NFCA and ESPN.com/USA Softball polls, are scheduled to play five games over three days.

SDSU kicks off its 2011 campaign Friday with a 1 p.m. PT game against North Dakota State. Following the season-opener, San Diego State will take on Utah State (9 a.m. PT) and Central Florida (2 p.m. PT) on Saturday. On Sunday, the Aztecs will meet Utah State again (11:30 a.m. PT) before the 2 p.m. PT contest against the host Bruins.

The Aztecs have had great success in season-opening games, including an impressive 13-1 (.929) mark in lid lifters under 15th-year head coach Kathy Van Wyk. SDSU has won 10 straight season-openers with its last loss coming against Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 5, 2000. Since records were first kept in 1980, San Diego State is 22-9 (.710) in its opening games.

The Aztecs return a stellar pitching staff, led by senior Samantha Beasley (San Diego/Steele Canyon HS), a 2010 third-team NFCA All-American, who finished last year ranked seventh in the nation with a 1.20 ERA, while recording a school-record 354 strikeouts.

**KATHY VAN WYK****HEAD COACH | 15TH SEASON | CS FULLERTON, 1983**

- As a player, Van Wyk earned All-America honors and won the Broderick Award, given to the best player in the nation, in 1981 after going 35-1 with a 0.18 ERA. The victories remain a school single-season record and .972 winning percentage was an NCAA Division I record until 2001. Her phenomenal season included four no-hitters, six one-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 26 shutouts and 270 strikeouts.
- Is the school's all-time winningest coach with 475 career victories, including a program-best 44 wins in 2008
- Earned her third Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year award in 2008 after leading the Aztecs to a 15-5 mark in league play. She also won the award in 2002 and 2006.
- Has led SDSU to six NCAA tournament appearances (2001, 2003, 2006, 2008, 2009 and 2010)
- Guided San Diego State to its fourth MWC regular season title in 2008 with a 15-5 record. The team's other championships came in 2002, 2003 and 2006.
- Coached her third All-American in 2010 in Samantha Beasley. Beasley was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Third Team.
- Has coached 46 all-conference selections, seven MWC Pitchers of the Year, four MWC Freshmen of the Year and 87 conference player/pitcher of the week winners

A Brief Look at the 2011 Aztecs

The San Diego State softball team begins its season Friday at the Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament in Los Angeles, Calif., on the campus of UCLA. That's the same place the Aztecs had their season end last spring, when they went 1-2 at the NCAA Los Angeles Regional. In fact, this is the second straight season that SDSU began its year at the place where it ended the previous campaign (also 2010 - began season in Tempe, Ariz., eliminated in NCAA tournament in 2009).

San Diego State lost three starters from last year's team, including four-year starters Brittany Knudsen and Monica Alnes. Knudsen, an outfielder, graduated ranked among the program's all-time top 10 in 22 categories, including leaders in on-base percentage (.432), runs (134, tied), extra-base hits (54, tied), double (36) and walks (99). A first baseman, Alnes ranked among the top 10 in 13 categories.

The future still looks bright, however, as there are four former all-conference selections on the roster, including redshirt senior Lindsey Marquez, senior Samantha Beasley, and juniors Justeen Maeva and Bailey Micetich.

Beasley, a 2010 third-team NFCA All-American, will lead the pitching staff once again after finishing last year ranked seventh in the nation with a 1.20 ERA, while recording a school-record 354 strikeouts. Micetich (2-5, 3.37 ERA) finished last year strong in relief at the NCAA tournament against Fresno State, allowing a single, then retiring 17 consecutive Bulldogs. Sophomore Kameron May (2-0, 0.68 ERA, also batted .308 with 10 RBI) and senior Brooke Petty (1-0, 7.00 ERA) logged 25 1/3 combined innings in 2010.

Both catchers are back for the Aztecs and each will look to contribute at the plate once again after a fine 2010 season. A year ago, Eva Sahatdjian (.299) and Kristin May (.293) each hit four homers and had 21 RBI apiece.

Three-year starter and exciting shortstop Jen Wisneski leads the middle infield, fresh off a year where she led the team with five home runs. Marquez (2007 all-MWC) looks to be healthy and should start at second base for the Aztecs. Maeva returns at first base, a year after earning all-conference honors while batting .362 with a team-high 36 RBI, while junior Ashley Rose came on late last season offensively and played the most at third base in 2010.

Senior Jessica Camello, who last year led the team with the .387 batting average, a mark which was the third-highest average in program history, makes the move from second base to right field this season. Junior Felicia Reifschneider and her 23 career stolen bases (14 in 2010) also returns for SDSU, but sophomore Patrice Jackson won't be available after breaking her leg in fall competition.

Senior Taylor Sutton, sophomore Roshana Lavery and redshirt Devin Gray also return for San Diego State. Non-red-shirt newcomers who should compete right away include Lorena Klopp, Katie Mathis and Hayley Miles.

ond in the MWC at 11-4, picked up 22 points, including two first-place votes. Brigham Young, which has won the league championship the past two years, is predicted to win the title again with 24 points, including the other four first-place votes. The last time a team other than SDSU or BYU won the regular season championship was 2004 (Colorado State). UNLV was picked third with 15 points, followed by Colorado State (13), Utah (11) and New Mexico (5).

Aztecs Receiving Votes in Two Polls

The San Diego State softball team is receiving national recognition heading into the 2010 season with votes in both national polls.

In the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, the Aztecs have 30 votes, the 27th-most in the nation. Illinois and Ohio State are tied for 24th in the poll with 56 votes apiece. SDSU is scheduled to play six of the top 11 in the preseason poll, including top-ranked Arizona and defending champion UCLA twice. All together, San Diego State will play 15 games against 11 opponents in the preseason top 25 and 18 against 14 foes who are ranked or receiving votes in the poll. Last month, ESPN.com writer Graham Hays had the Aztecs at No. 20 in his preseason poll.

In the USA Today/NFCA poll, SDSU picked up one vote, which tied Long Island, Illinois State and Northwestern for 42nd, 50 points behind the top 25 (No. 25 North Carolina, 51 points).

Nuveman Deniz Named to National Team Coaching Pool

San Diego State assistant head coach Stacey Nuveman Deniz has been named to the 2011-12 Women's National Team coaching pool, the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) and USA Softball recently announced. Nuveman Deniz is one of 24 coaches in the pool.

The assistant coaches for the women's and junior women's national team events this summer will be selected from this pool at a later date. The selection committee for the Women's National Team will continue to open the coaches' pool every two years due to the International Softball Federation (ISF) World Championships biennial cycle.

"It's a tremendous honor to be named to the USA Softball coaching pool," Nuveman Deniz said. "I've had the pleasure of representing my country on the national and international stage as a player and it was an incredible experience. To have an opportunity to do it as a coach would be quite humbling."

Entering her third season with the Aztecs, Nuveman Deniz serves as the team's recruiting coordinator, while working predominately with the SDSU hitters. In Nuveman Deniz' two years on Montezuma Mesa, San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA Regionals in both 2009 and 2010, while compiling a combined 67-36 (.650) record.

Over her two seasons as an assistant coach, the Aztecs have improved their batting average from .275 in 2008 (the year before she arrived) to .294 in 2010, and also in runs per game (3.98 to 4.14), home runs per game (0.23 to 0.50) and slugging percentage (.348 to .404).

Nuveman is a three-time Olympic medalist, winning gold in 2000 and 2004, and silver at the 2008 games in Beijing. She's also helped the United States National Team to a World Cup championship (2006), two World Championships (2002 and 2006) and two Pan American gold medals (1999 and 2003).

Nuveman was a four-time first-team NFCA All-American and three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year while at UCLA, finishing her career with four NCAA records - 90 home runs, 299 RBI, .945 slugging percentage and 240 walks.
