San Diego State Opens 2011-12 Campaign Monday vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff

- **When & Where:** Monday, Nov. 14, 2011, Viejas Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7 p.m. (PST)
- **TV:** Live on Channel 4 San Diego, as well as The Mtn., with Chris Ello calling the action.
- **Other Live Media:** Live audio as well as live stats will be available on goaztecs.com. There will be no live video feed for Monday's contest due to television.
- **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 324-237 in 19 seasons, while she is 243-172 in her 14 previous campaigns at SDSU.
- **Arkansas Pine-Bluff Head Coach Cary Shelton:** Shelton is in his third year as the head coach of the Lady Lions, boasting a school and career record of 9-51.
- **Series History:** This is the first all-time meeting between San Diego State and Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The Aztecs boast a 6-1 program record vs. current members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

NEWS & NOTABLES

- San Diego State opens the 36th year of Aztec women's basketball on Monday when its plays host to first-time foe Arkansas-Pine Bluff at Viejas Arena at 7 p.m. PT.
- SDSU is opening a season at home for the second year in a row and the third time in the last four seasons. The last time the Aztecs began a campaign at home in two consecutive years was in 2002-03 and 2003-04.
- Beth Burns is starting the 20th season of her head coaching career and 15th overall at the helm of the Aztecs. Burns is in her seventh season of her second stint on The Mesa.
- Two players are slated to make their first career starts in an SDSU uniform with junior transfer Chelsea Hopkins tabbed for point guard and true freshman Chairese ("Desi") Culberson set for forward.
- The Aztecs have seven players on their current roster

who did not play in a game a year ago, including five true freshmen. One of the freshmen, forward Deajanae Scurry, will redshirt in 2011-12.

■ San Diego State returns two starters in junior guard Courtney Clements and senior guard Sajoyia Griffin from its 12-17 squad a year ago. Six other letterwinners also return this season for Beth Burns.

■ SDSU was picked to finish second in the Mountain West by the media and the league coaches. Junior Chelsea Hopkins was tabbed preseason newcomer of the year, while Desi Culberson was picked as preseason freshman of the year.

UP NEXT

- The Aztecs will head on the road on Wednesday for three games in three days at the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. SDSU will face DePaul, host Hawai'i and Portland.

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 13-0 run midway through the first half to erase an early five-point deficit and go on to defeat visiting UC San Diego, 79-60, last Monday evening at Viejas Arena. The game was the lone exhibition contest for the Aztecs in 2011-12, while it was the third for the Tritons, who fell to 1-2 in such outings.

Junior guard **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** had a team-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting in only 18 minutes of action in her Aztec debut. Sophomore guard **Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.)** made six of her first seven shots from the field to finish with 13 points, while junior **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** was the third SDSU player in double figures with 10 points. Sophomore guard **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)** added eight points and four steals and **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)** contributed a team-best six rebounds and all five blocked shots.

The two sides were tied at 14 points apiece at the 13:41 mark of the first half when the Tritons utilized back-to-back 3-pointers and a lay-up to go up by five points at 19-14. The Aztecs countered with six consecutive baskets in the paint and a free throw to regain the lead at 27-19. UCSD made it a five-point game less than a minute later, but the host went on an 18-4 run to build a 19-point advantage at the half.

San Diego State went up by as many as 24 points, but the Tritons refused to go away, cutting their deficit in half as the Aztecs went without a field goal for just over seven minutes. Hopkins ended the drought with a layup at the 8:40 mark and the home team notched seven of the next nine points before eventually going on to claim a comfortable 19-point victory at 79-60.

The Aztecs shot over 53 percent from the field and 85 percent at the line, but were 0-for-6 from beyond the arc. UCSD, meanwhile, hit five 3-pointers, but had 23 turnovers and 10 fewer rebounds.

FOR OPENERS

San Diego State is beginning at Viejas Arena for the second consecutive year and the third time in the last four seasons. This marks the first time since 2002 and 2003 that the program has opened at home in consecutive campaigns.

This is the fourth time in program history the Aztecs have started their schedule on exactly Nov. 14, and the third occasion in the last six years (also 2006, 2008). Overall, SDSU boasts a 5-3 record when they have started a season prior to Nov. 15.

San Diego State is 19-16 all-time in season-openers since the program's inception in 1976-77, and have won three of the last four. The Aztecs are an amazing 27-8 in home openers and are beginning a campaign in California for the 23rd time.

SDSU has played a season-opener vs. a current member of the Southwestern Athletic Conference twice previously in 1988 vs. Alabama State and in 1989 against Alcorn State. The Aztecs were 1-1 in those outings.

San Diego State is 6-1 all-time vs. SWAC members with the most recent match-up being a 58-53 win

against Prairie View A&M on Nov. 29, 2008, in Honolulu, Hawaii.

WITH A VICTORY

An SDSU victory over the Arkansas-Pine Bluff will mean:

- SDSU improves to 1-0 all-time vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- SDSU is 7-1 vs. current members of the SWAC and has won the last five meetings.
- SDSU wins both its season and home opener for the fourth time in the last five years.

ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF TIDBITS

The Golden Lions played their 2011-12 opener on Saturday, falling at Nebraska, 95-43 ... UAPB was led by Lakendra Marsh's 10 points and eight rebounds ... The Lady Lions, however, had a whopping 47 turnovers and shot only 25 percent from the field ... UABP shot 75 percent from the line, accounting for 21 of its 43 points ... A year ago, Arkansas-Pine Bluff was just 1-28 overall with the lone victory coming against Texas Southern at home in late January ... The Golden Lions, under head coach Cary Shelton, return two starters and six letter-winners ... Chigoziani Okwumabua is her team's leading returning scorer and rebounder from a year ago with 8.8 ppg. and 5.4 rpg. ... Marsh was UAPB's leading 3-point threat last season with 37 to her credit.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first-place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and Mountain West newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's **Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.)** was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past

March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by Hoopgurlz, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

A year ago, current Aztec sophomore Melissa Sweat was named the league's preseason freshman of the year, while former standout Paris Johnson was picked in 2007.

Colorado State senior Kim Mestdagh, who is a two-time second-team all-league selection, was named the preseason player of the year. She was joined by Air Force's Dymond James, New Mexico's Sara Halasz, TCU's Starr Crawford and UNLV Jamie Smith on the preseason all-conference squad. Crawford and Halasz have already been ruled out this season due to injury.

CLARK, HOPKINS TABBED CAPTAINS

Aztec juniors Chelsea Hopkins and Gabrielle Clark were tabbed team captains for the 2011-12 season.

Hopkins sat out a year due to NCAA transfer rules, but was able to practice with the team. The 5-foot-8 guard is expected to start and has two years of collegiate experience under her belt at Duke from 2008-10.

Clark, meanwhile, is entering her fourth season on The Mesa and served as one of the squad's two captains a year ago. She is a two-time winner of the Tammy Blackburn coaches' award and has appeared in 52 career outings, starting twice.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced earlier this month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season. Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

The 6-foot-1 inch forward averaged a double-double at Inglewood High School her senior year and was an all-state pick by *Cal-Hi Sports* as a junior. She was a four-star recruit and rated 31st nationally at the forward position by the *HoopGurlz* website.

BACK AGAIN

San Diego State returns two starters, including senior point guard **Sajoyia Griffin (San Antonio, Texas)** and junior guard Courtney Clements. Six other letterwin-

ners also are back in seniors **Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.)** and **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)**, juniors **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)** and **Malia Nahinu** and sophomores **Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah)** and **Melissa Sweat**. Tutt has played in the most games of any Aztec with 86, while Chambers has come off the bench in 84 outings. Besides those two, only Clark has played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.

NOTING THE NEWCOMERS

Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago.

Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.

The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards **Erimma Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.)**, **Chairese Culberson**, **Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.)** and **Deajanae Scurry** to go with guard **Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.)**. The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.

Overall, five players account for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLI's

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing last Wednesday of forward **Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.)** and point guard **Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors, who are each ranked among the top recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2012.

Brandon attends Centennial High School in Corona, Calif., where she helped the Huskies to a 20-10 record last season as a junior, averaging 10.4 points, seven rebounds, three steals and two blocks per a game. She was a first-team all-league honoree in 2011 and was also tabbed second-team all-CIF.

Brandon was an all-Big 8 Conference pick for the Huskies as a sophomore and more recently, was named an honorable mention girls high school All-American by *The Sporting News*. She is the No. 82 ranked forward nationally and received a three-star scouts grade of 85 by *ESPN's Hoopgurlz* website.

The 6-foot-1 forward plays during the summer for West Coast Premier, which is the same club basketball team that produced current Aztec freshman Ahjalee Harvey, sophomore Kiyana Stamps and junior Chelsea Hopkins under head coach Brian Crichlow. The squad won a pair of AAU events this summer and claimed first place at the prestigious 2010 End of the Oregon Trail tournament.

Brandon currently boasts a 4.1 cumulative grade-point average and her father, David, has been one of her coaches throughout her high school career.

Levi-Dixon is a three-time *Cal-Hi Sports* all-state selection who has led San Diego High to a combined record of 78-21 over the last three seasons. Levi-Dixon has been tabbed a first-team all-CIF pick three times and is the 39th-ranked point guard nationally in this year's recruiting class by *Hoopgurlz*.

As a junior, the 5-foot-6 point guard averaged 21.2 points an outing in leading the Cavers to a 27-7 record and a perfect 10-0 mark in league play in 2010-11. San Diego High has advanced to the CIF championship game two consecutive campaigns, winning the title in 2010 before moving on to the quarterfinals of the state tournament. The Cavers have yet to lose a league game during her career and she has twice been tabbed the conference player of the year.

Levi-Dixon will be following in the footsteps of another former San Diego High alum Paris Johnson, who started every game and was a four-time all-conference honoree for the Aztecs at center from 2008-11.

The three-time first-team all-league pick who boasts a career scoring average of 25 points an outing was an honorable mention All-American by *The Sporting News*. Levi-Dixon also competes in track and field for the Cavers in the high jump and long jump and is interested in majoring in either criminal justice or athletic training at San Diego State.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

For the second campaign in a row, the Aztecs were easily the top ranked school among Mountain West members, as TCU is the only other team listed in the top 60 at No. 40. San Diego State's recruiting class was rated higher than several notable programs including 2011 national runner-up Notre Dame (No. 24), UCLA (No. 19), Georgia Tech (No. 20), West Virginia (No. 21), DePaul (No. 22), LSU (No. 23), Ohio State (No. 25), Georgetown (No. 26) and Arizona State (No. 32).

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, four-star recruits according to *HoopGurlz*, including forward

Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Kristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the Aztec fall signing class.

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

THE WELCOME MAT

Aztec head coach Beth Burns added one new member to her staff over the summer with the hiring of assistant coach Tammi Reiss (pronounced Reese).

Reiss, who will work with the Aztec guards, was an assistant coach for the WNBA Utah Starzz from 2001-02, before joining the franchise in its move to San Antonio in 2003.

The Eldred, N.Y., native spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater, when Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995 and 1996, made it to the Sweet 16 in 1994 and claimed a pair of ACC regular-season titles in 1994 and 1995. Reiss assisted legendary head coach Debbie Ryan in all aspects of the program, including recruiting, game and practice preparation, player development, opponent scouting, film exchange and camp coordination.

One of the all-time greats in Virginia basketball history, she played for the Cavaliers from 1988-92, when the team made three consecutive Final Four appearances and earned two ACC regular-season and tournament titles. Reiss garnered both Kodak and USBWA All-America honors as a senior in 1992, was a four-time all-league honoree and twice was tabbed to the ACC championship all-tournament squad. The guard ended her career ranked first in school history in 3-pointers (139) and 3-point field-goal percentage (.416) and was second in points (1,842) and free throws (437).

Off the court, Reiss excelled in the classroom, where she was honored as an Academic All-American as a senior and was a three-time conference all-academic pick. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from UVA in sports management in 1992, and was selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th anniversary women's basketball team in 2002.

Following her collegiate career, Reiss was chosen by the Utah Starzz in the first round (fifth pick overall) of the inaugural WNBA Draft in 1997.

WOODS PROMOTED

San Diego State head basketball coach Beth Burns announced this past April that Jualeah Woods has been promoted to the position of associate head coach.

Woods came to The Mesa in May of 2005, and is beginning her 14th season as an NCAA Division I assistant coach.

Since Woods' arrival, the Aztecs have won a Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament title, and recorded back-to-back NCAA appearances, including a trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 2010. On the court, she helped tutor four-time all-conference center

Paris Johnson, who finished her career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and consecutive starts. Woods also mentored 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year forward Jessika Bradley, who was tabbed a third-team all-league pick as a senior.

2010-11 REWIND

Here are some of team's notes from last season:

- SDSU won at least 12 games for the fifth consecutive season and advanced to the championship game of each of its three non-conference tournaments.

- The Aztecs had 11 contests decided by five or fewer points and nine by three or less, including six in league play. Only five of the team's 17 losses were by more than 10 points and the 10 regular-season conference defeats were by 74 total points. SDSU also had at least a four-point lead in 13 of 17 losses.

- SDSU set a Mountain West record for most blocked shots in league play with 115 to its credit. The Aztecs easily surpassed the previous high of 101 set by the 2008-09 SDSU squad.

- San Diego State finished fifth nationally with 6.4 blocks per game. The Aztecs trailed only Baylor (7.4), Saint Mary's (6.8), High Point (6.7) and North Carolina (6.5) in that category and had 34 more blocks than any other Mountain West squad, despite playing the fewest number of games.

- SDSU led the MWC and ranked 27th nationally in three-point field-goal defense (28.1). Opponents failed to shoot above 30 percent from three-point land in 17 of the 29 contests.

- Senior Coco Davis led the Mountain West and ranked fifth nationally in assists per game with a 6.3 mark. Her 428 career assists rank third in school history.

- Senior center Paris Johnson capped a phenomenal collegiate career by becoming the school's all-time leader in career blocks (267) and consecutive starts (126). She also was only the third player in school history to score 1,500 points.

AWARD CENTRAL

Three San Diego State women's basketball players, seniors Paris Johnson (third team) and Jessika Bradley (third team) and sophomore Courtney Clements (honorable mention) each earned Mountain West Conference postseason honors in 2011. Clements also became the second Aztec in a row to claim MWC Newcomer-of-the-Year honors, while Johnson was tabbed to the all-defensive team for the second time in the last three seasons.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has four of its recent stand-outs playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wilkp.) is in Poland.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-

time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the Eurobasket.com All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season. Gone are traditional powers BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Eilo will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

Burns was tabbed to the new position by current WBCA president and Arizona State head coach Charli Turner Thorne. Burns will be completing the final year of the three-year term of former secretary and Notre Dame associate head coach Carol Owens, who moved to a new position on the board as the representative for the Black Coaches & Administrators.

As WBCA secretary, Burns keeps track of the board's documents and records, ensures accuracy of meeting minutes and keeps the board posted on meeting dates and times. She also would assume the duties of the WBCA president in the absence of the board president

and vice president.

Last summer, she was reelected to what would have been a three-year term on the Board of Directors as a Division I at-large representative. In 2009, she finished the final year of Thorne's term when Thorne was named the organization's vice president.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 19-year overall head coaching record of 324-237, while her school record stands at 243-172 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.
