This will be the 53rd meeting between the teams with San Diego State owning a 35-17 series advantage. This marks the fifth neutral site meeting between the teams, with the Aztecs claiming three of the four neutral site wins. The Aztecs have won two of the three previous conference tournament meetings, dropping a 70-64 decision in the first round of the 1990 WAC Tournament (in El Paso, Texas), winning 58-51 in the first round of the 1991 WAC Tournament (in Laramie, Wyo.) and winning 80-69 in the first round of the 1996 WAC Tournament Albuquerque, N.M.). The Falcons have won four straight overall in the series although SDSU has won 17 of the last 25 meetings dating back to the 1992-93 season.

Glory's Last Chance; Sixth-Seeded San Diego State Opens Sixth Mountain West Conference Championship Against Third-Seeded Air Force on National TV Thursday Night

San Diego State (10-17 overall; 4-10 Mountain West Conference) begins pursuit of its second MWC championship when the sixth-seeded Aztecs take on third-seeded Air Force (18-11; 9-5 MWC) in the final quarterfinal game of the sixth annual MWC Tournament at Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo.

The 53rd meeting between the team and the fourth postseason meeting between the Aztecs and Falcons will begin at 10 p.m. MST/9 p.m. PST and will be shown nationally on ESPN. The game can be heard in southern California on XPRES 1090-AM.

San Diego State, which is playing a predominately nine-man rotation made up of two seniors, three juniors, two sophomores and two freshmen, is not your typical six seed. Just consider the following:

- ▶ SDSU outscored its MWC opposition in the first half by a 442-441 score.
- ▶ SDSU lost seven conference games in which it held a
- second half lead. ▶ SDSU lost four league games that were a one possession
- game with four seconds or less remaining in the second half. ▶ SDSU led more than 27 minutes in three of its MWC
- ▶ SDSU lost three conference games in which it led by at least 11 points.
- ▶ SDSU lost three league games in overtime.
- ▶ SDSU lost two MWC games in which it led with less than 10 seconds to play in the second half.

The Aztecs, who claimed the 2002 conference title from the fifth-seeded position, are 3-4 all-time in the MWC tournament, 17-17 all-time in Division I conference tournaments and 13-7 in the opening game of Division I conference tournaments.

San Diego State owns a 35-17 all-time series lead over Air Force. The Aztecs have won two of the three postseason meeting between the teams. All three occurred while the teams were in the Western Athletic Conference, with the Falcons winning in 1990 and the Aztecs posting victories in 1991 and 1996. Air Force has won four straight in the series overall, with SDSU's last victory coming on Feb. ored by the league. 22, 2003.

Young Aztecs Earn AII-MWC Honors

Three San Diego State underclassmen earned recognition on the Mountain West Conference all-league teams announced Monday.

The Aztecs' sophomore tandem of Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter each earned a spot on the league's secondteam. The duo were two of only three underclassmen on the three five-player teams.

Brandon Heath is ranked fifth in the league in scoring and assists. A native of Los Angeles, Heath has produced nine 20point scoring games this season and leads the Aztecs in scoring (17.7 ppg) and assists (94).

Marcus Slaughter is sixth in the league in scoring and second in rebounding. He has 10 double-double games this season and has scored in double figures in all 25 games he has played in this season. He is averaging 17.3 ppg and owns a team-best average of 9.0 rpg.

Freshman Matt Thomas earned honorable mention allconference honors. He is fourth on the team in scoring at 6.2 ppg and is averaging 3.2 rpg. He has made eight starts, including five straight and was one of only two freshmen players hon-

- Thursday's quarterfinal game between Air Force and San Diego State features the only four players from the Mountain West Conference first and second teams expected to return the following season. Of the 10 players on the two teams, five are seniors and one is expected to leave the college ranks (Andrew Bogut). That leaves SDSU's Marcus Slaughter and Brandon Heath and Air Force's Nick Welch and Antoine Hood as the only four players expected to return in 2005-06.

San Diego State-Air Force: The Series

- San Diego State and Air Force are meeting for the *- The San Diego State-Air 53rd time, with the Aztecs holding a 35-17 series lead.
- ▶ The Aztecs own a 3-1 advantage in games played on neutral ground.
- It used to be like clockwork. When SDSU and Air Force got together, the team with the halftime lead would go on to win the game. In fact, the team leading sophomores Marcus Slaughter at intermission had won 10 straight coming into the and Brandon Heath and Falcon 2004-05 campaign. But this year is the exception. The juniors Nick Welch and Antoine Aztecs led at the break in Colorado Springs (Jan. 29), 25-24, only to lose, 62-50. A month later, on Feb. 28, in San Diego, SDSU went into the locker room up three, 33-30, but could not overcome 27.3 percent shooting in the second half and wound up losing, 77-57.
- As mentioned above, the Aztecs held halftime leads in both games this year. The key to establishing that lead has been hot shooting and good defense. In the Jan. 29 game, the Aztecs outshot the Falcons 64.7 percent to 41.7 percent in the first half. In the Feb. 28 game, SDSU connected on 52.2 percent of its shots as compared to Air Force's 42.3 percent in the first 20 minutes. only two freshmen to earn all-
- Despite the score of the last meeting, SDSU led for Mountain West Conference more than a quarter of the game, 12:46 to be exact, and enjoyed a lead of six points on two different occasions. The contest was close throughout with Air Force holding a single digit lead as late as the 2:17 mark in the sec-free throws in that contest.
- ▶ Although the final score may not represent it, the two Slaughter tied his career-high games this year have been a see-saw battles. The first meeting featured four ties and 10 lead changes, while the second game saw the lead change four times and was tied on five different occasions.
- ▶ In eight of the last nine years in which the teams have Colorado Springs. He missed met, one team has swept the season series from the the rematch in San Diego with a other. In 1996 (three games), 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2003, the Aztecs broke out the broom, while in 2000, 2004 and 2005, Air Force won both meetings. The only time since 1996 that there was not a season sweep was in 2002 field (13-of-21) in three career when each team defended its home court.
- ▶ The Falcons current win streak of four straight is their longest in the series. The Aztecs have won seven consecutive meetings with Air Force on two ocassions, most recently from Jan. 20, 1996 through Feb. 7, 1998.
- ▶ The Aztecs have never lost three games to the Falcons in a single season.
- ▶ The series with the Falcons is the only MWC match-up in which the Aztecs hold the all-time lead. The 35-17 lead is 14 games better than the Aztecs' next closest series against a conference foe, a 23-33 deficit to Wyoming.

Game Storylines

- Force game will feature the only four players from the all-Mountain West Conference first- and second-teams expected to return next season. Aztec Hood are four of the five nonseniors on the first two teams. The other, Utah sophomore Andrew Bogut is expected to play professionally next season. - San Diego State lost five Mountain West Conference games in which it led at the half,

- ▶ The two schools have never faced in the Mountain West Conference tournament, but have met three times in the WAC tournament, the last time being in 1996. In postseason tournament games, the Aztecs own a 2-1 record. Their lone loss came on March 7, 1990 in overtime when they fell, 70-64, in Laramie, Wyo.
- ▶ Reaching 60 points in Thursday's game seems to be a key to victory for the Aztecs against the Falcons. Going back to the 1990-91 season over 27 meetings, SDSU has won all but one game (16-1) against Air Force in which it scored 60 or more points. Air Force also needs to reach the 60-point mark the Falcons are 12-3 this year when scoring at least 60 and 6-8 when scoring less.
- ▶ Series Trends: The team ahead at the half has won 10 of the last 12 games in the series (both losses have come this season)... The team with the fewest turnovers has won seven of the last eight games in the series... Since Feb. 24, 2000, teams that reach 60 points are 9-0... Since the formation of the MWC, SDSU is 5-2 when committing 18 or less turnovers in a game and 0-5 vs. Air Force when committing 19 or more turnovers... Four of the last six games that SDSU has lost, the Aztecs have turned the ball over exactly 19 times.

EARLIER MEETING THIS SEASON AND LAST MEETING IN COX

Air Force 77, San Diego State 57 | Feb. 28, 2005 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - Air Force connected on 13 three-point field goals, shot 52.8 percent from the field and ended the game on a 17-5 run to break open a close game and defeat San Diego State 77-57 on Feb. 28 at Cox Arena.

Playing with out sophomore Marcus Slaughter due to a sprained left toe, the Aztecs fell behind 14-7. But San Diego State battled back on senior night and used a 24-11 run to build a six-point advantage before settling for a 33-30 lead at intermission.

San Diego State scored its first 27 points of the game without tapping into its two leading scorers on the season. Brandon Heath (18.0) and Slaughter (17.3), who had accounted for 50.9 percent of SDSU's points this season, did not score a point until Heath converted made a pair of free throws with 3:39 to play in the first half.

After committing just three turnovers in the first half, SDSU turned the ball over three times in the first 4:20 of the second half. Air Force tied the game at 37 on Antoine Hood's layup off a pass from Nick Welch. That was part of an 11-0 Falcon run, which resulted in a 46-39 Air Force lead with 12:41 remaining.

San Diego State cut an 11-point deficit to eight with 3:08 to play, but was unable to get any closer.

The Falcons shot 52.8 percent from the field in the contest, while the Aztecs converted on just 40.0 percent from the field.

SDSU was led by true freshman Matt Thomas, who connected on 12-of-13 free throws and ended the game with 20 points. Heath and junior forward Triamine Davis each contributed 10 points and five rebounds.

With the win, Air Force (13-7, 4-1 Mountain West) moved into sole possession of second place in the conference and gained its 23rd consecutive win at home, the nation's second-longest home winning streak.

The Falcons started cold from three-point range and trailed by a point at the half.

Air Force's Nick Welch made a layup with 13:48 left in the game to start a 10-1 run for the Falcons early in the second half. Welch finished with 10 points.

A three-pointer by Tim Keller put Air Force up 41-30 with 10:10 left to play. The Falcons made 4-of-15 shots from three-point range in the first half but in the second half made 6-of-11.

A three-pointer by the Falcon's Marc Holum with 9:14 to play started another run that ended with a 3-pointer by Matt McCraw at 2:41 that put Air Force up 54-37. Keller finished with 12 points, while McCraw finished with 11. Burtschi also contributed on defense with five defensive rebounds and four steals.

Hitting shots from the low post and mid-range, San Diego State shot 64 percent from the field in the first half, with Marcus Slaughter going 4-for-4 for eight points, while Brandon Heath went 3-for-5 for eight points in the half.

San Diego State (9-9, 3-2) led 25-24 at the break and could have led by more had it made more than 1-of-8 free-throw attempts in the first half.

LAST SDSU VICTORY IN THE SERIES

San Diego State 49, Air Force 47 | Mar. 2, 2003 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State shredded the NCAA's top scoring defense with a season-best 61.4 percent shooting performance and snapped a three-game losing skid with a 67-53 win over Air Force at Cox Arena.

The Aztecs completed the season series sweep of the Falcons behind a 28-point performance from Tony Bland while making 27-of-44 field goal attempts for the highest percentage yielded by Air Force to date.

Mike Mackell chipped in 16 points as SDSU gained its third straight win over the Academy and improved to 7-0 in 2002-03 when holding the opposition to fewer than 60 points.

The teams traded the lead 10 times and were tied on seven other occasions as the Falcons hit 8-of-10 three-pointers and the Aztecs shot the ball at a 66.7 percent clip in the first half. Neither team led by more than three points over the first 17 minutes of the first period, until the Aztecs went on an 8-0 run behind five straight Bland points and a Steve Sir three-pointer to take a 39-32 lead.

SDSU maintained at least a seven-point lead the rest of the way as the Aztecs never yielded back-to-back baskets in the second half. Air Force cut the lead to 55-48 with 6:19 left, but San Diego State responded with a 12-2 run highlighted by an alley-oop dunk from Trimaine Davis.

Bland and Mackell combined for 44 of the Aztecs' 67 points and shot 18-for-22. Tommy Johnson came off the bench to provide a defensive spark with a career-high three steals.

Aztec Cliff Notes

San Diego State (10-17 overall/4-10 Mountain West Conference) has been competitive throughout the season while facing one of the most challenging schedules in school history. The Aztecs have done this while having the senior class miss 59 games due to illness, injury and suspension. What looked like one of the most experience teams in school history has had to rely heavily upon underclassmen due to the dismissal of Wesley Stokes (who started 28 of 30 games a year ago) and injuries to Chris Walton (groin pull/hip flexor, missed 10 games) and Travis Hanour (tendinitis, missed 23 games).

The result has been an exciting, and somewhat inconsistent, season with a number of first and second year players making an immediate impact. And the Aztecs have been close to making an impact this season, losing four games in overtime and another three games by four points or less.

San Diego State has played with a predominately nine-man rotation since the return of Walton. The Aztecs have started 15 different lineups, 13 of which have started two games or less together.

The most consistent player for SDSU this season has been 6-8 sophomore forward

Marcus Slaughter. Second on the team in scoring (17.3) and leading the team in rebounding (9.0), Slaughter has been a consistent threat for the Aztecs having scored in double figures every game he has played in this season and leading the team in scoring 11 times and rebounding 19 times. He started the first 25 games of the season but saw his consecutive games started streak broken at 42 when he missed SDSU's last two contests vs. Air Force and at Utah. He earned sec-

ond-team all-conference honors and is one of two SDSU candidates for preseason MWC player of the year next season. Joining Slaughter in the frontcourt are Mohamed Camara, Trimaine Davis, Chris Manker and Chris Walton. Typically the Aztecs have started three guards leaving one of the aforementioned players to join Slaughter on the front line.

Senior <u>Chris Walton</u> (6.4 ppg, 2.6 rpg) plays both the three and four positions for the Aztecs. He played the opener and then missed a month (nine games) due to a hip flexor/groin strain injury. He is still bothered by the injury, but has returned to play 21 or more minutes in all except two conference games (missing the Brigham Young game and playing 14 minutes against UNLV due to the flu). He has had a couple of terrific performances. He had 12 points, six rebounds and a game-winning shot at Brigham Young followed by 11 points, four rebounds and two assists in the victory at UNLV. He was 10-of-11 from the field and had a career-high 23 points in the victory over Colorado State. He has scored in double figures in five of his last 13 games.

Junior <u>Mohamed Camara</u> (2.6 ppg, 4.0 rpg, 18 blks.) is the Aztecs biggest post presence at 6-10, 265. He has only been playing basketball since 1999 and is continuing to develop his offensive skills. Had his best game of the season against Providence on Dec. 31 when he matched his career best with seven points and added a career-high 13 rebounds. He has seven or more rebounds in a game six times this season.

Senior Chris Manker (6.9 ppg, 2.7 rpg, 1.0 apg) exploded out of the gate and is putting together the best season of his career. Always a threat from behind the arc, the 7-0 center has emerged as a post option. This season he has 47 two-point field goals, 30 more than he had all of last season. He also has 64 career three-point goals. Most impressive, Manker leads the Aztecs in hockey +/-, as SDSU has outscored its opposition by 44 points when he is on the floor and been outscored by 112 points when he is out of the game.

Junior <u>Trimaine Davis</u> (5.2 ppg, 2.2 rpg) is playing the best basketball of his career. He is coming off the best stretch of games in his career posting career highs in points (12), rebounds (eight) and assists (two) against Brigham Young (Feb.

7) and following that up with nine points, seven rebounds in 29 minutes against UNLV (Feb. 12). He has four double-digit games in his last sseven outings, connecting on 28-of-41 (68.3 percent) shots during that stretch and is shooting 59.2 percent from the field this season. With 10 points against Air Force and at Utah in SDSU's last two games, the junior has scored in double figures in consecutive games for the first time in his career. As has always been the case, Davis is an enthusiastic player who took over the duties of team captain in Walton's absence.

Turning to the backcourt, the other staple in the Aztec lineup is sophomore guard <u>Brandon Heath</u> (leading scorer at 17.9 ppg, team-high 3.4 apg, 3.5 rpg). Heath has started 26-of-27 games this season, has 25 double-digit scoring games this season and has connected on a three-point field goal in 22 of his last 28 games. A graduate of Westchester High, Heath scored nine of San Diego State's last 11 points against the Cougars and followed that up with a career-high 37 points in the victory at UNLV. The sophomore has 19 career 20-point scoring games, and has 127 points in his last six games (21.2 ppg). He snaped out of an 0-for-9 shooting slump from three-point range by connecting on five consecutive threes against Utah on Saturday.

The rest of the backcourt consists of John Sharper, Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas.

Junior John Sharper (5.9 ppg, 1.1 rpg) is once again flirting with shooting 40 percent from three-point range. Fourth on the school's career three-point field goal percentage charts, he has started 18 games this season and played at least 13 minutes in all 27 games. He has a three-point field goal in eight straight games, connecting on 12-of-30 (40.0 percent) from bonus distance during that stretch.

Walk-on true freshman Tyler Smith (2.4 ppg, 1.7 rpg, 1.2 apg) has been the surprise of the year for San Diego State. Smith has started eight of the last 18 games and is second on the Aztec team in hockey +/-. This season, when he is on the court, the Aztecs have outscored their opposition by 12 points. When he is off the court, SDSU has been outscored by 80 points. He has made 12 of his last 19 three-point field goal attempts (63.2 percent) and had a career-best six assists at Brigham Young and a career-high 12 points in the home victory over Brigham Young.

True freshman Matt Thomas (6.4 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 1.6 apg) plays the point position for the Aztecs when he is on the floor. He has made nine starts this season, including six straight, and has seen action in all 27 games. An explosive player, Thomas has the ability to get around defenders and has double-digit scoring performances at Washington (14 points), vs. Saint Mary's (10 points), at New Mexico (14 points), vs. UNLV when he recorded his first double-double with 14 points and a career-high 10 rebounds, at Wyoming (11 points, nine rebounds), a career-high 20 points vs. Air Force and 14 points at Utah. He has scored in double figures in four of his last six games and has scored in double figures in consecutive games for the first time in his career.

See You in the Finals Next Year?

San Diego State and Air Force, two teams that should garner a lot of attention for preseason recognition meet in the quarterfinal round of the conference tournament on Saturday. Both teams feature a pair of second-team all-MWC players scheduled to return next season and return the bulk of their major contributors for the 2005-06 season as the box on the next page illustrates.

Thursday's game will feature the only four players from the Mountain West Conference first and second teams slated to return next season (other six players are comprised of five seniors and Utah's Andrew Bogut).

San Diego State's sophomore tandem of Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter were both on the all-MWC second-team and joined Bogut as the only sophomore on any of the three teams. Air Force placed juniors Nick Welch and Antoine Hood on the second team.

The Bad Luck Aztecs

If it wasn't for bad luck, the Aztecs would have no luck at all. The 10-17 record this season does not begin to demonstrate how close the Aztecs have been to having a solid if not Non-Seniors a terrific season. In 2004-05, San Diego State has lost three games in which they have led Pct. Total Minutes By with less than a minute remaining and six games that were a one possession contest with less than 25 seconds to play in regulation.

A trend that started last season, since the beginning of the 2003-04 season, San Diego State has now lost six games in which it led with less than a minute to play in regulation, 12 games that were a one possession contest with less than 25 seconds to play in regulation and are 0-6 in overtime.

This season, SDSU is 4-10 in conference, but 0-4 in games decided by four points or less or in overtime.

Other tidbits in San Diego State's 17 losses this season:

- ▶ The Aztecs have led in the final 10 minutes of the game: 8 games
- ▶ San Diego State led for more than 20 minutes of the game: 5 games
- ▶ Lost a game it led at half: 5 games
- ▶ Owned double-digit lead: 3 games

The four overtime losses match Idaho State for the most losses in an extra session this season among the 330 Division I schools with an RPI Ramking.

Can We Catch A Break?

Last season San Diego State finished 14-16 but were just a couple of key possessions away from not only posting a fourth consecutive .500 or better record, but also making an O4 MWC Record vs. a appearance in a third straight postseason.

In 2003-04, San Diego State lost three games they led with 59 seconds to go in regulation, lost six games that were a one possession contest with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games that SDSU led with 13:48 to go in regulation.

Spliting the six games that were a one possession contest with 25 seconds or less remaining that SDSU lost, would have given the Aztecs a 17-13 record.

Unfortunately, that trend has continued into the 2004-05 season. Of the Aztecs 17 losses this season, eight were a one possession game with under three minutes to play and six were a one possession game with less than 25 seconds to play in regulation.

- ▶ vs. UCSB, ot-L, 72-80. Aztecs shoot just 38.8 percent from the field but succeed from rallying from 10 points down to force overtime before suffering season-opening loss.
- ▶ vs. California, L, 57-60. Once again, San Diego State rallies from a double-digit deficit, trail by one point with 5:55 to play and have the ball down three when a three-point field goal attempt bounces off the rim as the clock expires.
- ▶ vs. Saint Mary's, L, 64-73. Stop us if you have heard this before. San Diego State, which trailed by 11 points at one time, rallies to take a one-point lead with 3:04 to play, but can't hold on to the lead.
- ▶ at Loyola Marymount, L, 68-72. Aztecs lead for 23:44 of the game and enjoyed a sevenpoint lead in the first half and a six-point lead in the second half. SDSU led with seven minutes remaining and trailed by two points with the ball with just over two minutes to
- vs. Providence, L, 67-76. San Diego State leads for more than 21 minutes of the game, leads by as many as sevn points and a five-point second-half lead. SDSU has more rebounds, more free throw attempts and fewer turnovers but can not overcome 34.9 percent shooting.
- ▶ vs. Wyoming, ot-L, 81-88. Aztecs led by as many as 11 points, had a three-point lead with 2:58 to play, a two-point lead with 1:03 to play, a one-point lead with 45 seconds leftand had two two point leads in overtime before losing.
- ▶ vs. UNLV, ot-L, 91-93. SDSU led by 18 points in the second half and by 10 points with under 30 secoonds to play before frantic UNLV rally forced overtime. SDSU led 39:09 of the contest.
- ▶ at Colorado State, ot-L, 88-93. Aztecs had a 14-point first half advantage, owned a four-point lead with under a minute to play and was up two with under 10 seconds to play in regulation.
- ▶ at Wyoming, L, 65-69. San Diego State rallies from 14 points down to take the lead and is down by just two points in the final minute despite shooting just 35.8 percent from the field in the game.
- ▶ vs. Air Force, L, 57-77. Playing without sophomore sensation Marcus Slaughter, the Aztecs lead by as many as six points in the first half and own a three-point advantage after 20 minutes.

For Openers

Overall, San Diego State is 13-7 in opening round/preliminary round games, including 1-4 in the Mountain West Conference with the win coming in the 2002 title run. SDSU has lost its last two first-round games. Only once in its history has San Diego State lost its first tournament game in three straight seasons (1988, 1989, 1990).

Mountain West History

San Diego State is 3-4 in the Mountain West Tournament. The Aztecs' three victories are tied for fifth most in the league with Wyoming. The Aztecs are 1-4 all-time in the first round and 1-0 in both the semifinals and championship game.

Against The Falcons

San Diego State has never faced Air Force in the Mountain West Tournament. However, dating back to the Western Athletic Conference, the Aztecs are 2-1 vs. Air Force in postseason play. The Falcons knocked off San Diego State in a 1990 WAC preliminary game, 70-64, in overtime. SDSU bounced back the next season to defeat the Falcons, 58-51, in another prelim game. In 1996, San Diego State defeated Air Force, 80-69, in a preliminary game.

Six Seed

When entering a postseason tournament as a sixth seed, San Diego State has a 2-3 record including an 0-1 mark in the Mountain West. San Diego State entered the 2004 Mountain West Tournament as a six seed and lost to No. 3 Utah, 75-69. SDSU has never reached the championship game as a sixth seed in any conference.

Three Feats

San Diego State is 4-4 all-time when facing a three seed, including a win over third-seeded UNLV in the 2002 tournament championship game. Only three times in their history have the Aztecs played in a 3-6 matchup and twice they came away with the upset win. In 1986, the sixth-seeded Aztecs knocked off No. 3 Utah, 73-71 in the WAC quarters. In 1998, SDSU was a sixth seed out of the Pacific division when it upset No. 3 Mountain division rep Wyoming, 60-57, in overtime

No Deficit too Big, No Lead too Safe

This season, the Aztecs have made a habit out of rallying from large deficits for victory while also knowing the sting of surrendering a big lead in defeats.

San Diego State overcame an 18-point deficit to defeat Monmouth earlier this season, the largest comeback of the Steve Fisher era, but also surrendered an 18-point advantage in the loss to UNLV.

Three times this season in conference play San Diego State has been unable to hold a double-digit advantage in conference losses to UNLV and Colorado State. In those two games, both overtime losses, the Aztecs led for 70:12 and trailed for just 9:49. Had the Aztecs been able to hold on to those three double-digit leads in conference play, SDSU would be 7-3 in league play and in sole possession of second place in the conference.

Below is a look at the biggest deficits overcome for victory and the largest leads surrendered in defeats this season.

Relying on the Underclassmen

Most people expected big things from San Diego State's senior class in 2004-05. With six players entering their final season on the Mesa, SDSU looked to be loaded with experience.

But due to injuries and other circumstances, the six seniors on the Aztec squad - Travis Hanour, Jared Ines, Tommy Johnson, Chris Manker, Wesley Stokes and Chris Walton - have played a total of 72 games, made 22 starts, scored 327 points, pulled down 136 rebounds and have 65 assists through 27 games.

Right now, the Aztec senior class is accounting for 20.7 percent of the minutes played, 17.7 percent of the scoring, 17.5 percent of the rebounding and 20.1 percent of the assists. That means the Aztecs are on pace to return players responsible for about 80 percent of those major statistical categories next season.

Despite having six members in its class, the seniors trail both the junior class (with three members) and sophomore class (with two members) in starts, minutes played, scoring and rebounds per game.

There may be hope on the horizon for the class, with Chris Walton returning from injuries to play recently. In addition, don't underestimate the importance of the senior class as SDSU is 5-0 when the group scores at least 20 points in a game. Although the senior class has accounted for just 59 of SDSU's last 543 points (10.9 percent).

Aztec Trends

Here are a couple of trends to look for on Saturday.

- ▶ In 28 of SDSU's last 29 games dating back to last season, the team that has had a higher field goal percentage has won the game.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 10-1 this season and 64-20 in the Fisher era when shooting better than their opponent. SDSU is 0-16 this season and 14-75, with 19 consecutive losses, when it has a lower field goal percentage.
- ▶ San Diego State is 10-8 this season when shooting at least 40 percent from the field (losses at nationally-ranked Washington, in overtime to Wyoming, at Air Force, at New Mexico, in overtime at Colorado State, vs. New Mexico and vs. Air Force, at Utah) and 0-9 when connecting on less than 40 percent of its shots.
- San Diego State is 9-5 when scoring more points than its opponent in the paint and 1-12 when scoring the same or fewer points in the paint.
- San Diego State is 5-0 this season when the senior class (Chris Manker, Chris Walton, Tommy Johnson, Travis Hanour and Jared Ines) contribute at least 20 points. The senior class had two points against Utah, was held without a point against Brigham Young, had 18 points at Colorado State and had six points at Wyoming. Of San Diego State's last 543 points, only 59 have been scored by members of the senior class (10.9 percent).
- ▶ Mohamed Camara: San Diego State is 4-4 this season when he shoots 50 percent or better from the floor.
- ▶ <u>Brandon Heath</u>: San Diego State is 3-2 this season and 8-3 in his career when Heath shoots 50 percent or better from the field... The Aztecs are 5-3 this season and 11-5 in his career when he posts an efficiency rating of +16 or better... SDSU is 7-6 this season when he has more assists than turnovers... Aztecs are 7-1 this season when he posts five assists or more in a game.
- ▶ <u>Chris Manker</u>: San Diego State is 4-3 this season and 11-4 in Manker's career when he blocks a shot... Dating back to his days at Oregon State, Manker's teams are 14-5 when he blocks a shot... SDSU is 15-12 in his career when Manker shoots 50 percent or better from the field... Aztecs are 5-1 this season when Manker records five or more rebounds.
- ▶ <u>John Sharper</u>: San Diego State is 12-10 since the beginning of the 2003-04 season when Sharper connects on multiple three-point field goals... Aztecs are 10-8 this season when he has two turnovers or less in a game.
- ▶ <u>Marcus Slaughter</u>: The Aztecs are 4-2 this season when Slaughter posts an efficiency rating of +20 or better... San Diego State is 3-3 this season when Slaughter shoots better than 50 percent from the field.
- ▶ <u>Tyler Smith</u>: San Diego State is 7-4 when he scores a point... The Aztecs are 4-0 when he has three or more assists... SDSU is 6-5 when he has more assists than turnovers.
- ▶ <u>Chris Walton</u>: San Diego State has won eight of its last 10 games and was 5-0 last season when Walton attempted at least four free throws... SDSU is 3-1 this season and 11-6 in his career when Walton scores in double figures.

Winning vs. Losing

If you look at San Diego State statistics in victories and losses, it is hard to believe the same team that has won 10 games, four by 15 or more points, is the same team that has lost 17 games, eight of which were a one possession game with less than three minutes remaining.

- ▶ The most glaring statistic is field goal percentage, where the Aztecs have shot 48.6 percent in 10 victories and 39.7 percent in 17 losses, a difference of 8.9 percent. In 28 of San Diego State's last 29 games dating back to last season, the team with the better field goal percentage has won. The Aztecs have lost 19 consecutive games when an opponent has a higher field goal percentage.
- ▶ To the surprise of no one, Aztec opponents are shooting better, 10.5 percent to be precise, in Aztec losses vs. Aztec wins. Holding opponents below 40.0 percent from the field has been a good omen, not only this season but during the Fisher era. The Aztecs are 36-6 when their opponent shoots 40 percent or less from the field.
- ▶ Another trend to look for is the rebound war. The Aztecs are pratically even, with a +1.2 rebound margin in victories and a -5.6 rebound margin in losses, a swing of 6.9 rebounds per game. San Diego State is 5-5 this season and 53-35 in the Fisher era when owning a rebound advantage. Meanwhile, San Diego State is just 26-59 during Fisher's six seasons when facing a disadvantage on the glass.



The Brandon Heath Experience



Sophomore guard Brandon Heath has enjoyed an impressive sophomore season, ranking among the league leaders in scoring (17.9) and assists (3.6). In all games, the sophomore joins Wyoming's Jay Straight as the only players in the league to rank in the top five of both scoring and assists. He is second in steals, fifth in scoring, fifth in minutes played, fifth in assists, seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio, eighth in free throw percentage and 10th in three-point field goals made

In Mountain West Conference games only, he ranks first in steals, fourth in scoring, sixth in assists, seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio, ninth in free throw percentage and 13th in three-point field goals made.

The scoring output Heath has produced in the two games against UNLV and Wyoming was the fifth highest total in consecutive games in school history and the highest since Anthony Watson scored 72 points (school-record 54 vs. U.S. International and 18 at Texas-El Paso) during the 1985-86 season. Below is a look at the most points scored in consecutive games during the Division I era. All four efforts that rank in front of Heath were produced by seniors and read like a who's who of Aztec basketball - school two-year scoring leader and 1979 all-WAC first-team Kim Goetz, 1984 All-American Michael Cage (twice) and 1986 WAC Player of the Year Anthony Watson.

Other tidbits on Heath's oustsanding season and career.

- ▶ Although his career consists of just 57 games, he is already 18th on the school's Division I career scoring chart with 895 points. His scoring average of 15.7 is the seventh-highest in the Division I era.
- ▶ One of only two MWC players (along with Utah's Andrew Bogut) to win multiple conference player of the week honors this season.
- ▶ As previously noted, he joins Wyoming senior Jay Straight as the only MWC players to rank among the league's top five in both scoring and assists.
- ▶ On the SDSU career charts, he is 7th in scoring average (15.7), 4th in three-point field goals attempted (298), 7th in three-point field goals (91), 8th in free throw percentage (76.6), 12th in steals (100), 13th in field goals attempted (766) and 18th in points (895) and 17th in free throws made (196).

Slaughter House Rules



Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter has gotten off to an explosive start this season. An honorable mention all-conference selection as a freshman and a second-team all-MWC selection this season, Slaughter is averaging 17.3 ppg and a team-high 9.0 rebounds. Entering the tournament, he ranked among the league leaders in rebounding (2nd), scoring (6th), blocked shots (8th) and steals (9th) and minutes played (4th).

Other notes on Slaughter's tremendous season.

▶ He has produced double-digit scoring games in all 25 games he has played in this season marking the first time in his career the sophomore has scored 10 or more points in as many as three consecu-

tive games. He had eight double-figure scoring games all of last season. His streak of 25 consecutive games is the second longest active streak in the MWC to Andrew Bogut of Utah. It is also the longest streak by an Aztec player since Mike Mackell tallied 10 or more points in 26 straight games during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons.

- ▶ Slaughter has 10 double-doubles this season, matching the school record for double-doubles by a sophomore set by Eddy Gordon in 1980 and matched by Michael Cage in 1982. The 10 double-doubles are the seventh highest total in a single-season since the stat has been tracked beginning with the 1975-76 season. Slaughter has 12 career double-doubles, including six in his last 10 games.
- ▶ He led the Aztecs in scoring just once last season but has already led SDSU in scoring in 11 of the first 25 games this season.
- ▶ He has attempted 182 free throws in 25 games which is already the sixth highest single-season total in the Division I era and the most attempted by an Aztec player in the Steve Fisher era.

Chris Walton's Long, Strange, Trip

After missing nine games and a month of the season, Chris Walton's senior season appeared to be in serious jeopardy. Even after returning from a hip fexor/groin injury that continues to nag him today, the forward had scored all of 10 points, on 3-of-14 field goal attempts in his four games of the season.

But since scoring 12 points and hitting the game-winning shot against Brigham Young, Walton has been on quite a roll. In his last 13 games, Walton is averaging 7.5 points, 2.5 rebounds and has connected on 40-of-76 shots from the

He responded by playing 30 minutes, scoring 12 points including the game-winner on TOs PG 3.3 a fadeaway seven-footer as time expired. The next day he flew to Philadelphia and was told playing with the injury would cause no more damage. With that knowledge, Walton has played 21 or more minutes every game since with the exception of the Brigham Young game he missed due to the flu and the UNLV game (first

Earlier this season he became the 14th Aztec player in the Division I era to log 100 career games and he is the only SDSU player to rank among the top 25 in career rebounds, assists and blocked shots.

Like Us Now? You'll Love Us in 2005-06

One thing Aztec fans know is that of the top eight players based on minutes played this season, six are slated to return next season (all but Manker and Walton). Included in that group of eight are two seniors (Chris Manker and Chris Walton), three juniors (Mohamed Camara, Trimaine Davis, John Sharper), two sophomores (Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter) and two true freshmen (Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas).

Joining that group is a recruiting class quickly earning accolades as one of the best nationally.

The Aztecs' early signees included Brett Hoerner, Kyle Spain, Kashif Watson and Jabbar Young. All four players, three from the high school ranks, and one from junior college, have been ranked among the top 125 players nationally in their respective class-

With the addition of Florida transfer Mohamed Abukar who started practicing with the Aztecs on Thursday and will be eligible mid-December next season, HoopScoop Online has the Aztec 2005 class ranked 19th nationally.

Below is a look at the 2005 Aztec class.

Hoerner, a 6-11, 200-pound forward, is a senior at Fullerton High in Fullerton, Calif. He averaged 16.0 points, 9.8 rebounds and recorded 112 block shots for a team that went 20-7 last season. Hoerner is ranked among the top 100 recruits in his class by six different scouting services, including Hoop Alliance, which ranks him 51st. He is ranked as the 20th best power forward in the country by ScoutHoops.com and is a member of Street & Smith's High Honorable Mention All-America team.

Spain, a 6-6, 205-pound forward, is a senior at Newark Memorial High in Newark, Calif. He averaged 16.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and shot 70.4 percent from the free throw line as a junior. His team went 29-5 and played for the CIF Division I championship in 2003-04. Spain recorded three 30-point scoring games and posted eight double-doubles as a junior. He is one of just five players named to the Street & Smith's San Francisco-Oakland all-Metro team. He was rated as the 42nd best player nationally by Hoop Scoop's Clark Francis and was select-

ed as the fourth best prospect in the state by the same service.

Watson, a 6-3, 180-pound guard, is a senior at Bishop Gorman High in Las Vegas. He averaged 17 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals for a playoff team that went 21-7 last season. This season, his prep team is ranked among the top 25 nationally by two publications. He is ranked as the second best shooting guard on the west coast and among the top 35 players at the two-guard position nationally by Rivals.com. He was named to Street & Smith's High Honorable Mention All-America team. His brother, C.J., is a starting guard at Tennessee.

Young, a 6-11, 285-pound center, is in his second season at San Bernardino College. He will have two seasons remaining when he joins the Aztecs in 2005-06. Young was listed as the 20th-best center in the class of 2002 by ESPN.com. He was also listed as one of 20 players to watch in the state of Maryland by USA Today while he was at National Christian Academy (Md.). Young attended classes at San Diego State in the Spring of 2003.

Abukar, a 6-10, 210-pound forward, will be a junior when he begins playing for the Aztecs next December. He played in 30 games as a freshman and saw action in seven games this season for Florida. Earlier this season, he scored a careerhigh 22 points in just 12 minutes of action against Florida A&M.

Looking Back on the 4-4 League Start

It might not appeared great on paper, but the Aztecs 4-4 start to league play this season was rather impressive. Beside being the first SDSU team to post a .500 record after eight league games in seven seasons, the Aztecs have victories at Brigham Young and UNLV and difficult road trips to New Mexico and Air Force out of the way.

Below is a look at some of the accomplishments of the 2004-05 Aztecs through eight league games.

- San Diego State opened a league campaign with at least three victories in its first four games since the 1996-97 team opened WAC play with a 3-2 mark (def. UTEP, lost at UNLV, won at Air Force, def. Wyoming, lost to Colorado State). In the last 19 seasons, this is just the fourth time SDSU has owned a winning league record after five games.
- San Diego State posted a conference record above .500 (when SDSU was 3-2) this late in the league season (at least four

games), since the 1996-97 team was 3-2 after five WAC games. SDSU has gotten to .500 late in league campaigns (finishing 7-7 in 2001-02 and 6-6 late in the 2002-03 season), but has never been above .500 after at least four games in the Mountain West Conference era.

- ▶SDSU won its first two road games of the league season for just the second time in 35 Division I seasons (the previous time was in 1984-85 when the Aztecs went 23-8 won the Western Athletic Conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament).
- ▶ SDSU won at Brigham Young and UNLV in the same season for the first time in school history.
- ▶ SDSU won at Brigham Young for just the third time in 26 visits to Provo (3-23) and snapped a 17-game conference losing streak to the Cougars in Provo. BYU fell to 30-2 in its last 32 league home games.
- ▶ SDSU claimed its first regular-season victory at the Thomas & Mack Center, second win over UNLV in the building and third victory over the Rebels in Sin City in 19 games (3-16). UNLV dropped to 27-9 in MWC home games, and the last five MWC teams to defeat UNLV at home have gone on to finish third or better in the final conference standings.
- SDSU became the eighth MWC team (Utah became the ninth last Monday) to win its first two road games of the league campaign. Of the previous seven teams, five went on to win or share the league title, one team finished second and one team finished third.
- ▶ SDSU joined the 2003 Utah team as the only teams in Mountain West Conference teams in league history to win at UNLV and at Brigham Young in the same season.
- ► SDSU swept Brigham Young for just the third time in school history and the first time since the 1984-85 season.

Early Road Wins Are a Good Way to Win Title and Go Dancin'

On Jan. 15, San Diego State became just the eighth team in Mountain West Conference history to win its first two league road games (Utah became the ninth last Monday night). All seven of the previous MWC teams to win their first two conference road games advanced to postseason play, with five making the NCAA Tournament. Of the seven previous members of the club, five won or shared the conference title, one team finished second and one team finished third.

Learning to Win

San Diego State may still be trying to exercise the ghosts left from last season. In 2003-04, the Aztecs finished 4-10 in league play, but lost five conference games that were a one possession game with 2:03 or less remaining in regulation, including four games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less in regulation.

The Aztecs took a big step toward putting the past behind them by rallying from 13 points down at Brigham Young to claim a 59-57 victory on Chris Walton's put-back seven-footer at the buzzer to defeat Brigham Young in the conference opener.

The victory snapped a couple of annoying trends:

- ▶ The two-point win over Brigham Young victory snapped a five-game conference losing streak in contests that were decided by three points or less or in overtime dating back to a 58-56 victory over Utah on Jan. 18, 2003.
- ▶ The last time SDSU won a road league games decided by three points or less or in overtime was at Rice on Jan. 24, 1998, while a member of the Western Athletic Conference.
- ▶ The Aztecs had dropped seven straight road league games that were decided by three points or less or in overtime. Against Wyoming, SDSU felt the flip side as the Aztecs were unable to hold an 11-point advatange and lost in overtime. San Diego State has also dropped consecutive overtime games to UNLV and Colorado State. Since the 2004 conference season, the Aztecs are 8-16 in league play, with eight of those losses coming in games that were a one possession game with 2:05 remaining in regulation and six of those coming in overtime.

Heath Earns Second Player of the Week Honor

San Diego State sophomore Brandon Heath has been named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the period ending January 16. It is his second honor of the season and he joins Josh Davis, Marcus Bailey and Andrew Bogut as the only league players to win the award multiple times in the same season as an underclassmen.

Heath recorded a career-high with 37 points, on 12-of-18 shooting from the field and 12-of-12 free-throw shooting, as the Aztecs recorded an 81-73 victory over Mountain West Conference preseason favorite UNLV on Saturday night. The 37 points were the most for an Aztec player during the Steve Fisher era and the most by an SDSU player in a Mountain West Conference game. It also tied for the 10th highest scoring output in school history and the fifth highest output in a conference game. The last time an Aztec player scored more than 37 points in a game was Anthony Watson's school-record performance of 54 points against U.S. International on Feb. 20, 1986.

Heath added a team-high five assists, two steals and played 39 minutes in the contest. He scored 11 consecutive Aztec points in the first half, helping SDSU erase a six-point deficit. In the second half, when UNLV cut the Aztec advantage to one point, he scored eight straight SDSU points. During a 12-4 run when the Aztecs clinched the victory (run started with SDSU up 61-60 with 6:48 left and ended at SDSU up 73-64 with 2:20 left), Heath scored 10 points and had an assist

on the other SDSU basket.

With his second MWC honor, Heath joins Aerick Sanders and Randy Holcomb as the only SDSU players to earn the honor multiple times. He is the first Aztec player, since player of the week records have been kept beginning in 1978-79, to win multiple honors as an underclassman.

Four-Game Win Streak Most Impressive Since 1984

Although the Aztecs four-game win streak was snapped at Washington, the dominance SDSU displayed during the streak is worth reflecting on.

Although the Aztecs have had longer win streaks, you have to go back 20 years to find a more dominating four-game win streak than what SDSU has put together during the last four games.

San Diego State posted four victories by a combined score of 311-234, or by 77 total points. That makes an average victory total of 19.3 points during the four-game streak.

The last time the Aztecs put together a more dominating four game run was when the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team outscored its opponents by 81 points in four consecutive games during December, 1984. The four-game streak was part of an 8-0 record that squad posted to begin the 1984-85 season and marks the last time San Diego State got off to a better start than this season's 4-1 record.

Below is a look at the most dominating four-game winning streaks based on point differential since the beginning of the 1984-85 season.

During the four-game winning streak, San Diego State put together some impressive numbers:

- ► San Diego State has shot 54.2 percent from the field during the four-game stretch, shooting above 50.0 percent from the floor in each of the last three games. That is the longest stretch since posting a 50 percent or better field goal percentage in five straight games from Feb. 22-Mar. 8, 2003. Since that time, SDSU shot 50 percent or better from the floor just twice in the 37 games prior to the beginning of the current three-game streak.
- ▶ The Aztecs have held their opponent to 40.1 percent field goal shooting, Since Steve Fisher's arrival at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 33-6 when their opponent shoots 40 percent or less from the field.
- A staple of the Aztec program has been strong rebounding. San Diego State has outrebounded four of five opponents this season and has a +8.2 rebound margin during the four-game winning streak.

As you might expect, four-game winning streak typically means good things for the rest of the season. The last two times SDSU has had at least a four-game winning streak in a season they have advanced to postseason play (2001-02 NCAA Tournament, 2002-03 NIT) and every season under Steve Fisher's direction that the Aztecs have a had four-game winning streak, SDSU has gone to finish .500 or better.







Steve Fisher

14th-Full Season • 6th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

ne of the nation's most distinguished coaches, Steve Fisher has guided San Diego State's transformation from a college basketball afterthought to one one of the most visible programs in the country.

In five short seasons, Steve Fisher has changed the outlook, fortunes and expectations of San Diego State basketball. The Aztecs have been transformed from the ugly duckling that muddled through the first-ever Mountain West Conference campaign with an 0-14 record into a program that has produced three .500 or better campaings in the last four seasons, advanced to postseason play twice in the last three years, claimed a conference championship and the first Division I postseason victory in school history.

It is a school that now regularly goes toe-to-toe with the west's best basketball programs on the court and in the recruiting wars. It may be the new program on the block but seniority rarely matters in the changing world of college athletics.

When Fisher arrived on the scene, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were in place all right. The Aztecs were expected and expecting to lose. The year before his arrival San Diego State won just four games.

The hiring only dates back to March of 1999, so referring to the "Steve Fisher Era" at San Diego State might be considered a bit premature. But with the Aztec banner now flying over the Mountain West Conference, there is little doubt that San Diego State basketball has reached a new level.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU daimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

The Aztecs survived the loss of four starters and arguably the most difficult schedule in school history to post a 14-16 record in 2003-04. Highlights during the campaign included a third-place finish at the EA Sports Maui Invitational and home victories over Brigham Young and Utah.

The future looks even brighter. The Aztecs return three starters to go along with another nationally-ranked recruiting class have SDSU fans looking forward to the 2004-05 campaign.
