- ▶The Records: With a perfect 2-0 record last week, the San Diego State women's basketball team is looking to build upon its pair of strong performances against BYU and UNLV, as it plays host to Colorado State Wednesday at 7 p.m. at Cox Arena. The Aztecs, who have a bye on Saturday, have just two contests remaining in the first round of conference action and are just one victory away from tying their season win total from all of last year, entering Wednesday's clash with an 11-7 mark and a 2-4 record in the MWC. Colorado State, meanwhile, is on the other end of the spectrum, bringing a 2-16 record and a nine-game losing streak, including an 0-5 mark in league play, to San Diego.
- ▶SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 258-195 in 15 seasons, while she is 177-130 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.
- ▶CSU Head Coach Jen Warden: Warden is in her third season at CSU. Her school record is 19-57, while her six-year head coaching mark is 48-116.
- ►CSU Series History: SDSU leads the overall series, 18-15, and is 11-5 in games played in San Diego. (Last: CSU def. SDSU, 67-56, on Feb. 22, 2007, in Ft. Collins, Colo.)

Aztec Women's Basketball Looks To Continue Win Streak Wednesday Versus Colorado State

The San Diego State women's basketball team looks to extend its two-game conference win streak when the Aztecs play host to visiting Colorado State Wednesday at 7 p.m. at Cox Arena. SDSU is coming off a pair of milestone victories at home against BYU and on the road at UNLV, which saw the team beat the Cougars for the first time since 2001, defeat the Lady Rebels in Las Vegas for the first time since 1997 and win on the road in league action for the first time in almost three years.

With a victory Wednesday, the Aztecs can match their win total (12) from all of last season and win three straight league games for the first time ever in Mountain West Conference play.

Last Time Out: Morris Leads SDSU To First Win At UNLV Since 1997

Sophomore Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) converted seven consecutive three-point attempts and scored a career-high 35 points to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its second straight win, as the Aztecs defeated host UNLV, 75-55, Saturday evening at Cox Pavilion. With the victory, SDSU claimed its first league road game since 2005 to improve to 11-7 and 2-4 in conference play, while the Lady Rebels fell to 6-12 and 2-3 in the MWC.

After missing her first three-point attempt of the night, Morris hit her next seven, finishing the evening 7-for-9 from beyond the arc and 13-for-21 from the field to beating her previous career high for scoring by 10. Her seven three-pointers trailed the San Diego State school record by one and nearly doubled her previous career best of four set earlier this season against Quinnipiac.

In addition to the 35 points, Morris added five rebounds, three assists and three of the team's seven steals on the night. She was helped offensively by redshirt freshman Allison Duffy's (Lakeside, Calif.) eight points, while freshman Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.) and sophomore Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) each chipped in seven. Senior Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.) had a career-best eight assists and tied Morris for the team lead in rebounding with five.

Through the first four and a half minutes, San Diego State attempted 10 shots making just four, but did its job on the defensive end of the floor, forcing six UNLV turnovers for the early 8-4 advantage. The Aztecs maintained a slight edge before putting together a 7-0 run with a Morris three-pointer and two straight baskets from Demus. The Lady Rebels ended their drought with three free throws, as UNLV trailed by seven despite attempting only nine shots from the field through the first 12 and a half minutes.

SDSU caught fire from beyond the arc in the second part of the first half. Morris hit five in a row to go with **Kate Eveland's (Southlake, Texas)** triple at the 3:44 mark, as the Aztecs were up by 11 at 38-27 heading into the locker room.

SDSU senior Kate Eveland played in her 100th career game ... The Aztecs have pulled down more offensive rebounds than each of their last five MWC opponents and are tied for the league lead in that category with Colorado State (15.0/g) ... SDSU has forced a combined 41 opponent turnovers in the first half of each of its last two games ... The Aztecs recorded 20 or more assists in a single game for the fifth time in 2007-08.

More On Morris

Jené Morris' offensive performance against UNLV on Saturday was notable for several reasons, including:

- Her 35 points are the most by an Aztec since Falisha Wright had 36 against Wyoming on Feb. 25, 1993.
- Her 35 points are the most-ever by an Aztec in a Mountain West Conference game with the next best being a 27-point effort by Jamey Cox against Colorado State in 2000. Morris is the first SDSU player to break the 30-point barrier in any game since Cox had 30 against CS Fullerton in Dec. 1999.
- Her 35 points are the most in a conference game this season and ranks third in MWC history in a league outing. The 35 points are also the most ever by a UNLV opponent at Cox Pavilion.
- Morris' seven three-pointers are the most by an Aztec since Cox had seven in a win over Murray State in Fresno on Nov. 29, 2002. The seven triples are one off the school record held by both Wright and Carmelia Bloodsaw. Morris' previous career best for three-pointers in a game was four versus Quinnipiac, which was also a team-high in 2007-08.
- Her 13 field goals are the most by an Aztec since Jodi Nowlin-Tres also had 13 versus UNLV on Jan. 9, 1997. Her 21 field-goal attempts are the most by an SDSU player since Michelle Strawberry also tried 21 at Wichita State in 2005.

Morris Named Mountain West Conference Co-Player Of The Week

San Diego State sophomore Jené Morris has been named the Mountain West Conference Basketball Co-Player of the Week, the league office announced Monday. Morris shared the award with Utah's Kalee Whipple. It is the first of her career and SDSU's second this season.

In the two wins, Morris averaged 26.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals, while shooting 62.5 percent from the field, including a 77.8 percent mark from beyond the arc. For the year, Morris leads San Diego State and the Mountain West Conference in scoring in league games (18.8 ppg.) and is also the Aztecs' top

scorer in overall contests (13.1 ppg.). She is first in the MWC in steals per game (2.8) and has a team-best 23 three-pointers.

Morris is the second Aztec to earn conference player-of-the-week honors this season, joining freshman center Paris Johnson, who was honored at the end of December. This is just the second time in league history that the Aztecs have had multiple players of the week in the same season.

Bouncing Back

After starting the conference campaign just 7-for-54 (13.0 percent) from beyond the arc in its first four games, San Diego State has rebounded with a combined 12-for-23 performance (52.2 percent) in its last two outings. The Aztecs were 3-for-9 against BYU and followed that up with a 9-for-14 showing at UNLV. The nine three-pointers are a season-high and most by SDSU in a game since the Aztecs had a school record 17 in a rout over Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.

Turnover Town

On Saturday, UNLV became the 16th team to have at least 20 turnovers against San Diego State in 2007-08. The Lady Rebels had 20 in the first half and finished with 26 overall, just three days after BYU committed 31 versus the Aztecs in San Diego on Wednesday.

Only two Aztec opponents, TCU (15) and Utah (19), have failed to reach the 20-turnover barrier. Four SDSU foes, including BYU, have posted 30 or more turnovers with the others being Nevada (37), Southern Utah (35) and Navy (28). The top-ranked team in the country, unbeaten Connecticut, also had 28 turnovers, its most in a single outing since also having 28 in a loss to North Carolina in 2004.

On the year, Aztec opponents have committed 464 turnovers in the 18 games (25.8/g). SDSU has won the turnover battle 14 times in its 18 outings, ranking second in the MWC in turnover margin, averaging 5.72 fewer giveaways than its opponents. The lone exceptions to the note above was in a win over Jackson State (25-24) and losses at TCU (20-15), Utah (22-19) and Wyoming (22-20).

The Aztecs' season-low for turnovers in a game is 10 against Navy, the team's fewest since it had nine versus Canisius in Jan. 2005.

Field-Goal Lows

For the fifth straight outing, San Diego State held its opponent to fewer than 50 field-goal attempts as UNLV managed 46 in Saturday's contest. The four previous league games saw Wyoming try only 40, New Mexico and Utah each attempt 43, and BYU tally 46. On the flip side, SDSU is averaging 56.6 field-goal attempts in its last five games, including 62 versus the Lady Rebels.

In 2007-08, the Aztecs have at least 50 field-goal attempts in all but one game, while opponents have been unable to reach that number on nine occasions.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over CSU will mean:

- ►SDSU wins three-straight MWC games for the first time in league history ... The Aztecs have claimed three consecutive conference victories for the first time since they won eight in a row to round out the 1997 campaign as members of the Western Athletic Conference.
- ▶SDSU matches its win total of 12 from all of last season.
- ►SDSU improves to 12-5 all-time against Colorado State in San Diego.
- ▶SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 15-7 all-time against CSU.

CSU Tidbits

Colorado State enters Wednesday's game with a 2-16 overall record and an 0-5 mark in conference action ... The Rams' lone victories have come against Navy and Pacific, with both coming at home ... CSU is led by Sara Hunter, who averages 10 points a game ... Juanise Cornell is the Rams' top rebounder (7.5/g) and Kandy Beemer along with Hunter are the squad's top three-point threats ... had 12 points and 18 rebounds against Wyoming on Saturday, but has played in just eight contests this season ... CSU is shooting 33.9 percent from both the field and three-point land ... Cornell and Aztec freshman **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)** both attended Bishop Amat High School.

Still In The Top 10

Through 18 contests, San Diego State remains in the top 10 nationally in steals, averaging 13.1 per outing. The Aztecs are first in the Mountain West and entered the week ranked seventh in the nation. The Aztecs have posted at least 12 steals in 13 games and have 235 on the year, including 17 last Wednesday versus BYU, which is the best by any MWC squad in a league game in 2008.

The team's 23 steals versus Southern Utah and 20 steals against Navy are still the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. The 23 steals are the team's most since also posting 23 versus Long Island University on Dec. 27, 1996. The total is second all-time in the MWC since the league began, trailing only Colorado State's 24-steal effort in 2001 against Sacramento State.

Individually, Jené Morris (2.8) and Quenese Davis (2.4) are first and third in the conference and entered the week 40th and 75th nationally in steals per game. Teammate Allison Duffy isn't far behind with 2.3 thefts per outing to rank her fifth in the league.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

What The W's Mean

- ►SDSU has recorded just its second 10-win season since 2001-02, and its second in a row. The last time the Aztecs had consecutive 10-win campaigns was in 2000-01, when the team won 13, and in 2001-02, when it had 10 victories.
- ►SDSU defeated Brigham Young for the first time since 2001, ending a 13-game skid. The Aztecs' victory over UNLV was its first in Las Vegas since 1997, and first conference win on the road since beating Air Force on Feb. 26, 2005.
- ►SDSU's nine non-conference victories are the program's most since the 1995-96 team had 11, including one in the league tournament.
- ►The Aztecs are 17-8 in games played at Cox Arena over the last two campaigns.
- ►SDSU recorded its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2002, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, 59-54. The Aztecs had dropped their previous seven outings in neutral site games.
- ▶The Aztecs have won four road games, its most in a season since the 2003-04 squad also won four times.
- ►SDSU won its season-opener for the first time 2002, and claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three years.
- ►The Aztecs were 5-0 against non-conference teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 3-2 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's, USD, Southern Utah and Cal Poly a year ago.
- ►The Aztecs are 15-4 in their last 19 games against non-conference opponents with the lone losses coming this year vs. Indiana St., Quinnipiac, No. 2 UConn and last year against No. 17/16 George Washington.

Offensive Production 101

After struggling in its first four conference outings, the Aztec offense has picked up the pace in the team's most recent games against BYU and UNLV, averaging 68.5 points and shooting 45.4 percent from the field.

SDSU is third in the Mountain West in scoring offense (67.7 ppg.) and in field-goal percentage (42.3). These numbers far surpass last year's when SDSU averaged just over 56 points an outing and shot 37 percent from the field.

State on Feb. 10, 2005. The Aztecs have recorded four games with 80 or more points for the first time since 1996-97, when SDSU had five such outings.

- ►SDSU also has three wins of 30 points or more for the first time since 1996-97. The 58-point margin of victory over Navy is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995.
- ►SDSU has shot above 50 percent three times and above 40 percent from the field in 11 of 18 games. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. The last time San Diego State shot over 40 percent from the field in four straight games was in 2001, when the Aztecs opened the campaign with five straight performances. SDSU's 56.7 shooting percentage versus Navy is the second-best in the league this year and the program's highest since the Utah Valley game (57.1).
- ► San Diego State scored 60 or more points in seven consecutive games for the first time since also posting a seven-game stint in 1995-96 from Dec. 27-Jan. 13.
- ▶The Aztecs have scored 40 or more points in a half nine times after reaching the barrier twice a year ago.

▶SDSU has 20 or more assists in five outings, including a league-high 28 against Navy. The 28 assists are the team's most since it also had 28 on Feb. 1, 1997 vs. San Jose St.. **Page 5** SDSU ranks first in the MWC (15.9) and is 33rd in the nation in assists per game.

Young Guns

SDSU has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in its first 18 games of 2007-08. The Aztecs' starting lineup in its season opener with Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five. This year's group also has just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as Shanna Demus played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles.

The Aztecs' four newcomers, Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.), Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris, have combined for 56.6 percent of the team's scoring and 48.5 percent of its rebounding. Johnson, Morris and Duffy are the team's three-leading scorers, while in six MWC games thus far, the trio have combined for all but one of the team's 10 double-figure scoring outings.

Injury Update

SDSU junior guard Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.) has missed the team's last eight games, snapping a streak of 37 straight outings in which she had logged minutes. Lipford was injured after being cut by glass at a holiday brunch, receiving 16 stitches to her left leg. She had surgery on Jan. 2, and is not expected to return this season. The Aztecs are also without redshirt freshman Christen Myles, who reinjured her knee in practice after having surgery earlier this fall.

What A Crowd

In nine home games this season, almost 12,000 people have turned out to see the Aztec basketball team in

action, already the highest total home attendance since 1996-97. SDSU is averaging over 1,320 fans per home game, compared to last year's 499 average.

The Aztecs set a single-game home attendance record with 5,271 fans against Connecticut. The mark beat the previous record of 4,311 versus UCLA at the San Diego Sports Arena on Jan. 28, 1978. This is the second time this season that SDSU has set a Cox Arena attendance record, after also doing so earlier this month versus Cal State Fullerton (2,397).

Aztecs Ink Four In Front Court

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of four prep standouts to National Letters of Intent. Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.), Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.), Lindsay Leo (San Jose, Calif.) and Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.) will join the Aztecs in 2008.

Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 2005. In just two short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007, and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 258-195, while her school record stands at 177-130 over 10 seasons. Burns recently earned her 250th career victory with the team's win vs. Southern Utah.

RENO, Nev. - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris , who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center Paris Johnson, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward Shanna Demus recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward Allison Duffy contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore Jené Morris led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4 or un with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

Southern Utah's Anne Westwood had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Erin Heuett contributed 11 points and four assists in the losing effort.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 19-point second-half deficit to just four, but was unable to complete the comeback as the Aztecs dropped their first game of season to Indiana State, 75-68, at Gersten Pavilion. SDSU fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Sycamores improved to 3-0 following the first game of the LMU Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament.

Aztec freshman Paris Johnson had a career-high 27 points and 13 rebounds for her first career double-double. Johnson's 27 points are the most by an SDSU player since Michelle Strawberry had 29 in the 2005-06 season-opener. Sophomore Jené Morris was the only other Aztec in double-figures with 11 points, including a pair of three-pointers, to go with her three steals.

SDSU had four of its five starters foul out by the end of the game, including point guard Quenese Davis, who was limited to just four points in 20 minutes, but still managed to contribute four steals and four assists.

The Sycamores got off to an early lead, making six of their first seven shots from the field including a 3-for-3 effort from beyond the arc to jump ahead by eight at 15-7 heading into the first time-out. The Aztecs rallied to get back to within three at 15-12 on a triple by Demus at the 14:51 mark and trailed by four with 12:38 remaining in the first half. Indiana State, however, went on a 10-0 run, hitting two more three pointers to go up 28-18.

ISU boasted its largest lead at the break, heading into the locker room up by 18 at 45-27, after shooting 55.2 percent from the field and making 7-of-8 three-point attempts.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start in the second half, scoring four straight points on a pair of lay ups by Johnson and limiting the Sycamores to just six points in the first six minutes of play. SDSU was able to make a further dent into its deficit with the help of a 9-0 run to get to within 10 at 54-44.

After the two sides traded trips to the free-throw line, San Diego State continued to stalemate the Indiana State offense, going on another 3-0 run to get to within seven at 56-49.

ISU countered with a 5-0 outburst of its own and was leading by 14 points as late as 66-52. A three-pointer by Morris sparked the Aztec rally again, as SDSU closed to within just four with 26 seconds left in the game. The Sycamores closed out the win by making three of their four free throws to claim the 75-68 victory.

San Diego State owned the advantage on the boards (40-36), in the steals department (13-6) and in the turnover column (23-19), but the Sycamores made eight three-pointers and converted 23 of their 35 trips to the charity line.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy recorded her second career double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team past Jackson State, 63-44, in the consolation game of the Loyola Marymount/Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament in Los Angeles. The Aztecs, who outscored the Lady Tigers (1-3), 30-18, in the second half, improved to 4-1 with the victory.

Duffy was 6-for-16 from the field and made 3-of-4 free-throw attempts. She added a career-high seven steals and two blocks in 36 minutes.

Sophomore Jené Morris added 15 points, 12 coming in the second half, and four rebounds. She was 6-of-7 from the floor and 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 13 points and a game-high five assists, while freshman Paris Johnson, who was named to the all-tournament team, had seven points and eight rebounds.

San Diego State led by as many as 14 in the first half when Morris connected on a 3-point attempt with 5:21 remaining. Jackson State, however, went on a 7-0 run over the next 3:55 before Duffy's jumper at the buzzer gave the Aztecs a 33-26 half-time lead.

The Lady Tigers got within three points at 33-30, 1:42 into the second half on an Erica Trahan jumper, but San Diego State responded with a 21-6 run over the next 11:21, capped by a Morris jumper with 6:57 remaining to put the Aztecs up 18 at 54-36. SDSU outscored Jackson State, 7-0, over the final 2:57 as San Diego State claimed the 63-44 victory.

The Aztecs held the Lady Tigers to just 29.3 percent shooting (17-for-58) for the game and owned a 45-39 rebounding edge.

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Cal Poly 42-27 in the second half to rally from a nine-point deficit, as the Aztecs improved to 5-1 overall with an 80-70 victory over the Mustangs Thursday at Mott Gym. SDSU owned a 20-12 advantage on the offensive glass and made eight three-pointers for its seventh consecutive win over Cal Poly, which dropped to 3-4 in 2007-08.

Aztec point guard Quenese Davis scored 14 of her team-high 21 points in the second half, matching the best offensive output of her career. Davis converted 11 of her 12 free-throw attempts and added four rebounds and four steals. Three other SDSU players finished in double-figure points, including freshman center Paris Johnson (17 points), sophomore guard Jené Morris (11 pts.) and freshman forward Allison Duffy (10 pts.).

The Aztecs shot 39.7 percent from the field for the second game in a row, but countered with 26 second-chance points and recorded a season-best 88 percent performance (22-for-25) at the stripe. SDSU matched its best start since 1995-96 with five wins in its first six outings following its final non-conference road game of 2007-08

After Cal Poly scored the first bucket to begin the night, the Aztecs reeled off six straight points to jump ahead 6-2. The Mustangs ended the run with a pair of free throws, but SDSU scored four more on back-to-back baskets by Johnson. Cal Poly put together its own offensive string, recording eight straight points to take a 12-10 advantage.

The schools traded leads four more times, before Cal Poly jumped ahead for the rest of the half, going up by as many as nine at 39-30, before heading into the locker room up five, 43-38. The Mustangs ended the half shooting 58.3 percent from the field and made 13 of their 14 free-throws (92.9 percent).

After Cal Poly once again opened the half with the first two points, SDSU responded with a triple by Davis, followed by two straight lay ups from Johnson to tie the game at 45-45.

Trailing by one, the Aztecs nailed back-to-back three-pointers to gain their first lead since early in the first half at 53-49. SDSU would go up by six on two occasions, before running out to the largest advantage of the night by either side at 67-57, following two Davis free throws.

Cal Poly made it interesting by getting to within six at 67-61 with just over three minutes left, but SDSU got four straight points from Allison Duffy and made 7-of-8 free-throws in the final 1:28 to secure the 80-70 win.

SAN DIEGO - In front of a Cox Arena record crowd of 2,397, the San Diego State women's basketball team kicked off its monthong homestand with a 76-45 victory over visiting Cal State Fullerton at Cox Arena. The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures to help the team move to 6-1 on the season for its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Titans, meanwhile, dropped to 1-5 on the year, losing their sixth straight against the Aztecs.

SDSU sophomore point guard Quenese Davis posted her first double-double of the season and the third of her career with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting, and a career-high 12 assists. Her 12 assists are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 helpers against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Four other Aztecs logged double-figures in points, including redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who matched her career-best with 15 points, and freshman center Paris Johnson, who added 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Jené Morris was the fourth starter in double-figures with 10 points, while junior LaSandra Dixon matched her career-high with 10 points off the bench.

Cal State Fullerton owned three, one-point advantages in the opening two minutes of the game, including at 5-4 on a layup by Ashley Richie. The Aztecs took the lead on a Quenese Davis bucket, but a Toni Thomas free-throw equalized the game at six points apiece. SDSU broke out of that tie with a 13-0 run and led by as many as 21 points, before heading into the locker room up 19 at 41-22.

Duffy opened the second half with each of San Diego State's first three baskets, as the host led by 25 with 17:47 remaining. The Aztec advantage reached 30 points on a three-pointer from Coco Davis at the 9:37 mark and peaked at 38 points at 76-38, before SDSU finished the afternoon with its second victory of 30 points or more this season at 76-45.

San Diego State shot a season-best 55.7 percent from the field and limited Cal State Fullerton to an opponent season-low 45 points. The Aztecs also forced 27 turnovers, had 21 assists and made four of their seven shots from beyond the arc.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team won their fourth straight and remained perfect at home following a tough 58-53 victory over rival University of San Diego at Cox Arena. The Aztecs won for the first time in their last six meetings with the Toreros to improve to 7-1 on the year, while the visitors fell to 4-4 on the season.

SDSU redshirt freshman Allison Duffy led the Aztecs in both scoring and rebounding with 14 points and six boards. Freshman center Paris Johnson and sophomore guard Quenese Davis both reached double-figures with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Davis had a game-high seven assists, while classmate Jené Morris contributed four of the Aztecs' 13 steals in just 18 minutes of action.

USD's Sam Child began the game with the hot hand, scoring each of her team's first nine points as the Toreros led by four early at 9-5. The visitors were up by as many as five at 16-11, before the Aztecs came storming back with an 8-2 run to take their first lead of the night at 19-18. The advantage changed hands two more times, before SDSU headed into the locker room up four at 29-25.

After a bucket by Torero Kiva Herman to open the second half, SDSU scored 11 unanswered points to build its largest lead of the evening at 40-27. USD would get to within three points on two occasions, including as late as 39 seconds remaining and the score 56-53. After securing a critical defensive rebound, Davis made both of her free-throw shots with 10 seconds left, as the Aztecs claimed the 58-53 win.

San Diego State held USD without a three-point field goal, as the Toreros were 0-for-4 from beyond the arc, compared to the Aztecs' 4-for-9 performance, three of which came in the second half. USD is the second SDSU opponent this season to fail to record a three-pointer, as Southern Utah also went without a triple.

SAN DIEGO - After a 13-day break for final exams, the San Diego State women's basketball team retook the court in convincing fashion, posting a 91-33 victory over Navy Tuesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their fifth straight and improved to 8-1 on the year, while the Midshipmen, who suited up a depleted squad due to illness, fell to 2-10 in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Shanna Demus, who scored a team-high 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting in just 16 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson chipped in 12 points, while sophomore guard Kim Spinardi came off the bench to add a career-high 11 points, including a 3-for-3 performance from beyond the arc.

The Aztecs, who are entered the week ranked second in the nation in steals per game, had 20 against the Mids, with five of those coming via redshirt frosh Allison Duffy. Senior Shannon Clay had a game-high nine rebounds and sophomores Quenese Davis and Jené Morris each added five assists.

After the two-sides traded buckets to open the evening, San Diego State went on a 20-0 run just over five minutes into the game for the 20-2 advantage. The Aztecs led by as many as 31 in the opening half, including at intermission, 45-14.

SDSU scored the first 11 points coming out of the locker room to go up by 42 at 56-14 at the 16:13 mark. The Aztec lead would grow to as many as 58 points before securing the 91-33 victory.

The Aztecs' 91 points are a season-high and the program's most since also scoring 91 versus Utah Valley State in 2005. The 58-point margin of victory is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995, while the Midshipmen's 33 points are the fewest the Aztecs have allowed since a 57-30 victory against Air Force in 2001.

SAN DIEGO - The visiting Connecticut Huskies lived up to their No. 2 national ranking, handing San Diego State its first home loss of the season, 85-53, Friday evening in front of a record 5,271 fans at Cox Arena. The Aztecs forced 28 UConn turnovers, but could not overcome a 49-23 halftime deficit, falling to 8-2 on the season, while the Huskies improved to 9-0.

Freshman center Paris Johnson was the lone SDSU player to finish in double-figures, scoring 14 points to go with her teamhigh seven rebounds. Classmate Coco Davis added eight points on a perfect 3-for-3 shooting performance from the floor. Sophomore Jené Morris had six assists and senior Shannon Clay recorded three of the team's 12 steals

Connecticut hit nine of its first 13 shots, scoring the first seven points and taking a 23-8 lead just over six minutes into the game. SDSU cut its deficit to 11 at 25-14 on a jumper by Johnson, but trailed by 26 points, 49-23, heading into the locker room.

The Huskies outscored the Aztecs by just six points in the second half, 36-30, but used their 54.1 field-goal percentage and 53-25 edge on the boards to cruise to the 85-53 victory.

Despite the loss, San Diego State became just the second opponent to reach the 50-point barrier against UConn in 10 contests this season, as the Huskies entered the game outscoring their opponents by a nation's-best 41.6 points per outing.

SDSU set a single-game attendance record and broke the Cox Arena mark for the second occasion in 2007-08, as 5,271 fans turned out for the second all-time meeting between the schools.

SAN DIEGO - Quinnipiac had nine three-pointers, including eight on 10 attempts in the first half, to defeat host San Diego State Friday, 78-59, in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped their second straight to fall to 8-3 on the year, while the Bobcats improved to 9-1 on the season following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU got a career-high 20 points from sophomore guard Jené Morris, who made a team season-high four three-pointers on just six tries from beyond the arc. Two other Aztecs finished in double-figure scoring with Paris Johnson tallying 15 points, while sophomore guard Quenese Davis had 12 points and a team-best seven rebounds and five assists.

Quinnipiac opened the afternoon with a 5-0 run, including the first of eight triples in the half via Brianna Rooney. SDSU scored its first three points at the free-throw line, before finally making its first field goal at the 16:21 mark on a Johnson lay-up. The Bobcats followed up that basket by outscoring the Aztecs 21-2, making five triples during that span, to go up by 22 points at 29-7. SDSU cut its deficit down to 13 at 31-18, but went into the locker room trailing by 16 at 44-28.

The Aztecs made it interesting in the second half, getting to within 11 at 54-43 with 12:13 remaining, but the Bobcats immediately responded with 10 more points over the next four minutes to go up by 19, and never looked back, winning 78-59.

The Aztecs shot a season-low 31.6 percent from the field and were outrebounded by 10 (42-32). SDSU did manage to own a positive margin in both the turnover (22-16) and steals column (12-10), but the Bobcats shot an Aztec opponent season-high 55.4 percent from the field, which included a 60 percent mark from three-point land (9-for-15).

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rounded out its non-conference schedule by holding on to defeat Western Michigan 77-72 Sunday in the consolation game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs finished 1-1 in its own tournament, improving to 9-3 on the season. The Broncos fell to 3-10 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

The Aztecs got 25 points, including 14 in the first half, from freshman center Paris Johnson, who was named to the six-player all-tournament team. Johnson was helped offensively by senior Kate Eveland's season-high 16 points and freshman Allison Duffy's 14 points. Duffy was one rebound short of her third double-double of the season with a team-best nine and also tallied four of SDSU's nine steals.

The host logged the first basket of the afternoon by Johnson, but the Broncos responded with five straight points for the 5-2 lead. SDSU then went on a 7-0 run to retake the lead at 9-5. The Aztecs stayed ahead for the remainder of the first half, going up by as many as 19 points at 36-17 with 3:41 left, before heading into the locker room up 12 at 40-28.

Western Michigan came out of the break with the first four points to cut its deficit to single-digits at 40-32 at the 19:22 mark. The Broncos took advantage of San Diego State's foul trouble, getting to within four on two occasions within the first 10 minutes. At 62-56, the visitors scored nine straight points to jump ahead by three on a Chandra Smith triple.

The lead switched hands three more times and the game was tied at 71 all with just 3:16 left. Coming out of the tie, SDSU got back-to-back baskets from its two freshmen front court players, Duffy and Johnson, and never trailed again, winning by five points, 77-79

San Diego State was outshot (47.3 to 46.9) and outrebounded (39-34), but forced Western Michigan into 23 turnovers. The Aztecs have won the turnover battle in all but one game this season and also added 22 assists in the victory.

WORTH, Texas - Facing the top scoring offense in the conference, the San Diego State women's basketball team dropped its first league game of 2008 to TCU, 86-63, Wednesday at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 9-4 overall and 1-0 in league action, while the Lady Frogs improved to 8-7 and 1-0 in MWC play.

Three Aztecs who made their Mountain West Conference debuts scored in double-figures, including leading scorer redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who had 14 points on 5-for-8 shooting. Freshman center Paris Johnson tallied her second double-double of the year, recording 13 points and matching her season-high with 13 rebounds to go with four blocks and four assists. Sophomore Jené Morris added 11 points, while senior Shanna Demus had six rebounds. Texas native Kate Eveland was a perfect 3-for-3 from the field, including a pair of three-pointers, for eight noints

TCU opened the evening with a 3-0 lead until SDSU got on the board with two free throws by Morris. The Aztecs missed their first four field goals, before Duffy scored on a lay up at the 16:53 mark and the score 10-4 in favor of the Lady Frogs. The host, meanwhile, made seven of their first 10 shots from the field and built an 11-point advantage at 17-6 and was up by as many as 16 on three occasions.

San Diego State continued its struggles from the field going over five minutes without a field goal mid-way through the half, but finally found its groove on both sides of the ball, putting together a 12-0 run to close to within four points at 28-24. The Lady Frogs went scoreless for 5:26, but managed to hold onto the 33-26 halftime advantage.

Coming out of the locker room, TCU used a pair of three-pointers and outscored SDSU 13-7 through the first media timeout for a 48-33 edge. The Lady Frogs continued to push the pace, runing out to a 20-point lead with 10 minutes left and never looked back, claiming an 86-63 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team was held to a season-low 47 points, including an 0-for-11 effort from beyond the arc, as visiting New Mexico claimed a 60-47 victory Saturday afternoon in the Aztecs' 2008 conference home opener at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 9-5 overall and 0-2 in league action, while the Lobos improved to 9-6 and 1-1 in MWC play.

SDSU sophomore Jené Morris scored in double-figures for the second straight outing, posting a team-high 17 points, six rebounds and three steals in 36 minutes of action. Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy had 10 points and three steals, but her front court teammate, freshman center Paris Johnson, was held to only seven points to snap a streak of eight straight outings in double-figure scoring.

The game started off as a close one, with the teams trading the lead five times in the first 12 minutes of action. At the 8:09 mark, New Mexico's Brandi Kimble made three straight baskets within a 1:26 span to give the visitors a 19-15 advantage. The Lobo lead grew to eight points on a three-pointer at 23-15, but the Aztecs trailed by only four at 28-24 heading into the locker room.

SDSÚ cut its deficit down to just a pair with the opening bucket of the second half on a jumper by Duffy. UNM quickly answered but it was still a four-point game until the 14:15 mark, when a pair of Lobo free throws jump started a 9-0 run to put them up by 13 points at 41-28. The Aztecs logged back-to-back baskets by Morris and senior Shanna Demus to get to within nine, but New Mexico went on another scoring run of 7-2 and the lead never fell below double-figures as the Lobos claimed a 13-point win at 60-47

Despite the loss, SDSU forced 26 New Mexico turnovers and had at least 12 steals for the 12th time in 2007-08.

SALT LAKE CITY - Despite a career-high 25 points from Aztec sophomore Jené Morris, the San Diego State women's basketball dropped a 74-62 decision at Utah Wednesday evening at the Huntsman Center. With the loss, SDSU fell to 9-6 overall and 0-3 in conference play, while the Utes, who shot over 64 percent from the field in the second half, improved to 13-3 and 2-0 in league action.

Morris scored 16 of her career-best 25 points in the second half, beating her previous high of 20 points set earlier this season against Quinnipiac. The guard recorded her third straight double-figure scoring outing in as many chances in league action. Morris was 10-for-18 from the field and made all but two of her seven free-throw attempts, while also contributing a team-best five rebounds and two steals in 37 minutes.

Two SDSU starters, forward Allison Duffy and guard Quenese Davis, scored nine points apiece. Davis added three assists and Duffy chipped in three of the team's eight steals on the night.

The Aztecs opened the game with the first bucket on a jumper by Duffy. The Utes responded with two straight baskets to go up by two, before a Morris jumper tied the score at four points apiece. Utah broke out of the tie with one of three triples in the first 20 minutes from Morgan Warburton.

The Utes remained ahead the rest of the half, but the Aztecs, who trailed by eight points on two occasions at 18-10 and 20-12, cut their deficit down to just a pair at 26-24, following three straight Morris free throws with 3:34 remaining. Utah, however, finished the half strong, going on an 8-0 run and owning a 10-point advantage of 34-24 at the break.

Coming out of the locker room, SDSU got the Utah lead down to single-digits on a three-point play by Morris at 38-31. Utah then went on a 9-0 run to jump out to its biggest lead of the night at 16 points at 47-31, and was up by 17 at 54-37 with just under 11 minutes left in the game.

The Aztecs' rallied from that point, using a pair of free throws by senior Shanna Demus to jump start an 8-0 run, while keeping the Ute offense scoreless for nearly four and a half minutes, as SDSU trailed by just nine at the 8:51 mark.

The nine point margin would be as close as the Aztecs could get the rest of the way, as Utah made 12-of-14 free-throw attempts in the final three minutes to secure the 74-62 victory.

San Diego State owned a 14-7 edge on the offensive boards and committed just three more turnovers than Utah, but could not overcome the Utes' 55.8 field-goal percentage on the night.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 19-point halftime deficit down to just 10 against Wyoming, the No. 20 team in the country, but was unable to complete the come back as the Aztec fell to the host Cowgirls, 65-49 Saturday afternoon at Arena-Auditorium. With the loss, SDSU was dropped to 0-4 in league action and 9-7 overall, while the Cowgirls improved to 16-1 and 4-0 in the MWC.

The Aztecs were led by redshirt freshman forward Allison Duffy, who scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half. Senior Shanna Demus had nine points, including a pair of three-pointers, while Jené Morris tallied seven points. Freshman Paris Johnson logged a team-high nine rebounds, while Demus contributed four steals

The Aztec offense struggled to get going to start the afternoon, as SDSU missed its first nine shots from the field until getting on the board at the 13:01 mark on two Morris free throws, trailing 13-2. San Diego State's first field goal of the game didn't come until the 8:30 mark when Morris nailed a three-pointer from straight away to put the visitors down by 15 at 20-5.

While SDSU may have struggled on the offensive end, the Aztecs' offensive rebounding kept them in the game owning a 12-3 edge at half, but trailing on the scoreboard by 19 going into the locker room at 37-18.

San Diego State was undeterred coming out of the break, as Duffy scored the first points on a pair of free throws. Wyoming countered with a lay-up, but Duffy once again answered with a basket of her own to get back to a 17-point deficit with 17:11 left.

The Aztecs got to within 11 points on two occasions, before finding themselves trailing by only 10 twice at both 51-41 and 53-43. A three-pointer by Justyna Podziemska restored the Cowgirl lead to 13 and SDSU was never able to get to within single-digits, falling 65-49.

Despite the loss, San Diego State grabbed a season-best 23 offensive boards to Wyoming's five. The Aztecs owned a 42-29 advantage on the glass and forced 20 Cowgirl turnovers.

SAN DIEGO - Senior Shanna Demus and sophomore Jené Morris each scored 17 points to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its first victory over BYU since the 2001 season, 62-39, Wednesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 10-7 overall and 1-4 in the Mountain West, while the Cougars dropped to 8-8 and 2-2 in league action.

Demus had a season-high 17 points on 5-for-8 shooting from the floor, including a 3-for-5 performance from beyond the arc, while also tallying a team-best five steals. Morris scored 11 of her 17 points in the first half and had four of the Aztecs' 17 steals on the night. SDSU sophomore Quenese Davis finished with nine points, seven assists, five boards and four steals in 32 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs in rebounding with nine for the second game in a row to go with three blocked shots.

San Diego State got off to a quick start, jumping out to an 8-0 lead before BYU could score its first points of the evening following a steal in the back court by Mindy Nielson at the 14:46 mark. The Aztecs responded with a three-pointer by Demus, which kick started a 9-0 run, as SDSU led by 15 just a little over eight minutes into the game.

The home team's lead would grow to as many as 27 points at 37-10, before heading into the half up by 26 at 37-11. SDSU forced 21 BYU turnovers in the first 20 minutes of play and the Cougars shot just 15 percent from the field on 3-for-20 shooting.

Brigham Young more than doubled its shooting percentage in the second half, but SDSU's advantage still grew to as many as 35 points on two occasions at 55-20 and 59-24. The Cougars ended the night on a 15-3 run in the final seven minutes, but was only able to get to within 23 points, as the Aztecs claimed a 62-39 win, their first in the two schools' last 14 meetings.

BYU did not have a player score in double-figures, as Cassie King had eight for the Cougars, who had a season-high 31 turnovers and were held to their second-fewest points of the year.

LAS VEGAS - Sophomore Jené Morris converted seven consecutive three-point attempts and scored a career-high 35 points to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its second straight win, as the Aztecs defeated host UNLV, 75-55, Saturday evening at Cox Pavilion. With the victory, SDSU claimed its first league road game since 2005 to improve to 11-7 and 2-4 in conference play, while the Lady Rebels fell to 6-12 and 2-3.

After missing her first three-point attempt of the night, Morris hit her next seven, as the guard notched the Aztecs' first 30-point scoring outing since 1999. Morris finished the evening 7-for-9 from beyond the arc and 13-for-21 from the field, beating her previous career high for scoring by 10 points. Her seven three-pointers trailed the San Diego State school record by one and nearly doubled her previous career best of four set earlier this season against Quinnipiac.

In addition to the 35 points, Morris added five rebounds, three assists and three of the team's seven steals on the night. She was helped offensively by redshirt freshman Allison Duffy's eight points, while freshman Paris Johnson and sophomore Quenese Davis each chipped in seven. Senior Shanna Demus had a careerbest eight assists and tied Morris for the team lead in rebounding with five.

Through the first four and a half minutes, San Diego State attempted 10 shots making just four, but did its job on the defensive end of the floor, forcing six UNLV turnovers for the early 8-4 advantage. The Aztecs maintained a slight edge before putting together a 7-0 run with a Morris three-pointer and two straight baskets from Demus. The Lady Rebels ended their drought with three free throws, as UNLV trailed by seven despite attempting only nine shots from the field through the first 12 and a half minutes

SDSU caught fire from beyond the arc in the second part of the first half. Morris hit five in a row to go with Kate Eveland's triple at the 3:44 mark, as the Aztecs were up by 11 at 38-27 heading into the locker room.

Morris continued her assault from three-point land, making two more in the first three minutes coming out of the break to put her team ahead by 17 at 48-31 with 16:48 remaining. San Diego State increased its lead to as many as 27 points on two occasions, including at 70-43, before winning for the first time in Las Vegas since 1997, 75-55.
