Aztecs Make First NCAA Tournament Appearance; **Battle Cal State Northridge at UCLA on Thursday**

San Diego State, winners of a school-record 38 victories this season, makes its first NCAAtournament appearance in the program's 25-year history as the Aztecs battle 23rd-ranked Cal State Northridge on Thursday morning at 11:30 a.m. on the UCLAcampus. The game will be carried live via the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

The fourth-seeded Aztecs have won eight of their last 10 games after advancing to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament last weekend in Albuquerque, N.M. San Diego State defeated UNLV, Utah and New Mexico to reach the title game without a loss. Weather forced the format of the tournament to change from double elimination to a winner-take-all championship, with a once defeated, top-seeded Brigham Young team claiming a 4-3 win in the championship game.

In addition to setting a school record for wins, the Aztecs are in Aztecs At-A-Glance position to break the school record for winning percentage, which was set last season when San Diego State went 35-27 (.565).

San Diego State first-year assistant coach Kelly Howard returns to her alma mater this weekend. Howard, a two-time All-American, who participated in the college world series four times for UCLA from 1993-96, earned the UCLABruin Booster Women's Athletic Outstanding Athlete of the Year award as a senior.

The Matadors, the region's third-seed, finished the Big West Conference in third place. Cal State Northridge is 31-22 overall.

The Mountain West Conference Tournament Wrap-Up

(3) San Diego State 4, (6) UNLV 0

San Diego State senior right-hander Sandra Durazo pitched a onehitter and faced the minimum as the third-seeded Aztecs defeated sixth-seeded UNLV 4-0 in the first game of the 2001 Mountain West Conference championship. The Aztecs won their conference tournament opener for the first time since 1992.

Durazo, who was honored as the Mountain West Conference pitcher of the year, carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning. The senior's bid for her first career no-hitter came to an end when UNLV's Shawna Goessling lined a 3-2 pitch off the glove of first baseman Summer Ehrsam to leadoff the seventh inning.

"Acouple of teammates told me about the no hitter before we took the field in the seventh inning," Durazo said. "I was just worried about winning the game, but it was still in the back of my mind because I have never thrown one."

Durazo allowed three Rebels to reach base in the game but faced the minimum thanks to three Aztec double plays. The senior threw 95 pitches, including 64 strikes. She also tied her school-record for victories in the season with 25 and with the first of her six strikeouts on the morning, broke a 14-year-old school-record for strikeouts in a season.

"What else can you say?" Aztec head coach Kathy Van Wyk said. "I was disappointed that she didn't get it, but it was an unbelievably dominating performance. She just keeps getting better as the season

The Aztecs struck early, scoring three times in the second inning. Freshman catcher Shauna Fisher singled home third baseman Tashie Aguinaga and center fielder Janna Kovensky to give San Diego State a 2-0 lead. Aguinaga was 3-for-3 on the day with a run scored.

Freshman shortstop Joann Figueroa completed the scoring in the

San Diego State right-hander Sandra Durazo pitched her second one-hitter of the day as the third-seeded Aztecs remained undefeated in the 2001 Mountain West Conference Championship with a 9-1 victory over second-seeded Utah on Thursday afternoon.

With the win, the Aztecs remain one of two undefeated teams in the tournament and are one win away from playing for the league championship and an automatic berth in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs also won for the 37th time this season, tying a school-record set back in 1985.

"It would not be overstated to call this one of the best day's in San Diego State softball history," head coach Kathy Van Wyk said. "And it is probably the greatest day in Sandra Durazo's career."

Durazo, who carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning of the Aztecs 4-0 tournament victory over UNLV, retired 16 batters before issuing a one-out home run in the bottom of the sixth inning after the Aztecs had built a 6-0 lead. That snapped the senior's sting of 29 1/3 innings without allowing an earned

"My ball is more than it has in a long time," Durazo said. "It is so exciting to be in this position. Last night at the banquet I felt togetherness with this team and it carried over today. It's an awesome feeling."

Durazo, who earned conference pitcher of the year honors last evening at the league banquette, pitched 14 innings on Thursday, allowing one run, two hits and three walks while striking out 13. The right-hander, who won for the 26th time this season breaking her own record set last season, would not have to wait long for offense.

In the top of the second, San Diego State scored twice. Sophomore designated player Kristina Kirk produced an RBI single that scored freshman center fielder Janna Kovensky who had walked. Junior first baseman Summer Ehrsam had an RBI ground out scoring senior first baseman Tashie Aguinaga.

Aguinaga, who was 3-for-3 in the first game of the day, went 2-for-4 with three runs scored against the Utes.

The Aztecs added to the lead in the third frame when junior second baseman Sarah Hershman singled home junior left fielder Kellie Nordhagen and Aguinaga. Hershman went 2-for-3 with a run scored and four RBI in the contest.

San Diego State extended the lead on an RBI triple by Hershman in the fifth inning and a run scoring single by junior right fielder Tiffany Goudy in the sixth inning. The Aztecs built a 6-0 lead, scoring four runs with two outs.

(3) San Diego State 4, (4) New Mexico 3 (10 innings)

Senior third baseman Tashie Aguinaga singled home freshman center fielder Janna Kovensky with the game-winning run in the 10th inning as third-seeded San Diego State moved to the Mountain West Conference championship game with a 4-3 victory over fourth-seeded New Mexico on Friday. The victory means the Aztecs must dispose of one more opponent at the league tournament to win the conference championship and earn the program's first NCAAtournament berth.

The Aztecs, which won their school-record 38th game of the season, will play the survivor of the other semifinal game between undefeated top-seeded Brigham Young and second-seeded Utah in the championship of the double-elimination tournament.

"This is probably the best all-around game I have ever seen us play," head coach Kathy Van Wyk said. "We made great defensive plays. We had great clutch hitting and we made big pitches when we needed to. I am so proud of this team."

After throwing a pair of one-hitters on Thursday, senior right-hander Sandra Durazo threw 148 pitches, 94 for strikes added to her school record for victories by winning for the 27th time this season.

San Diego State took an early lead in the first inning. With two on, Kovensky hit a three-run homer down the left field line. Her third home run of the season gave the Aztecs a 3-0 lead.

New Mexico responded with two runs in the bottom of the first. With one on, designated player Kathy Moore hit her first of two home runs on the afternoon to pull New Mexico to within 3-2.

Unlike Thursday, when Durazo allowed just two hits in 14 innings of work, the senior frequently worked out of jams. The Aztecs all-time leader in victories scattered 11 hits and stranded nine Lobos on the afternoon. Durazo had only three innings in which she faced the minimum and worked out of problems in the fourth and sixth innings when the first two batters reached base.

In the fifth inning, the Lobos tied the game on a solo home run to left field by Moore.

The score remained tied until the 10th inning. With one out, Kovensky reached on a fielder's choice and promptly stole second base. It was the eighth stolen base of the season for the freshman. Aguinaga then singled on a 0-1 pitch to center field, scoring Kovensky with the game-winning run.

With the wind gusting up to 25 mph out to left field, Durazo faced Moore to open the bottom of the 10th, but got the long-ball threat to pop-up to third base. The senior retired the next two batters to put San Diego State into the championship game.

Third-seeded San Diego State's remarkable late season run fell just short as top-seeded Brigham Young claimed a 4-3 victory in the 2001 Mountain West Conference championship on Saturday afternoon. With the victory, the Utes earn the league's automatic berth into the NCAAtournament.

The Aztecs, which entered the contest having won eight of nine and 10 of their last 12, loaded the bases with one out in the seventh inning, but center fielder Janna Kovensky's lined shot was snared by first baseman Hanson, who easily stepped on first base to complete the double play and allow Brigham Young to return to the NCAAtournament for the first time in school history.

Brigham Young took advantage of Aztec errors in each of the first two innings to score two unearned runs. In the first, Kari Pringle lifted a two-out single to right field that scored Oli Keohohou and an error in right field allowed Liz Smith to score from second giving the Cougars a 2-0 lead.

The Aztecs got one run back in the bottom of the first. Center fielder Joann Figueroa singled to open the frame, advanced to second base on an illegal pitch and was moved to third on a sacrifice bunt. Left fielder Kellie Nordhagen singled home Figueroa as San Diego State cut the deficit to 2-1. Nordhagen, a junior from Valencia, Calif., was 3-for-3 with a run scored and two RBIs in the contest.

The Utes added to their lead in the second in unconventional fashion. First baseman Mindy Hanson reached on a passed ball on strike three. Following a sacrifice, Utah scored its second unearned run in as many innings when Keohohou singled to right, where the ball was bobbled, allowing Hanson to score from second base.

Utah stretched the lead to 4-1 in the third on a sacrifice fly by Hanson scoring second baseman Kari Pringle.

The Aztecs battled back in the fourth inning, scoring twice. With two outs and no one on, a pinch hit to right fielder Tiffany Goudy. Nordhagen followed with a single, that scored Goudy following an error on the throw from the outfield. Kovensky followed with an RBI single to center field and the Aztecs cut the deficit to 4-3.

The Aztecs had opportunities to tie the game in the fifth, sixth and seventh innings. In the fifth, first baseman Summer Ehrsam, who was 2-for-3 on the day, leadoff the frame with a base hit. But the Cougars worked out of a jam when right fielder Tiffany Goudy bunted into a 5-3 double play.

The next inning, the Aztecs loaded the bases with only one out, but a chopper to short forced the runner

at home and a strike out ended the threat.

In the seventh, San Diego State had runners on second and third with one out when Kovensky's lined into a double play to end the Aztecs final threat of the day. Cougar pitcher Maryon DeWitt-Wallentine pitched out of trouble over the last three innings to earn her first save of the season.

The loss went to San Diego State senior right-hander Sandra Durazo. The Aztecs all-time leader in every pitching category scattered six hits and allowed two earned runs on the afternoon in falling to 27-13 on the season.

Brigham Young improved to 35-24 while San Diego State fell to 38-23. The 38 victories are a single-season school record for the Aztecs.

Durazo Sets MWC Record with Fifth PoW Award of the Year

For the fifth time this season, San Diego State right-handed pitcher Sandra Durazo was named the Mountain West Conference softball pitcher of the week for the period ending May 8. Durazo, who has earned the award 10 times in her career, two times in the Western Athletic Conference and eight times in the Mountain West, is the first league player to be a recipient of either the pitcher or player of the week honors five times in a single season.

The senior from Granda Hills, Calif., pitched all 30 innings for the Aztecs last week, posting a 3-1 record with a 0.47 earned run average. She did not allow an earned run in her final 17 innings of work and struck out 28 batters while issuing six walks in her four appearances last week. Durazo ran her streak of allowing one run or fewer to seven consecutive games.

Durazo led the Aztecs to a sweep of Colorado State, winning 4-1 and 2-1, and a split against New Mexico. The senior pitched nine shutout innings and recorded her sixth shutout of the season in the Aztecs 1-0 victory over the Lobos. Her lone loss of the week, a 1-0 defeat to New Mexico in the second game, occurred despite the fact that Durazo did not issue an earned run in the contest.

The senior was particularly effective with the game on the line as she limited hitters to just 11-for-57 (.193) with runners on base, including 6-for-31 (.194) with runners in scoring position and 0-for-4 (.000) with the bases loaded.

Durazo, who has earned all 10 of San Diego State's league victories this season, is 24-12 with a 1.36 ERA this season. Prior to winning the award for the fifth time, Durazo shared the conference record for most pitcher or player of the week honors in a season with Danielle Cassara of New Mexico set in 2000.

About the Aztecs

One day after setting the conference record for most softball player or pitcher of the week honors in a single-season, San Diego State right-handed pitcher Sandra Durazo was named the Mountain West Conference pitcher of the year. The announcement was made at the annual awards banquet on May 9, the day before the league championship begins.

In addition to earning pitcher of the year honors, Durazo joined junior second baseman Sarah Hershman and junior outfielder Kellie Nordhagen on the all-conference team. All three players were selected to the squad last season.

Durazo, a senior from Granada Hills, Calif., is 27-13 on the season with a 1.75 earned run average. The right-hander broke her school-record for victories in a season and has recorded a victory in all 10 of the Aztecs conference victories this season. She finished the regular-season ranked second in both ERAand victories and she is the conference leader in those two categories during the league season. She has pitched 75 consecutive innings for the Aztecs.

Hershman, a native of San Diego, Calif., batted .320 with a team-high 14 stolen bases, 26 runs scored and 24 runs batted in. The conference leader in triples, the junior ranks in the Aztecs career top five in home runs, stolen bases and runs batted in.

A native of Valencia, Calif., Nordhagen leads the team with a .354 batting average and 31 runs scored to go along with 15 RBIs and nine stolen bases. The junior has a team-high eight doubles this season and is third on the school career chart with 27.

The Aztecs featured three of the nine repeat players on this season's 20-member Mountain West Conference squad. In addition, the Aztecs also had two of the 10 non-senior members of the squad.

Noting the Aztecs

San Diego State's 38 victories this season is a new all-time record for victories in a single season, breaking the previous mark of 37 set in 1985... The Aztecs have won four of their last six and eight of their last 10 games... The Aztecs had a season-tying-best five game winning streak snapped in the second game against New Mexico on May 6... The Aztecs have gone 15 consecutive games without dropping two straight games and are 16-6 following a defeat... San Diego State has outscored its opponents 27-11 in the last eight games (6-2)... The Aztecs have outscored their opponents in every inning this season, except the second inning (20-26)... San Diego State is 16-10 in one-run games and 20-12 in games decided by two runs or less... San Diego State is 9-3 in extra innings and has claimed victories the last four times the Aztecs have been forced to extra innings... The Aztecs are 73-50 overall and 23-15 in conference play since the inception of the Mountain West Conference last season... The 73 wins are the highest two-year total, surpassing the previous high of 59 set in 1985-86 and tied in 1999-2000... The Aztecs broke last year's school-record for finishing the campaign eight games above .500 by finishing this season 15 games above the break-even mark.

Noting the Hitters

San Diego State finished fifth in the league in batting average – both overall (.248) and conference play (.244)... The Aztecs strike out total of 206 was the lowest in the league by 25 K's... San Diego State batters struck out an average of once every 7.87 plate appearances... The Aztecs had 101 sacrifice hits this season, 44 more than any other Mountain West Conference team... San Diego State is 13-2 when collecting 10 or more hits... The Aztecs are averaging 3.23 runs per game; however San Diego State has scored 20 runs in their last four games, an average of 5 per game... Seven times this season, San Diego State has recorded at least as many runs as they have hits in a game... The most recent occurrence was May 10, when the Aztecs defeated Utah, collecting nine runs on nine hits... Kellie Nordhagen's 10-game hitting streak is the longest on the team this season... Nordhagen went 19-for-36 (.527) during the stretch... She also has a seven-game hitting streak to her credit, going 10-for-25 (.400) during that stretch... She has a team-high 22 multiple hit games this season... Nordhagen and Sarah Hershman are the first Aztecs to hit over .300 in consecutive regular season's since 1987-88 (Trish Mang)... Hershman leads the team in triples (4) and sacrifice hits (18)... Tiffany Goudy has hit safely in 13 of the last 15 games... Janna Kovensky's 49 hits so far this season are the most for a freshman since the 1997 season, when Jackie Eigner pounded out 52 hits.

Noting the Pitchers

San Diego State leads the conference with a 1.93 earned run average overall and a 2.48 ERAin league action... The 38 victories by the staff is a new school record... Sandra Durazo pitched 100.2 of 127.0 innings during the conference season (79.3 percent)... Durazo has the decision in the Aztecs last 13 games overall and the last eight conference tilts... The last time Durazo was not involved in a decision was April 21 when Korin Gregory suffered the loss in an 8-2 setback to UNLV... Durazo has pitched San Diego State's last 44.0 innings... In that time she has allowed four earned runs for a 0.64 ERA... The Aztec pitching staff has an overall ERA of 2.02... If the season ended today, their team ERAwould be the lowest since the 1997 season, when they had a 1.92 ERA... The Aztecs are in a position to finish the 2001 season with a better earned run average than their opponent for the first time since the 1997 season when San Diego State posted a 1.92 ERAto its opponents' 2.34.


