### Aztec Basketball Set To Defend Surf 'N Slam Title Monday vs. Wake Forest

The San Diego State women's basketball team plays host to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic for the fifth straight

year, starting Dec. 28, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs will face Wake Forest (8-3) in the first of two games on Monday at 5 p.m. PT, followed by the Auburn vs. Valparaiso contest at 7 p.m. The consolation (5 p.m.) and championship (7 p.m.) games will follow two days later on Wednesday.

SDSU has played just one outing in a 17-day period, defeating Loyola Marymount, 75-54, on Dec. 21, in Los Angeles to improve to 6-4 overall. The Aztecs, who will play their final two non-conference contests of the season, are seeking their second Surf 'N Slam title in the tournament's five years of existence. The team finished as runner-up in 2006, before pulling off one of the biggest upsets in program history, defeating No. 4 Texas, to claim last year's title. SDSU ended up in third place in both 2007 and 2005.

Monday's first-ever meeting between the Demon Deacons and Aztecs will be streamed live on goaztecs.com with Chris Ello making the call from Viejas Arena. A live video feed and live stats are also available for all Surf 'N Slam games on the Aztecs' official site.

### Fast Facts: SDSU In Regular Season Home Tourneys

► This year marks the fifth straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005, the last time the Aztecs had a home tournament was in November 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

► SDSU did not play host to a regular-season tournament in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

► SDSU women's hoops has played host to 19 home tournaments in its previous 33 years of existence. SDSU is 17-2 in the first game of a home tournament and has won the team title 10 times, including each of the first four.

► SDSU has split games in six of its last seven home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2006, and did the opposite in 2005 and 2007. The Aztecs came out ahead in both outings at last year's Surf 'N Slam, defeating Sacramento State and No. 4/4 Texas, for the title.

The Aztecs are participating in two non-conference tournaments in the same season for the third year in a row, but just the third time since 2000.

### Fast Facts: Surf 'N Slam Tournament

► Wake Forest and Valparaiso are making their first Surf 'N Slam appearances, while Auburn is the first school, other than SDSU, to play in more than one edition.

Auburn claimed the first Surf 'N Slam title in 2005, with a 76-54 victory over Loyola (Md.). Four different schools from four different conferences have won a tourney championship game.

► All three schools would be first-time opponents for the Aztecs. This will also be the first-ever meeting between Valparaiso and Auburn. Wake Forest owns a 1-0 edge all-time over the Crusaders, while the Auburn-WFU series is knotted at 1-1.

SDSU junior center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** has received all-tournament honors at the Surf 'N Slam each of the last two seasons. Seniors Quenese Davis (2006) and Jené Morris (2008 - MVP) have each been named once.

### Aztec Find Shooting Touch In Win At LMU

The San Diego State women's basketball team used a stifling defense and a career offensive performance from Quenese Davis to erase an early nine-point deficit and cruise to a 75-54 victory over Loyola Marymount on Nov. 21 at Gersten Pavilion.

Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) notched her fourth 20point scoring outing of the season and second in as many games, finishing with a career-high 26 points, including 17 in the first half, on 10-for-13 shooting. She was one of four Aztecs in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) tallied 16 points all in the second half, junior Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.) had 14 points and junior Paris Johnson contributed 10 on 5-for-5 shooting.

Davis also had four steals, five assists and tied for the team lead with Bradley with eight boards apiece. Morris, meanwhile, finished with a game-high seven assists and ended the night 8-for-11 shooting from the floor.

The host Lions got off to the quick start, going up by four points at 4-0, before building a nine-point advantage on a 3-pointer at the 12:48 mark at 15-6. The Aztecs quickly closed the gap, as a Davis triple started a 9-2 run to get to within a pair at 17-15 and then later at 19-17.

Coming out of a media timeout, guard **Kim Spinardi** (Merced, Calif.) hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key for SDSU's first lead of the night at 20-19. A Bradley lay-up followed, but LMU knotted the game at 22 points apiece.

From there the Aztec defense took over, limiting the Lions to only four points in the final 5:58. Davis was just as dominating on the offensive side, as the senior scored 17 of the team's 26 first-half points to give her squad a 10-point halftime edge, 36-26.

The LMU drought continued coming out of the break with the home team only hitting one field goal within the first 7:18 as San Diego State built an 18-point lead at 49-31. The Aztecs would push their advantage out to as many as 23 on six occasions, before coming away with the 75-54 victory.

### **Other Loyola Marymount Notes**

 The Aztecs' 23 assists are its most in game since tallying 24 in last season's 85-70 victory over Montana State.

+ SDSU notched its third win this season by more

#### than 20 points.

• The Aztecs had four players reach double-figures in scoring, the fourth time that has happened this season and the third consecutive game.

• SDSU won the rebounding battle for the seventh time this season and the second consecutive game. The +13 margin over the Lions is the team's second-best of 2009-10, trailing only its +21 mark vs. USD.

• The Aztecs logged double-figures in steals for the fifth time this season. SDSU is 4-1 in such outings.

• SDSU has not used the same starting line-up in back-to-back games since the Oklahoma and South Carolina contests.

• LMU is the sixth Aztec opponent to score less than 60 points.

#### **On The Mark**

San Diego State shot a blistering 60 percent from the field (33-for-55), including a 64.3 mark (18-for-28) in the second half, to cruise to a 21-point win at LMU earlier this week.

The Aztecs' field-goal percentage is the team's best in a single-outing since making 68.1 percent vs. Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Individually, Paris Johnson was a perfect 5-for-5, while Quenese Davis (10-for-13) and Jené Morris (8-for-11) were equally impressive.

On the year, SDSU has shot above 50 percent from the field twice and better than 40 percent seven times, including a streak of four straight entering the Wake Forest contest.

Senior Quenese Davis continues to light up the scoreboard on the offensive side. Davis led the Aztecs' rally against LMU, scoring 17 of her career-high 26 points in the first half alone. The point guard has 20 or more points in each of the last two games and

in four contests overall in 2009-10.

Davis had only two 20-point scoring outings in her first 67 games in the Red & Black. Over the last two years, she has eight contests with 20 or more, giving her 10 for her career. The Aztecs are 9-1 all-time when Davis scores 20 or more points, with the only loss coming to No. 5/6 Notre Dame earlier this season.

The co-captain's scoring output as of late has been helped by the 3-point shot. Davis started the year 0-for-8 from beyond the arc through the first eight games and is 4-for-6 in the last two contests.

### **The Comeback Factor**

In all three of its December victories the Aztec basketball squad has rallied from at least an eight-point deficit.

Last Monday, SDSU trailed host LMU by nine points with 12:48 left in the first half, but came back to lead by 10 at halftime.

Overall the Aztecs have had to come from behind to win in five of their six victories. SDSU trailed by eight points in the second half vs. Long Beach State and was down by 10 points at UC Riverside on Dec. 4. The team also has rallied from much smaller deficits against UC Irvine (2 points) and Arizona (1 point). The USD contest

is the only outing where the Aztecs have led from the opening tip.

Although the Notre Dame and Pepperdine games ended up in the loss column, SDSU trailed by 21 vs. the No. 5 Irish and came all the way back to within two with 29 seconds left in the game. The Aztecs also were down by 11 against the Waves and ended up taking the lead with 48 seconds remaining in regulation.

### Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Wake Forest will mean:

SDSU advances to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam championship game for the second year in a row and third time overall (3-2 in opening games).

►SDSU improves to 18-4 during the month of December over the last four seasons.

SDSU is 3-4 vs. teams it did not play a year ago.

► The Aztecs notch the program's first win over a current member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, improving to 1-0 all-time vs. Wake Forest.

### **Wake Forest Tid-Bits**

Wake Forest enters the Surf 'N Slam with an 8-3 overall record, including a 7-1 mark at home ... The Demon Deacons won their first six contests, but have since dropped three of their last five ... SDSU and Wake Forest both played South Carolina earlier this season, with the Aztecs falling by three in the Virgin Islands and the Demon Deacons losing by 10 ... WFU has been led offensively by junior forward Brittany Waters, who is averaging 18.1 points and 6.5 rebounds a game ... Freshman center Sandra Garcia has pulled down 9.1 boards a game and sophomore Brooke Thomas has a team-best 38 assists ... Wake Forest advanced to the WNIT a year ago, finishing with a 19-12 overall record ... Head coach Mike Peterson served in the same position at TCU (1996-99) ... This is WFU's first Surf 'N Slam appearance.

#### **Five More For 300**

With her 295th victory as a head coach against Loyola Marymount on Dec. 21, Aztec head coach Beth Burns needs five more wins to meet the 300-victory plateau for her career.

Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 214 of her career victories coming on

Montezuma Mesa. She is in her 18th season overall as a head coach with all but six of those campaigns not with the Aztecs.

### **Good On The Road**

Last Monday at LMU, the Aztecs claimed their seventh straight win at an opponent's arena. The seven consecutive road victories dates back to a loss at Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2009.

The last time SDSU won seven straight road games (non-neutral sites) was during the 1996-97 campaign when the Aztecs won nine in a row.

### Aztecs Achieve No. 23/24 National Ranking

The San Diego State women's basketball team achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years, as the Aztecs were rated No. 23 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll on Nov. 23. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the Associated Press Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

In 2009-10, SDSU received votes in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls in both the preseason and first regular-season editions.

On Dec. 1, the Aztecs were also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

#### **1K Club**

Only 10 games into the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has already had two players reach the 1,000-career point milestone.

Jené Morris became the first to do so, recording her 1,000th career point in her 67th game in the Red & Black with her first bucket against South Carolina on Nov. 28. Fellow co-captain Quenese Davis followed suit two games later vs. Pepperdine, reaching the milestone on a second-half jumper in her 99th career outing.

Junior center Paris Johnson could be the third member of the 1,000-point club this season, as the San Diego native has 922 points in 73 games.

Prior to this year, the last Aztec to reach the 1,000-

### Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

 SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's season-opening win over UC Irvine. She is now first in Aztec history and third in the MWC record book in career assists with 550.

· Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.

· Jené Morris was one of six players named to the alltournament team for the Island Division at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. Morris averaged 17 points in the three games, bolstered by a 32-point effort against No. 5/6 Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament and by any player in the MWC in 2009-10.

 SDSU played its first overtime game in three years on Dec. 8, against Pepperdine.

 Quenese Davis played in her 100th career game vs. Long Beach State. She is the first Aztec to reach the century mark since Kate Eveland in 2008.

Davis is on track to play at minimum 120 career games, which would tie her for fourth-most in school history with all-time leading scorer Judy Porter. She has appeared in all 101 contests since coming to The Mesa in 2006, starting 100 of them.

The Aztecs received 25 of the 28 first-place votes and 240 points overall. SDSU had nearly 25 more points than second place TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

### More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State has also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, Lindy's College Basketball and Sporting News College Basketball Magazine.

A few weeks ago, ESPN.com and writer Graham Hays listed SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another ESPN.com writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

### Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year



Entering her third and final season at San Diego State, senior Jené Morris is already one of the most heavily-decorated players in program history and will be looking to add more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the preseason "Wade

Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball.

Morris is also up for the other college player of the year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America team.

She is just the second player in Mountain West Conference history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occasions

Morris was also selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983 to the women's player of the year.

### **More On Morris**

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a teambest 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including a 35-point performance vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the *Sporting News* and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

### **Awards Aplenty**

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row. Johnson has been singled out as a possible national "breakout star" by *ESPN.com's* Charlie Creme, after earning first-team all-league honors as a sophomore when she led the Aztecs in rebounding (8.3/g), blocked shots (94) and field-goal percentage (53.1).

Johnson's former club teammate, Aztec Jessika Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award.

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore, posting a pair of double-doubles, including a 10-point, 10-rebound performance vs. then No. 10 Oklahoma.

*ESPN.com's* Graham Hayes singled out the Johnson-Bradley duo as one of the country's best.

### Other Things To Watch For In 2009-10

With the build up behind this season, here are a few things interesting things to look at in 2009-10:

 SDSU has won 10 straight home MWC contests dating back to 2008, after going a perfect 8-0 in 2009. The Aztecs had won 18 straight home regular-season games, before falling to Pepperdine in overtime on Dec.
 8. Still, the team is 38-13 on their home court in the last three years.

• The Aztecs have 24 Mountain West Conference wins in the last three seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.

• Aztec head coach Beth Burns needs five more victories to reach the 300-win milestone in her career.

• With her school-record 94 blocked shots in 2008-09, SDSU junior Paris Johnson had more blocks than four teams in the MWC and more than 159 of 328 NCAA Division I schools. Johnson is second in Aztec career history in blocked shots with 163.

• SDSU will have a pair of sisters on the floor this

season with Coco and Quenese Davis and Allison and Ashley Duffy. Paris Johnson's sister Desiree also played for the Aztecs from 2005-07.

### Strength Of Schedule

The Aztecs have already had two games against ranked foes in then No. 5/6 Notre Dame and No. 17/20 Oklahoma. SDSU also played two other contests versus foes receiving votes in either national preseason poll with Arizona and South Carolina. Other future Aztec opponents to have been receiving votes so far this season include Auburn, New Mexico, TCU, Wake Forest and Wyoming.

### **TV** Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season televised games. SDSU's game with Arizona on Nov. 21 was carried live on The Mtn., while six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in mid-February. In all, the Aztecs will have five games on The Mtn. and two on CBS College Sports.

### The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-feet-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard. The new center-hung unit features the latest Daktronics LED video technology, which provides SDSU fans the ability to see live and recorded video images from any seat in the arena.

### Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah) and 5-10 combo guard Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent. The pair, who are each ranked among the top 100 recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2010.

### **Clements, Nahinu Join The Aztecs**

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster. The pair of sophomores transferred after playing one season at Arizona and will have three years of eligibility remaining at SDSU starting with the 2010-11 campaign.

### 2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

• Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.

• Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).

• Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.

 Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.

• Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.

 Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.

• Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

### **Last Year's Numbers**

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2008-09 team's statistical highlights:

• SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.16/g), steals (11.25/g), blocks (6.09/g) and turnover margin (+4.38), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.422) and offensive rebounds (13.66/g). The Aztecs' 195 blocks were easily a conference record, beating the old mark of 166 by New Mexico.

• SDSU ended the year ranked sixth nationally in blocks per game, 15th in steals and 19th in turnover margin.

• The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 21 of 32 games, had five blocked shots in 22 of 32 games, shot above 40 percent in 19 outings and eclipsed the 20-assist barrier in seven contests.

• SDSU set school season records for most threepointers (155; prev. 140 in 2004-05) and most blocks (195; prev. 162 in 1988-89).

#### **More Awards**

The awards were aplenty for this past year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris' was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, becoming just the third SDSU player so honored and the program's first since Falisha Wright in 1994. Morris was also tabbed the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year and was selected first-team all-conference, MWC all-defensive team, MWC championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris and center Paris Johnson became the first Aztecs to ever be named first-team all-Mountain West Conference in the league's 10-year history. Johnson also was a four-time league player of the week, WBCA honorable mention national player of the month and earned a nod on two non-conference all-tournament teams.

Johnson and Morris were joined on the MWC alldefensive squad by guard Quenese Davis, who was a second-team all-league choice and one-time player of the week. Head coach Beth Burns was also acknowledged for the team's performance by being voted MWC coach of the year, the fourth time she has won such an award in her career.

#### **Listen/Watch Live**

For the ninth straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the third straight season.

Again in 2009-10, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

#### **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns**



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard

work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action. The Aztecs won a share of their first-ever Mountain West regular season title, advanced to the MWC tournament championship game for the second consecutive year and garnered SDSU's first NCAA bid since 1997. For her efforts, Burns was named the league's coach of the year.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 295-213, while her school record stands at 214-148 over 13 seasons.

The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she needs just five more victories to get to the 300-win plateau.

### San Diego State 64, UC Irvine 42

**IRVINE, Calif.** - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a threepoint play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

### San Diego State 79, San Diego 52

Game 2 ■ Nov. 18 ■ Viejas Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley both scored 14, and juniors Jerica Williams, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Allison Duffy contributed 13 points apiece. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded five assists and, along with Morris, had four steals on the night to lead the defensive effort.

The Aztecs never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home teamscored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessika Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

**ST. THOMAS, UVI -** The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a careerbest. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessika Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

San Diego State was within a single basket following two Quenese Davis free throws with 29 seconds remaining, but the Irish made three of their four shots from the charity stripe to preserve the 84-79 victory.

**ST. THOMAS, UVI -** In a contest featuring 17 ties and 12 lead changes, the No. 23/24 San Diego State women's basketball team was outlasted by South Carolina, 58-55, in the final game of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas.

### San Diego State 66, UC Riverside 59

Game 7 ■ Dec. 4 ■ Student Recreation Center ■ Riverside, Calif.

**RIVERSIDE**, **Calif.** - San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson and seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

Johnson logged her 14th career double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 15 rebounds matched a career high, which was set March 7, 2009 at UNLV. She made all five of her free-throw attempts.

Davis scored 16 of her game-high 20 points in the second half and dished out a season-high eight assists. Morris, meanwhile, overcame a slow start to finish the game with 18 points, including a pair of three-pointers, and five steals. Both players played all 40 minutes in the backcourt for San Diego State.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior Jessika Bradley, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 three-point shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - Pepperdine's Jazmine Jackson hit the winning lay-up with less than a second left in overtime to hand the San Diego State women's basketball team a 62-61 loss at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, playing their first overtime outing since 2006, dropped to 4-4 on the year, while the Waves improved to 6-4 overall.

**SAN DIEGO -** The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 5-0 run in the final 43 seconds to win a close battle with visiting Long Beach State, 67-62, at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs picked up their fifth straight win in the series with the 49ers to improve to 5-4 on the year, while LBSU dropped to 3-6 in 2009-10.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a stifling defense and a career offensive performance from Quenese Davis to erase an early nine-point deficit and cruise to a 75-54 victory over Loyola Marymount at Gersten Pavilion. With the win, the Aztecs defeated the Lions for the second year in a row, improving to 6-4 on the season, while the home team dropped to 6-6 in 2009-10.

Davis notched her fourth 20-point scoring outing of the season and second in as many games, finishing with a career-high 26 points, including 17 in the first half, on 10-for-13 shooting. She was one of four Aztecs in double-figure points, as Jené Morris tallied 16 points all in the second half, Jessika Bradley had 14 points and Paris Johnson contributed 10 on 5-for-5 shooting.

Davis also had four steals, five assists and tied for the team lead with Bradley in rebounds with eight apiece. Morris, meanwhile, finished with a game-high seven assists and ended the night 8-for-11 shooting from the floor.

The host Lions got off to the quick start, going up by four points at 4-0, before building a nine-point advantage on a three-pointer at the 12:48 mark at 15-6. The Aztecs closed the gap in a hurry, as a Davis triple started a 9-2 run to get to within a pair at 17-15 and then later at 19-17.

Coming out of a media timeout, guard Kim Spinardi hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key for SDSU's first lead of the night at 20-19. A Bradley lay-up followed, but LMU knotted the game at 22 points apiece.

From there the Aztec defense took over, limiting the Lions to only four points in the final 5:58. Davis was just as dominating on the offensive side, as the senior scored 17 of the team's 26 first-half points to give her squad a 10-point halftime edge, 36-26.

The LMU drought continued coming out of the break with the home team only hitting one field goal within the first 7:18 as San Diego State built an 18-point lead at 49-31. The Aztecs would push their advantage out to as many as 23 on six occasions, before coming away with the 75-54 victory.
