SDSU Plays Host to MWC Softball Championship

The San Diego State softball team (26-28 overall, 4-16 MWC) plays host to this week's 2005 Mountain West Conference championships, May 12-14, at the SDSU Softball Stadium. The Aztecs, the tournament's No. 6 seed, open with a 2 p.m. game against No. 3 seed Colorado State, Thursday afternoon.

Top-seeded BYU claimed its second regular season conference crown with a 16-2 league mark and is currently 41-12 overall. UNLV is seeded second, followed by No. 4 Utah and No. 5 New Mexico.

The double-elimination tournament opens with an 11:30 a.m. game between Utah and New Mexico. Following the first game, the Aztecs and Rams will take the field in a re-match of last Sunday's regular season finale, which saw SDSU sweep a doubleheader.

BYU and UNLV both received opening round byes with the Cougars playing the winner of the Utes-Lobos game Thursday at 4:30 p.m. The Rebels will oppose the winner of the SDSU-CSU contest to complete the first day of competition at 7 p.m.

Four games will also take place Friday, while the MWC championship is slated for Saturday at 4:30 p.m.

The winner of the championship game receives an automatic bid to the NCAA softball championships.

This week marks the second time that San Diego State has played host to the MWC championships. The Aztecs last played host in 2003.

SDSU has advanced to the last four MWC championship games and has an all-time record of 8-7 in the tournament. A year ago, the Aztecs

defeated New Mexico (2-1) in the semifinals before falling to Utah (3-0).

Aztecs Vs. CSU

SDSU and Colorado State have faced each other 55 times, with the Aztecs holding a 30-25 edge in the all-time series. The Rams took two from the Aztecs in Fort Collins, winning 2-0 and 6-2, but SDSU exacted revenge at home, sweeping CSU 1-0 and 7-5. Head coach Kathy Van Wyk is 23-12 against CSU, while Rams coach Mary Yori is 6-14 against the Aztecs.

The Rams are led at the plate by Jessica Strickland (.386, 19 2B, 5 HR, 36 RBI) and Brittany Huerta (.346, 7 2B, 2 HR, 17 RBI). Top pitchers for CSU are the dual-threat Strickland (11-8, 2.00 ERA, 86 K), and Genevieve Kelly (14-8, 2.66 ERA, 105 K).

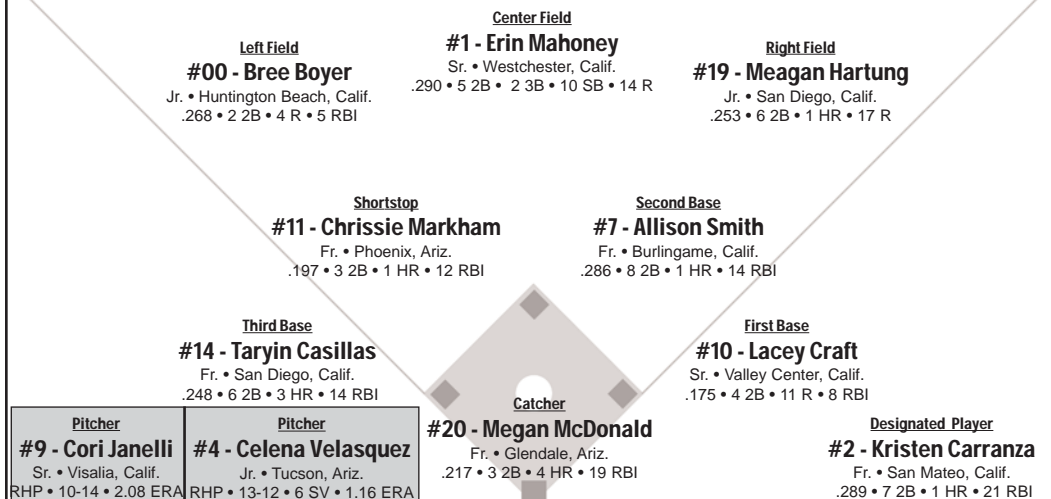
Velasquez Named POW

and 18th career shutouts. She allowed no earned runs and just six hits in 19.0 innings on the mound, leading the Aztecs to a 3-1 record for the week.

In game one vs. New Mexico, Velasquez struck out two and gave up only four hits, while walking two in SDSU's 3-0 win. She came on in relief in game two vs. the Lobos, holding New Mexico scoreless and striking out six in 3.1 innings of work.

On May 8, Velasquez tossed her second complete game shutout of the week and her 11th of the season in the Aztecs' 1-0 game one win vs. Colorado State. In 7.0 innings on the mound, she gave up only two hits and struck out four. In game two vs. the Rams, she came on in relief in the top of the sixth with the tying run at the plate and one out. She escaped the inning after forcing a popup to centerfield and a lineout to third. She retired CSU in order in the seventh inning to collect her sixth save of the season.

Bats Break Out In Final Weekend

Last weekend the Aztecs got what they had been praying for since the conference season began - hot hitting. And it couldn't have come at a better time for the team hosting the MWC Championship.

Entering last weekend, SDSU was last in the conference in batting average, hitting .236. But in the last four games, the Aztecs batted .295, with 31 hits, 10 RBI, 13 runs scored, three doubles and the team's first home run in conference play. The 13 runs matched SDSU's conference total entering the weekend.

Junior Meagan Hartung (7-for-12, .583), Senior Erin Mahoney (4-for-8, .500) and Freshman Chrissie Markham (4-for-12, .333) led the attack for the Aztecs, combining for 15 hits, four RBI, two runs and three stolen bases. Freshmen Megan McDonald (3-for-9, .333), Tamani Wells (2-for-6, .333) and Taryn Casillas (4-for-14, .286) also had a strong weekend for SDSU.

Defense Nearly Perfect On Mother's Day Weekend

The Aztec defense was almost perfect last weekend, committing only one error in 104 chances in the field, good for a .991 fielding percentage. SDSU picked up 27 assists and three double-plays, compared to only two double-plays in its previous 16 conference games. Perhaps the best was Taryn Casillas, who fielded a perfect third base with 13 assists on the weekend, compared to nine coming into the homestand.

Breaking All The Records

SDSU is already surpassing the 2004 softball edition in numerous statistics, and doing it 52 games into the season. Aztec pitchers had 251 strikeouts last season, but the 2005 staff, led by Celena Velasquez and Cori Janelli, already have 370. The 370 strikeouts also set a new team record, eclipsing the 266 the 2001 team tossed. Velasquez (197) and Janelli (149) have also topped their strikeout totals from last season of 101 and 85, respectively, and now rank third and fifth, respectively, in the Aztec single-season record book. Velasquez is just two strikeouts shy of second place on the single-season charts, behind Bre DeSanta, and six behind Sandra Durazo's 203, set in 2001. Last season Velasquez had five saves, a feat she has already surpassed with six this season. Her 11 career saves place Velasquez in the top-30 in the NCAA career record books.

Burlingame Has Got Game

When SDSU recruited teammates Kristen Carranza and Allison Smith from Burlingame High School in Burlingame, Calif., the Aztecs felt that they could be everyday starters and top hitters for the team, but they did not know it would happen in their freshman year.

Smith is third on the team with a .286 average, plays the majority of the time at second and third base. She is tied for third on the team with 14 RBI, and has a team-high eight doubles, a triple, a home run and 11 runs scored. Smith is third on the team in slugging (.389) and second in on-base percentage (.341). She leads the Aztecs during the conference slate, hitting .288.

Carranza is second on SDSU with a .289 batting average, splitting time in right field, first base and as a designated player. She leads the team with 21 RBI, three triples and 18 runs scored. Carranza ranks second on the squad with seven doubles. She has a team-high .361 on base average and is second with a .401 slugging percentage.

Hartung Heating Up At The Right Time

Meagan Hartung finally stopped the slump that had hampered her all season with her play last weekend. The junior went 7-for-12 (.583) with a run scored, two walks and a pair of stolen bases. Her seven hits in the four games nearly doubled her MWC total of five. She was the Aztecs' leading hitter with a .364 average in 2004, but like the team, had been mired in a 1-16 losing streak dating back to the game against Oregon on March 20. She broke out just in time to help the

red-hot Aztecs win three of their last four games heading into the MWC Championship, with a NCAA Tournament berth at stake.

She currently ranks seventh on the team in hitting, batting at a .253 pace with six doubles, a home run, seven RBI and 17 runs scored, good for second on the team. Hartung also ranks second in stolen bases, nabbing five this season.

Close But Not Quite

San Diego State's record doesn't show just how competitive the Aztecs really are. In the team's 28 losses this season, 17 have been by two runs or fewer and seven by just one run.

Pitching Staff Among The Best In Nation

Two-time Mountain West Pitcher of the Year Celena Velasquez and senior Cori Janelli are back to lead an excellent Aztec pitching staff. Velasquez, a junior, has an 13-12 record with six saves and a 1.16 ERA. She leads the team in appearances (39), strikeouts (197), and opponent batting average (.170), in 175.2 innings of work. She currently ranks first in the MWC in earned run average, opponent batting average, strikeouts, and saves, while she is second in innings pitched and fifth in wins. Janelli has posted a 2.08 overall ERA this season, including a 10-14 record with 149 strikeouts in 144.2 innings pitched. She ranks seventh in the conference in ERA and is fifth in opposing batting average. Janelli also places sixth in the league in innings pitched and she is third in strikeouts. Sophomore Katie Cochran is also in the mix with a 3-2 record and a 3.27 ERA. She has 24 strikeouts in 40.2 innings.

In the most recent national statistics released May 1 by the NCAA, Velasquez ranked eighth nationally in saves and 45th in earned run average.

Mahoney, Hartung Join Century Club

Senior outfielder Erin Mahoney recently became one of the newest members of the 100-hit club, with a single in her final at-bat against Southern Utah, March 5, to cap off a 3-for-4 afternoon. Mahoney also recently reached 35 sacrifice bunts, moving her into fifth in the all-time Aztec record book. She currently leads SDSU in batting with a .290 average, with five doubles, two triples, 14 runs scored, seven RBI and a team-high 10 stolen bases. She is also the toughest Aztec to strike out, fanning only eight times in 124 at-bats, or 0.45 times per game.

Meagan Hartung notched her 100th hit last weekend with a fifth-inning infield single in game two against New Mexico. Hartung and Mahoney are the only members of the current Aztec squad to notch 100 career hits.

Aztecs Tough At Home

Last season the Aztecs were 22-9 at home, including two-game sweeps of No. 21 Oklahoma State and Mississippi State, plus conference opponents Colorado State, New Mexico, and UNLV. SDSU was also 7-3 in San Diego during MWC play. The last two seasons combined, the Aztecs were 46-15, for a .754 winning percentage, the most home wins by any team in the MWC.

So far this season the Aztecs are 14-10 at home allowing only 58 runs in 24 games (31 of which came in five con-

The brand-new SDSU stadium is starting to feel more and more like home for the Aztecs since opening the facility on Feb. 17 with a loss to Oregon State, 9-5. Since that point, SDSU has gone 9-9, winning three of its last four games played at the stadium.

Van Wyk Is Winningest Coach In SDSU History

Kathy Van Wyk is the winningest coach in SDSU history with a 297-235-1 record. She broke Linda Spradley's (1984-94) win total of 253 on March 21, 2004, when the Aztecs topped Buffalo, 6-0. The two served as co-head coaches from 1995-96 and compiled a 48-69 mark. Under Van Wyk's leadership, SDSU has advanced to its only two NCAA tournament appearances in 2001 and 2003. The 2001 squad went 3-2 and advanced to the regional championship against host UCLA, while the 2003 team was 1-2 in tourney action.

Aztecs Vs. Brigham Young

SDSU and Brigham Young have faced each other 23 times, with the Aztecs holding a 12-11 edge in the all-time series. BYU swept the season series from SDSU, winning in Provo 6-0 and 9-4, and in San Diego 5-0 and 2-1. Head coach Kathy Van Wyk is 12-11 against the Cougars, while BYU coach Gordon Eakin is 8-3 against the Aztecs.

The Cougars are led at the plate by Lauren Watson-Perry (.438, 10 2B, 8 HR, 33 RBI) and laneta Le'i (.357, 11 2B, 10 HR, 50 RBI). Top pitchers for BYU are Summer Tobias (16-6, 1.70 ERA, 98 K), and Daniella Urincho (13-2, 1.75 ERA, 66 K).

Aztecs Vs. New Mexico

SDSU and New Mexico have faced each other 64 times, with the Aztecs holding a 40-24 edge in the all-time series. The Lobos took two from the Aztecs in Albuquerque, winning 2-1 and 4-1, but SDSU was able to earn a split at home, winning 3-0 before falling 3-2. Head coach Kathy Van Wyk is 23-11 against UNM, while Lobo coach Kim Newbern is 4-10 against the Aztecs.

New Mexico is led at the plate by Kristi Schmallen (.352, 6 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBI) and RYanne Hodgins (.319, 4 2B, 0 HR, 11 RBI). Top pitchers for the Lobos are Katie Gregg (8-5, 2.76 ERA, 33 K), and Ashley Perkins (4-14, 3.80 ERA, 119 K).

Aztecs Vs. UNLV

SDSU and UNLV have faced each other 61 times, with the Aztecs holding a 31-30 edge in the all-time series. The Rebels swept the season series from SDSU, winning 2-0 and 4-0 in Las Vegas, and 1-0 and 4-2 in San Diego. Head coach Kathy Van Wyk is 24-13 against UNLV, while Rebel coach Lonni Alameda is 4-4 against the Aztecs.

UNLV is led at the plate by Marissa Nichols (.440, 16 2B, 15 HR, 43 RBI) and Caitlyn Paus (.337, 8 2B, 9 HR, 44 RBI). Top pitchers for the Rebels are Jacque Kerrigan (26-13, 1.62 ERA, 176 K), and Shannon Crisp (14-2, 2.01 ERA, 46 K).

Aztecs Vs. Utah

SDSU and Utah have faced each other 62 times, with the Utes holding a 41-21 edge in the all-time series. Utah took two from the Aztecs in Salt Lake City, winning 2-1 and 2-0, after SDSU had earned a split at home, winning 1-0 after falling in the first game 5-0. Head coach Kathy Van Wyk is 13-20 against the Utes, while Utah coach Mona Stevens is 17-12 against the Aztecs.

The Utes are led at the plate by Diana Phillips (.312, 6 2B, 1 HR, 12 RBI) and Ivette Hernandez (.311, 5 2B, 9 HR, 29 RBI). Top pitchers for Utah are Brianna Gourdin (11-13, 2.98 ERA, 100 K), and Lindsie Nielsen (9-13, 3.32 ERA, 105 K).
