THIS WEEKEND

San Diego State continues its road swing this weekend as it heads to Oregon for the Nike Portland Invitational. The Aztecs will kick off the action on Friday, Sept. 12, when they take on undefeated Washington at 3 p.m. PT. SDSU will then close out the tournament two days later with a 2:30 p.m. match against No. 6 Portland. Both games will be played at Merlo Field, the home of the Pilots.

SERIES HISTORY VS. WASHINGTON

San Diego State trails in its all-time series with the University of Washington by a 1-5-1 count. The Aztecs' lone win came in the last meeting between the two teams on Sept. 4, 2005, when the Scarlet and Black blanked the Huskies, 1-0.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

With two big wins last weekend, Washington has continued its perfect start to the season at 4-0-0.

UW recently hosted the Husky/Nike Invitational (Sept. 5-7) where it finished second based on goals scored. Washington opened the weekend with a 4-1 victory over Colgate before shutting out Kennesaw State, 2-0. Junior Veronica Perez paced the Huskies with three goals on the weekend.

On the season, Perez leads UW with five goals, including two game-winners, and 10 points. Senior Melissa Beal has chipped in two tallies, while junior Alex Kirk has racked up a team-high three assists. Junior Alex Phillips has seen most of the action in front of the net with a 0.67 goals against average in three games played.

SERIES HISTORY VS. PORTLAND

San Diego State has never defeated Portland since the two teams first met in 1992. The Aztecs trail the all-time series by a 0-7 count and lost the last encounter, 3-0, in Seattle, Wash. (Sept. 2, 2005).

A GLANCE AT THE PILOTS

Portland (4-1-0) is ranked sixth in the latest NSCAA/adidas national rankings released on Sept. 9. The Pilots advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament a year ago.

Last weekend, Portland went on an offensive frenzy, dismantling Kennesaw State, 8-0, before downing Colgate, 6-0, to claim the Husky/Nike Invitational title. Freshman Danielle Foxhoven racked up five goals over the weekend with a hat trick vs. Colgate.

Portland's only loss of the season came at the hands of then third-ranked UCLA on Aug. 30, but the Pilots quickly bounced back from the defeat, upending then No. 1 USC just two days later.

On the season, the Pilots are led by Foxhoven, who has compiled six goals and 13 points. Junior Michelle Enyeart has also been a key asset to the offense with four goals and three assists. Junior Kelsey Davis has been manning the net for Portland, allowing just two goals in five games played for a 0.39 goals against average.

Mike Friesen

Head Coach
Second Season/Fifth Overall
at SDSU
Sonoma State, 1996

After spending three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen enters his second season as the Aztecs' head coach.

Friesen, the fourth head coach in Aztec history, has played a significant role in bringing excitement back to San Diego State soccer. An offensive standout in his playing days at Point Loma Nazarene (1988-89) and Sonoma State (1993-94), Friesen has helped the Aztecs become one of the most potent offenses in the West Coast.

As an associate head coach at SDSU, the Aztecs netted 28 goals in 2005, the most for the program since 2002. In 2004, SDSU reached the Mountain West Conference championship game for the first time since 1999. The team's 3-1-2 conference record was also its best since that same 1999 season.

Friesen teamed with former Aztec head coach Dr. Mike Giuliano to bring an up-tempo-in-your-face style of defense, which was successful, as evident by the team's nine shutouts in 2004, second most in school history. The Aztecs allowed just 18 goals in 21 games that season, the program's fewest since the 1990 squad gave up 12 goals in 13 games.

Prior to coming to San Diego State, Friesen spent five years working with the UC Santa Barbara women's program.

Upon arriving in Santa Barbara, Friesen helped turn the Gaucho program around, going from a 7-29-2 mark and scoring just 27 goals the two seasons prior to his arrival, to a 24-11-6 mark in 2002-03, tallying 105 scores.

Friesen has a great deal of experience coaching at a variety of levels. Before his time at UCSB, he guided the under-19 Santa Rosa United Aftershocks to the 1999 girls' California State Cup championship. In 1997, he directed Ursuline High School in Santa Rosa, Calif., to the CIF North Coast Section championship game.

victories were won at SDSU Sports Deck. After two weeks on the road, the Scarlet and Black will return to The Mesa for a 4 p.m. contest vs. UC Riverside on Friday, Sept. 19.

BACK FOR MORE

The Aztecs return 16 letterwinners and seven starters from a 2007 squad that posted a 9-8-3 mark and finished second in the MWC. SDSU had its best league record (4-2-1) since the 2000 campaign when the Scarlet and Black went 4-2.

Returning starters from last season include seniors Alicia Piz and Jillian Riker, juniors Millie Allen, Allie Crowson, Ali Lokanc and Heather Vandevanter, and sophomore All-American Aubree Southwick.

FRESH FACES

Several freshmen are expected to make an immediate impact in their first year on The Mesa. Newcomers Gretel Amman (D) and Megan McQueeney (D) have started all five games on the backline, while Tiffany Hurst (MF) has made her way into the starting lineup four times. Fellow freshmen Taylor Canatsey (F) and Jaime Nelson (MF) have also seen action over the last three weekends.

In all, the Aztecs welcome 11 newcomers in 2008. The remainder of the incoming class are sophomore transfer Michaela DeJesus (F), and freshmen Allie Brown (MF), Julia Flores (D), Megan Allaire (GK), Christina Palomino (GK) and Jackie Spinner (D).

AMONG THE MWC LEADERS

San Diego State has several players ranked among the Mountain West Conference's top 10 individual leaders. Jessica Gordon and Cat Walker are both tied for second in goals (3) and goals per game (0.60). The Aztec duo is also tied for third in points (7) and points per game (1.40). Senior Alicia Piz is tied for sixth with 3.20 shots per game, while Heather Vandevanter is tied for fourth with two assists. Sophomore goalkeeper Aubree Southwick is currently tied for third with 4.00 saves per game.

San Diego State was picked to finish in a tie for third place with Utah in the Mountain West Conference regular season standings. The Aztecs and Utes each received 36 points in the 2008 preseason coaches' poll, while Brigham Young was tabbed as the favorite with 49 points.

2007 POSTSEASON HONORS

Goalkeeper Aubree Southwick racked up the accolades last season, becoming the first player in Mountain West Conference history to earn two individual awards when she was tabbed the defensive player of the year and freshman of the year. The first-team all-MWC pick also garnered Soccer Buzz freshman All-America recognition.

Joining Southwick on the all-MWC first team was Jackie Ragudos, while Millie Allen and Jessica Girdner were both selected to the second team.

UP NEXT

San Diego State will return to The Mesa on Friday, Sept. 19, after two weekends on the road. The Aztecs will host UC Riverside at 4 p.m. PT in just its second home game of the season.

The following weekend, the Aztecs will head to Cal State Fullerton for a 7 p.m. contest (Sept. 26), before kicking off a three-game homestand that includes the Scarlet and Black's conference opener vs. UNLV (Oct. 3), which will be televised live on The Mtn.
