SAN DIEGO STATE AZTECS

2017-18 Record: 22-11 (11-7 Mountain West)

Head Coach: Brian Dutcher

PRESEASON NOTES

- San Diego State preps for the 2018-19 campaign as the defending 2018 Mountain West champions, after it won the MW tournament to capture its league-high 11th conference title.
- In its preparation for the upcoming season, SDSU will look to return to the NCAA tournament for the second straight year. The Aztecs' NCAA appearance in 2018 was their first since 2015, and their 12th postseason berth in the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT).
- Head coach Brian Dutcher is set for his second season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 22-11 record. He was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament in 2018. In 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat.
- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in redshirt sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels (2018 all-MW third team by media, honorable mention by coaches) sophomore forward Matt Mitchell and senior guard Devin Watson. The trio played in all 33 games a year ago with Watson starting every game, Mitchell receiving the opening nod 32 times (starting the final 31 outings) and McDaniels starting 21 of the final 22 contests (did not start on Senior Night).
- The aforementioned threesome ranked No. 2, 3 and 4 in scoring in 2017-18 with Watson leading the way at 12.2 points and falling seven points shy of tying outgoing senior Malik Pope for the team lead in the category. Mitchell and McDaniels, meanwhile, each finished with 10.5 scoring averages.
- SDSU returns from last year its leader in rebounding average (McDaniels 7.5), assists (Watson 124), steals (Mitchell 36), fieldgoal percentage (McDaniels - .586), free-throw percentage (McDaniels - .788), three-point field-goal percentage (Watson - .389), three-pointers (Mitchell and Watson - 49) and minutes (Watson - 1,031).
- Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley and junior forward Nolan Narain are back for their respective seasons after receiving the starting nod at different times throughout the 2017-18 campaign. Hemsley (7.3 ppg, 1.22 a/to) played in 32 of 33 games last year, starting seven times, and enters '18-19 with 63 starting assignments in 101 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Narain, meanwhile, started once in 23 games and averaged career highs in every category (4.7 ppg, 2.0 rpg, .688 FG).
- Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. Hailing from Torrance, Schakel ranked fourth on the team last year in three-point makes (27) and percentage (.346; min. 40 3FGA), while playing in all 33 games (13.8 mpg). Schakel averaged 3.2 points and 2.1 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing just nine turnovers in 455 minutes. In fact, he only had one multi-turnover game all season and finished the year with 26 straight one-turnover-or-less outings.
- SDSU also welcomes back redshirt freshman guard Adam Seiko and walk-on senior guard Michael Sohikish. The 6-3, 195-pound Seiko, who sat out '17-18, came to San Diego State as a three-star guard out of highly successful Sierra Canyon High where he helped them to a 27-3 record, a No. 5 California ranking and a No. 15 national ranking as a senior in 2016-17. Sohikish, meanwhile, was on the travel squad all last year and played in 11 games.
- The Aztecs will bring the tallest incoming freshman class since Dutcher has been on The Mesa, which dates to the start of the 1999-2000 campaign. The group's average height is 6-8 and includes 6-6 Aguek Arop, 6-8 Ed Chang, 6-10 Joel Mensah and 6-10 Nathan Mensah. Arop was the 2016 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year and a two-time all-state selection, while Chang and the Mensahs are considered four-star talents, according to ESPN. San Diego State will also bring into the fold Malachi Flynn, a Washington State transfer, who will sit this season. The guard averaged 15.8 points, 3.4 rebounds and a team-high 4.3 assists in 33.4 minutes last season as a sophomore for the Cougars.

TEAM NOTES

- The Aztecs finished last year with a 22-11 record and an 11-7 effort in the Mountain West. SDSU posted its 13th straight season with at least 19 victories despite losing 16 games due to injury (spread amonast seven different players), including five from senior guard and team co-captain Trey Kell. He also missed parts of three other games due to injury (SDSU was 3-5 in games he did not play due to injury or played partially due to injury).
- Of San Diego State's 11 losses last season, six came in games in which SDSU was tied or led at halftime, five came by four points or fewer, and four came when SDSU led with five minutes to play in the game.
- San Diego State was extremely unfortunate last season, going 1-5 in games decided by four points or less.
- San Diego State was a completely different team last year when healthy. After Kell missed what would be his final game due to injury on Feb. 10 (at Nevada), he returned the next game at home vs. Wyoming and helped lead the Aztecs to nine straight victories. The nine-game winning streak, which was tied for the fifth-longest in the country entering the 2018 NCAA tournament, included the final six games of the regular season and three in the Mountain West tournament.
- The Aztecs were once again the top defensive team in the Mountain West, ranking first in scoring defense (67.9) and field-goal percentage defense (.417) for the fifth consecutive season, SDSU also ranked second in the league in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.327). In conference games only, San Diego State ranked first in scoring defense (70.1) for the fifth straight year.
- As San Diego State continued the trend of having the MW's top defense (No. 30 nationally/No. 1 in MW in defensive adjusted efficiency by KenPom), it made strides on the offensive end, averaging 77.1 points per game. SDSU's offensive scoring output was better than the previous season's 68.5 average and was its highest since 1984-85, when that team put up 80.4 points an outing.
- The Aztecs ranked 77th in America in offensive adjusted efficiency by KenPom, which was an 106-place improvement from the season before. Prior to last year's performance, San Diego State had an average offensive adjusted efficiency ranking of 172 in the three years prior.
- SDSU posted at least 20 wins for the 12th time in the last 13 seasons. The Aztecs also recorded its 15th 20-win season with 13 coming with head coach Brian Dutcher on the sidelines.
- San Diego State is coming off its ninth NCAA tournament appearance in the last 19 seasons, all of which have occurred with Brian Dutcher on the sideline.
- SDSU claimed its Mountain West-leading 11th conference title last year and broke a tie with New Mexico by claiming its fifth MW tournament crown. The Aztecs, who were playing in their fourth Mountain West championship game in the last five seasons, won the tourney for the first time since 2011.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 210-71. SDSU's .747 winning percentage is the 12th-best nationally over the last eight years (complete list is on page 1).
- SDSU enters the new year having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 12 of the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT). In the last 13 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.2 victories.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last eight years.

PLAYER PERSONNEL

- San Diego State returns three starters in senior guard Devin Watson and sophomore forwards Jalen McDaniels and Matt Mitchell. The trio figures to be inserted into the starting five from the outset after Watson started all 33 games, Mitchell started 32 times, including 31 straight to end the year, and McDaniels started 21 of the final 22 games (did not start on Senior Night) last year. In addition to Watson, McDaniels and Mitchell saw action in every game.
- Watson will take the steering wheel of the offense in his final year of eligibility. The Oceanside native was a major reason the Aztec offense last season averaged almost nine points (+8.6) better than it did the previous season (77.1-68.5). Watson nearly led the team in scoring (12.2), falling seven points shy of tying leader Malik Pope, had a team-high 124 assists against just 60 miscues, and shared the team lead with 49 treys (Mitchell). A career 1,000-point scorer, Watson has averaged 13.5 points for his career and reached double figures in scoring 65 times in 94 career games. He owns the most starting experience of any player on the team (80), with 47 starts in his first two seasons at San Francisco and 33 last year with SDSU.
- McDaniels, who entered the 2018 NBA Draft without an agent and withdrew, will look to build upon a stellar redshirt freshman campaign in which he was an all-Mountain West third-team selection by the media and an honorable mention pick by the league's head coaches. The rising sophomore forward averaged 10.5 points and a team-best 7.5 rebounds, while shooting 58.6 percent from the floor and 78.8 percent from the free throw line, both of which were team highs. In Mountain West play, he was even better, ranking first on the team in points scored (226), but second in average (12.6), and first in rebounding (8.5), field-goal percentage (.628) and free-throw percentage (.813). A high-motor player, McDaniels scored in double figures 18 times, grabbed at least 10 rebounds 11 times and had nine double-doubles, all while not turning the ball over much (23 games with one turnover or less). He also led the Aztecs in their NCAA tournament game, posting 18 points and nine rebounds.
- Mitchell is back after a solid true freshman season that saw him average 10.5 points (.450 FG, .358 3FG), 4.0 rebounds, 1.8 assists and a team-high 1.1 steals, while tying for the team lead in three-pointers with 49 (Watson). Built like a two-sport star, standing at 6-6 and 230 pounds, Mitchell scored in double figures 20 times, including his 31-point outburst vs. Eastern Illinois (10-14 FG, 7-11 3FG, 4-5 FT) in his fourth career game. Mitchell's versatility can be seen by looking at his career highs - 31 points vs. EIU, 9 rebounds vs. Washington, 6 assists vs. California, 3 steals vs. four different opponents, 3 blocked shots

- vs. Air Force. With his size, Dutcher is able to play Mitchell at the 2, 3 and 4, with the possibility of him guarding a 5 thanks to his strength.
- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** will have the option of starting an all-senior backcourt with **Jeremy Hemsley** returning for his final season. The senior from Rancho Cucamonga is a 1,000-point scorer for his career and has averaged 10.8 points in 101 career games. The two-time all-Mountain West selection has started more games in an SDSU uniform (63) than anyone on the current roster, but also has experience coming off the bench to bring a spark if needed. Last season, he emerged as a lock-down defender, often drawing the toughest assignment on the perimeter, and produced the best assist-to-turnover ratio of his career (1.22).
- Notan Narain is coming off his most productive season after averaging career highs in every category (4.7 ppg, 2.0 rpg). The 6-10, 226-pound junior forward from Canada played in a career-high 23 games and started for the first time in a win at San José State. Narain played important minutes down the stretch as the Aztecs won nine straight games en route to the Mountain West championship. In the first victory of that nine-game stretch, Narain exploded for a career-high 18 points on 8-of-10 shooting in 18 minutes vs. Wyoming. Incredibly efficient from the field (.688 FG last season, .610 FG career) and on the offensive glass (21 of 46 rebounds last season were of the offensive variety), Narain is expected to continue his upward trend as he enters his fourth year in the program.
- Jordan Schakel enjoyed a true freshman campaign last season that saw him play in every game and make an impact not only on the stat sheet, but off it as well. The guard made 34.6 percent of his three-point attempts (27-78) as he transitioned from playing power forward in high school to shooting guard in college. He made at least one three-pointer in 17 games, including a 4-for-5 effort in a home win over Wyoming en route to a career-high 14 points. Schakel, who is not afraid to step in a take a charge as he did multiple times in a victory over Georgia, enters the new year having committed one turnover or less in 26 straight games, covering 329 minutes.
- Adam Seiko, who was a part of last year's incoming class, will join the active roster after utilizing his redshirt campaign in 2017-18. The 6-3, 195-pound guard is known for his defense, but last season in practice proved he can shoot the ball from the perimeter and has the ability to bring the ball up the floor and initiate the offense. Seiko's versatility in playing both guard positions will make him a welcomed addition to the roster, which also features walk-on senior guard Michael Sohikish. The former student manager suited up all last season and was a part of the travel squad, ultimately playing in 11 games, including the first five of 2017-18.
- Aguek Arop, Ed Chang, Joel Mensah and Nathan Mensah form the tallest incoming class since Dutcher arrived on campus prior to the start of the 1999-2000 campaign. The quartet's average height outdistances the 2012-13 group of Winston Shepard, Matt Shrigley and Skylar Spencer, 6-8.5 vs. 6-7.7. The foursome will provide length and athleticism to a group that already boasts it and to a program that has thrived on it over the years. In Arop (6-6, 210) and Chang (6-8, 210), Dutcher will have skilled wings that can put the ball on the deck and get to the rim, and shoot it in from the perimeter. As for the Mensahs, who are not related, they will bring their 6-10 frames to the table, be able to run the floor and do a variety things on both ends of the floor.
- Malachi Flynn will be waiting in the wings for 2019-20, as he sits following his transfer from Washington State. The high-scoring guard from Tacoma, Washington averaged 15.8 points, 3.4 rebounds and 4.3 assists last season as a sophomore for the Cougars. He had 10 games with at least 20 points in 2017-18, including a 30-point effort vs. Colorado and a 24-point, 5-rebound and 6-assist performance vs. the Aztecs last November at the Wooden Legacy in Fullerton. For his career, he has averaged 12.8 points, 3.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists in 62 games (61 starts).

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

2nd Season • 20th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is in his second season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 19-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 13 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an atlarge invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for

Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.


