March 12, 2003

- The Aztecs and Lobos met for the third straight year in the MWC Tournament with New Mexico winning the prior two games. Including today's game, the all-time series stands at 13-13.
- New Mexico sophomore Mandi Moore scored a combined 12 points in two meetings vs. SDSU this season. She had a game-high 11 points at the half of today's game and finished with 15 points. This marks Moore's 10th game scoring in double figures this season, but her first in seven games.
- In three meetings this season, the Lobos have outscored the Aztecs 107-59 in the first half. UNM held a 34-22 advantage at the break of today's game.
- SDSU opened the second half on an 11-0 run to pull with one (33-34), but never held a lead in the second stanza. Today's margin of victory for the Lobos was the smallest in the last seven meetings of the series.
- Ashonda Williams scored double figures for the fourth time this season and the second time in the last four games with a game-high 18 points.
- New Mexico senior Jordan Adams set the MWC Championship single-game record for blocks with five today.
- New Mexico senior Chelsea Grear totaled a game-high 11 rebounds, marking her fifth game this year with 10-plus boards.
- SDSU senior Jamey Cox averaged 13 points per game this season, but did not reach double figures in scoring in any of the three meetings vs. the Lobos. However her six points today moved her to seventh on the SDSU all-time scoring list with 1,275 points.
- Four players in today's game did not leave the court -- three Aztecs (Williams, Cox, Wolf) and one Lobo (Moore).
- SDSU freshman Ashlee Dunlap recorded her conference-leading 10th double-double of the season with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Game 3 – No. 2 New Mexico vs. No. 7 San Diego State

New Mexico Head Coach Don Flanagan:

“They came out and made a run to start the second half and we responded with poise and patience and we won because of that. It wasn’t the best game we’ve played, but at the same time when it’s the third time you’ve played a team it’s difficult because they are relaxed and they have nothing to lose. The two most important things for us were that we took the run and came right back at them and that we learn from this and move on.”

“They were hitting their shots and we weren’t hitting ours, but we calmed down and adjusted to what they were doing after having difficulty in the beginning.”

New Mexico player Mandi Moore:

“I never really thought we were in trouble. I knew that if we just stayed poised we would be alright and that’s what we did, stayed poised.
