AS A JUNIOR (2006-07)

Played in 20 games, starting five, after missing the first six contests with a stress reaction in her right foot ... Fourth on the team in scoring average (6.8 ppg.) and third in blocked shots (18) ... Seven double-figure scoring games ... Led the Aztecs in points three times and in rebounding on five occasions ... Shot 44.8 percent from the field ... Made her first career appearance against Cal Poly on Dec. 7, recording a block and a rebound ... Team game-high five rebounds and five points versus No. 17/16 George Washington ... Tallied eight points and added three rebounds, two steals and a block at Utah ... Then career-high nine points and five rebounds at Wyoming ... First career double-double in the win over CSU, posting then career bests of 12 points and 12 rebounds ... Season-high two assists and three blocks to go with seven boards at TCU ... Matched previous season-best with 12 points versus Utah ... Two assists, blocks and steals in win over UNLV ... In first start, had 12 points, six rebounds and two steals at Air Force ... Career-high 13 points on 6-for-7 shooting at Colorado St. ... A starter with 12 points at BYU and 10 vs. TCU ... Matched career best with 13 points against UNM and added a team-high eight boards and three blocks ... First career three-pointer on her first career attempt against the Lobos ... Finished the regular season with four straight double-figure scoring games.

AT WEST LOS ANGELES CC (2004-06)

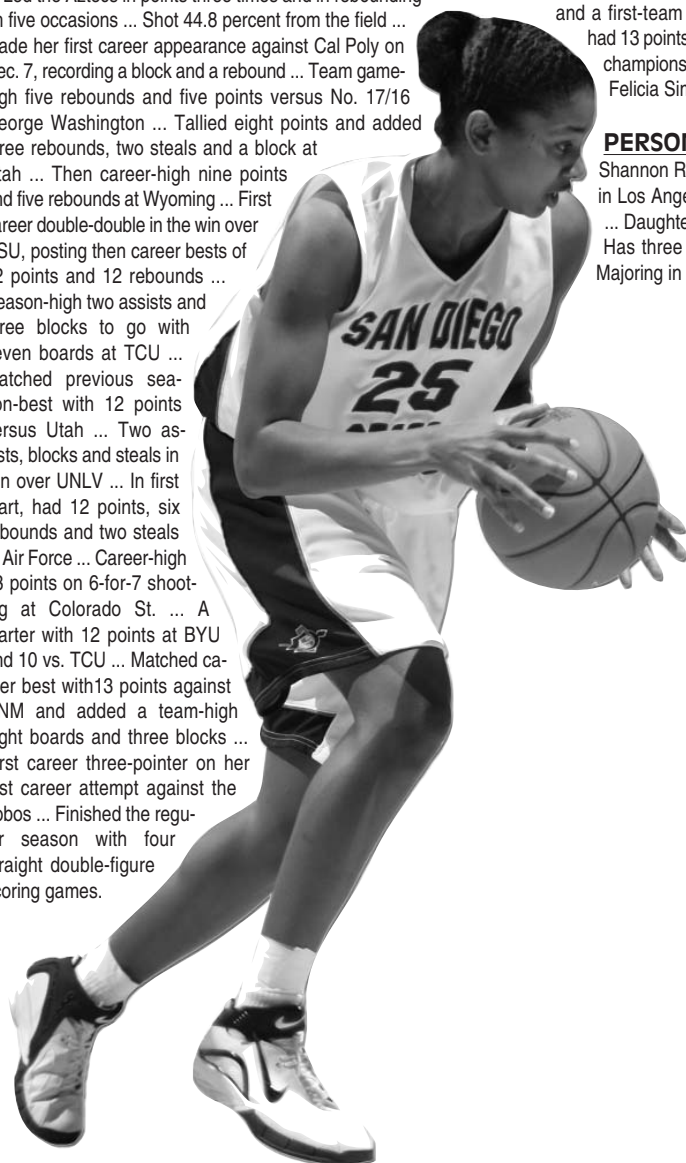

QUICKLY

Has appeared in 83 career games the most of any Aztec on the current roster ... Played in all of the team's contests since coming to SDSU in 2004-05 ... Saw action at the No. 2 spot most of last season, serving as the team's main threat from beyond the arc ... Solid at the free-throw line and on defense ... Ranks seventh in Aztec history in career three-pointers attempted (206) and ninth in triples made (62) ... Has at least one three-pointer in 20 of the last 25 games ... Mountain West Conference all-academic team member and scholar-athlete three straight years ... Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society ... Traveled to Ireland this past summer to complete an internship toward her degree in international business.

AS A JUNIOR (2006-07)

Played in all 28 games, starting on three occasions ... Career-best season scoring average of 6.6 points per game ... Her 41 three-pointers were most on the team and nearly double her previous two-year career total ... Career-high eight double-figure scoring games ... Season-best five assists in the victory against UC Davis ... Four-straight games with 10 or more points from Nov. 22-Dec. 7, helping the team to a 3-1 record during that span ... Was 4-for-5 from beyond the arc against Wichita State ... Made the game-winning shot versus Cal Poly in overtime ... Season-high five steals vs. Brown ... Career-best 18 points in the win over CSU, going 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and adding a 5-for-6 effort at the line ... Led the team in points for the second straight outing with 15, including three triples, versus BYU ... Matched career best with four three-pointers on six attempts against UNLV, finishing with 14 points ... Career-high two blocks vs. Wyoming ... Four steals at the MWC tournament against the Cowgirls.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2005-06)

One of five Aztecs to play in every game ... All 13 starts came against conference opponents ... Team game-high in assists seven times ... Fourth on the team in three-pointers made and first in percentage ... Made over 42 percent of her attempts from beyond the arc in conference contests ... Third in assists with 54 and tied for fourth in steals with 25 ...

41 of her 54 assists came in conference action (team best in league contests) ... Top season performance versus UC Davis, scoring a season-best 13 points, with nine coming on triples ... Also had a season-best six rebounds and five assists (no turnovers) in 33 minutes ... First start of the year at Colorado State, logging a career-high seven assists.

AS A FRESHMAN (2004-05)

Played in all 28 games, starting 20 times at the point ... Aztecs' leader in assists with 59 and second in steals with 52 ... Sixth in the MWC in both steals per game (1.86) and free-throw percentage (.750) ... In league contests, ranked fourth in steals (1.93/g) and fifth in free-throw percentage (.795) ... Led SDSU in assists in nine games ... Had three assists in her collegiate debut at USD ... Scored 17 points in her first home game against Cal State Stanislaus ... 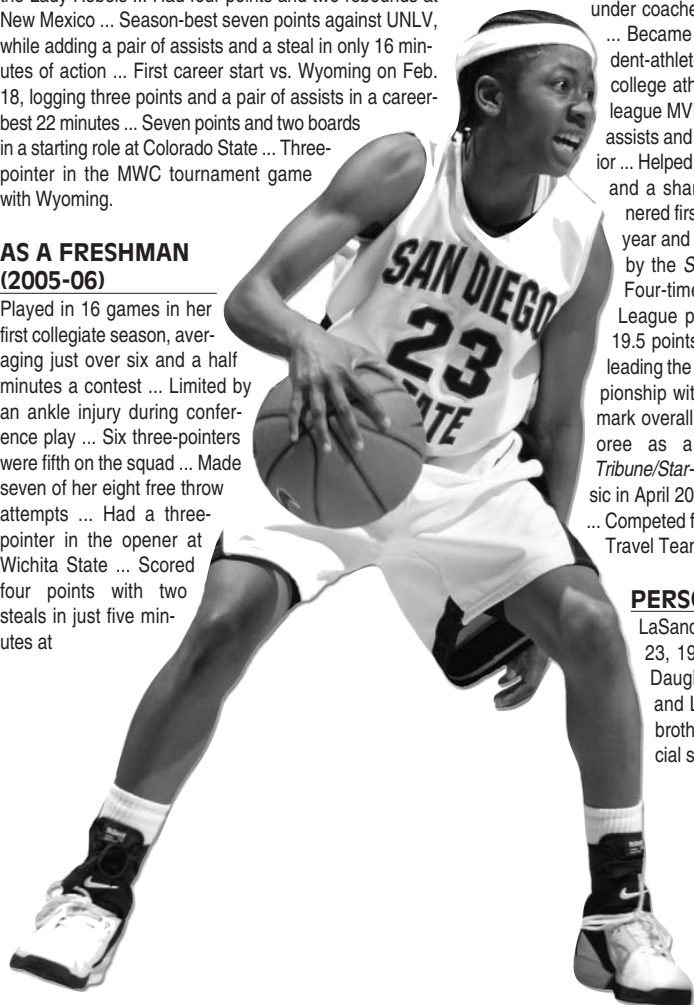

QUICKLY

A veteran point guard, who has started 39 career games ... A consistent on-court performer, who makes up for her lack of height with her quickness and speed ... Strong defensive player, tallying 67 career steals ... Is left-handed ... Standout in the classroom, who has earned all-academic honors from the MWC and as an SDSU scholar-athlete.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006-07)

Made 25 starts, playing in 26 games overall ... Third on the team in steals with a career-best 36 ... Chipped in 20 assists and 16 offensive rebounds ... Made her first 3-pointers of her career, hitting five of her 16 attempts ... Missed the first two games of the season recovering from ACL reconstruction surgery on her right knee ... Appeared in her first game since Feb. 2005, at USD, logging 10 minutes off the bench and scoring two points ... Eight points and three rebounds in her first start at Utah Valley State ... Had four steals in the win at Southern Utah ... Matched her career-high with six steals and had eight points against Wichita State ... First career block at Utah ... Matched her career best with nine points in the upset of Utah, tallying her first career three, while also chipping in a pair of steals ... Four steals at Air Force ... Nine points and a career-best two three-pointers against TCU ... Starter in her first career MWC tournament game, ending up with a career-high six rebounds to go with five points in 22 minutes.

AS A FRESHMAN (2005-06)

Played in 17 of the team's 27 contests, making 14 starts, including in each of the season's first 10 games ... Averaged 4.1 points and 2.0 rebounds per contest ... SDSU leader in assists per game (3.4) and second in overall assists (58) ... Third in steals with 31 ... A starter at the point in the team's first game at Wichita State ... Contributed a team-best five assists and five steals before fouling out ... Team-best five assists at UC Riverside ... Six points all in the first half at UC Davis to go with a four assists ... Four steals, six points and 11 assists in only 28 minutes versus Portland State ... Eleven assists were the most by an Aztec since November 2000 and tied as the second-most by a player in the MWC in 2005-06 ... Seven points and a season-high four boards against Boise State ... On why she chose to come to SDSU:

"I went to high school here and everyone knows me from being at San Diego (High School) ... I wanted to help the program and I knew the coaches and most of the team, because of my sister. I have a good vibe with them and wanted to stay (in San Diego)."
