THE GAME

- Weber State kicks off the 2019 season when Wildcats head to San Diego to take on the San Diego State Aztecs at SDCCU Stadium.
- Saturday's game will kickoff at 6:06 p.m. Pacific time. The game will be streamed on Facebook by the Stadium Network and will be shared on Weber State's Football Facebook page. Ari Wolfe, Darius Walker and Kristen Balboni will be on the call.
- Radio broadcast will be on 1430 KLO radio and kloradio.com with Steve Klauke and former Wildcat head coach and athletic director Jerry Graybeal on the call.
- Live stats will be at WeberStateSports.com.

OPENING DRIVE

- Weber State begins its 58th season of Division I football with Saturday's game.
- The Wildcats are coming off their two best seasons in school history. Weber State has won back-to-back Big Sky Conference titles for the first time in school history, and has advanced to the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs in each of the past two seasons.
- WSU finished 10-3 in 2018 and was ranked as high as third in the nation, before finishing sixth in the country in the final polls.
- Weber State is ranked eighth in the nation in the STATS FCS preseason poll, tied for the highest preseason ranking in school history. The Wildcats were picked third in the Big Sky Conference preseason polls.
- Head coach Jay Hill returns for his sixth season as head coach of the Wildcats. Hill has a career record of 36-26 at Weber State. The Wildcats are 21-6 in the last two seasons.
- The Wildcats have three players returning from last season that earned All-America honors last year and 10 players returning that earned Big Sky All-Conference honors.
- This will be the third ever meeting between the two teams but the first in 52 years. The two teams played in 1966 and 1967, with the Aztecs winning both games.
- This season Weber State is celebrating the 100th anniversary of football at Weber State and the 150th anniversary of college football.

WEBER STATE FOOTBALL HISTORY

Weber State began playing Division I football in 1962 and one year later, became a charter member of the Big Sky Conference. WSU has captured three Big Sky titles and advanced to the FCS Playoffs five times in school history, including last year. Weber State's list of legendary head coaches includes Sark Arslanian, Mike Price, Dave Arslanian and Ron McBride.

The 'Cats have had 51 players earn All-American honors and have had 37 players drafted in the NFL. Former WSU quarterback Jamie Martin won the 1991 Walter Payton Trophy and then had a long career in the NFL. Several other Wildcats have also played in the NFL, including Paul McQuistan who won a Super Bowl ring in 2015 with the Seattle Seahawks.

Steve Klauke, the 2016 Utah Sportscaster of the Year, is in his third season as voice of the Wildcats and will call all football and men's basketball game for the Wildcats. Klauke is a three-time Utah Sportscaster of the Year and is also the voice of the Salt Lake Bees,

which he has done for the last 22 years.

Klauke will be joined on football broadcasts again this season by former WSU head coach and athletic director **Jerry Graybeal**. Graybeal was the head coach at Weber State from 1998-04 and served as athletic director from 2005-09.

WEBER STATE COMING OFF BACK-TO-BACK BIG SKY TITLES

Weber State is coming off two historic seasons, including back-to-back Big Sky Conference titles, and two appearances in the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. It's the first time in school history WSU won back-to-back Big Sky titles and the 'Cats have posted a 21-6 record in the last two years.

In 2018, Weber State was ranked as high as third in the nation, the highest ranking in school history, and earned the No. 2 spot in the FCS Playoffs. The Wildcats finished the year ranked sixth in the country. Weber State had seven players earn All-America honors in 2018 and had a school-record 13 players earn first-team All-Big Sky honors.

TIED FOR HIGHEST PRESEASON RANKING IN SCHOOL HISTORY

The Wildcats are ranked eighth in the nation in the STATS FCS preseason poll, which is tied with 2018 for the highest preseason ranking in school history. The Wildcats are ranked ninth in the nation in the AFCA FCS Coaches poll.

WEBER STATE PICKED THIRD IN BIG SKY PRESEASON POLLS

Weber State was selected to finish third in the Big Sky Conference preseason coaches and media polls. Eastern Washington was picked first in both polls, with UC Davis second, followed by Weber State.

THREE RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS

Weber State had seven players earn All-America honors last season, with three returning this year. Running back Josh Davis, defensive end Adam Rodriguez and wide receiver and kick returner Rashid Shaheed return as All-Americans this season.

SAN DIEGO NATIVE RASHID SHAHEED RETURNS HOME FOR BIRTHDAY



Rashid Shaheed returns to his native San Diego this week. Shaheed is a two-time All-American for the Wildcats and has been one of the top kick returners in the country the last two seasons. He finished second in the nation in kickoff returns last season with an average of 34.3 yards per return. He finished with 19 returns for 651 yards and two touchdowns. In his two seasons at Weber State, Shaheed is WSU's career leader with four kick-off returns for touchdowns and is also the all-time leader at 31.7 yards per return.

Saturday, Aug. 31, the day the Wildcats open the season in San Diego is also Shaheed's 21st birthday. Shaheed attended Mt. Carmel High School in San Diego.

Weber State has 18 players from the state of California

JOSH DAVIS WON JERRY RICE AWARD, NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

In 2018, Josh Davis earned All-America honors and was honored with the Jerry Rice Award as the National Freshman of the Year.

Davis, a native of Sandy, Utah, was also named the Big Sky Freshman of the Year and set a Wildcat freshman record with 1,362 rushing yards, which also ranks as the sixth most yards in a season in school history. He had 250 carries and nine rushing touchdowns and finished the season ranked 12th in the country in rushing at 113.5 yards per game and totaled 1,779 all-purpose yards, the most ever by a Wildcat freshman and the seventh most in a season in school history.



NINE RETURNING ALL-CONFERENCE PERFORMERS

In addition to Davis, Rodriguez and Shaheed, Weber State returns six other players that earned All-Big Sky Conference honors last season. Senior defensive end Jonah Williams returns as a first-team All-Conference performer. Also returned are senior punter Doug Lloyd, junior kicker Trey Tuttle, senior linebacker Auston Tesch and junior center Ben Bos.

The Wildcats had 19 players earned all-conference honors in 2018, including a school record 13 players that earned first-team honors.

COACHING STAFF

Jay Hill returns for his sixth season at the helm of the Wildcats. He has a career record of 36-26 (.581), which is the second-highest winning percentage in Weber State history. He also has a record of 27-13 (.675) in Big Sky Conference games, the best percentage in school history. Over the last three seasons, Weber State is 20-3 in Big Sky games, and is 25-7 in conference games over the last four seasons. Hill will also serve as defensive coordinator for the Wildcats for the third-straight season.

Dave Schramm returns for his second season as offensive coordinator. Schramm has coached for 26 years and has also been offensive coordinator at Utah and Fresno State.

Associate head coach Brent Myers returns for his sixth season at Weber State coaching the offensive line. Also returning are assistant coaches Kite Afeaki (defensive line), Joe Dale (safeties), Grant Duff (outside linebackers) and Quinton Ganther (running backs)

New as coaches this season are Matt Hammer (inside linebackers), Shaun Harper (cornerbacks), Sklyer Ridley (tight ends) and Jared Ursua (wide receivers).

Two-time Wildcat All-American Brady May is a graduate assistant on offense with Gabe Long a volunteer assistant on defense. Derrick Luken returns as the Director of Football Operations.

DEFENSIVE DOMINATION

Over the last two seasons, Weber State has been one of the top defensive units in the Big Sky and in the nation. WSU has led the conference in total defense, scoring defense and rushing defense in each of the last two seasons and has ranked in the top in all of FCS both seasons. WSU lost six starters off the defensive unit from last season.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Six players have been selected as team captains, as voted by their teammates. Junior quarterback Jake Constantine, senior defensive end Adam Rodriguez, junior wide receiver/returner Rashid Shaheed, senior linebacker Auston Tesch, junior kicker Trey Tuttle and senior defensive lineman Jonah Williams will serve as the team captains for the Wildcats throughout the season.

ABOUT SAN DIEGO STATE

The San Diego State Aztecs finished 7-6 last season and was ?? in the Mountain West Conference at 4-4. The Aztecs advanced to their ninth-straight bowl game, before losing to Ohio in the Frisco Bowl.

This year SDSU was picked to finish second in the west division of the Mountain West and the Aztecs have four players that were named to the preseason all-conference team. San Diego State finished seventh in the nation in rushing yards allowed in 2018 at 103.8 yards per game. The Aztecs were also 21st in the country in total defense.

The Aztecs are coached by Rocky Long who is in his ninth season as head coach at SDSU. He has a career record of 71-34 and is 136-104 in 20 seasons as a head coach.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the third all-time meeting between the two schools but the first in 52 years. The two teams met in 1966 in Ogden and in 1967 in San Diego State, with the Aztecs winning both games.

Since the Mountain West Conference began in 1999, Weber State is 0-9 against MWC schools, with games against Colorado State, Fresno State, New Mexico, Utah, Utah State and Wyoming. Weber State's last Mountain West opponent was Utah State in 2016, a 45-6 USU win in Logan.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

12 of the 13 Big Sky schools are in action this weekend to kickoff the 2019 season. Eight of the schools are playing FBS opponents. The Big Sky boasts five schools ranked in the top 25 in the nation in the preseason polls, including three teams, Eastern Washington, UC Davis and Weber State, ranked in the top 10.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF FOOTBALL AT WEBER STATE

This year marks the 100th anniversary of football at Weber State University. The first football team was fielded in 1919, when the school was known as Weber Normal College. Weber's first game was played on Oct. 8, 1919, a 20-0 loss to Box Elder High School in Brigham City. The first win came on Oct. 31, 1991, a 6-0 win over Davis High School in Ogden.

Over the last 100 years, thousands of players have played football for the Wildcats. Weber State became a junior college in 1933, then became a four-year school in 1962. In 1963, the Wildcats became a charter member of the Big Sky Conference, joining Idaho, Idaho State, Montana, and Montana State as football playing schools.

The Wildcats have captured six Big Sky Conference titles, including winning back-to-back titles in 2017 and 2018. Weber State has had 38 players drafted in the NFL Draft and 62 players have earned All-America honors. Many coaches have come through Weber State before going on to careers in the NFL. Wildcat quarterback Jamie Martin won the Walter Payton Award in 1991 as the nation's top player and WSU running back Josh Davis won the Jerry Rice Award as the National Freshman of the Year in 2018.

This year is also the 150th anniversary of college football which will be celebrated all season by schools across the country.

QUICK HITS

Weber State is 28-29 all-time in season openers...The Wildcats are just 2-23 all-time when the season opener is on the road, with the last win coming in 1990 at Southern Utah...Weber State's last win over an FBS team came in 1993 at Nevada...WSU offensive coordinator Dave Schramm is a San Diego native and spent 12 seasons coaching at San Diego State from 1990-2001....WSU has just six seniors listed on the depth chart for week one...In the five seasons under head coach Jay Hill, Weber State is 30-4 when leading entering the fourth quarter.

LOOKING AHEAD

After Saturday's game, Weber State returns home for the first of six regular season home games as the Wildcats host Cal Poly on Sept. 7 in a non-conference game at Stewart Stadium.

The following week, WSU returns to the road for another Mountain West Conference opponent, playing at Nevada on Sept. 14.

Jay Hill is in his sixth season as the head coach at Weber State. In addition to his duties as head coach, Hill is Hill's third season also serving as the defensive coordinator for the Wildcats.

In his five years with the Wildcats, Hill has transformed the Weber State program and has led Weber State to three-straight FCS Playoff appearances, back-to-back Big Sky titles and back-to-back 10-win seasons, and the team has been ranked as high as third in the nation, all WSU school records.

In his five seasons he has a career record of 36-26 (.581), which is the second-highest winning percentage in Weber State history. He also has a record of 27-13 (.675) in Big Sky Conference games, the best percentage in school history. Over the last four seasons, Weber State is 25-7 in Big Sky games. Hill has also coached 12 players to All-America honors at Weber State. The Wildcats have also earned 70 Big Sky All-Conference honors and 45 Wildcats Academic All-Big Sky honors under Hill's leadership.

In 2018, Weber State had another record-setting seasons as the Wildcats finished 10-3 in conference play, winning 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever. Weber State also repeated as Big Sky champions with a 7-1 conference record for the first time ever. The Wildcats earned their first ever seed in the FCS Playoffs as they earned the No. 2 seed and advanced to the quarterfinals for the second-straight season. Weber State was ranked as high as third in the nation, the highest ranking ever, and finished the year ranked sixth in the country. The Wildcats also had 19 players that earned All-Big Sky honors, including a school-record 13 players named to the first time.

In 2017, Hill was named the Utah Coach of the Year as part of the Governor's State of Sport Awards after he guided Weber State to its best season in school history. The Wildcats won the Big Sky Conference title, won a school-record 11 games, won two games in the FCS Playoffs and were ranked in the top five in the nation

Hill, 44, was named the 11th head coach in Weber State football history in December 2013. Hill was a long-time assistant coach at the University of Utah, and came to WSU with a reputation as one of the top recruiters in the West. He spent 13 years (2001-13) at Utah, including the last nine seasons as a full-time assistant coach under Kyle Whittingham. Prior to that, he spent four years as a graduate assistant and administrative assistant with the Utes under legendary coaches Ron McBride and Urban Meyer.

The Lehi, Utah native played college football at Ricks Junior College, where he earned junior college All-American honors at cornerback. He went on to play two seasons (1998-99) at Utah under Ron McBride. Hill earned a bachelor's degree in Spanish in 2000 from Utah and earned his master's degree in ESS/Sports Psychology in 2005.

He and his wife Sara have four children: Ashtyn, Alayna, Jacob and Allie.

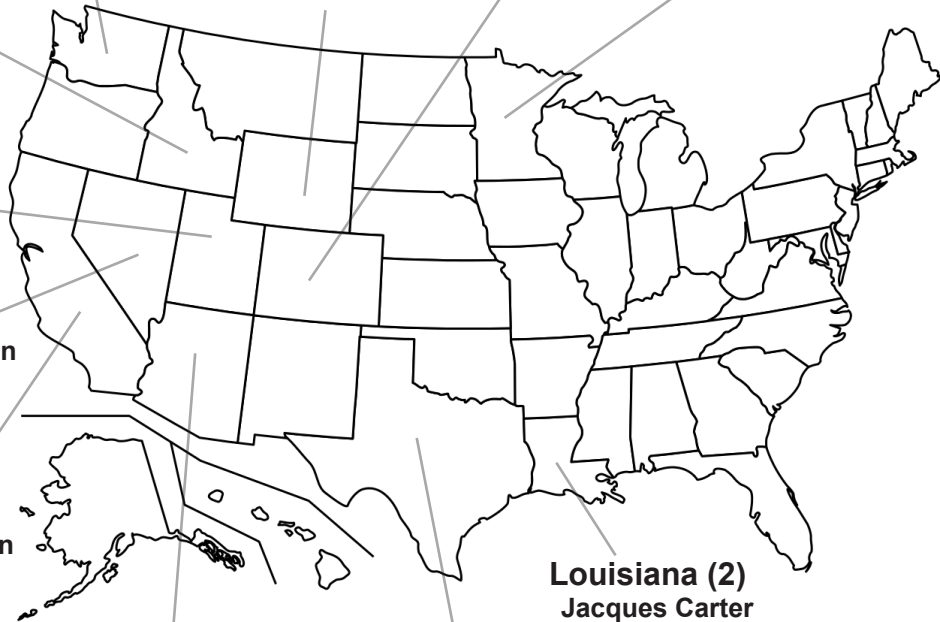
