THE SET-UP

San Diego State opens a three-game homestand, its first in 10 years, on Saturday when it plays host to Army in the Geico Fleet Week Classic at 4:30 p.m. PT. The game will be nationally televised by NBC Sports Network, with radio coverage provided by KOGO 95.7 FM & AM 600.

The Aztecs are looking to bounce back following a 21-12 loss at Washington last Saturday. San Diego State trailed, 14-0, less than 10 minutes into the game, but held an edge in the play throughout the rest of the contest. After yielding touchdowns on the first two drives of the game, the defense held the high-powered Husky offense without a point on their final seven offensive possessions. Meanwhile, the Aztec offense got in gear, with three drives of 71 yards or more in the contest. The teams had nearly the same total offense (UW 328, SDSU 327) and time of possession (UW 31:03, SDSU 28:57), but San Diego State was unable to overcome three turnovers, including a 44-yard fumble return for touchdown early in the third quarter.

The Aztecs and Black Knights are meeting for the second time in school history on the back end of a home-and-home series. Last season, San Diego State traveled to historic Michie Stadium and departed with a 23-20 victory. Colin Lockett caught five passes for 113 yards and a touchdown and the Aztec defense forced eight fumbles, recovering three.

San Diego State will be looking to continue a recent trend of success against service academy teams. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, the Aztecs are 4-0 against the academies (2-0 vs. Air Force, 1-0 vs. Army and 1-0 vs. Navy).

STORYLINES

- While a senior in high school, San Diego State head coach Rocky Long was recruited to play basketball at Army. In fact, the Black Knights head coach at the time, Bob Knight, paid a visit to his home trying to entice the two-sport star to attend the Academy. Long ended up choosing football and attended New Mexico where he left as as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games.
- In its last 22 games, SDSU has posted a 4-0 record against service academies, with a pair of victories over Air Force (2010 and 2011), a victory over Navy (2011 Poinsettia Bowl) and last season's win at Army (23-20 on Sept. 10, 2011).
- San Diego State is 32-10-1 in home opening games during the Division I era. The Aztecs are 62-23-4 in home openers all time. The Aztecs have won three straight home openers dating back to a 29-27 loss to Cal Poly on Aug. 30, 2008.
- San Diego State carries a six-game September home winning streak into Saturday's contest against Army. That dates back to a 52-23 loss to 24th-ranked Cincinnati on Sept. 29, 2007.
- San Diego State had 52 student-athletes play in the season-opening game at Washington on Saturday night. Demonstrating how young the team is, only 10 seniors saw playing time in the contest and two of those (quarterback Ryan Katz and wide receiver Brice Butler) were playing in their first game with the Aztecs. SDSU started only six seniors against the Huskies.
- San Diego State has only five seniors listed as starters on the current depth chart, three on offense (RG **Nike Embernate**, C **Alec Johnson**, QB **Ryan Katz**) and two on defense (CB **Leon McFadden** and CB **Josh Wade**).
- Last week, the Aztecs had 17 players make their first appearance in an Aztec game and had eight players on the offensive or defensive side of the ball make their first start at SDSU.
- San Diego State opens the 2012 campaign after advancing to bowl games each of the last two seasons (Poinsettia Bowl in 2010 and New Orleans Bowl in 2011). SDSU has never gone to bowl games in three consecutive seasons.
- The Aztecs play seven home games in 2012, which ties for the program's highest number since 1976. SDSU plays its next three contests at home (Army, North Dakota and San Jose State).
- Dating back to last season, San Diego State is playing its fourth consecutive game in a stadium that houses an NFL team. The Aztecs ended last season playing Fresno State at Qualcomm Stadium and faced Louisiana-Lafayette in the Superdome in the New Orleans Bowl. Last week, the Aztecs opened in Seattle's CenturyLink Field. San Diego State plays its next three games at Qualcomm Stadium, making it six straight at NFL venues. A Sept. 29 trip to Fresno State will snap the NFL venue streak at six.
- Despite serving as an assistant coach at SDSU for two seasons (2009-10), **Rocky Long** opens the 2012 campaign as the second winningest coach in Mountain West history. Long has 70 wins while a member of the league, trailing only TCU's Gary Patterson (77 wins). With TCU no longer in the league, Long needs seven victories to tie the record and eight to break it. The other nine active coaches in the league entered the season with a combined 75 wins while their teams have been a member of the conference.
- Entering Monday's games, San Diego State has compiled the nation's second highest winning percentage in combined football and men's basketball since the beginning of the 2010-11 academic year. The Aztecs are a combined 77-21 (78.6 percent) and trail only Ohio State in the two sports since the beginning of the 2010 football season. *See chart below*

- Adding the success of the women's basketball program at SDSU, which has advanced to NCAA Tournament play in two of the last three seasons, further demonstrates the department's overall success. Combining football, men's basketball and women's basketball records since the beginning of last season, San Diego State owns the seventh-best winning percentage in the country, trailing only Baylor, Stanford, Kentucky, Brigham Young, Notre Dame and Ohio State. *See chart above*
- The Aztecs have posted a 17-10 record since the beginning of the 2010 season after needing 57 games to claim 17 victories prior to the 2010 (SDSU went 17-40 during that stretch from the fifth game of the 2005 season through the end of 2009 campaign). The 17-10 record during that span is tied for the 32nd-best record in the country over that two-plus season span.

OFFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense from last season's 2011 team that scored 387 points, the second-highest total for an Aztec squad in the last 15 seasons.
- SDSU has four offensive players appearing on preseason watch lists for the top player at their position in the country - junior tight end **Gavin Escobar** (John Mackey Award Watch List (TE), Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (lineman)), senior center **Alec Johnson** (Rimington Trophy Watch List (center)), senior running back **Walter Kazez** (Doak Walker Award Watch List (RB)) and sophomore wide receiver **Colin Lockett** (Biletnikoff Award Watch List (WR)).
- San Diego State's offense got better as the game progressed against Washington. For the game, the Aztecs tallied 327 yards of total offense and put together three drives of 70 or more yards. In the second half, SDSU ran 36 offensive snaps for 206 yards for a 5.72 average.
- San Diego State has had just four student-athletes start at quarterback since Nov. 18, 2006. During that 66-game stretch, Kevin O'Connell (15 games during the 2006-07 seasons), Drew Westling (1 game; vs. Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008) and Ryan Lindley (49 games during the 2008-09-10-11 seasons). Last week, senior Oregon State-transfer **Ryan Katz** become the fourth SDSU player to start over the 66-game stretch.
- Although **Katz** made his first appearance as an Aztec at Washington, he comes to The Mesa with a wealth of experience. A native of Santa Monica, Calif., Katz started 14 consecutive games for the Beavers, including all 12 games of the 2010 campaign. Among his highlights, was a 17-for-24, two-touchdown performance in an upset victory over USC during his sophomore campaign.
- Last season, due to graduation and injury, San Diego State's combined receiving core ended the campaign with four career catches for 39 yards. That has changed significantly in 12 months, as SDSU enters the 2012 campaign with a Biletnikoff Award candidate and preseason all-Mountain West Conference selection in junior **Colin Lockett** (58 catches, 970 yards, 8 TDs in 2011), a former walk-on who had five or more catches six times last season, including three times in his final four games, in junior **Dylan Denso** (49 catches, 634 yards and 3 TDs in 2011) and highly-decorated USC transfer senior **Brice Butler** (41 catches, 554 yards and 3 TDs at USC). Making his long-awaited collegiate debut last week was Ezell Ruffin, who had a nine-yard rush out of the receiver position.
- Although San Diego State looks to replace third-round NFL Draft selection Ronnie Hillman, the Aztecs have quality depth at the position. Sophomore **Adam Muema** rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns against 10th-ranked Boise State in a game last season. In 2011, he rushed for 253 yards on 42 carries for a 6.0 yards per carry average in just six games. In his first 42 career carries before this season, he amassed more yards rushing than Hillman did in the same amount of carries. Also in the backfield, is senior **Walter Kazez**. A career 1,000-yard rusher, Kazez's season was cut short in 2011 when he suffered a knee injury at Colorado State. Kazez's 86 rushing yards last week, on only nine carries, was his highest output since the final game of his 2009 freshman campaign.
- The offensive line is anchored by two returning starters - senior center **Alec Johnson** and senior right guard **Nik Embernate**. Joining the two seniors on the offensive line is converted tight end, now left guard junior Bryce Quigley, junior left guard **Japeth Gordon** and sophomore right tackle **Zach Dilley**. The only new member of the coaching staff, former SDSU offensive lineman **Mike Schmidt**, leads the unit.
- San Diego State has gone 65 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 160 games.

DEFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- SDSU returns six starters off a squad that has continually gotten better under the direction of second-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fourth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than five years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction.

- The Aztecs are led on defense by Mountain West preseason defensive player of the year, senior cornerback **Leon McFadden**. McFadden is on the preseason watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) and the Jim Thorpe Award (DB). McFadden, who has been a first-team all-Mountain West selection the past two seasons, is looking to become the school's fourth three-time first-team all league selection, joining Marshall Faulk, Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila and Kirk Morrison.
- Plenty of other defensive players received preseason attention from at least one publication. Junior Aztec back **Nat Berhe** and sophomore linebacker **Jake Fely** were among the players getting attention. Berhe

is the top returning tackler of the 2011 squad, and has 106 stops and three interceptions in his two seasons. He posted a career-high 10 tackles in the R+L New Orleans Bowl last season. In his first full season on the field, Fely had 55 tackles, 5.5 sacks and forced three fumbles.

- SDSU has forced a turnover in 14 of its last 15 games, including three or more five times in the last 13 games.
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 230 yards rushing in its last three games combined. The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in three of the last seven games.
- Last week at Washington, the Aztec edefсне allowed just 14 points (the Huskies had a fumble return for touchdown) and 328 yards of total offense against one of the most potent offensive attacks in the country. In 2011, Washington averaged 33.38 points to rank 25th nationally and 409.85 yards (38th in the nation).
- The Huskies scored 21 points off three drives that accumulated a total of 97 yards of offense.
- The Aztecs held Washington without a point on its final seven possessions of the game. That is something that no team did against the Huskies in 2011.

SDSU VS. ARMY

- Saturday marks the second meeting between San Diego State and Army in football. This is the back end of a home-and-home series, with the Aztecs claiming a 23-20 win on Sept. 10, 2011.
- Last season's game marked the first time the Aztec football program played a game in the state of New York. It was just the 10th time in the school's Division I era that the Aztecs have played a game in Eastern time zone. That total is now 11 after playing at Michigan on Sept. 24, 2011.
- Saturday will mark the 28th time in San Diego State's Division I era that the Aztecs have encountered a team without a conference affiliation. SDSU owns a 21-6 record in those games and has won five of its last six encounters with the indies, including a 35-14 victory over Navy in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl and last season's win over the Black Knights.

SDSU VS. ARMY: CONNECTIONS

- While a senior in high school, San Diego State head coach Rocky Long was recruited to play basketball at Army. In fact, the Black Knights head coach at the time, Bob Knight, paid a visit to his home trying to entice the two-sport star to attend the Academy. Long ended up choosing football and attended New Mexico where he left as the school as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games.
- San Diego State head coach Rocky Long has made three appearance at Michie Stadium. In his first game as a collegiate player, Long's New Mexico squad was defeated by Army, 31-14, on Sept. 20, 1969. He also saw a game as a fan before leading the Aztecs into Michie Stadium for a 23-20 victory last season. In addition, Long, an avid supporter of the military academies, has viewed the Army-Navy game in person.
- Army head coach Rich Ellerson was the head coach at Cal Poly when the Mustangs defeated SDSU in both 2006 and 2008. He is 2-1 against the Aztecs, with the lone setback coming last season.
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long (1986-87 – linebackers) and Army head coach Rich Ellerson (1984-85 – defensive line) were both assistant coaches with the British Columbia Lions of the CFL.
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long was the defensive coordinator and assistant Osia Lewis was the linebackers/special teams coach at Oregon State when Army assistant coach Ian Shields played quarterback for the Beavers and was also a graduate assistant coach.
- SDSU offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig held the same position at Cal Poly when Army assistant coaches Payam Saadat (linebackers) and Bill Tripp (offensive line) were also on the Mustangs' coaching staff in 1997.
- SDSU assistant coach LeCharls McDaniel (secondary/special teams) and Army's Bill Tripp (offensive line) were both on the same coaching staff at Cal Poly in 1992.
- SDSU assistant coach LeCharls McDaniel (1977-80) and Army assistant coaches Andy Guyader (1992-96) and Chris Smeland (1970-74) all played their collegiate football for Cal Poly.

LAST MEETING: SAN DIEGO STATE 23, ARMY 20

■ Sept. 10, 2011 | Michie Stadium | West Point, N.Y.

WEST POINT, N.Y. – On a weekend when emotions ran high as the nation commemorated the Sept. 11 tragedy, San Diego State survived its' first-ever trip to the state of New York by edging a determined Army squad, 23-20, in front of 26,778 fans at Michie Stadium. With the victory, the Aztecs started a campaign at 2-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1976-77.

The game got off to a very good start for the visitors, as quarterback Ryan Lindley found wideout Colin Lockett on the second offensive play for a 68-yard touchdown strike only 33 seconds into the contest.

Army, meanwhile, fumbled on each of its first two possessions with the Aztecs taking advantage of the second one with a 16-yard scoring run from running back Ronnie Hillman to jump ahead 14-0.

The Black Knights cut their deficit in half on the first of three rushing touchdowns on the day by quarterback Trent Steelman and headed into the break tied, as the SDSU offense went scoreless in the second quarter.

The Aztecs finally got back on the board on their final drive of the third quarter, as Hillman caught a 24-yard pass and rushed four times for 45 yards, including a 20-yard scoring effort, to put them ahead, 20-14.

The advantage would have been seven, however, SDSU place-kicker Abelardo Perez missed the extra point. Army had a chance to take the lead for the first time to start the fourth quarter, but it returned the favor by also missing an extra point following a TD, as the game was once again knotted.

Starting from their own 20-yard line, the Aztecs drove 55 yards to set up what would turn out to be a game-winning 42-yard Perez field goal.

Army tried to answer with an incredible 17-play drive that ate up nearly eight and a half minutes on the clock and got it all the way down to the SDSU 25-yard line. Over the next four plays, however, the Black Knights moved backwards after they were flagged for a 5-yard penalty, gave up a 6-yard sack and threw two incomplete passes, including one on fourth down, giving the ball back and securing the Aztecs' 23-20 victory.

Overall, Army held a huge advantage in total offense (446-292) and time of possession (42:11-17:49), but had three drives ended by fumbles and two more turned over on downs. On the flip side, SDSU did not commit a turnover for the third outing in a row (longest streak in the program's division I history) and was called for only three penalties for 10 total yards.

Hillman logged his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 117 yards, while Lockett posted his first 100-yard receiving outing with five catches for 113 yards. Defensively, SDSU was led by Jerome Long, who had a career-high 10 tackles and a sack, and junior linebacker Rob Andrews, who posted a career-best nine stops and a forced fumble.

THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF'S TROPHY

- San Diego State might be able to make a claim on the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, presented annually to the top football military academy. The Aztecs have won four straight meetings with service academies, with all four of those wins coming since Oct. 16, 2010 (during the last 22 games).
- The current streak started with a 27-25 victory over 23rd-ranked Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010 at Qualcomm Stadium. Ronnie Hillman rushed for 191 yards on 24 carries and Ryan Lindley threw for 247 yards in the victory.

- Win No. 2 in the streak came in a 35-14 victory over Navy in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl. Hillman rushed for 228 yards and scored four touchdowns and Lindley was flawless, going 18-for-23 for 276 yards and two touchdowns.
- The streak reached three with last season's 23-20 win at Army on Sept. 10, 2011.
- The Aztecs pushed the streak to four with a 41-27 win at Air Force on Oct. 13, 2011. SDSU forced three turnovers and had nine tackles for loss, while Hillman and Lindley once again came through big. Hillman rushed for 172 yards and two touchdowns and Lindley was 15-of-21 for 209 yards and two scores.
- One reason for the recent success has been San Diego State's ability to keep the ground game in check for the service academies. In two of the four games during the win streak, the Aztecs have held their opponent well below their rushing average for the season. In all four of the wins, SDSU has held its opponent below their scoring average for the season.

Adding the season numbers up for the four teams above, the Aztecs should have allowed 120 points and 1,252 rushing yards. Instead, SDSU has allowed 86 points (71.6 percent of the expected total) and 1,145 rushing yards.

AZTECS IN HOME OPENERS

- San Diego State is an amazing 62-23-4 in home openers and owns a 72.9 winning percentage. In the Division I era, the Aztecs are 32-10-1 (76.2 percent) in their first home game of the season.
- SDSU will try and win its home opener in three consecutive seasons for the first time since winning five straight openers, 1993-97.
- San Diego State won its home debut in 17 consecutive seasons from 1963 through 1979. That covers the final 10 seasons of the Don Coryell era and the first seven campaigns of Claude Gilbert's tenure.

AZTEC OFFENSE

- **SCORING:** Through the first week, San Diego State ranks T-78th in total offense (327.00) and T-97th in scoring offense (12.00)... The Aztecs scored 12 points in Saturday's opener at Washington, snapping a streak of four consecutive games with 30 or more points... SDSU did increase its productivity as the game progressed with 206 yards of total offense coming after intermission... San Diego State has 400 or more yards of total offense in six of its last nine games dating back to last season... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 27 of their last 35 games... SDSU had three turnovers against the Huskies after committing just one turnover in their final three games of last season combined... It was just the second time in the last nine games that San Diego State had more than one turnover in a contest... In the game against Washington, the Aztecs put together three drives of 70 or more yards... SDSU is 7-for-8 in converting third or fourth down situations of five yards or less this season.
- **OFFENSIVE RUSHING:** The Aztecs rank T-41st nationally in rushing offense (199.00) and 19th in rushing yards per carry (5.12)... San Diego State rushed for 199 yards in Saturday's game against Washington marking the third time in the last four games that it has rushed for at least 199 yards... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 27 games), SDSU has 58 rushing touchdowns... The Aztecs have at least one rushing touchdown in nine consecutive games (dating back to Oct. 8, 2011 contest against TCU)... San Diego State running backs carried 20 times in the contest against Washington and did not have a carry that resulted in negative yardage.
- **OFFENSIVE PASSING:** The Aztecs rank 99th nationally in passing offense (128.00) and 78th in pass efficiency (116.03)... The 128 yards passing against Washington were the fewest in a game for the Aztecs since Oct. 4, 2010 (98 at TCU)... Despite that, the passing efficiency rating was higher than five games in 2011... - **OVERALL:** San Diego State ranks T-54th nationally in scoring defense (21.00) and 48th in total defense (328.00)... The Aztec defense got stronger as the game progressed last week at Washington... After allowing two touchdowns on the first two Husky possessions, SDSU did not allow a point on the final seven UW drives... In no game last season did Washington go seven consecutive possessions without a point... Of Washington's 328 yards of total offense, 97 came on its first two possessions... The Huskies' 21 points (including a fumble return for a touchdown) came on a total of 97 yards of offense.
- **RUSH DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 42nd nationally in rushing yards per game (106.00)... The Aztecs held Washington to 3.4 yards per rush... In the last three games, SDSU has allowed opponents an average rush of 1.71, 2.53 and 3.42... San Diego State had 10 tackles for loss in the contest from eight different players.
- **PASS DEFENSE:** The Aztecs are T-61st nationally in pass defense (222.00) and 67th in pass efficiency defense (134.11)... SDSU had three sacks and three PBU in the season-opening game against Washington.

MAKING THE ADJUSTMENTS

- The San Diego State coaching staff has earned its pay with halftime adjustments. Since the beginning of the 2011 campaign, the Aztec defense has decreased scoring and total yards from the first half to the second half in 12 of the 14 games. In fact, in the last 14 second halves, SDSU has allowed just 98 points and a mere 2,056 yards of offense in those 14 halves of football. That is a second-half average of 7.0 points, 146.9 yards and 1.4 turnovers.

LONG HAS BEST DEBUT SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Rocky Long, the school's 18th head coach, became the first San Diego State coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural season.
- Rocky Long posted an 8-5 record in his first season as head coach with the Aztecs. That is the highest victory total in a SDSU head coaching debut season since Denny Stolz finished 8-4 in his first year in 1986.
- With eight first-year wins, Rocky Long had one more coaching victory in his inaugural season as the previous two San Diego State coaches combined (Brady Hoke went 4-8 in 2009 and Chuck Long was 3-9 in 2006).
- Last season marked the third time in Rocky Long's head coaching career that his team has won at least eight games (also 2007 and 2003). His squads have won six or more games in eight of his last nine seasons as a head coach.
- Last year, Long helped guide the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, ended the program's 19-game losing streak to Pac-10/12 foes, snapped SDSU's 23-game losing streak to automatic qualifying BCS teams and gave the program its first win in the Eastern time zone since 1972, all in the opening month of the season.
- San Diego State finished the 2011 season above .500 for only the second time in the last 13 seasons.
- The Aztecs won eight games in a campaign for just the second time in the last 15 seasons.
- Long has 73 victories while coaching teams in the Mountain West. That is the second-highest total in the history of the conference.

LAST WEEK'S RECAP - WASHINGTON 21, SAN DIEGO STATE 12

SEATTLE -- San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback. It was the Aztecs' first season-opening loss since 2009.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

SDSU had multiple turnovers for only the second time in its last nine games, dating back to last year. San Diego State finished the 2011 season with just one turnover over its final three games.

FIVE AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has placed five student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Junior tight end Gavin Escobar, senior center Alec Johnson, senior running back Walter Kazee, junior Colin Lockett and senior Leon McFadden are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Escobar (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.) is one of 33 players on the John Mackey Award Watch List (most outstanding tight end) and one of 145 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman). Last season, the Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native reeled in 51 catches for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 51 receptions and 780 receiving yards were the second most by a tight end in school history. Escobar averaged 60.00 receiving yards per game, which were the third most in the country among tight ends. He ended up earning all-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season (first team in 2011, second team in 2010). Escobar is on the preseason all-conference team for this year.

Johnson (Denver, Colo.) is one of 51 players on the Rimington Trophy Award Watch List (best center). Johnson, one of SDSU's two returning starters on the offensive line, enters the 2012 campaign having made 29 career starts and is slated to start at center for the second consecutive year. Last season, Johnson never missed a game despite breaking his snapping hand (right) in the Aztecs' season opener. The MW academic all-conference honoree also helped SDSU rush for nearly 2,400 yards as well as finish among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (T-7th, 0.85 per game) and in fewest tackles for a loss allowed (15th, 4.46 per game).

Kazee (San Bernardino, Calif.) is one of 52 candidates on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back). Last year, Kazee rushed for 339 yards and four touchdowns on 74 carries (4.6 yards per rush) before a knee injury in the ninth game sidelined him for the rest of the season. Kazee also caught eight passes for 89 yards. For his career, Kazee has 1,042 rushing yards and nine touchdowns on 229 rushes (4.6 yards per carry). Additionally, Kazee has 191 yards receiving on 19 catches.

Lockett (Diamond Bar, Calif.) is one of 48 athletes on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding

wide receiver). Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards and his 74.6 receiving yards per game ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2010, including a 94-yard kickoff return touchdown in the season opener against Cal Poly. He's also on the 2012 preseason all-conference team.

McFadden (Inglewood, Calif.) is one of 84 players on the Bronco Nagurski Trophy Award Watch List (best defensive player) and one of 35 on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back). McFadden, who became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams) in July, is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years. Last year, McFadden led the league in passes defended (17), while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack.

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FIFTH BY LEAGUE MEDIA

■ The San Diego State football team is picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West preseason poll, which was released on July 24. The Aztecs had 173 points in the 2012 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The fifth-place projection is SDSU's second highest in the last eight years. Last season, San Diego State was selected fourth and finished fourth. It marked the sixth time in the last seven years that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 30 first-place votes, a first in its 14-year history of the MW.

Boise State was picked to win the league with 296 points, including 27 first-place votes. Only 74 points separated the second-place team (Nevada, 244 points) and the sixth-place team (Air Force, 170 points). Fresno State was third with 231 points and two first-place votes, while Wyoming (213 points) and SDSU (173 points) rounded out the top five at fourth and fifth, respectively.

MCFADDEN NAMED MW PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

■ San Diego State defensive back Leon McFadden has been selected as the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the league announced in July. McFadden was joined on the preseason all-conference team by tight end Gavin Escobar and wide receiver Colin Lockett.

McFadden became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams). McFadden, who is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years, is on the preseason watch list for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Thorpe Award (top defensive back). He's also the third player in the last 11 years (also Kirk Morrison and Lynell Hamilton) to be named to the preseason all-conference team for a second time. The Inglewood, Calif., native led the league in passes defended (17) last year, while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack.

Escobar, who is on the preseason watch list for the Lombardi Award (top lineman) and the Mackey Award (top tight end), had 51 catches a year ago for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 60.00 receiving yards per game in 2011 were the third most in the nation among tight ends. The Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native was an honorable mention All-American last year by Sports Illustrated after earning freshman All-America accolades by Sporting News in 2010.

A member of the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver), Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards. Lockett, who also had 58 catches and eight touchdowns, averaged 74.6 receiving yards per game, which ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2011, including a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the season-opener against Cal Poly.

■ San Diego State head coach Rocky Long announced that seniors Leon McFadden, Walter Kazez and Dominique Sandifer have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2012 season. This year, the special teams captain will be selected on a week-by-week basis.

McFadden, a senior defensive back from Inglewood, Calif., has played in 38 games in his three seasons as an Aztec. McFadden had a solid season last year recording 46 tackles in 13 contests, had two interceptions and averaged almost six yards per carry on punt returns. McFadden ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West for the second consecutive year and 12th nationally in passes defended with 17, including six more breakups than any other player in the league. He enters 2012 as the preseason Mountain West defensive player of the year.

Kazez, a senior running back from San Bernardino, Calif., has tallied 1,030 total yards in his 30-game career at SDSU. Kazez had one of his best seasons last year in becoming SDSU's second-leading rusher with 339 yards on 74 carries and four scores. He was also effective in the passing game as he tallied eight catches for 89 yards (11.1 ypc).

Sandifer, a senior wide receiver from Gardena, Calif., is a two-year letterwinner who had his 2011 season derailed by injury. Prior to his setback, he played in 23 straight games from 2009-2010 in 2010 and was part of the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl team. He is one of two senior wide receivers, but the only one to have worn a SDSU uniform. In his two seasons, he has tallied 561 yards, averaging 11.5 yards per reception.



ROCKY LONG

Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases

Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army

Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the second-most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 70, including eight last season
- Was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2002
- Has 12 years of head coaching experience and has spent 15 seasons as a defensive coordinator

AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- Last year, led the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, highlighted by a 42-24 victory over Washington State, which snapped a 19-game losing streak vs. Pac-10/12 foes and a 23-game skid against schools from automatic BCS qualifying conferences.
- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

- Long and his wife, Debby, have two daughters, Roxanne and Hannah. Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at NCAA schools. Roxanne was hired this July as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head women's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran, an NCAA Division III school in the American Southwest Conference. Hannah is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year and this past season led the Pirates to the NCAA regional semifinals and a 30-4 overall record.

SEATTLE -- San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback. It was the Aztecs' first season-opening loss since 2009.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

SDSU had multiple turnovers for only the second time in its last nine games, dating back to last year. San Diego State finished the 2011 season with just one turnover over its final three games.
