► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team plays a pair of games this week, finishing out its non-conference schedule with a Thursday evening contest against Utah Valley State College at home, before beginning round two of MWC play Saturday at UNLV.

The Aztecs take on the Wolverines Thursday in the first-ever meeting between the two squads. Utah Valley State is in its second year of Division I play and boasts an overall record of 2-18 as an independent.

SDSU, meanwhile, is looking to make it two in a row versus UNLV, having beaten the Lady Rebels for the first time in 10 tries, 76-60, in San Diego on Jan. 15. The Lady Rebels, who were picked to win it all in the pre-season league poll, are 11-10 overall and 2-5 in the MWC, with their lone conference victories coming against New Mexico and Air Force both at home.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his third season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 23-51.

► **UVSC Head Coach Cathy Nixon:** Nixon is in her 10th year at Utah Valley State and carries a school and career record of 203-104.

► **UNLV Head Coach Regina Miller:** Miller is in her seventh season with the Lady Rebels and boasts a record of 129-71. Her 13-year career record stands at 189-171.

SDSU Women's Basketball Takes On Utah Valley State, UNLV This Week

The San Diego State women's basketball team looks to head into round two of conference play on a winning note, as the Aztecs take a break from league action with a Thursday night game against first-time opponent Utah Valley State College at 5 p.m. at Cox Arena. SDSU is interrupting its MWC schedule for a non-conference game for only the second time since play began in 1999-2000.

Two days later, SDSU resumes conference action Saturday at UNLV, for a 3 p.m. tip-off at Cox Pavilion in Las Vegas. The Aztecs will look to make it two in a row versus the Lady Rebels,

Unlucky 13

The San Diego State women's basketball team finished round one of conference play with a pair of 13-point losses at BYU last Thursday (49-62) and at MWC co-leader Utah (52-65) on Saturday.

Against BYU, the Aztecs forced 25 Cougar turnovers and trailed by just two points early in the second half, but was unable to overcome a 30-percent shooting performance from the field. Aztec junior **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** had a team-best 13 points, while senior **Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas)** recorded six of her 10 points in the first half. SDSU's leading scorer, sophomore **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)**, added six assists and five rebounds, but was held to just four points all at the line.

Two days later, SDSU outscored Utah 41-29 in the second half, but could not bounce back from an 11-point performance in the first 20 minutes. Elliott had five of the team's 11 first-half points and finished the game with 14. Strawberry reached double-figures for the sixth time in the seven conference games, tallying 13 points. Casey added a team-high five rebounds and freshman **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** had nine points and three assists.

Other BYU, Utah Notes

Thursday's game was the first of two scheduled meetings between Aztec freshman **Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah)** and her sister, BYU senior Danielle Cheesman. Ashley Cheesman finished with eight points and a block in 31 minutes, while her sister had four points and five rebounds in 18 minutes ... BYU logged an SDSU opponent season-low 43 field goals and four three-point attempts, but made up for it with an Aztec opponent season-high 90.9 percent from the charity stripe ... Michelle Elliott had six of SDSU's nine assists versus the Cougars, a career-high for the sophomore ... the 41, second-half points against the Utes tie as the Aztecs' most in a half in an MWC game this season (also 41 in the first half vs. UNLV) ... the Utah contest marked only the second time this season that an SDSU opponent has led the entire game.

Berry Consistent

Certainly one of the most improved players for the Aztecs this season, junior guard Michelle Strawberry has scored in double-figures in six of the seven conference contests, averaging a team-best 12.3 points in MWC games. Strawberry tallied a career-high 20 points at Colorado State and was held below the 10-point barrier just once against Air Force when she scored five points.

Part of Strawberry's offensive success has come from her performances from beyond the arc and at the free-throw line. In seven league contests, she has 10 three-pointers after making only five in her first 12 games this season. Entering the year, Strawberry was just 9-of-38 from three-point land.

At the charity stripe, Strawberry made her first 18 free throws in MWC action, before missing the front end of a one-and-one at Utah. Her 94.7 league free-throw percentage (18-for-19) is tops in the MWC.

Opponent TOs

With the first half of Mountain West Conference play complete, SDSU has forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in five of its seven league outings. BYU was the Aztecs' latest victim, as the Cougars had 25 turnovers, including 13 in the first half last Thursday.

For the year, SDSU opponents have 20 or more turnovers in an outing 11 times, including in six of the last eight games. In 11 SDSU home games in 2004-05, opponents have committed 246 turnovers (22.4/g) to the Aztecs' 166, reaching the 20-mark on eight occasions.

Aztec TOs

The Aztecs committed just 11 turnovers in the loss at BYU last week, tying for the second fewest in a game this season. Two days later, while SDSU finished with 16 turnovers, only two of those came in the second half of play, the team's fewest in a half this year. The previous low came against Canisius, when the Aztecs committed five in the first 20 minutes and four in the second for a season-low nine.

SDSU has committed more than 20 turnovers just twice this year. The Aztecs are already on pace to break the school's record for fewest turnovers in a season for the second straight campaign. SDSU has 307 turnovers through 19 games, as opposed to 326 at the same point in

Movin' On Up

With a pair against Utah, Michelle Elliott is now by herself in seventh place in the SDSU career record books with 62 three-pointers. Elliott broke out of a tie for seventh with Ashonda Williams, who had 60 from 2002-03. By season's end, she should move past her classmate **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)**, who is fourth with 68 triples.

SDSU sophomore **Jessica Huettl (Eau Clair, Wis.)**, who was limited to just 11 contests a year ago, has 37 career threes and is just nine away from cracking into the top 10.

Through games of Jan. 30, the Aztecs still lead the conference in turnover margin (+4.58) and steals (10.58/g) ... In league contests, SDSU is also ranked first in steals (11.00/g) and turnover margin (+5.57) ... Individually in overall games, Michelle Strawberry is third in free-throw percentage (85.1) ... in MWC outings, Strawberry is first (94.7) and Michelle Elliott is third (89.5) in free-throw percentage ... **Veronica Shaw** (2.43/g) and Kate Eveland (2.29/g) are third and fourth in steals.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Utah Valley State will mean:

- SDSU claims its first win in its last seven outings since defeating UNLV on Jan. 15.
- SDSU finishes its non-conference campaign with a 6-7 mark for the second time in the last three years ... the Aztecs have won their final two non-conference games in a season for the first time since 2001-02.
- SDSU improves to 3-1 against first-time opponents in 2004-05.
- SDSU has won seven home games, its most in the Jim Tomey era and most since the 2001-02 campaign.

Utah Valley State Tid-Bits

Utah Valley State is 2-18 overall this season, its second as an NCAA Division I squad ... one of UVSC's wins came against Jacksonville State, while the other is against Montana State ... the Wolverines lost to Jacksonville State earlier this week (78-67) ... the Wolverines and Aztecs have played five common opponents in 2004-05, in Eastern Washington, New Mexico, Northern Colorado, Southern Utah and Utah ... junior forward Miriam Palkki (12.2 ppg.) leads UVSC in scoring and three-point shooting (35), while Katie Wilson (7.3 rpg.) is her team's top rebounder ... SDSU has not faced a non-conference opponent when its league schedule has already begun since 1999-2000, when it beat Texas A&M Corpus Christi (57-52) on Jan. 17, 2000.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over UNLV will mean:

- SDSU has swept the two-game conference series and won back-to-back games versus UNLV for the first time since 1997, when both schools were members of the Western Athletic Conference.
- SDSU claims its first win in Las Vegas since Jan. 16, 1997, when the Aztecs defeated the Lady Rebels 54-48, a span of six games.

► SDSU has swept a season series against a MWC foe other than Air Force and Colorado State for the first time since the league's inception in 1999-2000.

► SDSU wins its first road game of the season and its first road MWC contest since Jan. 31, 2004 at Air Force (span of eight games).

UNLV Tid-Bits

After being picked to win the conference in the preseason poll, UNLV has managed to win just two of its seven MWC contests, beating New Mexico and Air Force ... UNLV is 0-5 in league games on the road, but is 2-0 at home ... the Lady Rebels are led by guard Sheena Moore, who averages 15.3 points per game ... RanDee Henry averages 14.6 pointer per contest and a team-high 8.4 boards ... UNLV leads the league in scoring with 68.7 points per game ... UNLV advanced to the championship of the WNIT a year ago, finishing with a 26-8 record ... UNLV assistant Anthony Turner was the Aztecs' director of operations from 2000-02 under former head coach Barb Smith ... UNLV head coach Regina Miller is 7-2 all-time versus the Aztecs.

UNLV Rewind

► In its MWC opening win over UNLV, SDSU's 76 points are the team's second-most in its 77 all-time Mountain West Conference contests ... SDSU's 16-point margin of victory is the team's fourth-best in MWC play and biggest against an opponent other than Air Force ... the Aztecs won their first MWC opener since 2001 and defeated UNLV for the first time in its last 10 tries ... SDSU logged its first win over an MWC opponent other than Colorado State and Air Force since beating New Mexico, 56-52 on Feb. 15, 2001 ... SDSU had four players score in double-figures versus the Lady Rebels.

► SDSU shot a season-high 59.1 percent from the field, including 61.5 percent in the first half. The shooting percentage is the Aztecs' best ever in MWC play and highest in all games since shooting 68.1 percent versus Illinois State, Nov. 24, 2000.

Fritz, Jackson To Miss Rest Of Season Due To Injury

San Diego State women's basketball players Courtney Fritz and Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.) will miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season due to injury, Aztec head coach Jim Tomey announced Friday, Dec. 10.

Both in their sophomore campaigns, Fritz tore her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the second half of the Aztecs' game at Nevada on Dec. 7, while Jackson had ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle, which she suffered during warm-ups

Other 2004-05 SDSU Highlights So Far

- The Aztecs' 80 points against Cal State Stanislaus are the team's most in 61 contests since scoring 83 in a win over Air Force on Feb. 21, 2002.
- SDSU went 13-for-15 from the free-throw line (86.7 percent) against Northern Colorado, the team's best performance since making 88.9 (8-for-9) percent from the stripe on Nov. 25, 2000, versus Tennessee-Chattanooga ... SDSU made 6-of-7 free throws at Colorado State, the team's best percentage (85.7) ever in a MWC game.
- SDSU's 26-point margin of victory over Cal State Fullerton is its biggest in the three-year Jim Tomey era. The last time the Aztecs defeated an opponent by more than 26 points was Dec. 28, 2001, when SDSU downed Radford 89-42 (47 points) in San Diego.
- The Aztecs limited Southern Utah to just 37 points, fewest allowed by SDSU since Air Force managed just 30 in a 57-30 Aztec victory on Feb. 17, 2001, in San Diego. An SDSU opponent has failed to reach the 40-point barrier 18 times since the three-point line was put into effect for the 1987-88 season.
- SDSU has 70 or more field-goal attempts in a game twice this year, including 72 versus Canisius and 75 against Cal State Stanislaus. The 75 field-goal attempts are the most since Jan. 19, 1995, when SDSU also attempted 75 versus New Mexico.
- SDSU committed a season-low nine turnovers in the loss to Canisius, just one off the school record of eight which came in wins over Wyoming (Feb. 4, 1994) and Pepperdine (Dec. 7, 1996).
- SDSU has rallied from double-figure deficits twice this season. The Aztecs erased an 11-point deficit in the first half against CS Stanislaus and came back from a 14-point second half deficit with just under 12 minutes remaining to beat Eastern Washington (63-59). The 14-point comeback is SDSU's biggest since Feb. 13, 1994, when the Aztecs trailed by as many as 17 points in the first half and 15 in the second of their 67-65 win at UTEP.
- SDSU has broken the school record for most three-point attempts in a game three times this season. The Aztecs had 29 at Colorado State on Jan. 20, after posting 28 against Canisius (Jan. 4) and 27 versus Northern Colorado (Dec. 4). The record coming into the year stood at 25 versus New Mexico in the team's home finale on Feb. 28, 2004 ... SDSU has attempted 20 or more three pointers in a game six times, including in each of the team's first four outings ... 10 different Aztecs have attempted a three-pointer in 2004-05, with nine making at least one.
- SDSU logged a season-high 21 steals versus Air Force on Jan. 27. The 21 steals are the program's most since Jan. 30, 1999, when the Aztecs had 22 steals in a 89-68 victory over Fresno State. The 21 steals rank second in the Mountain West Conference this season, trailing Wyoming's 22-steal effort versus Colorado - Colorado Springs. In MWC history, the Aztecs' 21 steals tie for fourth in all games and second in league contests.
- SDSU has already recorded double-figures in steals on nine occasions in 2004-05. In the team's 11 home contests in 2004-05, SDSU has 10 or more steals seven times.
- SDSU hit a season-best 53.3 percent (8-for-15) of its three-point field goal attempts against New Mexico. The Aztecs' previous season high was a 35.7 percent, while the last time SDSU made 50 percent or more of its shots from beyond the arc was Jan. 6, 2004, when the Aztecs made 6-of-10 against Santa Clara.
- Three different SDSU players have tallied four or more three-pointers in a game five times ... Three different Aztecs have scored 10 or more points in the first half of a game seven times.
- SDSU has made 80 percent or more of its free throws in a game five times and 75 percent or more eight times.

San Diego State head coach Jim Tomey is in his third season with the Aztecs, carrying a 23-51 overall record. Tomey spent three years as an men's assistant coach at SDSU from 1999-2002, helping the Aztecs to the Mountain West Conference title and an NCAA tournament berth in 2001-02.

Before entering the collegiate arena, Tomey was the head boys' coach at the University of San Diego High School (USDHS), compiling a 212-71 record (.749) in 10 seasons, including a state title and seven CIF section crowns.
