- The second-seeded Rams will play No. 3 seed San Diego State in the 2022 Air Force Reserve Mountain West Championship semifinals on Friday, March 11 at 10 p.m., MT. CSU coverage is presented by McDonalds at 2401 S. College in Fort Collins.
- The game will be televised on CBS Sports Network.
- The audio will be on the Colorado State Sports Radio Network (along with online at CSURams.com), with Brian Roth and Adam Nigon handling the broadcast. CSU Sports Network broadcasts can be also accessed on mobile devices through the Varsity Network app (free on all Apple and Android devices). Fans can use the app for instant access to free gameday audio streams and receive push notifications to remind them of games starting or upcoming audio broadcasts.
- The game will also have live stats on CSURams.com.



2021-22 Rams Quick Hits

- Colorado State is under the direction of fourth-year head coach Niko Medved, who took over the helm of the Rams' program in 2018-19. In his ninth season as a head coach, Medved has a 156-131 record overall and improved on the previous season's winning percentage in each of his nine years as a head coach, including all years now at CSU.
- The 2021-22 season marks the 117th in the history of the Colorado State men's basketball program. The Rams are 1,327-1,296 (.505) in 2,623 games all-time.
- CSU concluded the 2020-21 season in the National Invitation Tournament, advancing to the final four and finishing 20-8 overall record, including 14-4 in MW play, a three-game improvement over 2019-20 and 11 games over 2018-19.
- The Rams earned their eighth invitation for postseason play in the last 11 years, though postseason events were eventually canceled due to the COVID-19 virus worldwide pandemic.
- CSU returns all five starters and nine letterwinners to this year's squad along with four newcomers.

The Leaders

- Colorado State head coach **Niko Medved** (Minnesota, '97) is in his fourth season at CSU as head coach with a 76-44 mark and has a 155-131 overall record in his ninth season as a head coach.
- San Diego State head coach **Brian Dutcher** (Minnesota, 1982) is in his fifth season with the Aztecs and as a head coach overall with a 118-38 record.

A Quick Look at San Diego State

- Returning two starters and seven letterwinners from last year's 23-5 team that won the Mountain West regular season at 14-3 and then tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament, San Diego State was picked to finish second in the preseason poll right behind the Rams.
- The defensive-minded Aztecs are led by senior guard Trey Pulliam, who is tops in assists. 2022 All-MW Defensive Team forward Nathan Mensah is the leader in rebounds and blocks in his senior year. Cal transfer and MW Newcomer of the Year and first-team pick Matt Bradley leads the squad in scoring, minutes and 3-pointers.

History Versus San Diego State

- This is a tight series, with San Diego State holding a 47-43 edge, including 43-40 in league play. The margin in neutral site games is 4-2 in favor of the Aztecs.
- This season, the two teams split their conference meetings, with each team winning at home.
- Against current Mountain West Conference teams, head coach Niko Medved is 48-30 overall (4-3 on neutral floors), with a 48-29 record while at CSU.

A Great Start To The Season

- For the first time in his head coaching career, Niko Medved had his team at 11-0 in the early part of the season. His previous best starts were 3-1 in his only season at Drake and 3-1 in each of his three previous seasons at CSU.
- The only other time CSU was 11-0 to start the season was in 2014-15, when the Rams were a school record 14-0 to start the season but ended up in the NIT.
- The 11-game winning streak is also tied for the second longest in program history with Boyd Grant's 1988-89 NCAA Tournament squad. The school record is 14 games, set in 2014-15 under Larry Eustachy.

On This Date

- All-time, CSU is 1-9 in games played on March 11, including 1-7 at neutral sites.

Excellence Displayed

- CSU has 25 overall wins on the season are the third most in program history and the 86.2 winning percentage is currently tops.
- The 14 home Moby wins are tied for 10th most in a single season.
- The Rams will have a winning road record for just the 15th time in program history (13th in the modern era).
- The Rams finished at 14-4 in conference play, just the second time in school history that CSU had 14 wins in league, matching last year's 14-4 mark under Niko Medved.

Improvement Always

- Head coach Niko Medved has had extensive success wherever he has coached, both as a head and an assistant.
- As an assistant coach, he helped turn around the CSU program to improving its win totals from his first year in each successive year, ending in four straight postseason appearances.
- He continued that trend at Furman and Drake, improving both programs' win totals from the previous year in each of his five seasons as a head coach, finishing his last three years in postseason play.
- In his first year at CSU in 2018-19, he led the Rams to surpass the previous season's win totals at CSU, both overall and in Mountain West play.
- In 2019-20, the Rams had nine non-conference wins, bettering 2018-19's total of five. The squad also won 20 games overall, improving on 2018-19's total of 12.
- The five-game win streak during the 2020-21 season was the longest for CSU since the Rams won seven straight during 2016-17.
- In 2020-21, Medved led the Rams to their best conference record in program history with the 14-4 mark. The 14 wins were most CSU wins in any conference in history.
- The 11-game winning streak that was snapped earlier this season is also tied for the second longest in CSU history with Boyd Grant's 1988-89 squad. The 2014-15 team, led by Larry Eustachy, won 14 in a row.
- Medved now seventh in the CSU record book in coaching wins with 77 and is second in winning percentage. He is at 63.6 behind the late Boyd Grant (63.8%, 81-46).
- The 25-4 record is the best 29-game mark in CSU history, while the 14-4 MW record ties for best MW mark.

• Prior to this year, there had only been eight weeks previously in program history that Colorado State was ranked in the Associated Press poll, including four during the 1953-54 season.
 • This was the first time in program history that the Rams have been ranked for four consecutive weeks by the AP.
 • The last time CSU was ranked prior to this was the Dec. 29, 2014 poll when they were 24th for the second week in a row. The No. 20 ranking is the highest since the March 9, 1954 poll when CSU was No. 19.
 • The highest-ever ranking for the Rams is No. 18, which occurred twice on Jan. 12 & Feb. 23, 1954, when the rankings only included the top 20 teams.
 • During the days of the United Press International Coaches' poll (UPI) (now the USA Today Coaches Poll), CSU was ranked 10 consecutive weeks during the 1962-63 season.

Moby Arena Home Court Advantage

• CSU has a record of 584-241 (.708) record all-time at Moby Arena, including 36-6 (.857) the last three years under Medved.
 • 2019-20's 12-4 mark had to do with some significant differences in major categories in favor of the Rams, with similarities resulting in a 10-1 mark in 2020-21, tying for fifth-best single-season win percentage at Moby.
 • This year's 14-1 record at home, follows a similar trend, as CSU tied for the second best home win percentage

in history.

• The Rams had their 13-game home winning streak snapped by UNLV on Jan. 28, a streak that dated back to last season. That is tied for the fourth-longest streak in arena history and tied for the sixth-longest home win streak in CSU history.

Moby Madness Is Back

• CSU has built a program which has earned the backing of the local community and students.
 • For just the first time in Moby Arena history, the Rams have sold out five home games in a single season (all consecutive) versus UNLV, San Diego State, Fresno State, Wyoming and this Boise State game.
 • In 2012-13, when head coach Niko Medved was an assistant at CSU, the Rams sold out three consecutive games and four total that season.
 • Only one other time has CSU had 7,000+ fans for three consecutive games, as it happened in 2014-15.
 • CSU had one of its top attendance seasons in Moby Arena. The Rams averaged 6,174 fans at home games, the top mark for the program since the formation of the Mountain West.
 • With the final game sellout, CSU averaged 6,906 for Mountain West games (85.4 percent) and 6,174 for the entire year (76.4 percent) with five consecutive sellouts.

- Colorado State had had three players reach the 1,000-point career mark during this season, as only 3 have now reached the mark for the Rams, the last prior to this year being J.D. Paige during the 2018-19 season.
- Junior David Roddy became #31 to reach the 1,000-point mark in his career in the first half of the Mississippi State game on Dec. 11, while junior Isaiah Stevens got to the benchmark in his next game against Air Force on Jan. 4. Senior Kendle Moore got it with his 23 points at Utah State on Feb. 26.

Valuing the Basketball

- The Rams have done a great job taking care of possessions and making the most of them.
- CSU is 11th nationally in fewest turnovers at 9.93 per game and 20th on assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.44.
- Junior Isaiah Stevens is 43rd in the country at 4.9 assists per game and 9th in Division I with a 2.98 assist-to-turnover ratio.

Starters Get It Going

- CSU's starters getting the scoring going was big last year, as the Rams were 18-3 last year when that group scored at least 50 points.
- In the season-opening win over Oral Roberts, the starting group had 56 points, while the bench chipped in 53.
- This year CSU is 16-2 when the starters tally at least 50.

Second Half Surge

- The Rams are making their move in the second half of games this season.
- CSU is outscoring opponents by an average of 5.6 points per game in the second half, including six games with 50 or more in the final 20 minutes.
- CSU is shooting at a stellar 52.8 percent clip from the field, 34.7 percent from the arc and limiting opponents to 43.3 and 31.1, respectively. The Rams have forced 1.4 more turnovers, grabbed +0.6 rebounds a game in the second half and shot 77.7 percent at the charity stripe.

The Cardiac Rams

- The three biggest comebacks for wins in program history have come in the past three-plus years under head coach Niko Medved.
- The most recent was the USVI Paradise Jam championship game Nov. 22, when CSU trailed by 20 (44-24) to Northeastern with 17:15 to play. The Rams closed the game outscoring the Huskies, 47-17, to win the tournament title by 10. This was the second-most points trailed in a win.
- CSU's rally from 26 points down at No. 23 San Diego

State on Jan. 2, 2021 made history as it is the largest comeback in both school and Mountain West history.

- The SDSU victory was the largest comeback win in Division I men's basketball last season and one of just five road comebacks of 26 points or more in a game between Division I opponents over the past 10 seasons, according to ESPN Stats & Information research.
- The previous largest comeback in CSU history occurred under Medved last season, as the Rams rallied from 19 down at Wyoming with 14:06 to play to earn a 77-70 win on Feb. 15, 2020.
- This year, the Rams have also come back from 13 down to Northern Colorado, 11 versus Mississippi State and 10 against Nevada for victories.

Defense Setting A Tone

- CSU has showed an improved defensive effort, which is highlighted in the stats, despite having the 311th club in the country in terms of experience entering the 2020-21 year.
- In 2020-21, the Rams were ranked in the top 75 nationally in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, 3-point field goal percentage defense and defensive rebounds.
- This year, the Rams had at least five blocks in each of the first three games. This was the first time that CSU had three-straight contests with five or more rejections since 2006-07.
- The 42 points by San Jose State on Jan. 15 were the fewest by a CSU opponent since holding SJSU to 41 points at home on Jan. 17, 2015 and tied for the 17th lowest opponent total in program history.
- CSU has held opponents to 63 points or less in 13 games (with seven of 55 or less), including two at the Paradise Jam.

Hitting From Deep

- Last year's squad that ranked in the top 70 in the country in 3-point field goals made featured four of the most prolific 3-point shooters in school history (who are all back this year). This year's team is currently eighth nationally.
- In the win over Creighton Nov. 21, CSU hit a school and Paradise Jam Tournament record 20 3-pointers. The

Colorado State Policy on Injury Reports

Roddy Named Third Team All-American, Consensus Mountain West Player of the Year,

- Colorado State junior forward David Roddy was named a Third Team All-American, as announced by the publication. He is the only non-Power 5 or Gonzaga player on any of the three teams announced. He is the fifth CSU player ever to be recognized as an All-American.
- Earlier this week, he was named the Mountain West Play-

er of the Year by the league's coaches and media in two separate polls. Just the third conference player of the year pick in CSU history joining Gian Clavell (2017-MW) and Mike Mitchell (1990-WAC), Roddy earned the consensus honors from both the media and the coaches' separate selections.

- The Minneapolis, Minn., native finished third in the league in conference scoring at 19.5 points per game, sixth in rebounding at 7.6 and first in field goal percentage at 57.5 percent. He was also 13th with 2.8 assists per game, eighth in blocks at 1.1 and 17th in minutes at 32.4 per contest.
- In league play, he was sixth in scoring at 19.06 points per game, fifth in rebounding at 7.61, first in field goal percentage at 56.6 percent from the floor and 12th with 3.06 assists per contest.
- He had a high of 31 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field along with nine rebounds and three steals in the win at New Mexico in his first game in The Pit. He scored in double figures in 17 of 18 league games, including nine of 20 or more.
- Recently, he had a game-high 23 points, four rebounds and two assists in a home win over league champion Boise State to sweep the season series with the Broncos.
- He became the 31st player in CSU history to reach 1,000 career points and is currently seventh with 1,358 points.
- He has seven double-doubles on the year and was named the USVI Paradise Jam MVP after averaging 31.0 points per game in leading CSU to the title with wins over Bradley, Creighton and Northeastern.
- Roddy set career highs in scoring twice, including 30 points in the first round of the Paradise Jam against Bradley.
- Roddy had another career night against Creighton, Nov. 21, scoring 36 points with seven three-pointers to lead CSU to the Paradise Jam championship game.
- Roddy was again named to the Wooden Watch List Jan. 31, after first appearing on it on Jan. 5. He also was named to the Lute Olson Award Midseason Watch List Jan. 12 and previously the Karl Malone Award Watch List at the start of the year for the nation's top power forward, as he was also honored as a finalist on Feb. 3.
- The junior was named Paradise Jam MVP after averaging 31.0 points per game in leading CSU to the title.
- On Feb. 17, Roddy had 31 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field along with nine rebounds and three steals in the win at New Mexico in his first game in The Pit.
- Currently, Roddy ranks third in the Mountain West at 19.31 points per game and is sixth in rebounding at 7.59 boards per contest. He also ranks first in field goal percentage, 13th in assists per game and sixth in blocked shots.
- A 2021 First-Team NABC All-District and All-Mountain West selection as well as a 2021-22 preseason All-MW pick, Roddy showed his development in his second year. As a sophomore, he increased both his scoring and rebounding averages, going from 11.4 points and 5.6 rebounds a game to a team-bests of 15.9 points and 9.4 rebounds. Those numbers were even better in MW play at 16.6 points and 9.9 rebounds per game, ranking, fourth, and second, respectively, in the league.

Stevens Honored As Second Team All-Mountain West

- Junior guard Isaiah Stevens was named Second Team All-Mountain West by both the league's coaches and media in separate votes for the second straight season.
- Stevens was among the most notable players in the league again, ranking 12th in MW scoring at 14.7, tops in free throw percentage at 90.2, third in assists at 4.8, second in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.0 and sixth in minutes with 34.7 per game.
- He reached the 1,000-point mark in his career during the season and is currently in 13th with 1,280 points. He ranks second all-time in assists with 439 and an average of 4.9 per game in his career.
- He earned All-Tournament Honors at the USVI Paradise Jam after helping guide CSU to the tournament title.
- In Mountain West action, the guard from Allen, Texas is

12th in scoring at 15.11 points per game, eighth in assists with 3.61, tops in free throw percentage at 91.8 percent, fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.10 and eighth in minutes played.

- He also scored in double figures in 17 contests with a career-high 35 points and eight rebounds at home against UNLV.
- Stevens had been named to final 10 on the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award Watch List, announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Jan. 31.
- Not on the original watch list, Stevens has been a leader for the Rams this season. As of Jan. 30, Stevens was among the leaders in the nation in several categories, including sixth with a 3.25 assist-to-turnover ratio, 15th in free throw percentage at 89.8 and 37th in assists per game at 5.1.
- For his career, Stevens became the 32nd Ram to reach 1,000 career points and is currently second in career assists with 439, second in assists average (4.9), fourth in minutes average (34.1), sixth in free throw percentage (85.8), 16th with 132 3-point FG made, 18th in 3-point FG percentage (38.9) and 20th with 91 steals.
- With a 3.51 in communication studies, Stevens was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District First Team Feb. 17 and will be on the ballot for Academic All-American.

Junior Class Continuing Impact

- The junior class of guards Isaiah Stevens and John Tonje, forward David Roddy and center Dischon Thomas are showing the continued growth in their third year of collegiate basketball.
- Last season, Roddy was first in scoring at 15.9 points per game and the top rebounder at 9.4 (2nd in MW), while Stevens was second in scoring at 15.3 points and first with 5.4 assists (No. 2 MW) per game. Roddy was a NABC First Team All-District, USBWA All-District, First Team All-MW pick while Stevens was named to the USBWA All-District squad as well as second team for the NABC All-District and Mountain West.
- In 2020-21, Tonje was fifth at 6.6 points per game (having averaged 3.6 as a freshman in 2019-20), while Thomas averaged 5.2 points and 3.1 boards a contest (up from 3.8 and 2.2 respectively).

Jacobs Production Increasing

- Graduate transfer Chandler Jacobs is feeling more comfortable at CSU and it is showing in his production.
- In conference play, he has five games scoring in double figures and has eight games with five or more rebounds.
- He is also 86.7 percent from the free throw line and averaging 6.1 points and 4.8 rebounds (20th in the MW) in MW action.
- On Feb. 13, he had 16 points (the first 6 for CSU in the OT) and seven rebounds in the overtime win at Boise State.
- On Feb. 23 against Wyoming, he scored a season-high 18 points (7-11 FG, season high 4 3-pointers) and seven rebounds in the Border War victory.
- In the Mountain West Quarterfinal against Utah State, Jacobs had just one field goal attempt, but it was huge, as he scored the game-winning layup with 1.8 seconds to play.

Winning The Paradise Jam

- The Rams won their first in-season tournament title since 2014 and 20th overall.
- CSU defeated its second team which was in the 2021 NCAA Sweet 16 in beating Creighton.
- The Rams hit a school-record and tournament-record 20 three-pointers in the win over Creighton. The total is also tied for the second most in Mountain West history.
- The Rams came back from a 20-point deficit in the championship game against Northeastern, the second-biggest comeback in program history.
- Junior forward David Roddy was named the tournament's MVP after, in three games, averaging 31.0 points, 6.7 rebounds and 1.7 assists per game while shooting 70.2 percent (33-of-47) from the floor, 53.3 percent (8-of-15) on 3s and 82.6 percent (19-of-23) from the charity stripe.
- Roddy set career highs with 30 points against Bradley in the first round and then 36 points (including career best 7 3s) in the semifinal victory over Creighton.
- Junior guard Isaiah Stevens was also honored on the All-Tournament Team, finishing with averages of 11.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 8.7 assists per game, while having a 6.5

assist-to-turnover ratio, including 19 assists to just one turnover in the final two tournament games combined.

Experience Gained=Success in '21-'22

- In 2020-21, CSU ranked 311th in terms of experience and youth in NCAA Division I basketball, yet finished among the top 70 teams in the nation.
- This year, CSU returned all five starters and nine total letter-winners from the 2021 NIT run.

- Colorado State will be in the eight-team field for the ESPN Events 2022 Shriners Children's Charleston Classic.
- Joining the Rams in the field are College of Charleston, Davidson, Furman, Old Dominion, Penn State, South Carolina and Virginia Tech.

Playing in front of fans in Moby Arena for the first time in 619 days, Colorado State opened the season in impressive fashion, pulling away in the second half for a 109-80 win over 2021 NCAA Sweet 16 foe Oral Roberts Tuesday night. It was the 14th straight season-opening victory and 41st consecutive home opener win for the Rams.

For the 7,287 in attendance, they were treated to a game that was up-and-down the floor throughout, as CSU built a seven-point halftime lead, 50-43. Coming out in the second half with a pair of starters dealing with injuries, CSU had its lead dip briefly to six before an 18-6 run put the hosts up 70-52 with 13:42 to play, with the margin growing to as many 34 in the closing minutes.

For the game, CSU finished at 58.9 percent (43-of-73) from the field and 45.8 percent (11-of-24) from the three-point arc, while holding ORU to just 39.7 percent (31-of-78) from the floor and 30.0 percent (12-of-40) beyond the three-point line. The Rams won the battle of the boards, 45-36, and outscored the Golden Eagles 50-34 in the paint. CSU also had nine blocked shots, the most since the Rams had 10 at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2004.

CSU was led by junior John Tonje with a career-high 31 points on 10-of-14 from the floor and hitting all eight of his free throws. Junior Dischon Thomas came off the bench with his first college double-double of 16 points and a career-high 10 rebounds along with a career-best five assists. In his CSU debut, fifth-year Chandler Jacobs had 15 points, while junior Isiah Stevens had 13 points and six assists in the win. Oral Roberts had four players also in double figures, led by pre-season All-American Max Abmas with 20, but limited to just 8-of-22 from the field, including 1-of-9 on threes.

• After committing turnovers on its first two possessions, CSU had just three the rest of the game for five, low under head coach Niko Medved and tied for ninth fewest for CSU in Moby Arena.

- CSU now leads the overall series 4-1, including 3-0 in Moby Arena.
- This was CSU's 30th 100-point game in history, as the Rams improved to 30-0 in those contests, including 25-0 in Moby Arena.
- The 109 points are the most since CSU had 111 in a triple-overtime win versus Tulsa on Dec. 21, 2019 and tied for the fifth most in program history.
- Tonje surpassed his previous collegiate high of 15 points in the first half, finishing the opening 20 minutes with 18
- This was the first time under Medved a player had 30 or more points in a game and the first time in the program since Prentiss Nixon had 31 at Arkansas, Dec. 5, 2017.
- The 7,287 fans in attendance were the most since the home finale in the 2016-17 season against Wyoming

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Nothing to complain about, really, but Niko Medved will find a few things to nitpick, for sure.

His Colorado State men's basketball team played well Friday night at Moby Arena and was never challenged by Arkansas-Pine Bluff in a 91-71 victory. The Rams shot well, defended well, cleaned the class and their stars shined.

They were good, but they can be better. He knows it. More importantly, so do his players.

"The objective is to win, but I think it's about how you play," Medved said. "We always talk about play to play, great, and the standard is the standard. Sometimes I think it's easy... what you wouldn't accept in losing you can't accept in winning. Sometimes it's easy if you win, you can gloss over something. You have to enjoy winning, but at the same time, you always have to take an unemotional look at the game and there's always things you can improve on. That's our charge."

The Rams are 2-0 on the season and still haven't played a close game. Still, this is a team which carries high expectations for the season, which means they have to carry them for themselves, too.

Take for instance David Roddy. He scored a career-best 28 points in the game. He matched a career-best with four blocks. He also had 13 rebounds, giving him the 15th double-double of his career. He's not going to tell you he played bad. He'd be lying through his teeth.

He will tell you he can play better. "It wasn't a perfect game at all. Too many turnovers," Roddy said. "Coach said we had 20 percent turnover percentage, so one out of every five possessions we're turning it over, and every time we're capitalizing off of a run, that's really when it starts. We start to get sped up and we start to turn over the ball."

"I'm disappointed in myself for that, because I know I can play better." Find a coach anywhere who doesn't appreciate that type of introspection. After practicing for nearly four months, the Rams are running a bit of a sprint to start the season with three games this week alone, with another on tap Sunday. They've prepared for a lot of things, but not everything, and not all of it in volume.

The Golden Lions threw a lot at the Rams defensively. They pressed a bit, threw in some 2-3 zone which Medved wasn't sure his team saw at all last season. They did it on the fly, which made it completely different than practice. And very valuable.

"Game reps. There's only so much you can script in a practice," guard Isiah Stevens said. "Teams make adjustments all the time, and they throw different looks, different bodies that we don't have on our team, size-wise or anything like that, so I feel for our team it's huge for us to get these game reps, especially with some of the new guys coming in who are going to be big for us."

Before answering, Stevens said his coach wouldn't agree with him, but in actuality, Medved did. He's definitely finding value in the quick run of games and the variety of looks his team is getting. It transpired from Tuesday to Friday, and he's pretty sure Sunday's game with Peru State (4 p.m. tip at Moby) will offer other twists.

SAINT THOMAS, U.S. Virgin Islands – After a slow offensive start in the first half, Colorado State found a better rhythm offensively in the final 20 minutes and rallied for a 66-60 win in the opening round of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam Friday afternoon. With the victory, the Rams improved to 4-0 on the season, while the Braves slipped to 1-3 overall.

This was a tight game throughout, as neither team led by more than eight the entire way through in this very physical battle. CSU shot just 24.0 percent (6-of-25) from the floor in the first half as the two teams were tied at 18 before a 9-3 closing run gave Bradley a 27-21 halftime lead.

The second half started with the Rams working the ball inside to junior David Roddy, as he scored the first two baskets to cut the margin to two. The teams then exchanged baskets that put Bradley up 37-32 at the first media timeout. From there Roddy scored six of the next eight points in an 8-0 run that put CSU up for good at 40-37 with 12:10 remaining. The Braves got within a single point on two other occasions, but a 9-2 run over 2:00 gave CSU its biggest lead of the game at 52-44 with eight minutes to go. While it got down to a single possession several times in the final minutes, each time CSU came up with a bucket and a stop to get the win as part of shooting 57.7 percent (15-of-26) in the final period.

Colorado State finished at 41.2 percent (21-of-51) from the floor for the game but just 26.3 percent (5-of-19) behind the arc. Bradley was held to just 39.1 percent (25-of-64) from the field and 25.0 percent (6-of-24) on threes. Bradley did win the board battle, 40-34, but CSU got to the charity stripe more and made it count, outscoring the Braves there 19-4.

Roddy finished with a career-high 30 points, 23 of those coming in the second half, along with a game-high nine rebounds. Junior John Tonje came off the bench with 13 points, while junior Dischon Thomas added 11 points and six rebounds, including three key offensive rebounds in the final minutes. Bradley also had three in double figures, led by Terry Roberts with 24.

SAINT THOMAS, USVI – Colorado State drained a school and U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam record 20 three-pointers and advanced to the finals of the tournament with a 95-81 victory over Creighton Sunday night.

The Rams led for the majority of the first half after junior David Roddy connected on a three-pointer to give CSU a 3-1 lead in the opening minute. CSU had as much as a seven-point lead in the opening 20 minutes but 9-2 Creighton run knotted the game at 33 with 1:43 remaining in the first. Colorado State then used a pair of triples from junior Dischon Thomas and a three at the intermission buzzer from Roddy to finish off a 9-3 run to end the half and give CSU a 42-36 lead at the break.

The second half with another three from Thomas, but the Bluejays went on a 14-2 run over less than three minutes to retake the lead at 50-47 with 16:36 remaining. After each team put two more on the board, the Rams took the lead for good on a three-pointer from freshman Jalen Lake in the right corner. CU answered with a basket, but the long distance shooting continued to stay hot for the Rams, as junior Isaiah Stevens and David Roddy hit on back-to-back possessions to spur a 17-4 run over 3:20 to make it a 72-58 CSU advantage midway through the final 20. CSU maintained a double-digit lead throughout the remainder of the half, building it to as much as 18 on a Roddy dunk in the final two minutes before the final 14-point margin.

Colorado State finished at 53.0 percent (35-of-66) from the floor overall but an even more staggering 56.8 percent (20-of-34) behind the three-point arc. Creighton was 55.0 percent (33-of-60) from the field, but just 31.8 percent (7-of-22) on threes. The Bluejays won the battle of the boards, 37-26, but CSU went plus-four on turnovers (13-9) and turned that into a 14-8 advantage.

Roddy finished with his second consecutive game with a career high, finishing with 36 points, including a career-best seven three pointers, along with three rebounds and three assists. Thomas also had career highs of 21 points and five three-pointers made. Junior Isaiah Stevens handled the ball effectively with a double-double of 17 points, 11 assists and 16 turnovers. Creighton had four in double figures, led by Arthur Kaluma with no turns.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Colorado State again put together a second-half rally with a combination of solid shooting and key defensive stops to defeat a spirited Northern Colorado squad, 88-79, Saturday afternoon in Moby Arena.

The visitors started out the game hot and led the majority of the first half behind a barrage of three pointers. After the early exchange of baskets, UNC built a 17-7 lead in the first six minutes of the contest. CSU came back and tied the game at 25 and eventually took the lead on junior David Roddy's three-pointer to make it 28-25 with 7:34 left in the first half. The Rams' lead grew to as many as nine at 36-30. However, Northern Colorado closed the first half on an 11-2 run, finishing by connecting with 11-of-20 three-point attempts in the opening 20 minutes but led by just three at the intermission, 41-38.

UNC continued to build on its late momentum with a 14-4 run to open the second half and take its biggest lead of the game at 55-42 with 15:34 to play. CSU chipped away and got it down to five, but the Bears went on a 7-0 run to make it 69-57 with just under 11 minutes remaining. From there, the Rams got aggressive and went on a 14-2 surge to tie it at 71 with 6:05 left. UNC hit a three to go back up on the next possession, but CSU's defense stepped up from that point on, finishing the contest on a 17-5 run, including hitting eight of nine from the charity stripe in the last three minutes to earn the victory.

Colorado State finished the game at 58.8 percent (30-of-51) from the floor and 52.9 percent (9-of-17) from the arc. UNC was 46.4 percent (26-of-56) from the field and hit 18 threes, going 48.6 percent (18-of-37). The Rams were excellent at the free throw line, hitting 86.4 percent (19-of-22), while the Bears were just 64.3 percent (9-of-14). CSU took the board battle, 29-27, while committing just six turnovers as compared to UNC's nine.

The Rams were led by juniors John Tonje and Isaiah Stevens with 20 points apiece, with 14 of Tonje's coming in the second half and Stevens adding six assists. Junior Dischon Thomas had 13 points, while Roddy added 12 points and 10 rebounds. Graduate Chandler Jacobs came off the bench to chip in nine points, five rebounds and a steal. Northern Colorado had three in double digits, led by Brodie Hume with 30 points.

STAT OF THE GAME • The Rams got a major contribution from the bench, as that group tallied 39 points for the game, 25 of them in the decisive second half.

NOTES • CSU now leads the overall series, 70-36, including 51-12 in Fort Collins. FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Colorado State started strong and took care of business against Little Rock, 86-55, Wednesday night in Moby Arena. The Rams remained one of the remaining undefeated teams in Division I, improving to 8-0 on the year, while the Trojans dropped to 4-4.

After an exchange of early leads made it 5-4 Little Rock, the Rams pulled away with a 22-2 run over the next 10 minutes to make it 26-7 CSU with just under seven minutes remaining in the first half. The lead grew to as many as 25 in the opening period, with Colorado State taking a 43-20 advantage into the break. The lead was maintained and expanded in the second half, growing to as many as 36 in the late stages.

Colorado State again proved effective on the offensive end, hitting 55.9 percent (33-of-59) of its field goal attempts, including going 25-of-36 on two pointers. Little Rock was held to just 38.5 percent (20-of-52) overall and 23.1 percent (3-of-13) on threes. The Rams hit all 12 free throw attempts and won the boards, 32-28.

CSU had four players in double figures, led by junior Isaiiah Stevens' double-double of 12 points and a school record-tying 12 assists, with no turnovers. Seniors Kendle Moore and Adam Thistlewood each contributed 11, while junior John Tonje came off the bench with 10 points. Little Rock had a pair of players in double digits, paced by Isaiiah Palermo's 16 points.

STAT OF THE GAME • Colorado State forced an opponent season-high 18 turnovers on the night.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - In one of the most complete performances of the year, Colorado State started strong and led from start-to-finish to defeat visiting Saint Mary's (Calif.), 74-58, Saturday afternoon in Moby Arena. The Rams remained one of the remaining undefeated teams in Division I, improving to 9-0 on the year, while the Gaels fell to 8-2.

Against the nation's fifth-ranked defense in terms of efficiency, CSU scored on its first possession with an Adam Thistlewood three-pointer and another from David Roddy to take an early 6-0 lead. SMC came back with the next four, but the Rams patient offense reeled off an 11-2 run to go up 17-6 with less than seven minutes gone. The margin got to four on two occasions, but CSU answered the call both times, the last finishing the half outscoring Saint Mary's 12-5 to lead 35-24 at the break.

CSU started the final 20 minutes like it started the game, scoring the first six points to push the lead to 17 points. From there, the Rams maintained control, never letting the guests get the margin to single digits and pushing the advantage to as many as 21 down the stretch. The Rams cleared the bench in the closing minutes, as a raucous Moby Arena crowd cheered the final moments of the 16-point victory.

Colorado State continued to be consistently strong on the offensive end of the floor, shooting 52.8 percent (28-of-53) from the floor and 56.3 percent (9-of-16) on threes against a team that had not given up 70 points all season and more than 61 in its last five games. The Rams' defense was also stalwart, limiting Saint Mary's to just 41.2 percent (21-of-51) on field goal attempts and a paltry 19.0 percent (4-of-21) beyond the arc. SMC did hold an advantage on the boards, 30-24, but the Rams had a plus-4 advantage in turnovers forced (15-11).

CSU had three players in double figures, led by Roddy's 19 points and seven rebounds, with 14 of those points coming in the second half. Junior Isaiiah Stevens has 14 points, four assists and three steals, while junior John Tonje came off the bench with 12 points. Saint Mary's had a pair of players with 10 points each in Matthias Tass and Augustus Marchiulioni.

STAT OF THE GAME • CSU's defense held SMC's other top three scorers, all averaging better than 10 points a game and a combined 34.6 points to just 20 points total on the day.

FORT WORTH, Texas – For the third time this season, Colorado State rallied from a double-digit deficit and pulled out the win, this time 66-63 over Mississippi State in the opener of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Classic Saturday afternoon in Fort Worth. With the thrilling victory, the Rams continued their season-opening win streak and improved to 10-0 (one of seven undefeated teams nationally), while the Bulldogs slipped to 6-3 overall.

The Rams trailed by as many as 11 in the first half and took a brief lead late before going into the halftime break down 29-27. Colorado State started the second half on a 6-2 surge to take a 33-31 lead less than two minutes in, but MSU went on a 10-0 run to go up 42-33 with 15:09 to play. The Bulldogs stayed in front for the next 10 minutes, including being up 57-49 with 6:16 remaining. From there, CSU went on 17-2 run, going back in front for good with 3:57 to go on a layup by junior David Roddy, making it 60-59. Back-to-back triples from junior Isaiah Stevens and senior Kendle Moore gave the Rams their biggest lead of the game at 66-59 and the team held on late with several key stops and rebounds to earn the win.

For the game, Colorado State shot 47.2 percent (25-of-53) from the floor, including 42.3 percent (11-of-26) on threes. Mississippi State was 33.9 percent (21-of-62) overall and 25.0 percent (7-of-28) beyond the arc. The Bulldogs had a slight advantage on the glass, 34-33.

CSU was led by Roddy with 19 points and seven rebounds, while Moore finished with 13 points and Stevens had eight points and 10 assists. Junior Dischon Thomas was strong on the glass for the Rams, grabbing 10 boards in the contest. MSU had four players in double digits, led by Garrison Brooks with 15.

STAT OF THE GAME

- Colorado State's defense clamped down in the second half, limiting Mississippi State to just 10-of-35 (28.6 percent) from the floor and 2-of-13 (15.4 percent) on threes.

With the win, the Rams continued their season-opening win streak and improved to 11-0 and 1-0 in the league, while the Falcons slipped to 8-5 and 1-1 in the conference.

Air Force grabbed the early lead and led the majority of the opening 20 minutes. CSU used a 14-0 run midway through the first half to go from a five-point deficit to a 30-21 lead with 2:40 to play and went into the break with a 33-28 lead. CSU never relinquished the lead in the second half, though the Falcons did tie it at 48 with 10:58 to play. However, the Rams made the plays down the stretch in the closing minutes to seal the victory.

Colorado State finished the game hitting a season-low 40.4 percent (23-of-57) from the floor and 30.4 percent (7-of-23) beyond the arc. Air Force was 52.3 percent (23-of-44) on field goal attempts and 47.6 percent (10-of-21) on threes. CSU won the battle of the boards decisively, 33-23 and forced 14 Air Force turnovers while only giving up six.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - No. 22 Colorado State rallied from a 10-point deficit in the first half with a strong offense performance in the final 20 minutes to pull out a 77-66 Mountain West win over Nevada Tuesday night in Moby Arena. With the victory, the Rams improved to a program-best 16-1 overall and 6-1 in the league, while the Black Pack dropped to 9-8 and 3-3 in conference action.

Playing with a depleted lineup without third-leading scorer John Tonje and senior Adam Thistlewood, the Rams trailed for most of the first half, falling behind by as many as 10 before being down 34-27 at halftime. A refocused CSU team came out with a 12-5 run in the first three minutes to tie the game at 39 and start the rest of the game at level.

The two teams went back and forth for the next 11 minutes, with nine ties and 11 lead changes overall, as neither team led by more than three in that span. With the game tied at 63 with 6:03 to play, CSU stepped up on both ends of the floor, held Nevada scoreless over 5:00 and took the game with a 12-0 run that put the Rams up for good at 75-63 with 1:03 to go and eventually finished the win off.

Colorado State finished the game shooting 49.1 percent (27-of-55) on field goal attempts, including 34.8 percent (8-of-23) on threes. The Rams connected on 68.0 percent (17-of-25) of its shots in the second half, including 44.4 percent (4-of-9) beyond the three-point line. Nevada was 47.1 percent (24-of-41) overall and 28.6 percent (8-of-28) from the arc. CSU won the battle of the boards with the much-taller visitors, 31-29, and outscored Nevada in the paint, 32-28.

Junior forward David Roddy led CSU with 18 points, eight rebounds, six assists and two steals, while junior guard Isaiah Stevens had 16 points and five rebounds. Graduate guard Chandler Jacobs added 14, while senior guard Kendle Moore chipped in nine, as seven Rams had six or more points on the night. Nevada also had three in double digits, led by Desmond Cambridge Jr.'s game-high 23 points.

LARAMIE, Wyo. – In another instant Border War classic, Colorado State and Wyoming battled through regulation and an extra five minutes to decide it, as the home Cowboys escaped with an 84-78 win in Laramie Monday night. With the loss, the Rams slipped to 16-3 and 6-3 in Mountain West action, while the hosts improved to 17-3 and 6-1 in the league.

Both teams had an 8-0 run in the opening 20 minutes and the largest lead of the first half was seven by either team as CSU took a slim 35-34 halftime lead. Nothing changed in the final 20 minutes of regulation, as both teams had chances in the final seconds to win the game, but finished 40 minutes in a 70-70 tie.

CSU came out at the start of the overtime and scored the first basket on a drive by junior forward David Roddy, but the Rams could not get a two-possession lead. With the game tied at 76, Roddy was called for his fifth personal. Both teams scored baskets to tie the game at 76, but Wyoming hit their next two shots and CSU missed a pair of missed shots for the difference in the game.

Colorado State finished the game at 47.8 percent (32-of-67) from the field, but just 30.0 percent (6-of-20) on threes, including 2-of-9 in the second half and overtime. Wyoming was 52.8 percent (28-of-53) from the floor and 42.9 percent (9-of-21) beyond the arc. The Cowboys won the board battle, 35-29, and got to the free throw line 24 times as compared to 11 for the Rams.

Roddy finished with 23 points, five rebounds, two assists and three steals, while junior guard Isaiah Stevens had 17 points, three rebounds and five assists. Junior guard John Tonje was the only other Ram in double figures with 15 off the bench. Wyoming had four in double figures, led by Hunter Maldonado's 35 points.

STAT OF THE GAME

- The game was nip-and-tuck the entire time with 16 lead changes and 10 ties with neither team leading by more than seven in the 45 minutes.

NOTES

- In the most-contested rivalry in the Mountain West, Wyoming holds a 138-98 advantage overall, including 118-71 in conference action and 77-42 in Laramie.
- CSU has won eight of the last 12 meetings overall (5 of the last 7), including both in Laramie last year. Since 2016-17, CSU is 5-2 now in Arena-Auditorium against the Cowboys, with all decided by nine points or less.
- The Rams are now 45-50 in overtime games all-time, including 15-24 on the road. This was the first overtime game for CSU since the three-overtime win over Tulsa in 2019-20.
- Roddy moved up to No. 16 in the CSU scoring charts at 1,164 points, passing Cliff SiHegogg (1966-70) at 1,160.
- Stevens moved into 17th right behind Roddy with 1,162 points and is now fourth in career assists with 392.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – In front of a second consecutive sellout crowd, junior forward David Roddy hit a running jumper with 6.3 seconds left to foil a San Diego State comeback and lift Colorado State to a 58-57 win in the annual Orange Out Friday night in Moby Arena. The Rams improved to 17-3 overall and more importantly 7-3 in the Mountain West, while the Aztecs dropped to 12-6 and 4-3 in the league.

The opening 20 minutes was a defensive battle on both ends of the floor, as CSU was just 8-of-23 from the floor but limited SDSU to just 6-of-28. The Rams led throughout the first half but only by as many as seven as they had a 23-18 halftime advantage.

Colorado State came out aggressive in the second half and built as much as a 20-point lead at 47-27 with 10:15 to play in the game. However, the defending Mountain West champions chipped away at the lead and got it down to 56-54 with 1:04 remaining. Lamont Butler hit a 3 with 13.9 seconds to give SDSU its only lead of the game. CSU quickly rebounded the ball and junior guard Isaiah Stevens hustled the ball up the court. A slight mishandle ended up in the hands of Roddy, who hit the running 13-footer to put the Rams back in the lead. The Aztecs had one last chance, but a strong defensive wall-up by redshirt-sophomore center James Moors made the difference in the final shot.

For the game, Colorado State finished at 40.8 percent (20-of-49) from the field, while San Diego State was limited to 30.2 percent (19-of-63) from the floor. Both teams hit 13 free throws and the Aztecs held a 43-31 advantage on the glass.

CSU was led by Roddy with 22 points, a game-high nine rebounds and four assists, while junior guard John Tonje tallied 16 points and Moors added a season-high 10 points and career-high eight rebounds. San Diego State was led by Matt Bradley, who was the only Aztec in double figures with 27.

STAT OF THE GAME

- CSU limited SDSU to just 30.2 percent from the floor, the Aztecs second-lowest field goal percentage on the year.

NOTES

- This is a tight series, with San Diego State holding a 47-43 edge, including 43-40 in league play. However, CSU holds a 27-14 advantage in Fort Collins.
- CSU is 10-2 in Orange Out games now, including 3-0 against the Aztecs (other wins 2013 and 2017).
- The Rams improved to 11-1 at home this year and 33-6 in the last three years under head coach Niko Medved.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - In the only regular-season meeting between the two teams, Colorado State used a strong second half and pulled away for a 65-50 Mountain West victory over visiting Fresno State Friday night. The Rams improved to a program-best tying 19-3 overall and 9-3 in the league, while the Bulldogs fell to 16-8 and 6-5 in the conference.

Trailing by three at 28-25 after the opening 20 minutes, Colorado State found its rhythm on both ends of the floor in the second half. The Rams came out and opened with an 10-2 run to grab the lead for good at 35-30. Fresno State did shrink the margin to one on two occasions, the last at 37-36, but CSU put together a 14-2 run to build a 13-point lead that never got below 10 the rest of the way.

Against one of the best defenses in the Mountain West, CSU finished at 51.9 percent (27-of-52) from the field, while limiting the Bulldogs to just 35.2 percent (19-of-54), including 18.5 percent (5-of-27) beyond the arc. Fresno State did win the boards, 37-26, but turned it over 12 times as compared to three for CSU.

CSU was led by junior forward David Roddy with 21 points, seven rebounds and a season-high eight assists. Junior guard Isaiah Stevens added 14 points, three boards and three assists, while redshirt-sophomore center James Moors and junior guard John Tonje chipped in 11 and 10, respectively. Fresno State was led by Orlando Robinson's game-high 24 points, but he was the only Bulldog in double figures.

STAT OF THE GAME

• CSU just committed three turnovers in the game, all in the first half, tying a Moby Arena record and outscored Fresno State 12-5 off turnovers.

NOTES

- Colorado State leads the overall series 24-18, but just 15-13 in conference matchups. However in Fort Collins, the Rams hold a decisive 18-3 advantage.

BOISE, Idaho - Colorado State battled for 45 minutes and found a way in the closing minute of overtime to pull out a 77-74 win at Mountain West-leading Boise State Sunday afternoon.

As two of the top teams in the Mountain West battled early, the first half was filled with runs, as CSU went on a 16-3 run but Boise State followed with a 17-0 run to retake the lead. Back-to-back scores on a layup by graduate Chandler Jacobs and a triple by junior forward David Roddy gave the Rams the lead again. The visitors closed the half on a 7-3 run and took a slim 39-37 lead into the halftime intermission.

The teams battled again at the start of the final 20 minutes. Boise State came out and took a lead, getting it to 61-54 with 9:26 to play. However, the Rams battled back with strong defense and an 8-0 run to take a lead at 62-61 with just under six minutes to play. CSU continued strong defense and it was 65-64 in the final minute. Jacobs grabbed a defensive rebound and was fouled with 38.2 seconds to play and hit both ends of the one-and-one to make it 67-64. Marcus Shaver Jr. hit a step back 30-footer to tie the game with 8.3 seconds remaining. CSU got the ball but couldn't get a shot off on a no call, BSU got a shot off after an inadvertent whistle but it missed and the game went to an extra five minutes.

CSU never trailed in the extra period as Jacobs scored six consecutive points in the overtime period, hitting two free throws and a pair of baskets as the game was tied at 69, 71 and 73. Jacobs grabbed a key offensive rebound in the final minute that ended with a Roddy tip-in to put the Rams up 75-73 with 29 seconds remaining. Boise State was fouled with six seconds remaining but Mladen Armus was only able to convert one of the two free throw attempts. Junior guard Isaiah Stevens grabbed the rebound, was fouled and converted his one-and-one to give the Rams a three-point lead. The Broncos had one last desperation three attempt from Shaver, but Roddy perfectly timed his block and swatted away the shot to seal the win.

Colorado State finished the game at 50.0 percent (29-of-58) from the floor and 30.8 percent (8-of-26) beyond the arc. Boise State was limited to 41.5 percent (27-of-65) on field goal attempts but hit 54.2 percent (13-of-24) on threes. The Rams hit all 11 free throw attempts while the Broncos were just 7-of-10 and held a slim 33-32 advantage on the boards.

For CSU, Roddy finished with 18 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots, while Jacobs had a season-high 16 points and seven boards. Junior guard Isaiah Stevens was the other Ram in double figures with 14 points along with four rebounds, five assists and a pair of steals. Boise State had four in double figures, led by Max Rice and Shaver with 17 points each.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Returning home for the Mountain West's most-played rivalry, Colorado State made the plays in the final minutes to secure a 61-55 win over visiting Wyoming Wednesday night in Moby Arena.

Colorado State raced out to an early 19-7 lead, but Wyoming rallied and eventually took a 27-25 lead with two minutes to play in the opening half. The Rams closed the half on a 6-0 spurt and led 31-27 at the break.

In a defensive battle between two of the league's top offensive teams, Colorado State finished the game hitting just 38.9 percent (21-of-54) from the floor and 33.3 percent (9-of-24) from the arc.

CSU was led by Roddy with his sixth double-double of the year with 26 points and 11 rebounds, while Jacobs came off the bench with a season-high 18 points on 7-of-11 shooting.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – In a battle between the league's top two teams in front of the fifth consecutive home sellout for the Rams, Colorado State made the plays in the closing minute to pull out a 71-68 win over league champion Boise State Saturday night in Moby Arena. With a sweep of the season series, the Rams secured the No. 2 seed in next week's Air Force Reserve Mountain West Championship and improved to 24-4 overall and 14-4 in the league, while the Broncos fell to 24-7 and 15-3 in conference play.

Early on, this was a game of double-digit runs, with CSU putting on a 12-0 spurt and Boise State a 10-0 run in the first half. From there, the teams both shot the ball well as each finished above 50 percent for the half, but a three by junior guard Isaiah Stevens right before the halftime horn put CSU up 41-36 at the break.

The Rams built their biggest lead of the game early in the second half at 47-36 with 18:31 remaining, but the Broncos rallied and tied it at 58 before eventually taking the lead twice in the final three minutes, the last at 68-67 with 1:28 to play. A blocked CSU shot came up short but redshirt-sophomore James Moors grabbed the ball out of the air, fought through two BSU defenders and put the Rams back up 69-68 with a minute to go. The Broncos missed a three, but got the ball back on a CSU turnover with 32 seconds to play. CSU came up with a stop as junior David Roddy knocked the ball into the hands of Moors and after an offensive rebound on a missed one-and-one, senior guard Kendle Moore knocked down two to give the Rams the victory after a failed final attempt for the Broncos fell short.

Colorado State finished the game at 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the floor and 35.7 percent (5-of-14) from the arc. Boise State hit 52.9 percent (27-of-51) of its attempts overall and 30.0 percent (6-of-20) on threes. Both teams were better than 80 percent at the free throw line and CSU held a slight advantage on the glass 24-22.

The Rams were led by Roddy with a game-high 23 points, four rebounds and two assists. Moore tallied 19 points on 7-of-19 shooting and five boards, while Stevens finished with 12 points and seven assists. Boise State also had three in double-figures, led by Abu Kigab with 15 points.

LAS VEGAS, Nev. – Colorado State's graduate guard Chandler Jacobs took a pass from junior guard Isaiah Stevens for a layup in the closing seconds as the second-seeded Rams came away with a thrilling 53-51 victory over seventh-seed Utah State in the Air Force Reserves Mountain West Championship quarterfinals Thursday night. With the win, the Rams advanced to the tournament semifinals for the 10th time and improved to 25-4, while the Aggies dropped to 18-15.

This game was in line with the rest of the early action today in the tournament, as neither team led by more than five in the contest and it came down to the final two possessions. After coming away with a steal down two, Utah State pushed the ball up the floor but senior guard Kendle Moore drew a charge to give the Rams the ball back. A CSU foul on the subsequent free throw put the Aggies at the line where they knotted the game at 51. On the final possession, with 13 seconds to play, Stevens held the ball briefly and then drove the lane, drawing the double team and finding Jacobs cutting in from the right for the game-winning layup with 1.8 seconds left.

Colorado State finished the game shooting 42.6 percent (20-of-47) from the field but just 16.7 percent (3-of-18) on threes. Utah State was limited to 40.7 percent (22-of-54) from the floor and only 6.7 percent (1-of-15) from the arc. The Aggies did win the battle of the boards 37-30.

The Rams were led by Stevens' 14 points, seven rebounds and five assists, while junior forward David Roddy had 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting along with six rebounds. Utah State was paced by Brandon Horvath's game-high 17 points.

STAT OF THE GAME
 • The last time that CSU won a game with fewer than 53 points is Dec. 5, 2007, a 44-40 win over Denver at Moby Arena, when head coach Niko Medved was in his first year as an assistant at CSU.

NOTES
 • Utah State has a 60-43 lead, but CSU picked up its first neutral site win over the Aggies in four tries with tonight's victory.
 • The Rams have won five of the last six meetings, including all three of this season's meetings.
 • This is the first time that CSU has scored lower than 60 points and won a Mountain West Tournament game and is now 10-8 in quarterfinal games all time.
 • CSU is now 5-0 in neutral site games this year and 10-1 against teams that played in the postseason last year.
 • The Rams improved to 18-1 when leading at the half and 17-0 when holding an opponent under 70 points.

NIKO MEDVED

Head Coach • Fourth Year at CSU • Minnesota (1997)

Niko Medved is in his fourth year as the head coach of the Rams' men's basketball program in 2021-22. Medved, a Colorado State assistant coach from 2007-13, has continued to show his prowess in program improvement, having led his respective squads to increased win percentage over the previous season in each of his eight years as a leader. That includes all three seasons at CSU, resulting in a nine-win improvement over two years and an 20-8 record this in 2020-21 that earned him Mountain West Coach of the Year from the league's media and United States Basketball Writers Association District Coach of the Year honors.

In 2019-20, the Rams continued their upward trend under Medved and his staff, posting an eight-victory improvement over his first year with a 20-win season. The Rams were also headed to the postseason for the first time in three years prior to the season being halted for the worldwide pandemic. As part of that season, three Rams were recognized for their play on the court, including second-team All-MW pick and the league's all-time leading rebounder Nico Carvacho and the Mountain West Freshman of the Year and third-team All-MW guard Isaiah Stevens.

He previously served as the head coach at Drake University for one season where he guided the Bulldogs to their first postseason berth in six years. Prior to his appointment at Drake, he engineered considerable success as head coach at Furman from 2013-16.

As a Colorado State assistant coach for six years beginning in 2007 when former head coach Tim Miles took the reins of the Rams' program, Medved was instrumental in the rebuild of the program that saw it improve from seven wins in 2007-08 to five consecutive postseason berths, including NCAA tournament appearances in his final two seasons. As recruiting coordinator at CSU, Medved was responsible for recruiting many of the contributing players on the Rams' roster who helped return the program to prominence, a list that includes:

- two-time All-Mountain West selection and eventual Olympian Andy Ogide
- 2013 honorable mention AP All-American and first-team All-Mountain West Conference choice Colton Iverson
- second team All-MW pick Dorian Green
- third team all-league and two time all-defensive team selection Pierce Hornung
- 2012 first team All-MW guard Wes Eikmeier
- 2013 MW Sixth Man of the Year Daniel Bejarano

During his season at Drake, he engineered a 10-game improvement over the previous season, including 10 wins in the Missouri Valley Conference, the most in 10 years and just the 11th time the squad had won 10 or more league games in a season. The turnaround was the 17th best in the nation this year from a 7-24 record prior to his arrival. The postseason berth in the CIT was the first since 2012 and the His squad defeated Wake Forest during non-conference play., the program's second-ever win against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. He also had a player named Missouri Valley Scholar-Athlete of the Week seven times during the season out of 11 opportunities and had four players named to MVC Scholar-Athlete teams.

In four seasons as head coach at Furman, Medved guided the Paladins from a seven-win squad prior to his arrival and led it to improved records each season. The run culminated in a 23-11 record in 2016 that earned him Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors and saw the program earn a share of its first SoCon regular season championship since 1990-91. Medved's team reached the semifinals of the CollegenInsider.com (CIT) postseason tournament in 2016-17, its second consecutive season in the CIT.
