OFF THE BOUNCE (through the games of February 6)

- Looking to match its longest league win streak of the season, three games, San Diego State travels to Reno, Nev. to take on Nevada on Friday at 5 p.m. PT at Lawlor Events Center.
- The Aztecs and Wolf Pack are meeting for the 33rd time, with SDSU sitting on a 25-7 advantage in the all-time series. In the Mountain West era, SDSU has a 21-4 lead in the series, but since its opening on Nov. 4, 1983, is just 5-6 at Lawlor Events Center. (complete results between San Diego State and Nevada are listed in the column on page 4)
- San Diego State is 5-4 in Lawlor Events Center since Nevada joined the Mountain West. Only one of those five wins has been by at least 10 points while the other four have been wins by no more than seven points, and its four losses are by an average of 16.3 points.
- San Diego State owns a 126-28 record (81.8 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the third best record in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (137-19, 87.8 percent) and Houston (136-25, 84.5 percent).
- Once again San Diego State is one of the elite teams when it comes to challenging itself. According to Kenpom, the Aztecs have the No. 15 strength of schedule rating, including the No. 9 rated non-conference schedule. SDSU has faced the No. 11 rated schedule in opponents adjusted offensive efficiency and the No. 26 rated schedule in opponents adjusted defensive efficiency.
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of MW members was finalized, SDSU has an 58-34 (.630) record in Mountain West ROAD games, the best mark in the conference. Boise State has the second-best record 48-46 (.511).
- The Aztecs are among the elite programs in the country and that includes winning on their opponent's floor. Since the beginning of the 2009-10 campaign, SDSU has the seventh best road record in the nation, 105-64 (62.1 percent). Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, SDSU has lost just 14 times in 48 road games (34-14, 70.8 percent), which is the THIRD fewest in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (6 losses) and Baylor (13 losses) and its 70.8 winning percentage in road games in that time frame is the SECOND best in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (32-6, 84.2 percent) with one of the Zags' six losses coming at the hands of the Aztecs, 84-74 on Dec. 29, 2023.
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of MW members was finalized, SDSU has an 85-11 (.885) record in Mountain West HOME games, the best mark in the conference. Boise State has the second-best record 76-20 (.792) and Colorado State is 61-33 (.649).
- The Aztecs metrics rank among the best in the nation. Through the games of February 6, the Aztecs were ranked No. 20 in the NET, No. 20 in Kenpom, No. 23 in T-Rank, No. 17 in KPI and No. 36 in BPI. San Diego State's strength of record is No. 19.
- San Diego State enters the Nevada game with a 7-5 record in Quad 1 & 2 games this season, including a 3-5 record in Quad 1 games. Its five losses have been on the road at some of the toughest venues to play in for an opposing team. The Aztecs lost at Brigham Young (65-74) in front of its second largest crowd of the season, at Grand Canyon (73-79) in front of its largest crowd, at New Mexico (70-88) in front of the largest crowd it has had since the 2009 season, at Boise State (66-67) in front to its second biggest home crowd this year and at Colorado State (71-79) in front of its largest home crowd of the year.
- Senior Jaedon LeDee surpassed the 1,000-career point milestone at Colorado State and enters the Nevada game with 1,041 points, 749

- SDSU has won at least 19 games in 18 straight seasons.
- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-23 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 75 of last 80 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 110-of-118 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 4th nationally in winning percentage (.743) since the beginning of the 2005-06 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

of which have come in 61 games with the Aztecs while in his first 79 games at both Ohio State and TCU he totaled 292 points.

- San Diego State, which won both the 2022-23 Mountain West regular season and tournament titles and reached the league tournament championship game for the sixth time in head coach **Brian Dutcher's** six seasons, looks for its unprecedented 17th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2023-24 season, San Diego State has won nine regular season and seven Mountain West tournament titles.
- At Air Force, San Diego State shot a season-high 70.0 percent (14-of-20) from the field in the first half, which marked the second time in the Mountain West era that the Aztecs have shot at least 70 percent in the first half (also: at Air Force (.704 on Jan. 22, 2021) and the fourth time since 1999-00. [SDSU shot at least 70.0 percent twice in the second half of a game: vs. UNLV (70.8 percent) on Jan. 26, 2019 and at Fresno State (77.8 percent) on Feb. 20, 2021]
- Junior wing **Reese Waters**, at Air Force, led San Diego State in scoring (15 points) for the fourth time this season and in doing so was successful on 5-of-8 shots from the bonus distance, a career-high for made triples.
- At Air Force, senior wing **Micah Parrish** reached double figure scoring for the 13th time this season, 22nd as an Aztec and 55th time in his career.
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** grabbed 9 boards at Air Force and led the Aztecs in rebounding for the 18th time this season and 37th time in his college career. He also scored in double figures for the 22nd time in 22 games in 2023-24.
- **Lamont Butler**, a senior guard, finished the Air Force game with 11 points to lock up his 10th game this year and 36th game in his career in which he has reached double figure scoring.
- Senior forward **Jay Pal** recorded a season-best three blocks at Air Force.
- **Brian Dutcher** is in his seventh season as San Diego State's head coach and his 25th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his six-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, six Mountain West championship game appearances, a 169-52 (.765) overall record, the 2023 NCAA national championship game, has been named the national coach of the year, and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

BIG NOTES

- With its win at Air Force, San Diego State improved to 58-34 (.637) in Mountain West road games since the start of the 2013-14 season (when the current configuration of the league started), the best winning percentage in the league (No. 2 is Boise State at .516).
- San Diego State stands at 148-142 in Mountain West road games since the start of the conference and remains the only program in league history with a winning road record in conference play.
- With its win against Utah State, San Diego State improved to 26-3 in its last 29 games immediately following a loss and wins its 33rd consecutive game when a loss is immediately followed by a home game.
- San Diego State committed just two turnovers against Wyoming. The two turnovers are the fewest in program history, the fewest in Viejas Arena history, equaled the second fewest in Mountain West history (all games including league games) and is tied for the second fewest in a Division I game this season.
- Jaedon LeDee now has three career games with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, which is tied with Jamaal Franklin for the most by an Aztec since the 2005-06 season. The complete list of Aztecs with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals in a game since 2005-06: Jaedon LeDee - 3, Jamaal Franklin - 3, Kawhi Leonard - 1, Jalen McDaniels - 1, Chase Tapley - 1, Billy White - 1.
- Jaedon LeDee is the fifth player in the country this year with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, while attempting nine or less field goals (vs. Nevada).
- Senior guard **Darrion Trammell** passed 1,500-career points at New Mexico and is one of two active players who stand 5-11 or less to have reached the milestone (also: California's Jalen Cone).
- Forward **Jaedon LeDee** recorded his second game of at least 30 points and at least 10 rebounds of the season (also: vs. Washington - 11/19/23) at San Jose State and is one of two players in the country who have accomplished the feat twice this season (also: Kansas' Hunter Dickinson).
- At San Jose State, **Jaedon LeDee** had San Diego State's eighth game of at least 30 points and at least 10 rebounds since the start of the 1996-97 campaign. LeDee and Jamaal Franklin have done it twice (Franklin did it on 2/25/12 vs. Colorado State and on 3/3/12 vs. TCU).
- San Diego State's 27-point win against Fresno State was its largest margin of victory of the season against a Division I opponent and largest since a 34-point triumph over Kennesaw State on Dec. 12, 2022 (W, 88-54).
- The Aztecs are 50-5 (.909) in their last 55 Mountain West home games and 28-2 (.933) in their last 30 MW home contests.
- The Aztecs snapped Gonzaga's 59-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents (last loss was a 71-66 setback against UCLA on Dec. 12, 2015). SDSU handed Gonzaga its second home loss in its last 92 games (90-2) (since Jan. 27, 2018).
- The Aztecs handed Gonzaga their largest home loss since an 11-point setback on Dec. 8, 2012 vs. No. 13 Illinois.
- Gonzaga had gone 173 straight home games without losing by 10 or more points prior to the Aztecs 84-74 win, which was the second-longest active streak in the country since at least the 1996-97 season.
- San Diego State is 12-9 (.571) under Brian Dutcher against AP Top-25 teams. The Aztecs were 29-98 (.228) against AP Top-25 teams prior to Dutcher taking over as head coach in 2017-18.
- San Diego State has won 65 of its 70 home games (65-5) since the start of the 2019-20 season, and its five home losses are tied for the third fewest in the nation in that time frame.
- The 14-point victory over Stanford is the Aztecs largest over a Pac-12 opponent since beating No. 20 UCLA by 15 points (73-58) on Nov. 5, 2020.
- San Diego State committed just seven turnovers in the game against Stanford. In its three games against Pac-12 opponents this season, SDSU had only 20 turnovers (6.7 per game) while its three Pac-12 opponents had 43 (14.3 per game).
- Michah Parrish** (15 points, 10 rebounds) and **Jaedon LeDee** (13 points, 10 rebounds) finished the UC San Diego game with double doubles. It marked the 54 time since 1979 that two Aztecs had a double double in the same game and first since Winston Shepard (20 points, 10 rebounds) and Malik Pope (10 points, 12 rebounds) did it against Washington on March 21, 2016, in the second round of the 2016 NIT.
- Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase MVP; scored a career-high 24 points and grabbed a career-best seven rebounds while also going 10-of-10 from the charity stripe vs. California.
- Against Washington, **Jaedon LeDee** became the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent.
- Following the Washington game, **Jaedon LeDee** was the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 enroute to the Wooden Award.
- Jaedon LeDee** was named the Tournament MVP and along with **Michah Parrish** were selected for the all-tournament team at the Continental Tire Main Event.

TOP GUNS AT AIR FORCE

At Air Force, San Diego State had its sharp shooters out in the first half and they were on target.

- The Aztecs were an eye popping 14-of-20 (70.0 percent) from the field in the first 20 minutes. It was the second time in the Mountain West era that SDSU shot it at an at least 70.0 percent clip in a first half (also: 70.4 percent on Jan. 22, 2021 at Air Force)
- Overall, since the start of the 1999-00 campaign, San Diego State has shot at least 70 percent from the field in a half on four occasions, the previously mentioned two times and twice in the second half of a game; 70.8 percent vs. UNLV on Jan. 26, 2019 and 77.8 percent at Fresno State on Feb. 20, 2021.
- SDSU was even better from the bonus distance, knocking down 8-of-11 triples (72.7 percent) in the first half. Was the third time versus a Division I opponent the Aztecs have hit at least 72.7 percent from beyond the arc since the start of the 1999-00 season. (also: 75.0 percent at Nevada on March 9, 2019 and 72.7 percent vs. Wyoming on Jan. 28, 2021)

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

San Diego State will play three neutral site and 13 true road games during the 2023-24 regular season and here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 105-64 (.621) record in road games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 67-32 (.677) record in neutral site games (min. 95 games) is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, in a minimum of 250 games, San Diego State's 172-96 (.644) record in road/neutral games is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 75-48 (.610) record in road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.

HOW WE WIN

For San Diego State, defense is the calling card. Following the games of Feb. 6, SDSU is rated No. 20 in KenPom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency.

- San Diego State has won 109 of its last 118 games (108-9; 92.4 percent) when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- San Diego State is 92-6 (93.9 percent) the last 98 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 201 of its last 230 games (201-29; 87.4 percent) when it limits its opponent to 30.0 percent or less from 3-point range.
- In its last 423 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 337 times (337-86; 79.7 percent).
- San Diego State is 70-11 (86.4 percent) in its last 81 games in which it had blocked at least three shots.
- San Diego State has won 32 of its last 36 games (32-4; 88.9 percent) when it limits its opponent to five or fewer offensive rebounds.
- San Diego State is 71-18 (79.8 percent) in its last 89 games in which it has at least five steals.
- San Diego State is 36-5 (87.8 percent) when **Lamont Butler** has multiple steals in a game.
- San Diego State is 21-4 (84.0 percent) when **Jaedon LeDee** has at least five defensive rebounds.

CLOSING OUT OPPONENTS

San Diego State is one of the elite teams when it comes to closing out opponents and chalking up the wins.

- SDSU is 16-0 this year, 152-10 under Brian Dutcher and 405-14 in its last 419 games in which it has a lead with five minutes to play.
- **The Aztecs are 13-1 in their last 14 games that have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.**
- Since Brian Dutcher took control of the program (since the start of the 2017-18 season), San Diego State has won 23-of-36 games (23-13) which have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.

- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** has earned inclusion on Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's 2024 Karl Malone Award Top-10 and the John R. Wooden Award Late Season Top 20.
- LeDee is one of the top 10 candidates for the Karl Malone Award, an annual honor, in its 10th year, which recognizes the top power forward in Division I men's college basketball.
- The John R. Wooden Award, presented by Principal and announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club, is chosen by a poll of national college basketball experts based on their performances during the 2023-24 season thus far, the list comprises of 20 student-athletes who are front-runners for the sport's most prestigious honor.
- A list of all the honors Aztecs have garnered are listed in the column on page 8.

10-PLUS POINT HALFTIME LEAD UNDER BRIAN DUTCHER...LOCK IT IN

- Under Brian Dutcher's leadership, since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Aztecs have played 221 games and in 75 of them, SDSU has taken a 10-plus point lead into halftime.
- The Aztecs have a 96.0 percent winning percentage (72-3) when they lead by double digits at the intermission.
- **SDSU has taken a 10-point or greater lead into the break in Mountain West games 45 times and has closed out its opponent 42 times (42-3; 93.3 percent)**
- In games at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena when San Diego State takes at least a 10-point advantage into the break in the Dutcher era, the team is 49-0.

RESUME BUILDING

If there is anything that represents a good loss, then the Aztecs have got five of them.

- San Diego State has lost five times this year and each of the losses have come on the road and against Quad 1 opponents.
- The Aztecs losses are at Brigham Young (65-74, Nov. 10), Grand Canyon (73-79 on Dec. 5), at New Mexico (70-88 on Jan. 13), at Boise State (66-67 on Jan. 20) & at Colorado State (71-79 on Jan. 30).
- Among teams in the top 20 of the NET, through the games of Feb. 6, that have played at least eight Quad 1 games, San Diego State's five losses are the fourth fewest behind Purdue & Connecticut with two Quad 1 losses, Houston, Kansas, Baylor, North Carolina & Arizona with three Quad 1 losses & Tennessee, Marquette & Wisconsin with four Quad 1 losses.
- Among the teams in the top 20 of the NET, San Diego State is one of five teams which has not lost a Quad 2, 3, 4 or non-DI game (also: Houston, Purdue, Dayton & Connecticut).

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

Here is a brief look at the Aztecs non-conference slate:

- San Diego State finished the non-conference schedule with a 6-0 home record and owns a 98-10 mark in non-conference home games since the start of the 2002-10 season.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, San Diego State is 27-1 in non-conference home games and, including this season, has not lost a non-conference home contest in four of the last five seasons. It's lone non-conference home loss since the start of the 2019-20 was a 62-72 defeat at the hands of Brigham Young on Dec. 18, 2020.
- San Diego State finished the non-conference slate 4-2 in Quad 1 & Quad 2 games, with both its losses coming in Quad 1 road games (at Brigham Young and Grand Canyon) and a Quad 1 win at Gonzaga.**
- The Aztecs went 3-0 in neutral site games and won the 2023 Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas after defeating Saint Mary's 79-54 and Washington 100-97. They then played California in the SoCal Showcase in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., and beat the Golden Bears 76-67 to win that event.
- Three of San Diego State's four true road games were Quad 1 games and SDSU went 2-2 on the road in those games including 1-2 in Quad 1 contests.
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee**, following the Continental Tire Main Event, was named Mountain West Player of the Week, NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week, Lute Olson Award National Player of the Week, ESPN National Player of the Week, Oscar Robertson Award National Player of the Week, and Continental Tire Main Event Most Valuable Player.
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase Most Valuable Player.

TRAMMELL PLAYS BEAT THE CLOCK...AND WINS

If the Aztecs need a bucket in the last seconds of the first half Darrion Trammell is the man they call on. The senior guard has made five shots in the last three seconds of the first half, the first three of which came in three successive games.

- Three of Trammell's last second shots broke a tie and sent the Aztecs into the intermission with a lead while the other two increased an Aztec lead.**
- Versus Washington (Nov. 19) Trammell splashed a 3-pointer with two seconds on the clock to send the Aztec to a 43-40 lead at the break and SDSU went on to win the game and the Continental Tire Main Event with a 100-97 victory in overtime
- Versus California (Nov. 25) Trammell sank a jumper in the paint with three seconds on the clock to push the Aztecs advantage to 39-34 en route to a 76-67 overtime win in the SoCal Showcase.
- Against Point Loma Nazarene (Nov. 27) Trammell nailed a driving layup, was fouled and completed the old school 3-point play with no time left on the clock to give the Aztecs a 41-26 lead on the way to a 71-51 decision.
- Against Stanford (Dec. 21) Trammell drove into the paint and hit a jumper, with no time on the clock, to send San Diego State to the locker room with a 34-32 advantage. SDSU would go on to win the game 74-60.
- Against Wyoming (Jan. 23), Trammell hit a fall-away in the lane with three seconds to play in the half to give the Aztecs a 34-32 lead at the break, en route to an 81-65 victory.

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEVADA

- This is the 34th meeting between the schools with San Diego State winning 26 of the previous 33 (26-7) encounters.
- San Diego State has won 13 of its last 15 games (13-2) against Nevada, regardless of location.
- In games played in Reno, the Aztecs are 5-4 vs. the Wolf Pack since they joined the league in the 2012-13 season.**
- Overall, in games played at the Wolf Pack's home floor, the Aztecs lead Nevada 7-6, but SDSU has been victorious just three in its last seven in the "Biggest Little City In America."
- After Nevada joined the league in time for the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs won the first seven games by an average of 12.9 points.
- The Wolf Pack defeated SDSU for the first time as a member of the Mountain West on Jan. 4, 2017.
- In the history of the series, San Diego State won five of the first six meetings, dropped two of the next three get-togethers, won seven straight and then split the season series in 2016-17. SDSU has won 10 of the 12 encounters between the teams over the past four seasons.
- The Aztecs are 4-0 against the Wolf Pack in the Mountain West Tournament, each time in the semifinal game. Most recently they faced off in 2018, 2019 & 2021 and SDSU beat Nevada by scores of 90-73, 65-56 and 77-70, respectively. The Wolf Pack were the No. 1 seed in both 2018 & 2019 and ranked No. 22 in 2018 and No. 14 in the country in 2019. The third meeting came in 2016 and ended in a 67-55 victory for the Aztecs.

LAST TIME VS. NEVADA

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State topped Nevada 71-59 on Wednesday night to move to a perfect 12-0 against the Wolf Pack in Viejas Arena during the Mountain West era.

The Aztecs (15-3, 4-1 Mountain West) dominated the glass, outrebounding the Wolf Pack (15-3, 2-2 MW) 44-25 including a 20-7 advantage on the offensive end. San Diego State also owned a 15-2 advantage in fast break points and made 22 free throws compared to

Nevada's seven from the stripe.

The game started with a Nevada score on the first possession of the night, but the Aztecs responded with 10 unanswered points to take control early. They would have a hot hand for the entirety of the first half, shooting 52.0% (13-of-25) from the field while holding the Wolf Pack to 37.5% (9-of-24) including 0-of-10 from beyond the arc. It led to a 14-point SDSU advantage heading into halftime.

However, Nevada came out of the break red hot, hitting 10 of their first 13 shots in the second half to tie the game with 11 minutes remaining.

In need of a momentum change, Lamont Butler managed a strip steal and fastbreak the other direction for a layup to end the SDSU scoring drought immediately followed by a Reese Waters three-pointer from to force a Nevada timeout.

The Wolf Pack came out of their personal timeout and scored five straight points of their own to even the score once again. After the under-eight media timeout, Jaedon LeDee took over with a 6-0 scoring run by himself to put the Aztecs back in front for good.

San Diego State wrapped up the night on a 18-6 scoring run to polish off their 71-59 triumph for their fourth win in Mountain West play.

LeDee recorded his ninth double-double of the year, leading the game with 22 points and 12 rebounds. It is his sixth game this season with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds.

Waters and Jay Pal nearly recorded double-doubles of their own in the win. Waters finished the night with 14 points and seven rebounds while Pal had eight points and 10 rebounds.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 436-315 (.581) overall against current members of the Mountain West Conference. (H: 253-91, A: 144-203, N: 39-21)
- San Diego State is 99-98 all-time in road contests against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 99 victories, 49 have come by 10 or more points.
- The Aztecs are 157-44 (.781) all-time at home against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 157 victories, 96 have come by 10 or more points.
- SDSU has won 28 of its last 30 (28-2; 93.3 percent) league games at Steve Fisher Court and has outscored its opponents by 16.5 points per game in those contests.
- Historically in league contests, against all members of the Mountain West, San Diego State has a 256-142 (.643) record.

SEEING DOUBLES

Through its first 23 games, three Aztecs have combined to record 11 double doubles.

- San Diego State's 11 double doubles in 2023-24 are the most in a season since the 2018-19 squad totaled 13.
- If SDSU maintains its current pace of a double double every 0.5 games, it will finish the regular season with 16, tied for seventh most since the start of the 1975-76 season.
- The Aztecs' record for double doubles in a season since the start of 1975-76 is 36 in 2010-11, followed by 30 in 1983-84 and 1975-76.
- The most players in a single season to achieve a double double since the start of the 1975-76 campaign is seven in the 1976-77 season.
- Senior forward Jaedon LeDee leads the team with nine double doubles in 22 appearances, Reese Waters and Micah Parrish have one each.
- The last Aztec to record 10 or more double doubles in a season was Jalen McDaniels in the 2018-19 campaign when he accomplished it 11 times.
- The record for consecutive games with a double double in a single season, since the start of 1975-76, is eight by Michael Cage in 1983-84... and he did it twice that year.
- The most consecutive double doubles for the program are Michael Cage's nine, which covered the final game of 1982-83 and the first eight of 1983-84.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE PARTY GOING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for now 25 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 555 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 17 postseason tournaments, including 12 NCAA appearances, a three of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 20223) and last season past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and 2023 national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his six years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 151 wins in his first six seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first six campaigns.
- His 169 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- His .765-career winning percentage is the fifth best in the nation since the start of the 2017-18 season.
- At the start of the 2023-24, in a minimum of 100 games coached, Brian Dutcher ranked No. 4 among winningest head coaches nationally with a .763 winning percentage.
- Dutcher is the No. 24-ranked head coach in the nation according to *CBSSport.com* top-25 and 1 coaches' rating.

TO 1,000-CAREER POINTS AND BEYOND

At New Mexico, senior guard **Darrion Trammell**, who finished the game 12 points, eclipsed the 1,500-career point milestone and enters the Nevada game with 1,549-career points.

- Trammell is one of two active players, who stand 5-11 or less, that has scored at least 1,500 points since the start of the 2020-21 season (also: California's Jalen Cone).
- When the Aztecs played at Grand Canyon on Dec. 5, senior wing **Micah Parrish** started the game with 996-career points, scored 10 in the game to pass the 1,000-point milestone and enters the Nevada matchup with 1,144-career points.
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** entered the Colorado State game with 998-career points, got to 1,000 on his first shot, finished the game with 13 points and enters the Nevada game with 1,041 career points.
- Parrish and LeDee are the fifth and sixth players, respectively, to reach 1,000-career points while wearing an Aztec kit, since the start of the 2019-20 season. (also: Malachi Flynn & Matt Mitchell in 2019-20, Jordan Schakel in 2020-21 and Matt Bradley in 2022-23). Note: Flynn scored 564 of his 1,355-career points while at SDSU, Bradley, who scored 2,322-career points, had 1,033 at San Diego State and 1,289 at California, Parrish has scored 527 in Scarlet and Black & 617 at Oakland, and LeDee totaled 292 points in 79 games at Ohio State and TCU and 749 in the 61 games he has competed in for SDSU.
- Senior guard **Lamont Butler** comes into the game against the Wolf Pack with 881-career points and would need to average 13.2 points per game in the remaining 19 games guaranteed to the Aztecs (31 regular season games & its first game in the 2024 Mountain West

USAFA, Colo. - Reese Waters scored 15 points, making five of San Diego State's season-high 11 3-pointers, and the 24th-ranked Aztecs cruised to a 77-64 win over Air Force on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (18-5, 7-3 Mountain West) took 5 1/2 minutes to settle in and grab their first lead, but once they did they never looked back. They broke open the game with a 13-0 first-half run and eventually led by 25 in winning their ninth straight over the Falcons (8-14, 1-9).

San Diego State moved into a four-way tie for first place in the conference standings, joining No. 25 New Mexico, No. 22 Utah State and Boise State.

The physical presence of Jaedon LeDee down low proved too much for Air Force to handle as he finished with 14 points and nine rebounds. San Diego State played hounding defense, too, and forced 14 turnovers - including three shot-clock infractions.

Beau Becker and Jeffrey Mills both had 15 points to lead Air Force. Two of the Falcons' top scorers, Rytis Petraitis and Ethan Taylor, were held to a combined 10 points. Petraitis got into foul trouble trying to help contain LeDee.

Micah Parrish added 14 points and Lamont Butler tacked on 11 for the Aztecs. Waters' five 3-pointers were a career-high and the most by an Aztec since the first game of the season on November 6.

San Diego State was dominant in the first half, leading 45-20 at the break. It was the second time since 1996-97 that the Aztecs led a Division One team on the road by that much at halftime. To build that lead, SDSU shot 70.0% from the field, 72.7% from beyond the arc and 75.0% from the free throw line while Air Force turned the ball over 11 times.

"It's an academy team, they're not going to give in," said Head Coach Brian Dutcher on the second half. "They hit a rhythm with what they were doing, and they shot 58% in the second half. They played a great second half. That's why I'm so happy we created the margin we did at halftime. We maintained it for much of the second half, then they went on a run at the end of the game, but it's a hard place to play. I'm excited to get out of here with a win and to be back in first place in the Mountain West tonight."

The Aztecs outshot the Falcons from the field (51.0%-45.7%) and from the free throw line (72.7%-57.1%) while both teams made half of their three point attempts. San Diego State had more rebounds (29-25) and fewer turnovers (9-14).

HOME FLOOR DOMINANCE IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- The 10 teams in the Mountain West had a combined home court record of 97-27 (.782) when it entered the games of Feb. 6.
- In a rare instance, the road teams won the majority of games on Feb. 6 (4-of-5).
- In conference home games, two teams have yet to suffer a loss: San Diego State and Colorado State each at 5-0.
- In all games, Eight of the 10 programs have a .500 or better mark on its home floor, with Air Force (4-8) and San Jose State (5-6) the lone teams with losing records.
- Colorado State (12 wins), San Diego State (11), Nevada (11) and New Mexico (11) have won the most games on their home floor this season.
- San Diego State (11-0) is the only Mountain West program that hasn't lost on its home floor in 2023-24.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the sixth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 210-25 home record, winning 89.4 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2023-24 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 246 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 220-26 mark (89.4 percent), including a 114-12 record (90.5 percent) in its last 126 home games against non-conference competition.
- **Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 150-30 (83.3 percent) home record against conference opponents.**
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 165-21 (88.7 percent) at home, including a 73-9 (89.0 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 71-7 (91.0 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 82-11 (88.2 percent) in their last 93 conference home games and 79-9 (89.8 percent) in their last 88 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 70 home games, San Diego State is 65-5 (.929), with an average scoring margin of +16.9 points in those victories. In 51 of those 65 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 19-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 9, 2021, against UC Riverside, and is the second-longest in school history, trailing a 27-game win streak from Nov. 22, 2008 to Nov. 30, 2011.
- **The Aztecs are 52-5 (91.2 percent) in their 57 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.**
- **San Diego State is 76-6 (92.7 percent) in its last 82 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.**

San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home enroute to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on nine occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22 and 2022-23).

LEDEE GARNERS INCLUSION ON MID-SEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Senior forward Jaedon LeDee received national recognition when both the Lute Olson and John R. Wooden Awards released their mid-season watch lists and LeDee earned inclusion on both.

A senior out of Houston, LeDee is the nation's fifth leading scorer, averaging 22.0 points per game, and ranks in the top-20 nationally in six additional statistical categories, including No. 9 in free throw attempts (128), No. 12 in points (330), free throws (94) and double doubles (8). In addition, he is No. 17 in field goals (113), and No. 19 in offensive rebounds per game (3.60).

LeDee has scored in double figures in each of his 15 appearances this season, reached 20 points in 10 of those contests, and totaled 30-plus points twice. He is one of two players in the nation who have multiple 30-plus point, 10-plus rebound games (also: Kansas' Hunter Dickinson).

- One of four players in Division I who totaled at least 539 points, dished out at least 157 assists and had a 1.73:1 assist-to-turnover ratio and if you add his 5-10 height to the mix, he is the only player to accomplish those statistics in 2021-22.

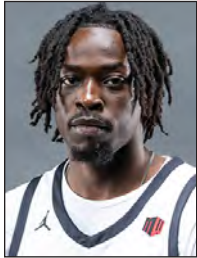
