AZTECS OPEN SECOND SEASON UNDER BRADY HOKE AT THE Q SATURDAY VS. NICHOLLS ST.

San Diego State opens its 88th season of intercollegiate football, its 42nd at the Division I level and second under head coach Brady Hoke on Saturday against Nicholls State. Kickoff is set for 5:05 p.m. The contest is the first regular-season football game played at Qualcomm Stadium this season, as the Chargers home opener against Jacksonville is on Sept. 19 (15 days after SDSU's home opener).

Season tickets, three-game mini-plans and individual game tickets remain on sale for San Diego State's entire 2010 schedule. Single-game tickets for the Nicholls State contest start at just \$5 and are available at SDSU's Qualcomm Stadium ticket office and online at GoAztecs.com.

Following Saturday's opener, San Diego State will hit the road for consecutive games, playing at New Mexico State (Sept. 11) and at Missouri (Sept. 18). In fact, between the opener (Sept. 4) and the Homecoming contest against Air Force on Oct. 16, the Aztecs will play just one home game in a 41-day period with that being the Sept. 25 game against Utah State, which also serves as the annual KGB SkyShow game.

► The Aztecs begin their second season under the direction of 2008 National Coach of the Year finalist Brady Hoke. SDSU jumped out to a 4-4 start a year ago before dropping four consecutive games to end the season. In two of those four losses, the Aztecs were unable to hold on to double-digit fourth quarter advantages.

► San Diego State returns 18 starters off last season's squad, the second most in the Mountain West Conference (TCU - 19). The Aztecs placed three student-athletes on the media's pre-season all-conference team, which consisted of 26 individuals. Senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, senior tight end Alston Umuolo and junior punter Brian Stahovich all earned pre-season all-league accolades. Brown (Biletnikoff), Umuolo (Mackey) and center Trask Iosefa (Rimington) also earned spots on national award watch lists at their positions.

► The Aztecs, who were picked by a majority of the media to finish fifth or sixth in the league and were slated by one major publication to qualify for a bowl game in 2010, were selected sixth in the media's MWC preseason poll.

► Over the offseason, Brady Hoke retained every full-time assistant coach, including defensive coordinator Rocky Long, offensive coordinator Al Borges and strength and conditioning coach Aaron Wellman. This marks the first time since 2004 that San Diego State has entered the season with every assistant coach from the previous campaign.

► In Brady Hoke's first season, San Diego State doubled its win total from the 2008 campaign from two to four. That may not sound like much, but of the 22 Division I-A coaches in their first season at their school in 2009, Hoke joins Washington's Steve Sarkisian and Iowa State's Paul Rhodes as the only three to accomplish that.



Last week, San Diego State senior center Trask Iosefa was named to the Rimington Award Watch List for the second consecutive season.

Aztecs Now Online, a weekly show featuring San Diego State athletics, is set to premiere on Monday, Aug. 30. The show will be posted every Monday night during the season exclusively on GoAztecs.com.

Hosted by Mike Costa, the sideline reporter for SDSU football broadcasts, Aztecs Now Online will highlight head coach Brady Hoke, a football student-athlete and an Aztec Olympic sport.

Each episode will include a review of the previous week's game and a preview of the upcoming contest as well as an Olympic sport feature, which gives fans an in-depth look at one of SDSU's other 17 sports on campus.

TEAM QUICK NOTES

- ▶ San Diego State is looking to win its season-opening game for the first time since 2004. The Aztecs have lost five straight lidlifters and are just 2-8 in their last 10 openers.
- ▶ San Diego State is 4-1 in its last five home games against unranked opponents, including 3-1 in that situation under Brady Hoke.
- ▶ San Diego State owns a 3-0 record on games played on Sept. 4, winning the three games by a combined score of 113-50. The last time SDSU won its season opener was Sept. 4, 2004 (six years ago gameday).
- ▶ San Diego State currently has six freshmen - five redshirt and one true - on the top two lines of the offensive depth chart. Of note is true freshman running back Ronnie Hillman, who is currently slated to start at that position.

STUDENT-ATHLETE QUICK NOTES

- ▶ Senior wide receiver **Vincent Brown** has caught 100 or more yards receiving in six of the last seven games in which he has finished (was held without a reception at Colorado State on Oct. 24, 2009, with a broken thumb which forced him to miss the remainder of the season). Prior to the injury, in his first six games of the 2009 campaign, Brown caught 45 passes for 758 yards and six touchdowns. He has seven 100-yard receiving games in his career to rank 13th in school history. One more 100-yard game will move him into a tie for 10th with Dennis Arey, Kassim Osgood and Webster Slaughter. Brown begins his senior campaign ranked 10th on the school's reception list (140) and 12th on the touchdowns reception chart (13).
- ▶ Junior quarterback **Ryan Lindley** enters the 2010 season in a tie for sixth place on the school's all-time career passing yardage chart with 5,707. Who is he tied with? None other than San Diego State All-American, NFL Most Valuable Player and current Aztec quarterback coach Brian Sipe. With 292 yards passing, Lindley can move past David Lowery for sixth place on the yardage chart. Lindley is slated to start his 24th game on Saturday, matching the total of Lowery. During the Division I era, only three signal-callers have started more games (Todd Santos 45, Kevin O'Connell 33 and Billy Blanton 28).
- ▶ Senior center **Trask Iosefa** is scheduled to make his 37th consecutive start on Saturday. A nominee for the Rimington Award for the nation's top center, Iosefa has started every game since the 2007 season.
- ▶ Senior running back **Brandon Sullivan** begins his final campaign with 1,027 career rushing yards. He needs just 74 more yards to enter SDSU's career rushing chart (top 31 players included). During the off-season, he made the position change to fullback, although he is still expected to log carries.
- ▶ Senior wide receiver **Doug Deakin** was one of three players to be named team captain in a vote amongst the players on Sunday. Deakin, who played in 11 games last season, all on special teams, was an assistant video coordinator during the 2006 season. He was a defensive scout team member, before making the change to the offensive side of the ball in 2007.
- ▶ Senior Aztec back **Andrew Preston** opens the 2010 campaign with 200 career tackles. He needs 79 more, to enter the school top-10 list. The last time an Aztec player cracked that top 10 chart was when former linebacker and current Jacksonville Jaguar Russell Allen ended his career with 375 stops.

SAN DIEGO STATE-NICHOLLS ST.: THE SERIES

- ▶ This will mark the first meeting between the Aztecs and the Colonels. It marks the only opponent on San Diego State's 2010 schedule that the Aztecs have not previously competed against.
- ▶ Nicholls State is located in Thibodaux, La., and has an enrollment of 7,181 students. The school competes in the Southland Conference and its school colors are red and gray.
- ▶ The Aztecs have never faced any of the eight current members of the Southland Conference in football. In case you're curious, the Southland's football membership includes: Central Arkansas, McNeese State, Nicholls State, Northwestern State, Sam Houston State, Southeastern Louisiana, Stephen F. Austin and Texas State. Last season, Stephen F. Austin and McNeese State finished tied atop the SLC standings with a 6-1 league mark.
- ▶ Although the Colonels are coming off a 3-8 campaign in 2009, they have posted a .500 or better record in three of the last six seasons.

SAN DIEGO STATE-NICHOLLS ST.: CONNECTIONS

- ▶ There are not a whole lot of connections between these two schools that are separated by a 1,778-mile drive. San Diego State does not have a student-athlete on the current roster from the state of Louisiana.
- ▶ The Colonels do have three players from the state of California. All three are junior college transfers and two are currently on the depth chart.
- ▶ Nicholls State senior corner back Jeremy Garrett, a projected starter, is from Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. (Altaloma High/Citrus College). That is the same hometown, although a different high school than that of San Diego State senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, who went to Rancho Cucamonga High School, graduating in 2007.
- ▶ NSU backup free safety is junior Shawn Elrod. Elrod is from La Quinta, Calif., and attended La Quinta High prior to going to College of the Desert. Elrod has the same hometown and high school as SDSU's true freshman offensive lineman Dontrell Onuahu.
- ▶ The Colonel's third player from the Golden State is senior defensive back Letroy Trahan of Rialto, Calif. Trahan attended Carter High, before starting his collegiate career at San Bernardino Valley College and Arkansas State. Aztecs' senior defensive back Dey Juan Hemmings attended Rialto High, but considers San Bernardino home.
- ▶ Several members of the Nicholls State coaching staff are graduates of Brigham Young University, including head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterback coach Charlie Stubbs, offensive line coach Keith Uperesa and wide receiver coach Justin Anderson.
- ▶ Although no members of the current San Diego State roster call Louisiana home, the Aztecs have historically had a rich pipeline to the New Orleans area, approximately 60 miles west of Thibodaux. Among the Aztecs players that have called Louisiana home are Lance Louis (TE, class of 2008), Kwan Howard (LB, class of 2006), Michael Franklin (RB, class of 2005), Jasper Harvey (OL, class of 2005), Hubert Caliste (DB, class of 2004) and of course, Marshall Faulk (RB).

AZTECS IN OPENERS

- ▶ San Diego State is 44-38-5 in season-opening games, including a 19-21-1 record in the Division I era. The Aztecs have lost their previous five lidlifters, last claiming a season-opening victory on Sept. 4, 2004 (six years ago game day), when SDSU defeated Idaho State, 38-21.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 60-23-4 in their home opener, but just 4-6 in their last 10 season debuts at Qualcomm Stadium. San Diego State has won two of their last three home openers, including last season's 35-19 win over Southern Utah. The Aztecs have lost their last three season openers played at Qualcomm Stadium.
- ▶ San Diego State will also open the 2011 campaign at Qualcomm Stadium on Sept. 3, against Cal Poly. Coupled with this season's opener coming at home, it will mark the first time the Aztecs have opened consecutive campaigns at home since 2005 and 2006. In 2012, SDSU is scheduled to start the season on Sept. 1, at Cincinnati.
- ▶ Brady Hoke is 3-4 in seven career season-openers, including 3-2 when his squad opens the season at home.

- ▶ San Diego State is an amazing 60-23-4 in home openers and owns a 71.3 winning percentage. In the Division I era, the Aztecs are 30-10-1 (74.4 percent) in their first home game of the season.
- ▶ After claiming a 35-19 victory over Southern Utah in the home opener last season, the Aztecs will try and win their home opener in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2003 and 2004.
- ▶ San Diego State won its home debut in 17 consecutive seasons, from 1963 through 1979. That covers the final 10 seasons of the Don Coryell era and the first seven campaigns of Claude Gilbert's tenure.

THREE AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

San Diego State placed three student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2010. Senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, senior center Trask Iosefa and senior tight end Alston Umuolo are on the initial short list for their positions' top honor.

Vincent Brown (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) is one of 51 candidates for the 2010 Biletnikoff Award, which is given annually to the nation's most outstanding college football wide receiver. Brown was one of 10 semifinalists for the same honor a year ago and is the first Aztec to be nominated for the award twice in his career. The 6-0 wideout enters the upcoming season with 140 career catches for 1,758 yards and 13 touchdowns. In 2009, he had 45 receptions for 778 yards and six touchdowns before suffering a season-ending injury against Colorado State. Despite only playing seven outings, he was still tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Trask Iosefa (Ewa Beach, Hawaii) is one of just 37 players to be named to the 2010 Fall Watch List for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to the nation's best center. Iosefa enters the 2010 campaign having made 36 consecutive starts, the most on the team. The three-year starter has played in every game since the beginning of the 2008 season. He was also on the Rimington Trophy watch list in 2009.

Alston Umuolo (Phoenix, Ariz.) is one of 32 candidates on the 2010 John Mackey Award Watch List, presented annually to the nation's top tight end. Umuolo, who earned a position on the preseason all-Mountain West Conference team as selected by the media at last month's media day, has established himself as one of the premier tight ends in the nation. Last season, he caught a career-high 22 passes for 243 yards and three touchdowns. In 33 career games, the senior has 42 receptions for 420 yards.

THREE AZTECS NAMED TO PRESEASON MWC TEAM

San Diego State football has been tabbed for a sixth-place finish and senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, senior tight end Alston Umuolo and junior punter Brian Stahovich have all been named to the preseason all-Mountain West Conference team, according to the annual preseason media survey conducted by the league office. The 26-member all-conference squad and predicted league finish were released July 27 at the MWC's annual media day in Las Vegas.

The sixth-place ranking in the preseason poll is the highest for an Aztec team since also being selected sixth prior to the 2006 campaign. San Diego State has finished at or higher than its projected preseason ranking in four of the last five seasons.

With three members on the all-conference team, San Diego State equaled its combined representation in the previous four seasons (2006-09) and placed multiple individuals on the squad for the first time since four Aztecs - Lynell Hamilton, Mike Kracalik, Matt McCoy and Kirk Morrison - earned spots on the

Brown was one of the top receivers in the country last season before suffering a season-ending thumb injury. Nonetheless, he earned second-team all-conference honors and enters his final year with 140 receptions, 1,758 receiving yards and 13 touchdowns receiving. Brown is on the preseason all-conference list for the second consecutive season, the first SDSU player to do so since current New Orleans Saints running back Lynnell Hamilton was tabbed in 2004 and 2005.

Despite playing his home games at sea level, Stahovich was one of the nation's top punters a year ago as a sophomore. In 2009, he averaged 43.8 yards per kick and had 13 of his boots downed inside the 20. He was 13th in the country a year ago in punting average.

With 33 career games played, Umuolo has established himself as one of the premier tight ends on the West coast. Last season, he caught a career-high 22 passes for 243 yards and three touchdowns.

Defending MWC champion TCU, which finished 2009 with an 8-0 conference record (12-1 overall) and a No. 6 national ranking, was picked to win the league and received all 31 first-place votes. The Horned Frogs were followed by Utah (242 points), BYU (207 points), Air Force (195 points) and Wyoming (147 points). Colorado State (7th - 96 pts.), UNLV (8th - 56 pts.) and New Mexico (9th - 45 pts.) rounded out the poll.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GAME ONE

The opener may count the same as all the other games, but over the past 20-plus years, it has been a good indicator of the type of season San Diego State will have.

Beginning with the 1986 Holiday Bowl season (excluding the 1992 season-opening 31-31 tie with USC), the Aztecs have won their season-opening game on 10 occasions. In those seasons, they have gone on to post a 62-54-1 record. That is a winning percentage of 53.4 percent and an average of 6.2 wins per season.

During that same time frame, San Diego State has dropped the lidlifter on 13 occasions, posting a record of 55-97-1, for a 36.3 winning percentage. The Aztecs have averaged 4.2 wins per season and have been unable to finish .500 or better the last eight times they have opened a campaign with an L.

If you are planning to win a conference title, winning the opener is important. In San Diego State's 18 championship seasons, the Aztecs opened with a victory 15 times. In 1962, 1974 and 1998, SDSU overcame a loss in game one to earn a conference championship.

AZTECS NAME CAPTAINS

San Diego State head coach Brady Hoke announced that seniors Doug Deakin, Ernie Lawson and Andrew Preston have been named team captains for the upcoming 2010 season. The three were selected in a vote by their teammates last Sunday.

Deakin, a senior wide receiver from Oak Park, Calif., started his career at San Diego State as a volunteer for the football video staff in 2006. He earned a spot on the roster the following season on the defensive scout team. In 2008, he switched positions to wide receiver and last season saw action in 11 games, mostly on special teams. He earned the 2008 President's Award for Highest Standards of Academic and Athletic Excellence, has been recognized as a SDSU Scholar-Athlete and was a 2009 nominee for the College Football Rudy Awards, honoring the student-athletes who demonstrate excellent character, contribution and commitment as members of their collegiate football teams.

Lawson, a senior defensive end from Vallejo, Calif., has played in 30 career games and made 17 career starts in his three seasons as a member of the Aztecs. He set career highs last season, with 22 tackles, 6 1/2 tackles for loss, two sacks and a fumble recovery. He has 49 career stops and has started 12 consecutive games for San Diego State. This summer, Lawson has moved from defensive tackle to defensive end, and earned preseason all-Mountain West Conference honors by Phil Steele Magazine. Lawson is also a San Diego State scholar-athlete.

Preston, a senior Aztec back from Centennial, Colo., has moved from an outside linebacker position last season to the feature spot in defensive coordinator Rocky Long's defense. Preston has played in 35 games in three seasons, including 29 consecutive contests. He has 200 career stops, the most of any active player. Five times in his career Preston has recorded double-figure tackle totals, including a career-best 18 stops against Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008. Despite the off-season position change, Preston still earned pre-season all-conference accolades by Phil Steele Magazine.

FAULK HONORARY WARRIOR FOR OPENER

Marshall Faulk, a three-time All-American at San Diego State and NFL Most Valuable Player, has been selected by the football team to be the debut Honorary Warrior at the Aztecs' season-opening game on Saturday against Nicholls State. A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, Faulk will plant the Aztec spear near the 50-yard line just prior to the team taking the field.

An Honorary Warrior will be named for every home game this season. The individual, who must be

an alumnus of the University, will be handed the spear from the Aztec Warrior and will throw it into the ground before the 2010 team runs onto the field.

In addition, several other new activities will start this Saturday. Two hours prior to kickoff, the football team will be dropped off in the Qualcomm Stadium parking lot, and walk between the E and F parking lots en route to the stadium, providing fans with a chance to cheer on the Aztecs as they head to the locker room. The Warrior Walk will take place two hours prior to every home game this season and for this week's contest with Nicholls State, will commence at 3 p.m.

Also, prior to the game, San Diego State's new supplemental character will make its debut. The new character, which will work in conjunction with the current spirit squad - cheerleaders, dance team and Aztec Warrior - will make its public debut just prior to the Honorary Warrior presentation and the team taking the field.
