2006 NCAA Tournament Participants

- San Diego State followed an NCAA Tournament appearance with a victory in the season opener the following season for the first time in the Division I era.
- Steve Fisher coached teams are now 13-3 in season-opening games.

- San Diego State has not claimed the title in a regular-season event since winning twice to take the 1987 Holiday Bowl Classic in San Diego.
- The Aztecs have won eight of their last nine (8-1), 18 of their last 21 (18-3) and 20 of their last 24 (20-4) games dating back to last season.
