- ▶The Records: The San Diego State women's basketball team will look to remain perfect and help head coach Beth Burns claim her 250th career win, when the Aztecs play host to Southern Utah Tuesday in their 2007-08 home opener. The two schools will face-off for the fourth time overall and the second straight year in a 7 p.m. match-up at Cox Arena. SDSU, which is 2-0 on the year with a pair of road wins at Nevada and most recently at Saint Mary's, posted a 55-52 victory at Southern Utah a year ago. The Thunderbirds enter Tuesday's contest with a 1-2 mark with a win over Concordia and a pair of losses to Kansas State and Utah Valley.
- ►SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 249-188 in 15 seasons, while she is 168-123 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.
- ► Southern Utah Head Coach Steve Hodson: Hodson, a former prep coach and men's assistant, is in his second year at his alma mater and as a head coach on the women's collegiate level. He has a 10-22 overall record and is 0-1 against the Aztecs.
- ► Southern Utah Series History: San Diego State owns a perfect 4-0 all-time record against Southern Utah, including a 2-0 mark in San Diego. The two schools faced each other last season in Cedar City for the first time. (Last: SDSU def. Southern Utah, 55-52, on Nov. 24, 2006, in Cedar City, Utah).

Burns Seeks Her 250th Career Win As SDSU Plays Host To Southern Utah Tuesday

Off to a 2-0 start for the first time in 15 years, the San Diego State women's basketball team plays host to Southern Utah Tuesday in its 2007-08 home opener at Cox Arena at 7 p.m. Aztec head coach Beth Burns can record her 250th career victory with a win over the Thunderbirds, who enter the game with a 1-2 mark.

SDSU posted a dominating performance in its second consecutive road game last Saturday, defeating Saint Mary's 83-60, for its largest margin victory since 2005. The Aztecs faces their third consecutive opponent who also appeared on last year's schedule, as SDSU beat Southern Utah, 55-52, in Cedar City last November.

SDSU's Overpowers Saint Mary's, 83-60

The San Diego State women's basketball team had five players score in double-figures in a 83-60 victory Saturday over Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. SDSU is now 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 season.

while the Gaels fell to 2-2.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point arc.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.), playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.) had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.) added 10 points off the bench.

SDSU started out the game on an 11-2 run on a layup by Davis with 17:46 remaining in the first half. Saint Mary's made a late run and got to within nine with 3:24 left, but an 11-4 run, capped by a LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.) layup late in the first half, gave the Aztecs the 46-29 lead at the break.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half. as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign.

Saint Mary's was led by Jontelle Smith, who scored 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting, while Louella Tomlinson had 11 points and four blocks.

Other Saint Mary's Notes

All 11 players on the team's active roster saw court time for the Aztecs ... SDSU has had three different players

score 10 or more points in the first half of a game this season. Allison Duffy and Jené Morris had 11 and 10 points, respectively, against Saint Mary's and Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.) had 12 points in the first half at Nevada ... SDSU's plus-14 advantage on the boards is its biggest since Jan. 31, 2004, when the Aztecs owned a plus-15 margin (47-32) in a 51-46 win at home against Air Force ... The Aztecs are 8-1 in their last nine games against non-conference opponents and have a current three-game non-conference road win streak.

With The 'W'

With SDSU's win over Saint Mary's last Saturday:

- ▶SDSU has started its season 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 squad won its opening five games.
- ►SDSU has claimed two road games in the same season for the first time since 2003-04, when it won four outings away from Cox Arena.
- ▶The Aztecs are 2-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 1-1 versus Nevada and Saint Mary's a year ago.
- ►SDSU won for the first time in Moraga, Calif., in three attempts. Aztec head coach Beth Burns is 2-1 alltime against Saint Mary's.

Getting Offensive

San Diego State's offensive performance against Saint Mary's was notable in a number of different categories:

- SDSU's 83 points are its most in a game and the first time breaking the 80-point barrier since beating Utah Valley State, 91-45, on Feb. 10, 2005, a span of 64 outings.
- ▶The 23-point margin of victory is the Aztecs' most since that same Utah Valley State game, as is their 46 first-half points (SDSU had 50 points in the first half vs. UVS).
- ▶SDSU shot 55 percent from the field against the Gaels, the team's highest field-goal percentage since the 2005 Utah Valley State when the Aztecs made 57.1 percent of its shots from the field. It is the first time the Aztecs have shot over 50 percent from the field since Dec. 16, 2005, vs. Portland State (53.1 FG pct.).
- ►SDSU had five players in double-figures in the same game for the first time since also having five vs. Colorado State on Jan. 20, 2007. In just two outings this season, the Aztecs have had six different players score 10 or more points in at least one game.

Steals And Turnovers

Through its first two games, SDSU has forced a combined 66 turnovers and logged 35 steals. The Aztecs

lead the Mountain West Conference in both turnover margin (+6.00) and steals per game (17.5), while the team's 18 steals against Nevada and 17 at Saint Mary's are the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. Individually, Quenese Davis (1st), Jené Morris (2nd) and Shanna Demus (t-5th) are all in the top 10 in the league in steals per game.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times and forced 20 or more turnovers on 11 occasions.

Double Her Pleasure

In just her second game in an Aztec uniform, redshirt freshman forward Allison Duffy recorded her first career double-double with 13 points and a team-high 10 rebounds at Saint Mary's on Saturday. Last season, SDSU had 10 double-doubles by five different players, including two by Quenese Davis and one by Shannon Clay.

Another Block Party?

After leading the Mountain West Conference in blocks per game in both overall and league-only outings in 2006-07, San Diego State looks like it is well on its way to doing the same again this season. In the opening two games, the Aztecs had 11 total blocks by six different players, ranking second in the league.

True freshman Paris Johnson has provided the bulk of the work with six to her credit, including five at Nevada, which tied for eighth in school single-game history.

San Diego State ranked 35th nationally with 4.6 blocks per game a year ago. The team's 129 blocks were the program's most since tallying 159 in 1994-95.

249 And Counting

Two games into her 16th season as a collegiate head coach, Beth Burns needs just one more victory to get to the 250-win milestone for her career. Burns is 249-188 overall in her 11 years at San Diego State and five campaigns at Ohio State. She is already the winningest head coach in Aztec history with 168 of the program's 465 all-time victories.

Aztecs For Home Openers

San Diego State will look to end a two-game losing skid in home openers, when it plays host to Southern Utah. The Aztecs dropped last year's first game in Cox Arena to Nevada, while falling to rival USD in the first home game of 2005-06.

All-time, SDSU is 24-7 in home openers, with its only other losses coming in 1977, 1987, 1989, 1998 and 2003.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Southern Utah will mean:

- ►SDSU is 3-0 to start a year for the first time since 1992-93.
- ▶SDSU breaks a two-game losing streak in home openers and improves to 25-7 all-time.
- ►SDSU stays perfect against Southern Utah with a 5-0 record. The Aztecs are 9-1 in their last 10 games against non-league foes.
- ►The Aztecs are 3-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 2-1 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's and Southern Utah a year ago.
- ► Aztec head coach Beth Burns is 4-0 all-time against Southern Utah. Burns records her 250th career victory as a head coach.

SDSU's fall recruiting class includes three California natives and one signee from the state of Washington. All four are at least 6-1, giving the Aztecs six players who are six-feet or taller in the freshman and sophomore classes alone in 2008-09.

SDSU women's basketball center Paris Johnson was picked as the Mountain West Conference's top freshman for the upcoming season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 17, at the conference's annual media day in Littleton, Colo.

Johnson earned San Diego County player-of-the-year honors her final two seasons as a prep at San Diego High School, averaging 21.4 points and 10.7 rebounds as a senior. She was listed as the No. 42 prospect in the country and the No. 15 ranked forward by HoopGurlz.com and twice garnered second team all-state accolades by CalHiSports.com.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed to finish seventh for the third year in a row in the MWC preseason poll. SDSU, which ended up seventh during the 2006-07 regular season, earned 93 points from the panel. Wyoming was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the first time in MWC history after winning the WNIT championship a year ago, receiving 24 of 30 first-place votes and 203 total points.

Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

Pair Added To Aztec Coaching Staff

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns added a pair to her staff this past summer. Heidi VanDerveer, who has over 20 years of experience on both the collegiate and professional levels, was named associate head coach on Aug. 29. VanDerveer comes to San Diego State from the Seattle Storm, where she recently completed her second season as an assistant coach. Tara Morrison joined the staff as the team's head manager after two seasons as an assistant coach at Binghamton University in New York and four at the University of Maine.

Last Year's Team Milestones

- ▶SDSU finished as the 11th most-improved team in NCAA Division I, going from three to 12 victories in 2006-07.
- The Aztecs posted the biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons in league history, claiming five Mountain West Conference victories after going winless in 2005-06.
- ▶SDSU's 12 wins are the program's most since 2000-01 ... The team's 11 victories at home are the most since 1996-97 ... The five conference victories are the most since 2000-01 ... The Aztecs' six-game win streak is the team's longest since 2000-01 ... Its seven non-conference wins are its most since 2001-01.
- SDSU led the Mountain West Conference in blocks in both overall and conference only contests, ranking 35th nationally.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005. In just two short seasons, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007 and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97. Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three reqular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 249-188, while her mark school record stands at 168-123 over 10 seasons.

RENO, **Nev.** - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris , who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point are

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay added 10 points off the bench.

SDSU started out the game on an 11-2 run on a layup by Davis with 17:46 remaining in the first half. Saint Mary's made a late run and got to within nine with 3:24 left, but an 11-4 run, capped by a LaSandra Dixon layup late in the first half, gave the Aztecs the 46-29 lead at the break.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half, as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign

Saint Mary's was led by Jontelle Smith, who scored 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting, while Louella Tomlinson had 11 points and four blocks
