2012 Season Recap

ANOTHER YEAR TO REMEMBER

San Diego State proved that the past two football seasons weren't a fluke.

The Aztecs turned a late-season seven-game win streak into a share of the Mountain West title and a school-record third straight bowl game appearance.

Below are a few of the notable accomplishments from the 2012 season:

- Finished 7-1 in MW play to tie Boise State and Fresno State for the league title, SDSU's 19th conference championship, first-ever MW title and first league championship since 1998.
- Played in the Poinsettia Bowl, marking the first time in the program's 43-year Division I history that San Diego State played in three consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs are one of only 39 schools in the nation with three straight bowl trips and one of just two in California (Stanford).
- Finished with nine victories, matching the program's most since the 1977 squad went 10-1 as an independent.
- Won seven consecutive games from Oct. 6-Nov. 24, SDSU's longest win streak since a seven-game streak from Nov. 15, 1980-Oct. 10, 1981. The seven straight wins in a single season was their longest streak since the final seven contests of the 1977 campaign.
- Defeated No. 19 (AP) Boise State on Nov. 3 for San Diego State's highest-ranked win in a road or neutral game. The Aztecs entered the game 0-31 in road games at AP Top-25 teams. SDSU defeated its highest-ranked opponent since a win vs. No. 16 Wyoming on Nov. 7, 1996. BSU had entered the game with an NCAA FBS-best 71-1 regular season home record since Sept. 22, 2001.

IN LONG WE TRUST

Head coach Rocky Long continues to leave his legacy on the Mountain West and now San Diego State.

Note the following:

- Is the MW's all-time leader in coaching victories (79).
- Was named the MW Coach of the Year in 2012, 10 years after winning the award while at New Mexico.
- Is tied with Claude Gilbert for the most coaching victories (17) ever through the first two seasons with the Aztecs.
- Owns the third-best coaching record in program history at 17-9 (.654).
- Became the first SDSU coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural campaign and accomplished the feat again in 2012.

MORE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Since the beginning of the 2010 season, San Diego State owns a 26-13 record (.667), which is tied for the 25th-highest winning percentage in the country during that span. In the nine seasons prior to 2010, the Aztecs posted a record of 38-80 (.322), which ranked 106th nationally.
- SDSU drew a Mountain West-best 247,029 fans during the home portion of the 2012 campaign.
- San Diego State has produced nine NFL Draft selections since 2011, including Gavin Escobar (2nd round, No. 47 to Dallas Cowboys), Leon McFadden (3rd round, No. 68 to Cleveland Browns) and Brice Butler (7th round, No. 208 to Oakland Raiders) in April. That is tied for the 30th-highest total nationally and is second among current MW schools (Boise State, 10).

THE RUNNING GAME

- During the 2012 off-season, many questioned if San Diego State would be able to get the same production out of its

ground attack with the departure of All-American Ronnie Hillman to the NFL. That was not a problem. The running back tandem of sophomore Adam Muema and senior Walter Kazee outrushed Hillman and helped the 2012 squad set a team rushing school record. Muema (1,458 yards, 16 touchdowns) and Kazee (822 yards, eight touchdowns) combined for 2,280 yards and 24 touchdowns, compared to Hillman's totals of 1,711 yards and 19 scores in 2011. As a team, the Aztecs rushed for 2,869 yards and 30 touchdowns. The 2,869 yards were 393 more yards than the previous best of 2,476, set in 1991, while the 30 rushing touchdowns were tied for the third most in a season.

OTHER 2012 INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES

- Four-year starting defensive back Leon McFadden ended his SDSU career with a school-record 39 pass breakups and was sixth with 186 interception return yards. He became just the second player in San Diego State history with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a season and only trailed Ricky Parker's career-best three from 1993-96. McFadden, who became the fifth player in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors three consecutive years, played in all 51 games with the Aztecs since arriving as a true

freshman in 2009.

- Offensive guard Nik Embernate and tight end Gavin Escobar joined McFadden on the MW all-conference team. Embernate became the second SDSU offensive lineman to earn first-team all-league honors since 2004 after helping San Diego State set a school record with 2,869 rushing yards. Escobar, meanwhile, made his second straight all-MW first team after being named a second-team pick as a freshman in 2010. A semifinalist for the Mackey Award (nation's top tight end), Escobar led the Aztecs in receptions (42), receiving yards (543) and touchdown receptions (6).
- Making up the second team were Aztec Nat Berhe, linebacker Jake Fely, center Alec Johnson and running back Adam Muema. Berhe led all SDSU players with 94 tackles to go along with five pass breakups, Fely had 90 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss and a team-high seven sacks, Johnson started at center for San Diego State's record rushing year and Muema rushed for 1,458 yards and 16 touchdowns.
- Rounding out the Aztecs' all-league picks were honorable-mention selections linebacker Derek Largent (61 tackles, 9.5 TFL, 6.5 sacks, 3 FR, 2 INT), defensive tackle Sam Meredith (36 tackles, 5.5 TFL) and offensive tackle Bryce Quigley, who converted from a tight end in 2012.

SEATTLE - San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

TEAM NOTES

* SDSU slipped to 46-39-5 in season-opening games, including a 21-22-1 record in the Division I era.

* The Aztecs lost their opening game of the season for the first time since 2009.

* SDSU had multiple turnovers for just the second time over the last nine games. The Aztecs had one turnover total over their final three games last season.

* SDSU extended its streak of scoring a touchdown to 65 consecutive games.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State scored the first 35 points of the game en route to a dominating 42-7 victory over Army in the 2012 home opener for the Aztecs.

SDSU forced three turnovers, scored four rushing touchdowns and a passing score, and added a 96-yard kickoff return for another touchdown in the program's largest margin of victory since the 2010 opener.

San Diego State scored three touchdowns in a span of 2:45 in the third quarter after opening up a 21-0 advantage at the half.

Adam Muema ran for 98 yards and a score in three quarters, while Walter Kazee rushed for 51 yards and two touchdowns. Backup quarterback Adam Dingwell added a 7-yard score for his first career score.

Ezell Ruffin had a career day with his first five receptions and 132 yards. All five of his catches were for first downs.

Ryan Katz threw for 215 yards, including a 8-yard touchdown to Chad Young to account for the Aztecs' other score.

SDSU kept Army off the scoreboard for its first nine possessions before a 10-yard run by Terry Baggett in the third quarter ended its bid for a shutout.

Nat Berhe led the Aztec defense with a career-high 14 tackles, while Josh Gavert and Eric Pinkins each had an interception. Derek Largent recovered his first-ever fumble.

SAN DIEGO – Despite a career-high 202 rushing yards by Adam Muema, San Diego State suffered a heartbreaking 38-34 setback to visiting San Jose State at Qualcomm Stadium. The Aztecs were outscored by 21-10 margin during a furious final quarter that witnessed one tie and four lead changes.

Muema posted a collegiate-best 25 carries, highlighted by an 83-yard touchdown run, to become the 18th player in program history with a 200-yard rushing game.

Walter Kazee added 90 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while Ryan Katz threw for 213 yards and two scores. Gavin Escobar led SDSU with five catches and a touchdown for 46 yards, while Colin Lockett had three receptions for 73 yards, including a 40-yard TD catch with just 2:24 remaining to put San Diego State up, 34-31.

Behind quarterback David Fales, the Spartans rallied with a 5-play, 65-yard drive that culminated with a 14-yard pass to Chandler Jones with just 50 seconds left.

It was the final dagger for the Aztecs, who couldn't mount one final comeback.

Fales finished the game 21-for-31 for 260 yards and four touchdowns to give SJSU its third straight win in the series.

Carr, however, hit Isiah Burse with a 31-yard touchdown pass and, following a 27-yard field goal by Quentin Breshears, tossed a 5-yard TD to Rashad Evans to give the Bulldogs a win in their first-ever Mountain West game.

Ryan Katz passed for 160 yards and two touchdowns for San Diego State and led all rushers with 89 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 67-yard run. It was his 10th-career game with multiple touchdown passes and third-straight game throwing for two or more scores.

Adam Muema rushed for 64 yards and scored two touchdowns, while Brice Butler (8 yards) and D.J. Shields (5 yards) each caught a touchdown pass.

Muema now has a rushing touchdown in six consecutive games, and his second career game with multiple touchdowns. However, he also had his first-career fumble in the second quarter after 117 career touches without putting the ball on the ground.

Eric Pinkins scored on a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown, giving the Aztecs three in the past three contests after not having one the previous 28 games.

SAN DIEGO – Ryan Katz rushed for three touchdowns and passed for another two as San Diego State avoided a three-game losing streak with a 52-14 victory over Hawai'i at Qualcomm Stadium.

Katz rushed for 57 yards, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards to become the first Aztec quarterback with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes - a 36-yard strike to Brice Butler and a 31-yard completion to Adam Muema - to finish with 247 yards of total offense.

Muema added a 1-yard touchdown run and ended the night with 77 yards on 20 carries, while Chase Price got in the end zone for the first time of his career with a 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

The SDSU defense limited the Warriors to 173 total yards of offense and forced three turnovers.

The Aztecs began the game with 21 unanswered points, with the opening touchdown coming on

Katz's 27-yard burst up the middle and into the end zone.

SDSU's kickoff coverage team followed with a big play, as Stan Sedberry forced Hawai'i return man Mike Edwards to fumble, and Eric Pinkins recovered.

The turnover gave the Aztecs the ball at the Warrior 18, and Muema scored five plays later from one yard out to extend SDSU's advantage to 14-0.

Katz's second rushing touchdown came on the Aztecs' next possession, as he evaded the rush, shook off a Hawai'i defender, and broke free for a 34-yard score to make it 21-0.

SDSU added a Brice Butler touchdown reception and another received another rushing touchdown by Muema to pull away.

The game was played before 50,586 fans, which was the 13th-largest home game in program history.

The San Diego State offense put up some fireworks prior to the annual SkyShow game, as its 52 points were its most since also scoring 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007.

SAN DIEGO – Adam Muema rushed for two touchdowns and Ryan Katz passed for two scores and ran for another to lead San Diego State to a 38-14 victory over Colorado State at Qualcomm Stadium.

Muema had 105 yards on 14 carries, while Katz was 16-for-22 for 181 yards with no interceptions, and finished with the second-highest pass efficiency rating of his career (171.84). Walter Kazee added 95 yards on the ground for the Aztecs, who finished without a penalty for the first time since Nov. 3, 1971 at San Jose State.

The SDSU defense forced three Ram turnovers (two interceptions by Derek Largent and a forced fumble by Josh Wade (recovered by Jake Fely)) and turned them into three touchdowns and 21 points.

Fely had a career-high 13 tackles, 3.5 for loss, with two sacks and a fumble recovery. Largent's two interceptions were a career high, and senior Leon McFadden's two pass breakups moved him within five of the SDSU career record.

San Diego State took just four plays and 1:47 to score on its opening drive, culminating with a 51-yard run by Muema. It was the Aztecs' longest opening drive of the season.

CSU responded with a 15-play, 72-yard drive that took up 5:33 of clock time when M.J. McPeek found Kiv Cartwright on a 2-yard pass on fourth and goal.

On the first play from scrimmage in the second half, Marquise Law fumbled for Colorado State, and Jake Fely recovered for the Aztecs. Two plays later, Katz scrambled to the end zone on 11 yards out to give SDSU a 24-7 lead.

After Derek Largent's interception gave San Diego State the ball at the CSU 33, Katz found Brice Butler for a 15-yard TD pass and a 31-7 advantage.

The Aztecs scored 31 unanswered points before a 1-yard run by Tommey Morris in the fourth quarter doubled Colorado State's scoring total.

RENO, Nev. – Backup quarterback Adam Dingwell threw three touchdown passes and a two-point conversion in overtime to lift San Diego State a 39-38 victory over Nevada.

Dingwell, who replaced an injured Ryan Katz after the team's second drive of the game, completed 14 of 23 passes for 177 yards. He came into the contest with two career completions for 28 yards.

After Nevada went up 38-31 in overtime on a 3-yard TD pass from Cody Fajardo to Brandon Wimberly, the Aztecs needed two just plays to pull to within 38-37, scoring on a 21-yard pass from Dingwell to Gavin Escobar. The Aztecs elected to go for the win and Dingwell sealed it with a pass to Adam Roberts in the corner of the end zone for the successful two-point conversion.

San Diego State trailed, 31-28, and tied it on a 35-yard field goal by Chance Marden as time expired in regulation to force overtime.

Nevada's Stephon Jefferson, the nation's leading rusher, was held to 108 yards on 32 carries, and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run that put the Wolf Pack up 31-21 with 7:46 left in the game.

Dominique Sandifer had five catches for 60 yards and a touchdown, while Escobar caught five balls for 39 yards and two scores. Walter Kazee (15 rushes, 58 yards) also scored a rushing touchdown for the Aztecs.

Without Katz, SDSU's defense rose to the occasion until the offense could regroup.

The Aztecs held Nevada to a season-low 10 points in the first half, as they were able to contain Johnson and Fajardo. The Wolfpack's first three possessions resulted in a three-and-out, a 36-yard field goal and a muffed punt that gave SDSU the ball at the Nevada 46.

The Aztecs turned the special teams mistake into a career-long 46-yard field goal by Chance Marden to put SDSU in front 6-3.

Katz was injured on a third-quarter scramble when he was tackled by Nevada linebacker Jeremiah Green. The senior was eventually carted off the field and did not return.

TEAM NOTES

* San Diego State rallied from a 10-or-more-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win for just the fourth time in 188 tries. The other times were Oct. 26, 1991 at Utah, Nov. 26, 1977 at San Jose State and Nov. 29, 1969 vs. Long Beach State.

* The Aztecs won their fourth consecutive overtime game and improved to 4-1 all-time in overtime games. Their last overtime game was Oct. 24, 1998.

* SDSU picked up its second win over a team that entered the game with at least a five-game winning streak since 2002, and handed Nevada just its third loss in its last 22 home games.

* The Aztecs joined South Florida (2012) and Louisiana Tech (2011) as the only visiting teams to win in Mackey Stadium since Oct. 3, 2009.

* SDSU won its third straight game, matching its second-longest winning streak contained in the same year in the last 14 seasons (does not include win streaks carried over from season to season).

SAN DIEGO – Adam Dingwell threw for 231 yards and two touchdowns in his first-ever start to lead San Diego State to a 24-13 victory against UNLV at Qualcomm Stadium.

Dingwell, who replaced Ryan Katz after he suffered a season-ending broken ankle the week before at Nevada, became the first Aztec quarterback to win his first start since Spencer Brinton did so in 1997.

Dingwell threw touchdown passes to Gavin Escobar (12 yards) in the second quarter and Colin Lockett (27 yards) in the third period. Escobar had 108 yards on four receptions.

Adam Muema ran for 143 yards on 21 carries and Walter Kazee added 105 yards and a touchdown on 21 rushes for the Aztecs. It was the second time this season both runners eclipsed 100 yards in the same game and the 16th time that has happened in program history.

The Rebels scored first when Tim Cornett broke free for a 64-yard touchdown on their opening drive after SDSU was forced to punt. San Diego State, however, scored a touchdown in each of the first three quarters to open a 21-6 lead.

UNLV's Nick Sherry found Devante Davis with 25-yard TD pass to cut the lead to eight late in the third quarter, but a 28-yard field goal by Chance Marden in the fourth sealed the 11-point win for the Aztecs.

However, it wasn't nearly SDSU's sharpest performance. The Aztecs turned the ball over three times in the first half alone and had several other miscues throughout the game.

Dingwell fumbled the snap from center Alec Johnson on the touchdown pass to Lockett, as the sophomore quarterback was able to scoop up the loose ball cleanly and fire a strike into the right corner of the end zone to extend the lead to 21-6 in the third quarter.

That was plenty of cushion for the SDSU defense, which held UNLV scoreless in the fourth quarter to preserve the victory.

TEAM NOTES

* With the win, San Diego State became bowl eligible for the third consecutive season. It was also the earliest in the season the Aztecs have become bowl eligible since 1993.

* SDSU claimed its fourth straight victory, matching its longest winning streak contained in the same year since 1995. The Aztecs also had four-game win streaks in 2010 and 1998.

* In addition, SDSU notched its sixth win of the season (Oct. 27), the fifth-earliest date for a sixth victory in the Division I era and the earliest date for a sixth win since 1993.

* The Aztecs have outscored their opponents 153-79 (+74) over their four-game winning streak, which marks their largest margin in a four-game winning streak in one season since 1995 (+91).

* SDSU finished with multiple 100-yard rushers for the second time this season and 16th time in program history, marking the second time in school history that the Aztecs have had two players each break 100-yard rushing in two games in the same season (also 1998 when Jonas Lewis and Larry Ned did it).

BOISE, Idaho – San Diego State used an opening 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and solid special teams play all around to defeat No. 19/14 Boise State, 21-19, at Bronco Stadium. It was the fifth straight win for the Aztecs, who snapped a 31-game road/neutral losing streak against top-25 AP teams.

Colin Lockett returned the opening kickoff for the 100-yard score, his second of the season and third of his career. Dwayne Garrett later blocked a Bronco punt, which set up a 3-yard run by Adam Muema and put SDSU up, 14-13, early in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth, Walter Kazee capped a 10-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:45 of clock time with a 1-yard rushing touchdown on a fourth and goal.

Southwick led BSU on a 16-play, 75-yard drive capped by his 1-yard touchdown toss to fullback Dan Paul that pulled Boise State within 21-19. The Broncos went for the two-point conversion, but Southwick was pressured and Rene Siluano picked off his pass near the goal line.

San Diego State ran out the clock on its ensuing drive to hand BSU just its second loss in its last 73 regular-season home games.

Muema rushed for 127 yards on 25 carries to lead the Aztec rushing attack.

SAN DIEGO – Adam Muema scored two touchdowns and San Diego State turned four Air Force turnovers into 21 points in a 28-9 victory at Qualcomm Stadium. It was the sixth consecutive win for the Aztecs.

Muema scored on first half runs of 20 and 15 yards and finished the game with 81 yards on 15 carries. Walter Kazee added a game-high 106 yards on 23 rushes.

Everett Beed returned a fumble 52 yards for another score that put SDSU up, 21-3, early in the third quarter.

Chad Young caught a 2-yard touchdown pass later in the quarter from Adam Dingwell for San Diego State's final points.

Dingwell was 11-for-18 for 90 yards, a touchdown and an interception. The pick came deep in Aztecs' territory and led to a 13-yard drive by the Falcons, culminating with a 5-yard TD rush by Wes Cobb.

Parker Herrington kicked a 22-yard field goal on AFA's first possession but later missed a 42-yard attempt at the end of the first half.

SDSU held Air Force to just a 5-for-18 (27.8 percent) effort on third down conversions.

The win was San Diego State's eighth of the season, the first time it has won eight in three straight years since 1972-77.

TEAM NOTES

* San Diego State picked up its 500th win in the history of the program, while Aztec head coach Rocky Long passed TCU's Gary Patterson for the most wins (78) in the history of the Mountain West. Long's first 62 in the Mountain West came with New Mexico (1999-2008), while his last 16 have come with SDSU.

* SDSU has won six consecutive games, which represents its longest win streak by an Aztec team since a six-game winning streak from Sept. 28 - Nov. 4, 1995.

* With the win, SDSU secured its third consecutive season with at least eight victories. The last time the Aztecs posted eight or more wins in three straight campaigns occurred when they accomplished the feat in six consecutive years from 1972-77.

* The Aztecs claimed their eighth victory of the season (Nov. 10), the fourth-earliest date for an eighth win in the Division I era and the earliest date for a seventh victory since 1991.

* SDSU improved to 12-19 all-time in the series with Air Force, including three consecutive wins. It matches the Aztecs' longest winning streak in the history of the series (also 2002-04).

* SDSU evened its record in the series to 7-7 at home. The Aztecs have won four of the last five vs. the Falcons at home.

* Three of the four turnovers forced by SDSU led to touchdowns. The Aztecs have now scored on 17 of their last 19 turnovers forced (16 touchdowns, one field goal).

* SDSU extended its streak to scoring a touchdown to 75 consecutive games.

* The Aztecs have recorded at least one rushing touchdown in 19 consecutive games (dating back to the Oct. 8, 2011 contest vs. TCU), their longest stretch since a 19-game streak from Nov. 25, 1989-Oct. 12, 1991.

LARAMIE, Wyo. – Adam Muema rushed for a career-high 255 yards and four touchdowns to give San Diego State a 42-38 come-from-behind victory at Wyoming. The win gave the Aztecs a share of the Mountain West title, their first league championship since 1998.

Muema scored on runs of 6, 2, 34 and 82 yards. His 255 yards were the ninth most in program history and most since 2001.

As a team, SDSU finished with 564 yards of total offense, including 400 on the ground, which was the second most in its Division I history.

Adam Dingwell added two touchdowns passes after completing 19 of 24 attempts for 164 yards.

It was the seventh straight win for San Diego State, its first single-season seven-game win streak since 1981, and ninth regular season win (first time since 1977).

The Aztecs rallied from a seven-point deficit three times in the game before outscoring the Cowboys, 21-0, over the second half, while limiting them to 112 yards and sacking quarterback Brett Smith four times.

Gavin Escobar had a team season-high six catches and an 11-yard touchdown, while Adam Roberts caught a 6-yard score for SDSU's other points.

TEAM NOTES

* San Diego State claimed its 19th football conference championship, but the first in the Mountain West era. The Aztecs' last conference title came in 1998 during their final campaign as a member of the Western Athletic Conference. That season, SDSU finished as Pacific Division co-champions.

* The Aztecs moved to 16-18 all-time against Wyoming, including a 6-11 mark in Laramie.

* SDSU has won nine of the last 14 meetings between the two schools.

* The road team has captured each of the past four games in the series.

* With their 400 yards on the ground, the Aztecs broke a school record for the most rushing yards in program history (in the Division I era since 1969), amassing 2,750 yards in 12 games. The previous best in a season was 2,476 in 13 games, set by the 1991 team (Marshall Faulk's freshman season).

* The 400 rushing yards were SDSU's second-best total in its Division I era, seventh-most overall and highest since recording 430 on Sept. 14, 1991 vs. Pacific.

* The Aztecs won their ninth game of the season, which represents the first time SDSU have collected nine regular-season victories since the 1977 Claude Gilbert led squad posted a 10-1 record.

* The Aztecs claimed their seventh consecutive victory, marking their longest win streak since a seven-game winning streak from Nov. 15, 1980-Oct. 10, 1981. The last time SDSU won seven straight games in a single season was Oct. 15-Nov. 26, 1977.

* The Aztecs won their final regular-season game for the third consecutive year. The last time SDSU won its final regular-season game in three straight years was 1986-88.

2012 Game Recaps

SAN DIEGO – Propelled by two defensive touchdowns, Brigham Young erased a 6-3 halftime deficit by erupting for 20 points in the fourth quarter to pull away for a 23-6 triumph over San Diego State in the 2012 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl at Qualcomm Stadium.

The Aztecs had their seven-game winning snapped after suffering five turnovers on the night, including four in the final quarter, as the Cougars notched their sixth straight victory in the series between the two former conference rivals.

SDSU drove deep into BYU territory on two drives in the first half, but had to settle for a pair of Chance Marden field goals from 27 and 23 yards out, respectively, which gave the Red and Black a 6-0 advantage by the 10:46 mark of the second quarter.

Following an exchange of punts, the Aztecs appeared to have increased their lead when Eric Pinkins intercepted a pass from Cougar quarterback Riley Nelson and raced 39 yards into the end zone. However, the apparent touchdown was nullified by a penalty on the return, and the subsequent Aztec drive stalled.

BYU took possession on its own 20 and drove 74 yards to the SDSU 6, where kicker Justin Sorensen booted a 23-yard field goal as the clock expired to put the Cougars on the board.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Aztecs found themselves pinned at their own 3-yard line early in the fourth period, when BYU linebacker Kyle Van Noy forced an Adam Dingwell fumble and quickly pounced on the loose ball in the end zone to give the Cougars the lead for good at 10-6.

Just 17 seconds later, BYU took advantage of another Dingwell fumble, as Jamaal Williams scored on a 14-yard run up the middle on the Cougars' first play after the turnover.

With 6:09 left in the game, Van Noy intercepted a Dingwell pass and dashed 17 yard into the end zone to complete the scoring.

Adam Muema broke the 100-yard barrier for the seventh time this season after gaining 111 yards on 26 attempts to lead the SDSU rushing attack, while Dingwell finished with 144 yards passing on 12-of-23 attempts.
