Camels Head West For Two Games

Following a 14-day break from competition for final exams, Campbell returns to action Tuesday at San Diego State in a 7:00 (pst) tip-off.

Looking for their first road victory of the year, the Fighting Camels journey to their farthest destination West ever to face the Aztecs of the Mountain West Conference, plus a Thursday date at San Diego.

CU rode balanced scoring to three season-opening victories at home against UNC Pembroke, Coastal Carolina and UNC Wilmington. In those 3 wins, five Camels reached double digits twice, while four hit double figures vs. UNCW.

Campbell then dropped road games at Radford and Appalachian State.

San Diego State opened the year with eight-straight wins before falling at Western Michigan (84-73) on Dec. 2 and against 14th-ranked Arizona (69-48) on Saturday.

SDSU is coached by Steve Fisher, who guided Michigan to the 1989 NCAA Tournament championship.

Noteworthy

▼ Senior guard **Ledell Eackles**, the son of former NBA standout Ledell Eackles, leads the NCAA in steals (5.2) per game. He grabbed a school-record 10 steals vs. UNC Pembroke and had 8 more thefts at Appalachian State.

▼ Campbell junior guard **Jake Wohlfeil**, a San Diego native, leads the Atlantic Sun Conference and ranks 21st nationally in free throw percentage (.929). He made his first 13 foul shots of the year before going 0-1 at Appalachian State.

▼ The Camels rank 10th among the nation's scoring leaders (88.0), 9th in assists (19.2) and 11th in steals (11.4).

▼ Six Camels are averaging at least 8.6 points score per game, while nine members of the roster are playing double figure minutes.

▼ The Aztecs are led by 2006 All-American, Mountain West Player of the Year and Wooden Award watch list member Brandon Heath, who is averaging 19.4 points through 10 games.

Thievin' Camels

▼ Campbell tied a school Division I era (since 1977-78) record by forcing 31 UNC Pembroke turnovers in CU's opener (11/11/06). Methodist also committed 31 miscues vs. the Camels on Dec. 8, 1979.

▼ Senior **Ledell Eackles** broke the school individual record for steals in a game with 10 vs. UNCP (11/11/06). In the first half alone, Eackles matched the previous record of 8 set by Dan Pogue vs. Coastal Carolina (2/26/94). **Eackles leads the nation in steals (5.2)** after an 8-theft outing at Appalachian State.

▼ CU ranks 11th nationally in team steals (11.4) and is averaging 23.4 points scored off 21.2 opponent turnovers per game.

Share (and take care of) the Ball

▼ Campbell leads the Atlantic Sun Conference and ranks 9th nationally at 19.2 assists per game.

▼ Ledell Eackles ranks 2nd in the A-Sun in assists (4.8), while Jonathan Rodriguez is 6th (3.8) and Jake Wohlfeil 12th (2.8).

▼ The Fighting Camels lead the league in turnover margin (+4.2) and assist/turnover ratio (1.13).

▼ Eackles leads the league in assist/turnover ratio (2.4), while Rodriguez is 4th (1.58).

Camels' 13th Year In the (A-)Sun

Campbell is in its 13th year as a member of the Atlantic Sun Conference. Since joining the league in 1994-95, the Fighting Camels have posted a 67-145 record vs. league opponents in regular season play.

High-Scoring Camels

▼ Campbell leads the Atlantic Sun Conference and ranks 10th in the nation in team scoring average (88.0).

▼ Campbell has hit the 100-point mark twice in its first five games. Only one other time in Campbell's Division I era (since 1977-78) has a CU squad scored 100 points twice in a year (1978-79).

▼ Campbell's 100-94 win over UNC Wilmington (11/20) marked the first time the Camels have scored 100 points vs. a Division I opponent since a 100-78 win over Charleston Southern in 1979.

▼ In its season-opening 106-66 win over UNC Pembroke, Campbell broke the 100-point barrier for the first time since Jan. 3, 1994 (a 114-62 triumph over Ferrum).

▼ CU's 106-point outing vs. UNCP tied for the 3rd-highest scoring game by the Camels since the program joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1977-78.

▼ Campbell has topped the 90-point barrier 10 times in the last two seasons.

▼ At 82.8 points per game, Campbell ranked 2nd among NCAA Division I schools in scoring offense during 2005-06, behind Long Beach State (83.3).

▼ In 2005-06, Campbell shattered the school single-season Division I era (since '77-78) scoring record by averaging 82.8 points per outing. The 1986-87 team averaged 75.9 points per game (which was also the first full year using the 3-point FG and shot clock).

▼ In a 103-99 overtime loss to Belmont on Feb. 18, 2006, Campbell broke the school record for points scored in an A-Sun game. CU defeated Centenary 95-89 in 2OT (1/5/98), then matched that total in a 95-91 victory at Lipscomb (1/4/06), before scoring 96 vs. ETSU in a 110-96 loss (1/7/06) in Buies Creek.

Camels and Aztecs

- ▼ Tuesday's game marks the first meeting between the Camels and San Diego State in men's basketball.
- ▼ Campbell's trip to San Diego also marks the farthest point West that the Fighting Camels have played a men's basketball game. CU played at Boise State's holiday tournament during the 1996-97 campaign.
- ▼ The two-game trip is a homecoming for Campbell junior guard **Jake Wohlfeil**, who earned all-conference honors at LaJolla High School (2003) and Christian High School (2001, 2002) before moving on to New Hampton (N.H.) Prep.
- ▼ Campbell is 0-1 all-time vs. current Mountain West Conference members. Campbell lost a 58-42 decision at Texas

Christian in Dec. 1984 when the Horned Frogs were members of the old Southwest Conference.

- ▼ Gaylord Perry, who won the 1978 Cy Young Award as a member of the San Diego Padres, attended Campbell Junior College during his minor league days in the Giants organization. Perry was slated to play basketball for the Camels until a Giants scout notified the franchise and put an end to Perry's hoops career.
- ▼ Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl is the largest facility (12,414) in which the Camels are scheduled to play during 2006-07. Campbell's Carter Gym (capacity 947) is the second-smallest of all 337 Division I members.

Quick Hits

- ▼ The Camels played in front of sell-out crowds (947 capacity) at Carter Gym in each of their first three games, the 6th, 7th and 8th capacity crowds in the building since the start of the 2005-06 season.
- ▼ Freshman **Jonathan Rodriguez** was named Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Week Nov. 29 after averaging a double-double in wins over Coastal Carolina and UNC Wilmington. Rodriguez' selection marked the first time a Camel freshman has earned the honor.
- ▼ **Russ Gibson** was named A-Sun Player of the Week (Nov. 13) after he scored 22 points vs. UNCP. He eclipsed his previous career-high (13 vs. Mercer 1/13/05) in the opening half alone with 14 on 7-of-8 shooting. He finished the contest shooting 10-of-11 from the floor, and 2-of-2 from the line while doubling his entire output (11 points in 17 games) during the 2005-06 season.
- ▼ The Camels shot 63.3 percent (38-60) from the field vs. UNC Pembroke (Nov. 11) for the team's highest shooting percentage in a single game since hitting 65.0 percent (26-40) at Georgia State on Jan. 4, 2000.
- ▼ **Ledell Eackles** set a school record with 10 steals in the game vs. UNCP. Eackles tied Dan Pogue's 12-year-old single game record with eight steals in the first half alone. Pogue had eight thefts vs. Coastal Carolina on Feb. 26, 1994.
- ▼ The Camels ended a 7-game losing streak to eastern North Carolina rival UNC Wilmington with a 100-94 victory (11/20). The win was CU's first over the Seahawks (who have made 4 NCAA appearances in the last 7 years) since the '95-96 campaign.

▼ CU averaged 905 spectators (96% of capacity) in its 13 home games last year, including SRO crowds against San Diego (960), Stetson (987), Kennesaw State (947), Florida Atlantic (947) and Belmont (947).

- ▼ Twice in the past 20 years, the Camels have posted perfect records at Carter in a year. The 1988-89 club went 8-0 on campus. The 1993-94 squad was a perfect 10-0 in the facility.
- ▼ The brick and concrete structure is named for the family of textile executive Howard Carter and was dedicated on Feb. 20, 1953.
- ▼ Some of the most famous names in basketball history, including John Wooden, Dean Smith, Bob Cousy, Pete and Press Maravich and Michael Jordan, have passed through the doors of Carter as instructors at the Campbell Basketball School. Founded in 1956 by former Campbell coach Fred McCall and former Wake Forest coach "Bones" McKinney, the Campbell Basketball School is the nation's oldest summer basketball camp in continuous operation.

Long Range Notes

- ▼ Campbell has made at least one three-point field goal in 271-consecutive games, dating to the 1996-97 season. The last time the Camels did not connect from long distance was on Dec. 27, 1996 when CU went 0-12 from the arc at Boise State.
- ▼ **Jake Wohlfeil** ranks 7th among A-Sun leaders in 3-point FG percentage (.364), while Reggie Bishop is 10th (.357).
- ▼ In 2005-06 Campbell set school records for 3s made (276) and attempted (787) in a year.
- ▼ Campbell led the A-Sun and finished 3rd nationally in 3s made per game (9.9) in '05-06.
- ▼ Campbell twice set a school record for 3s attempted in a game during '05-06 -- with 37 vs. North Carolina A&T (Dec. 14) and 38 against ETSU (Jan. 7).
- ▼ Eric Smith led the A-Sun and ranked 6th in the nation in 3s per game, hitting 3.8 per outing, while knocking down 107-268 treys (.399).

Camels at Carter Gym

- ▼ Home to Campbell basketball games since 1953, Carter Gym is the 2nd-smallest capacity (947) home court among NCAA Division I men's basketball members, behind only the Charleston Southern Fieldhouse (790).
- ▼ The Fighting Camels have used their homecourt edge to post a 285-140 (.688) record since the 1959-60 season.
- ▼ Campbell has sold out each of its first three games this year.

All-Freshman Status

Campbell has placed at least one player on the Atlantic Sun All-Freshman Team for five of the last six years, including 2005 honoree Ruell Pringle. In 2006, Oladapo Fagbenle, ranked 3rd among A-Sun leaders in blocked shots, but did not crack the All-Freshman unit. CU has two freshmen -- Jonathan Rodriguez and Kyle Vejraska -- on the 2006-07 squad.

Trio Signs With Camels

Jose Cami (Miami, Fla./Monsignor Pace), **Nathan Cass** (Columbia, Tenn./Zion Christian Academy) and **Cole Dewey** (Willow Spring, N.C./South Johnston) signed with Campbell University during the early recruitment period.

A 6-foot-2 guard, Cami is the fourth Floridian to join the Fighting Camel squad over the last three years. Fellow Monsignor Pace alum Stephon Griffin is a red-shirt sophomore point guard, while Jonathan Rodriguez (Miami) and Kyle Vejraska (Alachua) are freshmen on the 2006-07 squad.

In each of his three seasons with the Spartans, Cami has led Monsignor Pace to the state semi-final round. In 2005-06, his team posted a 27-5 won-lost record as Cami earned third-team all-county and honorable mention all-state recognition. He connected on 44 percent of his three-point shots as a junior and led all Dade County players in threes made and attempted, while contributing 13.5 points and 5.5 rebounds per game.

Under the direction of Coach Mark Lieberman, Monsignor Pace has compiled an 80-20 record during Cami's first three varsity seasons. Lieberman also is the associate head coach of Cami's AAU team, the Florida Rams, which has produced NBA standout Amare Stoudemire of the Phoenix Suns.

As a junior, Cass averaged 19.6 points, 9.5 rebounds and 5.9 blocks per game for Coach Paul Brenner at Zion Christian. The 6-foot-8 forward set school season records for points (491), rebounds (225) and blocks (141) while earning all-district and all-district tournament and team MVP honors.

Cass made 47.1 percent of his field goals, canned 41-of-99 (.365) from three-point range, and hit 69.5 percent of his attempts from the free throw line. Twice he scored a career-high 29 points in a game, while leading his team to a 15-10 record.

The son of South Johnston High School head coach David Dewey, Cole Dewey has led the Trojans to a 64-20 record over his first three varsity seasons. As a junior, the 6-foot-2 point guard averaged 18.0 points, 4.9 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals for South Johnston, which compiled a 22-5 record and won the Cape Fear Valley 3-A Conference regular season and tournament titles.

The 6-foot-2 guard already holds school records for career (.810) and season (.851) free throw percentage, while ranking second on school charts in career assists (307) heading into his senior year. He has made 37

percent (128-346) of his career attempts from three-point territory.

Dewey is a three-time academic all-conference performer. He earned all-conference and all-area honors during 2005-06 when he also was named Christmas tournament MVP and team MVP. He has also earned three varsity letters and twice gained all-conference honors in tennis.

Welcome Back "Mouse"

In his first game for the Camels since Feb. 2005, Stephon "Mouse" Griffin came off the bench and dealt a career-high 6 assists, while matching his career best with 7 points in 19 minutes against UNC Pembroke (11/11/06). Griffin, who underwent two ACL surgeries (spring and fall of 2005), also canned 5-of-6 from the line vs. UNCP.

Through 5 games, Griffin is shooting 70% (14-20) from the line and averaging 2.1 assists.

The John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center

The Campbell University Board of Trustees announced on Sept. 20, 2004 a pledge of \$4.5 million from the John William Pope Foundation which will be applied to the cost of a \$30 million convocation center to be constructed on campus. The \$4.5 million pledge represents the largest of several gifts the university has received from the Pope Foundation.

John Pope Jr. was not only a graduate, but a staunch supporter of Campbell University, who worked fervently in past fundraising campaigns. He announced in a 1995 campaign effort that the John William Pope Foundation would provide a challenge gift of up to \$100,000 to match gifts one-to-four for the Lundy-Fetterman School of Business Building Campaign. This challenge gift followed the Foundation's earlier gift of \$100,000 in April, 1994.

The trustees also voted to name the convocation center, the John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center, in memory of John W. Pope, Jr., who passed away in March, 2004, and in appreciation for his loyal and generous support of Campbell University since his graduation in 1975. Following John's graduation from Campbell, he joined his family's retail business, Variety Wholesalers, Inc., rising to senior vice-president. John also served on the Board of Directors of Variety Wholesalers and the John William Pope Foundation.

The John William Pope Foundation is a private grant making foundation located in Raleigh, NC. John W. Pope, Sr., is Chairman Emeritus of the Pope Foundation, and Chairman and CEO of Variety Wholesalers, Inc. Art Pope, the brother of John W. Pope, Jr., is President of the Pope Foundation and Vice-Chairman and President of Variety Wholesalers, Inc. The Pope family is originally

from the Dunn and Fuquay-Varina area.

The John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center will be a state-of-the-art, multi-purpose facility, which will seat 3,000 spectators for athletic events and up to 5,000 for special concerts, graduation activities and other community and regional events.

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the convocation center were held on Sept. 1, 2006.

Nationwide architectural firm Little Diversified Architectural Consulting (Little) has been selected to design Campbell University's proposed Convocation/Student Center, a multi-purpose, multi-educational complex. Little serves clients throughout the United States. The company, which has been in business nearly 40 years, provides integrated architecture and engineering services to corporations, financial institutions, developers, educational systems, and government agencies.

Goldsboro construction company T.A. Loving has been hired as the building contractor. The Loving Company also built the \$12 million Lundy-Fetterman School of Business, completed in 2000. It is currently working on a \$3.5 million renovation of the D. Rich Memorial Building, one of the oldest buildings on campus.

In addition, the Durham-based landscape architectural design company Lappas + Havener has been hired to provide a comprehensive master plan for the Campbell University campus.

Camels Away From Home

▼ Since joining NCAA Division I in 1977-78, Campbell stands 87-301 (.214) in road games. CU was 5-9 on the road in 2005-06, 5-5 on A-Sun opponents' home floors.

▼ With a 95-91 win Jan. 4, 2006 at Lipscomb, CU ended a 33-game A-Sun road slide, which dated to an 84-79 win at Jacksonville State on Jan. 19, 2002.

▼ Campbell University ended a 35-game losing streak away from Carter Gym on Dec. 11, 2004 with a 68-67 triumph at North Carolina A&T.

Campbell in Lid Lifters

▼ Campbell stands 14-16 in season-opening games since joining NCAA Division I in 1977-78.

▼ CU is 1-3 in openers under head coach Robbie Laing, dropping a 93-54 decision at East Carolina in '03-04, a 64-52 contest at Furman in '04-05 and a 90-81 setback vs. San Diego in '05-06 before taming UNC Pembroke 106-66 on Nov. 11, 2006.

▼ Before this year's triumph, Campbell's last season-opening win was a 65-64 triumph over Division II Francis Marion on Nov. 23, 2002 when Tarick Johnson hit a 37-footer at the buzzer.

▼ Campbell is 4-8 all-time in A-Sun openers following last year's 84-70 victory over Stetson.

Afternoons Delightful

▼ Over the past two seasons, Campbell owns a 7-4 record in games that started in the afternoon (before 6 pm). Three of those 4 losses came at the hands of 2006 league champion Belmont.

A Look at the Schedule

In addition to their A-Sun foes, the Fighting Camels will take on members of six other NCAA Division I conferences, plus independent Longwood and a pair of Division II members.

In-state rival UNC Wilmington, coming off an NCAA Tournament appearance, will visit Carter Gym for the second time in four years. CU meets former Big South Conference opponent Radford for the first time since the 1993-94 campaign.

Campbell starts the 2006-07 slate with three home dates – including a November 11 meeting against Division II UNC Pembroke in the season opener at Carter Gym. Coastal Carolina, guided by second-year coach Buzz Peterson, visits Buies Creek on Nov. 16.

UNC Wilmington returns to Carter for the first time since Dec. 2003 and only the second occasion since 1977 on Mon., Nov. 20 for a 7:00 p.m. tip-off. The Seahawks, under the guidance of first-year coach Benny Moss, are coming off a 25-8 season and the program's fourth NCAA appearance in seven years. An overflow crowd packed Carter Gym on Dec. 1, 2003. This year's game marks the 91st meeting between the schools since 1951-52.

Campbell and Radford square off on the hardwood for the first time since the 1994 Big South Conference Tournament semifinals when the Camels travel to southwest Virginia for a Nov. 25 date with the Highlanders. The two-game road swing ends at Southern Conference member Appalachian State on Nov. 27. The Camels and Mountaineers have not played in men's basketball since the 1983-84 campaign.

Following a break for final examinations, the Camels made a two-game trip to Southern California. On Dec. 12, Campbell takes on defending Mountain West Conference champion San Diego State, which returns four starters off last year's 24-9 squad. CU then travels to San Diego to complete a two-game contract with Coach Brad Holland's Toreros. USD claimed a season-opening 90-81 win at Carter Gym last year en route to an 18-12 record.

On Dec. 18, Radford travels to Carter Gym, where the Highlanders were 0-2 against Campbell while both were members of the Big South Conference. In Jan. of 1993, a last-second 3-point attempt by Radford's Doug Day struck a light fixture above the Campbell backboard and the Camels won 87-84. One year later, CU scored a 73-56 win over their league rivals during the regular season at Carter, then defeated Radford 72-61 in the Big South semis at Charleston, S.C. Campbell joined the Atlantic Sun Conference in the summer of 1994, ending the yearly home-and-home series.

With the departure of Florida Atlantic for the Sun Belt Conference, Atlantic Sun members will play an 18-game, double round-robin schedule in 2006-07.

CU starts league play with four road games among its first six league dates. The Camels travel to North Florida (Jan. 2) and Jacksonville (Jan. 4) before hosting Kennesaw State (Jan. 6) and East Tennessee State (Jan. 9) in a busy, 8-day stretch.

Russ Gibson scored a career-high 22 points and Jake Wohlfeil added 20 off the bench to lead Campbell to a 106-66 season-opening win over UNC Pembroke at sold-out Carter Gym. Campbell (1-0) used a 21-0 run midway through the first half to break open the contest against the Division II Braves. Eric Smith added 14 points and Ruell Pringle 10, while freshman Jonathan Rodriguez chipped in 13, plus 8 rebounds and 7 assists in his collegiate debut. Senior Ledell Eackles added 7 assists and a school-record 10 steals.

Freshman Jamelle Lowery led all UNCP scorers with 18 points.

Campbell passed the 100-point barrier for the first time since a 114-62 victory over Ferrum on Jan. 3, 1994 at Carter Gym.

Gibson eclipsed his previous career-high of 13 points in the opening half alone with 14 on 7-8 shooting. He finished the contest shooting 10-11 from the floor, and 2-2 from the line while doubling his entire output (11 points in 17 games) during the 2005-06 season.

The Camels shot 63.3 percent (38-60) from the field, made 9-of-23 threes, and held a 26-6 advantage in fast-break points. Leading 23-16 with 8:05 left in the opening period, Campbell outscored the Braves 30-2 (including the 21-0 flurry) over the next 7:24. The Camels made 12-of-14 shots during the 30-2 burst. Campbell shot 60.6 percent from the floor in the first period, while UNCP made just 28.6 percent of its shots. CU led by as many as 43. Jonathan Rodriguez led five players in double figures with 17 points and Campbell defeated Coastal Carolina 83-63 in a sold-out Carter Gym. Russ Gibson and Ledell Eackles added 14 points apiece for Campbell (2-0), while Reggie Bishop had 13 off the bench and Eric Smith chipped in 11.

Rodriguez pulled down a team-leading nine rebounds and led the squad with five assists, while hitting 6-of-11 from the floor and all five of his free throw attempts.

Campbell improved to 2-0 for the first time since 1997-98.

Jack Leasure topped Coastal Carolina (0-2) with 19 points, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range. Joseph Harris came off the bench to tie his career high with 14 points, while grabbing a game-high 13 rebounds.

Coastal led by as many as nine early in the game and held a 25-20 edge with 7:25 to go in the first half. However, the Camels scored 17 unanswered points – eight by Bishop – over the next 5:21 as the Chanticleers went cold from the field, missing eight-straight shots. Eackles sank a running 40-footer at the buzzer to put the Camels in front 40-27 at the half, capping a 30-9 rally.

Coastal was able to cut the gap to 47-40 with 14:21 to go on Moses Sonko's bucket in the lane, and trailed by just eight (53-45) with 10:25 left. However, Bishop capped a quick 7-0 run with a triple and the lead never went under double digits again. Campbell scored the last six points of the game and the 20-point decision was the largest margin of the night.

The Camels sealed their second-straight win by making 20-of-23 foul shots in the second half, 25-of-29 for the game (.862). Coastal attempted just nine shots from the line, hitting only four, for the entire contest.

Ruell Pringle scored a career-high 27 points and Jonathan Rodriguez added a season-best 22 as Campbell rallied for a 100-94 win over UNC Wilmington at sold-out Carter Gym. The Fighting Camels rallied from a 12-point half-time deficit to record their first win over UNCW since a 74-52 decision on Dec. 12, 1995 at Wilmington.

Campbell (3-0) hit the 100-point barrier for the second time in three games this year and for the first time over a Division I opponent since a 100-78 win on Jan. 13, 1979 at Charleston Southern.

Jake Wohlfeil added 18 points for Campbell, while Russ Gibson had all 10 of his in the second half for the Camels, who won their first three games for the first time since the 1997-98 season. Rodriguez added eight rebounds and six assists, while Ledell Eackles added five assists and made four steals, while committing no turnovers in 29 minutes.

Point guard Temi Soyobo led five UNCW scorers in double figures with a career-high 23 points before fouling out with 1:07 left in the contest. Vladimir Kuljanin added 21 points and 10 rebounds, while Jeff Horowitz came off the bench to score 16.

UNCW (1-2) led by as many as 15 in the opening half and held a 50-38 edge at the break. Campbell, however, hit nine of its first 15 shots in the second period and cut the UNCW advantage to 63-62 with 12:14 remaining. UNCW stretched the gap back to seven (81-74) with 6:06 to go, but CU responded with a 12-5 run. After Eackles was fouled on a follow shot and canned the free throw with 1:39 remaining, UNCW never got closer than three.

Campbell, which scored 26 points on its final 14 possessions, hit 56 percent of its shots (18-32) in the second half, and made 22-of-30 (.733) from the line in the final stanza.

Fourth Year at Campbell

Troy State (1982)

Now in his fourth year in charge of the Campbell University men's basketball program, Robbie Laing has overseen a dramatic turnaround in the Fighting Camels' fortunes during his tenure in Buies Creek.

Named Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year in 2006 by CollegeInsider.com, Coach Laing's Fighting Camels ended the year as the country's second-highest scoring team, and only one other school among 334 NCAA Division I members boasted a greater jump in conference victories from the 2004-05 season.

Along the way, the Camels shattered school records for scoring, 3-point field goals made and attempted and rebounds, while winning more than twice as many Atlantic Sun Conference games as in the previous three seasons combined.

"There's a lot of momentum being generated in Buies Creek for this program and our University," says Laing. "We have a lot of positive recruiting pitches available to us that we didn't have a couple of years ago. I think the foundation is now set for our program."

Laing was named recognized by Collegeinsider.com after the Camels made a nine-game improvement in the league win column. One year after a 0-20 league slate, the Camels produced a 9-11 A-Sun record, and 10-18 overall mark. Only Jacksonville State, which played four additional Ohio Valley games in '05-06, notched a larger increase in conference victories (12-8 from 2-14) over the previous season.

During the 2005-06 campaign, Campbell scored at an 82.8 points per game clip, second only to Long Beach State (83.3) among Division I membership. The Camels knocked down 9.9 three-point field goals per game, the third-highest mark in the country, while ranking 13th nationally in assists (17.0) and rebounds (39.2) per game.

The Camels topped the 90-point mark 8 times during the '05-06 campaign, the most in a season in the program's history since joining the Division I ranks in 1977-78. CU set school records for points scored in A-Sun games at home (99 vs. Belmont) and on the road (95 at Lipscomb).

Campbell led the Atlantic Sun Conference in scoring (82.8), rebounds per game (39.2), 3-point field goals made per game (9.86), rebounding margin (+3.4), offensive rebounds (15.75) and assists (17.0). Campbell fans reacted to the team's success by selling out Carter Gym five times and filling the 53-year-old facility to 96 percent of its capacity throughout the campaign.

The Camels carried their success on the road, logging a 5-5 record in A-Sun away games, including a victory at regular season co-champion Lipscomb. CU produced the program's best league road mark since the 1999-2000 squad went 6-3 away from Carter Gym in A-Sun action.

Campbell scored 2319 points in 28 games and broke school season marks for total points and scoring average in a season. The old records of 2276 points and a 75.9 scoring average were set during the 1986-87 campaign, the first year that the NCAA adopted the 3-point line full-time.

CU also broke 13-year-old records for threes made (276) and attempted (787) in a campaign. The '92-93 club hit 228 triples in 593 attempts. Despite playing only 28 games, the Camels pulled down a school-record 1098 rebounds in '05-06, 18 more than the 1986-87 squad grabbed in two additional contests.

Four Fighting Camels were named to the A-Sun All-Academic squad and Maurice Latham was chosen first-team All-Atlantic Sun Conference by league coaches as well as first-team all-state by the North Carolina Collegiate Sports Information Association.

Laing was introduced as head coach of the Fighting Camels in April 2003 after spending two seasons at Kansas State University as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. The 48-year-old Laing has also served in a similar capacity at Southern Mississippi, Auburn, Clemson and Georgia Southern.

The progress in Campbell's rebuilding process was evident during Coach Laing's second year in charge. Campbell finished with a positive rebounding margin for the first time in 11 years. Despite facing one of the most challenging schedules in school history, the Fighting Camels proved competitive, both on the road and at home, where the team played to a near-capacity Carter Gym audience each outing.

Ruell Pringle was named to the 2004-05 A-Sun All-Freshman Team, and four Fighting Camel players gained a spot on the league All-Academic Team.

In his first year in Buies Creek, Laing coached the youngest team in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Anthony Atkinson was named to the A-Sun All-Freshman Team, while four Camels earned A-Sun All-Academic Team honors.

Laing's coaching career has taken him to stops in the Big-12, Southeastern, Atlantic Coast, Conference-USA, Sun Belt and Atlantic Sun conferences on the Division I level.

Laing's primary role while at Kansas State was serving as the Wildcats' recruiting coordinator. He was instrumental in helping K-State land back-to-back top 25 recruiting classes rated by *Hoop Scoop* magazine. The Wildcats' 2001 class was ranked number-25 by the publication, with the 2002 class rated number-11.

In addition, he has recruited or coached six NBA players in his career, including three first-round draft choices.

At Campbell, Laing has implemented an up-tempo offensive scheme that is built upon strong rebounding and tough defense. The foundation of a team that intends to hit the

glass with purpose and play an up-tempo style will be defensive effort, according to Coach Laing.

Before spending the 1999-2000 season as an assistant coach at Southern Mississippi, Laing served the previous three years (1996-99) as head coach at Jones Junior College in Ellisville, Miss.

Prior to taking the head coaching position at Jones Junior College in 1996, Laing was an assistant coach under Cliff Ellis at Auburn, where he also directed recruiting efforts. While at Auburn, the resurgent Tiger program made a pair of NIT berths. Laing also served under Ellis for one season at Clemson, helping guide the Tigers to 18 victories in 1993-94.

At Campbell, Laing returned to the Atlantic Sun (formerly the Trans America Athletic) Conference where he spent two stints as an assistant at Georgia Southern.

In his final six-year stretch at the Statesboro, Ga., school (1989-93), Laing signed 15 players who went on to earn all-conference honors. The highlight came during the 1991-92 season, when all five starters were named to the All-Trans America Athletic Conference team.

During the 1986-87 season at Western Kentucky, he helped lead the Hilltoppers to a 29-9 record and a Sun Belt Conference championship. At WKU, he worked with the Hilltoppers' post players, three of whom were later selected in the NBA draft.

In all, Laing was with the Georgia Southern program for eight years, including three campaigns that saw the Eagles advance to postseason play. Georgia Southern won 70 percent of its games during his tenure with the program, posting a 161-70 overall record. The Eagles were ranked 30th among Division I schools in winning percentage from 1984 to 1993 before the school joined the Southern Conference.

A 1982 graduate of Troy State University, Laing embarked on his collegiate coaching career at his alma mater for two years, before moving on to Georgia Southern in 1984.

A standout athlete at Lakeside High School in Eufaula, Ala., Laing played football at Vanderbilt for one year before transferring to Troy State. He earned his B.S. in biology and physical education in 1982 and won two letters on the basketball team. He served as team captain during his senior year. Laing completed his M.Ed. in physical education at Georgia Southern in 1993.

Laing began his coaching career in 1981 at South Montgomery (Ala.) County Academy, where he guided his 1981-82 squad to a 14-11 record and earned district Coach of the Year honors.

He and his wife, the former Dana Riales, are parents of five children, including three sons, Earl Duncan (17), Christian (16) and Nathan (13), and two daughters, Ansley Rae (10) and Madison (9).
