# 2008 Season Recap

San Diego State's 2008 campaign was one of near misses and heartbreaking defeat.

The Aztecs opened the season with a pair of devastating losses. In the season's opening game, the Aztecs rallied from a nine-point deficit to take a fourth quarter lead, only to watch Cal Poly take a 29-27 victory on the final play of the game.

The following week, San Diego State traveled to Notre Dame for a nationally-televised game against the Irish. Despite being a three-touchdown underdog, the Aztec owned a 13-7 fourth-quarter lead and were just inches away from taking a two-score lead only to see the Irish rally for a 21-13 win.

Later in the season, SDSU took bowl-bound Colorado State to the closing moments before suffering a 38-34 defeat.

Despite all the turmoil and frustrations of injuries and near misses, San Diego State still stepped up in the final game of the season and sent 17 seniors out in style by eliminating UNLV from bowl competition with an impressive 42-21 victory over the Rebels.

Although the near misses provided for a frustrating 2009 campaign, the Aztec program showed that it may have a shorter path to the return of the school's glory days than a 2-10 record would indicate.

## INJURIES A STORY, AGAIN

San Diego State suffered through a rash of injuries once again during the 2008 season. The Aztecs had only seven players start all 12 games (RG Ikaika Aken-Moleta, LB Russell Allen, WR Vincent Brown, C Trask Iosefa, LB Luke Laolagi, LT Peter Nelson and DE Jonathan Soto).

A mere 16 players saw action in all 12 contests for the Aztecs.

In 2008, 40 different players started at least one game.

## THREE AZTECS EARN ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE HONORS

Three San Diego State football players, senior linebacker Russell Allen, senior safety Corey Boudreaux and sophomore defensive end B.J. Williams, earned honorable mention all-league honors for their performances during the 2008 season. Allen was tabbed an honorable mention pick for the second straight campaign, it was the first such honor for both Boudreaux and Williams.

Allen finished his Aztec career as a four-year starter and two-time team captain, posting 375 career tackles, 22.0 tackles for loss, three forced fumbles, four recovered fumbles and three interceptions in playing all 48 games since 2005. This past season, Allen led the team in tackles with 107, including 9.5 behind the line of scrimmage, to rank fourth in the MWC and tie for 34th nationally. He was also tied for first in the league in fumbles recovered (3) and was fourth in fumbles forced (3).

A two-time nominee for the Dick Butkus Award, Allen is the school's all-time leader in career assisted tackles with 161 and is second in career solo stops with 214. He finished his stint at SDSU with 10 games with 10 or more tackles, including five such efforts in 2008.

In only his second season as a starter, Boudreaux averaged a league-best 11.2 tackles per MWC game, marking the sixth consecutive year that an Aztec has led or ranked second in the conference in tackles in either overall or league-only outings.

Boudreaux finished 2008 with a career-high 101 stops, including 61 solo efforts. He also had four pass break-ups, two forced fumbles and two interceptions, including one in the team's finale with UNLV which he returned 82 yards for his first career touchdown. Boudreaux had four picks in the last two seasons and ended his career with 185 tackles.

Williams was the Aztecs' starter at defensive end for the second year in a row, posting a team-best 10.5 tackles for loss, which ranked him eighth in the Mountain West. He ended up fifth on the team in tackles with a career-high 74 and also recovered a pair of fumbles. Williams had 10 stops against TCU and a career-high 11 vs. BYU, including four for a loss of 10 yards.

## WE FOUND A QUARTERBACK

Many Aztec fans were worried entering the 2008 campaign as San Diego State looked to replace four-year starter Kevin O'Connell at quarterback.

Redshirt freshman Ryan Lindley proved more than ready for the challenge. Lindley started 11 games, completing 56.7 percent of his passes and throwing for an Aztec and Mountain West Conference freshman class record 2,653 yards.

Lindley got stronger as the season went on, throwing a touchdown pass in each of his final six games, while posting four 300-yard passing performances during the season.

## LOUIS IS LATEST AZTEC TO BE DRAFTED INTO THE NFL

Lance Louis, a four-year letterwinner who logged 39 games and 17 career starts at San Diego State from 2004-08, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the 2008 NFL Draft. Louis was selected with the 37th pick in the seventh round.

A native of New Orleans, Louis became the 18th former Aztec player this decade to be drafted. At least one San Diego State player has been selected in the NFL Draft in seven of the last eight years and 43 of the last 47 drafts dating back to 1963.

Louis played his first two seasons (2004-05) at tight end before suffering a devastating knee injury prior to the 2006 season. Following a lengthy rehabilitation, Louis returned to play on the offensive line in his final two campaigns (2007-08).

As a tight end, Louis played in 19 games, catching 14 passes for 195 yards and one touchdown. He posted career highs with five receptions for 93 yards at Hawai'i on Dec. 3, 2005. Following his return, Louis played in 19 games on the offensive line, including all 12 games this past season making 11 starts at right tackle.

**SAN DIEGO** – Despite overcoming a nine-point deficit in the second half, San Diego State's five turnovers proved to be too costly as the Aztecs fell to Cal Poly, 29-27, at Qualcomm Stadium.

SDSU took its first lead of the game at 27-26 in the fourth quarter and held that advantage until the Mustangs converted a 21-yard field goal with the clock winding down, dashing the Scarlet and Black's hopes of securing a season-opening win for the first time since 2004.

In his first collegiate start, Aztec redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley racked up an impressive 352 passing yards and three touchdowns, but it was Cal Poly who held a lopsided advantage in rushing yards (263-27) and won the battle in total offense (483-379).

On Cal Poly's second drive of the game, SDSU senior linebacker Russell Allen forced a fumble and also recovered it at the Aztec 3-yard line, but three plays later, sophomore running back Brandon Sullivan was tackled in the end zone for a safety, giving the Mustangs a 2-0 lead.

Cal Poly gained momentum from there, going up 9-0 on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Jonathan Dally to Ramses Barden with 3:07 left in the first quarter. Barden finished with a game-high 161 yards on seven catches.

San Diego State was able to get on the board and cut its deficit to two at the 5:41 mark in the second quarter on a 16-yard TD reception by Sullivan, but the Mustangs would eventually tack on one more before the end of the half to take a 16-7 lead.

The Aztecs came out of the break on fire, putting together a 7-play, 66-yard drive that ate up 2:12 on the clock and ended with a 30-yard touchdown catch by Roberto Wallace.

After Cal Poly got back on the board, SDSU closed out the third frame with a 23-yard TD pass from Lindley to Vincent Brown, and the Aztecs trailed by just two points (23-21) heading into the final 15 minutes of action.

The Mustangs opened the fourth quarter with a field goal, but the Aztecs would eventually take their first lead of the game on Sullivan's 5-yard touchdown run with 6:51 on the clock. Unable to convert an extra two-point attempt, SDSU held a narrow 27-26 advantage.

After a successful defensive effort on Cal Poly's subsequent drive, the Scarlet and Black took control of the ball with 4:24 left to play, but were unable to maintain possession, allowing the Mustangs to start their final drive at the 3:39 mark. Cal Poly took advantage of the opportunity, using up the clock to set up Andrew Gardner's game-winning field goal.

Lindley finished the evening 27-for-45, while Brown led the way on the receiving end with 98 yards and a touchdown on seven catches. Sullivan also had a strong showing with two touchdowns, a team-leading 43 yards on the ground and nine catches for 64 yards.

**NOTRE DAME, Ind.** – San Diego State held a six-point lead late in the fourth quarter, but the Fighting Irish came back to score two touchdowns in the final 10 minutes to pull off a 21-13 win in front of a sold-out crowd at Notre Dame Stadium.

SDSU finished the game with a slight advantage in total offense (345-342), but was unable to overcome 11 penalties and a costly turnover. Aztec redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley had another fine start, throwing for 274 yards, while Notre Dame signal caller Jimmy Clausen totaled 237 yards.

It was a defensive battle in the opening quarter with both teams coming up short on their first three drives of the game.

Notre Dame started off the second frame by moving down the field and into Aztec territory. On second and goal, the Irish attempted to run the ball, but Luke Laolagi forced a fumble before recovering it at the 3-yard line to prevent a UND touchdown.

The Scarlet and Black finally dented the scoreboard on a 1-yard touchdown run by Lindley. T.J. McKay came up big for SDSU on the defensive end, intercepting a Clausen pass and returning it 16 yards to the Notre Dame 44-yard line. Lindley then completed a 43-yard pass to Darren Mougey to set up the Aztecs' first score.

After getting excellent field position on a blocked punt, the Fighting Irish evened the game

on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Clausen to Michael Floyd. With just 1:14 left on the clock, the Aztecs had to let the time run down and went into the break with the score knotted at 7-7.

San Diego State regained the lead at the 8:31 mark in the third quarter with a 9-play, 80-yard drive that ended in a 15-yard TD catch by Mougey. A missed extra point gave the Aztecs a 13-7 advantage that held up going into the final 15 minutes of action.

Things were looking up for SDSU as it started the fourth quarter by making its way down to the Notre Dame 4-yard line. On first and goal, running back Brandon Sullivan was stopped short of the goal line, with the Irish forcing a fumble and recovering it for a touch-back.

Notre Dame capitalized on the opportunity, taking its first lead on its ensuing possession. The Irish then put the game out of reach when Clausen found David Grimes in the endzone to go ahead by eight points with 2:08 left to play.

Clausen finished the day 21-for-34 with two interceptions and three touchdowns, while his prime target was Golden Tate, who racked up 93 yards on a team-high six catches.

Lindley completed 29 of his 59 pass attempts, with one interception and one touchdown. Mougey recorded a career-high 97 yards on five catches, while Matthew Kawulok added a career-best nine receptions for 60 yards. Sullivan led the Aztec rush with 66 yards on 10 attempts. Laolagi paced the defense with 13 tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

**SAN DIEGO** – Coming off a bye week and playing at home for the first time since late August, San Diego State picked up its first win of the season as it compiled over 600 yards en route to a 45-17 victory over Idaho.

The Scarlet and Black held a lopsided 445-169 advantage in passing yards and easily won the battle in total offense (603-351). Aztec quarterback Ryan Lindley had a memorable game, setting Mountain West Conference and SDSU freshman records with 433 passing yards and four touchdowns.

Sophomore Vincent Brown also had a record-setting game, establishing career-highs in receiving yards (183) and receiving TDs (3). Junior Atiyah Henderson, meanwhile, paced the SDSU running game with his third career 100-yard rushing performance.

San Diego State quickly got on the board when Henderson ran three yards for a touchdown on the Aztecs' second drive of the game. Junior Lane Yoshida then tacked on three more points early in the second frame, converting a 26-yard field goal.

SDSU would eventually take a commanding 24-0 lead with 4:32 remaining in the first half as Lindley completed back-to-back 40-plus yard touchdown passes to Brown. Idaho was able

to get its first points before the end of the second quarter with a field goal, giving the Aztecs a 24-3 lead at intermission.

Coming out of the break, the Scarlet and Black picked up right where it left off with Lindley finding Brown once again, this time connecting for 51 yards. On its next drive, SDSU took a 38-3 lead on a 4-yard touchdown run by Henderson.

Idaho found the end zone for the first time with 12:28 left in the game as Troy Vital completed an 8-play, 66-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run. The Aztecs quickly responded, however, when Sullivan caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from Lindley just 1:26 later. The Vandals would tack on one more score before the end of the game for the final 45-17 margin.

Idaho quarterback Nathan Enderle finished the evening 11-for-26 for 112 yards with two interceptions. Eddie Williams led the Vandal receivers with 71 yards, while Prince McCarty totaled 82 yards and one touchdown on the ground.

Lindley completed 24 of his 38 pass attempts with one interception and four TDs. In addition to Brown's 183-yard performance, junior Mekell Wesley compiled 109 yards on six catches. Henderson, meanwhile, kept Idaho on its toes with 100 rushing yards on a season-high 21 attempts.

On the defensive side, senior Corey Boudreaux had an interception and returned it for 38 yards, while sophomores Romeo Horn and Jose Perez recorded their first career picks.

**FORT WORTH, Texas** – San Diego State was unable to overcome a first-half 20-point deficit as it dropped its Mountain West opener to TCU, 41-7, at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

The Horned Frogs, who entered the game as the No. 1 team in the nation in rushing defense, held the Aztecs to minus 13 yards on the ground. The Scarlet and Black finished the evening with just four first downs and 85 yards of total offense.

San Diego State hung tough with the home team in the early going and trailed just 3-0 at the end of the opening quarter. The Horned Frogs got on the board when a 15-play, 55-yard drive that ate up seven minutes on the clock set up a 20-yard field goal by Ross Evans.

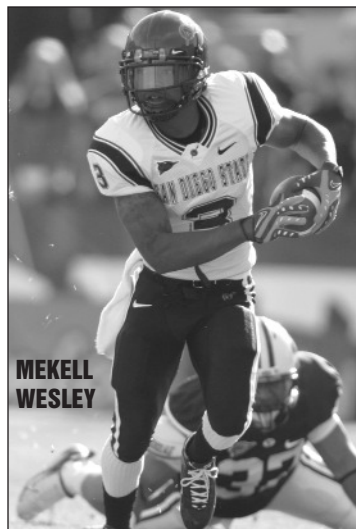
TCU added to its lead at the start of the second frame with another field goal from Evans, this time from 42 yards out. The Frogs then found the end zone on its final two drives of the half as Ryan Christian had a 10-yard touchdown run before Marcus Jackson completed a 3-yard TD pass to Shae Reagan to give TCU a 20-0 lead at the break.

The Aztecs got off to a good start in the third period when Russell Allen recovered a fumble by TCU quarterback Marcus Jackson at the Horned Frogs' 1-yard line. Mekell Wesley then ran the ball in from two yards out for the Scarlet and Black's first touchdown of the evening. TCU would not let up, however, as it scored 21 unanswered points to close out the game.

Jackson led the Frogs' attack, finishing the evening 10-for-19 with 115 yards and one touchdown, while also racking up a game-high 131 yards and two TDs on the ground.

San Diego State struggled to find its rhythm on offense after starting quarterback Ryan Lindley (4-for-8, 37 yards) left the game in the second quarter with a shoulder injury. Backup Drew Westling finished the game completing just six of his 17 pass attempts for 61 yards. Vincent Brown led the SDSU receivers with 52 yards on six catches.

Four Aztecs ended up with double digits in tackles, led by Corey Boudreaux's game- and career-high 14 stops. Allen (11 tackles), B.J. Williams (10) and Luke Laolagi (10) were also among the SDSU defensive leaders.

**SAN DIEGO** – San Diego State held a three-point lead at halftime, but it was unable to secure its first Mountain West Conference victory of the season as the Aztecs eventually fell to Air Force, 35-10, at Qualcomm Stadium.

The Falcons controlled the running game with a lopsided 401-35 advantage in rushing, while also winning the battle in total offense (473-165).

SDSU put up a solid first half with junior quarterback Drew Westling completing 15 of his 21 pass attempts, but the Air Force defense shut down the Scarlet and Black after the break, allowing the Aztecs to pick up only three first downs and 13 total yards in the final 30 minutes of action.

The Falcons got on the board on their first series as they drove 78 yards down the field to score on a 1-yard touchdown run by Tim Jefferson.

San Diego State responded in the second quarter and tied the game at seven after putting together a 14-play, 73-yard drive that ended in a 1-yard TD run by Westling. SDSU then took a 10-7 advantage on its following series when Lane Yoshida converted a season-long 45-yard field goal.

The Scarlet and Black kept its momentum going on the defensive end as junior Jonathan Soto forced a fumble on Air Force's ensuing drive, and senior Russell Allen recovered the ball at the Falcons' 32-yard line. SDSU was unable to take advantage of the opportunity, however, as Yoshida's 34-yard FG attempt missed wide left.

After an unsuccessful three-point attempt by Air Force at the end of the period, the Aztecs maintained their 10-7 lead heading into the break.

The Scarlet and Black was unable to find its rhythm on either side of the ball following the intermission as Air Force went on to score 28 unanswered points. The Falcons regained the lead with 9:11 left in the third frame when Asher Clark ran nine yards for the touchdown.

Trailing by only four points (14-10), Allen forced another Falcon fumble and sophomore B.J. Williams recovered it at the Aztecs' 12-yard line, but SDSU went three and out to turn the momentum back to Air Force. After tacking on one more score at the end of the quarter, the Falcons went on to find the end zone twice in the final 15 minutes of play for the 35-10 victory.

In his first Division I start, Westling compiled 128 passing yards on an 18-for-35 effort. Junior Atiyah Henderson led the way on the receiving end with seven catches for 41 yards.

The San Diego State defense had four players record double-digit tackles for the second straight game. Senior Corey Boudreaux once again led the effort with a career-high 21 tackles, which tied him for second in SDSU single-game history.

The Aztecs, who fell to the Lobos by just three points in 2007, were unable to match that effort as UNM dominated the battle in total offense (565-227). Rodney Ferguson and James Wright led the New Mexico attack as both rushed for over 100 yards, with Ferguson finishing the end zone four times on the afternoon.

UNM came out of the gates aggressively, jumping out to a 21-0 lead in the first seven minutes of action. The Lobos opened the game by picking off Aztec quarterback Ryan Lindley's third pass attempt of the day at the SDSU 46-yard line and eventually got on the board with a 20-yard run by Brad Gruner.

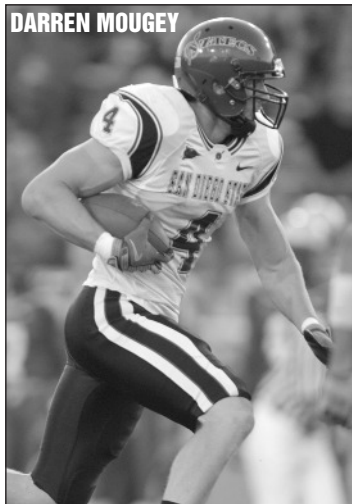
After scoring on its next drive, UNM's Jaymar Latchison recovered an Aztec fumble and returned it 28 yards for the Lobos' third touchdown of the first quarter.

In the second frame, Ferguson had back-to-back rushing TDs before New Mexico tacked on two more scores to take a commanding 49-0 lead into the break.

The Scarlet and Black's lone touchdown came in the third period when Lindley completed a 15-yard pass to Darren Mougey to conclude a 7-play, 61-yard drive that ate up 2:53 on the clock. SDSU was unable to get much else going, however, as the Lobos scored two more times in the final 15 minutes for the 70-7 victory.

Lindley, who had not played since suffering a shoulder injury in the first half of the TCU game, completed 18 of his 37 pass attempts for 156 yards. Mougey led the Aztec receivers with 53 yards and a touchdown on four catches.

Safety Corey Boudreaux, meanwhile, recorded his third consecutive double-digit tackle performance with a game-high 10 stops.

**SAN DIEGO** – In a back and forth battle that saw four ties, it was Colorado State who was able to take the lead late in the game and hold off the Aztecs, 38-34, at Qualcomm Stadium.

San Diego State recorded a season-best 226 rushing yards, but lost the battle in total offense (507-392). Junior Atiyyah Henderson led the Scarlet and Black with a career-high 177 yards on 25 carries.

After going three and out on its first drive, SDSU appeared to be in the same situation during its next possession, but freshman Brian Stahovich pulled off a fake punt and ran 21 yards for the first down. The Aztecs capitalized on their second chance as Henderson eventually reached the end zone on a 1-yard rush.

CSU got on the board before the end of the first 15 minutes of play when Jason Smith converted a 43-yard field goal, but junior Lane Yoshida responded with a field goal of his own from the same distance, giving the Scarlet and Black a 10-7 lead early in the second period.

Just under five minutes later, the Rams recorded their first TD of the evening to tie the game, but the Aztecs responded once again, this time with a 10-yard touchdown pass from redshirt freshman Ryan Lindley to sophomore Vincent Brown.

CSU evened the playing field (17-17) in the third frame when Dion Morton ran 12 yards for the score at the 12:37 mark. It didn't take long for SDSU to regain the lead, however, as junior Davion Mauldin tallied his first career touchdown on a 93-yard kickoff return. The return was the eighth-longest in school history and the longest overall since 1997.

The Rams then took their first lead of the night after Morton and Kory Sperry notched their second TDs of the game, but the Aztecs would not be outdone as Henderson tied it up at 31 with a 72-yard touchdown run with 1:03 remaining in the quarter.

CSU went ahead 38-31 early in the final period before SDSU closed the gap to four on a 33-yard FG by Yoshida. After getting a key defensive stop, the Scarlet and Black was primed to complete a come-from-behind victory as Lindley found Campbell down the field to get to the Rams' 41-yard line, but the Aztecs' run was stopped short on the following play when Jake Galusha picked off Lindley's pass to secure the win for Colorado State.

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** – San Diego State received a 311-yard passing performance from redshirt freshman Ryan Lindley and drove inside the Wyoming 18-yard line five times but was denied victory in a 35-10 loss to Wyoming at War Memorial Stadium.

The Aztecs struck first, driving 43 yards on their opening series before settling for a 35-yard field goal from Lane Yoshida. It marked the first time in 2008 that San Diego State had scored on its opening drive of the game.

The Cowboys responded on their second series of the game by driving 89 yards in 12 plays and converting three third-down situations en route to a Devin Moore 35-yard touchdown run.

The Aztec defense forced two three-and-out series in Wyoming's first three possessions to keep the score in check. But the Cowboys struck for three second quarter touchdowns, including two scores in the final 2:25 of the first half to open up a 28-3 halftime lead.

Wyoming completed just six passes on the afternoon and was held to 166 total passing yards, but completed two big pass plays, one each on its final two drives of the half, to help set up the touchdowns.

After starting at its own 20-yard line, Wyoming converted a third-and-2 to set up a 69-yard touchdown pass play from Stutzriem to Stewart. That gave the Cowboys a 21-3 advantage.

Following an SDSU punt, Wyoming again struck for a big play, this time converting a 58-yard pass play to take the ball from the Cowboy 37-yard line to the Aztec five. Two plays later, Devin Moore had his third rushing touchdown of the half and Wyoming had a 25-point half-time lead.

The Aztecs took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove to the Cowboy 5-yard line, before the drive stalled. Later in the quarter, the Aztecs would secure a touchdown for their 23rd consecutive game, when Lindley found Justin Shaw from 26 yards out. It marked the first career score for the senior Shaw.

Lindley continued his remarkable freshman campaign, recording his third 300-yard passing game and setting a school freshman record for most pass attempts without throwing an interception.

Senior Corey Boudreaux posted a game-high 13 tackles, including 11 solo stops, while senior linebacker Russell Allen posted his 10th career double-digit tackle game with 11.

The start of the game was promising for SDSU as it forced the high-powered BYU offense to a three-and-out situation. Brigham Young would pull away at the end of the half as it scored on a six-yard pass from Max Hall to Andrew George and a 25-yard field goal after consecutive three-and-out possessions for SDSU.

Leading 27-0 coming out of halftime, BYU kicked off to Aztec returner Mekell Wesley and he promptly fumbled the ball after a 23-yard return, which was recovered by the Cougars at the SDSU 29.

Hall took it from there and took advantage of the short field as he hit Dennis Pitta for a 13-yard gain, gave the ball to Wayne Latu, who picked up five yards, and then took it himself for an eight-yard gain, setting the stage for Latu's three-yard scoring run.

The game remained at 27-0 until the Aztecs dented the scoreboard thanks to Lane Yoshida's career-long 49-yard field goal.

On BYU's next possession, Corey Boudreaux knocked the ball away from Latu on 2nd and 3, giving the Aztecs excellent field position at their own 42. Six plays and 2:16 later, Yoshida was perfect from 34 yards out to cut the Cougar lead to 27-6 entering the fourth quarter.

Following six unanswered San Diego State points, the Cougars struck fast in the final stanza and went ahead 34-6 after Hall connected on a deep ball to Austin Collie for a 61-yard scoring pass. After that, Darren Mougey had the ball jarred loose, again giving BYU excellent field position, this time at their own 49. Seven plays later, Hall found Collie again for a nine-yard toss, making the score 41-6.

With 3:01 left in the game, Lindley directed a five-play, 2:12-drive that covered 31 yards and ended with Mougey grabbing a nine-yard TD pass in the back of the endzone. The extra point failed and BYU ran out the rest of the clock to emerge with its ninth win of the year.

**SAN DIEGO** – The San Diego State football team showed off a strong passing attack but it was not enough as the Aztecs fell to eighth-ranked and eventual Sugar Bowl champion Utah, 63-14, at Qualcomm Stadium. The game marked the second straight contest for San Diego State against a Mountain West Conference opponent ranked in the Top 25.

The Aztecs trailed by 21 points entering the fourth quarter but the Utes piled on 28 points in the final stanza, including a pair of lengthy interception returns for touchdowns to provide the final margin.

Utah quarterback Brian Johnson, who later earned Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors, connected on 27-of-38 passes for 283 yards and five touchdowns. Freddie Brown, who this past April was selected in the NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals, caught 11 passes for 110 yards and two touchdown strikes.

Utah ended the game with 520 yards of total offense and an additional 250 yards on returns.

SDSU freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley completed 23-of-41 passes for 247 yards and two touchdowns on the afternoon. Lindley got the Aztecs on the board in the second quarter when he found senior wide receiver Darren Mougey on a 31-yard touchdown strike. Mougey finished the game with five catches and a team-high 85 yards receiving.

Lindley's second touchdown of the game proved to be the only points scored for either team in the third quarter. San Diego State capped a 17-play, 95-yard drive with a 16-yard pass from Lindley to senior wide receiver Justin Shaw.

San Diego State had additional opportunities to put points on the board, but missed a field goal and had two turnovers in Utah territory.

A pair of Aztecs reached double figures in tackles as Andrew Preston recorded 12 stops and senior Russell Allen added 11 tackles and in the process became SDSU's all-time leading tackler in assisted tackles.

With the victory, the Aztecs finished the season at 2-10 (1-7 Mountain West Conference) and won its final conference contest for the seventh time in the last eight years. UNLV, which was trying to become bowl eligible, finished at 5-7 (2-6 MWC).

Although UNLV took an early 7-0 lead in the first quarter, the Aztecs would even the score when Lindley hit DeMarco Sampson with a six-yard pass for the touchdown.

San Diego State continued to roll as the Aztecs scored two unanswered touchdowns in the second quarter on runs by seniors Tyler Campbell and Darren Mougey.

The Rebels, who trailed 21-7, pulled to within a touchdown at 21-14 when Channing Trotter scored with 17 seconds left in the third quarter. San Diego State, however, exploded with 21 fourth-quarter points.

Lindley, who broke his own freshman record for completions, hooked up with Atiyah Henderson on a 12-yard scoring strike, making it 28-14. After UNLV's Mike Clausen threw his second TD pass to Ryan Wolfe making it 28-21, Campbell added his second rushing touchdown with 4:16 left in the game.

Free safety Corey Boudreaux capped the night with an 82-yard interception for a touchdown for the 42-21 Aztecs' win.

Vincent Brown led San Diego State receivers with eight receptions for 119 yards and notched his second career 100-yard receiving game of his career in the first half alone. Alston Umuolo, meanwhile, finished the game with a career-best eight grabs for 74 yards. Luke Lao-lagi anchored the SDSU defense with 12 tackles and a forced fumble and recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter.

Lindley became the 14th Aztec in school history with three or more 300-yard passing games after throwing for 387 yards. His 35 completions also tied him for third in the SDSU single-game record book.

Clausen was 26-for-40 for 316 yards and Wolfe had 11 receptions for 144 yards for UNLV.
