

No. 22 SDSU and No. 9 UCLA to Meet in LA For Sunday Showdown

In a battle between the top-two teams in the Pac-12 Conference, the No. 22 San Diego State men's soccer team travels to Los Angeles Sunday to meet No. 9 UCLA at 5 p.m. PT. The Aztecs enter Sunday's contest with a 8-2-2 record, including a 3-1 mark in the Pac-12, while the Bruins are 9-3-1 and 4-0. Both teams are ranked in all five national polls with a high of No. 22 by SDSU (*Soccer America*) and No. 9 by UCLA (NSCAA/Continental Tire; *Soccer Times*).

Noting the Aztecs

* San Diego State is off to a 8-2-2 (.750) start, matching its best start to a season in 20 years, when the Aztecs started 9-1-2 (.833) in 1991 ... SDSU's last .750 start was 2005 (7-1-4) ... The .750 winning percentage is tied for the 15th-best mark in school history.

* San Diego State is 3-1 in the Pac-12 Conference, tied for its best start to league play since it joined in 2005 ... The Aztecs started the 2007 conference slate with a 3-1 mark, but lost their next match ... SDSU only trails UCLA (4-0).

* San Diego State had its eight-game unbeaten streak snapped on Sunday in a heartbreaking 3-2 loss at Washington ... The Aztecs outscored the opposition, 18-4, over the eight matches ... The eight-game unbeaten streak was the longest since an eight-match undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the sixth longest in program history.

* The Aztecs are still nationally ranked in all five polls for the third season in program history (also 2005, 2010) ... SDSU is ranked 22nd by *Soccer America* and *College Soccer News*, 24th by NSCAA/Continental Tire, 25th by *Soccer Times* and 30th by *Top Drawer Soccer*.

* San Diego State is sixth in the latest NSCAA/Continental Tire Far Region poll, two spots down from last week's No. 4 rating.

* The Aztecs saw their four-match winning streak snapped on Sept. 24 when they tied Central Arkansas, 0-0, in double-overtime ... The four-game winning streak was SDSU's fourth since it joined the Pac-12 (other times were in 2005, 2007 and 2010) ... The last time San Diego State won five straight games was 2005.

* The Aztecs won the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament on Sept. 9-11 after going 2-0 ... It was SDSU's first outright CMSDC title in four tries ... San Diego State was co-champions in 2009 and runner-ups (via goal differential) in 2010 ... The Aztecs are 6-1-1 all-time at the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament and are unbeaten over their last seven in the tourney ... SDSU's only loss in the tournament was a 3-2 overtime setback to Michigan on Sept. 5, 2008 ... San Diego State is an impressive 10-0-2 in tournament games since 2009.

* The Aztecs have won 15 consecutive matches when leading at the half.

* Among the national leaders, SDSU is tied for 15th in winning percentage (.750), tied for 19th in goals per game (2.08) and 45th in goals against average (0.96) ... Individually, sophomore Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) is tied for 57th in assists per match (0.42).

* San Diego State is outscoring the opposition, 25-12 ... The +13 scoring margin is the best in the league (UCLA is second at +8).

* The Aztecs are outshooting their opponents, 211-117, through 12 games, including a 86-55 advantage on net ... SDSU leads the Pac-12 in a host of categories, including points (tied, 78) and points per game (6.50), goals (25) and goals per game (2.08), shots (211) and shots per game (17.58) ... In the individual rankings, redshirt sophomore Blake Hylan (San Diego/Torrey Pines HS) is second in goals against average (0.97), tied for second in shutouts (3) and fourth in saves per game (3.64), Byass is third in shots per game (3.75), tied for third in assists per game (0.42) and fourth in points per game (1.08), and redshirt sophomore Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) is third in goals per game (0.42) and fifth in points per game (1.00).

* Hylan had a streak of 356 minutes, 24 seconds played without allowing a goal snapped on Oct. 2 in a 2-1 win over California.

* Junior Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) and sophomore Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) have each started 31 consecutive games, the longest active streaks on the team. Steres has the next longest at 23.

Scouting the Bruins

UCLA comes into the weekend with a 9-3-1 record, including a 4-0 mark in the Pac-12, which leads the league. The Bruins are 9-1 over their last 10 matches, outscoring the opposition, 20-9. UCLA is ranked in all five polls, including No. 9 by NSCAA/Continental Tire and *Soccer Times*, No. 10 by *Soccer America* and *College Soccer News*, and No. 12 by *Top Drawer Soccer*.

Chandler Hoffman leads the league in scoring with 20 points on nine goals and two assists. The nine goals also lead the Pac-12. Kelyn Rowe has 15 points on five goals and five helpers, while Ryan Hollingshead (two goals, three assists) and Victor Munoz (one goal, five assists) have seven points apiece. Brian Rowe has been the team's top goalkeeper, posting a 8-2-1 record to go along with a 1.06 goals against average and three shutouts over 1,022:26.

* **THE SERIES:** UCLA owns a commanding lead in the series, 30-4-12 (.783 win percentage) ... In SDSU's Pac-12 era (since 2005), the Bruins lead, 5-1-6 (.667) ... San Diego State was 1-2-3 against UCLA from 2005-07, but have gone 0-3-3 over the last three seasons ... Only two (Oct. 15, 2008 and Nov. 13, 2010) of the 12 meetings in the Pac-12 era have been decided by more than one goal ... Six of the 12 games in the series in the Pac-12 era have gone into overtime ... SDSU is 0-5-3 against the Bruins when UCLA is nationally ranked (NSCAA/Continental Tire) ... Sunday will be the fourth meeting between the two schools when each was ranked (NSCAA/Continental Tire) ... The Aztecs are 0-2-1 in those games.

Last Weekend With the Aztecs

SDSU went 1-1 last weekend in the Pacific Northwest, downing Oregon State, 3-1, on Friday, before falling at Washington, 3-2, on Sunday. Five different Aztecs - sophomore Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.), freshman Tyler Smith (Huntington Beach, Calif.), sophomore Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.), senior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) and redshirt sophomore Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) - scored a goal, while Byass led the team with three points (one goal, one assist).

F Miles Byass, D Tyler Smith and D Casey Meuser each scored a goal in a 3-1 SDSU win at Oregon State ... The Aztecs improved to 8-1-2 overall, matching their best start to a season since 1988 (9-1-1), and 3-0 in the Pac-12 Conference, tying its best league start (2007) since it joined the conference in 2005 ... Additionally, SDSU stretched its unbeaten streak to eight matches (7-0-1), its longest since 2007 (7-0-1) ... The last time a San Diego State team had a longer unbeaten streak in a season was 2005 (7-0-2) ... Assists went to Byass, MF Evyn Hewett, MF Chance Marden and D Daniel Steres ... Byass had a team-high four shots, while MF Jose Altamirano had three attempts ... D Justin Davies and Meuser each added two shots apiece ... GK Blake Hylan had five saves over 90 minutes ... Meuser earned Man of the Match honors for his play after scoring the team's final goal in the 83rd minute and tied his career high with two shots. Meuser also kept the Beavers to many long range shots from the backline.

Washington's Jacob Hustedt converted a penalty kick in the 87th minute to give the host Huskies (6-3-2, 1-2 Pac-12) a 3-2 come-from-behind victory over No. 18 San Diego State ... The Aztecs (8-2-2, 3-1 Pac-12) saw their eight-game unbeaten streak come to an end with the loss ... SDSU had rallied from a 1-0 deficit with back-to-back goals by D Daniel Steres and F Jordan Ongaro in the 67th and 78th minute, respectively, before UW tied it up on a Casey McCool goal in the 80th minute ... At the 86:34 mark, a San Diego State player was whistled for a foul inside the box. ... Hustedt then finished the penalty kick into the back of the net for the game-winner ... The Aztecs lost for the first time since Sept. 4 after going 7-0-1 over their previous eight matches ... F Miles Byass had three shots to pace the SDSU offense, while MF Kody Duff and Ongaro came off the bench to contribute two shots apiece ... GK Blake Hylen had another solid game with one of the goals allowed being a penalty kick and another on a throw-in/finish from close range ... Hylen (7-2-2) tied his career high with seven saves and challenged the UW attack throughout ... The bench collectively earned Men of the Match honors, with Duff, D Robbie Freise and Ongaro leading the way.

At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 12th year as head coach at San Diego State and 15th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 43-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to the Pac-10 (now Pac-12) in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 56-41-27 (.560), including a 23-24-17 (.492) mark in the competitive Pac-12.

Over his 11 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, 10 professional players, eight all-Far West selections and 57 all-conference picks.

Aztecs Ranked in All Five National Polls

After going 1-1 last weekend, the San Diego State men's soccer team remained nationally ranked in all five national polls. It is the third season that the Aztecs have been ranked in all five national polls at the same time since it joined the Pac-12 in 2005. The other times were 2005 and 2010.

SDSU is 22nd in the *Soccer America* poll, dropping four spots from its No. 18 ranking the previous week. San Diego State trails Old Dominion (No. 21) and Coastal Carolina (No. 20) for the top 20, and is ahead of Duke (No. 23), West Virginia (No. 24), and Cal State Bakersfield (No. 25) and Iona (No. 25).

In the NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, the Aztecs are ranked 24th with 68 points, a point behind West Virginia (69) for 23rd. Georgetown (No. 20), St. John's (No. 21), Duke (No. 22) and West Virginia (No. 23) are each ahead of SDSU, while Virginia was the last team in the top 25 with 49 points.

San Diego State is 25th in the *Soccer Times* national poll with 35 points, down from 54 points and No. 21 a week ago. Northern Illinois is right above the Aztecs with 37 points, while Virginia is the first team out with 29.

SDSU improved two spots in the *College Soccer News* poll to 22nd, which is ahead of James Madison (No. 23), Duke (No. 24), Cal State Bakersfield (No. 25), Furman (No. 26), Northern Illinois (No. 27), Virginia (No. 28), Monmouth (No. 29) and Cornell (No. 30).

Finally, in the *Top Drawer Soccer* poll, which is a running attempt to project the postseason NCAA tournament, including every automatic berth, San Diego State is ranked 30th, down two spots from last week's No. 30. The Aztecs are ahead of William & Mary (No. 28) and Ohio State (No. 29), and below Illinois-Chicago (No. 31) and Wisconsin (No. 32).

Start Me Up

The Aztecs are off to a 8-2-2 (.750) start this season. It matches San Diego State's best 12-game start in 20 years (SDSU started the 1991 season with a 9-1-2 mark (.833)) and is tied for 10th-best start in program history. The 2005 team also started with a .750 winning percentage (7-1-4) and went onto qualify for the NCAA tournament.

Of the 12 teams in program history that have started with at least a .750 winning percentage through 12 games, four - 2005, 1988, 1982 and 1981 - have made the NCAA tourney.

Unbeaten No More

San Diego State had its eight-game unbeaten streak snapped on Sunday with a 3-2 heartbreaking loss at Washington. The streak matches its longest streak since a nine-game undefeated span in 2005 (Sept. 2-Oct. 2) and is the longest since 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 7).

It is tied for the program's sixth-longest unbeaten streak (also Oct. 14-Nov. 6, 1988). Three of the teams - 2005, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longest unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

Captaining the Aztecs

Redshirt senior Pedro Adan (San Diego/Preuss HS) and senior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) joined the long list of captains in the storied program when they were announced to the team in the spring.

Now in his fifth season (he redshirted 2007), Adan has played in 58 games, earning starts in 46 of the them. He

Last year, Adan played a career-high 1,055 minutes and also set a career best in shots (16) and tied a career high in shots on goal (three). This season, Adan has two assists in 938 minutes (fifth on team and most of non-defenders and non-goalkeepers).

Steres, meanwhile, became the first two-time captain since Raul Bautista captained the squad in 2005 and 2006 (both NCAA tournament teams). Steres is a two-time all-Pac-10 honoree, including a second-team selection last year as a junior. He has started 60 times over his 64 appearances, registering 32 points on 12 goals and eight assists. Last year, Steres started all 18 games he appeared in, and had 10 points on four goals and two assists, despite playing mainly in the back. This season, Steres is third on the team with 11 points on four goals and three assists, while his 1,109 minutes lead the squad.

Jose Altamirano Ranked 67th in Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Top 100

San Diego State junior Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) has been named to the Top Drawer Soccer's preseason Men's National Top-100 list, the website announced on Aug. 22. The midfielder is ranked 67th on the initial list and only three players in the Pac-12 Conference have a better ranking.

Last season, Altamirano had 11 points on one goal and nine assists en route to being named a second-team all-Pac-10 selection. The nine assists led the Aztecs and ranked third in the league (second in assists per game (0.47)). One of five SDSU players to start all 19 games in 2010, Altamirano logged 1,549 minutes (81:32 per game), the most of all midfielders and forwards. A U.S. Under-20 National Team member and 2009 honorable mention all-Pac-10 pick, Altamirano also garnered first-team Pac-10 All-Academic Team honors last year.

This year, Altamirano is third on the team with eight points on three goals and two assists. His 32 corner kicks lead the team and he has 30 shots in 12 games.

In all, 10 players from the Pac-12 were named to the preseason list.

Aztecs Land Five on Top Drawer Soccer Pac-12 Top-20 List

Five San Diego State men's soccer players have been named to the Top Drawer Soccer Pac-12 Conference Top-20 list, the website recently announced. The five picks are tied with UCLA for the most in the league.

Senior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) (No. 4), junior Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) (No. 6) and sophomore Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) (No. 7) all cracked the top 10, while redshirt sophomores Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) and Blake Hylen (San Diego/Torrey Pines HS) are 13th and 20th, respectively.

Steres, who is the first two-time team captain since Raul Bautista (2005-06), has twice been an all-Pac-12 honoree, including a second-team selection last year as a junior. He has started 60 times over his 64 appearances, registering 32 points on 12 goals and eight assists. This season, Steres is third on the team with 11 points on four goals and three assists, despite playing in the back, while his 1,109 minutes lead the squad.

Altamirano is on the Pac-12 list after coming in at No. 67 on the website's preseason national top-100 list on Aug. 22. A two-time all-conference player, including a second-team pick in 2010, Altamirano has 23 career points on five goals and 13 assists. Last year, the midfielder had nine assists, which led the Aztecs and ranked third in the league (second in assists per game (0.47)). This season, Altamirano is third on the team with eight points on three goals and two assists.


Byass, a 2010 honorable mention all-Pac-12 selection, has picked up where he left off last year after scoring five goals over the final five games. This year, the forward leads SDSU with 13 points on four goals and five assists (also a team high). Dating back to last season, Byass has 23 points over his last 17 matches on nine goals and five assists. Byass ranks third in the Pac-12 in shots per game (3.75), is tied for third in assists per game (0.42) and is fourth in points per game (1.08).

Ongaro, who gained valuable international experience by playing with the Canada U-20 National Team at the 2011 CONCACAF Championships in the spring, leads the team with five goals and is second with 12 points. Additionally, he has already matched his two assists that he had last year as a redshirt freshman. A forward, Ongaro is ranked third in the league in goals per game (0.42) and fifth in points per game (1.00). Eleven of his 22 shots have been on net.

Hylen, starting for the first time after playing five minutes off the bench last year as a redshirt freshman, continues to shine in net for San Diego State, going 7-2-2 with a 0.97 goals against average over 1,020 minutes. He has 40 saves over the 11 games, a .784 save percentage and three shutouts. Hylen, who had to replace four-year starter Brad Byrns, is second in the Pac-12 in GAA, tied for second in shutouts and fourth in saves per game (3.64).

SDSU Picked Fourth in Pac-12 Poll

San Diego State has been picked to finish fourth in the 2011 Pac-12 preseason poll, the league announced on Aug. 16.

The Aztecs garnered 13 points, three behind third-place Washington (16). UCLA has been selected to win the regular season title with 25 points, including five first-place votes, while California was picked second (21) with the other first-place vote. Stanford's 10 points were fifth in the poll and Oregon State was sixth with five points.

San Diego State is scheduled to play 19 matches in 2011, highlighted by home contests against 2010 NCAA semifinalist Michigan (Oct. 22), 2010 NCAA second round participant Penn (Sept. 11) and Pac-10 foes California (Oct. 2) and UCLA (Nov. 12), which both advanced to the 2010 NCAA quarterfinals.

Former Aztec Joe Corona Called Up to Mexican U-22 National Team

Former San Diego State men's soccer player Joe Corona (San Diego/Sweetwater HS) has recently been called up to the Mexican Under-22 National Team.

Corona, who chose Mexico over the United States and El Salvador, was called up to the team on Aug. 24 in preparation for a pair of friendlies with Chile on Sept. 2 and Sept. 6. Corona is one of 23 players on the current roster.

Prior to his call-up, Corona had started all six matches with the Tijuana Xolotlco of Mexico's first division, where he scored two goals on nine shots (four on net).

Corona is the ninth Aztec since 2006 to be called up to a national team, joining current players Jose Altamirano (United States U-20's), Jordan Ongaro (Canada U-20's) and John Pegg (Canada U-20's), and former players Nick Cardenas (U.S. U-20's), Kraig Chiles (U.S. Futsal), Myles Davis (Canada U-23's), Tally Hall (U.S. U-23's) and Omar Persad (Jamaica U-20's).

Other current SDSU players who have been part of the national pool or played for a national team prior to coming to Montezuma Road include Gemechu Abraham (U.S. U-17's), Kevin Bick (U.S. U-18's), Miles Byass (U.S. U-18's), Daniel Kohen (U.S. Maccabiah team), Ongaro (Canada U-17 and U-20's) and Abraham Villon (U.S. U-15, U-16, U-17 and U-18's).

Corona spent one year with San Diego State before joining the professional ranks, accumulating seven points in 2008 on three goals and an assist in just 501 minutes. A midfielder, he played in 15 matches, earning three starts.

Former Aztec Kraig Chiles Named to U.S. Futsal National Team Pool

Former San Diego State men's soccer player Kraig Chiles (San Diego/Poway HS) has been named to the United States Futsal National Team pool, U.S. head coach Keith Tozer recently announced.

Chiles was initially one of 42 players invited to the first-ever U.S. Futsal Identification (ID) camp from Sept. 12-15 at "Soccer City" in Torrance, Calif. The camp was designed to identify the top Futsal players in the country with the goal of strengthening the U.S. team that will attempt to qualify for the 2012 FIFA Futsal World Cup in Thailand.

After three days of intense training, Tozer selected Chiles and 19 others to attend the full national team training camp (Sept. 24-Oct.1), also in Torrance. From there, Tozer and the coaching staff will pick a roster of 13 that will represent the U.S. at the Grand Prix of Futsal in Manaus, Brazil, from Oct. 24-31.

"Kraig has proven to be a goal scorer in all forms of soccer - outdoor, indoor and now Futsal," Tozer said. "I am very happy to have him join the U.S. National Team and strongly believe as he gains Futsal experience he will only get better."

"As a soccer player, there is no greater accomplishment in your career than representing your country," Chiles said. "As a kid I dreamt about putting on the USA jersey, but I never thought it was something I'd realistically be able to do. I'm honored to be in this pool of players and I'm going to give everything I have to help this team (at the Grand Prix of Futsal) in Brazil and qualify for the World Cup."

Last season, Chiles capped an impressive showing in the Premier Arena Soccer League by leading the San Diego Sockers to their second consecutive championship and 12th overall title. Chiles was named the tournament's most valuable player after scoring four goals in the championship victory over La Raza de Guadalajara. He added a goal in the Sockers' 7-3 win over Mexico City in the semifinal match.

Chiles, who also garnered regular season MVP honors, led the league with 38 goals. He added 12 assists for 50 points, a Sockers' PASL-pro record.

Chiles scored 21 times over his career with the Aztecs (2003-07). He was a three-time all-Pac-10 (now Pac-12) Conference selection, earning first-team honors in 2007, honorable mention accolades in 2006 and second-team recognition in 2005.

In his final year on Montezuma Road, Chiles led the Pac-10 in shots (62) and was second with 20 points on eight goals and four assists. He also led SDSU in games started (19) and shots on goal (26).
