Utes Travel to San Diego, Face Aztecs Wednesday Night

The University of Utah men's basketball team will hit the road for the west coast this week. The Runnin' Utes will play a Mountain West Conference game at San Diego State Wednesday night at 8 p.m. PST.

Utah enters Saturday's game with a 10-4 overall record and a 1-0 Mountain West Conference mark. The Utes are coming off an 83-64 victory over Dixie State Jan. 9 at the Huntsman Center. It was the final non-conference game of the regular season for Utah. Luke Nevill scored 19 points and Johnnie Bryant came off the bench to add 19 more in the victory. It was Utah's best shooting night of the season. The Runnin' Utes converted from the field at a .620 clip.

San Diego State is 12-4 (2-0 MWC) coming into the contest. The Aztecs' last outing was a 72-67 road win at New Mexico. San Diego State overcame a 14-point, first-half deficit to take the five-point victory at The Pit. Lorenzo Wade scored 19 of his 23 points in the second half for the Aztecs in that win. SDSU's other league win was over TCU to open MWC play.

Utah Head Coach Jim Boylen



Jim Boylen was named the 14th men's head basketball coach at the University of Utah on March 27, 2007. Although this is his first head coaching position, Boylen brings 20 years of coaching experience in the collegiate and professional ranks with him to Utah.

After working in the NBA for 13 years, Boylen served as the top assistant to Tom Izzo at Michigan State during the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons. He helped direct the Spartans to a 45-24 record and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.

Boylen also began his coaching career at Michigan State, working under former head coach Jud Heathcote from 1987-92. After serving as a graduate assistant for two seasons he was promoted to a full-time assistant in 1989, filling that role for three years. The Spartans won the Big Ten Conference title and advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament in 1990. Michigan State also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1991 and 1992.

Following his first stint at Michigan State, Boylen joined the Houston Rockets as a video coordinator in 1992 and was promoted to assistant coach just two years later. With Boylen on staff, the Rockets won back-to-back NBA Championships in 1994 and 1995 and advanced to the NBA Western Conference Finals in 1997.

During Boylen's 11-year stint in Houston, the Rockets made seven playoff appearances and had nine winning seasons. While coaching with the Rockets, Boylen worked with four of the NBA's 50 Greatest Players in Charles Barkley, Clyde Drexler, Hakeem Olajuwon and Scottie Pippen.

While in Houston, Boylen also worked under Rudy Tomjanovich -- one of the greatest coaches in NBA history. Boylen's duties included skill development, game and practice preparation, working with the perimeter players, as well as positioning and shooting. He was also in charge of team and opponent analysis. In 2003-04, Boylen worked as an assistant coach at Golden State. He spent the 2004-05 season with the Milwaukee Bucks.

A native of East Grand Rapids, Mich., Boylen received his bachelor's degree in business from Maine in 1987. He captained the Black Bears' basketball team as a junior and senior and earned first-team all-North Atlantic Conference honors in his final year, averaging 21 points per game. He finished second in the conference Player of the Year voting to Northeastern's Reggie Lewis.

Boylen and his wife, Christine, have two daughters, Ashlen Clare and Layla Blue.

Runnin' Ute Fast Breaks

- Three Utah players are averaging double-digit points per game, while two more average 7.8 or more.
- Utah's 22-point win over Air Force was its largest margin of victory in a conference game since topping TCU 80-45 (35-point margin) on Jan. 28, 2006.
- Utah has held five different opponents to 54 points or less this season. The Runnin' Utes did not hold a single 2006-07 opponent to less than 55 points.
- Utah holds a 506-321 (.611) record against current members of the Mountain West Conference. The Utes are .500-or-better against all eight other MWC teams.
- The Utes currently rank No. 1 in the MWC in field-goal percentage. The Utes are currently converting at a .506 clip, which also ranks No. 6 in the nation.
- Air Force's 36-point offensive output on Jan. 5 was the lowest total for a Utah opponent since the Falcons scored 35 against the Utes on Feb. 1, 2003.

Scouting the Aztecs

San Diego State is 12-4 (2-0 MWC) coming into this contest.

The Aztecs' last outing was a 72-67 toad win at New Mexico. San Diego State overcame a 14-point, first-half deficit to take the five-point victory at The Pit. Lorrenzo Wade scored 19 of his 23 points in the second half for the Aztecs in that win.

SDSU's other league win was over TCU to open MWC play. The Aztecs opened the season with five straight wins, before dropping a 77-69 decision at Cal. Three more wins were followed by a loss to St. Mary's. SDSU's other two losses came to nationally-ranked Arizona and to Northern Colorado.

The Aztecs are adept at taking the ball away, ranking 28th in the nation in steals per game (9.3).

Last Time vs. San Diego State (Feb. 27, 2007)

SALT LAKE CITY -- Ricky Johns scored a career-high 30 points in his final home game for Utah, leading the Utes to a 74-68 upset of San Diego State.

Playing with members of his family in the crowd, the senior guard from the Bronx, N.Y., made 11 of 13 shots, including six of seven three-point attempts, to far surpass his previous career-high of 18 points and lift the Utes to their second straight win.

The Aztecs had won seven of their last eight games, but could not overcome a dismal first half in which they shot just 34.6 percent and fell behind by 13 points.

SDSU shoots .450 from the field, but allows opponents to hit at a rate of .440. The Aztecs are not particularly strong at the free-throw line (.677).

Brandon Heath added 19 points, but missed two long three-point attempts in the final 45 seconds.

The Utes finished the first half on a 17-4 run to take a 32-19 halftime lead that they never relinquished - despite making only four of their nine free throws in the final 1:10.

Luke Nevill had 16 points and 11 rebounds for the Utes.

►► Last Time Out - Utah 83, Dixie State 64

Luke Nevill made all eight of his shots and scored 19 points as the Utah Utes shook off a sluggish start to beat Dixie State 83-64.

Johnnie Bryant added 19 points off the bench for the Utes, who won their sixth straight home game. It was the first meeting for Utah with the NCAA Division II Rebels since 1928.

The Utes committed a season-high 20 turnovers and shot poorly early, allowing the Rebels to stay close for awhile.

The Rebels trailed just 26-25 with 3 1/2 minutes left in the first half. But then Nevill took over. The 7-foot 1-inch center scored back-to-back three-point plays to ignite a 21-5 run spanning the halves. That gave Utah a 47-30 lead with 15:07 left, and the Utes pulled

away from there.

Ben Hartman led Dixie State with 18 points, while Kasey Winters added 12. But the Rebels committed 21 turnovers in their sixth straight loss, while the Utes shot 12-of-22 from three-point range and hit 62 percent overall. It was the best shooting night from the field for Utah this season.

Utah's Stephen Weigh suffered a knee injury in the first half and had to be helped off the floor. He did not return.

Coach Jim Boylen picked up his first technical foul as a head coach in the second half, for protesting a carrying violation called against Bryant.

►► Ute-nited Nations

The University of Utah men's basketball team is made up of student-athletes from five different nations and three of the seven continents. Of the 16 players on the Runnin' Ute roster, 11 hail from the United States and five are international. Two Utah players are from Australia --Luke Nevill and Stephen Weigh. The Utes' two Europeans are Kim Tillie (France) and Luka Drca (Serbia). For good measure, Utah adds a Canadian to the mix with Tyler Kepkey.

During the summer, the Utes would often scrimmage with a full international team against an American squad. For the internationals, Kepkey would play the point, while Drca manned the shooting guard spot. Stephen Weigh was the small forward, while Tillie and Nevill roamed the paint as the power forward and center, respectively.

►► Run and Shoot

Utah is easily the top shooting team in the Mountain West Conference at this point in the season. The Runnin' Utes lead the MWC in field-goal, 3-point field-goal and free-throw percentage. Utah has made more than half of its field-goal attempts in seven of its first 14 games. Utah is converting at a .506 clip from the field, which also ranks the Utes No. 6 in the nation. The Utes' .620 field-goal percentage vs. Dixie State was the team's best since shooting .707 against Air Force on Jan. 16, 2007. Utah also ranks No. 5 in the nation in 3-point field-goal percentage (.424) and No. 10 from the charity stripe (.760).

►► Take Two, They're Free

Utah is the top free-throw shooting team in the MWC. The Utes convert from the charity stripe at a rate of .760, a number that climbed steadily since a shaky start to the season. Utah was below 70 percent from the line in three of its first four games. Over the last 10 games, Utah is at .813 from the line. However, the Utes have shot fewer freebies (196) than any team in the MWC. No other team has attempted fewer than 247.

►► Tenacious D

ESPN.com's Reggie Rankin wrote that Utah head coach Jim Boylen "has installed one of the best team defensive packages in the country" recently. The Utes have held 12 of their 14 opponents this season to fewer points than their current averages. Utah ranks second in the Mountain West Conference and 29th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing an average of 60.2 points per game.

>> Cool Hand Luke



Junior center **Luke Nevill** ranked ninth in the nation in field-goal percentage last season, shooting .637. The 7-foot 1-inch Aussie hasn't been quite that hot this season. But he has converted at least 50 percent of his shot attempts in all but three games this season and is currently converting at a .517 clip. He currently ranks 4th in the conference and 91st in the nation in field-goal percentage. Nevill is 11th in the MWC in scoring (13.9 ppg), 2nd in blocked shots (1.57) and 3rd in rebounding (7.1).

>> Nevill's Numbers

Nevill became the 19th player in the 100-year history of Utah basketball to reach both the 1,000-point and 500-rebound marks against Air Force on Jan. 5. Nevill currently has 1,019 points in his Utah career. He became the 32nd player in Utah history to join the 1,000-Point Club. Nevill's current rebounding total sits at 514. He has reached double-digit boards four times this season and 18 times in his career.

>> Drca Droppin' Dimes



Utah head coach Jim Boylen calls sophomore guard **Luka Drca** one of his most creative players. As of late, Drca has been creating plenty of opportunities for his teammates. In his last five outings, Drca has averaged 5.3 assists per game. He set a new career-high for helpers with six vs. Idaho State. He matched that number again Dec. 31 at Gonzaga. Drca followed that up with five helpers vs. Air Force Jan. 5 and had five more vs. Dixie State last week. In addition to his playmaking ability, Drca scored a career-high 12 points vs. Dixie State.

>> Johnnie Be Good



Senior guard **Johnnie Bryant** became the 33rd member of Utah's 1,000-Point Club with his fifth point against Dixie State last week. Bryant now has a total of 1,014 points in his Ute career. Bryant has led Utah in scoring (or tied for the team lead) in four of the Utes' last five games. Despite coming off the bench and ranking fifth on the team in minutes per game, Bryant is the team's second-leading scorer. He is the only non-starter among the MWC's Top 20 scorers. Bryant's .455 3-point field-goal percentage is 3rd in the MWC and 24th in the country.

>> It's Easy Being Green



Junior **Shaun Green** has done a little bit of everything for the Utes this season. Green ranks fifth on the team in scoring (7.8 ppg) and third in rebounding (3.7 rpg). He's also second in blocked shots (0.86 bpg) and is third in assists (2.4 apg). Offensively, Green started slowly this season. He was averaging less than two points per game through four contests. But Green has reached double figures in five of his last 10 games. He's hit at least one 3-pointer in his last eight games.

Join The Club

Junior center **Luke Nevill** and senior guard **Johnnie Bryant** have both joined Utah's 1,000-Point Club this season, becoming the 32nd and 33rd Utes in the 100-year history of Utah Basketball to reach that milestone. It's only the third time in Utah history that teammates reached 1,000 points in the same season. Tom Chambers and Danny Vranes turned that trick in 1980, while Nick Jacobson and Britton Johnsen accomplished the feat in 2003.

Nevill currently ranks 31st all-time in career scoring at Utah, while Bryant needs just four points to move into the No. 32 spot. Both Nevill and Bryant reached 1,000 points in their third year at Utah. Of the 33 members of the 1,000-Point Club, 24 of them reached the 1,000-point mark in three years or less.

University of Utah basketball coach Jim Boylen announced his first class of recruits Nov. 16. The Runnin' Utes signed five student-athletes to National Letters-of-Intent during the early signing period. Joining the Utes in 2008-09 are guard Jordan Cyphers (Wichita, Kan.) guard Chris Hines (Houston, Texas), forward Josh Sharp (Highland, Utah), guard Jace Tavita (Salt Lake City) and center Jason Washburn (Battle Creek, Mich.).

Jordan Cyphers - 6-4, 190, Guard/Forward, Wichita Southeast HS: Team is 9-0, ranked No. 2 overall in the State of Kansas and No. 1 in Class 6A; Averaging 24 points and eight rebounds per game

Chris Hines - 6-0, 185, PG, Klein Forest HS: Team is 22-3 and ranked No. 1 in Texas Class 5A; Averaging 15 points, six assists per game

Josh Sharp - 6-7, 180, Forward, Lone Peak HS: Team is 10-2, ranked No. 1 in Utah Class 5A; Averaging 13 points, eight rebounds, three assists and three blocks per game

Jace Tavita - 6-3, 180, Guard, Brighton HS: Team is 9-3, ranked No. 5 in Utah Class 5A; Averaging 15 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists

Jason Washburn - 6-11, 210, Center, Battle Creek Central HS: Team is 8-1 and receiving votes in Michigan Class A rankings; Averaging 12 points, 10 rebounds, four blocks, 3.5 assists

100 Seasons of Utah Basketball

2007-08 will mark the 100th season of basketball at the University of Utah. The Runnin' Utes will enter their 100th season with an overall record of 1,595-833. Utah ranks 10th in NCAA history in all-time winning percentage with a .657 mark. Utah also ranks 10th in the NCAA in all-time victories.

Utah has won three national championships -- the 1916 AAU Championship, the 1944 NCAA Championship and the 1947 NIT title. Utah is one of only 35 schools ever to win the NCAA Division I men's basketball title.

Home Sweet Huntsman

The University of Utah men's basketball team has enjoyed great success in the Jon M. Huntsman Center since the arena was constructed in 1969.

The Runnin' Utes are 245-30 (.890) in the Huntsman Center over the past 18 seasons. The Utes' all-time record in the 39-year-old facility is 477-101 (.825).

In conference home games over the last 13 years, Utah is 87-11 (.887). Seven of those losses have come in the last two years.

Utah finished 9-6 at home last season, winning five of its last six home games. Five of the Utes' home losses came by a combined 18 points. The last time the Utes lost six home games in a season was 1988-89 when they went 11-7 in the Huntsman Center.

Conference Domination

Utah has won 11 regular-season conference titles over the last 17 years. Only Kansas has won more league championships in that same span. Utah is tied with Kentucky and Penn for the second-best run of conference championships in the past 17 years.

All-time, Utah has won 28 regular-season conference titles, the fifth most in NCAA history. Kansas is first with 50 titles, followed by Kentucky (43), Western Kentucky (38) and North Carolina (34).

Upon joining the Mountain West Conference, Utah won the conference title the first two years of the league's existence. Those two championships extended a string of seven straight regular-season conference titles. Utah has won half of the regular-season titles handed out in the eight-year history of the MWC. The Utes won MWC championships in 2000 (10-4, shared with UNLV), 2000-01 (10-4, shared with BYU and Wyoming), 2003 (11-3, shared with BYU) and 2005 (13-1, outright championship).




