

All requests for working credentials (press, radio, television, scouting) should be directed to Jim Solien at least 24 hours prior to tip-off. Faxed inquiries may be sent to 619-582-6541. Credentials will not be mailed. They may be picked up at the media entrance at Viejas Arena (lower level) two hours prior to the start of all home games.

CAMPUS PARKING

Media desiring to cover Aztec practices on campus can park in the Viejas Arena Lot L and obtain a special parking pass at the Viejas Arena office. Media parking (via permit) will be provided for all home games in Parking Structure 4, adjacent to Viejas Arena.

DIRECTIONS TO VIEJAS ARENA

Take I-8 East to the College Avenue exit. Take College Avenue south towards SDSU. Turn right on Montezuma Road. Turn right on 55th Street. Viejas Arena is on the right-hand side.

PRACTICE AND INTERVIEWS

Media wishing to attend practice should contact the Aztec media relations department at least one day in advance.

Head coach Stacie Terry and the players are generally available to meet with the media following each workout, as requested. Coaches and players are also available to conduct television and radio interviews, which must be set up through the media relations office at 619-594-2576.

Please request all interviews with a minimum of 24 hours notice. San Diego State players and coaches will not be available for interviews on game days until postgame.

GAMEDAY SERVICES

The Aztec media relations office furnishes game programs, pregame notes and media guides prior to each game in the media room at Viejas Arena. Play-by-play accounts, halftime and final statistics and shot charts are also provided.

AZTEC BASKETBALL ON THE INTERNET

For the 13th consecutive year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of regular season and conference tournament games over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU graduate Chris Ello (play-by-play) begins his seventh season with the team and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. He currently plays host to a daily sports talk radio show, "The World of Sports According to Chris & Ben", on the all-sports station, XTRA Sports 1360 AM.

Ello started his career in sports talk in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has experience doing play-by-play for a variety of different sports at every level, including stints with the Aztec football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads. The last three years, Ello has served as the color analyst for the SDSU football broadcasts.

From 1996-2006, he was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). Ello also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

Ello is a 1985 graduate of San Diego State with a bachelor's degree in journalism, where he spent two seasons with the baseball team from 1980-81 as a left-handed pitcher. A former sports editor at the Daily Aztec, he resides in Rancho San Diego with his wife, Lori.

During the 2013-14 campaign, all regular-season Aztec home contests will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

MOUNTAIN WEST DIGITAL NETWORK

The Mountain West Conference, in collaboration with Campus Insiders and Volar Video, will greatly expand the video content and reach of its digital network starting in the fall of 2013. Campus Insiders, a partnership between Silver Chalice Ventures and IMG College, goes beyond the traditional sports media experience, giving dedicated fans an insider's perspective that includes behind-the-scenes content, original video programming (including hosts Bonnie Bernstein and Seth Davis), and live streaming events.

Mountain West institutions will produce over 175 women's basketball games during the 2013-14 season on the Mountain West Network. Games will be live-streamed for free on the network. Every stream will be available on the MWN (TheMW.com) and on instutional sites.

SEASON PREVIEW NOTES

AZTECS TABBED FOR PRESEASON HONORS

Coming off its second straight regular-season Mountain West title, San Diego State received a number of preseason accolades.

Individually, junior forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-MW team for the first time in her career, senior center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

Johnson is the fourth consecutive SDSU player to earn MW preseason freshman of the year honors, following in the respective footsteps of teammates Deajane Scurry and Desi Culberson, as well as Melissa Sweat, who received such distinction prior to the 2010-11 campaign.

Similarly, Warren's selection represents the fourth time in the past five seasons that an Aztec women's basketball student-athlete has been tabbed MW preseason newcomer of the year after Chelsea Hopkins (2011-12), Courtney Clements (2010-11) and Jessika Bradley (2009-10), all of whom went on to capture the postseason award following their first years in the league.

As a team, San Diego State was picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. The Aztecs collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes. New Mexico was picked to finish fourth behind SDSU, followed by UNLV, Utah State, Colorado State, Boise State, San José State, Nevada and Air Force.

This year marks the first time since the beginning of the 2007-08 campaign that SDSU has not been selected first or second in the MW preseason poll.

2012-13 REWIND

San Diego State enjoyed a memorable campaign in 2012-13. Below are some of the accomplishments of last year's team:

• The Aztecs captured their second consecutive Mountain West regular-season championship, finishing with a program-best 27 victories and .794 winning percentage. SD-SU's 27-7 record marked the team's fourth campaign with 20 or more wins in the last five years.

• The Aztecs also earned a spot in postseason play for the fourth time in the last five years, advancing to the second round of the WNIT.

• In addition to its victory total, SDSU established several other team records last season, including three-pointers made (164), three-pointers attempted (519), field-goal percentage defense (.337), defensive rebounds (880) and fewest turnovers (448).


• The Aztecs became just the second team in MW history to post an 8-0 record on the road in conference play, joining Utah in 2008.

• SDSU received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 on nine occasions last year and picked up a vote in the final *USA Today* Coaches Poll of the season.

THE YEAR IN NUMBERS

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Below are some of the team's 2012-13 statistical highlights.

• San Diego State led the Mountain West for all games in scoring defense (52.7 ppg), field-goal percentage defense



(.337), three-point field-goal percentage defense (.282), scoring margin (+15.6), blocked shots (5.59/gm), offensive rebound percentage (.399) and victories (27).

• The Aztecs ranked among the nation's top-50 teams in field-goal percentage defense (7th), blocked shots per game (9th), turnovers per game (12th), scoring margin (15th), scoring defense (19th), assist-turnover ratio (40th) and rebounding margin (45th).

• SDSU's 68.4 scoring average and 40.6 rebounding average were the highest since the 1994-95 campaign when it averaged 69.4 points and 41.3 boards per outing.

 The Aztecs limited opponents to 50 points or fewer in 17 out of 34 contests, including back-to-back games of 39 points in the first two rounds of the Mountain West tournament.

Of SDSU's 27 victories, 24 were of the double-digit variety, including five over 30 points.

• The Aztecs went 27-2 when the opposition shot under 40 percent from the field.

 San Diego State held its adversaries to three or fewer three-point field goals in a game on 20 occasions, including a 9-for-47 (19 percent) clip over the final five contests of the regular season.

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT 2013-14

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in Aztec basketball history, here are a few other things to look for in 2013-14:

• SDSU finished its regular-season home campaign with a 14-2 record in 2012-13. Combined with the 2011-12 squad that posted a 13-1 mark, the Aztecs recorded back-to-back seasons with double-digit wins at home for the just the third time in school history, following the 2008-09 (15-1) and the 2009-10 (12-2) teams, along with the 1995-96 (13-0) and 1996-97 (11-2) squads.

Overall, SDSU enters the season having claimed 27 of its last 30 home games and has gone 59-15 on the Viejas Arena floor since the start of the 2008-09 campaign.

 The Aztecs have recorded 56 Mountain West victories in the last five seasons after posting 31 wins in the league's first nine years.

• SDSU is 51-1 over the last two seasons when leading with five minutes to go in the game. The Aztecs' lone blemish during that stretch was a heartbreaking 59-58 loss at Washington in December 2012.

 SDSU has advanced to the final of the Mountain West Championship five out of the last six years, after not winning a single game in the MW tournament's first eight years of existence.

• Stacie Terry becomes the second first-year head coach in Aztec program history to assume the reins of a defending regular-season conference champion after Barb Smith in 1997-98.

THE 2013-14 AZTECS

> **Back Again:** San Diego State returns just one starter from last year's record-setting squad in junior Erimma Amarikwa, who collected third-team all-Mountain West honors in 2012-13. Five other letterwinners are back in senior Danesha Long, juniors Desi Culberson, Ahjalee Harvey, Khristina Hunter and sophomore Aleiah Brandon.

> Noting the Newcomers: Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

> With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.
