

2008 SEASON RECAP

It was a series of up's and down's for the 2008 San Diego State women's soccer team.


The up's: three blowout victories by a combined 14-0 margin, an impressive win over Pac-10 power Arizona State and 32 goals scored, the program's most since the 2002 season.

The down's: five one-goal losses, including three overtime setbacks, a 2-4-1 record in the Mountain West Conference (SDSU's worst in the 10-year history of the league) and 31 goals allowed, SDSU's most since 2002.

The Aztecs kicked off the season on the road for the fourth time in five seasons with a match at Cal State Northridge. It started out well for San Diego State when Heather Vandevanter connected on a pass from Brittany Bennett in the 42nd minute for the 1-0 lead. Like what would happen three more times in the season, however, SDSU would relinquish its lead as the Matadors scored once in the 64th minute and again in the second OT to take the 2-1 victory.

San Diego State bounced back one week later with an impressive 1-0 win at Cal Poly off a goal from Jessica Gordon and a six-save shutout by the sophomore sensation Aubree Southwick. The Aztecs carried that momentum back to San Diego for the team's home opener Arizona State. Cat Walker began her high-scoring season with a 14th minute tally to put San Diego State on the board. After a Sun Devil goal at the 62:33 mark, Walker sent a cross to Taylor Canatsey, who calmly headed in the game-winner. The goal, the first of the freshmen's career, came with just 2:23 remaining in regulation time.

The Aztecs then made their way to the Quaker State for games against Villanova and Loyola (Md.). Against the host Wildcats, SDSU surrendered an early goal but later took the lead on goals by Walker and Alicia Piz. Villanova answered with a goal in the 74th minute to force overtime. In the second extra period, the Wildcats knocked in the game-winner for another heartbreaking loss for San Diego State. Two days later in a game played at St. David's, Pa., Loyola (Md.) jumped out to a 1-0 lead just 1:06 into the



contest. Like the match before, the Aztecs answered with a two-spot on goals by Gordon and Walker. Also like the match before, SDSU surrendered the lead when the Greyhounds notched a tally in the 23rd minute and another in the 55th minute. Gordon tied the game in the 68th minute, however, when she struck on assists from Canatsey and Piz. It was Gordon's first two-goal game of her career.

San Diego State wrapped up its four-game road swing in the Pacific Northwest with its most difficult opponents yet: Washington and No. 6 Portland. The Aztecs held their own against the Huskies before eventually falling, 2-0. The Scarlet & Black dropped a 3-0 decision to the perennial power Portland two days later as the Pilots won the shot battle, 15-2.


With its record at 2-4-1, SDSU finally got a chance to play at home and made the best of it with a 3-1 triumph over UC Riverside. What was more impressive was the way it happened. After yielding a goal at the 49:42 mark to go behind, 1-0, SDSU answered just 54 seconds later when Gretel Amman notched her first collegiate goal. The Aztecs then added a penalty kick goal by Millie Allen in the 57th minute and an insurance tally by Piz in the 78th minute for the impressive come-from-behind win.

The celebration was short-lived, however, as SDSU made the quick drive to CS Fullerton. It appeared early that the Scarlet & Black would continue its winning ways when Vandevanter blasted home her second goal of the season in the 21st minute. The Titans responded with three unanswered goals in the 3-1 victory. Needing some momentum heading into the MWC portion of the schedule, SDSU got it with a 3-0 shutout over San Jose State two days later on goals by Walker, Amman and Vandevanter.

On Oct. 3 the Aztecs got to show their talent on national television when they met UNLV in the MWC opener for both teams on The Mtn. Megan McQueeny got her 15 minutes of fame when she scored her first collegiate goal at the 3:04 mark. Two unanswered goals by the Rebels later and SDSU had its seven-match home winning streak snapped. There was no rest for the weary for the Scarlet & Black as they played host to LMU two days later in its final non-conference game of the season. SDSU dominated the game with advantages in corner kicks (9-2) and shots (12-6), but was unable to get a ball across the line in the 0-0, double-overtime tie.

The Aztecs then had to make the dreaded trip to Utah for games against MWC powers Utah and BYU. In the first game, Southwick made a season-high nine saves, including two on penalty kick attempts, as Walker tied the game for SDSU at 1-1 in the 76th minute. The Utes scored three unanswered goals over the final 12:11 for the 4-1 victory. Two days later, the Cougars scored twice in the first 30 minutes for the 2-0 win.

San Diego State took the two setbacks in



stride and returned to The Mesa the following week where it arguably played its two best matches of the season before the home crowd. Against Air Force, the Scarlet & Black set SDSU Sports Deck records with seven goals and 27 shot attempts. The 7-0 triumph was also the program's largest margin of victory since a 9-0 victory over Cal Baptist in 1992. Walker became the first Aztec to record a hat trick since 2000, while Brooke Holliday, Tiffany Hurst and Ali Lokanc added one goal and an assist apiece. Jessica Gordon also scored for the Aztecs, while Christi Yount made four saves for the shutout. Two days later, SDSU defeated Wyoming, 4-0, on goals by Gordon, Jillian Riker, Lokanc and Holliday. Amman contributed two assists, while Yount made a game-high five saves for her second consecutive shutout.

San Diego State then went to Albuquerque to play New Mexico in a hostile environment. The Aztecs jumped on the scoreboard on a goal by Walker, but the Lobos answered in the 57th minute. The game would remain scoreless the rest of the way and end in a 1-1, double-overtime tie.

The Scarlet & Black wrapped up its regular season the following week at home against TCU. Once again, SDSU jumped out to the lead on a goal by Vandevanter in the 27th minute. The Horned Frogs came back with two goals in the second half for the 2-1 win on Senior Day at SDSU Sports Deck.

The Aztecs earned the No. 6 seed in the MWC tournament, but fell to the same TCU squad by the same score (2-1), but this time in overtime. With the loss, San Diego State finished the season with a 6-10-3 record (2-4-1 MWC).

Walker earned first-team all-MWC honors, while Gordon was tabbed as a second-team selection. SDSU also had a stellar year in the classroom with six players being named to the MWC all-academic team, including Holliday, Lokanc, Piz, Riker and Jackie Spinner.
