

Postgame Football Notes – San Diego State vs. Ohio

December 19, 2018

Big Notes

• Juwan Washington broke 100 yards rushing for the second straight game, fifth time this season and seventh time of his career.

Bowl Notes

- San Diego State played in its ninth consecutive bowl, tied for the 12th-longest streak in the country.
- The Aztecs are one of 14 schools and one of two from a Group of 5 program to play in at least nine straight bowl games.
- Head coach Rocky Long has guided SDSU to a bowl game in each of his first eight seasons, making him one of only six active coaches to lead their current team to a bowl game in each of his first eight campaigns.
- San Diego State dropped to 8-9 all-time in bowl games, including a 4-8 mark in the Division I era (since 1969).

<u>Team Notes</u>

- SDSU has still won 18 of its last 28 (19-9), 25 of its last 36 (25-11), 38 of its last 50 (38-12) and 39 since the 2015 season (39-15).
- The Aztecs were shut out through three quarters for the first time since Nov. 21, 2009 at No. 23 Utah.
- SDSU was shut out for the first time in a game since Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU (L, 52-0). San Diego State had gone 155 games without being shut out prior to tonight.

Series Notes

- San Diego State dropped to 0-1 all-time against Ohio.
- The Aztecs lost their first game against a team from the Mid-American Conference (MAC) and are now 13-1-1 all-time against current teams from the MAC.
- SDSU fell to 1-1 in bowl games against MAC teams (defeated Buffalo, 49-24, in the 2013 Idaho Potato Bowl).

<u>Trends</u>

- SDSU started with the ball for the 84th time in the last 97 games.
- SDSU allowed its opponent to score on its opening drive for just the 15th time since 2015 (54 games).

Player Notes

* Juwan Washington, Jr., RB (19 att., 129 yds. | 3 rec. 14 yds. | 5 KR, 84 yds.)

- Ran for 129 yards on 19 carries and caught three passes for 14 yards. Also added 84 yards on five kickoff returns.
- Broke 100 yards rushing for the second straight game, fifth time this season and seventh time of his career.

* Isaiah Richardson, RS-Fr., WR (3 rec., 58 yds.)

• Posted the first three catches of his collegiate career in his first appearance as an Aztec.

* Christian Chapman, Sr., QB (1-for-2, 8 yds., 0 TD, 0 INT)

- Stretched his active FBS streak of quarterback starts with one or less interceptions to 35 games. It is the longest streak since Navy's Kennan Reynolds went 45 games without more than one interception in a game from 2012-15.
- Dropped to 24-11 all-time as a starting quarterback.

* Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (11-for-24, 126 yds., 0 TD, 1 INT)

• Threw for 126 yards on 11-for-24 passing with 1 interception.

* Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (7 tackles (3 solo))

- Has 183 tackles and 19.5 tackles for loss over his last 18 games (first career 18 starts).
- His 127 tackles this season are the third most ever by an Aztec junior (records started in 1978) and the most by a SDSU junior since 1981.
- His 127 tackles also rank eighth on the school's single-season charts.

* Parker Baldwin, Sr., AZT (9 tackles (5 solo), 1 INT)

- Finished with a team-high nine tackles, including five solo stops.
- Recorded his second interception of the season and sixth of his career.
- Led the team in tackles for the fourth time this season.

Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 32nd consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 54th straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- The Aztecs had their seventh different starting lineup on the offensive line in 12 games this year. Ryan Pope is the only Aztec who has

- DE Myles Cheatum registered his first forced fumble of the season and second of his career.
- CB Kyree Woods made his first career fumble recovery.
- DT Damon Moore made his first career start.
- True freshman Cameron Thomas played in his first career game (on the kickoff unit).
- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Isaiah Richardson also played in his first collegiate game.
- Tonight's temperature was 56 degrees.
- Tonight's attendance was 11,029
