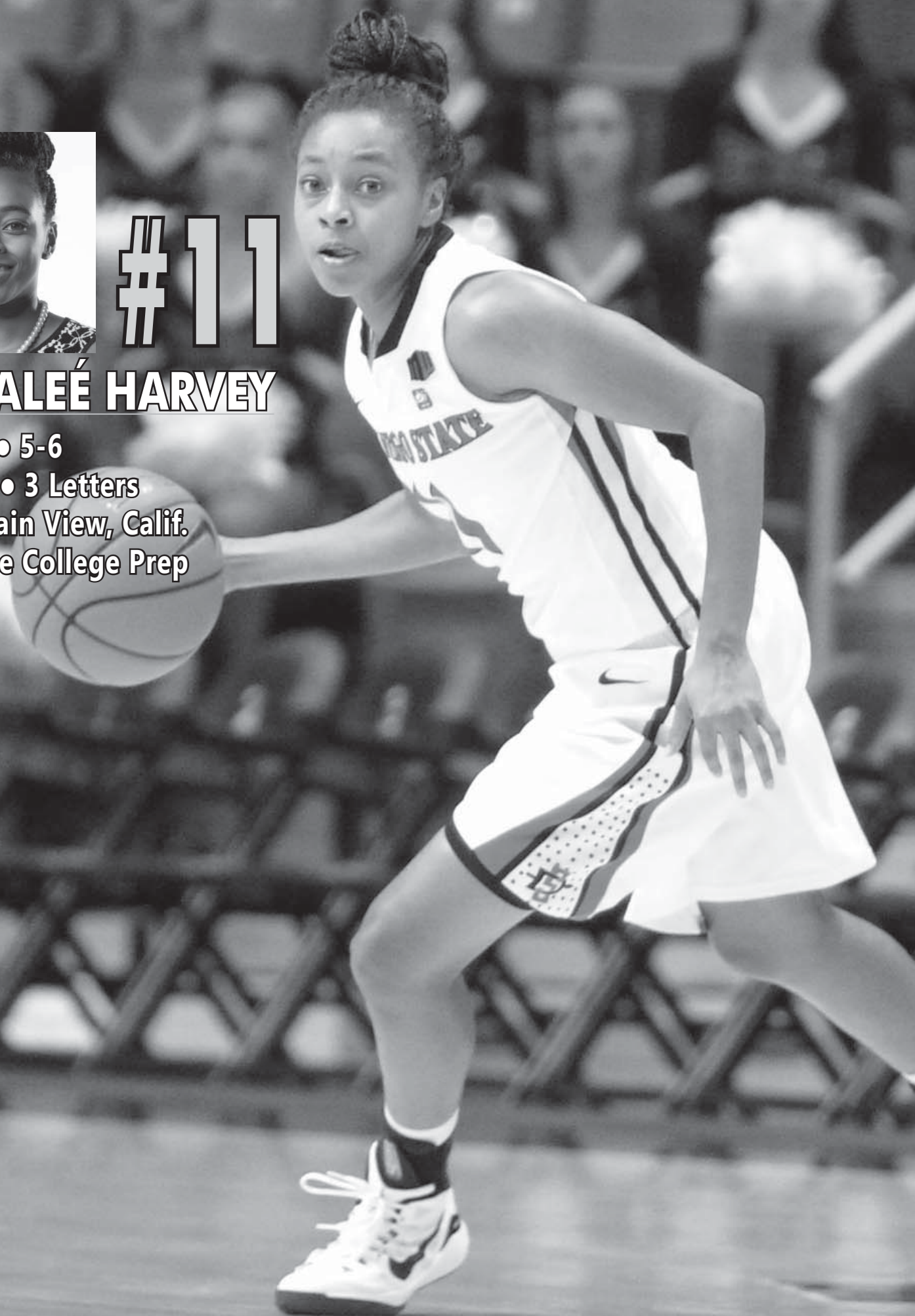

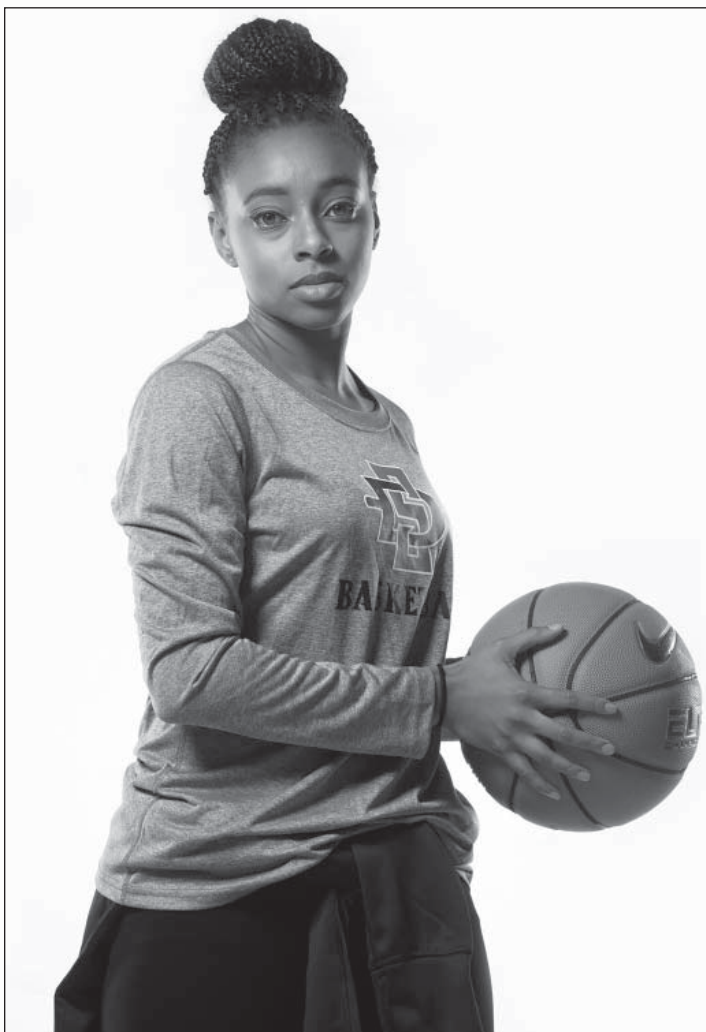

► As A Junior (2013-14)

Started seven of the first eight games at point guard before sitting out the rest of the season with an injured knee ... Averaged 3.6 assists per contest ... Posted career bests of 16 points and seven steals in the Aztecs' home victory over Miami (OH) (12-19-13) ... Recorded season highs of six rebounds and six assists vs. UCLA (12-15-13) ... Finished with 10 points and four boards against No. 19 South Carolina (11-23-13) ... Handed out five assists and went 5-for-5 from the free-throw line in the season-opener at Sacramento State (11-10-13) ... Also totaled five helpers at USC (11-13-13).

► As A Sophomore (2012-13)

Served a backup role in 29 games during her sophomore campaign ... Missed five contests during the non-conference schedule recovering from a hand fracture suffered in practice in late November ... Still finished third on the team in both assists (48) and steals (29) ... Also ranked fourth on the squad with 16 three-pointers made ... Recorded at least one steal in 13 consecutive games from Dec. 30-Feb. 13 ... Logged a season-long 30 minutes, contributing eight points, six assists and three steals vs. UC Irvine (11-14-13) ... Registered a season-high 10 points, while adding four assists and two steals against Savannah State (1-2-13) ... Drilled two 3-pointers in four different games, including the Aztecs' home win over Colorado State (2-13-13) ... Scored eight points and grabbed a collegiate-best seven rebounds to go along with three steals and one block vs. UNLV (2-17-13) ... Dished out a career-high eight assists in the regular-season finale vs. Boise State (3-9-13) ... Also saw action in three games at the MW Championship and the first two rounds of the WNIT.

► As A Freshman (2011-12)

Appeared in 28 contests as a reserve ... Averaged just over 10 minutes an outing (10.3), which ranked second on the team among true freshmen ... Her 17 triples were third on the team and her 23 assists ranked fourth ... Her three double-figure scoring outings were the most by an SDSU freshman ... Led the Aztecs in points and assists on one occasion each ... Owned SDSU's third-best season free-throw percentage at 78.6 and opened her collegiate career by converting on her first nine attempts ... Had a career-high seven assists in the season opener vs. UAPB ... Logged first double-figure scoring outing at Hawai'i,

► As A Redshirt Junior (2014-15)

Started 25 of 29 contests last year after missing the final 22 games of the 2013-14 campaign with a knee injury ... Averaged 6.6 points, 2.3 rebounds and a team-high 2.3 assists in 25.2 minutes ... Led the Aztecs in assists 12 times and steals on seven occasions ... Also topped the squad in three-point field goals made (21) and attempted (81) ... Produced six double-digit scoring efforts, matching her career-high with 16 points on 7-of-11 shooting in SDSU's home victory over eventual Mountain West tournament champion Boise State (2-7-15) ... Also contributed a team-best 16 points in the Aztecs' quarterfinal loss to New Mexico in the MW Championship (3-10-15) ... Dished out three assists or more in 14 games, including a season-high seven at Nevada (3-6-15) ... Twice came up one rebound shy of a career-high after grabbing six boards each at Utah State (1-31-15) and at Colorado State (2-14-15) ... Posted just her second-ever collegiate block vs. San José State (2-21-15) ... Drained a personal-best six free throws on six attempts in SDSU's triumph over UNLV in the regular-season home finale (3-3-15) ... Ended the year with a streak of seven straight games recording at least one steal.

Went to Eastside College Preparatory in East Palo Alto, Calif., where she played under head coach Donovan Blythe ... Garnered all-conference accolades on three occasions ... 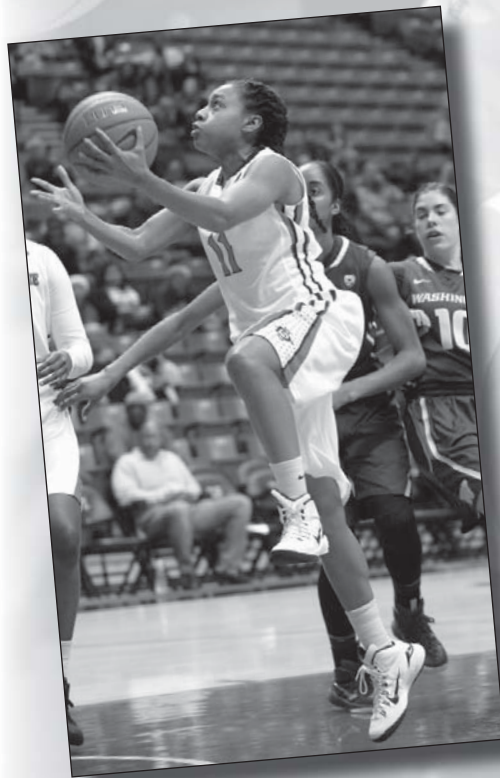

► 2014-15 Mountain West All-Academic Team

► As A Junior (2014-15)

Averaged 4.7 points and 3.5 rebounds in 15.4 minutes of action ... Was one of four Aztecs to appear in all 31 games ... Logged nine starts, including five of the first six encounters on the Mountain West slate ... Led SDSU in blocks 12 times, finishing with a career-high 19 rejections on the season (0.6/gm) ... Also topped the squad in free-throw accuracy (min. 7 att.) with a .742 clip ... Ranked third on the team with a .455 field-goal percentage, draining 60 of 132 attempts ... Scored a season-high 15 points on 7-of-10 shooting to help lift the Scarlet and Black past San José State (2-21-14) ... Also reached double figures with 10 points in the season-opening victory over Sacramento State (11-14-14) ... Drained her first collegiate three-pointer vs. Idaho State in the San Juan Shootout (11-27-14) ... Collected five rebounds or more eight times, including a season-high tying eight boards vs. CSUN (12-20-14) ... Matched her personal-best with three assists against Air Force (1-21-15) ... Had a scoring streak of 58 games in an Aztec uniform snapped in the

regular-season finale at Nevada (3-6-15) ... Received SDSU scholar-athlete recognition and earned a spot on the MW all-academic team for the spring semester.

► As A Sophomore (2013-14)

Was one of just three Aztecs to appear in all 30 games, averaging 6.2 points and 3.8 rebounds per contest ... Made nine starts, including eight straight to end the season ... Reached the double-digit scoring plateau on five occasions ... Notched her first collegiate double-double with career highs of 20 points and 12 rebounds in an SDSU romp at San José State (2-26-14) ... Also grabbed a season-best nine offensive boards against the Spartans ... Finished with nine points and 11 rebounds in the Aztecs' comeback victory at Air Force (2-15-14) ... Scored 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting in just 12 minutes off the bench, helping the Aztecs rally past UC Santa Barbara on the road for their first win of the year (11-30-13) ... Collected a season-high four blocks vs. USD in her first starting assignment on The Mesa (11-18-13).

► As A Redshirt (2012-13)

Utilized redshirt season after transferring to SDSU ... Served as a valuable practice player during the Aztecs' run to the Mountain West regular-season championship.

► At Boston College (2011-12)

Played one season at Boston College ... Played in 29 games and started on three occasions ... Averaged 2.7 points and 1.7 rebounds ... Saw action in just over 10 minutes per outing (10.6) and ranked third on the squad in field-goal percentage with a .431 mark ...
