Aztecs Golfers Tie For Sixth at Topy Cup in Japan

FUKUSHIMA, Japan -- The San Diego State men's golf team opened its 2006-07 season with a tie for sixth place at the 24th Annual Topy Cup in Fukushima, Japan. The Aztecs completed the three-day tournament shooting a total of 22-over-par 886 at the 7,127-yard, par-72 Tanagura Country Club. The Japanese school Tohoku Fukushi tallied a 3-under-par 861 to claim the team title by eight strokes over second-place finishers Arizona State and Kentucky.

After firing a dreary 14-over 302 in the opening round, SDSU rallied on the second day with a 1-under 287 to jump from 10th to seventh in the team standings. The Aztecs, however, could not generate the same momentum on the final day of competition, climbing only one spot to tie Japan's Nihon University for the sixth position.

SDSU was led by the steady play of junior Aaron Goldberg, who concluded the tournament in red figures with a 3-under 213. The Encinitas, Calif., native sank four birdies during the final round to finish in a four-way tie for third, three strokes behind the individual champion Daisuke Yasumoto of Tohoku Fukushi.

Junior Jamie Puterbaugh was the Aztecs' second finisher, tying for 18th with a 5-over 221. The Carlsbad, Calif., product was the only other SDSU golfer to break par, carding a 1-under 71 during the second round. Right behind Puterbaugh was senior John Gray (Vista, Calif.), who fired an even-par 72 on the second day en route to an 8-over 224.

Aztecs' Aaron Goldberg Finishes in Fifth-Place Tie at Husky Invitational

AUBURN, Wash. -- San Diego State junior Aaron Goldberg fired a 3-under-par 69 in the final round to lead the Aztec men's golf team to a seventh place at the Opus NW Husky Invitational in Auburn, Wash. Goldberg carded a 4-under 212 for the tournament to finish in four-way tie for fifth place at the 7,304-yard, par-72 Washington National Golf Club. With his effort, the La Costa Canyon High graduate posted his second straight top-five finish after tying for third at the prestigious Topy Cup in Japan on Sept. 7.

Despite two bogeys on the back nine, Goldberg sunk five birdies for the second consecutive round en route to his sixth career top-five performance for the Scarlet and Black. John Wise of host school Washington took home medalist honors with a 7-under 209, one stroke ahead of UCLA's Lucas Lee (-6).

As a team, SDSU also saved its best for last, shooting a 3-over 291 for a three-round total of 23-over 887 to finish in seventh place, one shot behind sixth-place Loyola Marymount and five in back of Washington State, which placed fifth. UCLA led the nine-team field wire-to-wire, winning the tournament with a 9-under 855, followed by Washington (E), UC Davis (+12) and California (+13).

The Aztecs had three other golfers shoot in the 70s during third-round action, including juniors Chad Moscovic and Jamie Puterbaugh, who each fired a 1-over 73. Moscovic shook off three straight bogeys on holes 7-9, draining three birdies on the back nine to finish in a tie for 30th with a 6-over 222. Puterbaugh was also able to offset five bogeys and a double bogey with six birdies of his own, moving up four spots to tie for 36th with an 8-over 224.

Aztecs Victorious at District 7 Shootout

LAS VEGAS -- Bolstered by four top-10 individual finishes, the San Diego State men's golf team cruised to its first team title of the season at the District 7 Fall Shootout at Angel Park Golf Club. The Aztecs shot a 30-under-par 822 for the tournament, winning by 14 strokes over runner-up Boise State on the 6,722-yard, par-71 Mountain Course. Colorado State and Denver finished in a distant tie for third with a 4-under 848, while Nevada rounded out the top five at 3-under 849.

The Aztecs were sparked by the play of junior Aaron Goldberg who captured medalist honors for the third time in his collegiate career after winning a sudden-death playoff over Boise State's Troy Merritt. Goldberg caught Merritt with a 4-under-par effort on the back nine during Tuesday's final round as both golfers completed regulation at 12-under 201. After consecutive pars in sudden death, Goldberg drained a birdie putt on third playoff hole to take the crown. With his performance, the La Costa Canyon High graduate set a school record for the lowest 54-hole score as well, eclipsing Andrew Scott's total of 203 set at the John Burns Intercollegiate in Hawai'i last February.

SDSU also received an exceptional effort from senior Chris Cole who jumped from the 16th spot into third place after firing an 8-under 205 for the tournament. For the second straight day, Cole logged an Aztec career best for 18 holes after carding a 6-under 65 during the final round, which is tied for third on the school's all-time list.

After entering the third round in a tie for eighth, juniors Chad Moscovic and Jamie Puterbaugh climbed into the seventh position as both players shot a 1-under 70 over the final 18 holes, finishing with a 5-under 208 overall.

SDSU Men's Golf Settles for Fifth at Barona Collegiate Cup

LAKESIDE, Calif. - Despite having three players finish in the top 20 on the individual leaderboard, the San Diego State men's golf team slipped one position on the final day and had to settle for a fifth-place showing at the Barona Collegiate Cup in Lakeside, Calif. SDSU shot an even-par 288 over the final 18 holes for a three-round total of 11-under 853 at the 7,323-yard, par-72 Barona Creek Golf Club.

For the fourth-straight outing, the Aztecs were led by junior Aaron Goldberg who carded a 6-under 210 for the tournament. Goldberg was in contention entering the final round, sitting just one stroke in back of co-leaders Zack Sucher of UAB and Nevada's Taylor Coffman. The La Costa Canyon High alum dropped into a tie for sixth, however, after carding a 3-over 75 during the final 18 holes.

Senior Chris Cole posted three consecutive rounds in red figures for the tournament, finishing in a tie for 14th with a 4-under 212. Sophomore Adam Porzak vaulted from 44th into a tie for 20th after carding a 3-under 69 for the Aztecs' lowest score of the final round. The transfer from Pepperdine finished with a 1-under 215 in his first competition for the Scarlet and Black and tied Cole for the team lead with 14 birdies over 54 holes.

UAB captured both the team and individual honors in the 18-team, 100-player field. The Blazers shot a 24-under 840 to claim the title by four strokes over runner-up Wichita State (-20), while Colorado State (-19) and San Diego (-15) placed third and fourth, respectively. Individually, Sucher earned medalist honors after defeating Coffman on the second hole of a sudden-death playoff.

SDSU Men's Golf Finishes Fourth in Hawaii to Close Out Fall Slate

KANEOHE, Hawaii - Junior Aaron Goldberg finished fourth to lead the Aztec men's golf team at the University of Hawai'i Fall Intercollegiate in Kaneohe, Hawaii. Goldberg carded a 2-under 214 for the three-day tournament, finishing eight strokes in back of the intercollegiate's medalist. As a team, SDSU concluded its final outing of the fall campaign, settling for fourth place with a 15-over 879 to finish 15 strokes behind first-place Loyola Marymount (E), which led the 16-team field wire-to-wire. New Mexico State (+5) and San Diego (+5) tied for the runner-up position, while Louisiana Tech (+16) took fifth to round out the top five.

After climbing to within three shots of the lead following the second round, Goldberg was unable to keep pace with LMU's Brian Locke and Darrin Hall of San Diego. Locke eventually defeated Hall on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff to claim the individual crown. Still, Goldberg nailed down his fourth top-five finish in five tournaments so far this season after recording two in all of 2005-06. In 15 rounds this year, the La Costa Canyon High graduate has already posted red figures on 11 occasions, compared to 14 over 38 total rounds last season.

The Aztecs also received a pair of notable performances from sophomore Adam Porzak and senior Cory Segall who completed the tournament tied for 15th and 19th, respectively. Porzak maintained the same position from the first day after firing a 3-over 75 over the final 18 holes to finish with a combined 4-over 220. Segall, meanwhile, continued his furious assault on the leaderboard, climbing an additional 15 places in the third round to crack the top 20 for the first time this year. The La Jolla High product finished the first round tied for 55th, but ended up just one stroke in back of Porzak with a 5-over 221.

SDSU Golfers Return to Aloha State to Open Spring Season

WAHIAWA, Hawaii - Despite moving from 11th on the first day to third after the second round, the San Diego State men's golf squad settled for a fourth-place finish at the John Burns Intercollegiate in Wahiawa, Hawaii. The Aztecs completed their first competition of the 2007 spring season by shooting a 1-under 287 over the final 18 holes for a three-round total of 8-under 856 at the 6,918-yard, par-72 Leilehua Golf Course.

Once again, SDSU was led by junior Aaron Goldberg, who carded a 5-under 211 for the tournament. The Encinitas, Calif., native was in contention after creeping to within two shots of the leaders entering the final day of action. After firing consecutive rounds of 4-under 68, Goldberg's score ballooned to a 3-over 75, knocking him out of the race and into a tie for 13th place. Still, the La Costa Canyon High alum posted his third-best 54-hole score of the year and became the Aztecs' top finisher for the sixth time in as many starts.

Both senior Cory Segall and junior Ryan Citarella finished the tournament on a high note by shooting a 2-under 70 in the final round. With his effort, Segall carded his best round of the season, climbing an additional 13 spots during the final round to finish in a tie for 30th place with a 1-under 215. Thanks to his final round, Citarella also tied for 32nd with an even-par 216. In all, the Santiago Canyon College transfer moved up 47 spots after the first round of play.

Brigham Young carded a 30-under-par 834 to win the team championship, shooting an incredible 18-under-par 270 during the final round to overtake 36-hole leader UNLV (-22) by eight strokes. Texas A&M (-9), SDSU (-8) and Colorado State (-6) rounded out the top five positions. Frank Wrenn of SMU, who competed as an individual, claimed medalist honors by one stroke over BYU's Nick Ellison after carding a 13-under 203.

SDSU Men's Golf Victorious at Callaway Golf Invitational

RANCHO SANTE FE, Calif. - Buoyed by a pair of top-five individual finishes, the San Diego State men's golf team captured its second title of the season at the Callaway Golf Invitational in Rancho Santa Fe, Calif. The Aztecs shot a 3-over-par 867 over the three-round event, outpacing host school San Diego (+10) by seven strokes at the 6,920-yard, par-72 Farms Golf Club. With the victory, SDSU successfully defended its tournament crown from a year ago when it topped the same Torero squad by 12 strokes. Cal Poly (+11), UC Davis (+14) and Nevada (+16), meanwhile, rounded out the top five in the team standings.

Leading the SDSU charge was junior Jamie Puterbaugh, who walked off the course in second place after carding a 2-under 70 over the final 18 holes for a combined total of 6-under 210. With his effort, the Carlsbad, Calif., native posted his highest career finish as an Aztec, ending the day just one stroke behind medalist Louie Bishop of UC Davis. Puterbaugh also snapped Aaron Goldberg's streak of six consecutive tournaments as the team's top finisher this season.

Goldberg was in contention as well, sitting in a tie for fourth place after the first two rounds. The Encinitas, Calif., product, however, was unable to gain any ground on the final day, maintaining the same position following a third-round score of 1-under 71. Still, Goldberg notched his fourth top-five finish of the year with a combined 4-under 212, just one shot in back of Arkansas' Andrew Landry, who took third.

SDSU Men's Golf Captures Second Straight Team Title, Wins Lexus Classic

FRESNO, Calif. - Sparked by three top-five finishes, the San Diego State men's golf team posted its second straight victory by winning the Fresno State Lexus Classic at the 6,950-yard, par-72 Sunnyside Country Club in Fresno, Calif. The Aztecs fired a 15-under-par 849 for the tournament, holding off UC Irvine (-14) by one shot in a thrilling finish. The two teams battled for the top spot throughout the day, easily outdistancing the remaining 13 teams in the field with Nevada (+6), Hawai'i (+8) and host school Fresno State (+14) rounding out the top five in the team standings.

After a tough second round, senior Cory Segall bounced back sinking eight birdies en route to a final-round total of 4-under 68. With his performance, Segall climbed into sole possession of third place at 4-under 212, just three strokes behind medalist Brian Edick of UC Irvine for his best finish ever as an Aztec. Junior Aaron Goldberg and sophomore Adam Porzak tied for fifth place as both players carded a 1-over 73 over the final 18 holes for a combined 2-under 214. Porzak, a transfer from Pepperdine, notched his best-ever collegiate finish, while Goldberg recorded his sixth top-five effort of the season.

SDSU also received a clutch performance from junior Chad Moscovic who shot a 33 on the back nine en route to a third-round score of 71. Moscovic improved five spots over the first two rounds, tying for 28th out of 92 golfers with a 5-over 221.

Aztecs Take Ninth at Oregon Duck Invitational

EUGENE, Ore. - The San Diego State men's golf team finished in ninth-place after firing a 10-over-par 298 during the final round of the Oregon Duck Invitational in Eugene, Ore. The Aztecs carded a 29-over 893 for the tournament after posting scores of 298 and 297 in the first two rounds. USC captured the team title at the 7,033-yard, par-72 Eugene Country Club with a combined 4-over 868, followed by Oregon State (+10), Arizona and host school Oregon (+11) and Stanford (+16).

After completing the first two rounds just five strokes off the pace, juniors Jamie Puterbaugh and Aaron Goldberg stumbled as both players shot a 3-over 75 over the final 18 holes to finish in a tie for 17th place with a combined 5-over 221. Still, Puterbaugh managed his second top-20 effort of the spring, while Goldberg kept his streak of top-20 performances alive through nine straight tournaments.

Aztecs' Goldberg Finishes in Fourth at ASU Thunderbird Invitational

TEMPE, Ariz. - Junior Aaron Goldberg finished a team-best fourth to pace the Aztecs at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational in Tempe, Ariz. Goldberg carded a 9-under 207 for the tournament for his seventh top-five finish at the 7,037-yard, par-72 Karsten Golf Course. With his performance, the La Costa Canyon High graduate posted his third top-five finish in five spring events.

Goldberg entered the last day of competition just five strokes off the pace, but was unable to close the gap after recording a pair of bogeys on the front nine. Still, the Aztec junior posted his second-best tournament score of the 2006-07 campaign and became the squad's top finisher for the ninth time in 10 outings. New Mexico's Charlie Beljan capped off a late surge on Sunday to take home medalist honors with a 15-under 201, three strokes ahead of second-round leader Derek Sipe of Oregon (-12).

One day after moving up four places in the team standings, SDSU slipped one notch in the final round, finishing in 12th after shooting an 8-over-296 for a three-round total of 14-over 878. Oregon led the 15-team field wire-to-wire, capturing the tournament crown with a 20-under 844, followed by host school Arizona State (-17), USC (-15), Texas A&M (-14) and Arizona (-12).

Three other Aztec players finished within three shots of one another, including junior Jamie Puterbaugh, who climbed six spots over the final 18 holes into a tie for 62nd. Puterbaugh led the team with four birdies in the final round en route to a 1-over 73, ending the tournament with a combined 7-over 223. Meanwhile, sophomore Adam Porzak tied for 64th at 8-over 224, followed by senior Cory Segall (La Jolla, Calif.), who tied for 72nd with a 10-over 226.

Aztecs Finish Fifth in Team Standings at Conference Championships

TUCSON, Ariz. - San Diego State sophomore Adam Porzak fell short in his quest to capture the individual title during the final round of the Mountain West Conference men's golf championships in Tucson, Ariz. Porzak carded the Aztecs' low score for the tournament with a collegiate-best 6-under-par 207, tying TCU's Robby Ormand for the top spot after carding an even-par 71 over the last 18 holes. The Poway High alumnus, however, was unable to recover from an errant tee shot on the first playoff hole as Ormand sank a six-foot par putt to walk away with medalist honors.

Porzak went into the final round with a share of the lead and was poised to claim the championship in regulation after opening up a two-shot advantage through 15 holes. An untimely bogey on the par-3 17th ultimately proved disastrous for the Pepperdine transfer as Ormand, who was five groups behind Porzak, capitalized on the misfortune with a birdie on the 15th to pull even. The sophomore from TCU followed with pars on his remaining three holes to force a playoff. Despite the bad break, Porzak posted SDSU's best-ever individual conference championship score en route to his highest finish as a collegian.

As a team, the Aztecs finished in fifth place for the tournament after shooting an 8-over-par 292 in the final 18 holes for a combined 11-over 863. Second-round leader Brigham Young (-6) briefly relinquished its hold on first place during the final day, but recovered in time to claim the team title by just one stroke over runner-up UNLV (-5) on the 7,136-yard, par-71 Catalina Course at the Omni Tucson National Resort. TCU (+2) completed the championships in the third position, while Colorado State (+8) vaulted over SDSU into fourth place. Following the tournament, the league announced its 11-member all-conference team, which included Aztec junior Aaron Goldberg for the second straight year.

Aztecs Miss Out on Berth in Championship Series After 24th-Place Finish

TEMPE, Ariz. - The Aztecs carded a 20-over 884 for the tournament to finish in 24th place out of 27 teams, missing out on a berth in the NCAA championship series for the second straight year.

The top 10 teams from each of the three regional meets advanced to the championship round. South Carolina claimed the west regional title after posting a combined 44-under 820 to overtake runner-up UCLA (822) on the final day of competition by two strokes. Individually, Benjamin Alvarado of host school Arizona State captured medalist honors with a blistering 18-under 198, beating out a trio of golfers by three shots.

Sophomore Adam Porzak was the Aztecs' top finisher for the tournament at 3-over 219, climbing six spots into a tie for 97th after shooting an even-par 72 over the final 18 holes. Cory Segall rallied after carding an 81 in the first round to shoot a 70 and 71, the Aztecs' lowest scores of the day, in the final rounds to finish with six-over 222.

Junior Jamie Puterbaugh also showed improvement on the third day, shaving seven strokes off his second round score for a 3-over 74 to finish at 231. Fellow classmate Chad Moscovic suffered a reversal of fortune, however, tumbling from the 68th spot into a tie for 121st on the heels of a final-round 82. Unable to finish his final round due to a stomach ailment, junior Aaron Goldberg withdrew from the event.

The Barona Collegiate Cup

Each year, the San Diego State men's golf program plays host to one of the premier events in the country, the Barona Collegiate Cup. Since 2001, the tournament has been held every fall at the 7,400-yard, par-72 Barona Creek Golf Club in Lakeside, Calif. For the first time in the tournament's history, the Barona Collegiate Cup will be played in the spring of 2008, March 17-18. Nestled in a scenic valley on the Barona Indian Reservation, the challenging, world-class golf course attracts a field of national championship contenders on an annual basis. The course is also well known to some of the best golfers in the world as it plays host to the PGA Nationwide Tour Championship in 2007 and 2010.

In 2006, the competition featured No. 38 UAB, No. 59 San Jose State, No. 60 SDSU, No. 63 Colorado State as well as top-75 teams in Wichita State, Saint Mary's, Utah, UC Davis and Washington State.

Wichita State took the first day lead after 36 holes. The Shockers shot an incredible 21-under 555 to take a six-shot lead over UAB. WSU had plenty of company chasing them on the leaderboard as San Diego trailed the Blazers by two strokes (-13), along with San Diego State and Colorado State in a tie for fifth with a 11-under 565.

In the final round, UAB shot a 279 to finish with a 24-under 840 to claim the title over Wichita State which shot a final round 289 for a 54-round score of 844 (-20). Rounding out the top-five on the leaderboard was CSU (-19), San Diego (-15) and the Aztecs (-11).


UAB also captured the individualist medalist honors as Zack Sucher defeated Nevada's Taylor Coffman on the second playoff hole. The duo both shot a 13-under 203 after 54 holes and finished two shots ahead of Colorado State's Zen Brown (-11).

The Aztecs' top finisher was Aaron Goldberg who tied sixth with an 6-under 210. The junior tied his season-low round of 66 in the opening round of the tournament.

San Diego State has finished among the top 10 at the Barona Collegiate Cup in five of the past six years, including winning the team championship in 2002. That season, the Aztecs' John Lepak shared co-medalist honors after carding a 10-under 206, which tied him for third on the school's all-time list for lowest 54-hole score.

In addition to SDSU's team title, Colorado State was victorious at the tournament in 2003 with a 28-under 836, while Ohio State carded an identical score to capture the inaugural event in 2001 by one shot over San Diego State.

This season's Barona Collegiate Cup will feature Oklahoma State and Texas A&M, ranked seventh and 11th in the preseason *GolfWorld*/Nike Coaches' poll as well as Baylor, Oklahoma, Arizona, Illinois, and San Diego.


