Aztecs Play Host to Annual Tournament This Weekend

• SDSU's women's tennis team season opens its fall 2004 schedule with the SDSU Fall Classic, Oct. 1-3, at SDSU Courts. This year's field includes 2004 NCAA tournament participant Alabama, Conference USA's third-place finisher Houston, and cross-town rival San Diego.

Mattera on the Mesa

• The 2004-05 season marks Peter Mattera's 24th season on Montezuma Mesa and his 12th as San Diego State's head coach. In his 11 seasons at the helm, Mattera has compiled a career record of 171-104 (.622) and has guided seven teams to the NCAA tournament. What is more impressive is that nine of his 11 squads have finished with an overall record of .500 or better.

The Future is Now

• The Aztecs return five players from last year's 9-15 (4-3 MWC) team. Among the returners are 2004 MWC all-conference selection and 81st-ranked player, junior Dita Hauerlandova, and one half of last year's all-conference doubles team in senior Indra Erichsen. Also returning are juniors Andrea Hermansen and Sarah Sansom and sophomore Alesya Vidov. In addition to the five returners, this year's squad welcomes four freshmen - Carla Bell, Eliska Krausova, Sisse Nielsen and Nina Spaeth.

Last Year in the Fall Classic

• The 2003 fall classic was a successful beginning for the Aztecs. Hauerlandova and then senior Katalina Romero finished second and third, respectively, in the Flight A singles bracket. In Flight B singles, Patricia Graf took the consolation crown. Since the tournament was not completed due to time constraints, the doubles pair of Erichsen-Romero could not compete in the Flight A final, but they did notch a victory over the No. 31 doubles team from the University of Illinois in the semifinal round.

Scouting the Crimson Tide

• Alabama enters the 2004-05 campaign coming off its fourth straight NCAA tournament appearance. The Crimson Tide returns six letterwinners from last year's squad, including juniors Robin Stephensen and Ashley Bentley. The duo have 2004 preseason ITA rankings of No. 16 and No. 49, and are No. 6 in the nation in doubles.

Alabama heads to San Diego having played in the 19th Annual Roberta Alison Fall Classic at the University of Alabama Tennis Complex, Sept. 24-26, where it claimed two singles championships and one doubles championship.

Scouting the Cougars

• The University of Houston finished third at the Conference USA Championships a year ago. The Cougars ended the season with a record of 15-10. Their 15 wins were the school's most since the 1997 season, when they recorded 19 victories. Houston is under the direction of first-year head coach John Severance.

Scouting the Toreros

• The West Coast Conference member San Diego Toreros compiled an overall record of 11-9 in 2004, and lost to Pepperdine in the WCC championship final. The Toreros return the 2004 WCC player of the year and NCAA tournament participant Emma Murphy. Also returning are all-conference selection Lauren Perl (singles) and honorable mention honorees for doubles Lauren Kazarian and Jenny Brown.

Take Interstate 5 North

• Following the SDSU Fall Tennis Classic, the Aztecs will travel up the I-5 to Los Angeles for the prestigious ITA/Riviera All-American Championships, Oct. 5-10. Last year's fall classic proved to be a good prep for the Aztecs as the duo of Erichsen-Romero made it to the round of 16 before being eliminated in the qualifying draw.

Did you know?

• The last time San Diego State had a below-.500 record under Mattera was 1993-94 when the Aztecs went 8-14 (six games under). In 2003-04, the Aztecs finished 9-15, also six games under .500. After the '93-'94 campaign, Mattera-coached teams had nine consecutive winning seasons, each with 15 victories or more and seven trips to the NCAA Tournament.
