► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team takes its first two-game Mountain West Conference road trip of the season, beginning with a Thursday night match-up at New Mexico and followed by a Saturday afternoon game at Air Force. The Aztecs are coming off their biggest victory of 2003-04, knocking off Colorado State (58-55) for the second straight year at home.

New Mexico, meanwhile, began its MWC schedule with three straight road games and is 10-6 overall and 2-1 in conference play going into its MWC home opener with the Aztecs. Air Force is 3-13 overall and 0-3 in MWC play in 2003-04 and has finished at the bottom of the league standings each of the last four seasons.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 15-28.

► **New Mexico Head Coach Don Flanagan:** Flanagan is in his ninth year at New Mexico and boasts a Lobo and career record of 178-87.

► **New Mexico Series History:** The series is tied at 13-13 (Last: New Mexico def. SDSU, 54-49, 3/12/03, in Las Vegas at the MWC tournament).

► **Air Force Head Coach Ardie McInelly:** McInelly is in her third season at Air Force and boasts a 14-58 record heading into this week. Her eight-year career record is 91-120.

► **Air Force Series History:** San Diego State leads 11-1 (Last: SDSU def. Air Force, 69-57, 2/27/03 in San Diego).

SDSU Women's Basketball Looks To Keep Momentum On Two-Game Conference Road Trip  
The San Diego State women's basketball team, which claimed its first conference victory Saturday, will look to stick to its winning ways when it heads out on its first two-game MWC road trip of the season. The Aztecs travel to New Mexico Thursday to take on the Lobos in their conference home opener at "The Pit" and then jump on a plane to Air Force for a Saturday afternoon game at Clune Arena.

SDSU will be looking to end and extend a pair of seven-game streaks this week. The Lobos own a seven-game winning streak against the Aztecs, while SDSU has won the last seven ver-

Aztecs Shock Colorado State For Second Straight Year

Aztec freshman guard Courtney Fritz's steal with four seconds left wrapped up SDSU's 58-55 women's basketball shocker over Colorado State at Cox Arena on Saturday night.

Fritz (Newberg, Ore.) not only had the timely steal, but nailed two clutch three-pointers in the final 3:05, including one with 1:07 left to give SDSU a 56-55 advantage, finishing with 15 points all from beyond the arc.

Aztec freshman Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.) tallied 15 points in the first half on 6-of-11 shooting to reach double-figures for the 15th time in 16 contests this season. Senior Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.) added a career high seven assists and junior Lindsey Casey's (Odessa, Texas) collected a career best seven boards with the final one coming with just three seconds left in the contest.

The SDSU win was the team's second straight at Cox Arena against Colorado State, having defeated the Rams, 60-47, last season. CSU was 21-13 a year ago and advanced to the WNIT semifinal.

Other Colorado State Notes

Colorado State's basket with 4:02 left in the first half was its last points until the 13:52 mark of the second, a dry spell of over 10 minutes ... only seven Aztec players saw minutes in the win, a season-low (prev. eight vs. St. Mary's) ... all seven Aztecs to get in the game scored points, the second time every SDSU player to log minutes has got on the scoreboard (also vs. UT-Martin - nine players) ...SDSU won the turnover battle versus CSU (14-15), marking the 11th time this season and the seventh time in the last eight contests that the Aztecs have had fewer turnovers than their opponent.

Assists = Wins

SDSU logged a team season-high 17 assists in the upset of Colorado State Saturday, improving to a perfect 5-0 when tallying more assists in a game than their opponent. The only time SDSU has had fewer assists and still come away with a victory was at UC Irvine back on Dec. 2.

Individually, senior Nicolette McCartney contributed a career and team season-best seven assists against the Rams, including six in the first half alone. Veronica Shaw also added a season-high four assists.

A Force In The First

For the second straight game and the fourth time this season, Aztec freshman Michelle Elliott scored 10 or more points in the first half, including 15 versus Colorado State last Saturday.

Courtney Fritz and Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.) have also reached double-figures in scoring in the first half. Fritz tallied a team season-high 16 points versus Cal State Fullerton (Dec. 1) and San Diego (Dec. 10) and had 10 points against Southern Methodist. Dunlap, meanwhile, has notched 10 or more points in the first half a team-high five times in 2003-04.

Shooting On The Up-and-Up

The Aztecs' shooting continued to improve in their most recent outing versus Colorado State, logging a 43.4 field-goal percentage. SDSU has shot over 40 percent from the field in four of its last five

contests, after doing so only twice in the team's first 11 games.

The Aztecs have reached the 40 percent mark in all three of its conference contests, boasting a 43.8 field-goal percentage, second-best in the MWC.

### Can We Please Go To The Line?

In just three conference games in 2003-04, San Diego State opponents have already gone to the free-throw line 42 more times than the Aztecs, making 79 trips to SDSU's 37. Last week, SDSU went to the charity stripe a season-low seven times against Colorado State and were outdone in the same category 13-36 versus Wyoming on Thursday.

Aztec opponents only own a slight advantage in overall games at 325-302. A year ago, the Aztecs took 84 fewer free throws than their opponents and 43 fewer in MWC contests. The MWC mark includes a school-record zero trips to the charity stripe on Jan. 25, 2003, at home versus Utah.

### One Away

With five blocks in her last six games, Nicolette McCartney has inched her way to within striking distance of moving up in the SDSU career record book. McCartney needs just one more block to tie Brooke Meadows for fifth place with 95 blocks.

In 2003-04, McCartney has 18 blocks, ranking third in the Mountain West Conference with 1.12 per game. A year ago, the team's lone senior had a career high 45 blocks in 27 outings.

### Seeing Double

SDSU freshman Michelle Elliott continues to be the team's most consistent threat on offense. Elliott has opened her career with double-figure scoring efforts in 14 of her 15 games with the lone exception being the UT-Martin contest in which she had eight points. A day later, Elliott bounced back into double-figures with a team-high 16 points versus Brown.

For the season, Elliott is still SDSU's leading scorer with 13.9 ppg., a stat that ranks her fifth overall and first among freshmen in the Mountain West Conference.

### New Mexico Tid-Bits

New Mexico plays host to its first conference home game of 2003-04 against the Aztecs Thursday ... the Lobos are 10-6 overall this year (7-3 at home) and 2-1 in MWC play ... New Mexico had won three straight before dropping a 52-43 contest Sunday to league-leading Utah ... the Aztecs and Lobos both earned wins over their only common opponent this season in CS Fullerton ... no Lobo averages in double-figure scoring, with Lindsey Arndt leading the team with 9.8 ppg. and Mandi Moore ranking second (8.4 ppg.) ... Arndt is also the team's top rebounder (7.3/g).

### San Diego State-New Mexico Series Shorts

- ▶ The series is tied 13-13, however, New Mexico has won 12 of the last 13.
- ▶ Six of the last 10 games between the two teams have been decided by 10 or fewer points.

Air Force Tid-Bits

Air Force enters this week with a 3-13 overall record and a 0-3 mark in the MWC ... the Falcons dropped their first six games, won the next three and have now lost seven straight ... Air Force's three wins have come against New Mexico Highlands, Northern Colorado and Portland ... SDSU and Air Force have played just one common opponent thus far in Texas Pan-American with the Aztecs winning 59-38 and the Falcons falling in overtime 68-67 ... Saturday's game will pit two of the conference's top freshmen in SDSU's Michelle Elliott and the Academy's Letricia Castillo ... Castillo leads her team in scoring with 13.3 ppg., while Shawna Neff and Amoy Jackson both average 10.9 ppg ... Jackson is her team's leading rebounder (6.1/g) and Jennifer Roesch is tops in assists (55).

San Diego State-Air Force Series Shorts

- San Diego State leads the all-time series, 11-1, and has won seven straight.
► SDSU is 5-1 against Air Force in Colorado Springs.
► San Diego State has played the Falcons fewer times than any other Mountain West rival (second-least 24 vs. Wyo.).
► Air Force has only two conference wins since the league play began in 2000. One of the victories came against San Diego State (77-72 in Colorado Springs on Jan. 22, 2000).
► SDSU holds both the highest point total (89, 1997) and largest margin of victory (32, twice) in the 12-game series.
► Second-year Falcon head coach Ardie McInelly posted a 1-1 record versus San Diego State while coaching at Idaho State and is 0-4 against the Aztecs while coaching at Air Force. SDSU head coach Jim Tomey is 2-0 vs. the Falcons.

Double-Double

After a two-game absence, sophomore Ashlee Dunlap finally added to her double-double output this season, logging her 10th of 2003-04 with 10 points and 10 boards against Wyoming last Thursday. Dunlap has now matched her season total in double-doubles from a year ago and is tied for the conference lead in 2003-04 with UNLV's Sherry McCracklin.

Dunlap remains in her third place spot in Mountain West Conference career history with the 20 double-doubles. Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the MWC record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23 and McCracklin, a junior, is two behind Dunlap with 18.

A year ago, Dunlap had six double-doubles through the first 16 games and at this pace, could easily pass Bacon for second on the list by year's end.

best 11 times overall this season. For her career, the sophomore has 22 double-figure rebounding performances in her 43 career games.

Through Jan. 19, Dunlap was ranked 30th in all of NCAA Div. I in rebounds per game.

## In The MWC

Through games of Jan. 26, SDSU is ranked in the top half of the conference in six categories, including scoring defense (58.7 ppg.), field goal percentage (.393), field goal percentage defense (.389), three-point percentage (.333), rebounding defense (34.8/g.) and blocked shots (2.88/g). Interestingly, the Aztecs were ranked dead last in three of those categories a year ago.

Individually, Ashlee Dunlap is still the league's second-leading rebounder with her 9.8 rpg., while she is second in blocked shots (1.19/g) and in both defensive (6.00/g) and offensive (3.81/g) boards. Courtney Fritz is second in three-pointers per game (2.31) and senior **Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.)** is third in blocked shots (1.12).

In MWC games, sophomore Veronica Shaw leads the conference in field-goal percentage (.593) and Fritz is tied for first in three-pointers made (3.00/g).

## Other Aztec Notes

SDSU has just 10 active players on its roster with freshmen **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** and **Jordie Smith (Ft. Collins, Colo.)** both out due to injury ... three different Aztecs have scored 20 or more points in a game four times this season ... Courtney Fritz owns the longest active streak in the MWC of consecutive games with a three-point field goal with 10 straight ... the Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent in nine games already this year after doing so only five times (once in league play) in 27 games in 2002-03.

## Pick Six

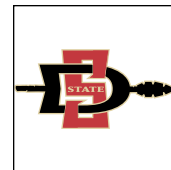
